### NEXT UP

- Oklahoma hits the road for the first time in 2011 with a midweek game at UT-Arlington on March 1. The Sooners and Mavericks have met in 13 of the last 14 years (missed 2007) and OU leads the overall series, 18-9. In 2010, OU topped UTA, 4-3, in Norman avenging the loss in 2009 at Arlington. OU has won five out of the last six meetings. Following the midweek game, OU travels to San Diego, Calif, for a tournament against San Diego State (March 3 and 6), San Diego (March 4) and California (March 5).

#### EVAN MISTICH

The junior college transfer scored a school-record six runs in the Sooners' 27-7 win over Arkansas-Pine Bluff on Feb. 22. In his three starts, Mistich has scored nine runs with seven hits and

six RBIs. The Houma, La., native leads OU with a .615 average and ranks third on the team with eight RBIs.

### HEAD COACH SUNNY GOLLOWAY

Sunny Golloway has led the Sooners to five NCAA Regional finals, 220 victories and a top 25 ranking in each of his six years at the helm of the OU program. In 2010, the Sooners made the program's 10th appearance in the College World Series and first since 1995.

The path started after OU hosted an NCAA Regional for the second straight year and advanced to the program's second Super Regional appearance. The series win over then-No. 1 Virginia propelled back to the final season at Rosenblatt Stadium in Omaha, Neb.

OU finished 2010 with a No. 5 national ranking and a 50-18 overall record, marking the fifth season in program history with 50 or more wins. Fifteen of those wins came in Big 12 play as OU finished in second place in the standings for the second straight year. In addition, Garrett Buechele and Max White were named All-Americans.

The run in 2010 was even more impressive when considering the nine Sooners lost to the MLB Draft, a Big 12 best in 2009. The nine selections tied for the third most in program history. Since 2005, 34 Sooners have been drafted under Golloway.

Including eight seasons (1996-2003) as the head coach at Oral Roberts and his record at OU's helm, Golloway is 555-272-1 (.671). The winning percentage ranked No. 15 nationally among active head coaches (min. five years) prior to 2011.

### LAST TIME OUT

The Sooners improved to 6-0 with a pair of midweek victories at home against Arkansas-Pine Bluff. On Tuesday, OU cruised to a 27-7 victory thanks to tying a school record with 14 runs in the eighth inning. Evan Mistich also set a school record with six runs scored. On Wednesday, OU needed just seven innings to complete a 12-1, run-rule victory.

### 6-0 STARTS

The 6-0 start is the best for a Sooner club under head coach Sunny Golloway. OU was 5-0 each of the last two seasons. The last time an OU team started a season 6-0 was in 1998 when the Sooners rattled off 12 straight wins to begin the campaign. The 1998 team holds the longest undefeated streak to start a season with a 12-0 mark. Other undefeated streaks to begin a season include 1994 (6-0), 1987 (7-0), 1984 (11-0) and 1974 (10-0).

### MISC NOTES

- OU leads the Big 12 with 11 home runs while the other nine teams in the conference have a combined 14.
- OU also leads the conference with 81 runs, the next closest team, Texas, has scored 39 runs. The Sooners lead the Big 12 in hits with 81, while Nebraska is second with 51.
- The Sooner offense has outscored the opposition 81-20, including 65 runs and 65 hits in the last four games.
- Garrett Buechele, the Big 12 Player of the Week, leads the Big 12 with four homers and 11 hits, and ranks second in RBI (10)
- Chris Ellison and Evan Mistich lead the Big 12 with 10 runs scored apiece, which is more than four teams in the Big 12 have scored (KSU, MU, BU and KU).
- Jordan John leads the Big 12 with 12 strikeouts and is tied for the lead in wins with two.
- Five of the Sooners' six starting pitchers have lasted at least five innings, including seven frames from Michael Rocha, Dillon Overton and Jordan John.
- OU has won its last 13 games at home dating back to last season
- Seven freshmen saw playing time after six games and 10 newcomers overall have taken the field
- Michael Rocha and the Sooner bullpen limited the Tribe to one hit on Feb. 18, the fewest allowed since OU's last no-hitter, a combined effort on March 9, 2005 against Arkansas-Pine Bluff.
- The Sooner bullpen is 3-0 with a save in 17.1 innings so far. It has allowed three earned runs (1.56 ERA) with 16 strikeouts.

### OU NO. 5 IN PRESEASON POLLS

The Sooners were tabbed No. 5 in *Baseball America's* preseason top 25 poll. Oklahoma was also ranked No. 5 in the preseason by the NCBWA. The Sooners have been ranked in the top 10 by *Baseball America*, at some point in the season, in each of the last three years. Only the 1984-1987 Sooners can claim a better streak among the nation's top 10 in program history. The 2011 preseason ranking is the highest for OU since 1995 when it was coming off the program's second National Championship and entered the season as *Baseball America's* No. 3 team in the nation.

### BIG CROWD ON OPENING DAY

The Sooners opening day win came in front of a crowd of 1,522 at L. Dale Mitchell Park, the largest attendance at an OU home opener since 1999 (1,680 vs. Emporia State). OU averaged 1,473 in the four games last weekend.

### SOONERS FAVORED TO WIN BIG 12 REGULAR SEASON

For the first time since 1995, Oklahoma is the preseason favorite to claim the Big 12 baseball regular season championship heading into the 2011 season, in a vote of the league's head coaches. In 2010, the Sooners made their 10th College World Series appearance and first trip to Omaha since 1995. It marks the first time since 1995 that OU was selected as the top pick in the preseason poll. The Sooners have twice been picked No. 2 in the Big 12 preseason poll (1999 and 2001) with the highest prediction under Golloway coming in 2010 (fourth). In 1995, OU was the No. 1 team headed into the Big Eight season after winning the program's second National Championship the previous year. A complete poll is listed on page 5.

### TIME FOR A RALLY

In the six victories in 2011, the Sooners have come from behind in three of those contests. Of Sunny Golloway's 226 wins at OU, 116 (.513) have been in come-from-behind fashion, including 22 last year. Below is a breakdown of the 2011 comebacks:

### OU LEADS BIG 12 IN HITTING

After six games, OU leads the Big 12 Conference in batting average (.406), hits (81), runs (82), homers (11) and slugging percentage (.678).

### WHO'S BACK

The Sooners return seven position starters and two weekend starting pitchers from last year's College World Series team that won 50 games for the fifth time in program history. Included in that bunch is 2010 All-American Garrett Buechele at third base, 2010 Freshman All-American Max White at second base and 2009 All-American Ryan Duke (closer). OU welcomes back all but 14 of the 105 home runs hit last year and 32 of the 50 wins registered by the pitching staff.

### BLAIR, BUECHELE, OGLE & ROCHA NAMED CAPTAINS

Seniors Elliott Blair and Michael Rocha and juniors Garrett Buechele and Tyler Ogle were voted as the 2011 captains by their teammates back in October during the team's annual visit to Willow Springs Boys Ranch in Chandler, Okla. Buechele is the only two-time captain (2010).

### BUECHELE COLLECTING PRESEASON ACCOLADES

Junior Garrett Buechele was named to the National Collegiate Baseball Writers Association and *Collegiate Baseball* preseason All-America teams. He also appears on the watch list for the Golden Spikes Award (nation's top player). While the preseason accolades are new for Buechele, he was tabbed a second team All-American following the Sooners' 2010 season. Buechele led OU in every offensive category en route to the program's 10th CWS appearance and first since 1995. The Arlington native was taken in the 18th round of the 2010 MLB Draft (Texas Rangers).

**DUKE TIED FOR CAREER SAVES LEAD**

Ryan Duke, who is on the NCBWA Stopper of the Year watch list for the second straight year, recorded one save at the 2010 College World Series in OU's opening win over South Carolina and moved into a tie for first place on OU's all-time saves list (below). Duke finished with 12 saves, the nation's 12th best total in 2010 and ranked second in the Big 12. He led the Big 12 in saves with 16 in 2009 (ranked sixth in the nation), the second most in a single season by a Sooner (Jeff Bajenaru - 20, 2000). Duke is the first Sooner in school history to have 10 or more in two seasons. Below is a look at where he ranks in OU history.

**EXTRA INNINGS UNDER GOLLOWAY**

OU was 3-2 in extra-inning games this season after winning two in the Norman Regional over Oral Roberts and North Carolina. On April 24 at Texas A&M, OU won in 13 innings and the game was the longest in terms of innings in the Sunny Golloway era and the longest for an OU team since May 16, 2002 vs. Oklahoma State. OU is 18-4-1 overall in extra innings since Sunny Golloway took over the helm of the Sooner program at the end of the 2005 season. One of those losses came at Oklahoma State (11 innings) earlier this year. The other losses included South Carolina (June 24, 2010), Arkansas (April 28, 2009) and Mizzou (April 19, 2009). The Sooners tied Nebraska in 2008. OU was 3-1 in 2009 in games played in extra innings.

**ONE-RUN GAMES UNDER GOLLOWAY**

The Sooners recorded one-run victories in 13 games this year and finished 14-7 in those situations in 2010. The Sooners are 63-26-1 (.705) under head coach Sunny Golloway. The Sooners' skipper entered 2010 with the best winning percentage among Big 12 coaches over the last five years (.721).

**BASEBALL ON KREF 1400 AM IN 2011**

The 2011 season marks the second with KREF 1400 AM serving as the flagship station of Sooner baseball. The partnership provides expanded coverage for OU fans to listen to 54 regular season games live over the air and extends into postseason play.

Additionally, 23 of the games are set to be carried on the Sooners Sports' Network, enabling fans to listen to OU baseball on the radio state-wide. The state-wide coverage begins on April 1 against Texas Tech and will continue for each of the games in Big 12 play. The network schedule also includes OU's midweek games at home vs. Oklahoma State (April 5) and TCU (April 12).

**2011 TELEVISION SCHEDULE**

In 2011, 13 baseball games will be televised locally for the 2011 season by Sooner Vision and Sooner Sports Properties. The broadcasts will air via the Sooner Sports Network on Cox Channel 3 in Oklahoma City and Tulsa. Local sports personality Toby Rowland from KWTW News 9 (Oklahoma City) will call the play-by-play along with color analyst Kenny Mossman, Oklahoma Associate Athletics Director for Communications.

On top of the local coverage, the Sooners can also be seen nationally for three contests. In the last six years, 69 OU games have been seen on regional or national television, with 20 telecasts in 2010.
