CONNECTICUT REPORT: The Huskies have spent the entire season ranked No. 1 in the national polls and are the lone remaining undefeated team in Division I. Connecticut has won all 27 of its games by at least 10 points.

In their most recent outing, the Huskies used a 22-1 run in a seven-minute stretch of the second half to defeat No. 24 Notre Dame, 76-66. Connecticut trailed 43-41 with 16:11 to play to mark the first time all season it has trailed a game in the second half. The Fighting Irish earlier scored the first six points of the game and the six-point deficit was similarly the Huskies largest of the year. Senior guard Renee Montgomery had 20 points, eight assists and five steals to lead four players in double figures and junior center Tina Charles had 19 points, eight rebounds and four blocked shots. Sophomore forward Maya Moore added 18 points, eight rebounds and four assists, while freshman guard Tiffany Hayes chipped in 10 points.

Moore (19.6), Montgomery (16.5) and Charles (16.0) all average in double figures for Connecticut, which owns a +32.0 scoring margin for the season. Moore leads the team with 9.3 rebounds per game and Charles is second at 8.2 boards per contest. The Huskies shoot .510 as a team from the field.

CONNECTICUT HEAD COACH GENO AURIEMMA: Geno Auriemma has built the Huskies program into one of the best in the nation and currently is in his 24th season as head coach. This season, Connecticut has been ranked No. 1 in the nation all year long and is the lone undefeated Division I team.

Since his arrival on campus in 1985, Auriemma has led the Huskies to five national championships, nine Final Four appearances, 16 BIG EAST regular season championships and 14 BIG EAST Championship titles. He is the first-ever women's basketball coach to lead a team to five straight berths in the Final Four and is the fastest women's coach to reach 600 career victories.

Auriemma is a six-time national Coach of the Year and has been named the BIG EAST Coach of the Year seven times, including being the recipient of both honors in 2007-08. In 2006, Auriemma was rewarded for his coaching success with induction to the Naismith Memorial Basketball Hall of Fame and the Women's Basketball Hall of Fame.

Entering tonight's game, Auriemma has a career record of 684-122 (.849) in his 24th season at Connecticut.

LAST TIME OUT: Villanova suffered a 70-56 home loss to No. 8 Louisville on Saturday, Feb. 21. The first half went back and forth before the teams went to intermission tied at 25-25. The Wildcats trailed 42-38 with 13:12 to play in regulation, when Louisville used a 10-0 run to take a 52-38 advantage at the 10:44 mark. Cardinal All-American Angel McCoughtry scored eight of Louisville's 10 points in the spurt. Villanova would never get to within nine the rest of the way. In the loss, Villanova was led by senior forward **Laura Kurz** with 18 points and junior guard **Maria Getty** with 10 points. Louisville was paced by McCoughtry with a game-high 34 points and Candyce Bingham added 12 points. Villanova shot 39.2 percent from the floor (20-of-51), 32.0 percent from three-point range (8-of-25) and 72.7 percent from the foul line (8-of-11), while Louisville was 27-of-47 from the floor (57.4%), 1-of-2 from behind the arc (50.0%) and 15-of-21 from the charity stripe (71.4%). The Cardinals owned a 32-23 advantage on the backboards. Both teams had 13 turnovers.

BEATING NO. 1: Villanova will be looking for its third win all-time against a No. 1 ranked team when the Wildcats play at Connecticut on Tuesday. The other two wins versus a top rated team came against Connecticut. Villanova defeated the No. 1 Huskies, 52-48, to win the 2003 Big East Championship and end Connecticut's NCAA record 70-game winning streak. On Feb. 28, 2004, the Wildcats tallied a 59-56 victory over No. 1 Connecticut on Senior Night at The Pavilion.

CONNECTICUT ON THE ROAD: Entering play on Tuesday, Feb. 24, Villanova has lost eight consecutive games at Connecticut. Of the eight, seven were played at Gampel Pavilion and the other in Hartford. Villanova's last win at Connecticut came on Jan. 27, 1993, 1993 by a score of 50-44.

BACK TO GAMPEL: Villanova will be playing at Connecticut's Gampel Pavilion for the first time since Jan. 15, 2005, when the Wildcats take on the Huskies on Tuesday, Feb. 24. In its last trip to Connecticut during the 2006-07 season, Villanova played the Huskies at the XL Center in Hartford.

THREE TO PLAY: The Wildcats will conclude the 2008-09 regular season with three games in six days beginning on Tuesday, Feb. 24 at Connecticut. Following the trip to Connecticut, Villanova will play at Georgetown on Feb. 28, before returning home for the regular season finale versus South Florida on Monday, March 2.

PLAYING FOR A BYE: With one win in its final three games, Villanova will be guaranteed a top eight finish in the league standings and would clinch a first bye in next week's Big East Tournament. With two more wins, the Wildcats will clinch a double bye and would be secured a spot in the Big East Tournament quarterfinals.

SHOOTING FOR 10: With one win in its last three games, Villanova will record 10 Big East wins for the 15th time in program history. The last time the Wildcats registered double figure conference victories was in 2004-05 when the 'Cats went 10-6.

CONFERENCE IMPROVEMENT: The nine Big East wins that Villanova has tallied this year is two victories better than the number of conference wins that the Wildcats recorded in the last two seasons together. Villanova went 2-14 in league play in 2006-07 and 5-11 in 2007-08.

PLAYING THE BEST: Tuesday's game at No. 1 Connecticut will be the fourth straight game for Villanova against a Top 25 opponent. The stretch began on Saturday, Feb. 14 with a 50-46 win over No. 25 DePaul and continued with a 70-54 loss at No. 19 Pittsburgh last Wednesday and a 70-56 home loss to No. 8 Louisville on Saturday.

TOP 25 RECORD: The Wildcats tallied their second Top 25 win of the season on Saturday, Feb. 14 with the 50-46 win over No. 25 DePaul. Villanova is 2-4 against Top 25 teams this year. The other Top 25 win was a 55-48 victory over No. 13 Notre Dame. The four losses were against No. 6 Baylor (62-57), No. 8 Louisville (70-56), No. 19 Pitt (70-54) and No. 23 Rutgers (60-51).

THE 30 POINT CLUB: Senior forward **Laura Kurz** tallied her second career 30+ point game last Wednesday at Pitt. In the 70-54 loss, Kurz netted a career-high 35 points on 14-of-21 shooting from the field, including a 1-of-4 effort from three-point range and a 6-of-6 effort from the foul line. The 35 point effort ranks as the ninth best individual performance in program history and it is the 35th game of 30 points or more ever recorded by a Villanova women's basketball player. Kurz's other 30 point effort was a 33 point performance against Providence on Feb. 12, 2008.

23 IN A ROW: Entering play at Connecticut on Tuesday, Feb. 24, senior forward **Laura Kurz** is riding a streak of scoring in double figures in 23 consecutive games. She has also scored in double figures in 25 of the team's 27 contests this year. The two games where she failed to score in double figures were Penn (8 points) and Wisconsin (8 points). In addition, she has been her team's leading scorer in 21 of the 27 contests.

TOP CAT: After 27 games this season, forward **Laura Kurz** leads the Wildcats in four different statistical categories. Kurz leads in scoring (18.3 ppg.), rebounding (7.2 rpg.), field goal percentage (.466) and blocks (37).

ENCORE 1,000: Earlier this year on Dec. 10 at Binghamton, **Laura Kurz** scored her 1,000 collegiate point. This included her points at Duke and Villanova. Kurz currently has 986 points in her two-year Villanova career and with 14 more points will reach the 1,000 point plateau in just her Villanova career. She scored 491 points last season in her first year at Villanova and she currently has 495 points this year.

SCORING 1,000: Two members of the Villanova team reached the 1,000 career point plateau this season. Senior forward **Laura Kurz** scored her 1,000th collegiate point in Villanova's win at Binghamton on Dec. 10. She currently has 1,344 career points which includes 358 in two seasons at Duke and the 986 points scored during her Villanova career. In a win over DePaul on Feb. 14, senior forward **Lisa Karcic** became the 20th player in Villanova women's basketball history to score 1,000 career points. She now has 1,009 points to her credit.

TOUGH D: Villanova currently leads the Big East Conference in scoring defense at 53.1 points per game. The Wildcats have held an opponent to no more than 52 points 17 times in 27 games this year, including 10 opponents that have been kept under 50 points per game. In the team's 13 Big East games, Villanova is holding its opponents to an average of 14.7 points below their season average.

TWO GAME STRUGGLES: Despite being the league's top rated defense, the Villanova Wildcats have had subpar defensive efforts in their last two outings (70-54 loss at Pitt/ 70-56 home loss to Louisville). The Panthers and Cardinals became the first team to score 70 points against Villanova this season. The previous high scored against Villanova prior to this game was 67 in overtime by LaSalle in the season opener. The previous high in a regulation game was 67 by George Washington.

FINE AT THE LINE: Villanova continues to lead the Big East in free throw shooting. After 27 games, the Wildcats are 253-of-326 from the charity stripe for .776. Villanova currently has five players shooting 70 percent or better from the foul line, including two who are shooting 80 percent or better (**Siobhan O'Connor**, .840; **Maria Getty**, .825). O'Connor is currently tied for second in the Big East in free throw percentage.

FROM FIRST TO LAST: Entering play at Connecticut on Tuesday, Feb. 24, Villanova ranks first in the Big East in scoring defense at 53.1 points per game. By contrast, the Wildcats are last in the league in scoring offense at 56.5 points per contest.

DON'T CROSS THE LINE: The three-point shooting attack for Villanova has centered around four players who have each attempted at least 97 shots from long range. Senior forward **Lisa Karcic** leads with 136 three-pointers attempted, while **Laura Kurz** has taken 130 triples and **Maria Getty** has attempted 111 shots from behind the arc. **Siobhan O'Connor** has tried 97 from long distance. Last season, these four players accounted for roughly two-thirds of the made three-pointers by the Wildcats.

THREE-POINT PRODUCTION: After 27 games this year, Villanova is 214-of-691 (.310) from three-point land and have outscored its opponents, 642-264, from behind the arc. The Wildcats currently have five players who have made at least 24 three-point field goals led by junior guard **Maria Getty** with 42.

DIAL LONG DISTANCE: Villanova is once again making a name for itself from behind the three-point arc. Last season, the Wildcats set NCAA Division I single-season records for three-pointers made and attempted in a season (326-for-858). In 2007-08, the Wildcats averaged 26 three-point attempts per game. So far this season, the team has taken an average of 25.5 shots per game from beyond the arc. In the season opener against La Salle, Villanova established a new school record with 44 attempted three-pointers. The Wildcats have attempted at least 30 three-pointers seven times this year.

HITTING THE BOOKS: Villanova junior guard **Maria Getty** has been named a first team *CoSIDA/ESPN The Magazine* District II Academic All-American. By earning first team honors, Getty will now advance to the national ballot to be considered for Academic All-American distinction. Getty, who has a 3.75 GPA as a finance major, was a second team All-District selection last season. Getty currently leads Villanova in minutes played (32.6 mpg.) and three-point field goals made (42), and ranks second in both scoring (8.6 ppg.) and steals (26). As a team, the Villanova women's basketball program finished third among the 24 Wildcat athletic programs in team GPA for the 2008 fall semester with a 3.390. Senior guard **Siobhan O'Connor** earned a perfect 4.0 GPA for the second consecutive fall semester.

SHOOTING SUCCESS The Wildcats have shot above 40 percent 12 times this year and in those 12 contests they are 10-2. One of the two losses came last Wednesday at Pitt when Villanova was 21-of-47 from the floor for 44.7 percent. The other loss took place on Wednesday, Jan. 14 against Rutgers when the Wildcats shot exactly 40 percent from the field (20-of-50) in a 60-51 setback to the No. 23 Scarlet Knights. The Wildcats have shot over 40 percent in four of the last eight games.

HALFTIME ADVANTAGE: When Villanova goes to halftime with a lead, its chances of success are pretty good. The Wildcats are currently 14-1 when leading at intermission. By contrast, Villanova is 3-8 when trailing at the break and 0-1 when tied at intermission.

TURNING 40: The 2008-09 campaign marks the 40th season of women's basketball at Villanova. The Wildcats played their first varsity season back in 1969-70, when the team posted a 4-6 record. The program currently has an all-time record of 653-393 (.625). Last season the Wildcats hosted Connecticut in the 1000th contest in program history. Villanova has 14, 20-win seasons in its history, all under 31st year head coach **Harry Perretta**, who has led the Wildcats to 570 wins in his tenure on the Main Line.

BLOCK PARTY: Through the first 27 games of the season, the Wildcats have had a big advantage over the opposition in the area of blocked shots. Villanova has collected 99 blocks thus far (3.6/game), while its opponents have just 40 blocked shots (1.5/game).

PLAYING TOGETHER: Villanova has had an assist on 343 of its 529 field goals (64.8%). The Wildcats currently have five different players with 44 or more assists, including senior guard **Siobhan O'Connor** with 68, while senior forward **Lisa Karcic** has 54 and junior guard **Maria Getty** has 54. Junior guard **Tia Grant** and senior forward **Laura Kurz** have 44 helpers each.

900 AND COUNTING: Villanova head women's basketball coach **Harry Perretta** coached his 900th career game at Villanova in a game at George Washington on Jan. 21. Perretta currently has a 31-year coaching record of 570-339.

KURZ EARNS PRESEASON HONOR: Senior forward **Laura Kurz** was named an honorable mention Preseason All-BIG EAST selection at the league's annual preseason Media Day event held at ESPN Zone in New York City. Kurz led Villanova last season with 14.9 points per game, 6.4 rebounds per contest, 48.5 percent shooting from the field and 43.8 percent accuracy from three-point range. She is currently averaging 18.3 points per game and 7.2 rebounds per contest this year.

TRADING RED FOR THE BLUE AND WHITE: Two Villanova players will become active this season after being granted redshirt seasons in 2007-08. Sophomore center **Heather Scanlon** and freshman guard **Sarah Jones** each return to the Wildcats this season. Scanlon averaged 2.1 points and 2.1 rebounds per game as a true freshman in 2006-07 and will be a key presence in the post for Villanova. Jones is a local product capable of playing at the point with strong passing skills and outstanding basketball instincts. Scanlon has played in all 27 games this year and is averaging 5.1 points per game and 4.0 rebounds per contest. She is shooting 40.8 percent from the floor (51-of-125) and 28.8 percent from behind the arc (17-of-59). Jones has logged time in 20 of the 27 games and has 28 points and eight rebounds to her credit.

VULIN HIRED AS ASSISTANT COACH: Head coach **Harry Perretta** completed his coaching staff for the 2008-09 season with the appointment of **Heather Vulin** as assistant coach. Vulin comes to the Main Line from Sacred Heart University, where she was an assistant coach from 2002-08. Vulin was the recruiting coordinator from 2004-08 and during her stint with the program the Pioneers amassed a 124-55 overall record and became the first team in the history of the Northeast Conference to post seven straight seasons with at least 18 victories. As a collegiate student-athlete at Minnesota-Morris, Vulin was a four-year letterwinner in basketball and volleyball and earned Academic All-Conference honors in both sports

FAMILIAR FACES: Former Villanova standouts **Courtney Davis (Mix)** and **Stacie Witman** both rejoin the team as a part of the women's basketball staff this season. Davis will begin her first season as the Director of Basketball Operations and Witman remains with the program as the Women's Basketball Intern. Davis ranks 16th in school history in scoring with 1,071 points and is also third in program annals in rebounding (869) and sixth in assists (457). She helped lead Villanova to the 2003 BIG EAST title and an Elite Eight appearance in the NCAA Tournament. Witman scored 911 points in her Wildcat career and graduated last season after ranking second in scoring (14.1) and rebounding (5.5) for Villanova.

VILLANOVA PICKED 10TH IN BIG EAST PRESEASON POLL:

In a preseason poll of league head coaches, Villanova received 85 points and was selected to finish 10th in the BIG EAST this season. The Wildcats return four starters and 10 letterwinners overall from a team that ranked among the nation's best last year with a +7.0-game turnaround from the previous season. The league's head coaches chose Connecticut to win the league title.

After 30 years as head coach of the Villanova women's basketball program, Harry Perretta has established himself as one of the most respected and knowledgeable coaches in the country. A true teacher both on and off the court, Perretta strives to have a positive influence on his student-athletes not only as basketball players, but also as people.

In his 31-year Villanova career, Perretta has tallied a career record of 570-339. His 570 wins place him 21st on the winningest active collegiate coaching list, and ranks him as the all-time winningest

coach in the history of Villanova basketball for both men and women. Since the beginning of the 2000-01 season Perretta has compiled an impressive 164-97 record.

During the 2007-08 season, Perretta led the Wildcats to one of the top turnarounds in the country with a 17-16 record. A year earlier, Villanova tallied an 8-21 mark with a young and inexperienced squad. In addition to the 17 wins, the Wildcats earned a bid to the WNIT, where they advanced to the third round. This marks the eighth postseason appearance in the last nine years. After playing in the 2000 WNIT, Villanova went to four consecutive NCAA Tournaments from 2001-2004 before playing in the WNIT in 2005, 2006 and 2008. Also, last season, Perretta guided junior forward Laura Kurz to second team All-BIG EAST honors.

Perretta registered his 14th career 20-win season in 2005-06 by leading the Wildcats to a 21-11 record. This was the fifth time in six years that Perretta led his team to a 20-win campaign. Villanova earned a WNIT berth, giving the Wildcats their seventh-straight postseason appearance. Also, in 2005-06, Perretta coached senior forward Liad Suez-Karni to first team All-Big East accolades.

In 2004-05, Perretta became the 26th Division I women's basketball head coach to win 500 games when the Wildcats defeated Pittsburgh, 70-49, on February 2. Villanova finished the season with a 19-12 overall record and qualified for the postseason for the sixth-straight season with a WNIT berth.

One year earlier, Perretta led his team to a fourth-straight 20-win campaign and a fourth consecutive NCAA Tournament berth where the Wildcats advanced to the second round. Perretta also coached his squad to a second-straight Philadelphia Big Five title in 2003-04. For his efforts, he was named Big Five Coach of the Year for the second consecutive season.

The 2002-03 season was a special one for Perretta and the Wildcats. In addition to an impressive 28-6 overall record and a 12-4 Big East Conference mark, Perretta led the Wildcats to their third Big East Conference Tournament championship and first since 1987 with an improbable 52-48 upset over previously unbeaten Connecticut. The win snapped Connecticut's NCAA Division I women's basketball record of 70-straight victories and ended Connecticut's streak of nine-straight conference tournament championships.

The 28 wins recorded in 2002-03 is the second most victories in school history. Villanova was rewarded for its season by earning a No. 2 seed in the 2002-03 NCAA Tournament which is the highest seed ever for a Philadelphia area women's basketball team. In the NCAA Tournament, the Wildcats recorded wins over St. Francis (Pa.), George Washington and Colorado and advanced to the Elite Eight for the first time in the program's history. Also, during the 2002-03 season, Villanova went 4-0 in the Philadelphia Big Five to capture the City Series championship and he was named the Big Five Coach of the Year. Under Perretta's guidance, senior guard Trish Juhline led the Big East in scoring and garnered first

team All-Big East acclaim for the second-straight year, while senior forward Katie Davis was named second team All-Big East and junior guard/forward Courtney Mix was a Big East Honorable Mention Team selection. In addition, Juhline was named the Big East Tournament's Most Outstanding Player.

In 2001-02, Perretta guided Villanova to a 20-11 mark and a trip to the NCAA Tournament. In the NCAA's, Villanova received the No. 9 seed in the west region where they defeated Pepperdine in the first round before losing to No. 1 seed Oklahoma in the second round. Under Perretta's tutelage, junior guard Trish Juhline became the first Wildcat since 1994-95 to be named first team All-Big East. Perretta also helped senior point guard Mimi Riley earn Big East Honorable Mention acclaim in 2001-02.

The 2000-01 season was a memorable one for Perretta, as he led his team to a 22-9 overall record and a berth in the NCAA Tournament where they advanced to the second round. In a 60-55 win over Temple on Dec. 2, 2000, Perretta won his 400th career game and with the 61-45 victory over Providence on Feb. 24, 2001. He became the all-time winningest coach in the history of Villanova basketball for both men and women with career win number 414. For his efforts in 2000-01, Perretta was named the Philadelphia Big Five Co-Coach of the Year. Also that season, Perretta helped senior center Brandi Barnes earn third team All-Big East distinction and sophomore guard Trish Juhline garner Big East Honorable Mention acclaim. In the Philadelphia Big Five, freshman forward Courtney Mix was named Rookie of the Year.

In 1995-96, Perretta led his team to a 21-7 record and added to his already impressive resume when he earned Big East Coach of the Year honors along with the Philadelphia Big Five Coach-of-the-Year award. Already the winningest coach in Villanova women's basketball history, on January 8, 1995 against the Georgetown Hoyas, Perretta earned his 300th career win at the age of 39. At the end of the 1994-95 season, he was named the Philadelphia Big 5 Coach of the Year.

The dean of the Big East and Big 5 coaches, Perretta has brought the Wildcats national respect and success during his tenure at Villanova. Always a crowd favorite wherever he goes, he is one of the most animated and vocal coaches in the country, continually instructing his players during the course of a game. Year-in and year-out, his teams are feared for their aggressive play, disciplined style, defensive prowess and pre-game preparations of an opponent.

A teacher of basketball, Perretta also realizes the importance of the overall college experience. He and his staff follow closely each player's academic progress, and in his 31 years at Villanova, 99 percent of the student-athletes who has stayed all four years has received her degree. Perretta is also a firm believer of using the basketball experience to teach his players lessons on life. Upon graduation, it is a sure bet that Perretta's players will leave Villanova as better basketball players, in addition to being prepared to be a success in whatever career avenue they choose.

During his career on the Main Line, he has led the Wildcats to eight NCAA Tournament appearances, national rankings in the Associated Press poll, Big East regular season and tournament championships in both 1985-86 and 1986-87, the 2003 Big East Tournament title, seven outright and four shared Big 5 titles, and fourteen 20-win or better seasons. In addition, one of his players, Shelly Pennefather, was recognized in 1987 as the nation's top women's basketball player, winning the Margaret Wade Trophy and earning Kodak All-America honors.

"This program is something I feel is my own, my own personal project," stated Perretta. "When I got here, there wasn't much to start with. Yet, all the players we have brought in have graduated, we've had All-Americans and gone to the Final Four (1982). The fact that we are considered one of the better teams in the country over the last 30 years makes me proud. I can honestly say that I wouldn't want to coach anywhere but Villanova."

Perretta began his career on the Main Line in 1978 at the age of 22, the youngest coach ever to head a women's program at Villanova. In his first season, he led the 'Cats to a 17-8 record and was a finalist for the AIAW small college coach of the year. During his career, Perretta and the Wildcats have had many highlights, including reaching the Final Four of the AIAW in 1982. The 1982-83 season saw Villanova begin play in NCAA Division I and in the Big East Conference. Since joining the Big East in 1982, Perretta has compiled a 197-162 conference record.

Perretta attended Lycoming College after earning All-Catholic League honors at Monsignor Bonner High School in Upper Darby, Pa. His playing career was cut short, however, by an ankle injury during his freshman year at Lycoming. Perretta spent the remainder of his college years assist-

ing Lycoming's varsity and junior varsity programs as a coach, and he also aided the women's program. He received his bachelor's degree in social studies and a secondary teaching certificate in 1978. In 1995, he earned his Master's Degree in Education from Villanova.

Perretta is married to the former Helen Koskinen and they are the parents of a 10 year old son, Stephen William and an eight-year old son Michael John. Together, they reside in Drexel Hill, Pa.
