THE GAME

Air Force vs. #7/9 Oklahoma

Saturday, Sept. 18, 2:30 p.m. CT, Gaylord Family - Oklahoma Memorial Stadium (82,112), Norman, OK

- Air Force is playing Oklahoma for just the second time ever and first time since opening the 2001 season against the third-ranked Sooners, who were coming off the 2000 national championship.
- Air Force is receiving votes in both polls this week.
- Oklahoma has won 32 straight home games dating back to 2005.
- Air Force is 2-0 for the third time in the last four years.
- Air Force is second in the nation and Oklahoma fourth in the number of true freshmen to play this season. The Falcons have played 13 while Oklahoma has played 12.
- Air Force is playing back-to-back games vs. nationally ranked teams for the first time since Nov. 15 and 22, 2008 when the team played No. 16/18 BYU (L 38-24) and No. 15/17 TCU (L 44-10).

THE COACHES

Air Force: Troy Calhoun (Air Force, 1989) is in his fourth season. He has led the Falcons to a 27-14 career record. Calhoun is 17-8 in MWC games, 10-6 in non-conference games, 16-4 in Falcon Stadium, 10-4 in the month of September and 0-0 vs. Oklahoma.

Oklahoma: Bob Stoops (Iowa, 1983) is in his 12th season. He has led the Sooners to a 119-29 overall record and is the winningest active coach in the country. Stoops is 77-17 in Big 12 games and 1-0 vs. Air Force.

THE SERIES

- Oklahoma leads the series, 1-0, after a 44-3 win in Falcon Stadium in 2001.
- The Sooners were the defending national champions and ranked third nationally at the time.

LAST MEETING VS. OKLAHOMA

Defending national champion Oklahoma defeated Air Force, 44-3, in Falcon Stadium in the season opener for the Falcons. The Sooners took a 20-3 lead into the fourth quarter before breaking away. Tim Duncan hit a 26-yard field goal to open the quarter. Nate Hybl, who opened the scoring in the first quarter with a two-yard run, hit Mark Clayton with an eight-yard scoring strike to stretch the lead to 30-3. Quentin Griffin added a touchdown run and Cory Heinecke closed the scoring with a 69-yard fumble return for a score. Oklahoma finished the game with 398 total yards. Griffin rushed for 201 yards on 26 carries to lead the Sooners. Air Force was held to 249 yards. Keith Boyea led the way with 80 yards rushing. The loss was the first under then-coach Fisher DeBerry in a home opener vs. a non-conference opponent.

AIR FORCE VS. THE BIG 12

- Air Force is 11-28-2 all-time against teams in the Big 12 Conference.
- Oklahoma's visit to Falcon Stadium in 2001 marked Air Force's last game vs. a team from the Big 12.
- Prior to that meeting, all the action against teams in the Big 12 was prior to the start of the league.
- Air Force's last win against a team from the Big 12 dates back to the 1985 Bluebonnet Bowl win over Texas, 24-16.

OKLAHOMA TIES

- Senior DE Rick Ricketts has three sisters, two of which have ties to Oklahoma. His sister Samantha was an All-American (2010) softball player at Oklahoma while Keilani is a sophomore pitcher currently on the softball team at OU.
- Air Force's varsity roster has two players from Oklahoma, junior DB P.J. Adeji-Paul and freshman RB Tony Daniels, Jr., who both are from Tulsa, OK. Adeji-Paul attended Jenks High School while Daniels went to Booker T. Washington.

SIZE DIFFERENCE

- Air Force's defensive line averages 6-foot-3 and 261 pounds per man compared to 6-foot-5 and 301 pounds per man for the Oklahoma offensive line. That's two inches and 40 pounds on the average per man.
- Air Force's offensive line average is 6-3 and 252 pounds while OU's defensive line is 6-3 and 274 pounds.

AIR FORCE VS. NON-CONFERENCE FOES UNDER CALHOUN

- Air Force is 10-6 against non-conference foes under head coach Troy Calhoun.
- The Falcons are 6-1 at home, 2-3 on the road and 2-2 in neutral site games.
- Air Force has a three-game winning streak vs. non-conference opponents entering this week.

AIR FORCE VS. RANKED TEAMS

- Air Force is playing back-to-back games vs. nationally ranked teams for the first time since Nov. 15 and 22, 2008 when the team played No. 16/18 BYU (L 38-24) and No. 15/17 TCU (L 44-10).
- Oklahoma is the highest ranked team Air Force has played since the third-ranked Sooners visited Falcon Stadium in 2001.
- The Falcons snapped a 14-game losing streak to ranked teams with its 47-20 win over No. 25 Houston in the Bell Helicopter Armed Forces Bowl last year.
- Air Force defeated No. 24 BYU last week to record consecutive victories over ranked teams for the first time since 1996-98. Air Force beat No. 8/9 Notre Dame, 20-17, in 1996 and No. 25 Wyoming, 10-3, in 1998.
- The 27-point victory over Houston last year is the largest victory margin over a ranked team in school history. The 21-point win over BYU is the third-largest in Air Force history over a ranked team.
- Air Force is 16-67-4 all-time vs. ranked teams.

FOUR BOWL TEAMS IN FOUR WEEKS

- Air Force is in a stretch of four games featuring bowl teams from 2009: BYU, Oklahoma, Wyoming and Navy.
- The four teams combined for a 36-17 (.697) overall record and a 16-9 (.667) conference mark in 2009.
- Following the four games, Air Force plays two of its next three on the road.
- The 2010 schedule features six 2009 bowl teams overall, including TCU and Utah.

LAST WEEK

Air Force defeated BYU, 35-14, in Falcon Stadium in the final conference game between the long-time rivals. The Falcons rolled up 477 total yards, including 409 rushing, while controlling the ball for 36:59. Asher Clark led the way with 121 yards rushing on 18 carries while Jared Tew chipped in with 77 yards on 17 carries. Jonathan Warzeka added 62 yards on six carries and scored on a 46-yard run on fourth-and-two in the third quarter. The Falcons were dominant in the second half defensively, holding BYU scoreless and allowing just five first downs, 62 rushing yards, 41 passing yards and 103 total yards. The defense was led by Jordan Waiwaiole, who had seven tackles. Brady Amack added six and Andre Morris chipped in with four tackles and two forced fumbles.

LAST WEEK'S GAME NOTES

Team Notes

- Air Force snapped a six-game losing streak to BYU, winning for the first time since 2003.
- The Falcons beat BYU in Falcon Stadium for the first time since 2002, snapping a three-game skid.
- Air Force improved to 11-1 in MWC openers and have won 11 straight.
- BYU had 183 yards of total offense in the first quarter and then had 126 total yards in the final three quarters today.
- BYU's 14 points mark the fewest points the Falcons have allowed to the Cougars since the 24-10 Air Force win in 2003.
- AFA's 35 points are the most against the Cougars since the 52-9 win in 2002.
- AFA had eight penalties in the first half and just two in the second half.
- The attendance of 46,692 marks the first sellout since 49,367 vs. Notre Dame in 2006.

Individual Notes

- Mikel Hunter's 37-yard TD catch in the first quarter was the first of his career. He had the first two-TD game of his career with his 33-yard rushing touchdown in the second quarter. It is the first time in his career that he has a rushing and receiving touchdown in the same game.
- Jon Davis' forced fumble in the first quarter is his first turnover this season and seventh of his career. He has three career interceptions, one fumble recovery and three forced fumbles.
- Andre Morris had two forced fumbles in the second quarter, the fourth and fifth of his career.
- Ryan Gardner had the first fumble recovery of his career.
- Jonathan Warzeka's 46-yard touchdown run in the third quarter was the longest run on his career. He now has scored a touchdown in four straight games.
- Reggie Rembert's interception was the seventh of his career and the 15th turnover of his career. He now has seven career interceptions, four fumble recoveries and four fumble recoveries.
- Tim Jefferson has rushed and passed for a touchdown four times in his career and in both games this season. He has a rushing touchdown in three straight games dating back to the Armed Forces Bowl.
- Asher Clark's 121 rushing yards mark the fifth 100-yard rushing game of his career. His last one was in the 2009 Armed Forces Bowl vs. Houston when he had 129 yards on 17 carries. It is also Air Force's first 100-yard rushing game vs. BYU since Todd Newell went for 116 yards in 2008.

THIS IS AIR FORCE FOOTBALL

- Air Force has an all-time record of 330-274-13 in its 55th season of varsity football. The Falcons are 179-113-3 at home and 151-161-10 on the road and in neutral site games. AFA has played in 20 bowl games and has a 9-10-1 all-time record.
- Air Force is playing in its 31st year in a conference. This season marks the school's 12th year in the Mountain West Conference. Prior to 1999, Air Force was a member of the Western Athletic Conference from 1980-98. The school was an independent prior to 1980.
- Air Force is 43-40 as a member of the Mountain West Conference. The team is 26-16 at home and 17-24 on the road. The Falcons are 76-59 overall since joining the MWC in 1999, including marks of 44-24 at home, 27-31 on the road, 5-4 in neutral site games and 3-2 in bowls.

ACADEMICS AND FOOTBALL

The Air Force football team has the second-highest multi-year Academic Progress Rate (APR) of any team in the Football Bowl Subdivision, according to a report issued by the NCAA. The program's 988 ranks second only to Rutgers, who had a 992, among the 120 FBS football playing schools. Rounding out the top five were Rice (987), Northwestern (986) and Duke (983). The multi-year APR is for the 2005-06, 2006-07, 2007-08 and 2008-09 academic years.

Air Force's number is easily the best within the Mountain West Conference. TCU is second with a 968 while Utah is third at 949. Colorado State is fourth with a 945 followed by BYU (940), New Mexico and UNLV (934), San Diego State (931) and Wyoming (928). The Academy is also the highest ranking service academy, as Navy posted a 973 and Army a 964.

In addition, the Air Force football team once again had the top Graduation Success Rate (GSR) in the Mountain West Conference in the recently released report for 1999-2002. Air Force's 87 percent is followed

CALHOUN LEADS THE NATION IN COACHES APR

Air Force football coach Troy Calhoun led the nation in Academic Progress Rates for Division I head coaches released by the NCAA. Calhoun has a three-year average of 986, posting a 981 in 2006-07, a 989 in 2007-08 and a 987 for 2008-09. Ken Niumatalolo of Navy (978) ranked second nationally followed by Randy Shannon of Miami (977).

The APR provides a real-time look at a team's academic success each semester by tracking the academic progress of each student-athlete on scholarship. The APR accounts for eligibility, retention and graduation and provides a measure of each team's academic performance.

SECOND HALF BREAKDOWN

- Air Force has been dominant in the second half so far this season.
- The Falcons have not allowed a second half point all season, while scoring 55 points.

BLOCKED KICKS

- Air Force has blocked 105 kicks since 1990 when the team began tracking them.
- The breakdown: 51 punts, 32 field goals and 22 PATs
- Air Force set a school record with 11 blocks in 1997 (7 punts, 3 FGs, 1 punt)
- Single season records for each category: Punts (7, 1997), FGs (3, 6 times, 2003), PATs (5, 2006)
- The Falcons have blocked six kicks under head coach Troy Calhoun
- Air Force ranks 14th nationally since 2002 with 27 blocked kicks (Fresno State leads with 48)

100 YARDS RUSHING UNDER CALHOUN

- Air Force is 17-3 when it has a 100-yard rusher with Troy Calhoun at the helm (since 2007).
- The team's only losses came in the 2007 Armed Forces Bowl vs. California, vs. No. 16/14 BYU in 2008 and vs. Houston in the 2008 Armed Forces Bowl.
- Air Force has had two or more players top the 100-yard mark in a game three times, the most recent vs. Houston in the 2009 Armed Forces Bowl (Jared Tew 173, Asher Clark 129)
- Asher Clark has rushed for 100-plus yards five times, including vs. BYU with 121 yards.
- Jared Tew has rushed for 100 yards four times.

Air Force rushing numbers

- Air Force leads the nation in rushing with a 423.0 per-game average.
- Air Force ranked third in the nation in rushing in 2009 with a 283.46 average.

Falcons honoring troops

The Air Force Academy football team is honoring the Air Force and several different units throughout the season by wearing patches on its uniforms. The team will wear the Air Force patch to honor the men and women of the U.S. Air Force.

The team will also honor 10 of the Air Force's Heritage Wings and Groups by wearing patches on their home uniforms; and six USAF Air and Space Expeditionary Wings by wearing patches on their away uniforms for the third straight year. The team will wear the Air Force logo on both uniforms for the first time in 2008.

The Heritage Wings and Groups date back to the foundations of the Air Force, beginning on Aug. 1, 1907, when the U.S. Army Signal Corps established a small Aeronautical Division to take "charge of all matters pertaining to military ballooning, air machines and all kindred subjects." But, it was not until May 26, 1909, that military aviation was born, when Lts. Frank P. Lahm and Benjamin D. Foulois made their first ascent and qualified as the airship's first Army pilots. The National Security Act of 1947 created a separate Department of the Air Force, headed by a Secretary of the Air Force; from that law, today's Air Force was officially born on Sept. 18, 1947.

The 10 patches represent active duty units that have colorful and distinguished histories. These "heritage units" not only represent the legacy of the Air Force past, but also the promise of its future. Each Air Force mission and capability is represented with this cross-section of units.

The Air and Space Expeditionary Force concept is the Air Force's vision for the 21st century to organize, train, equip and deploy forces for contingency operations while remaining ready to meet national crises. AEF also helps create a mindset and culture that embraces the unique characteristics of air and space power - range, speed, flexibility and precision. Military personnel that are deployed become a part of one of these six wings.

Air Force Media Services

Media policies at the Air Force Academy are designed to provide simple access to game playing participants and coaches of the Air Force football program. Our policies begin by ensuring the football program supports the educational and leadership development of the cadets at the Air Force Academy while providing easy coverage for media members.

PRACTICES

Video/Photography: Video and photography during practices will be done by media members who are first cleared through the Air Force Academy Media Relations staff. Video and photos may be taken during Monday and Tuesdays practices during pre-practice and periods 2-4.

Air Force Football Practices: The Academy prefers open football practices. Open practices provide the opportunity to observe the training of officer candidates who are a part of the Air Force Academy football team. Open practice guidelines include refraining from blogging, reporting, or twittering/text messaging on happenings during practices to include injuries or tactics. Failure to follow this guideline will result in closing future practices.

INTERVIEWS

Player Availability: Player availability at the United States Air Force Academy is based upon respect for each cadet's academic, military, and leadership obligations in addition to any needed physical rehabilitation/treatment. Because treatment time may be necessary, players must physically complete the previous team activity (ie. either practice or game) to be available. Air Force upperclassmen will be accessible on Mondays and Tuesdays from 1:15-1:45 p.m. and following games. Freshmen who played in the most recent game will be available on Tuesdays from 1:15 to 1:45 p.m. and following games. During USAFA mid-semester lessons M17 (Sept. 22) through USAFA T21 (Oct. 5) and during December final exams Air Force will select three cadets who will only be available after practices on Mondays and Tuesdays. Air Force players are available for live radio shows following each game.

Coaches Availability: Air Force assistant coaches are available to discuss the position players they coach. Assistant coaches are accessible on Mondays and Tuesdays from 1:15 to 1:45 p.m. Coach Troy Calhoun is accessible in a number of ways. They include: Sundays at 6 pm during the season via conference call (beginning Sunday, Sept. 5, after Monday practices, Tuesday mornings on the MWC teleconference, Tuesday afternoon from 12:30-1:00 at the Air Force Academy media room during his weekly teleconference, after Wednesday practices, and following games.

POST-GAME INTERVIEWS

Air Force's locker room is closed at all times. Coaches and players (that finished the game) will be brought to designated areas. After home games, it will be in the media room at the south end of the field.

RADIO/TV SHOWS

TV: Air Force Football with Troy Calhoun (TV) airs on the internet at goairforcefalcons.com and is available each night following games.

Radio: Falcon Talk with Troy Calhoun (Radio) airs every Thursday evening from 6:30 to 7:30 p.m. on KVOR AM 740 in Colorado Springs. The show is taped live at Colorado Mountain Brewery.

Head Coach Troy Calhoun

Sometimes people seem born for a particular job or situation. That has never been the case more than Troy Calhoun being the head football coach at the Air Force Academy.

The Air Force Academy's purpose is to develop young people of strong character who graduate and serve as outstanding leaders for our country. Air Force student-athletes must complete one of the nation's most demanding academic curriculums while further embedding the kind of heart and character that are a crucial foundation for service. It's a purpose Calhoun thoroughly respects and appreciates. While embracing the mission of the Academy, Calhoun has also found a way to build a very competitive football program within one of college football's strongest conferences.

Calhoun is the only coach in the 100-plus year history of service academy football to lead teams to at least eight regular-season wins and a bowl game in each of his first three seasons. He added another significant accomplishment this season, as he became the only coach in Air Force history to win at least seven regular season games three straight years. Calhoun was named National Football Foundation, Colorado Chapter, coach of the year in 2009 for his efforts.

His players have also been amazingly successful finishing their academic and leadership responsibilities. The Air Force football team's most recent NCAA APR is an astounding 988 which once again places the Academy amongst the nation's top three in the sport of football. A total of 58 players (from the Academy classes of 2008-12) have started at least one game since Calhoun became head coach. All 36 members of that group from the classes of 2008-09 have graduated from the Academy and are currently serving on active duty in the Air Force. There are 21 players from the classes of 2010, 2011 and 2012 that are on track to graduate with their respective classmates.

Calhoun has also lifted the Falcon football program to unprecedented heights within the Mountain West Conference in his four seasons. Calhoun is **27-14** in his fourth season after taking over a program that had posted three straight losing seasons before his arrival. They have posted wins at Notre Dame and Utah and led the Falcons to three straight bowl games for the first time since becoming a member of the MWC.

In Mountain West Conference play, Calhoun is **17-8**, the most MWC wins in school history in a three-year span. The 16 wins is the fourth most for Air Force over three years in its conference history and most since 1996-98. His conference winning percentage is the fourth best in MWC history.

Air Force, coming off a three straight losing seasons, finished the 2007 season 9-4 overall and placed second in the Mountain West Conference with a 6-2 mark in Calhoun's first year. The Falcons earned their first bowl bid in five seasons, advancing to the Bell Helicopter Armed Forces Bowl in Fort Worth, Texas.

The five-game turnaround from the previous season, was the largest in the nation by a first-year head coach and tied as the third-largest overall in the nation. The five-game turnaround is the best in school history since the 1958 team had a school-record turnaround of six games.

Calhoun was named the conference's coach of the year for his efforts. In addition, he was named coach of the year in Region 5 by the American Football Coaches Association and was one of eight finalists for national coach of the year honors. Calhoun followed with back-to-back 8-5 overall records and fourth place conference finishes with 5-3 marks in 2008 and 2009. The team earned bids to the Armed Forces Bowl each season and posted the school's first bowl victory since 2000 with a 47-20 win over Houston this season.

Calhoun brought a wealth of experience and impressive resume at the collegiate and professional levels that is flooded with success at every stop to the Academy. Calhoun came to the Academy after serving as offensive coordinator and quarterbacks coach for the Houston Texans in 2006. The Texans were one of only two NFL teams to triple their number of wins from the previous year.

Calhoun became a well-rounded NFL coach, working as a defensive assistant, special teams assistant and offensive assistant with the Denver Broncos from 2003-05. He began his NFL coaching career by serving as the defensive assistant under defensive coordinator Larry Coey in 2003.

Prior to the NFL, Calhoun was an offensive coordinator for six seasons on the collegiate level. He began his coaching career at Air Force, where he worked as a graduate assistant from 1989-90. He started at quarterback for the Academy in 1986 and was one of only two freshmen to letter for the 1985 team that finished fifth in the final polls with a 12-1 record that included wins over national powers Notre Dame and Texas.

Calhoun served his country from 1989-95 as an active duty officer in the Air Force. He was the Falcons' recruiting coordinator and the junior varsity offensive coordinator in 1993-94.

He moved to Ohio University in 1995 where he served as the quarterbacks coach for two seasons. Calhoun was promoted to offensive coordinator in 1997. Calhoun moved to Wake Forest in 2001 and remained there prior to his stint with the Broncos.

Groomed on the basics of integrity and passion, Calhoun is a native of Roseburg, Ore., and was raised in a home where both kids graduated from the Air Force Academy and were varsity letterwinners on nationally-ranked teams. Calhoun's younger sister, Callie, is a 1991 Academy graduate and four-year letterwinning in track and cross country. Calhoun finished at the Academy on the superintendent's list and graduated with over a 3.0 grade point average and a military performance average of better than 3.0. He and his wife, Amanda, live in Colorado Springs and have two children, Tyler (eight) and Amelia (six).
