BINGHAMTON REPORT: The Bearcats have won two straight entering tonight's game and are 4-4 overall on the season. Binghamton returns three starters from last year's team that finished fifth in the America East Conference and also adds five active newcomers to the roster under first year head coach Nicole Scholl.

On Saturday afternoon in Philadelphia, the Bearcats defeated La Salle, 53-47. Binghamton held the host team to 33 percent shooting and led by as many as 11 points late in the second half before holding on for the win. Senior forward Laura Franceski and junior guard Erica Carter each scored 10 points to pace the Bearcats, who have tallied three of their four wins on the road this season. Binghamton shot 44 percent (20-45) from the field in the game, hit 10-of-13 (77%) free throws and outrebounded the Explorers, 35-26.

Carter is the only Bearcat averaging in double figures this season and scores 11.5 points per game. Junior guard Muffy Sadler ranks second on the squad with 8.8 points per contest and is shooting a team-best 52.3 percent from the floor, including 14-of-26 (54%) three-pointers. Binghamton has forced its opponents into 20.0 turnovers per game. The Bearcats have used the same starting lineup in all eight games this season, with Carter, Holmes and Sadler in the backcourt and the tandem of Franceski and freshman Viive Rebane in the post.

BINGHAMTON HEAD COACH NICOLE SCHOLL: After three seasons as the associate head coach of the Bearcats and six years as an assistant before that, the 2008-09 season marks the first as head coach for Nicole Scholl, who first came to Binghamton in 1999.

During her tenure as an assistant coach with the Bearcats, Scholl helped oversee the Bearcats transition from a powerhouse Division III program to a Division I school with membership in the America East Conference. Binghamton went 19-9 in its first Division I season in 2001-02 and two years later won 17 games and entered the America East Championship as the No. 2 seed.

Before joining the Bearcat program, Scholl spent three years as an assistant at North Dakota State, at the time one of the top Division II programs in the nation. The Bison won a national championship in Scholl's first season with the program and made their 12th and 13th straight NCAA Tournament appearances in Scholl's first two seasons.

Scholl is a 1994 graduate of Moorhead State (Minn.), where she was a two-time captain and received honorable mention All-America accolades as a senior.

After 30 years as head coach of the Villanova women's basketball program, Harry Perretta has established himself as one of the most respected and knowledgeable coaches in the country. A true teacher both on and off the court, Perretta strives to have a positive influence on his student-athletes not only as basketball players, but also as people.

In his 31-year Villanova career, Perretta has tallied a career record of 557-333. His 557 wins place him 21st on the winningest active collegiate coaching list, and ranks him as the all-time winningest

coach in the history of Villanova basketball for both men and women. Since the beginning of the 2000-01 season Perretta has compiled an impressive 162-97 record.

During the 2007-08 season, Perretta led the Wildcats to one of the top turnarounds in the country with a 17-16 record. A year earlier, Villanova tallied an 8-21 mark with a young and inexperienced squad. In addition to the 17 wins, the Wildcats earned a bid to the WNIT, where they advanced to the third round. This marks the eighth postseason appearance in the last nine years. After playing in the 2000 WNIT, Villanova went to four consecutive NCAA Tournaments from 2001-2004 before playing in the WNIT in 2005, 2006 and 2008. Also, last season, Perretta guided junior forward Laura Kurz to second team All-BIG EAST honors.

Perretta registered his 14th career 20-win season in 2005-06 by leading the Wildcats to a 21-11 record. This was the fifth time in six years that Perretta led his team to a 20-win campaign. Villanova earned a WNIT berth, giving the Wildcats their seventh-straight postseason appearance. Also, in 2005-06, Perretta coached senior forward Liad Suez-Karni to first team All-Big East accolades.

In 2004-05, Perretta became the 26th Division I women's basketball head coach to win 500 games when the Wildcats defeated Pittsburgh, 70-49, on February 2. Villanova finished the season with a 19-12 overall record and qualified for the postseason for the sixth-straight season with a WNIT berth.

One year earlier, Perretta led his team to a fourth-straight 20-win campaign and a fourth consecutive NCAA Tournament berth where the Wildcats advanced to the second round. Perretta also coached his squad to a second-straight Philadelphia Big Five title in 2003-04. For his efforts, he was named Big Five Coach of the Year for the second consecutive season.

The 2002-03 season was a special one for Perretta and the Wildcats. In addition to an impressive 28-6 overall record and a 12-4 Big East Conference mark, Perretta led the Wildcats to their third Big East Conference Tournament championship and first since 1987 with an improbable 52-48 upset over previously unbeaten Connecticut. The win snapped Connecticut's NCAA Division I women's basketball record of 70-straight victories and ended Connecticut's streak of nine-straight conference tournament championships.

The 28 wins recorded in 2002-03 is the second most victories in school history. Villanova was rewarded for its season by earning a No. 2 seed in the 2002-03 NCAA Tournament which is the highest seed ever for a Philadelphia area women's basketball team. In the NCAA Tournament, the Wildcats recorded wins over St. Francis (Pa.), George Washington and Colorado and advanced to the Elite Eight for the first time in the program's history. Also, during the 2002-03 season, Villanova went 4-0 in the Philadelphia Big Five to capture the City Series championship and he was named the Big Five Coach of the Year. Under Perretta's guidance, senior guard Trish Juhline led the Big East in scoring and garnered first

team All-Big East acclaim for the second-straight year, while senior forward Katie Davis was named second team All-Big East and junior guard/forward Courtney Mix was a Big East Honorable Mention Team selection. In addition, Juhline was named the Big East Tournament's Most Outstanding Player.

In 2001-02, Perretta guided Villanova to a 20-11 mark and a trip to the NCAA Tournament. In the NCAA's, Villanova received the No. 9 seed in the west region where they defeated Pepperdine in the first round before losing to No. 1 seed Oklahoma in the second round. Under Perretta's tutelage, junior guard Trish Juhline became the first Wildcat since 1994-95 to be named first team All-Big East. Perretta also helped senior point guard Mimi Riley earn Big East Honorable Mention acclaim in 2001-02.

The 2000-01 season was a memorable one for Perretta, as he led his team to a 22-9 overall record and a berth in the NCAA Tournament where they advanced to the second round. In a 60-55 win over Temple on Dec. 2, 2000, Perretta won his 400th career game and with the 61-45 victory over Providence on Feb. 24, 2001. He became the all-time winningest coach in the history of Villanova basketball for both men and women with career win number 414. For his efforts in 2000-01, Perretta was named the Philadelphia Big Five Co-Coach of the Year. Also that season, Perretta helped senior center Brandi Barnes earn third team All-Big East distinction and sophomore guard Trish Juhline garner Big East Honorable Mention acclaim. In the Philadelphia Big Five, freshman forward Courtney Mix was named Rookie of the Year.

In 1995-96, Perretta led his team to a 21-7 record and added to his already impressive resume when he earned Big East Coach of the Year honors along with the Philadelphia Big Five Coach-of-the-Year award. Already the winningest coach in Villanova women's basketball history, on January 8, 1995 against the Georgetown Hoyas, Perretta earned his 300th career win at the age of 39. At the end of the 1994-95 season, he was named the Philadelphia Big 5 Coach of the Year.

The dean of the Big East and Big 5 coaches, Perretta has brought the Wildcats national respect and success during his tenure at Villanova. Always a crowd favorite wherever he goes, he is one of the most animated and vocal coaches in the country, continually instructing his players during the course of a game. Year-in and year-out, his teams are feared for their aggressive play, disciplined style, defensive prowess and pre-game preparations of an opponent.

A teacher of basketball, Perretta also realizes the importance of the overall college experience. He and his staff follow closely each player's academic progress, and in his 31 years at Villanova, 99 percent of the student-athletes who has stayed all four years has received her degree. Perretta is also a firm believer of using the basketball experience to teach his players lessons on life. Upon graduation, it is a sure bet that Perretta's players will leave Villanova as better basketball players, in addition to being prepared to be a success in whatever career avenue they choose.

During his career on the Main Line, he has led the Wildcats to eight NCAA Tournament appearances, national rankings in the Associated Press poll, Big East regular season and tournament championships in both 1985-86 and 1986-87, the 2003 Big East Tournament title, seven outright and four shared Big 5 titles, and fourteen 20-win or better seasons. In addition, one of his players, Shelly Pennefather, was recognized in 1987 as the nation's top women's basketball player, winning the Margaret Wade Trophy and earning Kodak All-America honors.

"This program is something I feel is my own, my own personal project," stated Perretta. "When I got here, there wasn't much to start with. Yet, all the players we have brought in have graduated, we've had All-Americans and gone to the Final Four (1982). The fact that we are considered one of the better teams in the country over the last 30 years makes me proud. I can honestly say that I wouldn't want to coach anywhere but Villanova."

Perretta began his career on the Main Line in 1978 at the age of 22, the youngest coach ever to head a women's program at Villanova. In his first season, he led the 'Cats to a 17-8 record and was a finalist for the AIAW small college coach of the year. During his career, Perretta and the Wildcats have had many highlights, including reaching the Final Four of the AIAW in 1982. The 1982-83 season saw Villanova begin play in NCAA Division I and in the Big East Conference. Since joining the Big East in 1982, Perretta has compiled a 197-162 conference record.

VILLANOVA (4-4) AT BINGHAMTON (4-4)

WEDNESDAY, DECEMBER 10 (7:00 PM), VESTAL, N.Y. (EVENTS CENTER)

LAST TIME OUT: Villanova started the game with a 23-7 run in the first 13 minutes and eventually made five free throws in the final 1:02 to hold off a late rally by Lehigh in a 58-52 win at The Pavilion on Sunday afternoon. The visiting Mountain Hawks cut the Wildcat lead to three on five separate occasions in the closing minutes but never got any closer as Villanova emerged victorious in its first home game in more than three weeks. Senior forward **Laura Kurz** registered her second straight double-double with 19 points and a career-high 15 rebounds and senior guard **Siobhan O'Connor** added 11 points, six rebounds, four assists and a steal. O'Connor scored six of her points in the final two minutes, including a jumper as the shot clock expired with 1:47 remaining that put the Wildcats in front 53-48. Villanova committed a season-low six turnovers and recorded an assist on 16 of its 21 made field goals. Junior guard **Maria Getty** matched O'Connor with a game-high four assists and also added seven points, four rebounds and two steals.

TURNING 40: The 2008-09 campaign marks the 40th season of women's basketball at Villanova. The Wildcats played their first varsity season back in 1969-70, when the team posted a 4-6 record. The program currently has an all-time record of 640-387 (.623). Last season the Wildcats hosted Connecticut in the 1000th contest in program history. Villanova has 14, 20-win seasons in its history, all under 31st year head coach **Harry Perretta**, who has led the Wildcats to 557 wins in his tenure on the Main Line.

VISITING VESTAL: Tonight's game will be the third meeting between Villanova and Binghamton and the second to take place in the Events Center. Exactly two years ago to the day the teams met for the first time here and the Wildcats posted a 59-40 win. Last season the Bearcats visited The Pavilion on a snowy evening in December and were defeated, 78-51, by Villanova.

LIMITED HISTORY VERSUS THE AMERICA EAST: Villanova enters tonight's game with a 6-2 record all-time against teams that currently play in the America East Conference. In addition to a pair of wins over Binghamton in the last two seasons, the Wildcats are 2-1 against Boston University, 1-1 against Maine and 1-0 against New Hampshire. Prior to the recent games against Binghamton, the most recent game against a current America East foe was a 70-61 loss to Maine at the start of the 1995-96 season.

HEADING HOME: Once tonight's game is in the books, Villanova will have played seven of its first nine games of the season away from home, including a Thanksgiving break trip to the U.S. Virgin Islands for the Paradise Jam Classic. The Wildcats will play their next four games at home, however, with dates against Temple (Dec. 20), Delaware (Dec. 22), Sacred Heart (Dec. 28) and Monmouth (Dec. 31) on tap at The Pavilion. Villanova does not go on the road again after tonight's game until it opens BIG EAST Conference play on Saturday, January 3 at Cincinnati.

THE KYLE CONNECTION: Wednesday night's game will be a homecoming game for junior guard **Kyle Dougherty**, who attended Owego Free Academy and is a native of nearby Sayre, Pa. As a scholastic standout, Dougherty was named a four-time All-State performer and was chosen as the *Press and Sun Bulletin* Player of the Year three times.

SPECIAL K: Senior forward **Laura Kurz** leads Villanova this season with 17.1 points and 9.5 rebounds per game, marks that rank her 11th and second, respectively, in the BIG EAST Conference. Kurz was named to the BIG EAST weekly honor roll this week after a pair of games in which she combined for 47 points and 29 rebounds. Last week began with Kurz posting 28 points and 14 boards at Saint Joseph's and ended with her 19-point, 15-rebound effort in a win over Lehigh. Both rebounding totals were new career highs for Kurz, who tallied consecutive double-doubles for the first time in her career. Kurz also leads Villanova in blocks (14), is second in assists (18) and third in steals (four).

CLOSING IN ON 1,000: **Laura Kurz** needs just 14 more points to reach the 1,000-point career scoring mark. Her current collegiate total of 986 points includes her freshman and sophomore seasons at Duke University, where she scored a total of 358 points. Kurz is also going to have a chance to reach 1,000 points just in a Villanova uniform. She currently has 628 points as a Wildcat (491 last season, 137 this season). With 22 regular season games remaining and at least one game guaranteed in the BIG EAST Tournament, Kurz would have to average 16.2 points per game the rest of the way to reach 1,000 points at Villanova. Her current season scoring average is 17.1 points per game.

SENSATIONAL SIOBHAN: Senior guard **Siobhan O'Connor** stepped up late in the game against Lehigh to help Villanova forge its first home win of the year. O'Connor scored six of her 11 points in the final 1:47 of the contest, including a jumper as the shot clock expired with 1:47 to play that stretched the Wildcats lead to 53-48. She also made four free throws in the final minute of play to secure the win. O'Connor tied a season high with 11 points in the game and also added six rebounds and four assists. She is averaging 5.9 points, 3.1 rebounds and a team-high 2.4 assists per game this season.

BLOCK PARTY: Through the first eight games of the season, the Wildcats have had a big advantage over the opposition in the area of blocked shots. Villanova has collected 37 blocks thus far (4.6/game) while its opponents have just 11 blocked shots (1.4/game). In comparison, senior forward **Laura Kurz** has 14 rejections for the Wildcats, three more than the first eight opponents have against Villanova. Kurz has blocked three shots in a game on two different occasions this year.

HELPING HANDS: In Sunday afternoon's win over Lehigh, the Wildcats recorded a season-high 16 assists on 21 field goals en route to a 58-52 victory. The efficient offense displayed in the game is a trademark of Harry Perretta teams and for the season Villanova has recorded an assist on 106 of 160 field goals (66 percent). The team has five different players with at least 14 assists, including senior guard **Siobhan O'Connor** with a team-high 19 helpers (2.4/game). Following O'Connor is senior forward **Laura Kurz** (18), junior guards **Maria Getty** and **Tia Grant** (16) and senior forward **Lisa Karcic** (14). Opponents of the Wildcats have registered an assist on just 65 of 157 field goals (41 percent) for the season.

GOOD HANDS PEOPLE: Another familiar component of Villanova women's basketball was on showcase in Sunday's game against Lehigh, as the Wildcats committed a season-low six turnovers in a 58-52 win. This was the first time all year that Villanova posted a single-digit total in the turnover column, a feat achieved 12 times in 33 games last season. The Wildcats led the entire nation last season with just 11.9 turnovers committed per game.

DEFENSIVE DOINGS: One of the bright spots for Villanova this season has been the play of its defense. The Wildcats have held an opponent to no more than 52 points five times in eight games this year. Villanova enters today's game ranked sixth among Big East teams with a defensive scoring average of 54.0 points and even that figure is inflated by the team's overtime game against La Salle and triple overtime marathon against Saint Joseph's. The Wildcat defensive scoring average through the first 40 minutes of games is just 50.8, which would rank second in the league.

SWIEZYNSKI CONTRIBUTES: Sophomore guard/forward **Amanda Swiezynski** had her best overall game of the season on Sunday against Lehigh. In a career-high 19 minutes played, Swiezynski tallied three points, three rebounds, three assists and a blocked shot in a 58-52 win. The three assists tied her career high. In seven games on the year, Swiezynski is shooting 50 percent (5-10) from the field, including 50 percent (3-6) from three-point range.

TRIPLE THE FUN: Villanova is once again making a name for itself from behind the three-point arc. Last season the Wildcats set NCAA Division I single-season records for three-pointers made and attempted in a season. With regards to the number of three-pointers attempted, Villanova is ahead of last year's pace from the standpoint of number of attempts per game. In 2007-08, the Wildcats averaged 26 three-point attempts per game. So far this season, the team has taken an average of 28.1 shots per game from beyond the arc. In the season opener against La Salle, Villanova established a new school record with 44 attempted three-pointers. The Wildcats have attempted at least 30 three-pointers four times in eight games, including each of the last three outings.

THREES FOR FOUR: The three-point shooting attack for Villanova this season has centered around four players who have each attempted at least 28 shots from long range. Senior forward **Lisa Karcic** leads the Wildcats with 54 three-pointers attempted and junior guard **Maria Getty** is close behind with 43 attempts. Senior guard **Siobhan O'Connor** has fired 30 three-point shots and senior forward **Laura Kurz** has taken 28 triples. Last season, these four players accounted for roughly two-thirds of the made three-pointers by the Wildcats.

BIG DISPARITY: Although the Wildcats have made a large number of three-pointers so far - 65 in eight games (8.1 per game) - the team is not shooting for the same percentage that it is accustomed to from behind the arc. Through its first eight games, Villanova has made only 29 percent (65-of-225) from long range. On the other hand, the Wildcats have been very effective finding open space in the lane and are shooting 50 percent (95-190) on two-point shots.

STAT SHEET STUFFER: Senior forward **Lisa Karcic** is always one of the most versatile players on the court for Villanova and this year ranks among the top three players on the team in seven different categories. Karcic currently is tied for the team lead in free throw percentage (13-17, .765) and has taken a team-high 54 three-pointers; she is second in rebounds (5.6/game), three-pointers made (13) and steals (6) and ranks third in scoring (7.8/game) and blocks (6). Karcic has done all this even while she continues to recover from an injury sustained late last season and has played an average of 27.5 minutes per game.

STEADY GETTY: Junior guard **Maria Getty** continues to lead Villanova in field goal percentage (30-64, .469) this season and is second on the team in scoring with 10.6 points per game. She has made a team-high 18 three-pointers and also shoots .419 (18-43) from behind the arc. Getty racked up at least 14 points in five of the first six games, including a career-high tying 17 in a win over Central Florida in the final game of the Paradise Jam Classic in the Virgin Islands. Getty's contributions go well behind her scoring, though, as evidenced by her performance in Sunday's, 58-52, win over Lehigh. Getty scored seven points in the game but also added four rebounds, four assists and two steals to help Villanova win at home for the first time in two tries this season.

WELL STOCKED: Villanova enters the 2008-09 season with 10 letterwinners returning from last season, including four starters. The returning starters are senior forwards **Laura Kurz** and **Lisa Karcic** and junior guards **Maria Getty** and **Tia Grant**. Overall, the Wildcats bring back the bulk of their production in nearly every stat category. Villanova returns 76.9 percent of its scoring, 81.6 percent of its rebounding, 82.2 percent of its assists and 79.4 percent of its three-point shooting from last season. In 2007-08, the Wildcats set NCAA single-season records for three-pointers made and attempted.

TRADING RED FOR THE BLUE AND WHITE: Two Villanova players will become active this season after being granted redshirt seasons in 2007-08. Sophomore center Heather Scanlon and freshman guard Sarah Jones each return to the Wildcats this season. Scanlon averaged 2.1 points and 2.1 rebounds per game as a true freshman in 2006-07 and will be a key presence in the post for Villanova. Jones is a local product capable of playing at the point with strong passing skills and outstanding basketball instincts.

VULIN HIRED AS ASSISTANT COACH: Head coach **Harry Perretta** completed his coaching staff for the 2008-09 season with the appointment of **Heather Vulin** as assistant coach. Vulin comes to the Main Line from Sacred Heart University, where she was an assistant coach from 2002-08. Vulin was the recruiting coordinator from 2004-08 and during her stint with the program the Pioneers amassed a 124-55 overall record and became the first team in the history of the Northeast Conference to post seven straight seasons with at least 18 victories. As a collegiate student-athlete at Minnesota-Morris, Vulin was a four-year letterwinner in basketball and volleyball and earned Academic All-Conference honors in both sports. She earned a degree in Secondary Education at Minnesota-Morris and went on to receive a Master's degree in Education from North Dakota State.

FAMILIAR FACES: Former Villanova standouts **Courtney Davis (Mix)** and **Stacie Witman** both rejoin the team as a part of the women's basketball staff this season. Davis will begin her first season as the Director of Basketball Operations and Witman remains with the program as the Women's Basketball Intern. Davis ranks 16th in school history in scoring with 1,071 points and is also third in program annals in rebounding (869) and sixth in assists (457). She helped lead Villanova to the 2003 BIG EAST title and an Elite Eight appearance in the NCAA Tournament. Witman scored 911 points in her Wildcat career and graduated last season after ranking second in scoring (14.1) and rebounding (5.5) for Villanova.

KURZ EARNS PRESEASON HONOR: Senior forward Laura Kurz was named an honorable mention Preseason All-BIG EAST selection at the league's annual preseason Media Day event held at ESPN Zone in New York City. Kurz led Villanova last season with 14.9 points per game, 6.4 rebounds per contest, 48.5 percent shooting from the field and 43.8 percent accuracy from three-point range.

VILLANOVA PICKED 10TH IN BIG EAST PRESEASON POLL: In a preseason poll of league head coaches, Villanova received 85 points and was selected to finish 10th in the BIG EAST this season. The Wildcats return four starters and 10 letterwinners overall from a team that ranked among the nation's best last year with a +7.0-game turnaround from the previous season. The league's head coaches chose Connecticut to win the league title. The results of the head coaches' poll were as follows:

Villanova and Saint Joseph's Play Three Overtimes in longest game in women's Big Five History

Villanova and Saint Joseph's played the longest game in their respective program histories as well as the first-ever triple overtime game in the history of women's Philadelphia Big Five play on December 4 in the Gallagher Center at Philadelphia University. Below are some of the rare occurrences that the game produced.

TEAM HIGHLIGHTS

- The nine-point margin in the final score was the widest that the two teams were separated by in the entire game. Villanova led by as many as eight points late in the first half.
- Prior to the third overtime period, Saint Joseph's largest lead in the game had been four points and that came when the Hawks led 4-0 in the first three minutes.
- Villanova led for more than 38 minutes in the game. After taking its first lead of the contest, 8-6 with 13:30 left in the first half, the Wildcats did not trail again until the final minute of regulation.
- The Wildcats held leads of as many as four points in each of the first two overtime periods. Saint Joseph's did not lead by more than two points in either of the first two overtimes.
- The two teams combined to go 1-of-12 from the field in the third overtime. The first points in the period came on a three-pointer by Saint Joseph's just under two minutes into the stanza. The final six points scored by the Hawks in the frame came on free throws.
- Despite just one field goal in the third and final overtime, Saint Joseph's outscored Villanova, 9-0, in the period thanks to six free throws. The Hawks wound up with a 14-5 scoring margin from the free throw line in the game, an edge that fittingly matched the difference in the final score.
- Ironically, the longest overtime game in Villanova history also wound up being the second most lopsided overtime game ever played by the Wildcats. Of the 28 overtime games Villanova has ever played, only one was decided by more than nine points. That came in a 77-66 win at Connecticut during the 1984-85 season. The Wildcats most lopsided overtime loss previously was a six-point defeat at home against Georgetown, 64-58, during the 1989-90 campaign.
- There were a relatively modest 34 fouls called in the lengthy contest and just two players fouled out, both from Villanova. There were 21 fouls whistled against the Wildcats and 13 against Saint Joseph's.

INDIVIDUAL HIGHLIGHTS

- Junior guard **Maria Getty** scored Villanova's first points of the game on a three-pointer just over four minutes into the contest. She did not score again in the game despite playing 42 minutes.
- Saint Joseph's took the lead for good on a three-pointer in the third overtime period by Jenna Loschiavo, who did not make another field goal in the entire game despite playing all 55 minutes to set a Hawks single-game record.
- Senior forward **Laura Kurz** set a Villanova record by playing 52 minutes in the game. Four other Wildcats played at least 40 minutes, with sophomore center **Heather Scanlon** and senior guard **Siobhan O'Connor** establishing career highs with 42 and 41 minutes played, respectively.
- Saint Joseph's used just two subs in the game and all of its starters played at least 43 minutes. Four of its starters played at least 50 minutes, including 55 for Jenna Loschiavo and 54 for Mary Kate McDade.
