STEPPING OFF

Texas A&M (5-4, 2-3) heads north for its final road game of the season on Saturday night when the Aggies face the Oklahoma Sooners (5-4, 3-2) at Gaylord Family-Oklahoma Memorial Stadium ... kickoff is set for 6:10 p.m. (CST) and the game will be televised nationally by FSN HD ... Joel Meyers, Gary Reasons and Jim Knox will have the call ... both teams enter the game off a tough road loss, with A&M falling 35-34 at Colorado and OU dropping a 10-3 decision at Nebraska.

Dave South (play-by-play) and Dave Elmendorf (commentary) will call the action ... pregame show begins at 5 p.m. ... A&M/OKLAHOMA SERIES NOTABLES

Oklahoma leads the all-time series with Texas A&M, 17-10, and has won six straight ... the Aggies have won four of the Big 12 meetings between the programs (1996-98, 2002) ... A&M's last win in the series was a 30-26 upset of the then No. 1-ranked Sooners on November 9, 2002 at Kyle Field ... the Aggies have lost five straight in Norman, with their last win coming in 1997—a game which saw A&M clinch the Big 12 South division title ... Saturday will mark just the third time since the formation of the Big 12, and in the last 60 years overall, that neither team is ranked on game day.

Texas A&M returns home to host Baylor at Kyle Field ... kickoff is set for 2:30 p.m. and the game will not be televised ... OU heads to Lubbock to face Texas Tech.

GRAY EARNS BIG 12 WEEKLY HONORS

Sophomore tailback **CYRUS GRAY** (DeSoto) was named the Big 12's Special Teams Player of the Week by a select media panel on Monday.

Gray totaled 181 yards on four kick returns in A&M's game at Colorado, including a career-best 99-yard kickoff return for a touchdown in the second quarter. He also added a 45-yard kick return in the fourth quarter to set up the Aggies' final score.

The honor is the second of Gray's career, who also earned special teams POW honors last season after his performance against Oklahoma. It is also the first Big 12 weekly football honor of any kind for an Aggie in 2009.

Quarterback **JERROD JOHNSON** (Humble) could break a host of single season passing school records against Oklahoma on Saturday.

JOHNSON SEEKS TOUCHDOWN RESPONSIBILITY RECORD

In just his third season and second as a starter, quarterback **JERROD JOHNSON** is within two touchdowns of matching the school record for touchdown responsibility. Johnson has thrown for 44 scores and added 13 rushing touchdowns for a total of 57 touchdowns. Reggie McNeal owns the school record of 59 with 44 passing scores and 15 rushing TDs.

JOHNSON KEEPS THE CHAINS MOVING

Texas A&M junior quarterback **JERROD JOHNSON** is on a record pace as a passer, but he consistently relies on his legs to keep drives going. Over half of his 75 rushes this season have produced a "money play," which is defined as a play that results in a first down or touchdown. Johnson is especially proficient on third and fourth down rushes with 21 money plays in 27 attempts, including 15 on 20 third down rushes.

JOHNSON HAS BEEN A DIFFERENCE-MAKER IN 2009

In his second season as a starter, quarterback **JERROD JOHNSON** has developed into a difference-maker in 2009. He ranks among the nation's top quarterbacks in virtually every important statistical category.

ALL-AMERICA CANDIDATE MILLER KEEPS RACKING UP SACKS

A part-time starter in his first two seasons at A&M, junior **VON MILLER** (DeSoto) has emerged as the nation's most feared pass rusher in 2009. Miller, who shifted to a hybrid defensive end/linebacker position last spring, has been atop the NCAA's sack leaders list all season and remains on pace to break Texas A&M's school record of 20 sacks by Jacob Green in 1979. Through nine games, Miller has compiled 15.5 quarterback sacks for a loss of 106 yards, and stands No. 2 on A&M's illustrious single season sacks list.

Miller could become Texas A&M's first first-team All-America selection since cornerback Jason Webster earned All-America honors in 1999.

NCAA SACK LEADER MILLER NAMED BUTKUS SEMIFINALIST

With just 5.5 sacks and 66 tackles in his first two seasons, **VON MILLER** (DeSoto) was somewhat of an unknown commodity coming into the 2009 season. But after registering a NCAA-high 15.5 sacks in the first nine games of the season, the accolades are beginning to roll in for the junior. Miller was added to the Ted Hendricks Defensive End Award "watch list" after two games and was recently named one of 16 semifinalist for the Butkus Award, which is given annually to the nation's top linebacker.

TANNEHILL IS FIRST SOPHOMORE TO 89 CAREER CATCHES

Sophomore quarterback/receiver **RYAN TANNEHILL** (Big Spring) reeled in the 89th reception of his career last week against Colorado, making him the first sophomore in school history to reach the 89-catch plateau. Tannehill grabbed No. 89 in the 20th game of his career, which is the fastest start in school history. The previous fastest to No. 89 was Jamaar Taylor, who reeled in his 89th in the 22nd game of his career. Taylor transferred to A&M as a sophomore and hit No. 89 in the second game of his senior campaign.

AGGIES ARE EFFICIENT ON THIRD DOWNS

Texas A&M leads the Big 12 and ranks No. 3 nationally with a 51.5 percent success rate in third-down situations. The Aggies have been successful on 69 of 134 third-down tries in 2009, and are the only Big 12 team that converts over 50 percent of their third-down tries.

EYE ON THE "WATCH" LISTS

Four Aggies are mentioned on "watch lists" for various national awards in 2009—quarterback **JERROD JOHNSON** (Manning Award), center **KEVIN MATTHEWS** (Rimington Trophy), tight end **JAMIE MCCOY** (Mackey Award) and "Jack" **VON MILLER** (Hendricks Award).

QB JERROD JOHNSON (MANNING AWARD)

Record-setting signal caller broke several notable school records and flirted with a variety of other school marks in his first season as a starter in 2008 ... moved into the starting lineup due to an injury to current Dallas Cowboy Stephen McGee, and he ended up starting the last 10 games at quarterback (also started a game at wide receiver) ... set school records for season passing touchdowns (21) and single game passing yards and total offense (419 and 487 vs. KSU) ... his late father, Larry Johnson, was a defensive back for the Aggies in the late 1970s.



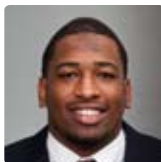
C KEVIN MATTHEWS (RIMINGTON TROPHY)

Second-year starter at offensive center for the Aggies ... the son of NFL Hall of Famer Bruce Matthews, Kevin is the catalyst for the Aggies' offensive front ... a former walk-on, Matthews earned a scholarship after serving as a backup to current San Francisco 49er Cody Wallace for two seasons.



TE JAMIE MCCOY (MACKEY AWARD)

Dynamic athlete who found a home at tight end after Head Coach Mike Sherman's arrival in Aggieland ... in his first season at the position in 2008, McCoy caught at least one reception in every game and finished the year with 43 catches for 500 yards and five touchdowns ... an amazing 30 of his 43 catches resulted in first downs for the Aggies ... McCoy arrived at Texas A&M as a dual-threat quarterback and saw action at the position as a freshman in 2006 (he had a 32-yard rushing touchdown against Louisiana Tech). He moved to wide receiver in 2007, but didn't see any action at the position.



JACK VON MILLER (HENDRICKS AWARD)

Playmaker who shifted from linebacker to a hybrid defensive end/linebacker position called the "jack" in Aggie defensive vernacular this season ... junior leads the nation with eight sacks through the first three games of 2009 ... also tops the country with eight tackles for loss ... has led the Aggie defense to 14 total sacks in 2009 after making just 16 for the entire 2008 season.



WIDE RECEIVER VETERANS FIND THE FIRST DOWNS

The Aggies are completing over 50 percent of their third-down situations in 2009 and that's in large part to the play of A&M's veteran trio of wide receivers, **RYAN TANNEHILL**, **JEFF FULLER** (McKinney) and **HOWARD MORROW** (Keller). The trio have combined to produce 22 first downs on 25 third-down receptions in 2009.

BIG PLAY NWACHUKWU

Texas A&M true freshman **UZOMA NWACHUKWU** (Allen) doesn't rank among the NCAA's top 100 in receptions, and doesn't even lead his team in catches per game. But the big play ability of the nation's No. 5 freshman in terms of receiving yards per game is undeniable. Nwachukwu (*pronounced WATCH-uh-coo*) ranks No. 5 among all receivers with 20.6 yards per catch average and his touchdown per catch ratio of 1/4.8 is tied for No. 2 in the nation.

Nwachukwu already has three 100-yard receiving games in 2009, which matched the overall school record of three originally set by Robert Ferguson (2000) and matched by Jamaar Taylor (2002).

Since missing the Oklahoma State game with a concussion, Pugh has produced 35 tackles (8.8 average), a fumble recovery, two interceptions and two broken up passes.

AGGIES REVERSE TROUBLING EARLY SEASON PENALTY TREND

The 2009 Aggies are living proof that penalties are correctable mistakes. Through four games, A&M was one of the most penalized team in all of college football with 41 flags for a whopping 382 yards. In the last four games, however, the Aggies have cut their penalties down by more than half with just 21 infractions for 181 yards. A&M's opponents have actually been penalized more than the Aggies with 71 flags for 643 yards.

TWO OF A KIND OFFENSE

Texas A&M is one of the only two teams in the NCAA Football Bowl Subdivision to rank in the top 35 of all four major offensive statistical categories. The other team is Arizona, who ranks No. 13 in total offense, No. 18 in rushing, No. 35 in passing and No. 22 in scoring.

HEAD COACH MIKE SHERMAN

A former head coach and general manager for the NFL's Green Bay Packers, Mike Sherman is in his second season as head coach of the Texas A&M football team. Sherman was hired as Texas A&M's 28th head football coach on Nov. 26, 2007.



Sherman compiled an impressive 59-43-0 record (.578) at the helm of the Packers from 2000-2005, which included three playoff appearances and two 12-win regular seasons. As an assistant coach in the NFL, Sherman helped the Packers and Seattle Seahawks to the playoffs, including the Packers' run to the 1998 Super Bowl.

In the college ranks, Sherman has compiled a 9-12 record as a head coach. As an assistant coach at Texas A&M (1989-93, 95-96), UCLA (1994), Holy Cross (1985-88), Tulane (1983-84) and Pittsburgh (1981-82), Sherman helped win three conference championships and been a part of eight bowl teams (five New Year's Day bowls).

An accomplished recruiter, Sherman's current class of 2010 commitments is currently ranked No. 10 nationally by ESPN.com and features verbals from three members of ESPNU 150 national recruits. Sherman's first signing class was ranked No. 22 nationally by Rivals.com and was bolstered by Sherman's late additions of 2008 Freshman All-Americans Jeff Fuller and Trent Hunter, Cyrus Gray and Terrence Frederick. Both Hunter and Gray earned Big 12 Player of the Week just months after being targeted by Sherman.

ALL-AMERICA CANDIDATE MILLER KEEPS RACKING UP SACKS

A part-time starter in his first two seasons at A&M, junior Von Miller has emerged as the nation's most feared pass rusher in 2009. Miller, who shifted to a hybrid defensive end/linebacker position last spring, has been atop the NCAA's sack leaders list all season and remains on pace to break Texas A&M's school record of 20 sacks by Jacob Green in 1979. Through eight games, Miller has compiled 15.5 quarterback sacks for a loss of 106 yards, and stands No. 2 on A&M's illustrious single season sacks list.

Miller could become Texas A&M's first first-team All-America selection since cornerback Jason Webster earned All-America honors in 1999.

PRESSURING THE QUARTERBACK

The Aggies already have 31 quarterback sacks and rank in a tie for third in the NCAA FBS in sacks just a season after posting only 16 sacks for the entire 2008 season and ranking No. 100 in the NCAA statistics. Led by hybrid linebacker/end **VON MILLER**, the Aggies have sacked the opposing quarterback 31 times in nine games or 3.33 per game. Miller has contributed 15.5 sacks, and nine other defensive mates have combined for 15.5 more.

AGGIES PLAYING 18 TRUE FRESHMEN IN 2009

Texas A&M is playing an extraordinary number of true freshmen in 2009. The Aggies have used 18 true freshmen from head coach Mike Sherman's second signing class, which is a school record. The previous high number of true freshmen to see action for the Aggies was 15 for Tom Wilson's 1980 team, which finished 4-7. Including among the 1980 freshmen were future NFL Draft picks Jeff Fuller Sr., Keith Guthrie, Mark Lewis, Ken Reeves, Tommy Robison and Thomas Sanders.

Since 1972, the Aggies have awarded varsity letters to 10 or more true freshman in a season only a handful of times: 15 in 1980, 11 in 1973 and 10 in 1972 and 2008. Interestingly, only once since the advent of freshman eligibility have the Aggies not played a single true freshman (1989).

NUMBER-CRUNCHING THE UNDERCLASSMAN IMPACT

Freshmen and sophomores are having an enormous impact for the Aggies in 2009. Underclassmen have accounted for 1,319 of A&M's 1,661 net rushing yards or 79.4 percent. Despite two of the Aggies' top four receivers being seniors, underclassmen have accounted for 1,946 of 2,637 receiving yards or 73.8 percent. Nearly 80 percent of the Aggies' 320 points have been scored by freshmen or sophomores (79.4 percent). Defensively, 417 of 659 total tackles have come from underclassmen (63.3).

JOHNSON'S PICKOFF-FREE STREAK ENDS IN BIG 12 RECORD FASHION

Junior quarterback **JERROD JOHNSON** (Humble) threw his first interception of the season against Kansas State (Oct 17), but not before breaking the Big 12's single season record for consecutive pass attempts without a pickoff. Johnson threw 225 straight passes without a pickoff to open 2009 before KSU's Tysyn Hartman stepped in front of his pass attempt in the second quarter. He broke the old single season mark of 213 set by Kansas' Todd Reesing in 2007. He had increased his overall Big 12 record streak to 242 attempts, which dated back to last year's Baylor game.

True freshman defensive lineman **WELLS CHILDRESS'** father, Ray, still ranks in the top five in tackles and QB sacks in A&M history and went on to a long career with the Houston Oilers in NFL.

"BULL" MARKET

A question mark a year ago, the placekicker position appears to be a strength for the Aggies in 2009 with the return of sophomore **RANDY BULLOCK** (Klein, Texas). In last year's season-opener, the Aggies missed a pair of field goals from less than 40 yards in a 18-14 loss. Bullock pulled off his redshirt in the sixth game of 2008 and responded with 6-of-7 field goals and made 20 straight extra points after missing the first one of his career. Bullock also showed a strong leg by booting a 46-yard field goal against Texas Tech, which was the longest by an A&M kicker since 2004.

Through nine games in '09, Bullock has converted nine of 12 field goal attempts, with one of the misses being a fourth-quarter block by Utah State. His 50-yard boot against Oklahoma State was a career best and was the longest by an Aggie since 2000. In addition, Bullock has converted all 39 extra points in '09 and has made 59 in a row entering Saturday's game.

TURNOVERS TELL STORY

Since 2005, the Aggies have compiled a 22-5 record in games with a plus turnover margin. In games with an even or minus turnover margin, the Aggies are 7-22. (see chart on page 3)

EXCELLING IN THE CLASSROOM

Seven Aggies have already earned their bachelor's degree from Texas A&M, which ranks among the most in the nation. The Aggies with diplomas already in hand are: **DEREK DUMAS, MATT FEATHERSTON, LEE GRIMES, JORDAN PETERSON, MICHAEL SHUMARD, VINCENT WILLIAMS** and **JEFF WOOD**. In addition, there are a large number of Aggies set to graduate in December of 2009: **CODY BEYER, CHEVAR BRYSON, MARCUS GOLD, JERROD JOHNSON** (will complete all course work, has an internship to finish degree plan in spring), **KEVIN MATTHEWS, JAMIE MCCOY, RYAN O'BRYANT, JORDAN PUGH, MATT RANKIN** and **DeMAURIER THOMPSON**.

IMPRESSIVE ASSISTANTS

• **MIKE SHERMAN's** coaching staff at Texas A&M is an impressive blend of veteran NFL and college assistant coaches. Tapping into his deep NFL ties, Sherman plucked **NOLAN CROMWELL** from the Seattle Seahawks, **TOM ROSSLEY** from the Green Bay Packers and **KIRK DOLL** from the Denver Broncos. From the college ranks, Sherman hired **JOE KINES** from Alabama, **RANDY JORDAN** and **BUDDY WYATT** from Nebraska, **CHARLES McMILLIAN** from TCU and **JIM TURNER** from Delaware. He retained **VAN MALONE** from the previous coaching staff.

• Several members of Sherman's staff had successful NFL playing careers. **NOLAN CROMWELL** was a four-time Pro Bowl safety and the NFC Defensive Player of the Year in 1980. **RANDY JORDAN** played in the 2003 Super Bowl with the Oakland Raiders and received the 2001 Ed Block Courage Award. **VAN MALONE** played five seasons for the Detroit Lions and served as the special teams captain.

• Prior to Texas A&M, Sherman served on the same coaching staff with **NOLAN CROMWELL** with the Green Bay Packers and Seattle Seahawks, **TOM ROSSLEY** with Holy Cross and the Packers, and **KIRK DOLL** at Texas A&M.

• As head coach at SMU from 1991-96, **TOM ROSSLEY** led the Mustangs to a 21-21 tie with the Aggies in 1994, which ended A&M's record 27-game conference winning streak. It was the only blemish on the Aggies' undefeated season that year.

• Three members of the staff had previous ties to the A&M program. **KIRK DOLL** was the Aggies' linebackers coach from 1988-93 under Jackie Sherrill and R.C. Slocum. **BUDDY WYATT** coached the defensive line at A&M from 2000-02 under Slocum and **VAN MALONE** is in his fourth season coaching the safeties.

COLLEGE STATION (AP)—Sam Bradford threw touchdown passes to four different receivers, Chris Brown ran for three scores and No. 6 Oklahoma started fast again and downed Texas A&M 66-28.

DeMarco Murray, Matt Clapp, Ryan Broyles and Juaquin Iglesias had TD catches and Bradford had a touchdown run for the Sooners (9-1, 5-1 Big 12), who set a single-game scoring record for an opponent at Kyle Field.

The Sooners have scored 231 points in four games since a 45-35 loss to Texas. Their defense was equally impressive in this one, holding the Aggies (4-6, 2-4) to 26 rushing yards and forcing four turnovers.

Cyrus Gray scored on a 98-yard kickoff return for a touchdown and set an A&M record with 261 kick return yards. But receiving lots of kickoffs was bad news for the Aggies, who were held to 278 total yards and dropped to 2-5 at home this season.

The Sooners have always struggled at Kyle Field and an unranked A&M team beat No. 1 Oklahoma 30-26 here in 2002. But Oklahoma had no problems in this one, leading 38-14 at halftime and 66-21 after three quarters.

Bradford completed 22 of 33 passes for 320 yards and tied a school record with his eighth 300-yard game of the season. Murray rushed for 123 yards and Brown ran for 117 against the Big 12's second-worst rushing defense.

Oklahoma outscored its first nine opponents 180-27 in the first quarter and needed only 90 seconds to score on the Aggies.

Murray broke a 70-yard run on the Sooners' second play from scrimmage and Bradford scrambled for a 15-yard touchdown with 13:31 left in the quarter. Oklahoma scored on its first possession for the ninth time in 10 games.

The Aggies went three-and-out on their first series and Murray caught Bradford's 35th touchdown pass of the season with 8:05 left in the first quarter.

On Oklahoma's next series, Bradford found Jermaine Gresham for a 23-yard gain to the A&M 22 and Brown scored with 5:44 remaining in the quarter. The 49-second possession was Oklahoma's 13th touchdown drive this season that lasted under a minute.

The Sooners outgained A&M 238-13 in the quarter. A&M coach Mike Sherman gathered his team for a fiery pep talk before the second quarter began, but it didn't make a difference - Bradford threw a 28-yard TD pass to Clapp with 14:27 left in the half to make it 28-0.

Gray returned the ensuing kickoff 67 yards to set up Jerrod Johnson's 20-yard touchdown pass to Jamie McCoy.

Johnson dived into the end zone with 5:11 left in the half to cut Oklahoma's lead to 28-14.

The Aggies were barely stemming the tide.

Broyles took a short pass from Bradford, evaded five A&M defenders and got to the 5, setting up another touchdown for Brown. Oklahoma got the ball back with 34 seconds left and Stevens kicked a 42-yard field goal on the second-to-last play of the half.

The Sooners had 423 yards and 18 first downs in the half, while the Aggies had minus-11 yards rushing and went 2-of-10 on third downs.

Johnson threw his first interception in 213 attempts, tying the Big 12 record, in the third quarter when Oklahoma linebacker Keenan Clayton picked off a pass.

Brown's 28-yard TD run with 8:39 left in the third quarter pushed Oklahoma over 50 points for the sixth time this season. The Sooners topped 500 yards for the seventh time this year.

Joey Halzle replaced Bradford early in the fourth quarter.

Stephen McGee replaced Johnson with 6:23 left in the third quarter. McGee, a senior, won the starting quarterback job in the fall, but he's missed all but one play in the last five games with a shoulder injury.

COLLEGE STATION (AP) — Jerrod Johnson threw for 349 yards and two touchdowns and ran for a score to lead Texas A&M to a 41-6 win over New Mexico.

Johnson completed 31 of 41 passes, and Cyrus Gray and Christine Michael added touchdown runs for the Aggies (1-0), who piled up 606 yards. The A&M defense showed dramatic improvement from last season, holding New Mexico to 21 rushing yards and sacking Donovan Porterie five times.

The Aggies, starting their second year under Mike Sherman, dominated from the start and built a 20-3 halftime lead. Johnson completed a 42-yard pass to freshman Uzoma Nwachukwu on A&M's first possession and Johnson scrambled for a 16-yard touchdown with 9:52 left in the opening quarter.

Jeff Fuller caught an 18-yard pass from Johnson early in the second quarter, setting up Randy Bullock's 22-yard field goal. Fuller led A&M with 10 catches for 111 yards in the game. Michael, one of 12 freshmen to play for A&M in the first half, broke two runs over 20 yards on the Aggies' next possession. Michael went out for a rest and Cyrus Gray's 13-yard touchdown run put A&M up 17-0 with 4:44 left in the half.

A&M marched 86 yards in 12 plays to start the second half. Johnson went 6-for-6 on the drive and Michael finished it with a 2-yard touchdown run. Aho matched his career best with a 48-yard field goal later in the third quarter. A&M answered with a 17-play drive, capped by Johnson's 7-yard touchdown pass to Fuller. Johnson threw a 44-yard touchdown pass to freshman Kenric McNeal with 9:14 left. Tommy Dorman finished the game at quarterback for the Aggies.

COLLEGE STATION (AP) — Zac Robinson threw two touchdown passes and No. 15 Oklahoma State overcame the absence of their top two playmakers to beat Texas A&M 36-31.

The Cowboys (4-1, 1-0 Big 12) played without All-America receiver Dez Bryant, who was ruled ineligible by the school this week for lying to the NCAA about contact he made with a former NFL player. Oklahoma State was also missing Kendall Hunter, the Big 12's leading rusher in 2008, who sat out with an ankle injury.

Robinson completed 14 of 25 passes for 279 yards, Keith Toston ran for 130 yards and Beau Johnson ran for two scores as the Cowboys won at Kyle Field for only the second time since 1983.

Jerrold Johnson threw three touchdown passes for the Aggies (3-2, 0-1) and set a Big 12 record by extending his streak of consecutive passes without an interception to 228. But Johnson faced constant pressure and the Aggies, who came in with the nation's second-ranked offense, were held to 382 yards.

Leading 29-25 early in the fourth quarter, the Cowboys put it away with a 16-play, 93-yard touchdown drive that chewed up almost eight minutes. Robinson converted two third downs with long passes and Beau Johnson scored with 7:15 left in the game.

Jerrold Johnson found Howard Morrow in the end zone with 3:35 left, but the two-point conversion try failed and A&M trailed 36-31. Oklahoma State regained possession and Toston picked up two yards on a fourth-and-1 with two minutes left.

Randy Bullock booted a 50-yard field goal on the first play of the fourth quarter, the longest by an A&M kicker since 2000.

The Cowboys drove to the A&M 6 in the first quarter, but a pack of Aggies stuffed Robinson at the line on fourth-and-1.

The Aggies drove inside the Cowboys' 10 early in the second quarter and came away empty when Bullock hooked a 32-yard field-goal try.

MANHATTAN, Kan. (AP) — Daniel Thomas ran for four touchdowns in the first half and Brandon Banks returned the second-half kickoff 97 yards for another score, leading Kansas State to an improbable 62-14 win over Texas A&M.

A week after allowing 66 points and more than 700 yards in a disheartening loss to Texas Tech, Kansas State (4-3, 2-1 Big 12) steamrolled Texas A&M on both sides of the ball for its most lopsided conference win since beating Iowa State 58-7 in 2002.

The Wildcats led 38-0 at halftime after Thomas scored on runs of 7, 3, 9 and 17 yards, then scored 21 points over the first 5:12 of the third quarter before Texas A&M (3-3, 0-2) finally started to put points on the board.

Keithen Valentine ran for a pair of touchdowns in the second half and Grant Gregory was steady after being replaced by Carson Coffman last week, throwing for 147 yards and a touchdown on 10-of-13 passing.

Kansas State's defense forced five turnovers while holding the Aggies to 70 first-half yards and minus-13 yards rushing overall.

The Wildcats also harassed Jerrod Johnson, the Big 12's total offense leader, with six sacks and three interceptions, ending his Big 12 record at 242 pass attempts without throwing a pick. He finished with 314 yards passing and threw two touchdowns to Uzoma Nwachukwu - both after Kansas State had built a 59-0 lead.

Cyrus Gray rushed for 119 yards and Christine Michael had a touchdown run for A&M (5-3, 2-2 Big 12), which gained 501 yards, went 10-for-13 on third-down conversions and never punted.

Jerome Tiller ran for a touchdown, but threw two costly interceptions for the Cyclones (5-4, 2-3). Tiller, a redshirt freshman, started in place of junior Austen Arnaud for the second straight week. Arnaud is recovering from a bruised throwing hand.

Alexander Robinson, the Big 12's leading rusher, ran for 76 yards on 20 carries after sitting out last week's 9-7 win at Nebraska with a groin injury.

The Aggies marched for touchdowns on their first three possessions and cruised to a 21-3 halftime lead.

A&M's Lionel Smith fumbled the second-half kickoff and Iowa State recovered. But A&M cornerback Justin McQueen intercepted Tiller at the goal line and the Aggies took over at their own 3.

Johnson threw a 7-yard touchdown pass to Howard Morrow on the third play of the fourth quarter. Tiller finished a quick Iowa State drive with a 4-yard TD run with 12:15 left, but Michael scored on a 7-yard run less than three minutes later.

BOULDER (AP) — Tyler Hansen overcame his second-straight eight-sack game to lead Colorado to a 35-34 win over Texas A&M.

Patrick Devenny's one-handed grab from 22 yards out tied it and Aric Goodman's conversion sailed through to put the Buffaloes ahead by a point with 2:04 left.

After defensive back Anthony Perkins picked off Jerrod Johnson's pass at midfield, the Aggies forced a punt, but Terrence Frederick muffed it and Buffs linebacker Marcus Burton recovered with 23 seconds to ice it.

Rodney Stewart ran 20 times for 118 yards and two touchdowns and Markques Simas caught seven passes for 135 yards for Colorado (3-6, 2-3 Big 12), which got the ball back with 3:53 left trailing 34-28.

The Aggies (5-4, 2-3) looked like they were about to become bowl eligible when Cyrus Gray, whose 99-yard touchdown on a kickoff return helped them take a 21-10 halftime lead, returned a kickoff 45 yards to midfield in the fourth quarter. Cornerback Jalil Brown shoved him late out of bounds, tacking on another 15 yards.

That allowed the Aggies to start their drive at the Colorado 40-yard line, but they stalled at the 3 and settled for Randy Bullock's 20-yard field goal that made it 34-28. That left 3:59 on the clock and the Buffs within a touchdown.

It was plenty for Hansen, who threw for 271 yards and ran for 45 more. His running yards would have been higher, but he lost 60 yards in sacks.

The Buffs scored 11 points in the third quarter to tie it at 21, but the Aggies answered with 10-straight points for a 31-21 lead. Demetrius Sumler's 7-yard TD run cut the Aggies' advantage to 31-28 with 7:14 remaining.
