BOBCATS RETURN HOME TO FACE COWBOYS

- This is the first meeting between Wyoming and Ohio.
- Ohio is coming off a 28-7 loss at Virginia Tech Saturday afternoon. Senior running back Calvin McRae scored his seventh touchdown of the season with a four-yard run to put the Bobcats up 7-0 early in the second quarter. He also led Ohio with 81 all-purpose yards. Senior quarterback Brad Bower completed nine of 16 passes for 70 yards, while McRae had six catches out of the backfield. Defensively, safety Todd Koenig led the Bobcats with nine tackles, while senior defensive lineman Landon Cohen had six tackles, two tackles for loss, a forced fumble and a fumble recovery.
- Wyoming dropped a 24-14 decision at Boise State Saturday evening. After falling behind 21-0, the Cowboys put up a pair of touchdowns late on a 21-yard touchdown reception by Devin Moore and a two-yard run by Wynel Seldon. Moore was Wyoming's leading rusher with 27 yards on eight carries, while Karsten Sween threw for 227 yards on 26-for-48 passing with one interception, in addition to the scoring toss to Moore. Greg Bolling was the Cowboys' leading receiver with six catches for 59 yards. Quincy Rogers led the way defensively with 14 tackles, while Sean Claffey had 12 stops, including one sack and 1.5 tackles for loss.
- Wyoming went 6-6 last season with wins over Utah State, New Mexico, Utah, Colorado State, San Diego State and UNLV. The Cowboys lost to Virginia, Boise State, Air Force, Syracuse, TCU and BYU. Wyoming was picked to finish fifth in the nine-team Mountain West Conference by the league's media. Preseason All-MWC picks were tight end Wade Betschart, junior linebacker Ward Dobbs and senior cornerback Julius Stinson.

A WIN VERSUS WYOMING WOULD ...

- Improve Ohio's record to 1-2 against Mountain West Conference opponents...The Bobcats lost at Colorado State on November 14, 1992 by a score of 35-24 and at UNLV on September 24, 1988 by a tally of 26-18.
- Be the 482nd win in the program's history (481-498-48, .492)
- Mark the program's first 3-1 start since 1997 when Ohio finished 8-3 overall and 6-2 in the MAC
- Be the third time in four years that the Bobcats have won their first two home games...In 2005, Ohio knocked off Pittsburgh (16-10, OT) and Kent State (35-32), while the program registered victories over VMI (42-14) and Buffalo (34-0) in 2004.

Ohio and Wyoming have never met on the gridiron before. Ohio will travel to Laramie to face the Cowboys during the 2008 season.

COMMON OPPONENT

In 2006, Ohio and Wyoming did not play against any common opponent. The Cowboys and the Bobcats will also not face any common opponents during the 2007 season.

ON THE FIELD

Last Saturday's game against Virginia Tech was the second time this season that the Bobcats played on natural grass, and just the second time since the 2005 season. This week, the Bobcats return home to the artificial surface of Peden Stadium. Ohio is 14-9 under Frank Solich on artificial surfaces.

SCOUTING THE COWBOYS

- Wyoming is 2-1 on the season following season-opening home wins against Virginia (23-3) and Utah State (32-18) and a 24-14 loss at Boise State Saturday.
- The Cowboys went 6-6 in 2006 and finished in a tie for third in the Mountain West Conference with a 5-3 mark.
- Junior Devin Moore is the Cowboys' leading rusher this season with 237 yards rushing on 45 carries (5.3 per carry) with one touchdown. Junior Wynel Seldon has also carried the ball 45 times and has a team-best three rushing touchdowns. Sophomore quarterback Karsten Sween has started all three games under center and paces Wyoming with 660 yards passing, going 70-for-114 with three touchdowns and four interceptions. He sports a pass efficiency rating of 111.70. Sophomore wide receiver Greg Bolling has the team lead in receptions with 17 for 181 yards and two touchdowns.
- Senior cornerback Julius Stinson is the team's leading tackler with 24 tackles, two tackles for loss, two interceptions and one pass breakup.
- Senior punter/kicker Billy Vinnedge had made four of seven field goal attempts this season and has averaged 45.8 yards per punt, while dropping four kicks inside the 20. He has made field goals from 25, 39, 40 and 48 yards, while missing from 32, 37 and 52 yards.
- The Cowboys' 35-yard rushing effort last week against Boise State came on the heels of averaging 194 yards on the ground in wins over Virginia and Utah State.

FOUR FROM PHOENIX

- There are no players on the Ohio roster who hail from the state of Wyoming.
- Four players between the two teams call Phoenix, Arizona their hometown. For Ohio, sophomore offensive lineman Chris Rodgers went to Central High, while Wyoming junior offensive lineman Tim Bond (Desert Vista), freshman wide receiver Anthony Dunkerley (Millenium) and sophomore nose guard Ben Smith (Phoenix Christian) are also from Phoenix.

McRAE BACK TO CARRY RUSHING LOAD

• Senior **Kalvin McRae** (Decatur, Ga.) was a first-team All-MAC selection for the second straight year in 2006. He ran for 1,252 yards, the second-best single-season rushing total in school history. He became the first Bobcat in 30 years to rush for 1,000+ yards in consecutive seasons.

• So far in his senior season, McRae stands third all-time on the school's rushing list. With 281 yards rushing in 2007, he currently stands at 3,245 for his career. He needs 719 yards to break the school's all-time record and become the first Bobcat to rush for better than 1,000 yards in three consecutive seasons.

• McRae has earned as much attention from the national media and awards committees as he surely will from opposing defenses this season. During the 2007 preseason, McRae has been recognized as an All-America candidate, a First-Team All-MAC selection and named to watch lists for both the Walter Camp award and the Maxwell Award.

• Against Gardner-Webb in the season opener, McRae became the third Bobcat in school history to rush for 3,000 career yards (Stevland Hookfin, 1995-98, 3,972; Kareem Wilson, 1995-98, 3,597).

• During the 2006 season, McRae tied the school record for most 100-yard games in a single season with eight, matching the record established by Hookfin in 1998. (McRae set a school-record with seven consecutive 100-yard games.) Hookfin (1995-98) also holds the record for most 100-yard games in a career for the Bobcats with 19 over four years. With one so far this season, McRae is currently tied for second on the career list with 15 to match Wilson (1995-98).

• The 2007 campaign presents a number of opportunities for McRae to solidify his name in the record books, including one chance to complete a feat never before accomplished by a Bobcat running back. According to the complete school records, which date back to the 1960 season, no Bobcat has ever led the team in rushing yards in four consecutive seasons. Having already led Ohio as a freshman (559 yards), a sophomore (1,153 yards) and a junior (1,252 yards), McRae could be the first.

McRAE BACK TO CARRY RUSHING LOAD (Cont.)



Calvin McRae

- During his junior campaign, McRae set the Ohio single-season record with 15 rushing touchdowns. He has six so far this season, giving him 32 in his career, which is now second on the all-time list.

- In 2006, McRae ranked 46th in the nation with 109.43 all-purpose yards per contest. In addition to averaging better than 89 yards from scrimmage on the ground, McRae also tallied 20 yards per game receiving for the Bobcats.

- As a junior, McRae totaled a team-high 1,532 all-purpose yards, which was strong enough to place fifth on the all-time single season chart for the Bobcats.

McRae appears on Ohio's single-season all-purpose yard leaders list twice, having amassed 1,250 all-purpose yards during his sophomore season. For his career, McRae has totaled 3,908 all-purpose yards, which ranks third all-time on the career list. McRae needs 216 all-purpose yards to break the record of 4,123 yards currently held by former Ohio running back Steveland Hookfin (1995-98).

- During the 2006 season, he led Ohio with 16 touchdowns and one two-point conversion for a total of 98 points, the second-best single-season scoring effort ever in Bobcat history. The school record for points in a single season dates back to 1968 (the Bobcats' last MAC Championship and bowl appearance prior to the 2006 season), when Bob Houmard scored 114 points. McRae is currently ranked third all-time in school history with 218 career points scored. Former Bobcats quarterback Kareem Wilson (1995-98) leads the all-time list with 302 points in his career.
- McRae's aforementioned 16 total touchdowns during the 2006 season ranked second all-time in on Ohio's single-season top ten, trailing only Houmard, who found the end zone 19 times during the illustrious 1968 campaign. McRae is currently second all-time with 36 career touchdowns. The school record of 49 career touchdowns is held by Kareem Wilson (1995-98).

TIME IS ON THEIR SIDE

- The scoreboard isn't the only place the Bobcats dominated during their season-opener against Gardner-Webb on Sept. 1. Ohio held the advantage in time of possession, not only for the game, but during each individual quarter. Ohio held the ball for close to 60 percent of the game (34 minutes and 51 seconds) overall, but showed the most dominance down the stretch. A particularly stingy fourth quarter defense allowed the Runnin' Bulldogs to control the ball for just 5:22 during the final period.
- Against Louisiana-Lafayette in the second game of the season, Ohio once again led the overall time of possession, with a 30:07 to 29:53 margin.
- Despite the loss against Virginia Tech, Ohio once again controlled the clock. The Bobcats held an advantage of almost a minute over the Hokies. Ohio held one of its largest margins of the season during the first half. The Bobcats were able to hold the ACC-power Hokies scoreless in the first quarter by controlling the clock for more than 11 minutes during the 15-minute period.
- Through three games in the 2007 season, Ohio is now 11-6 under head coach Frank Solich in games during which the Bobcats led in time of possession.

FUMBLE-ITIS

With 6:50 remaining in the first quarter, Michael Mitchell recorded his first forced fumble of the season, and the seventh of his career. Landon Cohen recovered the fumble, marking his second recovery in as many weeks, and the second of his career. Later in the quarter, long snapper Ryan Senser recorded his first career fumble recovery, setting up the Bobcats' only touchdown of the contest.

STOUT HOKIES

Virginia Tech's first scoring drive was the longest - in terms of plays (12) - that Ohio has yielded this season. The Hokies held Ohio to just 114 yard of total offense, the lowest total for the program since amassing 110 at Akron on Nov. 15, 2005.

SCHULTE LAUNCHES PUNTS

Redshirt freshman punter Matt Schulte has launched some long, long punts this season. Against Gardner-Webb, Schulte had kicks of 57 and 58 yards. In the first quarter Saturday, Schulte went one more with a new personal best, 59 yards, which turned the field position tables on the Hokies. Schulte also had a career-high 13 punts against the Hokies.

HUGE CROWD

The Bobcats and Hokies squared off in front of 66,233 fans, the most for Ohio since Coach Solich's arrival. The previous high also came against the Hokies, which was held in front of 65,115 fans.

IRONMEN

Seniors Calvin McRae (Decatur, Ga.), Landon Cohen (Spartanburg, S.C.) and Brett Sykes (Eastlake, Ohio) have played in every game for the Bobcats over the last three-plus seasons. Dating back to the start of the 2004 season, the trio has appeared in all 39 games in which the Bobcats have taken the field. Cohen and McRae currently share the team lead in consecutive games started, which stands at 28 games. McRae has started 36 games, earning eight starts in the middle of his freshman season.

FOURTH DOWN FORTUNE

Through three games in 2007, Ohio remains perfect on fourth down. The Bobcats have converted on all four of their fourth-down attempts. Not only does the precise 1.000 conversion percentage ranks Ohio atop the MAC, but it is also tied for the best in the land. Ohio is one of 17 Football Bowl Subdivision (formerly I-A) schools which boast a perfect conversion percentage on fourth down.

- Only three schools in the nation have been both as efficient and as daring as the Bobcats on fourth down. Cincinnati, New Mexico and Boston College have matched Ohio's 4-for-4 record.
- Against Louisiana-Lafayette, Ohio went for it on fourth down just once, but it turned out to be a very good decision for the Bobcats. Facing fourth down and one yard to go on the Ragin' Cajuns' 45-yard line, senior Brad Bower gained the lone yard needed on a quarterback sneak to give Ohio another first down. Seven plays later, fellow senior Calvin McRae found the end zone on a 13-yard rush to put the Bobcats up 30-23. Michael Braunstein's subsequent point-after gave Ohio its final margin of victory at 31-23.
- The Bobcats were more than efficient on fourth down during their opener. They were downright perfect. Ohio converted on each of three attempts on fourth down against Gardner-Webb. Ohio was three-for-three against the Runnin' Bulldogs, handing the ball to senior Calvin McRae each time.
- The Bobcats did not have any attempts on fourth down against Virginia Tech.

Bobcats Win When Scoring Twenty-Eight

- Since the 1998 season, Ohio is 30-10 (.750) when reaching the 28-point plateau.
- In that same span, Ohio has had 13 victories when scoring less than 28 points, including five contests during the 2006 season (vs. Western Michigan 27-20; at Illinois 20-17; at Kent State 17-7; at Eastern Michigan 16-10; vs. Akron 17-7).
- The Bobcats have won 12 straight games when scoring at least 28 points.
- Ohio is 25-6 since 1998 when scoring at least 30 points, 11-1 when putting up at least 40 points and 4-0 when scoring at least 50 points.

Ohio in Overtime

The Bobcats' 16-10 win in 2005 versus Pittsburgh was the fourth overtime game in school history, and the first overtime game at Peden Stadium.

MEYERS MAKES A STAND

Against Louisiana-Lafayette, Jordan Meyers forced the first fumble of the season for the Bobcats at the Ohio 41 at the 8:12 mark of the first quarter. It was the third forced fumble of Meyers' career. Ohio's Ervin Jackson recovered the fumble, the first fumble recovery of his career.

- Meyers also finished the game with a career-high and a team season-high nine solo tackles, including one for a loss. Fellow linebacker Lee Renfro also added nine tackles against the Ragin' Cajuns.

RECORD-SETTING DAY FOR BOWER

Against the Ragin' Cajuns, Brad Bower completed the longest pass of his Ohio career, a 64-yard pass to Justin Fitzgerald at the 11:10 mark of the second quarter, moving the Bobcats from their own 24-yard line to Louisiana-Lafayette's 12. The completion was the longest play from scrimmage for the Bobcats this season and the longest reception of Fitzgerald's career.

- Against the Ragin' Cajuns, Bower also set career marks with 17 completions on 28 attempts for 264 yards passing. At the 2:48 mark of the second quarter, Bower threw his first interception of the season, the 11th of his career, at the Louisiana-Lafayette 19-yard line.

MCRAE'S MARKS

Against Louisiana-Lafayette, a 13-yard touchdown run for Calvin McRae at the 4:32 mark in the fourth quarter gave him his fourth touchdown of the game, tying him for first all-time in touchdowns for a game (six others have scored four in a game).

- The touchdown was McRae's third on the ground for the game, a career-high, and tied for sixth most in a single game in Ohio history.
- McRae is the first to score four touchdowns in a single game when finding the end zone both in the air and on the ground. Against the Ragin' Cajuns, McRae opened the scoring for the Bobcats by hauling in a 44-yard pass from quarterback Brad Bower. McRae added three rushing touchdowns in the second half for the victory.

COMEBACK CATS

The 31-23 win over Louisiana-Lafayette marked the first time under Frank Solich that the Bobcats have won after trailing after three quarters. Ohio scored two touchdowns in the fourth quarter for the final eight-point margin.

- Prior to the victory over the Ragin' Cajuns, Ohio was 0-12 when trailing at the start of the final stanza. The win marks the third time since 2005 that the Bobcats have won despite facing a halftime deficit. Ohio also came back to win after trailing at the break at Eastern Michigan (10-9) and at Northern Illinois (17-14).

LUCHSINGER LOCKS IN

Ohio's Kris Luchsinger recorded his second sack of the game with 10:09 left in the fourth quarter on a Louisiana-Lafayette fourth down attempt. The sack resulted in a 10-yard loss, giving the Bobcats possession at the Louisiana 45-yard line. His two sacks were the first two of his career.

- Those two sacks against Louisiana-Lafayette also placed Luchsinger among the conference's defensive leaders. After the second week of the season, Luchsinger is tied for second on the MAC leaderboard with 1.0 sacks per game and tied for fifth with 1.50 tackles for loss per game.

- The transfer from Washington has converted all three field goal attempts (from 21, 27 and 43 yards, respectively), as well as all nine point-after-touchdown tries for the Bobcats this season.
- Dating back to his time with the Huskies, Braunstein is now perfect on his last 46 PATs and has hit his last 11 field goal attempts.

OHIO NAMES CAPTAINS

• During fall camp, the Ohio Bobcats officially announced the 2007 Team Captains, tabbing six seniors and one junior for the roles.

• **Landon Cohen, Sr., DT, Spartanburg, S.C.**

Cohen was named second-team All-MAC in 2006 after starting all 14 games for the Bobcats. He led the Bobcats' defensive line with 14.0 tackles for loss.



• **Jameson Hartke, Jr., DE, Centerville, Ohio**

Entering his third year with the Bobcats, Hartke is tied for seventh all-time at Ohio with 11.5 career sacks. He started all 14 games in 2006 and earned second team All-MAC honors.



• **Taj Henley, Sr., LB, Richmond, Va.**

In three years with the Bobcats, Henley has played in 34 games, including all 14 of his junior campaign. He made 14 tackles during the 2006 season as a reserve linebacker.



• **Todd Koenig, Sr., S, Nantyglo, Pa.**

A returning starter in the defensive backfield for the Bobcats, Koenig recorded 49 tackles, including 25 solo stops during the 2006 season.



• **Kalvin McRae, Sr., RB, Decatur, Ga.**

A two-time All-MAC running back, McRae has been named to the watch list for the Walter Camp and Maxwell awards this season.



• **Matt Miller, Sr., OL, Mechanicsville, Va.**

One of three offensive linemen to start all 14 games for the Bobcats in 2006, Miller led Ohio with 61 pancake blocks and graded out at 85 percent.



• **David Shelby, Sr., OL, New Albany, Ohio**

Shelby started every game of the 2006 season, playing a team-high 856 snaps, including every snap over the final six games of the season.



QUICK STARTS IMPORTANT FOR BOBCATS

- Since the start of the 2002 season, the Bobcats have played 60 games in which one team or the other has held the lead at halftime. In those games, the squad leading at intermission has won 50 times (.833).
- Ohio has won 15 straight games when leading at halftime, including all seven games in which the Bobcats held the lead at the break during the 2006 season and the first contest of the 2007 season, a 36-14 win over Gardner-Webb on Sept. 1. The last time the Bobcats could not hold a halftime lead was on Nov. 15, 2003 when Akron overcame a 21-14 halftime deficit to win, 35-28.
- The 31-23 win at Louisiana-Lafayette marked the third time in the last two seasons Ohio overcame a halftime deficit (20-10). Against Northern Illinois on Sept. 9, the Bobcats trailed 17-14 at the break, but pulled out a 35-23 win. Eastern Michigan held a one-point edge (10-9) over Ohio heading into halftime on Nov. 4, but the visiting Bobcats held the Eagles scoreless in the second half for a 16-10 win.
- The Bobcats are 1-2 when tied at halftime since the start of 2002.

SEASON-OPENING SAFETIES

- In each of the last two seasons, Ohio has recorded a safety during its season-opener. Against Gardner-Webb on Sept. 1, senior Joshua Abrams' third blocked punt of the game was knocked out of the Runnin' Bulldogs' end zone for a safety. Against UT-Martin in the 2006 season-opener, Ohio registered a second quarter safety to go up 9-0 en route to a 29-3 victory.

WHEN YOUR'E HOT, YOU'RE HOT

Second half scoring was contagious for the Bobcats during the first two games of this season.

- Against Gardner-Webb, Ohio scored on five consecutive offensive possessions (three touchdowns and two field goals) and capped the scoring effort with a safety on the next defensive possession en route to a 36-14 victory. The Bobcats offensive tear included scores on four of their five offensive possessions in the second half.
- Against Louisiana-Lafayette, the Bobcats also found themselves in the middle of a second-half hot streak, scoring touchdowns on three consecutive possessions in the second half. All three were rushing touchdowns by Calvin McRae.

NEW LOOK FOR THE BOBCATS

Prior to the 2007 season, Russell Athletic and Ohio University officially signed an agreement that designates the world renown athletic performance brand as the "Official Team Uniform and Apparel" manufacturer of Ohio Athletics through 2012. The five-year, all-inclusive outfitting agreement gives Russell Athletic, a subsidiary of Fruit of the Loom, exclusive rights as uniform and apparel provider for all Ohio University varsity teams and coaches in addition to category exclusivity for licensed apparel at stadium and arena concessions.

TERRIFIC TRIFECTA

- In the season-opener against Gardner-Webb, senior Joshua Abrams wasted no time making the most of his final year with the Bobcats. In addition to scoring the first touchdown of his career on a one-yard run in the final minute of the first half, Abrams led the Bobcats' special teams effort with three blocked punts.
- Abrams blocked punts in each of the second, third and fourth quarters, tying his previous career block total of three (all recorded during the 2006 season).
- The NCAA record for blocked punts in a single game is four, shared by Ken Irvin of Memphis (1992) and James King of Central Michigan (2001).
- Abrams is now four blocks away from tying the NCAA record for punts blocked in both a single season and his career. Central Michigan's King holds the record for career blocks with 10 (2001-04), as well as blocks in a single season (7-2001).
- With six currently to his credit, Abrams is in a six-way tie for third all-time on the NCAA's career punt block list.

OHIO HERITAGE LINE

Ohio Athletics' five Heritage line marks:

- **Interlocking OU** - This mark dates back to the 1900s and was one of the first University marks seen on athletic gear. It was used on Ohio's basketball uniforms as well as on sweaters and jackets worn by members of our earliest football and baseball teams.

- **OHIO** - This mark dates back to the 1940s & 1950s. This mark was worn primarily by the men's basketball team and was on the warm ups of the 1941 NIT runner up team. This mark was also on the basketball court at Grover Center while it served as home to Ohio Basketball in the 1960s.

- **Attack Cat** - This mark dates back to the 1960s and 1970s. This mark was the original midcourt logo at the Convo and received national exposure when Bobcat basketball standout Walter Luckett was on the cover of Sports Illustrated in 1972.

- **Full Body Bobcat** - This mark represents the first time that Ohio used a full-body Bobcat logo. It was featured prominently during the 1960s and 1970s.

- **The Paw** - This mark came into use in 1978 and was worn on the Bobcat football helmet. The Paw Print received national exposure in 1984 when the Bobcat basketball team advanced to the NCAA basketball tournament.

BOBCATS PICKED TO WIN MAC EAST

Announced at Mid-American Conference Football Media Day in Ford Field on July 25th, the Bobcats were named the favorite to repeat in the East Division in 2007 according to the MAC News Media Association Preseason Poll.

- The Bobcats, who went 9-5 overall and 7-1 in league play in 2006 en route to a division title and an appearance in the GMAC Bowl, received 15 first-place votes in the preseason poll. Ohio garnered 216 total points, the most of any of the 13 football programs in the MAC. Kent State accumulated 203 points and was tabbed to finish second in the East Division, two first-place tallies behind Ohio.

- With 15 first-place votes, Western Michigan will enter the season the favorite in the MAC West Division. Central Michigan, the defending division and league champion, received 10 first place votes.

- WMU is also the preseason pick to win the 2007 MAC Championship with 11 votes followed by CMU with 10 and Ohio with six.

OHIO FOOTBALL HONORED BY AFCA

The American Football Coaches Association has announced that the Ohio football team has received 2007 Academic Achievement Award honorable mention recognition.

- The award recognizes NCAA Football Bowl Subdivision programs that graduate at least 70 percent of its players. It marks the the third time in the last four years, and fourth time overall that the Bobcats have earned honorable mention accolades. Ohio was also on the honored in 1999, 2004 and 2005.

- During the 2006 season, four members of the Bobcat team were honored as Academic All-MAC honorees: Austen Everson (quarterback), Jameson Hartke (defensive end), J.J. Knabb (center), and Tyler Russ (linebacker).

- Hartke, Russ, and nose tackle Shane Yates were also honored as members of the Second-Team Academic All-District IV team.

OHIO HIRES NEW "VOICE OF THE BOBCATS"

- Ohio Director of Athletics Kirby Hocutt has announced the hiring of Warren Swain to the position of Director of Broadcasting, which includes play-by-play duties for the Ohio Sports Network.

- The new "Voice of the Bobcats" brings a distinguished resume to his new position in Athens. A veteran of collegiate athletics broadcasting, Swain most recently served as the play-by-play voice for Drake University. In addition to Drake, Swain's play-by-play experience includes covering Nebraska, Virginia, Oregon, Iowa State and Creighton since his career began in 1972.

- Swain's duties will extend beyond play-by-play in Ohio's Director of Broadcasting position. Swain will also be responsible for coordinating all radio broadcast activities for OSN, including games, the "Frank Solich Call-In Show" and "Tim O'Shea Call-In Show," and the daily "Bobcat Minute." Among his other responsibilities, Swain will also be involved in the coordination of OSN television broadcasts and will work with OSN affiliates.

OHIO RELEASES HERITAGE LINE

The Ohio University Athletics Department unveiled five Heritage marks in a press conference in August.
