### SCOUTING THE HUSKIES

- Sophomore running back Jordan Todman is the leading returning rusher for UConn following the graduation of do-everything back Donald Brown. Todman ran for 296 yards on 47 carries with three touchdowns. Quarterbacks Cody Endres and Zach Frazer both return as well. The duo combined to complete 85 of 167 passes for two touchdowns and nine interceptions last season being starting quarterback Tyler Lorenzen. Redshirt sophomore wideout Kashif Moore also returns to the fold in 2009. A season ago, he posted a team-best 27 catches in the run-heavy offense, for 273 yards with one touchdowns.
- Redshirt junior linebacker Scott Lutrus was far and away UConn's most active defender, posting 106 tackles, with nine tackles for loss, one interception and five pass breakups.
- Senior punter Desi Cullen averaged 39.8 yards on 59 kicks last season, dropping 24 inside the 20 yard-line with five touchbacks.
- Redshirt sophomore kicker Dave Teggart converted an impressive 13 of 15 field goals last season and all 16 extra point attempts. His only two field goal misses came from 40+ yards.

### LOOKING AT FIFTH

Ohio head coach Frank Solich move past Mark Banks (1913-17) for sixth on the program's all-time victories list with the win over Miami to end the 2008 season. Next up is Brian Burke who won 31 from 1979-84. Don Peden tops the list with 121 wins from 1924-46.

### SMASHING RECORDS

The Ohio offense was a juggernaut of sorts in 2008, setting school records in single-season passing yards (2,795), single-season passing yards per game (232.9) and single-season touchdown passes (21). Individually, quarterback Boo Jackson stood out above the rest. He set school marks in single-season touchdown passes (19), single-season total offense (2,688), career completion percentage (60.5), career passing yards per attempt (7.7), career pass efficiency (137.75) and career total offense per play (6.62). He also set a single-game school record for total offense when he piled up 413 yards in the home opener against Central Michigan. Senior Chris Garrett became the first Bobcat to post two career kick returns for touchdowns when he raced 97 yards for a score on the Senior Night win over Akron. Garrett's performance helped propel him to first on Ohio's career kick return average list (26.5). However, he saved his best performance for last when he posted a school-record 321 all-purpose yards in the Bobcats' season-ending victory over Miami.

### HONORED

The Ohio football squad had five student-athletes named to the All-Mid-American Conference Football teams last season. Ohio had three student-athletes named to the second team (senior defensive lineman Jameson Hartke, sophomore linebacker Noah Keller and senior offensive lineman Josh Leuck) and two to the third (junior safety Steven Jackson and senior tight end Andrew Mooney). Hartke (Centerville, Ohio) had 52 tackles, eight tackles for loss (team-high), four sacks (team-high), one interception, two pass breakups and one fumble recovery this season after making the switch to defensive tackle from his defensive end spot. A captain on this year's team, he finished second in school history for career sacks (17.5) and ninth for career tackles for loss (30.5). Keller (Kearney, Neb.) was Ohio's leading tackler this season with 104 stops (ninth in the MAC), the highest single-season school mark since linebacker Matt Muncy registered 115 in 2005. He also had five tackles for loss, one sack, one interception, two pass breakups and one forced fumble. Leuck (Omaha, Neb.) posted the highest grade among Ohio's regular rotation of offensive linemen at 88 percent. In a team-high 779 plays this season, he also posted a 74% technique grade, had 29.5 pancakes and 19 declainers while allowing just three penalties, six quarterback pressures and five sacks. Jackson (Austin, Tx.) posted 71 tackles (third-highest on the team) this season with two tackles for loss, two interceptions, four pass breakups and two forced fumbles (team-high). He was named MAC East Defensive Player of the Week on Sept. 22 of this season. Mooney (Lubbock, Tx.) had 27 catches for 287 yards and three touchdown receptions after missing three games with a knee injury. Last season, he set the school's single-season touchdown reception mark with nine and his 12 career grabs tie him for second all-time in the category.

### MITCHELL SELECTED 47TH OVERALL BY THE OAKLAND RAIDERS

Ohio safety Michael Mitchell (Ft. Thomas, Ky.) was selected in the second round (47th overall) by the Oakland Raiders in the National Football League Draft. He is the highest Ohio player to be drafted since Gene Ruskowski's fifth-round selection (44th overall) by the Los Angeles Rams in 1948. The last time an Ohio student-athlete was drafted in a higher round was the Bobcats' only first round selection, Art Lewis (ninth overall)

in 1936 by the New York Giants. Mitchell is also the 28th student-athlete in Ohio history to be drafted. With the seventh-round selection of Landon Cohen by the Detroit Lions (216th overall) in 2008, this marks the first time the program has had a draft pick in back-to-back years since 1972-73 (Al Benton and David Green-1972, Dave Juenger-1973).

### TAKING AIM

The Ohio offense put up some big numbers during the 2008 season. The Bobcats surpassed the school record for passing yards (2,795), passing yards per game (232.9) and passing touchdowns (21). Individually, junior quarterback Boo Jackson set school marks for passing touchdowns (19) and total offense (2,688). He also had 2,355 passing yards, which ranked second in the school's single-season records. Jackson is also currently Ohio's career leader in completion percentage and pass efficiency (min. 200 attempts) with his 60.5 completion percentage (185-306).

### THIRD DOWN WOES

One of the reasons for Ohio's struggles last season could be traced to its proficiency on third down from both sides of the ball. The Ohio offense converted 39.6 percent (67-169) of its third downs, while the opposition converted 48.3 percent (84-174). During Ohio's four years under head coach Frank Solich, the Bobcats have converted 35.0 percent (244-698), while the opposition has converted 39.0 percent (276-708).

### GETTING NON-OFFENSIVE

The Bobcats continued a trend that has been growing for the past five seasons in the wins over VMI and Akron. Ohio got a pair of non-offensive touchdowns, courtesy of senior line-backer Michael Brown's nine-yard fumble return and L.J. Flintall's 97-yard kickoff return for touchdown against the Keydets. Against the Zips, LaVon Brazill's 66-yard punt return and Chris Garrett's 97-yard kick return dented the scoreboard. The two scores represented Ohio's 23rd and 24th non-offensive scores since the beginning of the 2004 season.

### HALFTIME LEADS

With the Bobcats' 17-9 lead going into the locker room against Miami, Ohio has now led 25 times at intermission under Solich. With the win, the Bobcats are now 19-6 when taking a lead into intermission since the beginning of the 2005 season.

### CROWD PLEASERS

Last season's matchup with Ohio State was the largest audience (105,002) for the Bobcats in school history. The previous record was 93,222 when Ohio last traveled to Columbus on Sept. 18, 1999. Official capacity for Ohio Stadium, also known as The Horseshoe, is listed as 102,329. Ohio has played in front of five of its eight largest crowds since Sept. 2002, including a crowd of 66,233 at Virginia Tech during the 2007 season. The Bobcats travel to Tennessee on Sept. 26 this season, a game that will surely attract another huge crowd for the Bobcats.

### SCORING FIRST UNDER SOLICH

Ohio has enjoyed good success when putting the first points of the game on the board under Frank Solich. Since the beginning of the 2005 season, the Bobcats are now 12-7 when scoring first.

schedule as they are 4-0 over the last three seasons when they appear on the conference's network. The wins are: 38-21 over Ball State (10/22/05), 27-20 over Western Michigan (10/7/06), 17-7 at Kent State (10/28/06) and 48-42 over Eastern Michigan (10/13/07).

### BOBCATS WIN WHEN SCORING 28

Since the 1998 season, Ohio is 36-14 (.720) when reaching the 28-point plateau.

- In that same span, Ohio has had 14 victories when scoring less than 28 points, including five contests during the 2006 season (vs. Western Michigan 27-20; at Illinois 20-17; at Kent State 17-7; at Eastern Michigan 16-10; vs. Akron 17-7).

- Ohio is 29-9 (.763) since 1998 when scoring at least 30 points, 14-2 (.882) when putting up at least 40 points and 5-0 (1.000) when scoring at least 50 points.

### BOBCATS NAME CAPTAINS

The program has announced that senior quarterback Brandon Jones, senior center David White, senior linebacker Lee Renfro and junior linebacker Noah Keller have been named captains for the 2009 campaign.

### Last Time Out

#### UConn 37, Ohio 19 Sept. 21, 2002

After leading 19-6 with less than five minutes remaining in the third quarter at Memorial Stadium, the Ohio football team allowed 31 unanswered points as the Bobcats fell to Connecticut 37-19.

Connecticut quarterback Dan Orlovsky's one-yard run with 14:05 remaining in the game gave the Huskies a 20-19 advantage and then Terry Caulley scored on a four-yard run at the 11:23 mark following an Ohio interception, the Bobcats' first turnover on the day. Following a second interception, Marc Hickok nailed a 47-yard field goal with 3:32 left in the game and then Caulley scored again on a 27-yard run with 1:36 remaining to provide the final score.

Two third-quarter field goals by Kevin Kerr extended Ohio's lead to 19-6 before a 26-yard touchdown pass from Orlovsky to Jason Williams produced a score for the Huskies with 4:40 left in the third quarter. Kerr capped off a nine-play, 55-yard drive with a 32-yard field goal to open the second half. Then the senior from Cincinnati made a 24-yarder with 5:46 remaining in the third quarter.

With a 54-yard touchdown run, his second of the day, Chad Brinker passed the 2,000-yard career rushing mark and gave Ohio a 13-3 lead with 13:40 left in the first half at Memorial Stadium. Kerr missed the extra-point attempt and a 45-yard field goal attempt late in the half as the Bobcats led 13-6 at intermission.

Following a partially blocked punt by Tony Collette, Brinker capped off a seven-play, 36-yard drive with a two-yard touchdown run to give Ohio a 7-0 lead with 5:22 remaining in the first quarter.
