FIRST AND 10

-Ohio heads returns home to Athens on Tuesday for its final home game of the season versus Miami. Kickoff is set for 7 p.m. and the game will be aired on ESPN2.
-Prior to the game, Ohio will honor its 19 seniors.
-With its 29-28 win this past Wednesday at Bowling Green and Miami's 24-21 loss versus Western Michigan, Ohio won the Mid-American Conference East title and picked up its season-best fourth straight victory.
-Ohio has won three out of the last six MAC East titles.
-Ohio has racked up over 500 yards-or-more of total offense in three of its last four weeks.
-Ohio owns a 8-3 record on the year. The Bobcats have gone 8-3 in each of the last three seasons.
-In Ohio's three losses, the Bobcats have lost by an average of just 5.3 points per game.
-The Bobcats rank third in the MAC in both total offense (465.0) and total defense (343.3).

WHAT TO WATCH FOR

-A win over Miami would be the Bobcats' sixth straight win over the Redhawks.
-A win over the Redhawks would give the Bobcats their fifth-consecutive victory. Ohio has not won five-straight games this season.
-A win win over Miami would give Ohio its ninth win on the year and would mark just the sixth time in school history the Bobcats have won nine games or more in a single season.
-Ohio is just 15 points shy of setting a single-season team record.
-Sophomore quarterback Tyler Tettleton is just six completions shy of becoming the school's all-time single season leader.
-Senior running back/kick returner Donte' Harden is just

270 all-purpose yards shy of becoming the school's all-time single season leader.

-Junior Matt Weller is just 15 points shy of becoming the school's all-time single season leader.

MIAMI SERIES HISTORY

Ohio and Miami will meet for the 88th time on Tuesday in the annual Battle of the Bricks. The Redhawks hold the all-time series lead at 51-34-2. The first time the two teams met was back in 1908 with Miami earning a 5-0 victory in Athens. The last meeting took place on Oct. 23, 2010 in Oxford, Ohio. In that contest, Ohio defeated Miami 34-13.

SCOUTING MIAMI

Miami dropped its first four games of the season, losing to Missouri, Bowling Green, Minnesota and Cincinnati. The Redhawks got things turned around over its next five games, going 4-1 with its lone loss at Toledo. The Redhawks feature a passing offense that ranks second in the Mid-American Conference. Quarterback Zac Dysert has surpassed 300 yards passing in five games this season. His primary target has been wide receiver Nick Harwell, who has registered eight 100-yard receiving games this season. Defensively, the Redhawks feature the league's top pass defense as they have held opponents to just 194.5 yards passing per game.

RECAPPING THE LAST TIME OUT AT BOWLING GREEN

-Ohio's win over Bowling Green was its third straight victory over the Falcons. The Bobcats' win was also their fourth-consecutive victory which is a season-best.
-The Bobcats improved to 8-1 in the month of November. since 2009.
-Ohio trailed 28-19 in the fourth quarter, but rallied back to win the game. The Bobcats' fourth-quarter rally

marked just the fifth win for Ohio since 2005 when trailing after three quarters.

-Sophomore quarterback Tyler Tettleton finished the game with 194 passing yards and now ranks 10th on the all-time career list.

-Tettleton also rushed for a career-high 128 yards.

-Tettleton rushed for one touchdown and passed for another. In 2011, he has accounted for 31 touchdowns. No quarterback in Ohio history has ever accounted for 30 touchdowns or more in a season.

-Senior wide receiver Riley Dunlop caught five passes for 96 yards. He now ranks in the top 10 in both categories all time.

-Dunlop's 96 yards receiving was a career-high.

-With his second quarter touchdown, senior wide receiver LaVon Brazill became the all-time single season leader for touchdown receptions with 10.

-Junior kicker Matt Weller connected on a school record five field goals, including a season-long 49-yard field goal and the game-winning field goal.

-Senior linebacker Noah Keller finished with a game-high 15 tackles to surpass 400 for his career. He is just the eighth player in school history to post 400 tackles or more.

THE 2011 SENIOR CLASS

Ohio's 19 seniors will take the field at Peden Stadium for the final time Tuesday night. This year's class has been responsible for one of the best periods in Ohio football history. Since 2007, the Bobcats have posted a 35-27 record, have made two bowl appearances and have won a pair of MAC East titles.

SCHOOL OF CHAMPIONS

The football team's third MAC East Title in six years continued a successful trend for Ohio University athletics this fall. In 2011 the Ohio field hockey team won the MAC and advanced to the NCAA tournament. The volleyball team won the MAC East title. In women's cross country, sophomore Juli Accurso won the individual crown and will compete at the NCAA championships on Nov. 21.

PROTECTING THIS HOUSE

Ohio has posted an impressive 4-1 record at Peden Stadium this fall. The Bobcats opened the year strong at home as it defeated both Gardner-Webb (Sept. 10) and Marshall (Sept. 17) by a combined 74-10 count. In addition, the Bobcats have outgained their opponents

2,261-1,465 at home. Dating back to 2009, the Bobcats have posted an impressive 14-3 mark inside Peden Stadium.

THE DRIVE

Down two points to Bowling Green with 7:34 left in the game, Ohio engineered its longest drive of the year in terms of time and plays. The Bobcats began the drive on their own 10-yard line and went 83 yards in 15 plays. Ohio used all of the remaining 7:34 on the clock and capped the drive with a 23-yard field goal from Matt Weller. Weller's field goal was his school-record fifth on the night.

A RECORD BREAKING PLAY

Sophomore Tyler Tettleton's 63-yard touchdown pass to senior wide receiver LaVon Brazill in the first quarter against Central Michigan was his 21st on the year. The play moved Tettleton into first place all-time for touchdown passes in single season, while Brazill tied the single-season record for most touchdown receptions on the play. This past Wednesday at Bowling Green, Brazill became the all-time leader for touchdown receptions in a single season.

BO KNOWS

Ohio sophomore Beau Blankenship rushed for a career-high 129 yards and two touchdowns at Central Michigan on Nov. 10. Prior to his 129-yard output, Blankenship's previous career-mark was 50 yards. **In his last two games, Blankenship has averaged 92.0 yards per game, averaging 5.3 yards per carry.**

BIG PLAY BOBCATS

This past Wednesday against Bowling Green, Ohio recorded five plays of 25 yards-or-more against the Falcons. In 2011, the Bobcats have recorded 52 plays of 25 yards-or-more and have surpassed last year's total of 44.

OFFENSIVE EXPLOSION

Ohio has racked up over 500 yards of total offense in three of the last four weeks. Earlier this season against Marshall, Ohio totaled season-high 559 total yards which ranks seventh all-time for a single game mark. In the four games in which Ohio has recorded 500 yards-or-more offensively, the Bobcats are 4-0.

TETTLETON CONTINUES TO MAKE HIS MARK

On Nov. 10 against Central Michigan, quarterback Tyler Tettleton became the single season all-time passing leader after he threw for 218 yards. Following his 258-yard output against Temple he became just the seventh player in school history to pass for 2,000 yards or more in a single season. On Oct. 8 against Buffalo, Tettleton became the all-time leader for passing yards in a single season by a sophomore. **He has set 10 single season records in 2011.** Through 11 games this season, Tettleton has thrown 23 touchdowns passes to just six interceptions. Four of Tettleton's last four interceptions have come off of deflections. He has also accounted for 31 touchdowns on the year (23 passing; eight rushing).

HERSHEY EARNS MAC EAST PLAYER OF THE WEEK HONOR

Senior punter Paul Hershey was named Mid-American Conference East Special Teams Player of the Week on Nov. 14. Ohio has received nine weekly awards this fall.

UNDER 100

Ohio limited Central Michigan to just 65 yards rushing on Nov. 10 which marked the fourth time this season the Bobcats have limited an opponent to 100 yards rushing or less. On Oct. 22, Ohio held Akron to just 81 yards rushing. Earlier in the month, the Bobcats held Kent State to just 79 yards rushing on Oct. 1. In the Bobcats' season-opener on Sept. 3, Ohio held New Mexico State to just six yards rushing.

THE WELL IS NEVER DRY

Junior kicker Matt Weller has established himself as one of the top kickers in the Mid-American Conference. In 2011, he has connected on 22-of-29 field goals and is

40-of-41 on extra points. He also ranks in the league's top three in two statistical kicking categories. In addition, Weller has not missed a field goal from 40 yards or less this season.

A CAREER NIGHT FOR HARDEN

Senior running back Donte' Harden rushed for a school-record 322 all-purpose yards to go along with a pair of touchdowns versus Temple on Nov. 2. Harden also registered career-highs in rushing (184 yards) and receiving (75 yards). Harden currently has 795 yards rushing this season, which is a single season career-high for the Erie, Pa. native. Since his return from an injury that sidelined him for two and a half weeks, Harden has rushed for 578 yards, averaging 5.9 yards per carry.

ELITE COMPANY

Ohio moved to 2-0 when wearing its black jerseys. In the two games in which Ohio has donned the Green and Black uniforms, the Bobcats have scored over 30 points in both games and have surpassed 500 yards of total offense.

ALL GOOD THINGS MUST COME TO AN END

Sophomore quarterback Tyler Tettleton threw an interception on Oct. 8 against Buffalo. It was his first pick in 188 attempts. This past week against Bowling Green, Tettleton had his streak of 200-yard passing games snapped at eight. He finished the night just short with 194 yards passing.

SURPASSING 2,000

Senior wide receiver LaVon Brazill became just the third player in school history to surpass 2,000 career receiving yards after he totaled 165 yards against Temple. Former Bobcats Todd Snyder (1967-69) and Taylor Price (2006-09) are the only players in program history to surpass 2,000 career receiving yards. Quarterback Tyler Tettleton also surpassed the 2,000 yard mark. Following his 258 yard passing effort against Temple, Tettleton became the seventh Ohio quarterback in school history to throw for 2,000 yards or more in a single season.

BIG PLAY BRAZILL

Senior wide receiver LaVon Brazill has recorded at least one play of 20 yards or more in every game this season. In 2011, Ohio has recorded 52 plays of 25 yards-or-more and 13 of those have come from Brazill.

DUNLOP AMONG THE TOP 10

Senior wide receiver Riley Dunlop cracked into the top 10 in both career receptions and receiving yards this past Wednesday at Bowling Green following his five catch, 96-yard performance. In 42 career games, Dunlop has 95 receptions for 1,277 yards.

CRACKING THE CENTURY MARK

Senior wide receiver LaVon Brazill surpassed 100 yards receiving four times this season after he tallied a career-high 165 yards against Temple. He is also one of just five receivers in the league who have recorded 100-or-more yards receiving in four games this season.

TETTLETON IN THE REDZONE

Quarterback Tyler Tettleton has put together an outstanding 2011 season, but it is in the redzone where the sophomore signal-caller has been at his best. Tettleton has thrown 12 touchdowns and just two interceptions.

On Sept. 17 against Marshall, Ohio's offensive line held the Thundering Herd without a sack.

OXFORD, Ohio- The Ohio football squad put up five rushing touchdowns and forced host Miami into six turnovers as the visiting Bobcats nailed down a 34-13 win at Yager Stadium on the RedHawks' Homecoming.

Ohio improved to 5-3 overall and 4-1 in the Mid-American Conference, while Miami dropped to 4-4 and 3-1 in the league. The win was Ohio's fifth-straight in the series and seventh-straight road win, tying the mark the program set from 1959-61.

Ohio got two rushing scores from running back Donte Harden and quarterback Boo Jackson, while running back Vince Davidson had a career-high 103 rushing yards on 17 carries with another score. Jackson completed 10 of 19 passes for 149 yards and an interception with four of those completions going to Riley Dunlop for 68 yards.

Defensively, the Bobcats got two sacks apiece from defensive lineman Dak Notestine and cornerback Travis Carrie, while linebacker Eric Benjamin added another. Ohio also picked off four passes in the game, two by cornerback Omar Leftwich, with safeties Steven Jackson and Hilton Dawson III providing the other two. Linebacker Chad Clemens had a team-high five tackles.

Miami was led by quarterback Zac Dysert's 21-for-36 effort, which netted 332 yards, two touchdowns and four interceptions. Eleven of those passes went to Nick Harwell, a career-high, while his 219 receiving yards was a school record. Thomas Merriweather led the way with 35 yards on seven carries, but due to the sack yardage, the RedHawks mustered just 11 yards on 21 carries. C.J. Marck had a team-high nine tackles, while Evan Harris and Pat Hinkel each had eight.

-Ohio's win over Bowling Green was its third straight victory over the Falcons. The Bobcats' win was also their fourth-consecutive victory which is a season-best.

-Ohio's victory and Miami's 24-21 loss to Western Michigan also clinched the MAC East title.

-The Bobcats improved to 8-1 in the month of November. since 2009.

-Ohio trailed 28-19 in the fourth quarter, but rallied back to win the game. The Bobcats' fourth-quarter rally marked just the fifth win for Ohio since 2005 when trailing after three quarters.

-Sophomore quarterback Tyler Tettleton finished the game with 194 passing yards and now ranks 10th on the all-time career list.

-Tettleton also rushed for a career-high 128 yards.

-With his second quarter touchdown, senior wide receiver LaVon Brazill became the all-time single season leader for touchdown receptions with 10.

-Junior kicker Matt Weller connected on a school record five field goals, including a season-long 49-yard field goal and the game-winning field goal.

-Senior linebacker Noah Keller finished with a game-high 15 tackles to surpass 400 for his career. He is just the eighth player in school history to post 400 tackles or more.
