TIP OFF

The Bobcats dropped their third-straight MAC home game (dating back to last season's finale) by falling to Akron 67-62 Wednesday in the Convo.

The Bobcats got a strong performance from Armon Bassett (25 points, 8-13 FG, 9-10 FT). Point guard D.J. Cooper had 11 points, five assists and three steals in a season-high 38 minutes. Akron's Jimmy Conyers was all over the glass with 14 boards to go with his 16 points. Brett McKnight fought off early foul trouble to amass 13 points in just 16 minutes.

The RedHawks shook off a rusty first-half performance (11 points) to clip Kent State 55-53 in overtime Tuesday at Millett. Miami's Kenny Hayes, the league's leader in minutes per game at 35.93, averages 14.1 points and 3.33 assists per contest.

WHO'S HOT

Freshman point guard **D.J. Cooper** has scored in double figures in 12 of his first 16 collegiate contests this season. He is averaging 12.8 points, 5.6 assists, 4.6 rebounds, and 2.8 steals per game.

NOTABLES FROM THE AKRON GAME

The Bobcats did a great job in transition against the Zips, outscoring Akron 17-4 on the fast break. Bassett also tied career-highs with his eight field goals and nine free throws

JUST TWO

Ohio took just eight 3-point attempts in the 67-62 loss to Akron, the fewest for the program in at least the last 10 years.

THREE STRAIGHT

When Ohio dropped a five-point decision to Akron on Wednesday, it suffered its third straight MAC home loss (dating back to last season's finale against Buffalo). The last time the program had such a streak was Jan. 15, 2003 vs. Northern Illinois (68-61), Jan. 18, 2003 vs. Miami (77-65) and Jan. 28 vs. Bowling Green (66-60 in overtime). Ohio will also look to avoid its first 0-3 MAC start since the 2003-04 season (Toledo, at Northern Illinois, at Kent State).

FREEBIES

The Bobcats have excelled at the free throw line this season, with Steven Coleman (.848), Armon Bassett (.846) and D.J. Cooper (.803) all shooting above 80 percent on the season. Bassett has made 20 of his last 21 attempts from the charity stripe.

SCORELESS

The Bobcats were missing points from key players in the 62-60 loss to Kent State. Ohio's Kenneth van Kempen and Jay Kinney were held off the board for the first time all season as they combined to go 0-6 from the field in 52 combined minutes.

BAGGING THE ONE-POINTER

When Armon Bassett's corner 3-pointer found the bottom of the net, downing IUPUI in the process, it snapped a three-game losing streak for the Bobcats in one-point games. Ohio had previously fallen at Tulsa (81-80, 12/6/09), home against Bowling Green (52-51, 1/24/09) and 55-54 at Akron (1/17/08). Prior to Wednesday's win, the last one-point victory had been Feb. 3, 2007 at Central Michigan when Whitney Davis made a layup with nine seconds left and CMU's Jordan Bitzer lipped out a layup to give the Bobcats the win.

KINNEY LIKES THE ROAD

When the Bobcats hit the road, freshman Jay Kinney's 3-point percentage skyrockets. The 6'1 guard has connected on just 23.3 percent (10-43) of his long-range attempts at home, while making 48.3 percent (14-29) of those shots in Ohio's road games.

BASSETT THE KEY?

When you break down the numbers, there is a significant difference in Armon Bassett's output in Bobcat wins and losses. In the five Ohio wins in which Bassett has participated, he has led the team in scoring with 15.8 points with a 37.9 percent (11-29) 3-point percentage. In the Bobcats' seven losses, Bassett has scored 11.4 points per game, with a 17.1 percent (6-35) mark from beyond the arc.

ICE COLD

The Bobcats struggled mightily against the Pitt Panthers in the squad's last time out. Ohio connected on just 23.9 percent (17-71) from the field, the lowest percentage for the program in at least the last 10 years. The six assists were also the fewest since the Bobcats registered just two in a 20-point home loss to Akron (69-49) on Feb. 16, 2005.

BOBCATS IN THE NCAA

The Bobcats' quick start has translated into a couple of impressive numbers in the NCAA's rankings. Through Jan. 10, Ohio's D.J. Cooper ranks ninth in steals per game (2.8) and 20th in assists (5.7) which makes him the only freshman in the nation to rank in the top 29 of **BOTH** categories.

COOPER NAMED MAC EAST PLAYER OF THE WEEK

Freshman D.J. Cooper averaged 15.0 points, 8.5 assists, 5.0 rebounds, 2.0 steals and 0.5 blocks in a pair of wins over Illinois State and Eastern Kentucky en route to MAC East Player of the Week honors. Cooper posted 18 points, six assists and five rebounds in the win over the Redbirds, a team that was ranked sixth (at the time) in the Colleg Insider.com Mid-Major Poll. The 5'11" guard followed that up with his second double-double of the season against the Colonels by registering 12 points, 11 assists, five rebounds and three steals.

BETTER IN THE SECOND

The Bobcats have been marvelous in the second half this season, averaging 42.5 points per game, compared to their 30.3 clip in the first half. Ohio shoots 11 percent better from the field in the second (46-35) and nine percent better from the line (76-67), while it is 13 percent better from 3-point range (40-27). The program has been tied or behind at the half in seven straight games and has scored more in the game's second 20 minutes in all but one game (N.C. A&T) this season.

CASHING IN

Ohio did a masterful job at the free throw line in the 75-57 win over Illinois State, connecting on 12 of 13 free throws for a 92.3 percentage from the charity line. That is the highest single-game percentage for the program since a 94.7 mark (18-19) in an 11-point home win over Northern Illinois on February 9, 2006. As far as the opposition is concerned, the Redbirds' five free throws made were the fewest since Bowling Green also had five in a 69-48 Bobcat win on Feb. 19, 2008. ISU's seven attempts were the fewest since Akron took just six (and making just two) in a 55-54 Zip win on Jan. 17, 2008. The Bobcats followed that effort with a 19-22 (86.4 percent) effort against Eastern Kentucky.

WATCHING THE BOARDS

Despite some early season success, Ohio has struggled in the rebounding battle at times. The Bobcats had been outrebounded in five straight games, which also happened twice last season. The last time the program suffered a longer streak was a six-game stretch during the 2002-03 season (Feb. 1-Feb. 19). That streak was ended when the Bobcats outrebounded Eastern Kentucky 34-27 and posted 50 boards two games later against Elon.

BASSETT BOMBS DELAWARE

Junior Armon Bassett had a monster day in Ohio's 86-70 win at Delaware with a career-high 27 points on 8-12 shooting from the floor, 2-4 shooting from 3-point range and 9-10 from the free throw line. He also posted four assists and two steals in 33 minutes. For his efforts, Bassett was named MAC East Player of the Week. Bassett's 27 points and DeVaughn Washington's 21 against Delaware marked the first time since Ohio's 80-74 win over Brown on March 18, 2008 that Ohio had two 20-point scorers (Jerome Tillman 21, Leon Williams 20).

CENTURY MAN

Ohio senior center **Kenneth van Kempen** played his 113th career game in Bobcat Green and White against Akron on January 13. The native of Weert, in the Netherlands, has been a regular on the court since joining the Bobcats during the 2006-07 season, playing in an average of 32+ games each season. During this tenure, van Kempen has made 29 starts, including 14 games of the 2009 season thus far.

Former teammate Leon Williams (2005-08) holds the school record for games played with 127. van Kempen can move into the top 10 with 119.

LEADERS OF THE MAC

The Bobcats have established themselves at the top of the conference in two team and individual statistical categories. Through games of January 14, Ohio is ranked No. 1 in:

*3-Point FG Defense: The Bobcats yield just a .297 clip from beyond the arc, just ahead of Eastern Michigan's .313 mark.

*Assist-to-Turnover Ratio: The Bobcats check in with a rate of 0.98, slightly ahead of second-place Akron.

TOP TEN MAN

Freshman **D.J. Cooper** is wasting no time making sure that teams and fans around the MAC learn the Chicago native's name. Through 16 games this year, Cooper is already among the conference's top ten performers in a number of offensive categories. He is first in the conference in assists (5.63) and steals (2.81), third in assist-to-turnover ratio (1.91), tied for third in minutes (33.75), eighth in free throw percentage (.803).

STREAK ENDED

With their 71-46 win over Lamar on Nov. 23, the Bobcats extended their non-conference home winning streak to 30 games, a run that dated back to Nov. 29, 2004. During that time, Ohio registered victories over the likes of Butler, George Mason, New Mexico State and Tulsa at the Convo. However, that streak came to an end on Dec. 9 when Austin Peay overcame a 10-point halftime deficit to win 68-66.

Ohio is now 12-1 at the Convo under John Groce against non-conference opponents. The Bobcats have posted a 67-11 (.859) mark at the Convo (against all opponents) since the beginning of the 2004-05 season.

CAREER MARKS

The balanced offensive performance against Lamar on Nov. 23 led to a few individual career highs for the Bobcats.

Freshman guard D.J. Cooper had a (then) career-best 16 points and two blocks, while Kenneth van Kempen tied his career-high with 11 rebounds. Freshman forward Reggie

Keely tied his career-high with six rebounds. David McKinley also hit his first free throws against the Cardinals. Cooper snared a career-best five steals in the loss to Pittsburgh.

CONTROLLING THE BOARDS

Ohio's impressive performance on the boards in the season opener against Ohio Valley University marked the first time Ohio had pulled down more than 50 rebounds in more than seven seasons. Ohio's 63 rebounds against Ohio Valley University on Nov. 13, while not a school record, was the Bobcats' best since the 2001-02 season.

Ohio collected 61 rebounds against Akron on Jan. 8, 2002 in a four-overtime MAC contest. The school record stands at 89 rebounds, set against Northern Illinois on Dec. 6, 1965.

COOPER STRONG OUT OF THE GATE

Bobcat fans caught a glimpse of **D.J. Cooper's** on-court awareness during the preseason, but the 5-11 guard waited until it was official to make his presence known, coming close to a triple-double in his first-ever collegiate contest.

Against Ohio Valley on Nov. 13, Cooper scored 13 points, dished out 12 assists and collected seven rebounds.

ALREADY MAKING A DENT IN THE RECORD BOOKS

Just one game into his career in the Green and White, **D.J. Cooper** has already etched his name into the school record books. His 12 assists against Ohio Valley ties him for fifth all-time for assists in a single game.

The last Bobcat to record 10 or more assists in a single contest was Bubba Walther, who also dished out 12 assists in a March 18, 2008 contest at the Convo against Brown.

SENIOR SETTING CAREER MARKS ON THE BOARDS

Senior center **Kenneth van Kempen** pulled down 10 rebounds against Ohio Valley in the Bobcats' season opener on Nov. 13th. The total bested the senior's previous career high by four.

Just four days later, van Kempen bested his own mark again, pulling down 11 rebounds against NC A&T and duplicated that feat the next time out against Lamar.

SAYLES STRONG IN RETURN TO COURT

Redshirt Junior **Asown Sayles**, who sat out the 2008-09 season after undergoing shoulder surgery, set seven new career marks in his very first collegiate start. Among Sayles' marks were nine rebounds, four points and two blocks in Ohio's season opener against Ohio Valley on Nov. 13.

NCAA YEAR IN RESIDENCY

Ohio currently has two players sitting out their required NCAA Year In Residency.

Armon Bassett, who transferred to Ohio from UAB in the middle of the 2008-09 season will be eligible to suit up for the

Bobcats, beginning with Saturday's game versus Marshall.

Junior **Alex Kellogg**, who transferred to Ohio from Providence at the conclusion of the 2008-09 season, will practice with the Bobcats this season and prepare to make this debut in the Green and White at the start of the 2010-2011 season.

GROCE SIGNS FOUR NEW BOBCATS

Ohio head men's basketball coach John Groce announced another highly-regarded signing class this fall with the additions of **T.J. Hall** (Gainesville, Fla.), **Ethan Jacobs** (Tipton, Ind.), **Ricardo Johnson** (Covington, Ky.) and **Nick Kellogg** (Columbus, Ohio).

Hall, a 6-6 forward, is a three-star prospect according to FloridaProspects.com. He was coached at Gainesville High School by Kelly Beckham and the Florida Elite AAU Program by Conrad Foss, which also produced current Ohio sophomore Steven Coleman.

Hall's Gainesville squad won the 5A state championship as a junior with a 29-3 record. In the title game, Hall notched 21 points, including a 5-7 effort from 3-point range after posting eight points, 10 boards and six assists in the state semifinal. Hall received a grade of 85 in ESPN.com's recruiting rankings and was listed as the #78 small forward.

Jacobs, a two-star recruit according to Scout.com, is a 6-10 center who checked in at #255 in HoopScoop's senior rankings and was listed as the #23 center. He plays at Tipton High School for head coach Brad Dickey and was a member of the Spiece Indy Heat AAU Program that is directed by Todd Hensley. Jacobs received a grade of 86 in ESPN.com's recruiting rankings.

Jacobs' Tipton squad notched a 23-3 mark last season, losing to Ft. Wayne Bishop Luers (the eventual state champion 60-53 in the regional).

Johnson, a 6'5" three-star recruit according to Scout.com and Rivals.com, was listed 83rd in the class of 2010 by MaxPreps.com and checked in as the 18th-best wing forward. He received a grade of 90 in ESPN.com's recruiting rankings.

Johnson is an athletic wing, who averaged 11.1 points, 5.0 rebounds and 3.4 assists as a junior while leading his team to the Kentucky state championship, where he was named Tourney MVP. As a sophomore, Johnson helped lead his team to a 34-3 record and a runner-up finish in the state tournament.

Kellogg, the younger brother of current Bobcat junior Alex Kellogg, helped lead his St. Francis DeSales High School team to back-to-back state Final Fours. The 6'2" combo guard was rated #204 in HoopScoop's senior rankings and was listed as the 65th-best "2 Guard" in the class. He also received a grade of 87 in ESPN.com's recruiting rankings and checked in as the 62nd-best "point guard" in the class.



JOHN GROCE

HEAD COACH » SECOND SEASON » TAYLOR '94

There is a fire that burns inside John Groce, a determination to succeed at the highest levels. In more than a decade working for some of the titans of the college basketball world, he earned a reputation that included traits such as passionate, driven, tireless and bright.

The work that Groce has put in over the last 15 years has given him an ample taste of that success. He has reached the postseason 13 times in his 15 years on the collegiate sidelines, helping guide teams to a Final Four, two Elite Eights, a National Invitation Tournament championship and numerous conference titles.

As he enters his second season as head coach at Ohio University, Groce has wasted no time instilling that same fire into every facet of the Bobcat program.

Immediately upon his hire as the 16th head coach in Ohio history, Groce set about laying the foundation of his trademark offensive style: a high-powered, aggressive system that paid tangible dividends in 2008-09. Six Ohio players met or exceeded their previous career-high scoring averages and five shot better than 40 percent from the field in 2008-09, as the Bobcats paced the Mid-American Conference with an average of 13.6 assists per game.

Touted as an "offensive genius" by former protege Greg Oden, Groce's high-octane style also led to a banner year for the Bobcats from beyond the arc. Ohio took advantage of open looks created on the break to lead the MAC in three-point field goal percentage for the first time in program history. The Bobcats finished the season with a 36.3-percent mark from long distance, matching the ninth-best single-season output in school history, while its 208 trifectas equaled the fifth-best total by a Bobcat squad.

While Groce's attacking style of play undoubtedly led to results on the court, it also benefited the Ohio players when it came time for the 2009 postseason awards. The Bobcats sent three representatives to the All-MAC teams following Groce's first campaign on the sidelines, as Jerome Tillman was named to the first team, Michael Allen was an honorable mention selection and Steven Coleman earned a spot on the All-Freshman Team. The All-MAC status wasn't the only honor bestowed upon Tillman after a year in the John Groce system, as he also picked up NABC All-District 14, MAC Report Online Player of the Year and MidAmPub.com Player of the Year accolades after finishing third in the league in scoring and second in rebounding.

Already known as one of the premier recruiters in the college game, Groce and his staff enjoyed an off-court success of a different kind during the 2008-09 season as their five-player 2009 recruiting class was regarded as the 10th-best in the country among mid-majors by ESPN.com and one of the top-70 in the nation overall by Hoop Scoop Online. Two members of the class – point guard D.J. Cooper and small forward Marquis Horne – were named the best incoming players at their position in the MAC by Rivals.com, while all five were nominated for McDonald's High School All-America status during their final prep campaigns.

Since his first day on the job, Groce, a former teacher, has also placed great importance on the academic success of the Ohio program. Each of Groce's first two quarters on the job saw the Bobcats post team grade-point averages that rank among the five-best in the 15 academic quarters since the beginning of the 2004-05 school year. Under his tutelage, seven different Ohio players have earned an individual GPA of 3.00 or better for a quarter a combined 13 times.

Prior to his arrival in Athens, Groce spent four seasons on staff at Ohio State, the final two as associate head coach. During his tenure, he helped the Buckeyes to 105 victories, including a school-record 35 wins in 2006-07, a pair of outright Big Ten regular-season titles, two NCAA Tournament appearances, a berth in the 2007 NCAA National Championship game and the 2008 NIT title.

Groce was also heavily involved in recruiting at Ohio State and played a vital role in bringing future first-round NBA draft-picks Greg Oden, Mike Conley, Jr., and Daequan Cook to Columbus, earning him the title of Rivals.com Recruiter of the Year in 2006. His 2007 class at OSU, which featured a five-star prospect and two four-star recruits, was also ranked sixth in the nation.

Groce's talent didn't go unnoticed at the national level during his time at Ohio State, as Jeff Goodman of FoxSports.com recognized him as one of the top-10 high-major assistant coaches in the country in May of 2008. The previous summer also saw Groce receive praise from the national basketball media, as Bob McClellan of Rivals.com anointed him the assistant coach from across the country most ready to lead his own program.

The Danville, Ind., native began his coaching career in 1993 as an assistant at his alma mater, Taylor University, in Upland, Ind. During that time, Taylor posted a 71-28 record and earned a pair of trips to the NAIA national tournament. He helped the Trojans to a 29-5 record and a No. 1 national ranking in 1994.

Groce broke into Division I basketball as a member of Herb Sendek's staff at NC State in 1996, ultimately serving as an assistant with the Wolfpack from 1996-00. NCSU earned postseason bids in each of his four years on the sidelines, including a trip to the 2000 NIT semifinals. With his hiring at Ohio, Groce became the eighth former Sendek assistant to ascend to the Division I head coaching ranks.

In 2000-01, Groce moved on to Butler, where he joined Thad Matta's staff for the first of his eight years working with the current Ohio State head coach. With Groce on the bench, the Bulldogs captured both the Midwestern College Conference regular-season and tournament crowns, and advanced to the second round of the NCAA Tournament.

Groce accompanied Matta to Xavier in 2001, helping lead the Musketeers to a 78-23 overall record and an appearance in the NCAA Tournament in each of his three seasons on staff. The crown jewel of Groce's time in Cincinnati was a berth in the 2004 NCAA Elite Eight.

After starring for current Iowa head coach Todd Lickliter at Danville High School, Groce played basketball for three years at Taylor, helping the Trojans to a composite 86-18 record and three trips to the NAIA Tournament, including a NAIA Final Four bid in 1991. He earned a bachelor's degree in mathematics from Taylor in 1994.

Born on Sept. 7, 1971, in Muncie, Ind., Groce and his wife, Allison, have two sons, Conner and Camden.
