## 2007-08 WOMEN'S BASKETBALL GAME NOTES

**SOUTH ALABAMA REPORT:** The Jaguars will head for the San Francisco Tournament with a 4-0 record and are coming off a 42-34 home win over Tulsa. South Alabama had scored at least 72 points in each of its first three games.

In the win over Tulsa, the Jaguars limited their visitors to just 18 percent (11-of-61) shooting in the game and pulled out to a 22-12 lead at halftime. Despite shooting only 22 percent as a team, USA received nine points apiece from senior Patrice Brunner and sophomore Shakira Nettles. Brunner added a team-high 12 rebounds for the Jaguars, who actually were outrebounded 64-45 in the contest.

Through four games, South Alabama owns a +25.7 scoring margin and have held their opponents to only 45.5 points per game. Nettles leads the team with 12.5 points per contest, while junior forward Ra'Shawna Sippio averages 11.8 points and 7.5 rebounds per contest.

The Jaguars play out of the Sun Belt Conference and this season were picked to finish in a tie for fourth place in the league's East Division. South Alabama returns seven letterwinners and three starters from a team that went 14-16 last season and finished 7-11 in conference play. Senior guard Monique Jones was chosen as a third team preseason all-conference pick. She is averaging 9.5 points and 6.5 assists per game through the first four outings of the season.

**SAN FRANCISCO REPORT:** The host Dons enter their own home tournament with a 2-2 record and have defeated both Colorado State (101-96) and Cal State Fullerton (73-63) this season. The win over Colorado State was the first triple overtime game in school history.

San Francisco is coming off the win over Cal State Fullerton on Monday night. In that game, senior forward Dominique Carter had 24 points and 10 rebounds, while senior center Lisa Olden added 10 points and nine caroms. Junior forward Necolia Simmons scored seven points and pulled down a game-high 13 rebounds as the Dons owned a 50-26 edge on the glass. San Francisco led by six points at halftime and by as many as 12 in the second half before settling on the final margin.

Through the first four games of the season, Carter leads the team with 16.8 points per contest and averages 6.5 rebounds per game. Simmons is contributing 11.5 points per game and averages a team-best 8.0 caroms. The Dons average 43.2 rebounds per outing and shoot .375 (100-267) from the field, .282 (20-71) from three-point range and .671 (53-79) from the foul line.

San Francisco was picked to finish sixth in the eight-team West Coast Conference this season, while San Diego was chosen as the league favorite. Carter earned a spot on the Preseason All-Conference team and is vying to become a four-time first team All-League pick. She has earned the honor in each of the past three seasons.

**UMKC REPORT:** The Kangaroos are 3-1 heading into this weekend's tournament and are coming off a 76-62 win at home over Colorado State. UMKC has also defeated Central Arkansas and Air Force, while the lone loss came against Kansas.

In the win over Colorado State, UMKC stretched a two-point halftime edge to the final margin by going 13-of-17 from the free throw line in the second 20 minutes. Sophomore guard Chazny Morris led all players with 23 points to lead three Kangaroos in double figures. Senior center Alysa Klein and junior guard Taushelle Rushing each added 10 points.

Through the first four games of the season, UMKC owns a +6.0 scoring margin (68.0-62.0) over the opposition and averages 42.5 rebounds per game. Morris leads the team with 17.8 points per contest and is tied with Klein for the team lead with 7.3 rebounds per game. Klein averages 10.3 points per game and freshman guard Sarah Stewart has chipped in 10.5 points per contest.

The Kangaroos were picked to finish seventh out of 10 teams in the Summit League this season. UMKC returns nine letterwinners and three starters from a team that finished 10-20 overall and 6-8 in the league a year ago.

Klein was named a preseason first team all-conference selection and Morris earned preseason second team honors.

## 2007-08 WOMEN'S BASKETBALL GAME NOTES



After 30 years as head coach of the Villanova women's basketball program, Harry Perretta has established himself as one of the most respected and knowledgeable coaches in the country. A true teacher both on and off the court, Perretta strives to have a positive influence on his student-athletes not only as basketball players, but also as people.

In his 30-year Villanova career, Perretta has tallied a career record of 538-314. His 538 wins place him 21st on the winningest active collegiate coaching list, and ranks him as the all-time winningest coach in the history of Villanova basketball for both men and women. Over the past seven seasons Perretta

has compiled an impressive 142-78 record.

In 2006-07, Perretta had the difficult task of guiding a young team that had graduated four starters and 66.6 percent of the scoring from the previous season. Villanova struggled to an 8-21 campaign with one of Perretta's youngest teams in his tenure with the Wildcats.

Perretta registered his 14th career 20-win season in 2005-06 by leading the Wildcats to a 21-11 record. This was the fifth time in six years that Perretta led his team to a 20-win campaign. Villanova earned a WNIT berth, giving the Wildcats their seventh-straight postseason appearance. After playing in the 2000 WNIT, Villanova went to four consecutive NCAA Tournaments from 2001-2004 before playing in the WNIT the last two seasons. Also, in 2005-06, Perretta coached senior forward Liad Suez-Karni to first team All-Big East accolades.

In 2004-05, Perretta became the 26th Division I women's basketball head coach to win 500 games when the Wildcats defeated Pittsburgh, 70-49, on February 2. Villanova finished the season with a 19-12 overall record and qualified for the postseason for the sixth-straight season with a WNIT berth.

One year earlier, Perretta led his team to a fourth-straight 20-win campaign and a fourth consecutive NCAA Tournament berth where the Wildcats advanced to the second round. Perretta also coached his squad to a second-straight Philadelphia Big Five title in 2003-04. For his efforts, he was named Big Five Coach of the Year for the second consecutive season.

The 2002-03 season was a special one for Perretta and the Wildcats. In addition to an impressive 28-6 overall record and a 12-4 Big East Conference mark, Perretta led the Wildcats to their third Big East Conference Tournament championship and first since 1987 with an improbable 52-48 upset over previously unbeaten Connecticut. The win snapped Connecticut's NCAA Division I women's basketball record of 70-straight victories and ended Connecticut's streak of nine-straight conference tournament championships.

The 28 wins recorded in 2002-03 is the second most victories in school history. Villanova was rewarded for its season by earning a No. 2 seed in the 2002-03 NCAA Tournament which is the highest seed ever for a Philadelphia area women's basketball team. In the NCAA Tournament, the Wildcats recorded wins over St. Francis (Pa.), George Washington and Colorado and advanced to the Elite Eight for the first time in the program's history. Also, during the 2002-03 season, Villanova went 4-0 in the Philadelphia Big Five to capture the City Series championship and he was named the Big Five Coach of the Year for the fourth time in his career. Under Perretta's guidance, senior guard Trish Juhline led the Big East in scoring and garnered first team All-Big East acclaim for the second-straight year, while senior forward Katie Davis was named second team All-Big East and junior guard/forward Courtney Mix was a Big East Honorable Mention Team selection. In addition, Juhline was named the Big East Tournament's Most Outstanding Player.

In 2001-02, Perretta guided Villanova to a 20-11 mark and a trip to the NCAA Tournament. In the NCAA's, Villanova received the No. 9 seed in the west region where they defeated Pepperdine in the first round before losing to No. 1 seed Oklahoma in the second round. Under Perretta's tutelage, junior guard Trish Juhline became the first Wildcat since 1994-95 to be named first team All-Big East. Perretta also helped senior point guard Mimi Riley earn Big East Honorable

Mention acclaim in 2001-02.

The 2000-01 season was a memorable one for Perretta, as he led his team to a 22-9 overall record and a berth in the NCAA Tournament where they advanced to the second round. In a 60-55 win over Temple on Dec. 2, 2000, Perretta won his 400th career game and with the 61-45 victory over Providence on Feb. 24, 2001. He became the all-time winningest coach in the history of Villanova basketball for both men and women with career win number 414. For his efforts in 2000-01, Perretta was named the Philadelphia Big Five Co-Coach of the Year. Also that season, Perretta helped senior center Brandi Barnes earn third team All-Big East distinction and sophomore guard Trish Juhline garner Big East Honorable Mention acclaim. In the Philadelphia Big Five, freshman forward Courtney Mix was named Rookie of the Year.

In 1995-96, Perretta led his team to a 21-7 record and added to his already impressive resume when he earned Big East Coach of the Year honors along with the Philadelphia Big Five Coach-of-the-Year award. Already the winningest coach in Villanova women's basketball history, on January 8, 1995 against the Georgetown Hoyas, Perretta earned his 300th career win at the age of 39. At the end of the 1994-95 season, he was named the Philadelphia Big 5 Coach of the Year.

The dean of the Big East and Big 5 coaches, Perretta has brought the Wildcats national respect and success during his tenure at Villanova. Always a crowd favorite wherever he goes, he is one of the most animated and vocal coaches in the country, continually instructing his players during the course of a game. Year-in and year-out, his teams are feared for their aggressive play, disciplined style, defensive prowess and pre-game preparations of an opponent.

A teacher of basketball, Perretta also realizes the importance of the overall college experience. He and his staff follow closely each player's academic progress, and in his 30 years at Villanova, 99 percent of the student-athletes who has stayed all four years has received her degree. Perretta is also a firm believer of using the basketball experience to teach his players lessons on life. Upon graduation, it is a sure bet that Perretta's players will leave Villanova as better basketball players, in addition to being prepared to be a success in whatever career avenue they choose.

During his career on the Main Line, he has led the Wildcats to eight NCAA Tournament appearances, national rankings in the Associated Press poll, Big East regular season and tournament championships in both 1985-86 and 1986-87, the 2003 Big East Tournament title, seven outright and four shared Big 5 titles, and fourteen 20-win or better seasons. In addition, one of his players, Shelly Pennefather, was recognized in 1987 as the nation's top women's basketball player, winning the Margaret Wade Trophy and earning Kodak All-America honors.

"This program is something I feel is my own, my own personal project," stated Perretta. "When I got here, there wasn't much to start with. Yet, all the players we have brought in have graduated, we've had All-Americans and gone to the Final Four (1982). The fact that we are considered one of the better teams in the country over the last 30 years makes me proud. I can honestly say that I wouldn't want to coach anywhere but Villanova."

Perretta began his career on the Main Line in 1978 at the age of 21, the youngest coach ever to head a women's program at Villanova. In his first season, he led the 'Cats to a 17-8 record and was a finalist for the AIAW small college coach of the year. During his career, Perretta and the Wildcats have had many highlights, including reaching the Final Four of the AIAW in 1982. The 1982-83 season saw Villanova begin play in NCAA Division I and in the Big East Conference. Since joining the Big East in 1982, Perretta has compiled a 192-151 conference record.

"It is hard to believe that I have been at Villanova for 30 years. It seems like yesterday that I was just beginning my career here," said Perretta. "When I think back over the years, it is amazing to me how many special people I have come in contact with. I have been very fortunate to have some great people play for me here at Villanova. I consider myself lucky that I have been able to coach at one place my entire career."

Perretta attended Lycoming College after earning All-Catholic League honors at Monsignor Bonner High School in Upper Darby, Pa. His playing career was cut short, however, by an ankle injury during his freshman year at Lycoming. Perretta spent the remainder of his college years assisting Lycoming's varsity and junior varsity programs as a coach, and he also aided the women's program. He received his bachelor's degree in social studies and a secondary teaching certificate in 1978. In 1995, he earned his Master's Degree in Education from Villanova.

Perretta is married to the former Helen Koskinen and they are the parents of a nine-year old son, Stephen William and a seven-year old son Michael John. Together, they reside in Drexel Hill, Pa.

## 2007-08 WOMEN'S BASKETBALL GAME NOTES

### 2007-2008 SEASON PREVIEW

Entering last season, Villanova faced the unenviable task of having to replace four starters and 66.6 percent of its scoring from a team that went 21-11 in 2005-06. This year, the Wildcats return four starters and 76.4 percent of their scoring. Due to an inexperienced roster that included seven of its top players being freshmen and sophomores, Villanova struggled to an 8-21 season a year ago. As his team prepares for the 2007-08 season, head coach Harry Perretta is hoping the experience his young Wildcats gained last year will prove dividends on the court this season.

#### **GUARDS:**

Villanova returns its entire backcourt from last year. The starting guards appear to be the sophomore duo of **Maria Getty (5-9, Centerville, Ohio)** and **Tia Grant (5-11, Lido Beach, N.Y.)**. These two combined to start 55 of a possible 58 games last year. Getty is a combo guard who has a great feel for the game. She emerged as one of the team's top three-point shooters a year ago connecting on 41 triples which ranked her second on the team. Grant is an athletic performer with a wealth of potential. The versatile Grant is a slasher who has shooting range that extends to the three-point line. She also has the ability to be a top-notch defender.

As the only pure point guard on the Wildcat roster, junior **Siobhan O'Connor (5-6, West Chester, Pa.)** will see a great deal of playing time at the lead guard position. O'Connor was slowed during the end of last year by a shoulder surgery, but looks completely healthy entering the 2007-08 campaign. A tireless worker, O'Connor will give Villanova a stabilizing force at point guard. Sophomore **Kyle Dougherty (5-10, Sayre, Pa.)** showed good improvement last year and should see increased time this season. Dougherty is a skilled offensive player with good ball handling skills. Freshman **Sarah Jones (5-9, Philadelphia, Pa.)** will add depth to the Villanova backcourt. Jones, who helped lead her team to four consecutive Public League championships, possesses good basketball instincts. Adding depth at guard will be junior **Leslie Murray (5-8, Moorestown, N.J.)** who joins the team as a walk-on in 2007-08.

#### **FORWARDS:**

Look for Villanova's offensive firepower to come from the forward spots this season. The team's leading returning scorer is senior **Stacie Witman (6-0, Plymouth Meeting, Pa.)** who averaged 12.4 points per game and 5.4 rebounds per contest last season. After missing 10 games due to a broken foot, Witman returned and emerged as one of the team's go-to players last season. Witman is a good athlete who can score inside and outside.

In the season finale versus Providence, Karcic registered a career-high 29 points, including scoring 24 in the first half. Due to her size and versatility, Karcic has the ability to create mismatch problems for opponents. In addition to averaging 11.3 points per game last season, she led the team in three-point field goals made with 61. Karcic will see time at both forward and center.

## 2007-08 WOMEN'S BASKETBALL GAME NOTES

A newcomer to the Wildcat rotation this year will be junior **Laura Kurz (6-2, Lower Gwynedd, Pa.)** who sat out last season after transferring from Duke University. Kurz is a talented offensive player whose game will be a boost to the Villanova attack. Kurz is an outstanding three-point shooter who can also score on the low block due to her size and post moves. Look for Kurz to see playing time at both forward and center. A fourth Wildcat expected to see be in the forward rotation is junior **Briana Weiss (6-0, Piedmont, Calif.)**. The left-handed Weiss is a fundamentally sound player with a high basketball IQ. She played in 28 of the 29 games last year and averaged 13.8 minutes per contest. Redshirt freshman **Amanda Swiezynski (6-0, Exeter, N.H.)** will battle for playing time at forward. Swiezynski, who has a good feel for the game, will provide the Wildcats with strength in the frontcourt. Senior **Claire Hannenberg (5-10, Wellesley, Mass.)** will provide depth at forward. Hannenberg began her career as a manager before earning a spot on the team last season. She is a hard worker with a good mid range jump shot.

### CENTER:

In addition to Kurz and Karcic, two other Wildcats expected to be in the mix at center include sophomore **Heather Scanlon (6-3, Drexel Hill, Pa.)** and redshirt freshman **Shannon Elliott (6-2, Wilmington, Del.)**. Scanlon is a talented performer who continues to show significant improvement. Scanlon, who has the ability to be a dominant rebounder, should use the experience she gained last year and be a force in the middle this year. Elliott redshirted last year and appears in top shape entering this season. Elliott will provide the Wildcats with a center who can step away from the basket and hit the three-point shot. She also does a very good job of running the court. Senior **Adrian Semrau (6-4, Grafton, Ohio)** will provide depth and size at center. The tallest player on the team, Semrau was a standout volleyball player at Villanova earning second team All-Big East honors in 2006.

### SCHEDULE:

Villanova will play a 29-game slate that includes 16 Big East Conference games, four Philadelphia Big Five contests and nine non conference battles. The Wildcats will open the season on Friday, Nov. 9 with a city series game at La Salle. Two days later, Villanova travels to Loyola (MD). After an away contest at Monmouth, the 'Cats will head west for Thanksgiving to compete in the University of San Francisco Tournament. Villanova will be joined in the tournament by host San Francisco, South Alabama and the University of Missouri Kansas City. Following

the Thanksgiving Tournament, Villanova returns to open the home portion of its schedule against Fairfield on Nov. 28.

The Fairfield game begins a stretch of six consecutive home games that include dates with Penn, Saint Joseph's, George Washington, Massachusetts and Binghamton. Villanova will play at Temple on Dec. 21 before closing out the non conference segment of the schedule with a game at Manhattan on Dec. 30.

The Wildcats will once again play a 16-game Big East schedule this year. Villanova will play host to conference foes Connecticut, Seton Hall, Georgetown, Syracuse, Pittsburgh, Cincinnati and Marquette and the team will play at Notre Dame, Rutgers, DePaul, St. John's, South Florida, West Virginia and Louisville. Villanova will play a home and home with Providence.

## 2007-08 WOMEN'S BASKETBALL GAME NOTES

**LAST TIME OUT:** The Wildcats are coming off a 53-39 win at Monmouth on Sunday, Nov. 18. Villanova led 17-13 with 10:12 left in the first half, before the 'Cats held the Hawks to just three points the rest of the half to take a 29-16 lead at halftime. Villanova held a 39-29 advantage with 11:26 left in regulation when Monmouth used a mini 10-6 run to cut the Wildcat lead to 45-39. The Wildcats then responded with eight straight points to open up a 53-39 lead with 2:30 to play. Of the eight consecutive points, seven were recorded by sophomore guard **Maria Getty**. In the win, Villanova was led by senior **Stacie Witman** who scored a game-high 17 points and junior **Lisa Karcic** who added 13 points and seven rebounds. Getty added seven rebounds and five assists, while junior **Laura Kurz** grabbed a game-best eight rebounds. Monmouth was paced by Jennifer Bender who had 11 points and seven rebounds. For the game, Villanova was 19-of-50 from the field (38.0%), 9-of-30 from three-point range (30.0%) and 6-of-8 from the foul line (75.0%), while Monmouth shot 30.0 percent from the floor (15-of-50), 16.7 percent from three-point range (1-of-6) and 80.0 percent from the charity stripe (8-of-10). Both teams grabbed 34 rebounds. Villanova committed 10 turnovers, while the Hawks were credited with 12 turnovers.

**TOURNAMENT HISTORY:** In the history of Villanova women's basketball, the Wildcats have tallied an all-time in-season tournament record of 61-31 (.663).

**THANKSGIVING FORTUNES:** Villanova has won six of the last eight Thanksgiving Tournaments they have participated in. The six titles have come at the following tournaments: Nevada (1999), Florida International (2000), Fairfield (2001), Colorado (2002), New Mexico (2003) and Rhode Island (2005). In 2004, the Wildcats lost to North Carolina in the first round of the Las Vegas Thanksgiving Classic, before defeating Texas Arlington in the consolation game. Last year, the Wildcats lost to Tulane in the first round of the Florida International Tournament, before defeating North Florida in the consolation round.

**HEADING WEST:** This weekend's Odwalla San Francisco Tournament will mark the eighth time that Villanova has played in a tournament west of the Mississippi. In the other seven tournaments, Villanova captured the championship in five of the seven and have an all-time record of 12-2 in games played west of the Mississippi. The five tournament titles have taken place at the UNLV Thanksgiving Tournament in 1993, the St. Mary's (Calif.) Thanksgiving Tournament in 1997, the Nevada Danka Classic in 1999, the Colorado Coors Classic in 2002 and the New Mexico Mountainview Classic in 2003. The only two tournaments that Villanova has played in west of the Mississippi that it did not win was the Women's Sports Foundation Tip-Off Classic held in November, 2003 in Eugene, Oregon and the UNLV Thanksgiving Tournament in 2004.

**NOTHING IN COMMON:** Villanova will be joined in the San Francisco Odwalla Classic by South Alabama, UMKC (University Missouri Kansas City) and the host San Francisco. Villanova has never faced any of the three teams in its program's history.

**END OF THE ROAD:** After participating in this weekend's San Francisco Odwalla Classic, Villanova will complete a stretch of five straight games away from home to start the season. The Wildcats opened the season with a 64-58 win at La Salle on Friday, Nov. 9, before losing at Loyola (Md.) on Sunday, Nov. 11 by a score of 49-47. Villanova won at Monmouth on Sunday, Nov. 18 by a score of 53-39. In all, Villanova will travel a total of 5,376 round-trip miles before it returns to the Pavilion to play its home opener against Fairfield on Nov. 28. The good news for the Wildcats is that once they do return home, the team will have six straight home contests.

**HOMECOMING AFFAIR:** It will be a fun Thanksgiving for Villanova junior forward **Briana Weiss** who will be returning to her native northern California this weekend. Weiss, who hails from Piedmont, Calif., is a 2005 graduate of Bishop O'Dowd High School. During her high school career, Weiss was a two-time All-League performer and was named a Top 20 player in Northern California. A 1,000 point scorer at Bishop O'Dowd, she averaged 19.2 points per game, 8.1 rebounds per contest, 3.3 steals per game and 3.2 assists per contest. Weiss has played in three games this year as a reserve for the Wildcats and has scored eight points. She is averaging 9.7 minutes per contest.

**ACTING DEFENSIVE:** Villanova has done a good job of playing team defense in the early going in 2007-08. After three games, the 'Cats are giving up just 48.7 points per contest. Villanova has held two of its three opponents under 50 points. The 58 points scored by La Salle in the season opener is the most points given up by the Wildcats this year.

**PLAYING TOGETHER:** As is the case with all Harry Perretta coached teams, the 2007-08 Villanova Wildcats play unselfish team basketball. After three games, Villanova has had an assist on 41 of its 57 made field goals for 71.9 percent. In last Sunday's win at Monmouth, the Wildcats had an assist on 16 of their 20 field goals.

**ASSISTING HER TEAMMATES:** Sophomore **Tia Grant** leads Villanova in assists after three games with 14 for an average of 4.6 assists per game. What is even more impressive is that she has just two turnovers to go with the 14 assists.

**HITTING THE BOARDS:** Junior forward **Laura Kurz** is coming off a strong rebounding game in her last outing. In a 53-39 win at Monmouth, Kurz grabbed a career-high eight rebounds, including four offensive boards. Kurz, who sat out last year after transferring from Duke, is averaging 7.0 points per game and 5.3 rebounds per contest.

**30-POINT CLUB:** Senior forward **Stacie Witman** tallied the 32nd game of 30+ points in Villanova women's basketball history when she netted 31 points in the season opener versus La Salle on Friday, Nov. 9. The 32 performances have been registered by 15 different players. In the 64-58 win over La Salle, Witman was 10-of-21 from the field, 5-of-12 from three-point range and 6-of-6 from the foul line for a career-high 31 points. She also added seven rebounds, three assists and a steal.

**PICKING UP WHERE SHE LEFT OFF:** Senior **Stacie Witman** has been Villanova's leading scorer in two of the first three games. After leading the team with 31 points at La Salle in the season opener, Witman netted nine at Loyola (Md). Last Sunday, she scored a team-best 17 points in a win at Monmouth. Dating back to last year, she has registered double figures in points in 10 of her last 12 games. Over the final nine games of 2006-07, she averaged 15.3 points per contest. She is currently averaging a team-best 19.0 points per game and 5.3 rebounds per contest.

**FREE THROW FORTUNES:** The free throw line has been very kind to the Wildcats in the first three games of the 2007-08 season. Villanova is 24-of-27 (88.9%) from the foul line in the early going this season. **Stacie Witman** has been the team's top performer at the charity stripe with an 11-of-11 performance.

**TAKING CARE OF THE BALL:** After three games this year, the Villanova Wildcats are averaging 9.0 turnovers per game. The 'Cats had eight turnovers against La Salle, nine at Loyola and 10 at Monmouth. Last year, Villanova ranked second in the country in turnovers per game at 12.1 per contest. Villanova has ranked near the top of the national statistics in fewest turnovers per game six times in the last seven years.

**OFF TARGET:** Villanova has struggled from beyond the arc in the early going of the 2007-08 season. After three contests, Villanova is 26-of-90 (28.9%) from three-point range. Last year, the Wildcats were 224-of-695 from three-point range.

**STARTERS RETURN:** The Wildcats return four of their five starters from a year ago and in many ways will have a familiar look on the court this season. Although the team will have to replace the production of the graduated Jackie Adamshick, the team brings back sophomore guards **Maria Getty** and **Tia Grant** in addition to senior forwards **Lisa Karcic** and **Stacie Witman**. Last season, those four players combined for 56 percent of the team's scoring, 41 percent of the rebounding and 48 percent of the assists.

**MAJORITY OF SCORING RETURNS:** In 2006-07, the Wildcats had a youthful and inexperienced roster with seven of the top nine players being freshmen and sophomores. That now benefits Villanova heading into this season, as the team returns 76.4 percent of its scoring from last season. The team returns four starters in sophomore guards **Maria Getty** and **Tia Grant** and senior forwards **Lisa Karcic** and **Stacie Witman**.

**KURZ ELIGIBLE:** Junior forward **Laura Kurz (Lower Gwynedd, Pa.)** will be eligible to play this season after sitting out last year to complete NCAA Division I transfer requirements. Kurz came to Villanova after playing two years at Duke University and will start at forward for the Wildcats. After two contests, she is averaging 7.0 points per game 5.3 rebounds per contest.

**FAMILIAR FACE:** There is one change on the Villanova coaching staff this season as former standout **Trish Juhline** returns to the team as an interim assistant coach for the season. Juhline replaces Mary Beth Snell, who resigned in October to accept a job in the career counseling center at the University of Portland. Juhline is one of the most decorated players in the program's history. She currently ranks third all-time in scoring with 1,659 points and 11th in assists with 385. She also holds the school record for career three-point field goals with 275. During her four-year Villanova career, she helped the Wildcats to an 85-41 mark, three NCAA Tournament berths, a Big East Championship and an NCAA Tournament Elite Eight appearance. Juhline spent the last four seasons as a member of the Drexel University women's basketball staff.

**ANOTHER FAMILIAR FACE:** Trish Juhline is not the only familiar face that will be a member of head coach Harry Perretta's staff in 2007-08. **Jackie Adamshick**, who played on the Main Line from 2002-07, will serve as Perretta's administrative intern. Adamshick finished her career ranked seventh in school history in scoring (1,372) and rebounds (703).
