WISCONSIN REPORT: After opening the season with a 64-44 loss at South Dakota State, the Badgers rebounded to post home wins over Drake (55-39) and Canisius (69-54).

Wisconsin shot 49 percent from the field in its 15-point win over the Griffs and led by 14 points at halftime en route to the victory. The Badgers stretched the halftime lead to as many as 24 points in the opening minutes of the second half and 53 percent shooting by Canisius wasn't enough to overcome the big deficit. Jamie Russell scored 16 points on 6-of-10 shooting to lead the way for the Badgers and Alyssa Karel added 10 points. Lin Zastrow had six points and seven rebounds and Rae Lin D'Alie dished out a game-high seven assists.

Through the first three games of the season, Karel is the only Wisconsin player scoring in double figures. She is averaging 10.7 points per game and seven different players each are scoring at least 6.0 points per contest. Zastrow contributes 6.3 points and is the team leader with 7.0 rebounds per game.

BAYLOR REPORT: The Bears are off to a dominant 4-0 start to the season and are ranked in the top 10 in the country in both major national polls.

Baylor has opened the year with wins over Florida Atlantic (90-45), Stanford (81-65), Stephen F. Austin (77-42) and Rice (83-58).

The Bears jumped out to a 25-point halftime lead in the win over Rice and held their hosts to just 32 percent (20-63) shooting for the game. Baylor led by as many as 32 points in the early stages of the second half and put five different players in double figures in scoring. Rachel Allison had 16 points and 14 rebounds and Melissa Jones also had a double-double with 11 points and 10 boards. The other players to score in double figures were Jessica Morrow with 14 points, Danielle Wilson with 13 and Jhasmin Player with 12.

All five of the players that scored in double figures against Rice have started all four games and each averages at least 8.8 points per game. Allison leads the team with 17.5 points and 10.3 rebounds per game. The Bears as a team pull down 53.2 rebounds per game and own a +18.8 rebounding margin over their competition.

CENTRAL FLORIDA REPORT: The Golden Knights have posted one win through the first three games, with the victory coming at home, 71-69, over Florida A&M. UCF has also been defeated by Colorado (86-59) on the road and by Florida Atlantic (68-63) at home.

In the loss to Florida Atlantic, the Golden Knights led by as many as 10 points in the first half and 28-25 at halftime but shot just 28 percent (8-29) in the second half. Emma Cannon recorded a double-double with 15 points and 10 rebounds and Chelsie Wiley came off the bench to make 10-of-10 free throws and lead the team with 18 points to go along with seven rebounds, three assists and two steals. Marshay White added 11 points off the bench as the UCF reserves actually outscored the starters, 32-31.

Cannon, White and Marcquitta Head all are scoring in double figures this season for the Golden Knights. Cannon is leading the team with 17.3 points and 12.7 rebounds per game, while White and Head each are scoring 11.0 points per contest. Wiley has been the team's top passer and is averaging 8.0 points and 3.3 assists per game. The Golden Knights have done an effective job on the glass and average 48.7 rebounds per outing.

After 30 years as head coach of the Villanova women's basketball program, Harry Perretta has established himself as one of the most respected and knowledgeable coaches in the country. A true teacher both on and off the court, Perretta strives to have a positive influence on his student-athletes not only as basketball players, but also as people.

In his 31-year Villanova career, Perretta has tallied a career record of 555-330. His 555 wins place him 21st on the winningest active collegiate coaching list, and ranks him as the all-time winningest

coach in the history of Villanova basketball for both men and women. Since the beginning of the 2000-01 season Perretta has compiled an impressive 160-94 record.

During the 2007-08 season, Perretta led the Wildcats to one of the top turnarounds in the country with a 17-16 record. A year earlier, Villanova tallied an 8-21 mark with a young and inexperienced squad. In addition to the 17 wins, the Wildcats earned a bid to the WNIT, where they advanced to the third round. This marks the eighth postseason appearance in the last nine years. After playing in the 2000 WNIT, Villanova went to four consecutive NCAA Tournaments from 2001-2004 before playing in the WNIT in 2005, 2006 and 2008. Also, last season, Perretta guided junior forward Laura Kurz to second team All-BIG EAST honors.

Perretta registered his 14th career 20-win season in 2005-06 by leading the Wildcats to a 21-11 record. This was the fifth time in six years that Perretta led his team to a 20-win campaign. Villanova earned a WNIT berth, giving the Wildcats their seventh-straight postseason appearance. Also, in 2005-06, Perretta coached senior forward Liad Suez-Karni to first team All-Big East accolades.

In 2004-05, Perretta became the 26th Division I women's basketball head coach to win 500 games when the Wildcats defeated Pittsburgh, 70-49, on February 2. Villanova finished the season with a 19-12 overall record and qualified for the postseason for the sixth-straight season with a WNIT berth.

One year earlier, Perretta led his team to a fourth-straight 20-win campaign and a fourth consecutive NCAA Tournament berth where the Wildcats advanced to the second round. Perretta also coached his squad to a second-straight Philadelphia Big Five title in 2003-04. For his efforts, he was named Big Five Coach of the Year for the second consecutive season.

The 2002-03 season was a special one for Perretta and the Wildcats. In addition to an impressive 28-6 overall record and a 12-4 Big East Conference mark, Perretta led the Wildcats to their third Big East Conference Tournament championship and first since 1987 with an improbable 52-48 upset over previously unbeaten Connecticut. The win snapped Connecticut's NCAA Division I women's basketball record of 70-straight victories and ended Connecticut's streak of nine-straight conference tournament championships.

The 28 wins recorded in 2002-03 is the second most victories in school history. Villanova was rewarded for its season by earning a No. 2 seed in the 2002-03 NCAA Tournament which is the highest seed ever for a Philadelphia area women's basketball team. In the NCAA Tournament, the Wildcats recorded wins over St. Francis (Pa.), George Washington and Colorado and advanced to the Elite Eight for the first time in the program's history. Also, during the 2002-03 season, Villanova went 4-0 in the Philadelphia Big Five to capture the City Series championship and he was named the Big Five Coach of the Year. Under Perretta's guidance, senior guard Trish Juhline led the Big East in scoring and garnered first

team All-Big East acclaim for the second-straight year, while senior forward Katie Davis was named second team All-Big East and junior guard/forward Courtney Mix was a Big East Honorable Mention Team selection. In addition, Juhline was named the Big East Tournament's Most Outstanding Player.

In 2001-02, Perretta guided Villanova to a 20-11 mark and a trip to the NCAA Tournament. In the NCAA's, Villanova received the No. 9 seed in the west region where they defeated Pepperdine in the first round before losing to No. 1 seed Oklahoma in the second round. Under Perretta's tutelage, junior guard Trish Juhline became the first Wildcat since 1994-95 to be named first team All-Big East. Perretta also helped senior point guard Mimi Riley earn Big East Honorable Mention acclaim in 2001-02.

The 2000-01 season was a memorable one for Perretta, as he led his team to a 22-9 overall record and a berth in the NCAA Tournament where they advanced to the second round. In a 60-55 win over Temple on Dec. 2, 2000, Perretta won his 400th career game and with the 61-45 victory over Providence on Feb. 24, 2001. He became the all-time winningest coach in the history of Villanova basketball for both men and women with career win number 414. For his efforts in 2000-01, Perretta was named the Philadelphia Big Five Co-Coach of the Year. Also that season, Perretta helped senior center Brandi Barnes earn third team All-Big East distinction and sophomore guard Trish Juhline garner Big East Honorable Mention acclaim. In the Philadelphia Big Five, freshman forward Courtney Mix was named Rookie of the Year.

In 1995-96, Perretta led his team to a 21-7 record and added to his already impressive resume when he earned Big East Coach of the Year honors along with the Philadelphia Big Five Coach-of-the-Year award. Already the winningest coach in Villanova women's basketball history, on January 8, 1995 against the Georgetown Hoyas, Perretta earned his 300th career win at the age of 39. At the end of the 1994-95 season, he was named the Philadelphia Big 5 Coach of the Year.

The dean of the Big East and Big 5 coaches, Perretta has brought the Wildcats national respect and success during his tenure at Villanova. Always a crowd favorite wherever he goes, he is one of the most animated and vocal coaches in the country, continually instructing his players during the course of a game. Year-in and year-out, his teams are feared for their aggressive play, disciplined style, defensive prowess and pre-game preparations of an opponent.

A teacher of basketball, Perretta also realizes the importance of the overall college experience. He and his staff follow closely each player's academic progress, and in his 31 years at Villanova, 99 percent of the student-athletes who has stayed all four years has received her degree. Perretta is also a firm believer of using the basketball experience to teach his players lessons on life. Upon graduation, it is a sure bet that Perretta's players will leave Villanova as better basketball players, in addition to being prepared to be a success in whatever career avenue they choose.

During his career on the Main Line, he has led the Wildcats to eight NCAA Tournament appearances, national rankings in the Associated Press poll, Big East regular season and tournament championships in both 1985-86 and 1986-87, the 2003 Big East Tournament title, seven outright and four shared Big 5 titles, and fourteen 20-win or better seasons. In addition, one of his players, Shelly Pennefather, was recognized in 1987 as the nation's top women's basketball player, winning the Margaret Wade Trophy and earning Kodak All-America honors.

"This program is something I feel is my own, my own personal project," stated Perretta. "When I got here, there wasn't much to start with. Yet, all the players we have brought in have graduated, we've had All-Americans and gone to the Final Four (1982). The fact that we are considered one of the better teams in the country over the last 30 years makes me proud. I can honestly say that I wouldn't want to coach anywhere but Villanova."

Perretta began his career on the Main Line in 1978 at the age of 22, the youngest coach ever to head a women's program at Villanova. In his first season, he led the 'Cats to a 17-8 record and was a finalist for the AIAW small college coach of the year. During his career, Perretta and the Wildcats have had many highlights, including reaching the Final Four of the AIAW in 1982. The 1982-83 season saw Villanova begin play in NCAA Division I and in the Big East Conference. Since joining the Big East in 1982, Perretta has compiled a 197-162 conference record.

Perretta attended Lycoming College after earning All-Catholic League honors at Monsignor Bonner High School in Upper Darby, Pa. His playing career was cut short, however, by an ankle injury during his freshman year at Lycoming. Perretta spent the remainder of his college years assist-

ing Lycoming's varsity and junior varsity programs as a coach, and he also aided the women's program. He received his bachelor's degree in social studies and a secondary teaching certificate in 1978. In 1995, he earned his Master's Degree in Education from Villanova.

Perretta is married to the former Helen Koskinen and they are the parents of a 10 year old son, Stephen William and an eight-year old son Michael John. Together, they reside in Drexel Hill, Pa.

2008-2009 SEASON PREVIEW

With four starters and nine letterwinners returning, hopes are high at Villanova as the Wildcats prepare for the 2008-09 season. After winning just eight games with a young and inexperienced team two years ago, the team rebounded with 17 wins and trip to the WNIT last year. The only letterwinner who will not return this year is forward Stacie Witman who has been lost to graduation. Witman had a terrific senior season a year ago. She started all 33 games and finished second on the team in scoring with a 14.1 points per game average to go with 5.5 rebounds per game (second on team) and 2.6 assists per game (second on team). Witman also ranked second on the team in three-point field goals made with 67.

FORWARDS:

The top scoring threats for the Wildcats will come from the forward spots in the senior duo of **Laura Kurz (6-1, Lower Gwynedd, Pa.)** and **Lisa Karcic (6-1, New Hyde Park, N.Y.)**. In her first season in a Wildcat uniform last year after transferring from Duke University, Kurz provided Villanova with much needed offensive output. Kurz, who has good post moves and shooting range that extends well beyond the three-point line, finished last year averaging a team-best 14.9 points per game and shooting a team-best 49.5 percent from the field (191-of-386) and a team-high 43.8 percent from three-point range (56-of-128). Kurz also led the Wildcats in rebounding with a 6.4 rebounds per game average. For her efforts last season, Kurz was a second team All-Big East selection.

Karcic is coming off a season where she finished third on the team in scoring at 12.2 points per game, in addition to leading the team in three-point field goals made with 77. She also led the Wildcats in blocks with 33 and steals with 43 and she was third on the squad in assists with 81. The biggest question surrounding Karcic centers around her health. In last year's Big East Tournament, Karcic suffered a torn ACL that forced her to miss all three games in the WNIT. Karcic is currently ahead of schedule with her rehab and looks on track to be 100 percent when the season tips-off in November.

The two reserves at forward look to be senior **Briana Weiss (6-0, Piedmont, Calif.)** and sophomore **Amanda Swiezynski (6-0, Exeter, N.H.)**. Weiss is a fundamentally sound player with a high basketball IQ. Weiss' knowledge of the Villanova system will help her earn valuable minutes. One of her main strengths is the ability to shoot the ball from behind the arc. Swiezynski also possesses a strong basketball intellect with a feel for the game. Swiezynski, who will provide the Wildcats with strength along the frontline, averaged 8.5 minutes per game last season and looks to be in position to earn more playing time in 2008-09.

GUARDS:

Villanova will have the same guard rotation that they have had the last two seasons. The starters will be the junior tandem of **Maria Getty (5-9, Centerville, Ohio)** and **Tia Grant (5-11, Lido Beach, N.Y.)**. Getty will start at the point, but will also see time at the shooting guard position. Getty has good basketball instincts and is one of the team's best three-point shooters. Last year, she finished fourth on the team in three-point field goals by connecting on 48-of-116 for 41.4 percent. She also led the team in assists with 97.

The team's top reserve is senior point guard **Siobhan O'Connor (5-6, West Chester, Pa.)**. A tireless worker, O'Connor continues to improve each season. Her tough-minded approach and high energy style of play make her one of the most valuable players on the Wildcat roster.

O'Connor averaged 24.7 minutes per contest last season as a reserve and averaged 4.9 points per game to go with 65 assists and 35 three-point field goals.

Two other Wildcats expected to see time in the backcourt will be junior **Kyle Dougherty (5-10, Sayre, Pa.)** and redshirt freshman **Sarah Jones (5-7, Philadelphia, Pa.)**. Dougherty is an offensively skilled player with good ball handling skills. She should use her experience to earn playing time this year. Jones is a physical guard with a big upside. A good athlete with good basketball instincts, Jones will fight for playing time in 2008-09.

CENTER:

The center position will be held by sophomore **Heather Scanlon (6-3, Drexel Hill, Pa.)** and sophomore **Shannon Elliott (6-2, Wilmington, Del.)**. Scanlon played as a true freshman in 2006-07, before redshirting the 2007-08 campaign. She used the year off to get in top shape and looks ready to be a contributor this season. Scanlon will provide the Wildcats with versatility at the center position. In addition to possessing strong post moves, Scanlon also has the ability to step outside and shoot the three-point shot. She also has very good passing skills.

Elliott earned valuable playing time last season as a redshirt freshman appearing in 28 games and averaging 8.5 minutes per contest. Elliott is an active player who plays hard all the time. A good rebounder, she also has shooting range that extends to the three-point line.

SCHEDULE:

The Wildcats will play a 30 game schedule that includes 16 Big East Conference games, four Philadelphia Big Five contests and 10 non conference contests. Villanova will open the season on Friday, Nov. 14, when the Wildcats play host to Big Five rival La Salle. The Wildcats then travel to Fairfield and Penn. Following a week off, Villanova will spend the Thanksgiving holiday in the Virgin Islands participating in the Paradise Jam Tournament. In the Virgin Islands, the Wildcats will take on Wisconsin, nationally ranked Baylor and Central Florida.

Following the Paradise Jam, Villanova returns to the states to play two of three on the road. The 'Cats play at Saint Joseph's on Dec. 4, host Lehigh on Dec. 7 and travel to Binghamton on Dec. 10. After a 10 day break for final exams, Villanova opens a homestand of four straight games versus Temple, Delaware, Sacred Heart and Monmouth. The only other non conference game on the schedule is a trip to George Washington in mid-January.

In Big East play, Villanova will play home games against Rutgers, West Virginia, Notre Dame, St. John's, DePaul, Louisville and South Florida. The Wildcats will travel to Big East foes Cincinnati, Syracuse, Seton Hall, Marquette, Pittsburgh, Connecticut and Georgetown. Villanova will play home and home with Providence.

LAST TIME OUT: Senior guard **Siobhan O'Connor** made a game-winning three-pointer with 36 seconds remaining and Villanova edged Penn, 45-43, at The Palestra for its first Big Five win of the season. The Wildcats trailed 43-40 with 2:33 remaining but junior guard **Maria Getty** scored two of her game-high 14 points with 2:06 left to pull to within 43-42. The Quakers went 0-for-5 from the field in the final 1:36 as Villanova rallied. Getty made 5-of-9 shots from the field, including 4-of-7 three-pointers in the game. O'Connor finished with 11 points and the two guards combined to go 6-of-10 from three-point range while the rest of the team was a combined 0-for-12. As a team, the Wildcats shot 12-of-22 (55%) on two-point shots and 6-of-22 (27%) on three-point attempts. Senior forward **Lisa Karcic** matched a game-high with seven rebounds and classmate **Laura Kurz** tallied eight points and six caroms for Villanova.

TURNING 40: The 2008-09 campaign will mark the 40th season of women's basketball at Villanova. The Wildcats played their first varsity season back in 1969-70, when the team posted a 4-6 record. The program currently has an all-time record of 638-384 (.624). Last season the Wildcats hosted Connecticut in the 1000th contest in program history. Villanova has 14, 20-win seasons in its history, all under 31st year head coach **Harry Perretta**, who has led the Wildcats to 555 wins in his tenure on the Main Line.

PACK YOUR BAGS: Villanova is in the midst of playing six straight games away from home after beginning the season by hosting La Salle. The Wildcats will have traveled more than 3,600 miles by the time the six-game stretch is over, with the vast majority of those miles coming during this week's 3,200-mile round trip to the Virgin Islands for the Paradise Jam. The only other road trip during the six-game stretch was a contest at Fairfield (Bridgeport, Conn.) on Monday, November 19. The other two games include local contests in Philadelphia against Penn last Wednesday and against Saint Joseph's on Thursday, December 4.

TOURNAMENT TIME: Head coach **Harry Perretta** is continuing the tradition of bringing his team to a tournament during the Thanksgiving holiday. It isn't hard to see why this has been such a popular idea for the Wildcats over the years. Villanova has won seven of the last nine Thanksgiving tournaments it has participated in, including capturing the title at last year's Odwalla Classic hosted by the University of San Francisco. The program has an all-time record of 63-31 (.670) in regular season tournament action.

LOOKING BACK: Last season Villanova defeated University of South Alabama and host University of San Francisco to capture the Odwalla Classic. The Wildcats won a Thanksgiving tournament for the seventh time in the last nine such tournaments they entered with a thrilling, 73-70, overtime win over the Dons. The other six titles for Villanova have come at the following tournaments: Nevada (1999), Florida International (2000), Fairfield (2001), Colorado (2002), New Mexico (2003) and Rhode Island (2005). In 2004, the Wildcats lost to North Carolina in the first round of the Las Vegas Thanksgiving Classic, before defeating Texas-Arlington in the consolation game.

LIMITED HISTORY: Of the three teams that Villanova will play in the Paradise Jam, the only one it has faced before is Wisconsin. The one meeting between the Wildcats and Badgers is at least a recent one, as the teams met last year in Madison in the second round of the WNIT. Led by 17 points from Stacie Witman and 15 from **Laura Kurz**, Villanova made 7-of-9 three-pointers in the second half and tallied a 60-54 victory.

TAKE NO OFFENSE: In its most recent game, Villanova tallied a 45-43 win over Penn at The Palestra last Wednesday. The game was the first since November 11, 2007 in a 49-47 loss to Loyola (Md.) that both the Wildcats and their opponent scored fewer than 50 points. The last time Villanova won a game in which it scored fewer than 50 points came in a 41-37 win over Boston College in the quarterfinals of the BIG EAST Championship on March 6, 2005. The 88 combined points in the win over Penn last week were the fewest since that victory over Boston College.

DEFENSIVE DOINGS: Villanova has presented a very difficult defensive front for opposing teams through the first three games. The Wildcats have given up just 51.7 points per game and in each of their last two victories have held the other team to 45 or fewer points. Villanova is limiting its opposition to 37.9 percent (53-of-140) shooting from the field and is forcing its opponents into 15.7 turnovers per game. Six different players have at least two steals for the Wildcats, with junior guard **Maria Getty** leading the way with three swipes.

THREE AT A TIME: Villanova's vaunted three-point shooting attack has continued this season. After setting new NCAA Division I single-season records for three-pointer made and attempted last season, the Wildcats are averaging 7.7 made three-point field goals on 28.3 attempts per contest this year. In the season opener against La Salle, Villanova set a single-game school record with 44 three-point shots attempted. The three-point leader so far has been junior guard **Maria Getty**, who has made 9-of-18 (50%) from long distance and accounted for 27 of her 44 points from behind the arc.

BIG DISPARITY: Although the Wildcats have made a large number of three-pointers so far - 23 in three games - the team is not shooting for the same percentage that it is accustomed to from behind the arc. Through its first three games, Villanova has made only 27 percent (23-of-85) from long range. On the other hand, the Wildcats have been very effective finding open space in the lane and are shooting 58 percent (39-67) on two-point shots.

PHENOMENAL IN PHILLY: With its 45-43 win over Penn last week, Villanova improved to 34-2 all-time against the Quakers, including a record of 18-1 in games played at The Palestra. Prior to the two-point margin of victory in last Wednesday's game, Villanova had won the previous five overall meetings between the teams by an averaging of 24.6 points.

GOOD GETTY: Junior guard **Maria Getty** has enjoyed a strong start to the 2008-09 campaign. She has been the team's leading scorer in two of the first three games and is currently averaging 14.7 points per contest, second best on the team. Getty has been remarkably accurate from the field, shooting 15-of-25 (60.0%) from the field, including 9-of-18 (50.0%) from three-point range. She also ranks third on the team with 4.3 rebounds per game and is the team leader with three steals. Getty is in her third season as a backcourt starter for the Wildcats and as a sophomore in 2007-08 averaged 7.3 points per game.

KURZ COUNTS: In a win over Fairfield on November 17, senior forward **Laura Kurz** tallied her 11th game in a Villanova uniform with 20 or more points. She scored 25 points on 11-of-18 shooting against the Stags to help the Wildcats to a 61-45 victory. A strong offensive performance by Kurz is usually a good indication of a Villanova victory. When Kurz scores at least 20 points, Villanova is 8-3.

SENSATIONAL SIOBHAN: One of the most unheralded players on the Villanova roster is senior guard **Siobhan O'Connor**. A versatile point guard who is usually spotted providing whatever contributions the Wildcats need most on the court, O'Connor is second on the team through three games with 34.0 minutes per contest. She is averaging 6.7 points and 3.7 rebounds per game while leading the squad with 2.7 assists per contest. In last Wednesday's win at Penn, O'Connor scored a season-high 11 points and made a game-winning three-pointer with 36 seconds left in the contest.

CONTINUING COMEBACK: Senior forward **Lisa Karcic** continues to work her way back from an injury suffered in the first round of last year's BIG EAST Championship. Karcic has returned to start all three games this year and is averaging 5.3 points and 7.0 rebounds per contest. Her rebound total is second best on the team and she also ranks second with seven assists, three blocked shots and two steals. The only part of her game which Karcic is still fine tuning is her shooting touch. She is shooting 4-of-23 from the field, including 4-of-17 from three-point range, though the first three games.

SCANLON RETURNS: After a redshirt season in 2007-08, sophomore center **Heather Scanlon** has made her return to the Villanova lineup as the starting center in each of the first three games. She currently is averaging 4.7 points and 2.7 rebounds per game while shooting 50 percent (6-of-12) from the floor and making 2-of-4 three-pointers.

SHANNON ON THE BLOCK: Sophomore center **Shannon Elliott** continues to show some of the promise that she displayed as a redshirt freshman last season. She has honed her defensive skills and through the early part of the season leads the Wildcats with four blocked shots. In 28 games last season, including one start, Elliott averaged 1.9 points and 1.5 rebounds per contest.

SARAH SIGHTING: Redshirt freshman **Sarah Jones** made her Wildcat debut in the season-opening loss to La Salle and played 16 minutes coming off the bench. Jones scored eight points to lead all Villanova reserves in the game. Three games into the season now, Jones is averaging 10.3 minutes per game off the bench and has contributed 2.7 points and 1.3 rebounds per game. In the win over Penn last Wednesday, Jones rebounded a missed shot by the Quakers with 11 seconds left in the first half and quickly pushed the ball up the floor, where she found junior guard **Maria Getty** for a buzzer-beating three-pointer. The play helped Villanova score five straight points to end the half and cut a six-point deficit to just one at the break.

WELL STOCKED: Villanova enters the 2008-09 season with 10 letterwinners returning from last season, including four starters. The returning starters are senior forwards **Laura Kurz** and **Lisa Karcic** and junior guards **Maria Getty** and **Tia Grant**. Overall, the Wildcats bring back the bulk of their production in nearly every stat category. Villanova returns 76.9 percent of its scoring, 81.6 percent of its rebounding, 82.2 percent of its assists and 79.4 percent of its three-point shooting from last season. In 2007-08, the Wildcats set NCAA single-season records for three-pointers made and attempted.

TRADING RED FOR THE BLUE AND WHITE: Two Villanova players will become active this season after being granted redshirt seasons in 2007-08. Sophomore center **Heather Scanlon** and freshman guard **Sarah Jones** each return to the Wildcats this season. Scanlon averaged 2.1 points and 2.1 rebounds per game as a true freshman in 2006-07 and will be a key presence in the post for Villanova. Vulin was the recruiting coordinator from 2004-08 and during her stint with the program the Pioneers amassed a 124-55 overall record and became the first team in the history of the Northeast Conference to post seven straight seasons with at least 18 victories. As a collegiate student-athlete at Minnesota-Morris, Vulin was a four-year letterwinner in basketball and volleyball and earned Academic All-Conference honors in both sports. She earned a degree in Secondary Education at Minnesota-Morris and went on to receive a Master's degree in Education from North Dakota State.
