

2007 MID-AMERICAN CONFERENCE SOFTBALL TOURNAMENT

The Mid-American Conference will bring eight (8) teams (top three from each division plus the next two teams with the best overall winning percentage regardless of division) to Midland's Currie Stadium. This year's softball tournament will begin Wednesday, May 9th and will conclude Saturday, May 12th.

Currie Stadium is unofficially the "World Softball Capital", Midland is a continual host of state, national and international softball tournaments. In 1999, Midland was the site of the final qualifier for the 2000 Olympics' USA Women's Softball Team.

This year will mark the second year that Currie Stadium located in Midland, Mich. will host the Mid-American Conference Softball Championship. The Kent State Golden Flashes are the 2006 MAC Softball Champions.

***** Divisional Champions / Regular-Season Champion

1. To qualify as the MAC divisional champion, a team must play at least 14 conference games.
2. The divisional championship will be decided on overall conference winning percentage. A tie game shall count as a half-game won and a half-game lost. If two teams are tied for the championship, they shall be considered co-champions.
3. The team with the best overall conference winning percentage shall be declared the MAC Champion. If two or more teams are tied for the championship, they shall be considered co-champions.

***** Tournament Seeding. The No. 1 seed shall be the team with the highest overall conference winning percentage, with the No. 2 seed being the other divisional champion. The No. 3-8 seeds will be based on overall conference winning percentage, regardless of division. Ties in the conference standings shall be broken as follows:

- a. Head-to-head competition
- b. Winning percentage* vs. ranked conference teams (top to bottom, regardless of division; versus common opponents, regardless of the number of times played)
- c. Overall winning percentage vs. common MAC opponents
- d. If tied teams have played each other, average of runs scored against; if tied teams have not played each other, average of runs scored against vs. all common MAC opponents
- e. Coin flip

* Winning percentage is used instead of record because of situations where teams do not play each other the same number of times. Therefore, a team that is 1-0 (1.000) would win the tiebreaker over a team that is 1-1 (.500).
