- Kent State went 4-8 in 2008 with wins over Delaware State, Miami, Temple and Buffalo. It suffered defeats at the hands of Boston College, Kentucky, Louisiana-Lafayette, Ball State, Akron, Ohio, Bowling Green and Northern Illinois.

SCOUTING THE GOLDEN FLASHES

- Sophomore running back Jacquise Terry leads Kent State with 372 yards rushing on 63 carries (5.9 per carry) with three touchdowns. Freshman quarterback Spencer Keith has completed 73 of 132 passes for 892 yards with seven touchdowns and five interceptions. Freshman wideout Tyshon Goode has a team-best 20 catches for 250 yards and one touchdown.
- Junior linebacker Cobrani Mixon has 75 tackles, with nine tackles for loss and two sacks. He also has three pass breakups and one fumble recovery.
- Sophomore punter Matt Rinehart has kicked 47 times and has an average of 39.9 yards to his credit with 12 punts landing inside the 20-yard line and five touchbacks.
- Freshman kicker Freddy Cortez has converted just three of eight field goals this season, with 42 yards being his career long. He has converted 17 of 19 extra points.
- Junior running back Anthony Bowman has averaged 24.6 yards on his 24 kick returns, with one touchdown to his credit. Junior wideout Leneric Muldrow has averaged 10.8 yards on his six punt returns.

THE NATIONAL SPOTLIGHT

Ohio's defense has been among the nation's best from a statistical standpoint and the national numbers bear that out. The Bobcats lead the nation in turnovers forced (23) and fumble recovered (12). It is also tied for third in kicks/punts blocked (3), sixth in passes intercepted (11), seventh in turnover margin (1.43) and tied for ninth in passes defended (38).

CAREER DAYS

A few Bobcats had career-highs in the 28-7 win over Miami. Offensively, running back L.J. Flintall had 12 carries and 54 rushing yards. Backfield mate Donte Harden and wideout Terrence McCrae both had their multiple TD games of their careers, on the ground and in the air, respectively. Wideout Taylor Price had a career-best 25 rushing yards. Defensively, Stafford Gatling had four tackles, while fellow lineman Marcellis Williamson posted six.

MILESTONES

Quarterback Theo Scott's two touchdown passes against Miami gave him 18 for his career, which tied him for seventh all-time in Ohio's career records. He needs 11 more to tie Cleve Bryant (1967-69) for Ohio's all-time mark. Wideout LaVon Brazill also needs 130 receiving yards to reach 1,000 for his career.

TOUGH SLEDDING

The Bobcat defense yielded just seven points in the 28-7 win over Miami. That was the fewest points allowed against the RedHawks since a 20-0 blanking in 1982. Ohio also yielded just 52 yards rushing against Miami, the fewest for the program since yielding 48 in a 23-7 win over Temple in 2007.

BALL SECURITY

The Bobcats have made tremendous strides in taking care of the football this season. Dating back to the 2008 season finale at Miami, Ohio has had as many or fewer turnovers as the opposition in eight straight contests.

CLEMENS CASHES IN

Ohio linebacker Chad Clemens blocked a punt in the Bobcats' 28-7 win over Miami, setting up the Ohio offense at the five-yard line. The rejection is Ohio's third this season and it ties the program for third nationally in blocked kicks/punts.

ON PACE

Ohio freshman kicker Matt Weller has 10 field goals through the first half of the season, which is within striking distance of Michael Braunstein's single-season school record of 20 set during the 2007 season. The Ohio defense has 11 picks thus far, which is on pace for the fourth-highest single-season mark in program history.

THE AIR UP THERE...

Through seven games, Ohio has passed for 1,425 yards, a total that is on pace for fourth in the school's single-season records. It also boasts 13 touchdown passes so far, which is also on pace to break the school mark set last season (21).

BUT BACK TO THE GROUND...

The Bobcats have outgained their last three opponents (Bowling Green, Akron, Miami) in rushing yardage. The last time the program accomplished that feat against three-straight opponents was 2007 when Ohio outgained Eastern Michigan, Toledo, Bowling Green and Temple in succession.

IN NEED OF THE BIG PLAY

Much has been made of Ohio's quick-strike ability this season and with good reason. Despite piling up 189 points and 27.0 points per game this season, both of which are totals that are on pace to land in the school's all-time top 10 at season's end, the Bobcats are 116th nationally in first downs per game (15.43).

THE DAK ATTACK

Junior defensive lineman Dak Notestine had three sacks at Bowling Green, which tied Mario Daniel (vs. Ball State), Bobby Holloway (vs. Hawaii) and Andre Jackson (vs. Toledo), for the single-game school record. For his efforts, Notestine was named MAC East Defensive Player of the Week. Daniel, Holloway and Jackson all posted their records during the 1996 season. Notestine and the rest of the Ohio pass rush will be matched up with the Kent State offense, which is tied for last nationally in red zone offense (57.9 percent) and is next to last in third down conversions (20-for-91, 21.98 percent).

KEEPING AN EYE ON THE RECORD BOOK

Ohio wideout Taylor Price needs three touchdown catches to become Ohio's all-time leader in TD receptions, 10 catches to move into third in career catches and 100 yards to move into third in career receiving yards. Running back Chris Garrett needs 21 kick returns to become Ohio's all-time leader in the category and 123 all-purpose yards to move into third in career all-purpose yards.

AIR ATTACK

Quarterback Theo Scott's numbers at Tennessee not only set personal marks, it dented the Bobcat record book as well. The 30 completions tied for fourth in the school's single-game records, while the pass attempts were fifth and the passing yardage was eighth. At his current clip, Scott would break the school's mark for single-season touchdown passes, set by Boo Jackson's 19 last season.

SACKLESS

The Ohio offensive line has not allowed a sack in its last five games, the longest such streak for the program under Coach Solich. It will be put to the test this week as the Golden Flashes have registered a MAC-best 17 sacks, good enough for 39th nationally.

TURNING THEM OVER

Ohio has forced 23 turnovers in its first seven games this season, the best mark in the nation. Kent State has

HOME TEAMS IN CAPS

LIGHTS, CAMERA, ACTION!

The contest against the Huskies will be Ohio's 16th nationally-televised game in the last four years. Here's a look at how the Bobcats have fared in televised games since the start of the 2005 season.

surrendered 16 turnovers this season, a mark that is tied for 103rd nationally.

FINDING PAYDIRT

The Bobcats had been held without a rushing touchdown in each of 2009's first four games, the only program in the nation that failed to do so. Ohio corrected that issue in dramatic fashion in the 44-37 win at Bowling Green, with three rushing scores and then again versus Miami with two more. Only San Diego State, New Mexico, Miami (OH) and Washington State have fewer this season.

LOOKING AT FIFTH

Ohio head coach Frank Solich moved past Mark Banks (1913-17) for sixth on the program's all-time victories list with the win over Miami to end the 2008 season. Next up is Brian Burke who won 31 from 1979-84. Don Peden tops the list with 121 wins from 1924-46.

GETTING NON-OFFENSIVE

The Bobcats have continued a trend that has been growing for the past five seasons. Ohio got a pair of non-offensive touchdowns, courtesy of Kenny Jackson's 69-yard interception return for a touchdown at North Texas, helping an 11-point comeback by the Bobcats. The 26th touchdown since the beginning of the 2004 season came when Errik Ejike's 23-yard interception return gave the Bobcats an early lead against Cal Poly. The 27th score came on Garrett's 95-yard kickoff return for touchdown and the 28th came when LaVon Brazill raced 72 yards on a punt return at Bowling Green. Ohio made it five straight games with a non-offensive score when linebacker Melvin Payne blocked a rugby-style punt at Akron and fell on it in the end zone for a touchdown. That TD was Ohio's first blocked punt returned for a touchdown since Jordan Meyers duplicated the feat on Oct. 8, 2005. For his efforts, Payne was named MAC East Special Teams Player of the Week.

HALFTIME LEADS

With the Bobcats' 21-7 lead going into the locker room against Miami, Ohio has now led 29 times at intermission under Solich. With the win, the Bobcats are now 23-6 when taking a lead into intermission since the beginning of the 2005 season.

SCORING FIRST UNDER SOLICH

Ohio has enjoyed good success when putting the first points of the game on the board under Frank Solich. Since the beginning of the 2005 season, the Bobcats are now 14-7 when scoring first.

LOVING THE LEAGUE

The Bobcats love it when the Mid-American Conference television package appears on the schedule as they are 4-0 over the last three seasons when they appear on the conference's network. The wins are: 38-21 over Ball State (10/22/05), 27-20 over Western Michigan (10/7/06), 17-7 at Kent State (10/28/06) and 48-42 over Eastern Michigan (10/13/07).

BOBCATS WIN WHEN SCORING 28

Since the 1998 season, Ohio is 40-14 (.741) when reaching the 28-point plateau.

- In that same span, Ohio has had 15 victories when scoring less than 28 points, including five contests during the 2006 season (vs. Western Michigan 27-20; at Illinois 20-17; at Kent State 17-7; at Eastern Michigan 16-10; vs. Akron 17-7).

- Ohio is 31-9 (.775) since 1998 when scoring at least 30 points, 15-2 (.882) when putting up at least 40 points and 5-0 (1.000) when scoring at least 50 points.

JUST ELEVEN

Ohio's 11 completions at Akron are the fewest in a game for the program since it posted just nine in a 38-29 win over Miami on Nov. 24, 2007.

BRAZILL'S BLAZING SPEED

When LaVon Brazill darted through the Bowling Green punt team for a 72-yard punt return for touchdown, he dashed into Ohio's records. It was his second career punt return for touchdown, making him the fourth player in Bobcat history with multiple punt returns for touchdowns. He joined Stafford Owens (3, 2000-04), Larry Hargrove (3, 1987-89) and Dick Phillips (2, 1950-52) as the others. It also marked the 11th-longest punt return in program history.

INCOMING!

The Ohio defense allowed 390 yards passing in the 44-37 win at Bowling Green, the most for the program since yielding 405 to the Falcons in a 41-16 BG win in Peden Stadium. The Bobcats also allowed 26 first downs, the most since Miami posted 28 in Ohio's 38-29 win on 2007's Senior Day in Peden.

WELLER ON FIRE IN FIRST TWO

Ohio kicker Matt Weller bombed a 50-yard field goal in the 23-16 loss to Connecticut, which helped propel him to MAC East Special Teams Player of the Week honors. That kick tied him for 10th all-time with Gary Homer (twice) and Mike Fultz for the longest field goal in school history. The freshman from Twinsburg, Ohio also averaged 65.0 yards on his three kickoffs. He followed that performance with a 3-3 effort at North Texas, connecting on kicks of 47, 44 and 35 yards.

DEADLY ACCURATE

Quarterback Boo Jackson is currently Ohio's career leader in completion percentage and pass efficiency (min. 200 attempts) with his 60.1 completion percentage (202-336).

CROWD PLEASERS

Last season's matchup with Ohio State was the largest audience (105,002) for the Bobcats in school history. The previous record was 93,222 when Ohio last traveled to Columbus on Sept. 18, 1999. Official capacity for Ohio Sta-

Ohio has played in front of five of its eight largest crowds since Sept. 2002, including a crowd of 66,233 at Virginia Tech during the 2007 season. The Bobcats set a program record when they drew 24,617 fans to Peden Stadium in the season-opening loss to UConn. The program played in front of its second-largest crowd (95,535) in the Sept. 26th's loss at Tennessee.

NO FLY ZONE

Ohio held Cal Poly to just one completion and 12 yards passing, by far a low for an Ohio opponent since Coach Solich became head coach in 2005.

THIRD DOWN D

The Bobcats held North Texas two a 2-for-14 clip on third down, the best for the program since it posted the exact same number against Tennessee-Martin in the 2006 season opener.

OVERTIME

Ohio's game against North Texas was the first double overtime game in school history.

ROAD OPENER SUCCESS

With the win at North Texas, Ohio has won three of its last four road openers. The Bobcats defeated Louisiana-Lafayette 31-23 in 2007 and Northern Illinois 35-23 in 2006.

BOBCATS NAME CAPTAINS

The program has announced that senior quarterback Brandon Jones, senior center David White, senior linebacker Lee Renfro and junior linebacker Noah Keller have been named captains for the 2009 campaign.

PRICE NAMED TO BILETNIKOFF LIST

Ohio senior wide receiver Taylor Price (Columbus, Ohio) has been named to the Fred Biletnikoff Award watch list. Price nabbed 51 passes for 694 yards and five touchdowns last season, all of which were team-highs for the Bobcats. Fourteen of those catches came in the season opener at Wyoming, which set a school record. He also tied a school record with three touchdown receptions in the 49-42 win over Akron. Price is one of 37 players nationwide named to the watch list for the award, presented annually by the Tallahassee Quarterback Club to the top receiver in college football. The winner of the Biletnikoff Award will be announced as part of ESPN's College Football Awards Show on Dec. 10. The award will be officially presented to the winner at the annual Biletnikoff Award dinner, hosted by the Tallahassee Quarterback Club, on Feb. 12, 2010. Price's touchdown reception against Cal Poly gave him 12 for his career. That mark ties him for second on the school's all-time list with former Bobcats Andrew Mooney (2007-08) and Tom Compernelle (1983-86).

SMASHING RECORDS

The Ohio offense was a juggernaut of sorts in 2008, setting school records in single-season passing yards (2,795), single-season passing yards per game (232.9) and single-season touchdown passes (21). Individually, quarterback Boo Jackson stood out above the rest. He set school marks in single-season touchdown passes (19), single-season total offense (2,688), career completion percentage (60.5), career passing yards per attempt (7.7), career pass efficiency (137.75) and career total offense per play (6.62). He also set a single-game school record for total offense when he piled up 413 yards in the home opener against Central Michigan. Senior Chris Garrett became the first Bobcat to post two career kick returns for touchdowns when he raced 97 yards for a score on the Senior Night win over Akron. Garrett's performance helped propel him to first on Ohio's career kick return average list (26.5). However, he saved his best performance for last when he posted a school-record 321 all-purpose yards in the Bobcats' season-ending victory over Miami.

HONORED

The Ohio football squad had five student-athletes named to the All-Mid-American Conference Football teams last season. Ohio had three student-athletes named to the second team (senior defensive lineman Jameson Hartke, sophomore linebacker Noah Keller and senior offensive lineman Josh Leuck) and two to the third (junior safety Steven Jackson and senior tight end Andrew Mooney). Hartke (Centerville, Ohio) had 52 tackles, eight tackles for loss (team-high), four sacks (team-high), one interception, two pass breakups and one fumble recovery this season after making the switch to defensive tackle from his defensive end spot. A captain on this year's team, he finished second in school history for career sacks (17.5) and ninth for career tackles for loss (30.5). Keller (Kearney, Neb.) was Ohio's leading tackler this season with 104 stops (ninth in the MAC), the highest single-season school mark since linebacker Matt Muncy registered 115 in 2005. He also had five tackles for loss, one sack, one interception, two pass breakups and one forced fumble. Leuck (Omaha, Neb.) posted the highest grade among Ohio's regular rotation of offensive linemen at 88 percent. In a team-high 779 plays this season, he also posted a 74% technique grade, had 29.5 pancakes and 19 declainers while allowing just three penalties, six quarterback pressures and five sacks. Jackson (Austin, Tx.) posted 71 tackles (third-highest on the team) this season with two tackles for loss, two interceptions, four pass breakups and two forced fumbles (team-high). He was named MAC East Defensive Player of the Week on Sept. 22 of this season. Mooney (Lubbock, Tx.) had 27 catches for 287 yards and three touchdown receptions after missing three games with a knee injury. Last season, he set the school's single-season touchdown reception mark with nine and his 12 career grabs tie him for second all-time in the category.

MITCHELL SELECTED 47TH OVERALL BY THE OAKLAND RAIDERS

Ohio safety Michael Mitchell (Ft. Thomas, Ky.) was selected in the second round (47th overall) by the Oakland Raiders in the National Football League Draft. He is the highest Ohio player to be drafted since Gene Ruskowski's fifth-round selection (44th overall) by the Los Angeles Rams in 1948. The last time an Ohio student-athlete was drafted in a higher round was the Bobcats' only first round selection, Art Lewis (ninth overall) in 1936 by the New York Giants. Mitchell is the also the 28th student-athlete in Ohio history to be drafted. With the seventh-round selection of Landon Cohen by the Detroit Lions (216th overall) in 2008, this marks the first time the program has had a draft pick in back-to-back years since 1972-73 (Al Benton and David Green-1972, Dave Juenger-1973).

- Against Wyoming during the 2007 season, Garrett had his first career kickoff return for a touchdown. The 94-yard return tied then for the second-longest all-time in school history, matching a mark set in 1964 by Jerry France against Bowling Green.
- Garrett was one of several players in school history to return one kickoff for a touchdown and became the first to repeat the feat when he returned a kick 97 yards against Akron on Nov. 22, 2008. Garrett returned a punt for a touchdown during his freshman season, an 88-yarder against Western Michigan. Powered by his 95-yard kickoff return for touchdown at Tennessee, Garrett set the single-game school record with 221 kick return yards and became the school's all-time leader in kick return yardage.
