WILDCATS READY FOR SECOND TOP-10 SHOWDOWN OF 2012

For Openers

After blitzing No. 6 Stanford, 18-6, in its 2012 season-opener, top-ranked Northwestern travels east this week to square off with No. 5 Duke Sunday in Durham. The 'Cats are in search of their eighth straight win in the series with the Blue Devils.

Series Information

Northwestern's run of seven straight wins against Duke has not come without its share of dramatics. Last year, the No. 2 and No. 3-ranked teams squared off in Evanston on April 2, when the 'Cats came back from a three-goal second-half deficit and ended the game on a 7-2 run to steal a 12-10 victory. Goalkeeper **Brianne LoManto** keyed the win with eight second-half saves and a season-high 11 for the game, while her counterpart, Mollie Mackler, recorded 20 saves and kept NU to a 1-for-9 success rate on 8-meter chances.

Duke is coming off its sixth-ever appearance in the NCAA semifinals in 2011 when it finished the season 15-5. This year, the Blue Devils are 2-1 and coming off a tough 7-5 defeat to NU's ALC brethren Vanderbilt, in which Duke was limited to 0-of-3 on free position chances while Vandy finished 6-of-7.

Last Time Out

Top-ranked Northwestern handled a challenging season-opening road test with relative ease last Friday, outscoring No. 6 Stanford

11-2 in the second half to secure an 18-6 victory at Cagan Stadium. **Shannon Smith** and **Erin Fitzgerald** each posted hat tricks to lead a group of 12 Wildcat goal-scorers. Northwestern was aided by a 20-6 advantage on draw controls, led by the nine collected by sophomore **Alyssa Leonard**. For Stanford, the loss snapped a string of 22 consecutive wins at Cagan Stadium dating to Feb. 20, 2009.

Veteran Cast Returns for Wildcats

There can't be many teams in the country that return the type of offensive production that Northwestern does after its remarkable run to a sixth NCAA championship in seven years. Of the 14 players who scored more than one goal for the Wildcats a season ago, 13 will once again be suiting up for NU in 2012, with graduated senior **Brooke Matthews** the lone exception (25 goals, seven assists in 2011). Northwestern can also rest easy when looking ahead to 2013; four of NU's top seven point-producers last season were underclassmen and will be back next year.

Getting Back on 'D'

Northwestern's defense in 2012 is led by a stalwart crew of returners including goalkeeper Brianne LoManto. Now in her third and final season as a starter, LoManto boasts a 43-4 career record in the cage with 317 saves and two runs to the national championship game under her belt. In front of her on defense is last season's IWLC A Defender of the Year, Taylor Thornton, along with multi-year contributors Lacey Vigmostad, Christy Turner and Maria Tedeschi. Last year, the Wildcats ranked eighth in the nation with an 8.57 goals against average and did not allow more than 10 goals in any of their six postseason contests.

Shannon Smith Poised to Topple Northwestern Records

Coming off one of the most prolific seasons in NCAA women's lacrosse history, 2011 Tewaaraton Trophy and Honda Sports Award winner Shannon Smith will be aiming to pick up in 2012 where she left off in her record-setting junior season. Smith's 86 goals set a Northwestern single-season standard and her 128 points were the second-most in school history. But in 2011 it was as much about the quality as the quantity of Smith's scoring. The Long Island native notched the decisive goals in NU's NCAA semifinal and championship game victories and also recorded four second-half goals in a 10-9 win over Florida in the ALC title game.

In the midst of her senior campaign, Smith ranks fifth in career assists at NU (81), fifth in points (272) and seventh in goals (191), leaving her within striking distance of becoming NU's all-time leader in both points and goals.

In addition to winning the Tewaaraton and Honda Sports Awards, Smith also was named the Suzy Favor Big Ten Female Athlete of the Year and was nominated for the Women's Sports Foundation Sportswoman of the Year Award.

Thornton One of Nation's Top All-Around Threats

Junior Taylor Thornton earned 2011 IWLC A Division I Defender of the Year honors for her ability to combine lockdown defending with an end-to-end scoring threat. The Dallas native led the Wildcats with 38 ground balls and ranked third with 49 draw controls, behind only to specialists Alyssa Leonard and Alex Frank. On the defensive end, Thornton's performances included keeping the nation's leading goal-scorer, Kitty Cullen of Florida, without a goal in NU's 10-9 win in the ALC Championship game. But Thornton's ability to clear a defensive ride often put her in prime position for scoring chances, most memorably for the overtime game-winner vs. No. 3 North Carolina early in the 2011 regular season.

2012 Schedule: Homestands Highlight Tough Slate

It's nothing new for Kelly Amonte Hiller's squads to face a schedule full of many of the nation's most successful programs, but the 2012 schedule is still unique for a number of reasons. Chief among them are the two extended homestands that make up all of NU's Lakeside

AMONTE HILLER AGAINST THE ATLANTIC COAST

Kelly Amonte Hiller, a former All-American at Maryland, has been able to continue the success against ACC opponents she got used to in her playing days. Since taking over the reins of Northwestern in 2002, the Wildcats have played 33 games against Atlantic Coast opponents, posting a 25-8 record in the past eight seasons including a 12-1 mark in Evanston. Northwestern was 6-0 vs. the ACC in 2011 after vanquishing North Carolina in the semifinals and then-No. 1 Maryland in the title game.

Field appearances: Northwestern plays four out of five at home between March 3 and March 25 before hosting five straight games to close the regular season between April 13-28.

On the docket for the Wildcats in 2012 are eight teams that qualified for the NCAA Championship last season, including Duke and North Carolina, two of NU's fellow participants in the national semifinals. The Final Four rematch with the Tar Heels kicks off the final five-game homestand, preceding dates Johns Hopkins and Florida that could go a long way toward determining the American Lacrosse Conference championship. Another highlight at Lakeside Field includes the March 25 matchup with Navy as Cindy Timchal, head coach of the Midshipmen and Amonte Hiller's college coach, returns to Evanston where she was the first lacrosse coach in Northwestern history (1982-90).

Leonard Continues Dominance on the Draw

Northwestern won five one-goal games in 2011, thanks in no small part to the reliability of its primary draw control specialist, Alyssa Leonard. Leonard recorded 91 in her freshman campaign—tied for the second-best single-season total in Northwestern history—en route to being named the ALC Freshman of the Year. She picked up right where she left off in NU's season-opener at Stanford, winning nine draw controls—only the 11th time in program history a Wildcat has won at least nine draws—as

NU dominated the Cardinal for the game, 20-6. With Leonard leading the way last season, the Wildcats came away with 62.6 percent of their draw control opportunities and ranked fourth nationally with 15.13 per game.

Champion Challenge Provides Stern Preseason Test for Wildcats

Northwestern stepped on the field for the first time this year at the Champion Challenge presented by U.S. Lacrosse on Jan. 28-29 in Orlando. The Wildcats performed well in their exhibition opener, a 9-3 win over Team England, thanks in part to three goals by Kelly Rich and four assists by Casey Bocklet. On Sunday, NU squared off with arguably the best team in the world, Team USA, overcoming a slow start to ultimately play well in a 16-6 defeat to the national squad. Amanda Macaluso and Erin Fitzgerald each had two goals while senior GK Brianne LoManto turned away 11 USA shots. On the other side, eight of Team USA's 16 goals were scored by former Northwestern players.

Field General Alex Frank

A two-year captain for the Wildcats, senior Alex Frank has been a rock in the midfield throughout the career. The 2011 All-American contributes heavily off the draw, winning 69 draws last season and entering play this weekend sixth all-time at Northwestern with 178—just 29 shy of second place. In addition to her effort on the draw, Frank's stellar 2011 campaign also consisted of 19 goals, 24

Six Seniors Provide Steady Leadership for 'Cats

Throughout the 2012 season, **Kelly Amonte Hiller** can take comfort in knowing that she has six seniors with a remarkable amount of experience directing her troops on both ends of the field. Northwestern has six seniors on its roster who have combined to make 284 career starts, an average of 47.3 starts per individual. This year's senior class consists of midfielder **Alex Frank**, goalkeeper **Brienne LoManto**, midfielder/attack **Jessica Russo**, attack **Shannon Smith**, defender **Maria Tedeschi** and defender **Lacey Vigmostad**.

Freshmen Set Out to Make an Impact

For the second consecutive year, **Kelly Amonte Hiller** welcomed in a highly touted, 11-member freshman class to the Wildcats lacrosse family. The group hails from eight states ranging from Minnesota to Texas to Michigan and up and down the East coast. Included in the group is two-time Under Armour All-American and Long Island native **Casey Bocklet**, who has three older brothers who preceded Casey in playing Division I college lacrosse—Matt (Johns Hopkins) and Chris (Virginia) each were members of NCAA championship squads. Another Under Armour All-American in the newest crop of Wildcats is goalkeeper **Bridget Bianco**, a two-time South Jersey Goalie of the Year honoree and winner of three Group III state championships.

The Family Business

Freshman **Casey Bocklet** is making a name for herself early in her career, which is no small task for someone who comes from the family lineage she does. Bocklet has three older brothers who had successful careers playing Division I lacrosse, including two—Matt at Johns Hopkins and Chris at Virginia—who were part of NCAA championship-winning squads. The Long Island native got off to a fast start at the preseason Champion Challenge event, handing out four assists in NU's 9-3 victory over Team England on Jan. 28. Other Wildcats with siblings who have played Division I lacrosse include **Brienne LoManto** (brother Nick at Delaware) and **Erin Fitzgerald** (brother Connor at Delaware).

Fitzgerald Looks To Build on Strong 2011

Junior **Erin Fitzgerald** established herself as a consistent scoring threat for NU in 2011, finishing with 40 goals and 47 points—both good for second on the team behind **Shannon Smith**. She had seven games with at least three goals a year ago, including the NCAA quarterfinals vs. Albany and semifinals vs. North Carolina. Fitzgerald, daughter of a former NCAA champion wrestler at Iowa, also paced the Wildcats with 13 free position goals on the season.

Sophomore Spark

Harrington is not the only member of the sophomore class poised to make big contributions for NU in 2012. On offense, **Kelly Rich** figures to build on a rookie campaign in which she scored 20 goals, including at least one goal in seven straight games from Feb. 27-March 26, and twice earned ALC Rookie of the Week honors. Midfielder **Kara Mupo**, who led all NU freshmen with 25 points and made 14 starts in 2011, will again play a key role in the offense this season. **Kat DeRonda** blossomed into a reliable playmaker down the stretch of 2011 with seven goals and nine assists, while 2011 ALC Rookie of the Year **Alyssa Leonard** and **Christy Turner** each will feature prominently in NU's midfield and defensive units, respectively.

LORDS OF LAKESIDE

Northwestern's performance on its home field has been nothing short of historic, with the Wildcats compiling a home record of 71-1 since the start of the 2005 season. That includes a 40-1 mark since the construction of Lakeside Field prior to the 2008 campaign. The Wildcats also are 30-4 at home against opponents ranked in the top 10 and won an NCAA-record 58 straight home contests from May 13, 2004 through April 18, 2010.

'Cats and Buckeyes to Meet in Home of New England Patriots

For the second year in a row, Northwestern will be playing a regular-season game in the home of an NFL franchise. The Wildcats will head to Gillette Stadium in Foxborough, Mass., home of the three-time Super Bowl champion New England Patriots, to face Ohio State on Saturday, March 31. The Buckeyes, coached by former NU assistant Alexis Venechanos, need not look far for a connection to the successful NFL franchise; Amanda Belichick, daughter of revered Pats' head coach Bill Belichick, is an assistant for the OSU women. A year ago, Northwestern defeated William & Mary in majestic Cowboys Stadium in Dallas during the 2011 "Dallax" event.

Ann Elliott Elevated to Associate Head Coach

Northwestern head coach **Kelly Amonte Hiller** announced on Jan. 19 the promotion of **Ann Elliott**, an assistant on the Wildcats staff since 2009, to the position of associate head coach. A member of three national championship-winning teams as a player for the Wildcats (2004-07), Elliott has been integral in NU's return to the NCAA title game each of her three seasons on staff. She is the first Northwestern lacrosse coach to be named an associate head coach since Amonte Hiller took over the program 11 years ago.

Thinking Big Picture

Northwestern remains in the midst of one of the most remarkable runs in modern collegiate athletics having reached the national championship game in seven straight seasons, bringing home the title six times. Since the start of the 2005 season, the Wildcats are 147-7 in all games, including a 71-1 mark at home. Northwestern is 39-2 against ALC foes in that span and has not lost a home game to a conference opponent since May 6, 2004.

NORTHWESTERN HEAD COACH KELLY AMONTE HILLER



In May of 2011, head coach Kelly Amonte Hiller officially completed a decade's worth of seasons since resurrecting the Northwestern women's lacrosse program—and what a decade it was. By bring-

ing home the 2011 NCAA championship, Amonte Hiller and NU rose to the top of the women's college lacrosse world for the sixth time in the last seven seasons, a run on par with any accomplishment in modern collegiate athletics.

A four-time IWLCA National Coach of the Year, Amonte Hiller enters 2012 with an incredible active streak of seven consecutive appearances in the NCAA title game. Since the 2004 season, Amonte Hiller has amassed an overall record of 163-10 (.942) and won 28 of 30 games her team has played in the NCAA Tournament.

Along the way, Northwestern has won seven American Lacrosse Conference titles, produced the nation's Tewaaraton Award winner in six different seasons and featured 37 IWLCA All-Americans.

Northwestern's rapid rise to the level of national prominence under Amonte Hiller—particularly in an area of the country that had never before seen such success in women's lacrosse—has caught the eyes of many, in and out of lacrosse. In 2011, *ESPN The Magazine* named Amonte Hiller one of the 20 best recruiters across all college sports, joining the likes of other multiple-time NCAA champion coaches Mike Krzyzewski of Duke (men's basketball) and Anson Dorrance of North Carolina (women's soccer).

The 2011 season perfectly encapsulated all that Amonte Hiller brings to the table as head coach: strong recruiting, tireless preparation, midseason motivation and in-game strategy. In a year in which it began the season without the title of defending national champion for the first time since 2005, NU reeled off 12-straight victories to open its schedule, including five against top-10 opponents. After suffering two mid-season losses, Amonte Hiller reinvented her team as the 'Cats went on to capture the ALC Tournament by avenging one of those losses against top-seeded Florida, 10-9, in the title game.

NU continued to peak at the right time, culminating with a pair of one-goal wins on championship weekend to secure a sixth national title for the Wildcats. Following the season, Shannon Smith became the

third different player under Amonte Hiller to win the Tewaaraton Trophy as well as the Lacrosse Honda Sports award as the nation's top player. Additionally, Amonte Hiller coached freshman Alyssa Leonard—who was in just her third year playing lacrosse—to ALC Rookie of the Year honors thanks in large part to Leonard's 91 draw controls, tied for second-most all-time in a single season at NU.

A truly legendary figure in the lacrosse world, Amonte Hiller was the 1995 and 1996 NCAA Division I Lacrosse Player of the Year, leading Maryland to national titles in both seasons. She was a four-time All-America in lacrosse under former NU head coach Cindy Timchal, ending her career as the school's all-time record holder for career goals (187), assists (132) and points (319, 70 more than second place). In addition, Amonte Hiller also earned All-America accolades in soccer for the Terrapins and was named the ACC Female Athlete of the Year in 1996 for all sports. She graduated from Maryland in 1996 with a bachelor's degree in speech communication.

After several seasons as an assistant coach at Brown, UMass and Boston University, Amonte Hiller was given the chance in 2001 to resurrect a Northwestern program that had operated as a club team since 1993. As a first-year head coach, Amonte Hiller directed NU to a 5-10 season in 2002 followed by an 8-8 mark the following year. By 2004, the Wildcats were 15-3 and participants in the quarterfinals of the NCAA Championship.

A magical 2005 season culminated in the first national championship by any NU team since 1949 and sent Amonte Hiller's first class of recruits out as champions. That perfect 21-0 season served as the springboard to Northwestern's active streak of seven consecutive appearances in the national title game. During that stretch, Amonte Hiller's team set an NCAA record for most consecutive home victories, winning 58 in a row from May 13, 2004 to April 18, 2010.

Amonte Hiller's legacy extends to the national program as well. She was a member of the national team for more than a decade, winning IFWLA World Cup titles with the Elite Team in 1997 and 2001.

In 2005, she was named to the All-World Team at the World Cup in Annapolis, Md., where the U.S. finished second to Australia.

Amonte Hiller resides in Evanston with her husband Scott and daughters Harlee and Lew.
