WASHINGTON vs. #3/3 OKLAHOMA

Third-Ranked Sooners Make First-Ever Trip To Montlake

THE GAME: The Washington football team (0-1 in the Pac-10, 0-2 overall) continues its current three-game homestand with a game against its third consecutive ranked opponent. This Saturday at 4:45 p.m. PT, Oklahoma (2-0 overall) rolls into Husky Stadium ranked No. 3 in the nation in both the Associated Press and coaches' polls. The Sooners, who beat the UW two seasons ago in Norman in the only other regular-season meeting between the two, opened their season with wins over Tennessee-Chattanooga and Cincinnati the last two weeks. After this game, the Huskies have a week off before closing out the homestand Sept. 27 vs. Stanford.

HUSKIES vs. SOONERS HISTORY: Washington has faced Oklahoma only twice. The more recent of those two games was just two seasons ago (Sept. 9, 2006) in Norman. See page three of this release for more on that game. The first meeting with Oklahoma remains one of the most famous games in the long history of Husky football. That Huskies-Sooners matchup took place in the Orange Bowl on Jan. 1, 1985, with all sorts of national championship implications on the line. The Huskies, who finished No. 2 behind Brigham Young in both major polls that season, beat Coach Barry Switzer's Oklahoma team, 28-17, behind a game MVP performance from tailback Jacque Robinson. The Huskies rushed for 192 yards in the game, surprising an Oklahoma defense that ranked No. 1 in the nation against the run and 68 yards per game. Washington entered the game 10-1 overall and ranked No. 4 in the country while the Sooners were ranked No. 2 with a 9-1-1 record. No. 1 Brigham Young had already disposed of a 6-5 Michigan team in the 1984 Holiday Bowl, but conventional wisdom held that if the Sooners beat the Huskies, Oklahoma would likely end up atop the polls. The Huskies had missed out on their chance for an unbeaten season and a Pac-10 title in the next-to-last game of the regular season when USC handed the top-ranked Huskies a 16-7 loss. In the Orange Bowl game, Washington jumped out to a 14-0 lead in the first quarter on a 29-yard pass from Paul Sicuro to Danny Greene and a one-yard Robinson run. However, the teams went to the locker room at halftime tied at 14-14 after a one-yard TD run from OU's Danny Bradley and a 61-yard pass from Bradley to Derrick Shepard. After a scoreless third, one of the most well-remembered and unusual incidents in Husky history occurred. After OU's Tim Lashar kicked a field goal to apparently give his team its first lead, the Sooners were penalized when the "Sooner Schooner" trotted onto the field prematurely as there had been a penalty on the play that had thus negated the field goal. After the original five-yard penalty and 15 more yards for unsportsmanlike conduct moved the kick back 20 yards, Tim Peoples blocked the next try, keeping the game tied at 14-14. However, Lashar later nailed a 35-yard field goal gave the Sooners a 17-14 lead with 8:48 to go. The UW then rallied behind Hugh Millen, who came off the bench in relief of Sicuro, who had replaced him as the starter earlier in the season. Millen drove the UW 74 yards on seven plays, the last a 12-yard TD to former Roosevelt High teammate Mark Pattison. On the ensuing OU drive, Husky linebacker Joe Kelly intercepted a pass at the Sooners' 10-yard line to set up a six-yard TD run from Rick Fenney that put the game away. Alas, amid controversy, Brigham Young emerged as the No. 1 team in both major polls.

TELEVISION: The Washington-Oklahoma will air live on to a national audience on ESPN television with Mike Patrick, Todd Blackledge and Holly Rowe providing the commentary. Additionally, "Huskies All-Access" airs Thursday evening on FSN. The program is an up-close look at each Husky game, with features, one-on-one interviews and sideline video.

RADIO: The Washington ISP Sports Network, with its flagship station KJR 950-AM, will carry the live broadcast of every football game to three different states and British Columbia, Canada, on 21 different radio stations. Longtime play-by-play man Bob Rondeau and color analyst Chuck Nelson are joined by sideline reporter Elise Woodward. Many game broadcasts will also be carried on XM Satellite Radio on channel 194, 195 or 196 and can be heard over the internet via the Dawg Channel at gohuskies.com. Also, the UW-Oklahoma game will air live nationwide on Sports USA Radio.

THE COACH: Tyrone Willingham was named Washington's 22nd head football coach on December 13, 2004. A former head coach at Notre Dame and Stanford, Willingham became the first African-American to serve as the Huskies head coach. Now in his fourth season at the UW, he brings an impressive resume with him to the Husky program. Willingham has acquitted himself well among his peers for much more than just fielding winning teams. Over the past 31 years Willingham has developed a coaching style that emphasizes toughness, enthusiasm, intelligence, discipline, commitment and unselfish play. The result has provided his players with more than just the opportunity to enjoy victories on the field. His guiding principles have prepared his players to be successful in life. Willingham, who turned 54 last Dec. 30, served as the head coach at Stanford (1995-2001) and Notre Dame (2002-2004) before coming to the UW. His Stanford teams enjoyed a 44-36-1 record while he was 21-15 with the Fighting Irish. In his inaugural season with the Irish in 2002, he wasted no time reversing the tide of the Irish program, leading Notre Dame to a 10-2 regular-season record and a trip to the 2003 Gator Bowl in Jacksonville, Fla. He was named Sportsman of the Year by The Sporting News after the 2002 season, while also picking up several national coach of the year awards. Prior to his tenure at Notre Dame, Willingham directed the Stanford program for seven seasons. In 1999, the Cardinal won the Pac-10 and earned a trip to the Rose Bowl for the first time since 1972, earning Willingham Pac-10 Coach of the Year honors. He also led the Cardinal to the 1995 Liberty Bowl, the 1996 Sun Bowl and the 2001 Seattle Bowl. Willingham, who grew up in Jacksonville, N.C., played both football and baseball at Michigan State, earning three letters in both sports and was awarded the Big Ten Conference Medal of Honor as the outstanding scholar-athlete in the league. He began his coaching career as a graduate assistant at his alma mater in 1977 and, aside from his two previous head coaching stints, has served as a full-time assistant at Central Michigan, Michigan State, North Carolina State, Rice and Stanford, as well as with the Minnesota Vikings. Here's a look at Willingham's head coaching career:

PAC-10 DOUBLE DIP: It used to be somewhat unusual to find a Pac-10 head coach who had previously been the head man at another school in the conference. Now, UW coach Tyrone Willingham is one of three that fit that bill, alongside UCLA coach Rick Neuheisel (formerly of Washington) and ASU coach Dennis Erickson (formerly of WSU and OSU). Willingham, who previously spent seven seasons in charge at Stanford, is the third straight UW coach to have previously been the head man at another league program as his predecessor Keith Gilbertson was formerly Cal's head coach.

WILLINGHAM vs. THE PAC-10: Thanks mostly to his time at Stanford, but also via frequent games vs. Western teams while at Notre Dame, Tyrone Willingham has amassed a lengthy record against Pac-10 teams. Overall, Willingham is 53-47 against Pac-10 teams. Interestingly, his teams have struggled the most against UW, as he went 1-6 against his current team. Here's Willingham's record against each Pac-10 team: Arizona (4-4), Arizona State (4-6), California (8-2), Oregon (4-5), Oregon State (3-6), Stanford (4-1), UCLA (4-6), USC (4-9), Washington (1-6), Washington State (7-4).

COACHING STAFF: Washington's coaching staff, under fourth-year head coach Tyrone Willingham, saw its biggest turnover in his tenure with three new assistant coaches on this year's staff – defensive coordinator Ed Donatell, running backs coach Steve Gervais and tight ends and special teams coach Brian White. The UW's current list of assistants includes a number of names that are familiar to savvy Pac-10 football fans. Willingham, of course, spent seven seasons in charge of Stanford, where he'd previously served as an assistant (1989-91) for three seasons. And, two members of the Husky staff from 2004 season were held over as well, lending more than a little familiarity. Defensive line coach Randy Hart is working for his fifth different head coach as a member of the Husky staff while linebackers coach Chris Tormey, is beginning his 17th season at the UW, spread over three different stints. Aside from those three, several other UW coaches came to Seattle with experience in or around the Northwest. Spokane native Tim Lappano previously worked at Idaho, Washington State, California, Oregon State and with the Seattle Seahawks. Donatell has spent much of his coaching career in the NFL, but was a graduate assistant at the UW in 1981 and 1982. Finally, Mike Denbrock (offensive line) worked one season at Stanford. Only White, Gervais and wide receivers coach Charlie Baggett, who has spent much of his career in the NFL, don't trace their coaching roots through the Pac-10 before coming to the UW. White, however, did square off vs. the UW last season when he was on the Syracuse staff and Gervais is a local product, having served as head coach at four Puget Sound-area high schools, winning six state titles overall. One of the two Husky grad assistants is in his second season and was well known before that as former North Carolina QB Luke Huard is the younger brother for former Husky signal callers Damon and Brock Huard. The other grad assistant, in his first season at the UW, is Torrey Myers, who has coached mainly in New Mexico.

WASHINGTON-OKLAHOMA TIES: As might be expected when dealing with two programs from different parts of the country, there's not been a lot of interaction or crossover between the UW coaching staff and players and those of Oklahoma. There are no players from Oklahoma on the Huskies' roster, nor are there any players from Washington (or the Northwest) on the Sooners' roster. The closest thing to a connection among players is several players from each team hail from the Phoenix area, both Oklahoma (Joey Halzle) and UW (Josh Gage and Skyler Fancher) have players from Huntington Beach, Calif., and Husky safety Victor Aiyewa is from the Houston, Texas, area, as are several Sooners. The coachings staffs at Washington and Oklahoma share no true connections, in that no current coaches have worked with one another on previous staffs, etc. The closest thing to a connection is that OU receiver coach Jay Norvell spent last season in the Pac-10 as offensive coordinator at UCLA. Likewise, quarterbacks coach Josh Heupel's first full-time job was as a tight ends coach at Arizona in 2005. No Husky coach has ever spent time on a coaching staff of a current Big 12 program.

LAST TIME vs. OKLAHOMA (SEPT. 9, 2006): Washington's only game vs. Oklahoma other than the 1985 Orange Bowl came in Norman two seasons ago. Tied at halftime, the 10th-ranked Sooners pulled ahead in the third quarter to post a 37-20 win over the Huskies. After OU punted on its first possession, Husky tailback Kenny James ran 54 yards for a touchdown on the UW's first play of the game. OU quarterback Paul Thompson hit Malcolm Kelly with a seven-yard score later in the first to tie it. In the second, both teams traded field goals, leaving the score tied at 13-13 after two periods. However, after halftime, Oklahoma pulled away. Thompson and Kelly connected on a 35-yard score and, after a field goal, Adrian Peterson ran in from 17 yards out. In the fourth quarter, Peterson scored on a seven-yard run to ice it before Carl Bonnelli wrapped up the scoring with a two-yard pass to Sonny Shackelford. Louis Rankin rushed for 112 yards to lead the UW while Peterson rushed for 165 for the Sooners. Of note was the fact that Husky punter Sean Douglas booted punts of 82 and 81 yards, the two longest punts in Washington history.

HUSKIES vs. THE BIG 12: Remarkably enough, Washington has played at least one game against every current member of the Big 12 Conference except one: Missouri. The Huskies are 21-19-2 (.524) all-time against the other 11 Big 12 members. The UW is 14-9-1 against the Big 12 in games played in Seattle, 4-7-1 as the visiting team and 3-3 in bowl games. The first-ever such matchup came way back in 1915 when Washington beat Colorado, 46-0, on the UW campus. Prior to the game vs. Oklahoma two years ago, it had been five years since the prior UW-Big-12 game, that being a scintillating 47-43 Husky loss to Texas in the Holiday Bowl on December 28, 2001. The last time a Big 12 team visited Husky Stadium was Sept. 25, 1999, when the Huskies beat Colorado, 31-24. Here's the UW's all-time record against each current Big 12 institution: Baylor (1-3), Colorado (5-5-1), Iowa State (1-0), Kansas (1-0), Kansas State (4-1), Missouri (0-0), Nebraska (3-3-1), Oklahoma (1-1), Oklahoma State (1-1), Texas (1-3), Texas A&M (1-2), Texas Tech (2-0).

TOP-10 NON-CONFERENCE FOES AT HUSKY STADIUM: Oklahoma, ranked No. 3 in this week's Associated Press top-25 poll, will be the highest-ranked non-conference team to visit Husky Stadium since Oct. 4, 1969, when a No. 1-ranked Ohio State team beat the Huskies, 41-14, at Husky Stadium. Washington has hosted No. 1-ranked USC in each of the Trojans' last two visits to Seattle, but those were, of course, Pac-10 Conference games. In fact, despite a long tradition of playing tough non-conference opponents, the Sooners will be only the fourth top-5 non-conference opponent to play the UW in Seattle and the 13th top-10 non-league foe to visit Montlake. Here's a list of every top-10-ranked non-conference teams to play the UW in Seattle (all rankings are AP at the time of the game):

PLAYING THE FRESHMEN: A total of eight true freshman saw action in the Huskies' season opener at Oregon: Devin Aguilar, Jermaine Kearse, Senio Kelemete, Kavario Middleton, Chris Polk, Jordan Polk, Alameda Ta'amu, Everrette Thompson. In the BYU game, freshman tailback David Freeman made his debut, increasing the total to nine true freshmen who have played for the Dawgs this season. That surpasses the total of seven that saw action in the 2007 season. In 2006, only two true freshmen played. In the Oregon game, two freshman (C. Polk at tailback and Middleton at tight end) started the game. Additionally, Jordan Polk was on the field for the start of the game as a kickoff returner and Kelemete was listed as a starter, but the UW opened in a nickel defense, so he wasn't on the field for the first play and therefore did not officially start the game. Chris Polk, Kelemete and Middleton all started vs. Brigham Young.

TEAM NOTES

THE RED ZONE: Washington is a perfect 5-for-5 in the red zone this season, scoring a touchdown on four of those five trips. The Huskies have foiled their opponents in two of nine red-zone trips, getting a missed field goal at Oregon and a fumble vs. BYU. Here's a breakdown of the Huskies and their opponents in the red zone this year:

CAPTAINS: Washington does not have season-long captains as Coach Tyrone Willingham will name game captains each week. Each game's set of captains are informed of the honor the Friday night before each game and revealed to the fans, etc., when those four designated players take the field for the coin flip prior to each game. Here are this year's game captains:

Oregon: Donald Butler, Juan Garcia, Jake Locker, Daniel Te'o-Nesheim

BYU: Juan Garcia, Paul Homer, Chris Stevens, Trenton Tuiasosopo

ONLY THE BIG BOYS: As of last season, Washington is one of just five NCAA Division I-A programs that has never faced a non-Division I-A opponent since the current division setup was established in 1978 (the division's names have undergone a change this year, but the setup is still the same). Both Michigan and Ohio State fell of the club as the Wolverines opened last season with Appalachian State and the Buckeyes vs. Youngstown State, both on the same day. The five schools that have yet to play a non-Division I-A opponent since the advent of the current format are Michigan State, Notre Dame, USC, UCLA and Washington.

DECADE AFTER DECADE: Washington has won a conference title and a trip to the Rose Bowl in each of the last nine decades, dating back to the 1920s when Washington won the berth in 1923 and 1925. In the 1930s, the Dawgs won the '36 title. In the '40s, Washington earned the trip in 1943 and then barely slipped in under the wire in the 1950s, winning the 1959 crown. The Huskies won two Rose Bowl berths in the 1960s -- 1960 and 1963 -- and one in the 1970s (1977). Titles in 1980 and 1982 did it for that decade and three straight trips to Pasadena to begin the 1990s covered that 10-year span. Now in the 2000s, UW was the first team to earn Rose Bowl berths in nine straight decades. USC joined the Dawgs in that distinction in 2004 after their New Year's Day appearance in Pasadena.

ROSTER CHANGES: As always, a number of changes have occurred to the UW roster since it was published in the media guide. For the most accurate and up-to-date roster, please refer to the final two pages of this press release.

FINISHING FIRST OR SECOND: Despite a lower division finishes in the Pac-10 the last four years, Washington has finished either first or second in the conference (including ties) in 18 of the last 31 seasons, dating back to a fourth-place finish in 1976. Over that span, Washington has won the championship (outright or shared) eight times -- 1977, 1980, 1981, 1990, 1991, 1992, 1995 and 2000 -- while finishing second 10 other times.

THE 100-YARD FACTOR: Since the 1947 season, Washington is 166-45-3 (.783) when a Husky player rushes for 100 yards in a game. The Huskies went 3-1 in such games in 2003, 1-1 in 2004, 2-3 in 2005, 2-1 in 2006 and 3-4 in 2007. In last year's season-opener at Syracuse, tailback Louis Rankin rushed for 147 yards in a 42-12 Husky win. Rankin had 255 in a win at Stanford and both Rankin and Brandon Johnson went over 100 in the win over Cal. However, the Huskies lost to Ohio State, Arizona and WSU despite 102, 157 and 103 yards, respectively, from Jake Locker, and lost at Hawaii despite 145 from Rankin.

HISTORY LESSON: Successfully rushing the football and winning go hand-in-hand for the Huskies. Since 1990, UW has rushed for 200 yards in a game 71 times. The Huskies' record stands at 59-11-1 (.838) in those contests. Since the 1995 season, Washington is 34-8-1 (.802) when rushing for 200 yards. The UW was 3-3 in such games last year (wins vs. Syracuse, Stanford and Cal; losses to Arizona, WSU, Hawaii).

PLAYING AT HOME: Washington has gone unbeaten at home 13 times in its history, including six times in the last 19 seasons. Washington has won 79 of its last 114 (.697) games at Husky Stadium with one tie (79-34-1). Since 1980, the Huskies stand 127-45-2 (.736) at home. Since 1990, the Huskies are 49-25-1 (.660) at Husky Stadium vs. Pac-10 opponents.

HISTORIC HUSKY STADIUM: The 2008 season marks the 89th season of play in Husky Stadium. Original construction on the facility was completed in 1920 when Washington played one game in the new campus facility. Thanks to several major renovations, Husky Stadium's seating capacity has increased to its current total of 72,500. UW's all-time record in Husky Stadium currently stands at 344-157-21 (.679).

FAMILY TIES: As is the case with most seasons of Husky football, there are a number of players on the Washington football team related to either current or former Huskies. Linebacker Trenton Tuiasosopo is a first cousin of former Huskies Marques and Zach Tuiasosopo as well as older sister, Leslie, a standout Husky volleyball player and now an assistant coach for the UW volleyball team, and younger sister Ashley, a sophomore on the Husky softball team. Fullback Luke Kravitz' father Al, was a defensive end that lettered at the UW in 1970 and 1971. Fullback Paul Homer is a cousin, by marriage, of former Husky offensive lineman Aaron Dalan, who married former Washington women's basketball player Gena Pelz. Cornerback Matt Mosley is a cousin to former Husky Luther Carr. Outside linebacker Fred Wiggs is the younger brother of former Husky defensive lineman Sekou Wiggs and, freshmen Chris Polk and Jordan Polk are cousins. Lastly, freshmen Riley Gervais and Taylor Lappano are the sons of current Husky assistant coaches Steve Gervais and Tim Lappano.

LOCKER ON THE RUN: Last season, with four games yet to play, Jake Locker had already broken Dennis Fitzpatrick's UW record for rushing yards in a season by a quarterback. By season's end, Locker's 986 yards were a Pac-10 and school single-season record and second-most in a *career* by a UW QB. Locker's 157-yard rushing day vs. Arizona was ranked No. 3 on the UW's single-game, QB rushing list, behind Fitzpatrick's 249 (vs. WSU, 1974) and Marques Tuiasosopo's 207 (vs. Stanford, 1999). LOCKER'S TOTAL OFFENSE: In his first season at the helm of the Husky offense, Jake Locker compiled the second-most total offense yardage in UW single-season history, with 3,048 (986 rushing, 2,062 passing). He also posted the No. 2 total offense mark in single-game history, with 493 vs. Arizona, only 16 yards short of Marques Tuiasosopo's historic 509-yard performance vs. Stanford in 1999. MISCELLANEOUS NOTES

OVERALL ATHLETIC SUCCESS: Having firmly established itself as one of the top broad-based Division I intercollegiate athletics programs in the country, the University of Washington once again placed in the top echelon in the annual U.S. Sports Academy Directors' Cup competition in the 2007-2008 academic year. Husky athletics finished 22nd among all NCAA Division I institutions (279 schools earned at least a point and were ranked) in the annual standings. Washington scored a total of 745.25 points in the Director's Cup, which is based solely on NCAA championship competition (and therefore didn't include the Huskies' national championship in men's rowing, which is not an NCAA sport). The 2007-08 Washington athletic season was highlighted by a number of team and individual successes, including a second-place national finish by the women's rowing team, a seventh-place finish at the NCAA men's golf championships and an eighth-place by the women's cross country team.

GRADUATION SUCCESS RATE: The UW football team once again had a good showing in the most recent NCAA Graduation Success Rate report, released at the end in October, 2007. In the 2007 ranking (which measured graduation success rates for those who enrolled from 1997 to 2000 and graduated within six years), the UW football team ranked second in Pac-10 Conference at 64 percent, trailing only Stanford (93). Washington had also ranked second in the 2005 and 2006 ranking. Here are the Pac-10's 2007 NCAA Graduation Success Rate rankings:

- The Hepatitis B vaccine was developed by UW faculty member Ben Hall. Since it became widely available in 1986, millions of people all over the world have been protected from this debilitating disease.
- In a new program called "Husky Promise" announced last year and starting this fall, Washington state students from low income families will be able to attend the UW without ever having to worry about paying tuition--it will be free for them while they earn their bachelor's degree. The UW program is one of the largest in the nation making this commitment to those from economically disadvantaged backgrounds.
