Getting In The Game...Things To Know Before Kickoff

- ▶ First and foremost among the Villanova story lines entering Friday afternoon's game at Georgetown is the opportunity for the Wildcats to secure a spot in the BIG EAST Championship which begins later this month. Villanova can automatically clinch a spot by beating or tying the Hoyas on Friday. If the Wildcats lose to Georgetown they would also need to have Rutgers lose their final game, which will be played at home Friday night versus Seton Hall. From a mathematical standpoint, Villanova can finish anywhere from fourth to sixth in the National Division standings, with the top five teams earning a conference tournament berth.
- ▶ Senior forward **Katie Ryan (Wayne, N.J.)** was named to the weekly BIG EAST Honor Roll on Monday afternoon. This is the third time this season and the ninth time in her career that Ryan has received weekly recognition from the league. She scored three goals last week in road games against DePaul and Notre Dame.
- ▶ In two games last week senior forward **Katie Ryan (Wayne, N.J.)** scored the 40th goal of her career and also became the third player in school history to reach 100 career points. Ryan currently has offensive totals of 40 goals, 22 assists and 102 points in her career. She ranks third in program history in both goals and points and is tied for seventh in assists. Earlier this season Ryan set a school record when she scored her 15th career game-winning goal.
- ▶ Entering play against Georgetown on Friday afternoon Villanova is led offensively by the trio of senior forward **Katie Ryan (Wayne, N.J.)**, redshirt freshman midfielder **Stephanie Myers (Downingtown, Pa.)** and junior forward **Heidi Sabatura (Lawrenceville, N.J.)**. Ryan leads the team with 29 points (12 goals, five assists), while Myers (seven goals, five assists) and Sabatura (six goals, seven assists) each have 19 points. This year marks the first time since 1987 that the Wildcats have at least three players with 19 or more points.
- ▶ Sophomore goalkeeper **Jami Kranich (Hamden, Conn.)** has continued her excellent play in the net during the second half of this season. Kranich made six saves at Notre Dame on Sunday while making countless more big plays in front of the goal to thwart potential scoring opportunities by the Fighting Irish. Kranich ranks second among all goalkeepers in the nation in minutes played (1684:03). For the season she owns a 1.55 goals-against average with a .707 save percentage. Kranich has made 70 saves and allowed 29 goals in 18 games on the year. Her 70 saves are the sixth most in the BIG EAST Conference, and she also ranks seventh in conference-only games with 41 saves in 10 league contests.

VILLANOVA WOMEN'S SOCCER: NEWS FOR THE WEEK OF OCTOBER 17-23, 2011

VILLANOVA UPDATE: Entering the final regular season game at Georgetown on Friday afternoon, Villanova has an 8-8-2 overall record and a 4-6 mark in BIG EAST play. With 12 points in the regular season conference standings the Wildcats are tied for fourth place in the BIG EAST National Division along with Seton Hall, one point ahead of Rutgers. Mathematically, Villanova can finish either fourth, fifth or sixth in the final division standings. The top five teams in the division earn a berth to the BIG EAST Championship that begins next week.

PLAYOFF SCENARIOS: The Wildcats are in position to control their own destiny in terms of clinching a berth in the BIG EAST Championship. A win or a tie against Georgetown on Friday afternoon would automatically clinch a playoff spot for Villanova, although the following scenarios could all come into play based on the possible outcomes of Friday's games between the Wildcats and the Hoyas, as well as Seton Hall and Rutgers.

Scenario 1: If Villanova wins on Friday...

Villanova clinches a playoff berth and can finish either fourth or fifth in the division
Villanova finishes fourth with a Rutgers win or tie against Seton Hall
Villanova finishes fifth with a Seton Hall win

Scenario 2: If Villanova ties on Friday...

Villanova clinches a playoff berth and also clinches the No. 5 seed in the division

Scenario 3: if Villanova loses on Friday...

Villanova clinches a playoff berth only if Seton Hall defeats Rutgers
In this scenario Villanova is the No. 5 seed in the division

RYAN EARNS HONOR ROLL NOD: Senior forward **Katie Ryan (Wayne, N.J.)** was named to the weekly BIG EAST Honor Roll on Monday afternoon, marking the third time this season and ninth time in her career that Ryan has received recognition in the weekly awards from the league. In road games against DePaul and Notre Dame last week, Ryan tallied three goals to increase her season total to 12 scores.

In a 3-2 win at DePaul on October 14, Ryan notched her second multi-goal game of the season. She scored the first two goals of the game for the Wildcats and both of those tallies gave Villanova the lead. In the process, Ryan also became the third player in school history to reach 100 points for her career.

Ryan continued her hot streak in a 3-1 loss to Notre Dame on Sunday afternoon, when she scored in the 62nd minute to tie the game at 1-1 before the Fighting Irish eventually netted two goals in the last six minutes to go on to the victory. Ryan scored the first Villanova goal in a road game against Notre Dame in the Wildcats last five trips to South Bend, as the last Villanova goal at Alumni Stadium or its predecessor came back in 2001. The goal Ryan scored was also the 40th of her career.

BACK-TO-BACK MILESTONES: As the previous note alluded to, senior forward **Katie Ryan (Wayne, N.J.)** reached a pair of career milestones last weekend. First up, she reached 100 career points thanks to a pair of goals in a 3-2 win at DePaul. Ryan also notched her 40th career goal in a 3-1 loss at Notre Dame.

Ryan has currently played in 76 career games with 60 starts and her career totals are 40 goals, 22 assists and 102 points. She ranks third in program history in both goals and points and is tied for seventh in assists. Earlier this season, Ryan established a new school record for game-winning goals with the 15th game-winner of her career. She also ranks second in the Villanova record book with 203 shots.

TOP 10 LIST: Senior forward **Katie Ryan (Wayne, N.J.)** is one of 11 active players in the nation who have at least 100 points in their collegiate careers. She is tied for 10th place on that list with her 102 career points (40 goals, 22 assists). Below is the complete list of players in the nation with 100 or more points in their careers.

SERIES AGAINST GEORGETOWN: Villanova leads the all-time series with the Hoyas by an 11-4-2 margin, although more recently Georgetown has won the past three meetings and outscored the Wildcats by a count of 10-1 in that span. The last win for the Wildcats was a 1-0 triumph on September 21, 2007 when a goal by Kelly Eagan midway through the second half accounted for the game winner.

The last game between these teams took place on September 1, 2010 at the West Campus Soccer Complex when the Hoyas produced a 3-1 victory. All four goals in the game were scored in the first half.

MILESTONE FOR SABATURA: Junior forward **Heidi Sabatura (Lawrenceville, N.J.)** became the ninth player in school history to accumulate 20 or more career assists when she set up the lone Villanova goal in a 3-1 loss to Notre Dame last Sunday. Sabatura, who leads the Wildcats in assists with seven this season, now has exactly 20 helpers in her career and holds sole possession of ninth place in the program's record book. Of the nine players with at least 20 assists, Sabatura is the second to reach the mark this season. Senior forward **Katie Ryan (Wayne, N.J.)** accomplished the feat earlier in the year.

TAMING THE TOP 50: In the latest RPI rankings released by the NCAA earlier this week, Villanova came in at No. 103 out of 330 teams that make up Division I. To this point in the year the Wildcats are 2-2-1 against teams that are currently in the top 50 of the RPI, including wins over No. 26 West Virginia and No. 32 Georgia. In addition, Villanova is just one of two teams from the BIG EAST National Division to post a non-conference win over a top 50 team. Notre Dame beat Wisconsin (No. 49) earlier in the season.

TRIPLE THREAT: Most of the offense for Villanova this season has come from the trio of senior forward **Katie Ryan (Wayne, N.J.)**, junior forward **Heidi Sabatura (Lawrenceville, N.J.)** and redshirt freshman midfielder **Stephanie Myers (Downingtown, Pa.)**. Ryan currently leads the team with 29 points (12 goals, five assists) while Myers (seven goals, five assists) and Sabatura (six goals, seven assists) are tied for second on the squad with 19 points apiece. This season marks the first time since 1987 that the Wildcats have had three offensive players with 19 or more points. During the 1987 campaign Villanova had four players total 20 points or more on the year.

2011 SEASON NEWS AND NOTES

October 16: Notre Dame 3, Villanova 1 (Post-Game Notes)

Senior forward **Katie Ryan (Wayne, N.J.)** scored for Villanova in the 62nd minute, tying the score 1-1 at the time before Notre Dame went on to put two goals on the board in the final six minutes of an eventual 3-1 victory. Prior to Ryan's goal, the Wildcats had been shut out in their last four road games against the Fighting Irish. The last Villanova goal at Notre Dame came in 2001 when Quinn Sellers scored in the 87th minute of a 2-1 overtime loss. The only previous goal for the Wildcats in a road game against the Fighting Irish came in 1996 when Amy Poplawski scored in the 60th minute of a 10-1 loss.

During the game senior forward **Katie Ryan (Wayne, N.J.)** became the third player in Villanova history to reach the plateau of 40 career goals. She finished the game with career totals of 40 goals, 22 assists and 102 points. Ryan is third in school history in goals and points, as well as tied for seventh in assists. She is also the Wildcats all-time record holder with 15 career game-winning goals and is second all-time with 203 shots.

October 14: Villanova 3, DePaul 2 (Post-Game Notes)

Villanova had lost its previous nine road games against BIG EAST opponents prior to the 3-2 win over DePaul. The victory also improved the Wildcats to 4-0 all-time on the road against the Blue Demons dating back to the 2005 season when DePaul joined the league. Overall, Villanova is 7-0 against the Blue Demons, including a 3-0 mark at home and a 4-0 record on the road in head-to-head meetings.

Senior forward **Katie Ryan (Wayne, N.J.)** became the third player in school history to reach 100 career points thanks to her two goals in this game. Ryan had exactly 100 points (39 goals, 22 assists) as of the end of the game.

Junior forward **Heidi Sabatura (Lawrenceville, N.J.)** scored her sixth career game-winning goal in this game, moving within one game-winner of entering the program's all-time top 10 in the category. Sabatura has three game-winning goals this season, with those tallies coming at Georgia State (Aug. 26), versus Cincinnati (Oct. 9) and in this contest against DePaul.

October 10: Jami Kranich Earns Spt on BIG EAST Honor Roll

It was fitting recognition for sophomore goalkeeper **Jami Kranich (Hamden, Conn.)** to be named to the weekly BIG EAST Honor Roll on October 10, the first weekly honor of her career. Kranich has steadily improved her play in the net this season and came off her best game of the season before earning the honor roll nod.

Kranich delivered her first shutout of the season in a 1-0 win over Cincinnati one day earlier, while making six saves in the process. All six of those saves protected the 1-0 lead for the Wildcats, with no stop being bigger than her save of a penalty kick in the 15th minute. It was her second career save of a penalty kick in game action. Kranich also made six saves in a 3-2, double-overtime loss to Louisville on October 7. The game-winning goal scored by the Cardinals in the second extra period deflected off of a defensive player and into the net.

October 9: Villanova 1, Cincinnati 0 (Post-Game Notes)

It was Senior Day at the West Campus Soccer Complex and in a ceremony prior to the game Villanova honored its upcoming graduating class of seniors **Lauren McCoy (Spotsylvania, Va.)**, **Katy Nagy (Bellmore, N.Y.)**, **Erin Ryan (Doylestown, Pa.)**, **Katie Ryan (Wayne, N.J.)** and **Megan Verdeur (Levittown, Pa.)**. The senior class has currently been a part of 37 victories in their careers and the group is 23-10-5 (.671) at home. The 1-0 win over Cincinnati also improved the Wildcats to 19-8-1 (.696) all-time on Senior Day.

The only goal of the 1-0 victory for Villanova was scored by junior forward **Heidi Sabatura (Lawrenceville, N.J.)** just 4:32 into the contest. This marked the earliest in a game that the Wildcats have scored a game-winning goal since a 1-0 win at home over Connecticut on September 29, 2006. In that contest, Nikki Mabery scored the game's only goal just 1:18 into the contest.

Villanova registered its first and so far only shutout of the season with the 1-0 victory. Sophomore goalkeeper **Jami Kranich (Hamden, Conn.)** made six saves and posted the fourth shutout of her career. Kranich made all six of her saves after the Wildcats had already grabbed a 1-0 lead. None of her stops was bigger than her save on a penalty kick in the 15th minute. It was the second career PK save in game action for Kranich.

The victory improved Villanova to 4-0-1 at home all-time against the Bearcats, with all four wins coming since Cincinnati joined the BIG EAST before the 2005 season. The tie was a 0-0 draw on October 14, 1984 at Villanova Stadium during the second season of Wildcats varsity women's soccer.

October 7: Louisville 3, Villanova 2 (2ot) (Post-Game Notes)

Villanova is 1-1-2 in overtime games this season. All four of the team's games that have required extra time have gone to the second and last overtime period. The first three overtime games of the season for the Wildcats all came in non-conference play.

Redshirt freshman midfielder **Stephanie Myers (Downingtown, Pa.)** registered her second multi-goal game of the season by scoring both Villanova goals. Her first career two-goal game was earlier this year in a 3-2 win at Georgia. As of the end of this game, Myers had scored at least one goal in three straight contests and had a total of four scores in that span.

The loss was the first for the Wildcats in a home game against the Cardinals and leaves Villanova with a 4-3 all-time mark against Louisville. The Wildcats are 3-1 at home against the Cardinals and 1-2 on the road.

October 3: Katie Ryan Honored as National and BIG EAST Player of the Week

Following the best weekend of her collegiate career senior forward **Katie Ryan (Wayne, N.J.)** was named the BIG EAST Offensive Player of the Week and also received multiple national honors. Ryan totaled three goals, three assists and nine points in consecutive victories over Pittsburgh and West Virginia, wins that snapped what had been a six-game losing streak.

Ryan tallied a goal and an assist in a 3-1 win over Pittsburgh and then erupted for two goals and two assists in a 4-1 upset of No. 22 West Virginia. After the Wildcats fell into an early 1-0 deficit Ryan brought Villanova back with two straight goals less than three minutes apart to send the team well on its way to the big win. Ryan also had two assists in the second half and played a part in all four Wildcat goals in the game. The six points she registered against the Mountaineers were a career high, and the game is one of five multi-goal games Ryan has had in her career.

October 3: Stephanie Ryan Garners BIG EAST Honor Roll Nod

Redshirt freshman midfielder **Stephanie Myers (Downingtown, Pa.)** was named to the weekly BIG EAST Honor Roll on October 3 after consecutive wins by Villanova over Pittsburgh (3-1) and West Virginia (4-1).

Myers scored the first game-winning goal of her collegiate career in the win over Pitt, breaking a 1-1 halftime tie with a go-ahead goal just over two minutes into the start of the second half. She continued her run of success this season in the 4-1 win over the Mountaineers, tallying one goal and one assist in that contest. Myers assisted on the game-winning goal versus West Virginia as the Wildcats easily erased an early 1-0 deficit with four unanswered goals.

October 2: Game Against West Virginia Was "Breast Cancer Awareness Day"

Villanova made its home game versus West Virginia on October 2 "Breast Cancer Awareness Day" and raised several hundred dollars in support of Susan G. Komen for the Cure by selling pink hair extensions. The team also wore the hair extensions during the game. The fundraiser was shared by the Wildcats volleyball team, which hosted its annual 'Dig Pink' match on the same day. In addition, the Villanova field hockey team collected nearly a thousand dollars in donations to benefit the National Foundation for Cancer Research.

October 2: Villanova 4, No. 22 West Virginia 1 (Post-Game Notes)

Villanova defeated West Virginia for the first time since registering a pair of 1-0 wins during the 2004 season, with the latter victory coming in the quarterfinals of the BIG EAST Championship. The Wildcats trail the all-time series with the Mountaineers by a 9-5-5 margin after this win.

Since the two wins over West Virginia back in the 2004 season Villanova had tallied an 0-6-1 mark in head-to-head meetings. Five of the six losses were by just one goal and three of those slim defeats were overtime affairs.

Prior to this loss the Mountaineers had not been beaten by a BIG EAST opponent since a 2-1 loss at Marquette last season on September 23, 2010. West Virginia won its final nine regular season conference games last year, picked up three more wins in the BIG EAST Championship and were off to a 5-0 start in league play this season. All told the Mountaineers had a 17-game winning streak versus league foes snapped by the Wildcats.

The four goals scored by Villanova was one more than West Virginia had allowed in its first five conference games combined. The Mountaineers surrendered just three goals in a 5-0 conference start and came into the game tied for the league lead with a 0.60 goals-against average in conference games. The four scores by the Wildcats were the most West Virginia allowed to a BIG EAST opponent since a 5-1 loss to Notre Dame on October 8, 1999.

Villanova scored a total of exactly one goal in its first four conference games, all losses. With the four tallies in this game, the Wildcats had racked up seven scores in a two-game span which began with a 3-1 triumph over Pittsburgh two days earlier. The last time Villanova had as many as four goals in a BIG EAST game was in a 4-0 win over Pittsburgh on October 5, 2001.

West Virginia is the first and so far only nationally-ranked opponent the Wildcats have played this season. The last win for the team over a ranked foe came last season in a 3-2 win over No. 16 Wake Forest in double overtime on September 12, 2010.

Senior forward **Katie Ryan (Wayne, N.J.)** set a new school record with her 15th career game-winning goal in this game. Ryan surpassed the previous mark of 14 career game-winners that she held with Ann Brennan (1983-86) and Cathy Ford (1983-85), who were both members of the inaugural Villanova varsity women's soccer team back in 1983.

In addition to setting the career game-winning goal record, senior forward **Katie Ryan (Wayne, N.J.)** accumulated a career single-game high of six points in the contest. Ryan had a part in all four Villanova goals and finished the day with two goals and two assists. She scored the Wildcats first two goals of the game in the first half and later assisted on two scores in the second half.

The six points tallied by senior forward **Katie Ryan (Wayne, N.J.)** in the game were the most by a Wildcat player in a BIG EAST contest since Quinn Sellers had six points against Georgetown on October 7, 1999. Sellers scored all three Villanova goals in a 3-1 victory that day.

September 30: Villanova 3, Pittsburgh 1 (Post-Game Notes)

Villanova snapped a six-game losing streak and also notched its first conference win of the season. The last win for the Wildcats had been a 3-2 decision in double overtime on September 2, nearly one month earlier. The team had been 0-6-1 since then and was shut out in its previous three contests before scoring three times in this victory.

Freshman defender **Victoria Gersh (Silver Spring, Md.)** scored the first goal of the game for Villanova in the 11th minute of the contest. Her goal broke a scoreless stretch of 315:32 for the Wildcats offense, which had not scored since the second half of a 2-1 loss at Rutgers on September 16.

The goal scored by Gersh also marked the first goal for Villanova against the Panthers since 2006, a stretch that includes the Wildcats being held scoreless by Pittsburgh in four straight games from 2007-10. Villanova lost just one of those outings, though, as the games each year from 2007-09 ended in a 0-0 draw. It had been a streak of 381:06 since the Wildcats scored the last of two second half goals versus the Panthers on October 15, 2006.

Pittsburgh scored its only goal of the game in the 31st minute. That tally marked the first ever for the Panthers in a game played at Villanova. In seven previous home games against Pittsburgh the Wildcats had gone 5-0-2 with a 15-0 scoring margin, a stretch that spanned just over 700 minutes of play before Ashley Cuba found the back of the net in this game.

With three points in the game (one goal, one assist) senior forward **Katie Ryan (Wayne, N.J.)** took over sole possession of third place in school history with 90 career points. Ryan also became the eighth player in school history to reach the threshold of 20 career assists.

September 25: Syracuse 1, Villanova 0 (Post-Game Note)

Villanova suffered its sixth straight loss and was also shut out for the third consecutive game. The last time the Wildcats were held scoreless in three straight outings came late in the 2009 season from October 16-23. Those three games included 0-0 draws at home versus Pittsburgh and West Virginia and a 2-0 loss at Notre Dame.

September 23: St. John's 2, Villanova 0 (Post-Game Note)

St. John's scored one goal in each half of the 2-0 win over Villanova. This contest was the 11th game of the season for the Wildcats and the first which was decided by more than one goal. Its first 10 games of the season Villanova had eight games decided by one goal and two others result in a tie.

September 18: Seton Hall 1, Villanova 0 (Post-Game Note)

Seton Hall won at the West Campus Soccer Complex for the first time since 1999 and had lost its last five games at the venue since then. Despite losing to the Pirates for the second straight year Villanova maintains an 11-6-1 edge in the all-time series between the teams, which dates back to 1994.

September 16: Rutgers 2, Villanova 1 (Post-Game Notes)

Villanova dropped to 6-10-1 all-time in BIG EAST openers with the 2-1 loss. This mark includes a 3-6-1 record when the Wildcats first conference game of the season is played on the road. This contest marked the first time that Villanova and Rutgers have met in the BIG EAST opener for either squad.

Freshman forward **Caitlin Forte (Selbyville, Del.)** made her first collegiate start in the game.

September 9: Penn 1, Villanova 0 (Post-Game Notes)

Villanova played its first game ever at PPL Park, home of the MLS Philadelphia Union. The game attracted a season-high attendance of 667 fans for the Wildcats and was a terrific opportunity for Villanova to host its first game at a world-class and high-profile venue.

The contest was the first of two that Wildcat teams will host at PPL Park this fall. The football team hosts its annual rivalry game against Delaware on November 19. Previously, the Villanova men's soccer team played host to USF in a BIG EAST contest on October 9, 2010.

At halftime of the game the Wildcats honored former All-American goalkeeper and 2011 U.S. Women's National Team member Jillian Loyden for being a part of this past summer's Women's World Cup. Loyden was a member of the only Villanova women's soccer championship squad in 003, when she redshirted the season before going on to play four incredible season in goal for the Wildcats. Loyden is the only first team All-American in program history and is also the only person to be named BIG EAST Goalkeeper of the Year on three occasions (2005-07). Loyden currently plays for the WPS magicJack.

Villanova also recognized at halftime Morgan Mysza, who was matched up with the Wildcats women's soccer team through the Friends of Jaclyn organization, a non-profit charitable organization that seeks to improve the quality of life for children with pediatric brain tumors. September 5: Katie Ryan Named to Weekly BIG EAST Honor Roll

Senior forward **Katie Ryan (Wayne, N.J.)** received a spot on the weekly BIG EAST Honor Roll on September 5 after coming up big for the Wildcats in a pair of games at the Nike Tribe Fairfield Inn & Suites by Marriott Invitational. Villanova opened the tournament with a 3-2, double-overtime victory over Virginia Commonwealth. Ryan had a goal and an assist in the contest, including the game-winning goal in the 110th minute just 31 seconds before the game would have ended in a draw. With time quickly winding down Ryan won a loose ball from the VCU goalkeeper and scored the game-winning goal, at the time tying the school record with the 14th game-winning tally of her career. In the championship game of the tournament, Ryan scored a game-tying goal in the second half to help forge a 2-2 draw against host William & Mary, which was ranked second in the Mid-Atlantic Region at the time. Through the end of the tournament, Ryan had scored a goal in seven consecutive games, including the first six games this season as well as the finale of the 2010 season.

2011 SEASON NEWS AND NOTES

September 4: Villanova 2, William & Mary 2 (2ot) (Post-Game Notes)

Villanova picked up its first point in five meetings against William & Mary by playing to a 2-2 draw. The Wildcats had previously been 0-4 all-time against the Tribe, although all four of those losses came between 1988-91.

This contest was the championship game of the Nike Tribe Fairfield Inn & Suites by Marriott Invitational and the 2-2 draw ran Villanova's record in regular season tournament play to 18-2-3 (.848) since the 2005 season.

Following the game redshirt sophomore defender **Alexa Carugati (Newtown, Pa.)**, sophomore goalkeeper **Jami Kranich (Hamden, Conn.)** and junior forward **Heidi Sabatura (Lawrenceville, N.J.)** all were named to the All-Tournament Team.

This game ended a streak in which Villanova played four of its first six games of the 2011 season versus opponents from the Colonial Athletic Association. Including these four contests the Wildcats are 18-23-5 (.446) all-time against the teams that make up the CAA, although that mark is a more revealing 7-1-2 (.800) since the start of the 2004 season.

Senior forward **Katie Ryan (Wayne, N.J.)** scored her sixth goal of the season in the game. She scored once in each of the first six games of the year for Villanova and had a streak of seven consecutive games with a goal dating back to the final game of the 2010 campaign.

September 2: Villanova 3, Virginia Commonwealth 2 (2ot) (Post-Game Notes)

Villanova extended its winning streak to a season-high four games with this win. The last three games in the streak ended in a 3-2 score and all four victories were by the slimmest of one-goal margins. Despite the close games in the streak the Wildcats trailed just once in the four games and even that one deficit lasted for only 59 seconds.

The win in this game was the 14th in school history for Villanova in double overtime or later. This is the sixth straight season that the Wildcats have won a game in double overtime and the team is now 13-7-61 (.537) all-time in double overtime games (this record has been updated to include two other double overtime contests since the VCU game).

Villanova was playing in the first game of the Nike Tribe Fairfield Inn & Suites by Marriott Invitational. This is the second straight season that the Wildcats have tallied a win over Virginia Commonwealth in tournament action. Last season, Villanova beat the Rams by a 2-1 score in the first game of the JMU/Comfort Inn Harrisonburg Invitational.

Senior forward **Katie Ryan (Wayne, N.J.)** scored the 14th game-winning goal of her career in this game, tying the school's all-time record. She has since broken that mark and holds the all-time Villanova mark with 15 career game-winning goals.

August 28: Villanova 3, Georgia 2 (Post-Game Notes)

Villanova played against a member of the Southeastern Conference for only the second time ever and improved to 2-0 in those meetings with the 3-2 victory. Previously, the Wildcats played an SEC opponent for the first time and came away with a 1-0 win in double overtime against Louisiana State on September 10, 2006. That game was played at a neutral site at Navy.

The win was the second in as many games for Villanova in a weekend trip to Georgia, which began with a 3-2 win at Georgia State two nights earlier. These victories were the first in back-to-back road games for the Wildcats since wins over Davidson and Charlotte on September 4 and 6 during the 2009 season. Since then Villanova had been 4-14-1 away from home, including a mark of 2-13-1 in true road games and a 2-1 mark in neutral-site contests.

Senior forward **Katie Ryan (Wayne, N.J.)** has steadily ascended the Villanova career lists in nearly every offensive category throughout the 2011 season. In this particular game she moved into fifth place in school history in career points and also moved into a tie for third place in the program record book in career game-winning goals.

August 27: Wildcats Enjoy Lunch Hosted by Atlanta Alumni Chapter

Villanova made its first ever trip to the state of Georgia earlier this season and one of the highlights of the trip was a lunch hosted by the Atlanta Chapter of the Villanova University Alumni Association.

The Atlanta Chapter has offered a great deal of support to Wildcat teams over the years and at the lunch held at the team's hotel Chapter President Greg Megan '79 addressed the team and told the current women's soccer student-athletes that all Villanova alumni are extremely proud of the team's success both on the field as well as academically. He also spoke about the players' time as student-athletes being just the beginning of a life-time relationship with Villanova.

Head coach **John Byford** presented Megan with a memento in recognition of the team's appreciation for all of the support during the Wildcats trip to Georgia, which featured a pair of victories over Georgia State and Georgia. The latter win was the first ever on the road against a Southeastern Conference opponent for Villanova.

August 26: Villanova 3, Georgia State 2 (Post-Game Notes)

Villanova defeated Georgia State in its first road game of the 2011 season. Last year the Wildcats were just 1-8 on the road, although that stat is not completely revealing as the team added two other wins away from home in neutral-site contests last season.

The one true road win for Villanova in 2010 came in the season opener at Temple. With this win at Georgia State the Wildcats went unbeaten in their first road game of a season for the 11th consecutive year. Dating back to the 2001 season Villanova is 8-0-3 in its first road game each year.

Senior forward **Katie Ryan (Wayne, N.J.)** has steadily ascended the Villanova career lists in nearly every offensive category throughout the 2011 season. In this particular game she moved into sole possession of fourth place in program history with her 31st career goal.

The first goal of this game was scored by senior forward **Katie Ryan (Wayne, N.J.)**. It was the 13th time in her career that she scored the first goal of a game, including the eighth "first goal" out of 12 overall tallies since the start of the 2010 season.

This game was the second in a row, also including the team's previous contest against Saint Joseph's, in which both Villanova and its opponent attempted and successfully converted a penalty kick. Prior to the previous game against the Hawks, there had not been a Wildcats contest in the last 10 years in which both teams scored on a penalty kick in the same game.

August 22: Villanova 2, Saint Joseph's 1 (Post-Game Notes)

This contest marked only the second time that Villanova played a game on a Monday in the last 15 years. The most recent Monday outing for the Wildcats came at Rutgers on September 22, 2008 in a BIG EAST contest that was locally televised. This year's game against Saint Joseph's was the result of a weather-related postponement one day earlier.

Senior forward **Katie Ryan (Wayne, N.J.)** has steadily ascended the Villanova career lists in nearly every offensive category throughout the 2011 season. In this particular game she became the sixth player in program history to reach the mark of 30 career goals and tied for fourth place in the Wildcats record book for goals scored. Ryan also moved into sole possession of fourth place in school history with her 12th career game-winning goal.

Despite their campuses being separated by just a few miles Villanova and the Hawks met for only the fifth time ever in women's soccer. The Wildcats lead the all-time series by a 4-1 count and avenged a loss to the Hawks in the most recent meeting, also at the West Campus Soccer Complex on August 28, 2005 and won by Saint Joseph's by a 2-1 final score.

Freshman defenders **Kaitlin Hogman (Center Valley, Pa.)** and **Kathryn Rayner (Needham, Mass.)** both made their collegiate debuts in the game.

2011 SEASON NEWS AND NOTES

August 19: Villanova 1, James Madison 1 (2ot) (Post-Game Notes)

Villanova extended its unbeaten streak in season openers to 11 straight (10-0-1) with the 1-1 draw. The Wildcats are 15-11-3 (.569) all-time in season openers and have not lost their first game since dropping a 1-0 decision at La Salle to open the 2000 season. In addition to the 15-11-3 overall mark the Wildcats are also 9-6-1 (.594) when opening the season at home. Villanova has not lost a season opener played at home since 1996, ironically losing the first game that season by a 1-0 final score to James Madison.

Prior to this 1-1 draw the Wildcats had not had a tie in their season opener in more than 20 years. The only times Villanova started the season with a draw came in 1986 and 1988. Both years the Wildcats opened the season on the road, both times versus Adelphi. Each of those contests ended in a 2-2 score. This tie against James Madison was halted in the 104th minute due to an impending severe thunderstorm.

None of the 19 games played by the Wildcats during the 2010 season ended in a tie but the first game of the 2011 campaign finished that way. Villanova had played 21 straight games with a draw since a 1-1 tie against Connecticut in the first round of the BIG EAST Championship on October 29, 2009. The Wildcats eventually advanced out of that game to the quarterfinal round by virtue of an edge in penalty kicks.

Senior forward **Katie Ryan (Wayne, N.J.)** has steadily ascended the Villanova career lists in nearly every offensive category throughout the 2011 season. In this particular game she moved into sole possession of sixth place in school history with the 29th goal of her career.

The assist recorded in this game by redshirt freshman midfielder **Stephanie Myers (Downingtown, Pa.)** was the first of her collegiate career. Myers scored one goal in the first five games of the 2010 season before suffering a season-ending injury and being granted a medical redshirt for the season.

The starting lineup for Villanova in the season opener included three players who were granted medical redshirts due to injuries last season. The three included redshirt freshman midfielder **Stephanie Myers (Downingtown, Pa.)**, redshirt junior midfielder **Lauren McCoy (Spotsylvania, Va.)** and redshirt sophomore defender **Alexa Carugati (Newtown, Pa.)**. In addition, redshirt freshman forward **Kelly Mahoney (Darien, Conn.)** made her collegiate debut with 36 minutes of action off the bench, including playing all 14-plus minutes of overtime.

Freshman midfielder **Amanda Penkrot (Wilmington, Del.)** and freshman defender **Victoria Gersh (Silver Spring, Md.)** both made their collegiate debuts in the starting lineup for Villanova. Meanwhile, redshirt freshman **Kelly Mahoney (Darien, Conn.)**, freshman midfielders **Bryana Gold (Atlanta, Ga.)** and **Katie Sanquist (Laytonsville, Md.)** and freshman forward **Caitlin Forte (Selbyville, Del.)** also made their collegiate debuts by coming off the bench.

August 13: Exhibition Game at Hofstra Results in 1-1 Draw

Villanova had just one preseason tuneup before the start of the 2011 season and it came in an exhibition game at Hofstra, where the Wildcats and Pride played to a 1-1 draw. The result was a positive one for Villanova against a team that was receiving votes in the preseason national rankings.

The sides played three 30-minute periods and one 20-minute overtime period before settling on the 1-1 final score. The game was tied following 90 minutes of play thanks to a goal scored in the 85th minute by freshman midfielder **Victoria Gersh (Silver Spring, Md.)** off of a feed from senior forward **Katie Ryan (Wayne, N.J.)**.

For the Wildcats the preseason exhibition was a chance to bring together against an outside opponent the things that the team worked on during preseason training. The contest, albeit an unofficial one, was the first meeting between Villanova and Hofstra since the Wildcats posted a 3-2, neutral-site victory in 2008 at the Penn Invitational. The Pride were not an opponent to take lightly after finishing the 2010 season with a 19-3 record and advancing to the second round of the NCAA Tournament.

August 12: Wildcats Return From Training Trip to New Jersey Shore

For the second straight season a part of preseason camp for Villanova included a trip to the Jersey Shore, where the team trained for four days in preparation for the 2011 campaign. Practice sessions were held each afternoon during the trip from August 8-11 and the Wildcats also had a number of team-building activities. This year's trip was once again a successful part of the team's training for the season.

August 9: Katie Ryan Earns Preseason All-BIG EAST Honors

In the annual preseason poll of league head coaches senior forward **Katie Ryan (Wayne, N.J.)** earned a spot on the All-BIG EAST Preseason Team. This is the second straight year that Ryan has garnered such recognition and comes on the heels of her earning first team All-BIG EAST accolades for the 2010 campaign.

During the 2010 season Ryan led Villanova with nine goals and 24 points and also paced the squad with four game-winning tallies. She added six assists as well and ranked among the BIG EAST leaders in every offensive category.

August 9: Wildcats Predicted to Finish Fifth in BIG EAST National Division

Following a 2010 season that was interrupted from start to finish due to a cavalcade of injuries Villanova was chosen to finish fifth in the BIG EAST National Division this year in a preseason poll of league head coaches. The Wildcats earned 67 points in the preseason poll and finished just six points behind fourth place pick Louisville, perhaps acknowledgement from the rest of the league of last season's injury-related atypical finish. Villanova went 7-12 overall and 2-9 in BIG EAST play in 2010.
