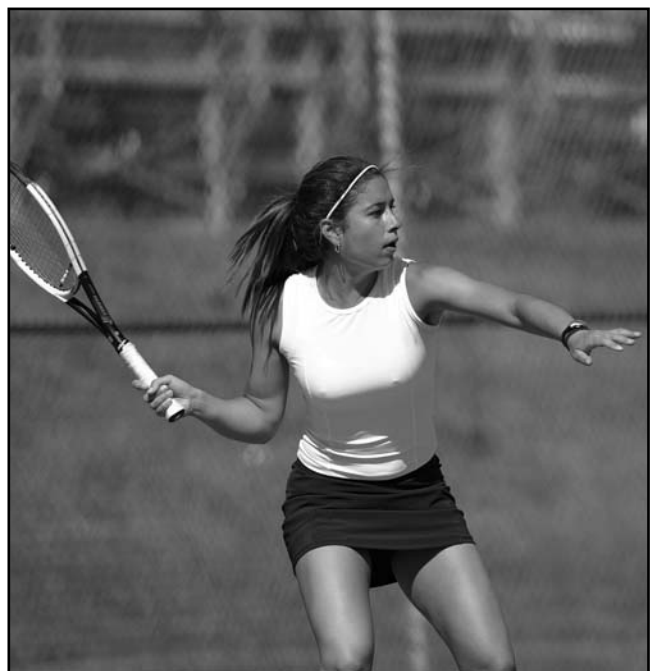

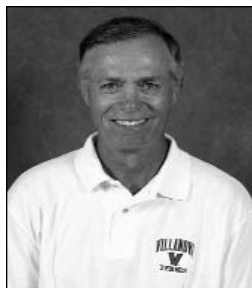

13TH SEASON

Villanova head coach Bob Batman enters his 13th season at the helm of the Wildcats' men's tennis team. He also has served as the Director of Villanova Tennis for the past nine seasons. For his career, Batman has compiled an impressive 150-105 overall record on the Main Line.

Prior to his arrival at Villanova, Batman coached the men's and women's tennis teams at the University of the Redlands in Redlands, Calif. During his stint at Redlands, Batman coached the men's team to the Division III national championships and a final ranking of No. 8 in the nation. He also helped lead the women's team to their first-ever national ranking (No. 25), and their No. 1 singles player to the national semifinals.

Batman has also spent time as an instructor, teaching tennis around the world. He served as a resident tennis professional at the famous Vic Braden Tennis College at Coto de Caza Resort in California, as Director of Tennis at Camp Walt Whitman in New Hampshire, and as the head tennis pro at the Gottingen Tennis Center in Gottingen, West Germany. Presently, Batman is the Director of Tennis for the Martins Dam Tennis and Swim Club in Wayne, Pa.

A former Navy fighter pilot, Batman is a graduate of Fairmont State College, where he earned his Bachelor's degree in business administration. Batman also has a Master's degree in education counseling from the University of the Redlands.

2005-06 Men's Outlook

With only three returning from last year's squad, all sophomores, a unique challenge awaits the 2005-06 team - players and coach alike. This will make for a thin and inexperienced beginning to this season's campaign. After making it to the Big East Championships for the first time since the implementation of the limited six-team format, this will be first and foremost, a rebuilding year. The loss to graduation of four solid seniors, as players and leaders, will certainly make for a challenging, if not interesting year.

Although sophomores Dimitri Chimerakis, Scott Fahrendorf and Charlie Farmer inherit leadership roles not usually expected so early in their college career, it is a situation they were aware of throughout 2004-05. The guidance and support provided by last year's seniors, Ricardo Baraldi, Aaron Kusza, Sean Gallagher and Angel Rubio will serve as an example they can positively build on for now and in the future. These sophomores do return as a solid and battle-tested trio. Last year's #3 singles and #2 doubles player, Chimerakis, will be looked to elevate his playing positions. Fahrendorf will similarly be counted on to step higher up the ladder from his #5 singles and #3 doubles spot his freshman year. A successful doubles player, Farmer will be depended on to contribute on the singles side of match play this year. Incoming freshman Brian Maher should provide immediate help in both singles and doubles.

9TH SEASON

Steve Reiniger enters his ninth season as head coach of the Villanova women's tennis program in 2005-06. Reiniger steered the Wildcats to a 14-9 season in 2003-04 and looks to improve further upon that this season with a veteran squad.

Reiniger began his Villanova career as an assistant for the Wildcat men's and women's tennis teams under Bob Batman in 1994. He graduated from West Chester University in 1994 with a Bachelor's of Arts degree in philosophy. At West Chester, Reiniger played four years of varsity tennis, reaching the conference finals in singles and doubles during his last two seasons. As a senior, he was named his team's Most Valuable Player.

Reiniger is U.S.P.T.A. certified and has 12 years of teaching and coaching experience at a number of levels. He has taught at several different clubs in Pennsylvania, including a stint as the teaching pro and Director of Junior Development at Radley Run Country Club. Reiniger is presently the head tennis teaching pro and the head Platform Tennis pro at the Merion Cricket Club.

Reiniger resides in Collegeville, Pa. with his wife, Beth, a Villanova alumna, and their daughter, Rachel.

2005-06 Women's Outlook

After an injury-riddled season, the women look to rebound with a solid nucleus of returners and an infusion of new talent.

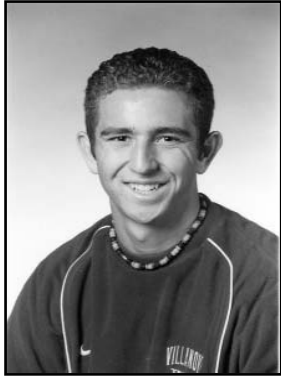
Coach Steve Reiniger retains his numbers one, three, five and six singles players from last season. After a sound 2004-05 season, junior Candice Carlin should once again anchor the team at the #1 singles and doubles positions. Coming off a breakout sophomore campaign, junior Leighann Reilly should continue to provide dependable results.

Senior co-captain Lindsey Puchyr adds further depth and experience at the five spot, while junior Taryn Cappellini and sophomore Zoe Murray split time at #6 singles.

The departures of the team's only seniors last season, Courtney and Morgan Flezzani, left holes at the numbers two and four singles spots, but there are several players looking to step into those roles.

Red-shirt senior Melissa Reed is one of those players. She has spent most of her career fighting injuries and looks to make this year her first full season of competition.

Expectations for the incoming class should elevate the depth of this year's team in both singles and doubles. Freshmen Lyndsey Lostritto, Jaclyn Williamson and Daniella Phillis, along with transfer Ashley Reed, are all anticipated to bolster this year's squad.

A GLIMPSE OF VILLANOVA

THE UNIVERSITY

Founded in 1842 by the priests and brothers of the Order of St. Augustine, Villanova University is a comprehensive Roman Catholic institution that welcomes students of all faiths. The University offers a wide variety of degree programs through four colleges: the College of Liberal Arts and Sciences, the College of Commerce and Finance, the College of Engineering and the College of Nursing.

A SOLID ACADEMIC REPUTATION

The oldest and largest Catholic university in the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania, Villanova is one of 255 institutions — and one of 18 Catholic colleges and universities — in the nation to have a chapter of Phi Beta Kappa, the prestigious national liberal arts honors society. Recently, U.S. News & World Report ranked Villanova first in the North for the 12th time.

THE STUDENTS

Today Villanova University maintains an average annual enrollment of 10,275 including graduate and law school and part-time undergraduate programs. The full-time undergraduate enrollment is 6,295. The undergraduates come from 48 states plus Puerto Rico and 52 foreign countries. Ninety-two percent of our first-year students ranked in the top 30 of their high school classes.

THE FACULTY

Villanova's 490 full-time faculty, 90 percent of whom hold the highest degree in their field, teach classes that average 23 students. The student/faculty ratio is 12:1.

THE CAMPUS

Located in a suburban community 12 miles west of Philadelphia, the picturesque 254-acre campus features more than 60 buildings, including a library with more than 800,000 volumes and over a million microform items, a 12,000-seat stadium, and 27 residence halls.

THE EXPERIENCE

Villanova students may choose to study abroad for a summer, a semester, or a year; compete on one or more of 11 men's and 13 women's sports teams at the NCAA Division I level (football is Division I-AA); immerse themselves in Campus Ministry; and take part in any of more than 130 registered student organizations.

FINANCIAL ASSISTANCE

In 2001-2002, Villanova offered more than \$4.8 million in merit-based academic scholarships to prospective freshmen. Villanova also offered over \$17 million in need-based financial aid to prospective freshmen through the Villanova Grant Program. This funding is provided by the University and does not include federal, state, and/or private assistance, which our students also receive.

ACCREDITATION

Villanova and its programs have received accreditation from the Middle States Association of Colleges and Secondary Schools, the AACSB/International Association for Management Education, the American Chemical Society, the American Bar Association, the Association of American Law Schools, the Pennsylvania State Board of Nurse Examiners, the National League for Nursing Accreditation Commission, the Accreditation Board for Engineering and Technology, the National Catholic Education Association, and the Computing Sciences Accreditation Board. Villanova is a member in good standing of the National Association for College Admission Counseling.

ALUMNI

Villanova's 77,000+ living alumni maintain close ties with the University through a large network of alumni chapters and societies which may be found throughout the U.S. and abroad.

ENROLLMENT

Admission to Villanova is very competitive. If you have a strong academic background and a wide range of interests, and if you're motivated to contribute to the intellectual and spiritual environment of our University community, then we encourage you to apply.

Getting to Villanova

FROM NEW YORK AND NEW ENGLAND: Take the New Jersey Turnpike to EXIT 6 (Pennsylvania Turnpike exit). Follow the Pennsylvania Turnpike Westbound to EXIT 20 (formerly Exit 25A) for Mid-County Interchange/I-476 Interchange. Follow I-476 South to EXIT 13 (Villanova/St. Davids). At the bottom of the ramp turn right onto Route 30, also known as Lancaster Avenue. Proceed East on Route 30 (Lancaster Avenue) for one-half mile and at the fourth parking lot you will see Villanova's main parking lot on the right. To reach the Main Gate entrance turn left at the next light (Ithan Avenue) and follow to the second drive on left, directly across from the Pavilion.

FROM THE WEST: Take the Pennsylvania Turnpike to EXIT 326 (formerly EXIT 24) for Valley Forge. Take I-76 (Schuylkill Expressway) to EXIT 28-A (I-476 South/Chester). Take I-476 South to EXIT 13 (Villanova/ St. Davids). At the bottom of the ramp turn right onto Route 30 East, also known as Lancaster Avenue. Proceed East on Route 30 (Lancaster Avenue) for one-half mile and at the fourth traffic light you will see Villanova's main parking lot on the right. To reach the Main Gate entrance turn left at the next light (Ithan Avenue) and follow to the second drive on left, directly across from the Pavilion.

FROM THE SOUTH: Take I-95 North to EXIT 7 (I-476 North/Plymouth Meeting). Take I-476 North to EXIT 13 (Villanova/St. Davids). Proceed East on Route 30 (Lancaster Avenue) for one-half mile and at the fourth traffic light you will see Villanova's main parking lot on the right. To reach the Main Gate entrance turn left at the next light (Ithan Avenue) and follow to the second drive on left, directly across from the Pavilion.
