THE TIP-OFF

Winners of four in a row, Ohio will face its first road test of the MAC slate when it visits Miami on Wednesday ... Ohio head coach John Groce will be looking to become just the second floor general in school history to win his first MAC road game ... With a win, the Bobcats will start the MAC season with a pair of wins for the third time in the last four year ... Each of the previous two occasions featured two home games ... The last time Ohio got off to a 2-0 start in MAC play with at least one road game was the 2001-02 season.

WHO'S HOT

Senior forward **Jerome Tillman** is averaging 20.3 points and 10.3 rebounds per contest during Ohio's four-game winning streak ... Senior guard **Michael Allen** has tallied 23 assists and turned the ball over just three times - an assist-to-turnover ratio of 7.7-1 - in Ohio's last four outings ... Senior forward **Justin Orr** has scored in double figures in five of the Bobcats' last six games ... Sophomore guard **Tommy Freeman** has connected on nine of his last 18 three-point field goal attempts ... Freeman has reached double digits in points in two of the team's last three games.

NOTABLES FROM THE KENT STATE GAME

The Bobcats' victory over KSU extended their winning streak in MAC home openers to four ... The win also marked the third time in the last four years that Ohio has captured its league debut ... The victory over KSU was Ohio's fifth in the last seven meetings between the two teams in Athens ... The Bobcats converted 12-of-12 free throws with less than five minutes left in the game to seal the victory ... Ohio won the rebounding battle (40-35) for the third time in as many games ... Ohio's bench outscored KSU's reserves, 19-2.

UP NEXT

The Bobcats will play their second-straight divisional road game on Saturday when it visits Buffalo for a 4 p.m. tip ... Ohio holds a 20-4 (.833) advantage in the all-time series with the Bulls, and have won four of the last five meetings between the two teams.

BOBCATS SEE IMPROVED FIELD GOAL PERCENTAGE ON BOTH ENDS DURING WINNING STREAK

During the course of its four-game winning streak, Ohio has been shooting the ball with an elevated level of efficiency, while also making life harder for opponents on the other end of the floor.

The Bobcats are shooting 44.7 percent from the field during their three-game run, an improvement of nearly two percent over their mark of 43.0 from the season's first 10 games.

Meanwhile, Ohio has held opponents to just a 39.5 percent clip from the floor in its last 10 games, a difference of 6.2 percent from the 45.7 it was yielding in the previous 10 games.

OHIO TAKING CARE OF BUSINESS FROM THE LINE LATE IN GAMES

After knocking down all 12 of its free throw attempts in the final 4:43 of regulation in its victory over Kent State in the MAC opener, Ohio is shooting is 77.8 percent (56-of-72) from the line as a team in the last five minutes of games this season. Seniors **Michael Allen** and **Justin Orr** and junior **Kenneth van Kempen** have combined to sink a perfect 19-of-19 shots from the charity stripe with less than five minutes on the clock this season.

The Bobcats' home victory over Tulsa on Dec. 3 was also secured at the line in the latter stages of the game, as Ohio knocked down 9-of-11 attempts in the last 2:25 of regulation to capture a 12-point win.

FREEMAN FEELIN' IT IN SECOND HALF OF WIN OVER KENT STATE

Though he entered the locker room at the break after netting only five points in the first half of Ohio's win over Kent State on Jan. 11, the game's second half quickly became the **Tommy Freeman Show**. The sophomore guard poured in 13 second-half points en route to equaling his career high with 18 on the day, as he connected on 4-of-7 shots from the floor and 3-of-5 from long distance after halftime.

The manner in which Freeman went about scoring those 13 points is also noteworthy as each of them came in a 7:18 stretch (11:42-4:24), accounting for 13 of the Bobcats' 18 points during that time.

TILLMAN SCORCHING THE TWINE FOR OHIO

If senior forward **Jerome Tillman** has felt any lingering effects from a 4-of-14 day from the floor at Delaware on Dec. 13, they haven't shown on the court. The MAC's leading scorer has hit 31-of-46 field goal attempts in Ohio's last five games, a smoldering shooting performance of 67.4 percent.

On Jan. 3, Tillman matched his career high with 10 field goals on just 16 attempts en route to a career-best 28 points in the Bobcats' victory over Bucknell.

TILLMAN FEELING FINE AT THE LINE

Senior forward **Jerome Tillman** has made 22 of his last 25 free throw attempts heading into Wednesday's matchup with Miami. His streak of 15 in a row was halted in the win over Kent State, as he finished the day 7-of-10 in Ohio's MAC-opening 71-65 victory.

On the year, Tillman is shooting a team-high 78.9 percent from the free throw line, nearly six percent better than his career 73.6 clip.

Interviews at away games should be arranged with Cory Walton. If scheduled in advance, phone interviews will also be available.

SECOND-HALF STEVE

Freshman guard **Steven Coleman** was a major contributor to Ohio's explosive second-half performance against Kent State on Jan. 11, shooting 2-of-3 from the floor en route to scoring five of his eight points on the day after the break.

That performance, however, was just a microcosm of his second-half success this season. Through 14 games, Coleman is shooting 53.4 percent (31-of-58) from the floor and 89.2 percent (15-of-17) from the line in the second half.

Another telling stat is the fact that Ohio is 7-2 on the year when Coleman shoots 50 percent or better after the break.

ALLEN FEELING GENEROUS AND STINGY AT THE SAME TIME

In 46-career games at Ohio, senior guard **Michael Allen** has dished out 199 total assists, while recording five or more assists in a game on 19 occasions.

Allen has also been stingy with the ball in those 19 games, turning it over just 51 times in comparison to 123 assists. His assist-to-turnover ratio in games in which he hands out at least five assists is 2.41-1, while his overall career mark currently stands at 1.86-1.

After torching Bucknell for nine assists without turning the ball over in the Bobcats' win over Bucknell on Jan. 3, Allen handed out six dimes compared to just one turnover on Jan. 11 as Ohio kicked off MAC play with a 71-65 win over Kent State.

BOBCATS MUDDYING THE WATERS AT HOME

One of the key factors in Ohio's 6-0 start at home is the fact that the Bobcats are turning their opponents over at a rate of 17.7 times per game at The Convo this season. The Green & White forced Holy Cross into a season-high 27 miscues on Dec. 22, while just one of the six teams to visit Athens this season (Bucknell) has been able to escape The Convo with fewer than 17 turnovers.

Visiting teams have also seen their efficiency numbers decline after meeting the Bobcats on their home court, collecting a combined 66 assists in response to the 106 turnovers - an assist-to-turnover ratio of just 0.62-1.

GETTING IT DONE AT HOME

With their 85-67 win over Bucknell on Jan. 3, the Bobcats extended their non-conference home winning streak to 26 games, a run that dates back to Nov. 29, 2004. During that time, Ohio has registered victories over the likes of Butler, George Mason, New Mexico State and Tulsa at The Convo.

SECOND VERSE DIFFERENT THAN THE FIRST

Despite trailing at the half in nine of their 14 contests this season, Ohio is +56 in the second half this season, outscoring its opponents, 537-481, after the break.

Down by four, 30-26, to Kent State at the break on Jan. 11, the Bobcats responded with a 45-35 second-half outburst to capture a six-point victory in their MAC opener. The effort marked the sixth time in 14 games this season that Ohio played its way to a double-digit cushion in the second half.

The 17-point second-half cushion Ohio enjoyed against William & Mary in the season opener was its largest since doubling up George Mason, 50-25, on Feb. 23, 2008.

TILLMAN IN MIDST OF LENGTHY DOUBLE-FIGURE STREAK

Dating back to last season, senior forward **Jerome Tillman** has scored in double figures in 19-straight games, and 22 of his last 23 outings overall.

The last time Tillman was held below 10 points was March 1, 2008 at Miami, when he netted a half dozen on just six shots attempts.

DOUBLE-DOUBLES STACKING UP FOR TILLMAN

Ohio's leader in both points and rebounds per game, senior forward **Jerome Tillman** has registered a double-double in six of the Bobcats' 14 contests this season.

Since notching his first-career double-double in the 2005-06 season opener, Tillman has accomplished the feat 24 times in 79 outings, or roughly one time in every three contests.

TILLMAN CLIMBING OHIO'S CAREER SCORING LIST

With 16 points in Ohio's win over Kent State on Jan. 11, senior forward **Jerome Tillman** moved past Vic Alexander to take sole possession of 15th place on Ohio's career scoring list with 1,335 points.

Already one of just 17 players in school history with 1,300-career points, Tillman will take the court on Wednesday with his sights set on Ohio Athletics Hall of Fame member Robert Tatum, who stands just 13 points away in 14th place (1,348). The following is a snapshot of where Tillman currently stands on the program's all-time chart:

TILLMAN KEEPING ELITE COMPANY IN OHIO RECORD BOOKS

During his ascent up Ohio's career scoring chart this season, senior forward **Jerome Tillman** has moved past six members of the Ohio Athletics Hall of Fame on the program's all-time ledger.

Tillman began to make his move when he passed both Lewis Geter and Frankie Baumholtz - Ohio's first All-American - in the win over Austin Peay. He proceeded to surpass John Canine, Bunk Adams and Jerry Jackson before his 14 points against Marshall on Dec. 17 propelled him ahead of Don Hilt and into 19th place on the program's career list.

With 1,335 points to his credit, the next Ohio Hall of Fame member on Tillman's radar is Robert Tatum, who currently stands in 14th place with 1,348-career points.

TILLMAN AMONG MOST PROLIFIC FREE THROW SHOOTERS IN SCHOOL HISTORY

Currently in the midst of his finest statistical season from the free throw line, senior forward **Jerome Tillman** has also made a dent in Ohio's career free throw lists this year.

OHIO SIGNS TOUTED FOUR-PLAYER CLASS

Ohio University head men's basketball coach John Groce has announced the signing of D.J. Cooper, Marquis Horne, Reggie Keely and James Kinney to National Letters of Intent.

D.J. COOPER - CHICAGO, ILL.

A three-star recruit out of Seton Academy, Cooper was ranked 21st nationally among point guards by Scout.com, and also placed 30th on ESPN.com's rating. He is also the second-ranked point guard prospect in Illinois, as well as the state's No. 12 overall recruit, according to ChicagoHoops.com, and has been named a candidate for the 2009 McDonald's All-America Game.

MARQUIS HORNE - CINCINNATI, OHIO

Horne, a 6-6, 185-pound three-star prospect from Princeton High School, averaged 12 points and seven rebounds per game as a small forward in 2007-08. For his efforts as a junior, Horne was recognized with Cincinnati Enquirer honorable mention All-Division I and first-team All-Greater Miami Conference honors. He is rated the 10th-best overall prospect in Ohio by Rivals.com, and All-Ohio Basketball listed him at No. 14 on its ranking of Class of 2009 recruits.

REGGIE KEELY - UNIVERSITY HEIGHTS, OHIO

Keely, a two-star prospect out of Cleveland Heights High School, averaged 18 points, eight rebounds and two blocks per game as a junior en route to earning Division I honorable mention and Hoop Scoop Online all-state honors. Named a top-100 power forward prospect, the 6-8, 230-pound Keely was also ranked the No. 8 prospect in Ohio by Rivals.com, as well as the ninth-best player in the state by both All-Ohio Basketball and Hoop Scoop Online.

JAMES KINNEY - CHAMPAIGN, ILL.

A two-star guard, the 6-1, 150-pound Kinney posted averages of 16 points and more than six assists per game as a junior at Centennial High School in 2007-08, earning honorable mention all-state accolades from the Champaign News-Gazette. The same publication has also included Kinney on its first-team all-area and All-Big 12 Conference squads in each of the last two seasons. Prior to the beginning of his senior year, he was also selected to the 6-3 Club for elite high school guards by MidStateHoops.com.

His 353-career makes from the charity stripe currently rank eighth in program history, leaving him a dozen shy of tying Sanjay Adell's seventh-place total of 365. Tillman's 480-career attempts are also currently eighth on the program ledger, 22 away from tying Bunk Adams for seventh place (502).

TILLMAN CLOSING IN ON ANOTHER CAREER LIST

Already in 15th place on the program's career scoring chart, senior forward **Jerome Tillman** has his eyes on Ohio's career rebounding chart, as well.

With a game-high nine against Kent State on Jan. 11, Tillman increased his career total to 736 boards, and needs 47 more to tie Don Hilt's total of 783 for 10th place in program annals.

BOBCATS SEEING BALANCE FROM BALLHANDLERS

Through 12 games this season, Ohio's primary ballhandlers have each taken a prominent role in directing the offense. Senior **Michael Allen** has led the Bobcats or shared the team lead in assists nine times, while freshman **Steven Coleman** has paced the squad five times and fellow rookie **Frankie Dobbs** has done so on three occasions.

Prior to the Xavier game, when sophomore forward **DeVaughn Washington** handed out a team-leading four assists, at least one member of the triumvirate had led or shared the team high in seven-straight games to open the campaign.

TOMMY THREE-MAN

Sophomore guard **Tommy Freeman** has taken well to his new role as one of the Bobcats' sharpshooters this season, as evidenced by the fact that 26 of his 34 field goals (76.5 percent) and 59 of his 83 field goal attempts (71.1) have come from beyond the arc.

Freeman also displayed his knack for knocking down trifectas in limited playing time as a freshman last year. In 44 career games, Freeman has made 75.0 percent (39-of-52) of his field goals and taken 74.6 percent (94-of-126) of his shots from long distance.

SECOND-HALF EXPLOSION LEADS TO VICTORY OVER BUCKNELL

Leading Bucknell by six points, 37-31, at the break on Jan. 3, the Bobcats came out of the locker room with a vengeance, outscoring the Bison by a count of 48-36 in the second half to secure an 85-67 victory.

Ohio shot a scorching 58.1 percent (18-of-31) from the floor in the second period, led by a 7-of-9 performance from senior forward **Jerome Tillman**. The Bobcats were also able to pull away on the strength of a 20-15 second-half rebounding advantage, as Tillman hauled in eight of his game-high 15 after the break.

WASHINGTON CLOSES OUT DECEMBER ON A HOT STREAK

After chipping in with nine points on 4-of-7 shooting in the victory over St. Francis on Dec. 30, sophomore forward **DeVaughn Washington** finished a stretch that saw him average 13.0 per game, while shooting 59.0 percent (23-of-39) from the floor, in Ohio's last four December outings.

He was also active on the glass at both ends of the floor, averaging a team-high 7.0 rebounds per game during that stretch, leading the

team in three of the four outings. Thirteen of Washington's 28 boards (46.4 percent) in that stretch came on the offensive end.

ORR NAMED OHIO'S THIRD TEAM CAPTAIN

Senior forward **Justin Orr** was named a team captain by head coach **John Groce** in early December, joining fellow seniors **Michael Allen** and **Jerome Tillman** in that role. Orr and Allen are both first-time team captains, while Tillman is reprising the duty he held a year ago, making him Ohio's first two-time captain since the 1972-73 and 1973-74 seasons.

TILLMAN NAMED TO MARQUES MAYBIN CLASSIC ALL-TOURNAMENT TEAM

After turning in two 20-point scoring games and a double-double in his three outings in Louisville, senior forward **Jerome Tillman** was named to the Marques Maybin Classic All-Tournament Team.

Tillman averaged 21.3 points and 9.7 rebounds per game at the tournament, while also shooting 85.7 percent (24-of-28) from the free throw line in the three games.

COLEMAN DOUBLES UP ON AUSTIN PEAY

Nearly three years had passed since Leon Williams scored 29 points and grabbed 15 rebounds in the 2005 MAC title game on March 12, 2005, marking the last time an Ohio freshman posted a double-double.

Freshman guard **Steven Coleman** put an end to that drought at Austin Peay on Nov. 22, finishing with 21 points and 10 boards in a 79-68 Ohio victory. Not only was Coleman's effort the first double-double by a Bobcat frosh since the day Williams carried Ohio to its last NCAA Tournament berth, but it also marked the most points scored by an Ohio freshman since that day.

BOBCATS EARN HIGHEST TEAM GPA IN A HALF DOZEN QUARTERS

Ohio recorded a team grade-point average of 2.53 during the fall quarter, its highest team mark since the spring term of the 2006-07 academic year. The academic performance was also the fourth-highest single-quarter output in records dating back to the 2004-05 school year, a span of 13 quarters.

In addition to the team academic success, four Ohio players - senior guard **Michael Allen**, senior forward **Jerome Tillman**, junior center **Kenneth van Kempen** and freshman guard **Frankie Dobbs** - all earned GPA's of 3.00 or better during the fall term.

GROCE CONTINUES TRADITION OF STRONG DEBUTS BY OHIO HEAD COACHES

With the Bobcats' season-opening win over William & Mary on Nov. 16, John Groce became the fourth-straight Ohio head coach, and ninth overall, to win his first game on the sidelines.

The victory also improved first-year Ohio head coaches' record to 8-5 when leading the team for the first time at home, and 3-1 when doing so at The Convo.

TILLMAN LEADS ACTIVE MAC PLAYERS IN POINTS AND REBOUNDS

Senior forward **Jerome Tillman** is the MAC's active leader in both points and rebounds, with 1,335 and 736, respectively, to his credit.

He is also the top returning rebounder in the conference, averaging 7.6 boards per game last season, and the league's sixth-leading returning scorer.

This season, he will look to become just the third Ohio player since 1946 to lead the team in scoring for a second time with a year in between those two seasons.

OHIO TAKES ITS FIRST-CLASS SCHEDULE TO ANOTHER LEVEL

In a four-day period from Dec. 7-10, the Bobcats squared off with Louisville and Xavier, ranked 11th and 10th, respectively, at the time of the games.

Prior to that stretch, the last time Ohio had faced two top-11 teams in the same regular season was the 1962-63 season, when it played two games against a Loyola-Chicago team that was ranked in the top-five on both occasions.

The Louisville and Xavier games also marked just the third time in program history that the Green & White had met two top-11 teams in the same regular season.

BOBCATS PICKED FIFTH IN MAC EAST

Ohio was selected to finish in the MAC East this season, as voted upon by the league's coaches, media and sports information directors. The race in the East was a tight one, as only four votes separated third-place Bowling Green from the Bobcats in the fifth position. Akron is sandwiched by BGSU and Ohio in fourth place.

TILLMAN EARNS SECOND-STRAIGHT PRESEASON ALL-MAC NOD

Senior forward **Jerome Tillman** was one of 10 players named to the preseason All-MAC team in October by a vote of the league's coaches and media. The selection marked the second-straight season in which the two-time all-conference pick graced the preseason squad.

Tillman is the only two-time preseason honoree on the East squad, while he and Eastern Michigan's Carlos Medlock were the only repeat honorees from a year ago.

TILLMAN TABBED PRESEASON MAC PLAYER OF THE YEAR BY BLUE RIBBON

The leading returning rebounder and sixth-leading returning scorer in the MAC this season, senior forward **Jerome Tillman** was named the league's Preseason Player of the Year by Blue Ribbon when the publication released its annual conference forecast on Sept. 24.

Tillman was also named to the five-player preseason all-conference squad, along with David Kool of Western Michigan, Al Fisher of Kent State, Carlos Medlock of Eastern Michigan and Miami's Michael Bramos.



BLUE RIBBON TOUTS BOBCATS' FRONT COURT AS LEAGUE'S BEST

With two returning starters and five letterwinners back in the fold this season, Blue Ribbon selected Ohio's frontcourt as the top unit in the MAC heading into the 2008-09 campaign. The Bobcats edged Miami and Eastern Michigan, respectively, to earn the billing.

THE FRIENDLY CONFINES

Since opening the doors to the Convocation Center for the 1968-69 season, Ohio has posted a 388-120 (.764) mark on its home floor. The Bobcats' home tradition is very much alive, as they've posted a 55-6 (.902) record at The Convo since the beginning of the 2004-05 campaign.

GROCE LOOKING TO JOIN SELECT GROUP OF OHIO HEAD COACHES

The 16th head men's basketball coach in the history of Ohio University, the John Groce Era officially dawned on June 27, 2008. The Danville, Ind., native will enter the 2008-09 season looking to become the sixth Ohio leader, and fourth in a row, to guide the Bobcats to a winning season in his first campaign.

Groce will have history on his side as he strives to accomplish that feat, as four of the previous five Ohio head coaches who took over after a winning season went on to post a record of .500 or better in their first year on the bench. The Bobcats went 20-13 a season ago.

BOBCATS CONTINUE HISTORY OF EXCELLENCE IN THE CLASSROOM

Data recently released by the NCAA showed that student-athletes who entered the Ohio men's basketball program between 1998 and 2001 boasted a Graduation Success Rate (GSR) of 80 percent, a mark that stands 18 points higher than the Division I national average.

The release also indicated that student-athletes who entered Ohio University for the 2001-02 school year posted a graduation rate of 74 percent, while overall Ohio student body checked in at 71 percent.

BOBCATS BRING BASSETT INTO THE FOLD

Ohio head coach **John Groce** announced on Jan. 2 that guard **Armon Bassett** has enrolled at the University and joined the men's basketball program.

Bassett, who spent the first two years of his career at Indiana, was a third-team All-Big Ten selection last season after leading the league in three-point field goal percentage. In 61-career games for the Hoosiers, he averaged 10.4 points, 3.2 assists and 2.5 rebounds per game, while leading IU to a pair of NCAA Tournament berths.

A junior, Bassett will be eligible to compete for Ohio at the conclusion of the 2009 fall quarter.

JOHN GROCE

HEAD COACH » FIRST SEASON » TAYLOR '94

In more than a decade as an assistant or associate head coach for some of the titans of the college basketball coaching world, John Groce has earned a reputation that includes words like passionate, knowledgeable, tireless, bright and thorough. On June 27, 2008, those qualities were bestowed upon the Ohio University men's basketball program when Director of Athletics Jim Schaus introduced Groce as the 16th head coach in school history.

Recognized in the last year by both Fox Sports and Rivals.com as one of the nation's top assistants, Groce (pronounced Gross) has reached the postseason 13 times in his 14 years on the collegiate sidelines. He has helped guide teams to a Final Four, two Elite Eights, a National Invitation Tournament championship and multiple conference titles.

Prior to his arrival in Athens, Groce spent four seasons on staff at Ohio State, the final two as associate head coach. During his tenure, he helped the Buckeyes to 105 victories, including a school-record 35 wins in 2006-07, a pair of outright Big Ten regular-season titles, two NCAA Tournament appearances, a berth in the 2007 NCAA National Championship game and the 2008 NIT title.

"I am very grateful for the opportunity to be the head coach at Ohio University," Groce said at his introductory press conference. "I appreciate the board of trustees, Dr. McDavis and Jim Schaus affording me and my family the chance to be part of the Bobcat community. We look forward to the transition and are very excited about the opportunity we have to positively impact the basketball program, the University and the Athens community at large."

Groce was also heavily involved in recruiting at Ohio State and played a vital role in bringing future first-round NBA draft picks Greg Oden, Mike Conley, Jr., and Daequan Cook to Columbus, earning him the title of Rivals.com Recruiter of the Year in 2006. His 2007 class at OSU, which featured a five-star prospect and two four-star recruits, was also ranked sixth in the nation.

The Danville, Ind., native began his coaching career in 1993 as an assistant at his alma mater, Taylor University, in Upland, Ind. During that time, Taylor posted a 71-28 record and earned a pair of trips to the NAIA national tournament. He helped the Trojans to a 29-5 record and a No. 1 national ranking in 1994.

Groce broke into Division I basketball as a member of Herb Sendek's staff at NC State in 1996, ultimately serving as an assistant with the Wolfpack from 1996-00. NCSU earned postseason bids in each of his four years on the sidelines, including a trip to the 2000 NIT semifinals.

With his hiring at Ohio, Groce became the eighth former Sendek assistant to ascend to the Division I head coaching ranks.

In 2000-01, Groce moved on to Butler, where he joined Thad Matta's staff for the first of his eight years working with the current Ohio State head coach. With Groce on the bench, the Bulldogs captured both the Midwestern College Conference regular-season and tournament crowns, and advanced to the second round of the NCAA Tournament.

Groce accompanied Matta to Xavier in 2001, helping lead the Musketeers to a 78-23 overall record and an appearance in the NCAA Tournament in each of his three seasons on staff. The crown jewel of Groce's time in Cincinnati was a berth in the 2004 NCAA Elite Eight.

After starring for current Iowa head coach Todd Lickliter at Danville High School, Groce played basketball for three years at Taylor, helping the Trojans to a composite 86-18 record and three trips to the NAIA Tournament, including an NAIA Final Four bid in 1991. He earned a bachelor's degree in mathematics from Taylor in 1994.

Born on Sept. 7, 1971, in Muncie, Ind., Groce and his wife, Allison, have a son named Conner.
