## Head Coach Joel Greenlee

### Northern Iowa, 1989



**Joel Greenlee** enters his 10th year as head coach of the Bobcat wrestling program with a 100-71-4 (.583) overall record and a 27-18-1 (.598) mark in the Mid-American Conference. He was hired as an assistant/interim head coach in 1997-98 due to an illness of then-head coach Harry Houska. Greenlee was then named the full-time head coach before the 1998-99 season.

Ohio suffered injuries throughout its lineup during the 2005-06 season and completed the year with an 11-11 record. Competing with a young and inexperienced squad, the Bobcats posted dual-meet victories over North Carolina State and Virginia Tech. With an 18-16 win over West Virginia on Feb. 10, Ohio gave Greenlee the 100th victory of his coaching career.

At the 2005 NCAA Championships, Greenlee guided Jake Percival to a third-place finish at 157 pounds. In the process, Percival became the first four-time All-American in MAC history. As a team, the Bobcats placed 26th in the nation with 21.5 points.

At the 2005 MAC Championships, Percival was named MAC Wrestler of the Year for the third straight time and Most Outstanding Wrestler of the MAC Tournament for the second year in a row after becoming just the third grappler in MAC history to win four individual titles.

Ohio managed a 10-12-1 record in 2004-05 despite competing with a depleted lineup at times. Eight of the Bobcats' 10 starters at the beginning of the year missed all or part of the season. The team still recorded wins over Ohio State, Virginia and Old Dominion, however, and posted a 3-2 record for a third-place finish in the MAC. Six of the squad's losses came to nationally-ranked programs.

In 2003-04, Ohio went 8-6 overall and finished in a tie for third place in the MAC with a 2-3 record, finishing third at the MAC Championships. Two Bobcat wrestlers - Percival at 157 pounds and heavyweight Jeremiah Beltran - claimed MAC titles while a third, Joel Weimer, joined them at the NCAA Championships as a wild card entry in the 197-pound weight class.

In 2002, Greenlee guided three Ohio wrestlers into the national tournament with Percival placing fourth as a freshman. The year before, the Bobcats won their first MAC Tournament title under Greenlee's tenure and the 15th in the history of the program. As a result, he was named the 2001 MAC Coach of the Year.

Greenlee's accomplishments during his first season at Ohio earned him the NWCA National Assistant Coach of the Year award in 1998. His 1997-98 team finished ninth at the NCAA Tournament - the Bobcats' best finish since 1973 - and won the regular-

season MAC title with a 5-0 record in the conference. He coached Dwight Gardner (158) to the school's first individual national title since 1978 and guided Shawn Enright (134) to a second-place national finish.

Prior to coming to Ohio, Greenlee was an assistant coach at the University of Northern Iowa from 1989-97. While at Northern Iowa, the Panthers compiled a 70-58 record.

Greenlee also had a stellar wrestling career in his own right. While competing as a heavyweight at Northern Iowa, he was a two-time All-American, finishing second in 1989 and fourth in 1988. In 1989, Greenlee was champion at the prestigious Midlands Tournament and Midwest Championships and was named the Outstanding Wrestler at both meets. Greenlee still holds the highest winning percentage in school history with a 127-16-4 (.878) career record. He also holds the Panther records for dual victories (58) and dual victories in a season (20 in 1986-87).

Greenlee has also enjoyed success at the international level. He finished second at the U.S. Olympic Team Trials in 1992 and was selected as a training partner for the Olympic Team. He won the Cerra Pelado Tournament in Cuba in 1993 and the Cuban All-Star Tournament in 1992. He placed third three times at the John E. du Post World Team Trials.

During his time at Northern Iowa, Greenlee was also the camp director for the Northern Iowa wrestling camps. He was assistant camp director for the Bruce Baumgartner Heavyweight Wrestling School from 1993-97.

He and his wife, Roxann, have a son, Walker, and a daughter, Madison.

Percival was less than 40 seconds away from being Ohio's fifth national champion but had to settle for second place and his third straight All-America performance. With Weimer winning two of his matches and Beltran winning one, the Bobcats finished 25th as a team, their best finish since tying for ninth in 1998.

For the second straight year, Percival earned MAC Wrestler of the Year honors after heading into the NCAA Championships with a perfect record. The Elyria native also claimed the Outstanding MAC Tournament Wrestler award for winning both his matches in such dominant fashion.

During the 2002-03 season, Greenlee led a young Bobcat squad to a 9-8 record (2-3 in the MAC) and a third-place finish at the MAC Championships. Two wrestlers, Percival at 149 pounds and Anthony Carrizales at 133, qualified for the NCAA Tournament with Percival placing fifth for his second straight All-American finish.

# Assistant Coach Kyle Hansen Northern Iowa, 2002

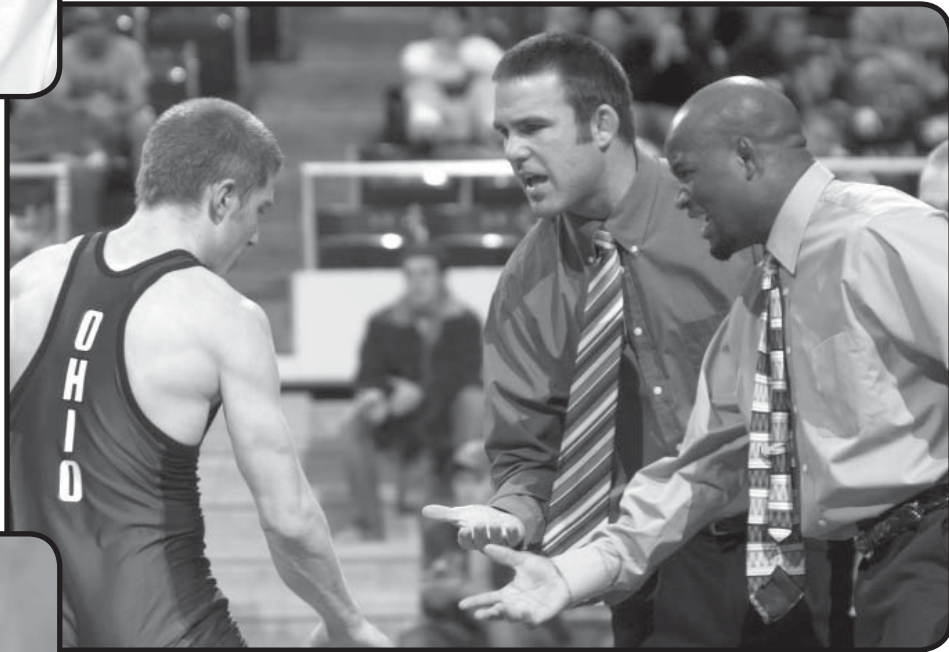


Kyle Hansen enters his second season as an assistant coach with the Ohio wrestling program. Hansen joined the Bobcats in August of 2005 and helped the team to an 11-11 overall record despite many injuries and a lack of senior experience.

Prior to joining the Ohio staff, Hansen spent the previous three years as the University of Northern Iowa wrestling program's conditioning specialist. He also added the role of Panther Club wrestling coach his final season at Northern Iowa.

A two-time All-American and two-time Academic All-American, Hansen finished his collegiate career at Northern Iowa with 79 career wins, including 39 dual meet victories. He was ranked as high as fifth in the nation at 184 pounds as a senior for the Panthers in 2001-02.

A native of Wilton, Iowa, Hansen graduated from Northern Iowa in 2002 with a degree in construction management.



# Graduate Assistant Ozzie Saxon Wartburg, 2005

Ozzie Saxon joined the Ohio wrestling program as a graduate assistant in 2005-06 and returns for his second season. Saxon finished as the NCAA Division III national runner-up twice, earning All-America honors both times and helping Wartburg College (Waverly, Iowa) win the 2003 and 2004 Division III national team titles.

The 2004 Iowa Conference champion at 133 pounds, Saxon posted a 50-6 career record for the Knights and earned his bachelor's degree in electronic media from Wartburg in 2005.

Prior to joining the Knights, Saxon won a junior college national title for North Idaho College in 2002.

**2005-06:** Finished his junior campaign with a 10-13 record, including 1-4 in the MAC ... Held a 7-10 mark in duals and recorded two major decisions on the year ... His 5-3 decision over West Virginia's Matt Holsopple on Feb. 10 sealed an 18-16 victory for the Bobcats and gave head coach Joel Greenlee his 100th career coaching win ... On Jan.

Beat Findlay's Brett Boggs and Ohio State's Chris Burtscher (exhibition) at Ohio Collegiate Championships ... Went 3-1 to finish second at the season-opening Ashland Open ... Completed his sophomore season with one pin, one technical fall and four major decisions while not giving up any bonus points.
