VILLANOVA-SAINT JOSEPH'S SERIES HISTORY

SAINT JOSEPH'S REPORT: The Hawks have alternated from loss to win in each of their first six games and are currently 3-3 overall. Saint Joseph's played in the Vanderbilt Thanksgiving Tournament and lost to Virginia Tech, 66-63, before defeating Davidson by a 78-68 score.

The Hawks have used the same starting lineup for all six of their games with senior Mary Kate McDade, senior Jenna Loschiavo and junior Mariame Djouara in the backcourt and juniors Brittany Ford and Ashley Logue in the post. Ford has led the team in scoring so far with 14.8 points per game on 50 percent (32-64) shooting from the field. She is also second on the team with 5.2 rebounds per contest. Loschiavo is the other Saint Joseph's player averaging in double figures and scores 11.8 points per game with a team-high 18 three-pointers. Loschiavo has made 18-of-41 (44%) shots from beyond the arc. McDade runs the offense from the point and contributes 6.7 points and 5.3 assists per contest.

In the win over Davidson, the Hawks led by 19 points at halftime and cruised to the victory behind 18 points from Djouara and 17 from Loschiavo, who made 5-of-8 three-pointers. Saint Joseph's hit on 10-of-21 triples in the contest and also made 14-of-17 free throws to secure the outcome.

SAINT JOSEPH'S HEAD COACH CINDY GRIFFIN: Among the accomplishments for eighth-year head coach Cindy Griffin in her time with the Hawks is the team's five postseason berths in the last seven seasons. Griffin began her coaching career at her alma mater and returned to the school in 2001 to become head coach.

Upon her arrival, Griffin helped to reinvigorate the program in her first year, leading the 2001-02 squad to a 24-8 record and the second round of the WNIT. A year later, Griffin earned Atlantic 10 Coach of the Year honors, when Saint Joseph's finished 19-11 and captured the Atlantic 10 Eastern Division title. In 2005-06, Griffin led the Hawks to the biggest turnaround (+13.0 games) in the entire nation from the previous season. The Hawks reached the semifinals of the Atlantic 10 Championship and once again advanced to the WNIT.

Entering tonight's game, Griffin has a head coaching record of 126-93 in her eighth season at Saint Joseph's and a 174-126 overall record as a head coach in her 11th season. Griffin was the head coach at Loyola (Md.) for three years before returning to the Hawks.

After 30 years as head coach of the Villanova women's basketball program, Harry Perretta has established himself as one of the most respected and knowledgeable coaches in the country. A true teacher both on and off the court, Perretta strives to have a positive influence on his student-athletes not only as basketball players, but also as people.

In his 31-year Villanova career, Perretta has tallied a career record of 556-332. His 556 wins place him 21st on the winningest active collegiate coaching list, and ranks him as the all-time winningest

coach in the history of Villanova basketball for both men and women. Since the beginning of the 2000-01 season Perretta has compiled an impressive 160-96 record.

During the 2007-08 season, Perretta led the Wildcats to one of the top turnarounds in the country with a 17-16 record. A year earlier, Villanova tallied an 8-21 mark with a young and inexperienced squad. In addition to the 17 wins, the Wildcats earned a bid to the WNIT, where they advanced to the third round. This marks the eighth postseason appearance in the last nine years. After playing in the 2000 WNIT, Villanova went to four consecutive NCAA Tournaments from 2001-2004 before playing in the WNIT in 2005, 2006 and 2008. Also, last season, Perretta guided junior forward Laura Kurz to second team All-BIG EAST honors.

Perretta registered his 14th career 20-win season in 2005-06 by leading the Wildcats to a 21-11 record. This was the fifth time in six years that Perretta led his team to a 20-win campaign. Villanova earned a WNIT berth, giving the Wildcats their seventh-straight postseason appearance. Also, in 2005-06, Perretta coached senior forward Liad Suez-Karni to first team All-Big East accolades.

In 2004-05, Perretta became the 26th Division I women's basketball head coach to win 500 games when the Wildcats defeated Pittsburgh, 70-49, on February 2. Villanova finished the season with a 19-12 overall record and qualified for the postseason for the sixth-straight season with a WNIT berth.

One year earlier, Perretta led his team to a fourth-straight 20-win campaign and a fourth consecutive NCAA Tournament berth where the Wildcats advanced to the second round. Perretta also coached his squad to a second-straight Philadelphia Big Five title in 2003-04. For his efforts, he was named Big Five Coach of the Year for the second consecutive season.

The 2002-03 season was a special one for Perretta and the Wildcats. In addition to an impressive 28-6 overall record and a 12-4 Big East Conference mark, Perretta led the Wildcats to their third Big East Conference Tournament championship and first since 1987 with an improbable 52-48 upset over previously unbeaten Connecticut. The win snapped Connecticut's NCAA Division I women's basketball record of 70-straight victories and ended Connecticut's streak of nine-straight conference tournament championships.

The 28 wins recorded in 2002-03 is the second most victories in school history. Villanova was rewarded for its season by earning a No. 2 seed in the 2002-03 NCAA Tournament which is the highest seed ever for a Philadelphia area women's basketball team. In the NCAA Tournament, the Wildcats recorded wins over St. Francis (Pa.), George Washington and Colorado and advanced to the Elite Eight for the first time in the program's history. Also, during the 2002-03 season, Villanova went 4-0 in the Philadelphia Big Five to capture the City Series championship and he was named the Big Five Coach of the Year. Under Perretta's guidance, senior guard Trish Juhline led the Big East in scoring and garnered first

team All-Big East acclaim for the second-straight year, while senior forward Katie Davis was named second team All-Big East and junior guard/forward Courtney Mix was a Big East Honorable Mention Team selection. In addition, Juhline was named the Big East Tournament's Most Outstanding Player.

In 2001-02, Perretta guided Villanova to a 20-11 mark and a trip to the NCAA Tournament. In the NCAA's, Villanova received the No. 9 seed in the west region where they defeated Pepperdine in the first round before losing to No. 1 seed Oklahoma in the second round. Under Perretta's tutelage, junior guard Trish Juhline became the first Wildcat since 1994-95 to be named first team All-Big East. Perretta also helped senior point guard Mimi Riley earn Big East Honorable Mention acclaim in 2001-02.

The 2000-01 season was a memorable one for Perretta, as he led his team to a 22-9 overall record and a berth in the NCAA Tournament where they advanced to the second round. In a 60-55 win over Temple on Dec. 2, 2000, Perretta won his 400th career game and with the 61-45 victory over Providence on Feb. 24, 2001. He became the all-time winningest coach in the history of Villanova basketball for both men and women with career win number 414. For his efforts in 2000-01, Perretta was named the Philadelphia Big Five Co-Coach of the Year. Also that season, Perretta helped senior center Brandi Barnes earn third team All-Big East distinction and sophomore guard Trish Juhline garner Big East Honorable Mention acclaim. In the Philadelphia Big Five, freshman forward Courtney Mix was named Rookie of the Year.

In 1995-96, Perretta led his team to a 21-7 record and added to his already impressive resume when he earned Big East Coach of the Year honors along with the Philadelphia Big Five Coach-of-the-Year award. Already the winningest coach in Villanova women's basketball history, on January 8, 1995 against the Georgetown Hoyas, Perretta earned his 300th career win at the age of 39. At the end of the 1994-95 season, he was named the Philadelphia Big 5 Coach of the Year.

The dean of the Big East and Big 5 coaches, Perretta has brought the Wildcats national respect and success during his tenure at Villanova. Always a crowd favorite wherever he goes, he is one of the most animated and vocal coaches in the country, continually instructing his players during the course of a game. Year-in and year-out, his teams are feared for their aggressive play, disciplined style, defensive prowess and pre-game preparations of an opponent.

A teacher of basketball, Perretta also realizes the importance of the overall college experience. He and his staff follow closely each player's academic progress, and in his 31 years at Villanova, 99 percent of the student-athletes who has stayed all four years has received her degree. Perretta is also a firm believer of using the basketball experience to teach his players lessons on life. Upon graduation, it is a sure bet that Perretta's players will leave Villanova as better basketball players, in addition to being prepared to be a success in whatever career avenue they choose.

During his career on the Main Line, he has led the Wildcats to eight NCAA Tournament appearances, national rankings in the Associated Press poll, Big East regular season and tournament championships in both 1985-86 and 1986-87, the 2003 Big East Tournament title, seven outright and four shared Big 5 titles, and fourteen 20-win or better seasons. In addition, one of his players, Shelly Pennefather, was recognized in 1987 as the nation's top women's basketball player, winning the Margaret Wade Trophy and earning Kodak All-America honors.

"This program is something I feel is my own, my own personal project," stated Perretta. "When I got here, there wasn't much to start with. Yet, all the players we have brought in have graduated, we've had All-Americans and gone to the Final Four (1982). The fact that we are considered one of the better teams in the country over the last 30 years makes me proud. I can honestly say that I wouldn't want to coach anywhere but Villanova."

Perretta began his career on the Main Line in 1978 at the age of 22, the youngest coach ever to head a women's program at Villanova. In his first season, he led the 'Cats to a 17-8 record and was a finalist for the AIAW small college coach of the year. During his career, Perretta and the Wildcats have had many highlights, including reaching the Final Four of the AIAW in 1982. The 1982-83 season saw Villanova begin play in NCAA Division I and in the Big East Conference. Since joining the Big East in 1982, Perretta has compiled a 197-162 conference record.

Perretta attended Lycoming College after earning All-Catholic League honors at Monsignor Bonner High School in Upper Darby, Pa. His playing career was cut short, however, by an ankle injury during his freshman year at Lycoming. Perretta spent the remainder of his college years assist-

ing Lycoming's varsity and junior varsity programs as a coach, and he also aided the women's program. He received his bachelor's degree in social studies and a secondary teaching certificate in 1978. In 1995, he earned his Master's Degree in Education from Villanova.

Perretta is married to the former Helen Koskinen and they are the parents of a 10 year old son, Stephen William and an eight-year old son Michael John. Together, they reside in Drexel Hill, Pa.

VILLANOVA (3-3, 1-1 BIG FIVE) AT SAINT JOSEPH'S (3-3, 1-0 BIG FIVE)
THURSDAY, DECEMBER 4 (8:00 PM), PHILADELPHIA, PA.

LAST TIME OUT: In its final game at the Paradise Jam Classic in the U.S. Virgin Islands, Villanova pulled away from a one-point halftime lead by shooting 54 percent in the second half and led by as many as 23 points before settling on a 68-50 win over Central Florida. Senior forward **Lisa Karcic** scored 11 of her season-high 14 points during a 28-4 run by the Wildcats that turned a 39-36 deficit into a 64-43 lead with just over three minutes remaining. Villanova made a season-high 12 three-pointers in the game and held its opponent to 50 or fewer points for the fourth time in six games this year. Senior forward **Laura Kurz** paced the Wildcats with 18 points and junior guard **Maria Getty** tied a career-high with 17 points in the winning effort.

ISLAND RECAP: The Wildcats went 1-2 during their Thanksgiving trip to the Paradise Jam Classic in the Virgin Islands. Villanova opened the tournament with a 47-45 loss to eventual champion Wisconsin and was also dealt a narrow 62-57 setback to No. 6 Baylor. In the loss to the nationally-ranked Bears, the Wildcats trailed 29-8 late in the first half but eventually got as close as three points down the stretch in the second period. In the final 1:17, Villanova twice had the ball with a chance to tie the game on a three-pointer but those two possessions yielded a missed layup and a turnover as Baylor hung on to win.

ALL-TOURNAMENT HONORS: Senior forward **Laura Kurz** represented Villanova on the All-Tournament team at the Paradise Jam Classic. In three games at the tournament, Kurz totaled 38 points, 21 rebounds, eight assists and eight blocked shots. She scored a game-high 18 points in the win over Central Florida to go along with six rebounds, five assists and two blocks. Kurz also had 17 points and three blocks against Baylor and pulled down nine rebounds with three blocked shots against Wisconsin. Last season, the Thanksgiving break took Villanova to the Odwalla Classic in San Francisco and Kurz earned Most Valuable Player honors as the Wildcats claimed the team title.

TURNING 40: The 2008-09 campaign will mark the 40th season of women's basketball at Villanova. The Wildcats played their first varsity season back in 1969-70, when the team posted a 4-6 record. The program currently has an all-time record of 639-386 (.623). Last season the Wildcats hosted Connecticut in the 1000th contest in program history. Villanova has 14, 20-win seasons in its history, all under 31st year head coach **Harry Perretta**, who has led the Wildcats to 556 wins in his tenure on the Main Line.

ROAD WARRIORS: Of the first six games this season for Villanova, only its opener against La Salle on November 14 was played at home. The Wildcats will be playing their sixth straight road game this evening and their first contest since returning from three neutral-site games at the Paradise Jam Classic in the U.S. Virgin Islands. Villanova has traveled more than 3,600 miles since playing its last home game. The road trek ends following tonight's game, however, as the Wildcats return to The Pavilion on Sunday afternoon to host Lehigh.

GOING OFF SITE: Due to a renovation of the Alumni Fieldhouse at Saint Joseph's, the Hawks women's basketball team is playing all of its home games this year at the Gallagher Center on the campus of Philadelphia University.

CITY SERIES SUCCESS: The Wildcats have had a great deal of success in Philadelphia Big Five play since the inception of the 'City Series' in 1979. Villanova currently owns a record of 85-32 (.726) against their four Big Five opponents. Head coach **Harry Perretta** has led Villanova to at least a share of 10 Big Five titles, including six seasons with a perfect 4-0 record and an outright championship.

BIG FIVE BEST: Tonight's game features the two most winningest teams in Big Five play since the 'City Series' began for women's basketball in 1979. Saint Joseph's has won 86 games in Big Five play while Villanova is right behind with 85 all-time victories. In head-to-head action, the Hawks leads the all-time series against the Wildcats by a 25-12 margin. Villanova has won five of the last six games in the series.

DEFENSIVE DOINGS: On three occasions in the first six games of the year, the Villanova defense has limited an opponent to fewer than 50 points. The Wildcats allowed just 45 points to Fairfield and 43 points to Penn in consecutive wins on November 17 and 19, then gave up just 47 points in a narrow two-point loss to Wisconsin. Through games of November 30, Villanova ranked 23rd in the nation in scoring defense, allowing an average of 52.3 points per game to the opposition. The Wildcats have not surrendered more than 68 points in a game yet this season.

HELPING HANDS: Head coach **Harry Perretta** encourages a team-oriented style of play and encourages his players to look for one another on the court. Through the first six games of the season, Villanova has registered an assist on 77 of its 116 made field goals (66 percent). In comparison, the Wildcats opponents have assisted on just 48 of 112 field goals (43 percent). Senior forward **Laura Kurz** leads the team with 14 assists for the year but six different players all have at least nine helpers. Senior guard **Siobhan O'Connor** and junior **Tia Grant** each have 13 assists and junior guard **Maria Getty** has 10.

BLOCK PARTY: Villanova has played strong defense this season but of particular note was the number of blocked shots for the team at the Paradise Jam Classic last week. In three games, the Wildcats totaled 17 blocked shots, including a season-high nine rejections against sixth-ranked Baylor in a narrow 62-57 loss in the middle game of the tournament. The nine blocks were the most since Villanova had 11 against USF last season on February 19, 2008. The Wildcats also had five blocks against Central Florida during the tournament. Senior forward **Laura Kurz** and sophomore center **Heather Scanlon** had three blocks apiece against Baylor and Kurz finished the tournament with eight rejections in three contests.

TRIPLE THE FUN: Villanova is once again making a name for itself from behind the three-point arc. Last season the Wildcats set NCAA Division I single-season records for three-pointers made and attempted in a season. With regards to the number of three-pointers attempted, Villanova is ahead of last year's pace from the standpoint of number of attempts per game. In 2007-08, the Wildcats averaged 26 three-point attempts per game. So far this season, the team has taken an average of 27.2 shots per game from beyond the arc. In the season opener against La Salle, Villanova established a new school record with 44 attempted three-pointers.

THREES FOR FOUR: The three-point shooting attack for Villanova this season has centered around four players who have each attempted at least 20 shots from long range. Senior forward **Lisa Karcic** leads the Wildcats with 40 three-pointers attempted and junior guard **Maria Getty** is close behind with 32 attempts. Senior forward **Laura Kurz** has taken 21 triples and senior guard **Siobhan O'Connor** has fired 20 three-point shots. Last season, these four players accounted for roughly two-thirds of the made three-pointers by the Wildcats.

BIG DISPARITY: Although the Wildcats have made a large number of three-pointers so far - 51 in six games - the team is not shooting for the same percentage that it is accustomed to from behind the arc. Through its first six games, Villanova has made only 31 percent (51-of-163) from long range. On the other hand, the Wildcats have been very effective finding open space in the lane are shooting 49 percent (65-132) on two-point shots.

CONSISTENCY FOR MARIA: One of the early storylines this season for the Wildcats has been the increased scoring production from junior guard **Maria Getty**. After scoring 7.0 points per game as a freshman and 7.3 points per outing as a sophomore, Getty ranks second on the Villanova squad this year with 12.5 points per contest. She is shooting 57.8 percent (26-of-45) from the field and has made 50.0 percent (16-of-32) of her three-point attempts. An even better sign for the team has been Getty's consistency. She has scored at least 14 points in five of the six team games thus far, including a career-high tying 17 points in a win over Central Florida in the team's most recent game.

SPECIAL K: Senior forward **Laura Kurz** is leading the Wildcats in both scoring and rebounding this season with marks of 15.0 points and 7.8 rebounds per contest. She scored a season-high 25 points in a win over Fairfield and has reached double figures in four of six outings. With her 18-point performance in last week's win over Central Florida, Kurz stretched her collegiate scoring total to 939 points. She scored 358 points during her freshman and sophomore seasons at Duke and has 581 points in a Villanova uniform. During her Wildcat career, Kurz has registered 11 games with at least 20 points, five games with at least 10 rebounds and four double-doubles.

STEADY SCANLON: In her return from a redshirt season a year ago, sophomore center **Heather Scanlon** is providing valuable contributions to the Wildcats this season. Scanlon ranks fourth on the team with 6.2 points per contest and is tied for third with 3.7 rebounds per game. She is shooting .500 (14-28) from the floor, including .600 (6-10) from three-point range. Scanlon also has nine assists and three blocked shots. In three games at the Paradise Jam Classic last week, Scanlon averaged 7.7 points, 4.7 rebounds and 2.0 assists per game, including scoring a career-high 10 points against Wisconsin in the opening game of the tournament.

CONTINUING COMEBACK: Senior forward **Lisa Karcic** continues to work her way back from an injury suffered in the first round of last year's BIG EAST Championship. Karcic is averaging 27.0 minutes per game even as she improves from a physical standpoint and is averaging 8.7 points and 5.8 rebounds per game. Karcic leads the team with 40 three-pointers attempted and in the win over Central Florida had a season-high 14 points thanks to 4-of-7 accuracy from beyond the three-point arc. After scoring just 16 points in the first three games of the season, Karcic has registered three straight games scoring in double figures.

SENSATIONAL SIOBHAN: One of the most unheralded players on the Villanova roster is senior guard **Siobhan O'Connor**. A versatile point guard who is usually seen providing whatever contributions the Wildcats need most on the court, O'Connor is third on the team through six games with 29.2 minutes per contest. She is averaging 5.5 points and 2.8 rebounds per game while ranking second on the squad with 2.2 assists per contest. O'Connor scored a season-high 11 points and made a late game-winning three-pointer at Penn on November 19. In her last game, against Central Florida, O'Connor went 6-of-7 from the foul line and finished with eight points in a 68-50 Wildcat victory.

WELL STOCKED: Villanova enters the 2008-09 season with 10 letterwinners returning from last season, including four starters. The returning starters are senior forwards **Laura Kurz** and **Lisa Karcic** and junior guards **Maria Getty** and **Tia Grant**. Overall, the Wildcats bring back the bulk of their production in nearly every stat category. Villanova returns 76.9 percent of its scoring, 81.6 percent of its rebounding, 82.2 percent of its assists and 79.4 percent of its three-point shooting from last season. In 2007-08, the Wildcats set NCAA single-season records for three-pointers made and attempted.

TRADING RED FOR THE BLUE AND WHITE: Two Villanova players will become active this season after being granted redshirt seasons in 2007-08. Sophomore center **Heather Scanlon** and freshman guard **Sarah Jones** each return to the Wildcats this season. Scanlon averaged 2.1 points and 2.1 rebounds per game as a true freshman in 2006-07 and will be a key presence in the post for Villanova. Jones is a local product capable of playing at the point with strong passing skills and outstanding basketball instincts.

VULIN HIRED AS ASSISTANT COACH: Head coach **Harry Perretta** completed his coaching staff for the 2008-09 season with the appointment of **Heather Vulin** as assistant coach. Vulin comes to the Main Line from Sacred Heart University, where she was an assistant coach from 2002-08. Vulin was the recruiting coordinator from 2004-08 and during her stint with the program the Pioneers amassed a 124-55 overall record and became the first team in the history of the Northeast Conference to post seven straight seasons with at least 18 victories. As a collegiate student-athlete at Minnesota-Morris, Vulin was a four-year letterwinner in basketball and volleyball and earned Academic All-Conference honors in both sports. She earned a degree in Secondary Education at Minnesota-Morris and went on to receive a Master's degree in Education from North Dakota State.

FAMILIAR FACES: Former Villanova standouts **Courtney Davis (Mix)** and **Stacie Witman** both rejoin the team as a part of the women's basketball staff this season. Davis will begin her first season as the Director of Basketball Operations and Witman remains with the program as the Women's Basketball Intern. Davis ranks 16th in school history in scoring with 1,071 points and is also third in program annals in rebounding (869) and sixth in assists (457). She helped lead Villanova to the 2003 BIG EAST title and an Elite Eight appearance in the NCAA Tournament. Witman scored 911 points in her Wildcat career and graduated last season after ranking second in scoring (14.1) and rebounding (5.5) for Villanova.

KURZ EARNS PRESEASON HONOR: Senior forward **Laura Kurz** was named an honorable mention Preseason All-BIG EAST selection at the league's annual preseason Media Day event held at ESPN Zone in New York City. Kurz led Villanova last season with 14.9 points per game, 6.4 rebounds per contest, 48.5 percent shooting from the field and 43.8 percent accuracy from three-point range.

VILLANOVA PICKED 10TH IN BIG EAST PRESEASON POLL:

In a preseason poll of league head coaches, Villanova received 85 points and was selected to finish 10th in the BIG EAST this season. The Wildcats return four starters and 10 letterwinners overall from a team that ranked among the nation's best last year with a +7.0-game turnaround from the previous season. The league's head coaches chose Connecticut to win the league title. The results of the head coaches' poll were as follows:
