WHAT TO WATCH FOR ...

- Kansas (2-3 overall, 0-2 Big 12) will host top-ranked Oklahoma looking for its first Big 12 Conference win in 2011 under second-year head coach **Turner Gill** (5-12 at KU, 25-42 overall) on Saturday, Oct. 15 at 8:15 p.m.
- Kansas is taking on Oklahoma for the 102nd time in its 122 years of college football. The Jayhawks are 27-68-6 all-time versus the Sooners, including an 14-31-3 mark in games played in Lawrence.
- Kansas fell to the Sooners, 35-13, in Norman in 2009, and has lost six-straight in the series with OU. KU's last win in the series was a 20-17 win in Lawrence during the 1997 season.
- The Jayhawks boast an all-time record of 572-562-58 (.505 winning percentage).
- Kansas has six players on its roster from the state of Oklahoma, and Oklahoma fields seven Sunflower State natives on its roster.
- KU head coach Turner Gill is 10-4 all-time in games versus Oklahoma. He was 3-1 during his playing career as the quarterback at Nebraska. Additionally, he compiled a 7-3 mark against the Sooners as an assistant with the Cornhuskers. Gill is facing OU for the first time as the head coach at Kansas.
- KU is 7-8-3 all time in games played on Oct. 15. The Jayhawks last played on Oct. 15 versus Oklahoma in 2005, falling 19-3 to the Sooners in Kansas City at Arrowhead Stadium.

CREDENTIALS

All credential requests can be made on-line at www.kuathletics.com/media. Credentials requested after Monday of the game week will not be mailed. Instead, they will be available for pickup at a location agreeable to both parties. The Kivisto Field at Memorial Stadium Media Will Call distribution location is at the base of the elevator, below the pressbox, on the West side of the stadium. Working space in Kansas' Memorial Stadium press box will be allotted on the following basis: (1) Daily newspapers covering for Sunday publication and television stations covering for weekend news programs; (2) Sports editors of Kansas daily newspapers; (3) Radio personnel for an originating broadcast; (4) Official school daily, two seats only; (5) Television sports directors and approved special coverage; (6) Press and TV working photographers, weekly press representatives, non-broadcasting radio representatives and internet sites whose primary purpose is to gather news and disseminate it.

PHOTOGRAPHERS

Credentials for sideline photographers will be issued on the basis of circulation, with priority granted to agencies covering the participating schools on a regular basis. All photographers must pick up a photo sticker in order to be admitted to the sidelines. This may be done at the gate at the southwest corner of Memorial Stadium.

PARKING

Media parking is located in the Mississippi Street Parking Garage just south of the Kansas Union on the southeast side of Memorial Stadium. The garage is approximately two blocks away from the stadium.

PRESSBOX AND GAMEDAY SERVICES

The Kivisto Field at Memorial Stadium pressbox is located on the West side of the stadium. Entrance is at the base of the elevator located just off of Maine Street. Level eight is reserved for the print media, home and visiting radio, home and visiting booths for coaches and athletics directors, along with game and scoreboard operations. Level nine serves as the photo deck and the location for television booths. Packets with pregame information will be distributed in advance of kickoff on the day of the game. Play-by-play, quarter, halftime, final statistics, coaches and player quote sheets, are all regular services on game day. A fax service is also provided upon request. Stat monitors with live, updated statistics are available throughout the print media level and in booths for electronic media. In addition, television monitors are also part of the fixtures in both home and visiting radio booths and in the main pressbox area.

WIRELESS INTERNET

Complimentary access to wireless internet is available at Memorial Stadium and information about how to access it will be available in the pressbox.

TELEPHONES

Writers wanting phone lines at their seat locations should contact the KU Telecommunications Office at (785) 864-9300 regarding installation. For specific line location, please list **Katy Lonergan** as the contact. Allow at least two weeks notice prior to the game. There are several community telephones in the main working press area of the pressbox. These phones are available on a first-come, first-serve basis.

WEEKLY PRESS RELEASE

Each Monday a complete release previewing the upcoming game and reviewing the season will be available on kuathletics.com. The release will also be e-mailed to media requesting this service each Monday.

WEEKLY PRESS CONFERENCE

Kansas head football coach **Turner Gill** will conduct a weekly press conference, followed by selected players, each Tuesday during the season. The press conferences are held in the George R. Mrkoncic Auditorium located in the Anderson Family Football Complex south of Kivisto Field at Memorial Stadium at 11:30 a.m. Coach Gill will speak at 11:30 a.m., followed a luncheon with media members. Selected Kansas players and assistant coaches will interview at 12:30 p.m.

INTERVIEWS

Contact the media relations office for all player or coach interview requests. All interviews with players and assistant coaches will take place during the press conference time between 12:30-1 p.m. on Tuesdays or after practice on Wednesdays. To request players for the weekly press conference, media should contact the media relations office by 5 p.m., each preceding Sunday via email (katyl@ku.edu/mtc@ku.edu). Out-of-town media wishing to interview Kansas players should also contact the media relations office with their requests by 5 p.m., Sunday. Home and cell phone numbers for players will not be provided and players have been instructed not to accept calls from media. Please do not contact a player or coach without scheduling the interview through the media relations office.

After the Game

Coach Gill will hold a postgame news conference with the media in Mrkoncic Auditorium. Selected Kansas players and assistant coaches will be available for interviews in Mrkoncic Auditorium following Coach Gill's news conference. Athletics Media Relations office representatives will be available to assist in postgame interviews. An Athletics Media Relations staff member will accompany members of the press wishing to go to the sidelines, beginning with five minutes remaining in the final quarter.

LAST THREE MEETINGS WITH OKLAHOMA

Oct. 24, 2009 - No. 25 Oklahoma 35, at No. 24 Kansas 13: Despite holding Oklahoma to just 337 yards of total offense - nearly 100 yards below the Sooners' season average - the Jayhawks suffered a 35-13 loss to OU at Kivisto Field at Memorial Stadium. Kansas quarterback Todd Reesing threw for 224 yards, but his three first-half interceptions put the Jayhawks behind 14-0 early. Kansas answered with a pair of field goals by junior kicker Jacob Branstetter, including a career-long 57-yarder just before the end of the half. Despite cutting the deficit to a single possession before halftime, the Jayhawks could not contain the Oklahoma offense in the third quarter. The Sooners opened the second half with a nine play, 75-yard drive that culminated with a nine-yard touchdown pass from Landry Jones to senior wide receiver Adron Tennell to give the Sooners a 21-6 advantage. OU extended its lead to 28-6 on its next possession, as Brown hauled in an eight-yard TD pass from Jones.

Oct. 18, 2008 - No. 4 Oklahoma 45, No. 16 Kansas 31: Despite a record-breaking performance by wide receiver Dezmon Briscoe, the No. 16 Kansas football team was defeated by the fourth-ranked Oklahoma Sooners, 45-31,

at the Gaylord Family-Oklahoma Memorial Stadium. Briscoe caught 12 Todd Reesing passes for 269 yards, both school records, and two touchdowns to lead the Jayhawks in a losing effort. Reesing finished the game 24-of-41 for 342 yards and two touchdowns passing. It was the fifth 300-yard game of the season for the junior from Austin, Texas, tying his own school single-season record that he set in 2007. Running back Jake Sharp was also impressive in defeat, carrying the ball 12 times for 103 yards and a touchdown.

Oct. 15, 2005 - Oklahoma 19, Kansas 3: In a game that featured a pair of stellar defensive units, the Kansas football team fell to Oklahoma, 19-3, at Arrowhead Stadium. Oklahoma parlayed two Kansas turnovers into an early 10-0 lead. Following an OU punt, the Jayhawks marched down the field behind a balanced attack. Mark Simmons made a leaping catch on a pivotal third down to keep the drive alive. The reception helped set up a 32-yard field goal by Scott Webb to make it 10-3. OU finally broke the scoring drought when Rhett Bomar found Malcolm Kelly for a 25-yard touchdown with early in the fourth quarter. The Sooners later added a 40-yard field goal by Hartley for the final score of 19-3.

**KANSAS HEAD COACH
TURNER GILL**

Turner Gill (North Texas, 1990) is in his second season at the Kansas helm, after being named the University's 36th head football coach on Dec. 13, 2009. He has guided KU to a 2-3 mark in 2011 and owns a 5-12 overall mark in his second season with the program. In his first year at Kansas, Gill took over a team that had lost its last seven games of the 2009 season. After a season-opening loss, Gill guided the Jayhawks to a 28-25 upset victory against then-No. 15 Georgia Tech. KU would win three games in his first year, including a thrilling 52-45 victory against Colorado in a game that KU trailed 45-17 in the fourth quarter. Gill came to Lawrence after spending the previous four seasons as the head coach at Buffalo (2006-09) where he turned a down program into a conference champion in his third year. Gill was a highly successful player and assistant coach at Nebraska for a combined 18 seasons before spending one year with the Green Bay Packers and then taking over at Buffalo.

**OKLAHOMA HEAD COACH
BOB STOOPS**

Oklahoma head coach Bob Stoops is 134-31 in his 13th season. He led OU to the 2000 national championship. The Sooners have played for three more and captured eight Big 12 South crowns and seven Big 12 titles. Oklahoma has spent 24 weeks at No. 1 in the AP poll and a national-leading 20 weeks atop the BCS standings. Under Stoops' tutelage, Oklahoma is 86-19 vs. the Big 12. OU has set three NCAA records under Stoops and set or tied 112 school records. Stoops was a four-year starter at Iowa. He began his coaching career in 1983 as a volunteer in the Hawkeye program under Hayden Fry, working through the ranks until he became co-defensive coordinator at Kansas State (1991-95). He left KSU for Florida and a three-year stint as Steve Spurrier's defensive coordinator. Stoops helped coach the Gators to a national championship in 1996. He was hired at Oklahoma prior to the 1999 season.

**OKLAHOMA
SCOUTING REPORT**

Oklahoma enters Saturday's game with a perfect 5-0 mark after knocking off Texas, 55-11, in its last outing. No. 1/3 OU has one of the most dynamic offenses in the NCAA. The Sooner passing offense is led by junior quarterback Landry Jones, who has completed 69.3 percent of his passes on the year. Jones has made good on 142 of his 205 passing attempts, good for 1,814 yards and 13 touchdowns. Jones is averaging 362.8 passing yards per game and has thrown just five interceptions. Jones has hit numerous receivers on the season, with his favorite targeted being senior Ryan Broyles. Broyles has caught 47 passes for 598 yards and seven TDs. Sophomore Kenny Stills has hauled in 19 receptions for 256 yards and four TDs. The OU ground game is led by Dominique Whaley, who has gained 462 yards on 83 carries. Whaley leads the Sooners with eight TDs. Sophomore

linebacker Tom Wort leads the OU defense with 32 tackles, while junior linebacker Ronnell Lewis also has 32 tackles, including 7.0 TFLs for minus 50 yards. Senior linebacker Travis Lewis has 31 tackles in just four games.

KU-OU CONNECTIONS

Kansas has six Oklahoma natives on its roster: **Anthony Davis** (Tulsa), **Gavin Howard** (Owasso), **Reil Lewis** (Muskogee), **Jake Love** (Tonkawa), **Michael Martinovich** (Tulsa) and **John Williams** (Tulsa). Oklahoma fields seven Sunflower state natives on its roster in Blake Bell (Wichita), Jaydan Bird (Wichita), Geneo Grissom (Hutchinson), Justin McCay (Shawnee Mission), Marshall Musil (La Crosse), Patrick O'Hara (Topeka) and Jordan Phillips (Towanda). Kansas offensive coordinator/quarterbacks coach Chuck Long served in the same capacity at Oklahoma from 2002-05. Long played at Iowa along with OU head coach Bob Stoops.

- Freshman WR **JaCorey Shepherd** recorded a 68-yard touchdown reception in the fourth quarter, which marked the longest of his career. Shepherd has touchdown catches of 68, 56 and 48 yards this season.

- The 68-yard completion was the longest of sophomore QB **Jordan Webb's** career, and the longest pass play by the Jayhawks since a 74-yard pass play in the Missouri game in 2009.

- Webb ended the game completing 25-of-36 passes for a career-best 316 yards and two touchdowns.

- It marked the first 300-yard passing game by a Jayhawk since Todd Reesing threw for 498 yards in 2009 against Missouri.

- Sophomore WR **Ricki Herod** recorded an eight-yard catch in the fourth quarter, marking the first reception of his career.

- Junior DE **Toben Oporum** recorded a nine-yard sack, marking his second sack of the season.

- Sophomore P **Ron Doherty** recorded a 59-yard punt in the first quarter, which was a career long and the longest by a Jayhawk since Alonso Rojas had a 62-yard punt at Nebraska in 2010.

- Nick Sizemore** blocked a punt in the second half, which marked KU's first blocked punt since the Insight Bowl in 2008.

BIERE HONORED

Kansas senior tight end **Tim Biere** was honored by the College Football Performance Awards (CFPA), as he was named the National Tight End Performer of the Week Sunday. The 6-foot-4 senior from Omaha, Neb., recorded career bests in catches (seven) and receiving yards (93), to go along with his first touchdown of the season in KU's loss to No. 6 Oklahoma State. Biere's 19 catches this season match his season total from a year ago, while his 235 receiving yards this season are a career high. He was named to the CFPA Preseason Watch List in July and was an honorable mention honoree last week versus Texas Tech.

SHEPHERD GOES LONG

Kansas freshman WR **JaCorey Shepherd** continues to make big plays for the Jayhawks. Shepherd recorded his third TD of the season in the game at OSU. He hauled in the pass from QB **Jordan Webb** and raced 68 yards to pay dirt, marking KU's longest TD of the season. Shepherd now has TD receptions of 68, 56

and 48 yards on the season. The Mesquite, Texas, native is averaging 27.2 yards per catch on his eight receptions.

WEBB HITTING THE MARK

Kansas sophomore QB **Jordan Webb** has been extremely efficient in running the Jayhawk offense through the first five games of the 2011 season. Webb ranks second in the Big 12 and eighth nationally in passing efficiency. The Union, Mo., native has completed 80-of-117 passes on the season, good for 1,130 yards and 11 TDs. Additionally, Webb has thrown just six interceptions, giving him a rating of 171.9. Webb is leading a Jayhawk offense that is averaging an astounding 9.5 yards per pass. Additionally, he has been sacked just nine times in five games.

YOUNG RECEIVERS MAKING PLAYS

Kansas has had 15 different players record a reception on the season, with seven of the 15 players being in either their first or second season with the program. True freshman **JaCorey Shepherd** leads the way with eight receptions for 218 yards and three TDs. Shepherd also owns the longest reception of the season with a 68-yarder to his credit. Four of KU's 12 receiving TDs have been hauled in by a freshman or sophomore.

GO D.J. THAT'S MY D.J.

Kansas junior wide receiver/kick returner **D.J. Beshears** has been all over the field for KU. Beshears leads the Big 12 and ranks eighth nationally in all-purpose yardage. The Denton, Texas, native has four rushes for 34 yards, 19 receptions for 257 yards and 28 kickoff returns for 624 yards. Beshears is averaging 184.6 all-purpose yards per game and has recorded two TDs, both on receptions. He, along with teammate **Bradley McDougald**, are both on the Paul Hornung Award fan ballot available at www.votepaulhornung.com.

JOHNSON LEADING TACKLER IN BIG 12

Jayhawk senior LB **Steven Johnson** opened the 2011 season right where he left off at the end of the 2010 season, collecting double figures in tackles. Johnson was credited with a career-best 15 tackles versus McNeese State, including nine solo stops. He also had 2.0 TFLs for minus three yards and forced a fumble. Johnson has six double-figure tackle games in his career, including three in 2011. Johnson ranks second in the Big 12 and 34th in the NCAA in tackles with 9.2 per outing.

DIVERSITY ON DISPLAY

Kansas has scored 24 touchdowns on the season, with 13 different players getting in on the action. Sophomore RB **James Sims** leads the way with five TDS and freshman RB **Darrian Miller** has three scores on the ground. Freshman WR **JaCorey Shepherd** has three receiving TDs, while junior WR **D.J. Beshears** has made two TD grabs. Also scoring TDs on the ground have been senior RB **Reil Lewis**,

redshirt freshman RB **Brandon Bourbon**, freshman RB **Tony Pierson** and sophomore QB **Jordan Webb**, while senior TE's **Tim Biere** and **AJ Steward**, junior WR **Kale Pick**, redshirt freshman WR **Andrew Turzilli** and senior WR **Daymond Patterson** have each tallied a receiving TD.

OFFENSIVE EXPLOSION

Kansas second-year head coach Turner Gill has gone on the record in saying this year's Kansas team will feature a more explosive, speedy attack and the Jayhawks have backed up his words. KU recorded five plays of 20 or more yards in its season-opening win over McNeese State and added five more in its win over Northern Illinois. Of KU's 24 plays of more than 20 yards, eight have resulted in TDs. The Jayhawks only managed 31 plays of more than 20 yards during the entire 2010 season, with only five of those plays going for touchdowns. Sophomore RB **James Sims** leads the way with eight plays that have gone for 20 or more yards. Freshman WR **JaCorey Shepherd** owns the team's longest play of the season with a 68-yard TD catch.

POWERFUL RUSH

Kansas recorded 301 yards on the ground in its season-opening win over McNeese State, marking its first 300 yard rushing game since it tallied 334 yards rushing in the 2008 season opener versus Northern Colorado. The Jayhawks followed that up with 253 yards rushing in their win over Northern Illinois. The KU rushing offense ranks fourth in the Big 12 and 18th nationally after five games as it is averaging 219.4 yards per game. Sophomore RB **James Sims** ranks 11th in the Big 12 and 66th nationally in rushing yards per game with his 76.0 per game average.

NEWCOMERS PUT UP THE POINTS

Of the nine true freshmen who have made their career debuts in KU's first five outings, four have scored points. PK **Alex Mueller** leads the way among the freshmen in scoring as he has connected on 23-of-24 PATs and has also booted two field goals. Mueller ranks second on the team with 29 points. RB **Darrian Miller** has three TDs on the ground, while fellow RB **Tony Pierson** has found the endzone twice. WR **JaCorey Shepherd** has three TDs receiving. Out of Kansas' 173 points, 67 have been scored by true freshmen.

THIRD DOWN EFFICIENCY

KU's offense is 16th in the NCAA in third-down conversion at 50.67 percent. Kansas has converted on 38-of-75 third downs. Four of the five teams Kansas has played this season also rank in the top 16 nationally (Georgia Tech, first; Oklahoma State, fifth; Texas Tech, ninth; Northern Illinois, ninth). Additionally, this week's opponent, Oklahoma, ranks 27th in the NCAA in third-down efficiency.

BESHEARS STARS AGAINST NIU

Kansas junior wide receiver/kick returner **D.J. Beshears** earned weekly honors from both the Big 12

and the Paul Hornung Award on Sept. 13 following the Northern Illinois game. Beshears was named the conference's **Special Teams Player of the Week** and was one of six national honorees on the **Paul Hornung Award Weekly Honor Roll**. Beshears recorded 285 all-purpose yards and scored the game-winning touchdown in the final seconds as Kansas outlasted Northern Illinois, 45-42. He set career highs in kick return yardage (197), receptions (seven), receiving yards (70) and touchdown receptions (two). His 51-yard kickoff return set up KU's final scoring drive. Beshears scored KU's first touchdown of the game – a 15-yard pass from **Jordan Webb** in the first quarter – and also had an 18-yard run on KU's decisive drive. The Kansas junior leads the Big 12 with 382 all-purpose yards, which includes a conference-best 283 yards in kick returns. This marks the second time that Beshears has been named Big 12 Special Teams Player of the Week, also taking the honor on Sept. 27, 2010 after KU's win over New Mexico State.

SHEPHERD SHINES VS. MCNEESE ST.

Kansas freshman WR **JaCorey Shepherd** had an outstanding game versus McNeese State as he caught three passes for 107 yards to lead the Jayhawks in receiving yards and tie for the team lead in receptions. Shepherd caught a 56-yard touchdown pass from Jordan Webb in the third quarter, which marked the longest pass play for the Jayhawks since 2009, when Dezmon Briscoe caught a 74-yard touchdown from Todd Reesing against Missouri. Shepherd's 107 yards receiving made him the first Jayhawk freshman to record 100-plus receiving yards in a game since 1997 (Termaine Fulton, 138 vs. Texas). He followed that performance up with two catches for 29 yards in the first half against Northern Illinois, before sitting out the second half of play with an injury.

OPURUM TURNS UP THE PRESSURE

Kansas junior DE **Toben Opurum** is off to a great start in his first full season playing at the Buck Linebacker/Defensive End position. Opurum leads KU and ranks fourth in the Big 12 with 6.5 TFLs for minus 23 yards through the first five games of the season. His 6.5 TFLs ranks 37th in the NCAA. Opurum ranks seventh on the team in tackles as he has recorded 22 on the season, including 15 solo stops. He is one of five Jayhawks to have recorded a sack, along with DE **Keba Agostinho**, S **Bradley McDougald**, LB **Darius Willis** and DE **Pat Lewandowski**.

PUNT TEAM SHOWS IMPROVEMENT

After struggling for much of the 2010 season with the punt team unit, Kansas has opened the 2011 campaign with great performances in that phase of the game in its first five outings. Led by sophomore P/K **Ron Doherty**, the Jayhawks rank first the Big 12 and 15th nationally in net punting averaging 40.24 yards per punt. Doherty recorded a career-best 59-yard punt in Kansas' loss at Oklahoma State. Additionally, KU sophomore FB **Nick Sizemore**, junior CB **Greg Brown**, sophomore LB **Huldon Tharp** and redshirt freshman S **Ray Mitchell** have been named

Several Kansas players have made their first career starts in KU's first five games of the season, including DE **Pat Lewandowski**, WR **Marquis Jackson**, WR **Christian Matthews**, FB **Nick Sizemore**, DE **Keba Agostinho**, LB **Darius Willis**, LB **Tunde Bakare** and FS **Keeston Terry**.

DEBUTS

Kansas has had 23 players participate for the first time in their collegiate career. In addition to first-time starters FB **Nick Sizemore**, LB **Darius Willis** and LB **Tunde Bakare**, the following players have played for the first time in their Kansas careers: P/H **Victor McBride**, WR **Marquis Jackson**, WR **Andrew Turzilli**, TE **Jimmy Mundine**, TE **Trent Smiley**, WR **JaCorey Shepherd**, RB **Darrian Miller**, RB **Tony Pierson**, RB **Brandon Bourbon**, LB **Michael Reynolds**, S **Victor Simmons**, LB **Ben Heeney**, DE **Pat Lewandowski**, CB **Dexter McDonald**, LB **Isaac Wright**, S **Tyler Hill**, S **Ray Mitchell**, LB **Malcolm Walker**, PK **Alex Mueller** and LS **Tanner Gibas**.

TWO JAYHAWKS LOST FOR THE SEASON

Kansas will be without the services of two starters for the remainder of the season as senior WR **Daymond Patterson** and junior DT **John Williams** suffered season-ending injuries. Patterson was injured late in the first half of KU's season-opening win over McNeese State. The injury will cause him to miss the remainder of the season, but he will apply for a medical redshirt. Williams, who injured his knee in KU's win over Northern Illinois, recently had surgery to repair a torn ACL and will return to the KU lineup for the 2012 season. Patterson entered the 2011 season as KU's leading returning receiver and recorded three catches for 34 yards, including a TD in the season-opener before getting injured. Williams recorded four tackles prior to his injury.

SON OF A GUN

Several members of the Kansas football team come from extremely strong football bloodlines. Two Jayhawks are the sons of current collegiate head football coaches and a third player's father is an assistant coach at the collegiate level. Redshirt freshman WR **Connor Embree's** father Jon is in his first year as the head coach at Colorado, while fellow redshirt freshman LB **Jake Farley** is the son of Mark Farley, who is beginning his 11th year as the head signal caller at Northern Iowa. Additionally sophomore RB **Ryan Burton's** father, Ron, is the defensive line coach at Air Force. Also to be noted is special teams quality control coach **Kyle Brey** is the son of Notre Dame head men's basketball coach Mike Brey.

TEAM CAPTAINS

On August 28, **Turner Gill** announced the team captains for the 2011 season. This year's permanent team captains include: on offense, C **Jeremiah Hatch** and TE **Tim Biere** and on defense, LB **Steven Johnson** and DE **Toben Oporum**. Hatch, Biere and Johnson are seniors, while Oporum is a junior.

WOUNDED HAWKS RETURN

A number of veteran players did not play, or saw limited action due to injury in 2010, but have returned to the Jayhawk line up in 2011. The following are capsules for those players:

- **RB Reil Lewis**... Injured leg in 2010 preseason and sat out all season.
- **OL Trevor Marrongelli**... Started first four games of 2010 season at OG this year before suffering season-ending injury.
- **OL Jeff Spikes**... Missed all of 2010 due to off-season lower leg injury after starting 23 games first two years.
- **LB Hulton Tharp**... 2009 freshman All-American missed all of 2010 with a lower leg injury.

BABY JAYS

Kansas fields one of the youngest rosters in the country in 2011 as it counts 71 one of its players as underclassmen. The 71 players who are either freshmen, redshirt freshmen or sophomores account for 70 percent of the squad. Of the 22 players listed as starters on offense and defense, seven Jayhawks are underclassmen, including sophomores DT **Kevin Young**, DE **Keba Agostinho**, LB **Darius Willis**, QB **Jordan Webb**, RB **James Sims** and FB **Nick Sizemore** along with redshirt freshman S **Keeston Terry**.

OPURUM HONORED

Kansas junior DE **Toben Oporum** earned honorable mention Defensive Linemen of the Week honors by the College Performance Awards for his efforts against McNeese State. Oporum tallied 11 tackles, including seven solo stops, versus the Cowboys. He led KU with 3.5 TFLs for minus eight yards, which included one sack for minus two yards. Additionally, Oporum was credited with two quarterback hurries.

UP NEXT

Kansas will host the Sunflower State Showdown for the second-straight season on Saturday, Oct. 22, when it welcomes in-state rival Kansas State to Memorial Stadium. Game time is set for 11 a.m., with a live telecast on FSN. KU will be playing on FSN for the second time this season as it also played on the network when it hosted Texas Tech.

At Kansas (Head Coach)

* Guided the Jayhawks to a 28-25 upset win over No. 15 Georgia Tech in his second game at the helm of the program.

* Led KU to a thrilling come-from-behind 52-45 victory over Colorado, a game in which Kansas trailed 45-13 in the fourth quarter. The win marked the largest comeback in school history.

At Buffalo (Head Coach)

Despite 316 yards passing from sophomore quarterback Jordan Webb, Kansas could not slow down a potent Oklahoma State offense on Saturday at T. Boone Pickens Stadium as the Jayhawks fell, 70-28. Kansas turned the ball over four times (two fumbles and two interceptions) for the second-straight week, to fall to 2-3 on the year and 0-2 in Big 12 play. No. 6/7 Oklahoma State improved to 5-0 and 2-0 in the Big 12. Saturday's game marked the first of four-straight conference games against a ranked opponent. Webb finished the game 25-for-36 for a career-best 316 yards and two touchdowns, one of which came on a 68-yard pitch and catch to freshman wide receiver JaCorey Shepherd with 10:52 left in the game. Webb is the first quarterback to surpass 300 yards passing since Todd Reesing threw for 498 versus Missouri in 2009. The Jayhawks drove down the field on their opening possession of the game, going 80 yards in 10 plays to take a 7-0 lead. Webb found senior tight end Tim Biere crossing through the middle of the end zone from 10 yards out for the senior's first touchdown of the season. Biere led the Jayhawks with career-highs in catches (six) and yards (81) and hauled in a touchdown reception. For the first time this season Kansas could not get the running game on track as the Jayhawks were held to only 153 rushing yards. However, Oklahoma State wasted little time answering with a touchdown of its own. Oklahoma State scored on its first seven offensive possessions of the game, to lead 56-7 at the end of the first half.

Defensively Kansas held Oklahoma to nearly 100 yards less than its season average and offensively put up 80 yards more than the Sooners had been allowing, but three turnovers led to 14 first-half points for OU as the No. 25 Sooners posted a 35-13 win at No. 24 Kansas. Oklahoma held a 7-0 lead after the first quarter. Kansas drove to the Oklahoma 10-yard line early in the second quarter, but threw an interception which was returned 85 yards for a Sooner score. Prior to the end of the half, KU kicked two field goals, including a career-long 57-yarder by Jacob Branstetter at the end of the half as OU led 14-6 at the break. At halftime KU had out-gained Oklahoma 171 to 110 yards and controlled the ball for 19:19 to OU's 10:41. Oklahoma scored touchdowns on each of its first two second-half possessions and tacked on another score early in the fourth to take control of the game. KU QB Todd Reesing had his NCAA best active streak of throwing a touchdown pass stopped at 24 games. He threw 224 yards with three interceptions as KU's total offense of 305 yards was its lowest output in its last 38 games. Defensively Ryan Murphy came up with his second interception of the season, while Justin Springer recorded a career-high nine tackles and a trio of freshmen - D.J. Beshears, Lubbock Smith and Huldson Tharp - all had seven stops.

Three different Jayhawks rushed for more than 60 yards as part of a ground game that accumulated 301 yards and three touchdowns, while sophomore quarterback Jordan Webb added three touchdown passes to lead Kansas football to a 42-24 victory against McNeese State in its 2011 season opener at Memorial Stadium. Sophomore running back James Sims led the rushing attack with 104 yards and a touchdown. Freshman running back Tony Pierson added 73 yards and a touchdown in his Jayhawk debut, including a run of 47 yards in the first half. Fellow rookie Darrian Miller ran for 63 yards in his first collegiate game. Webb added 27 yards and a touchdown on the ground. Webb attempted 10 passes in the game, completing seven, for a total of 146 yards. All three of Webb's touchdown completions were at least 25 yards long, including passes of 56 and 48 yards to freshman wide receiver JaCorey Shepherd. Shepherd finished the game with 107 yards on three receptions to become the first freshman to eclipse the 100-yard receiving mark in a game since Termaine Fulton racked up 138 yards against Texas in 1997. Defensively, senior linebacker Steven Johnson led the team with a career-high 15 tackles, including nine solo tackles and two for a loss. Junior Toben Oporum, sophomore Darius Willis and freshman Pat Lewandowski all recorded sacks at defensive end for a combined loss of 14 yards. Oporum joined Johnson with double-digit tackles, registering a career-high 11, three for a loss.

Facing a fourth-and-goal with 14 seconds remaining in the game, quarterback Jordan Webb completed a six-yard touchdown pass to wide receiver D.J. Beshears right at the goal line to give Kansas a thrilling 45-42 victory over Northern Illinois in front of 48,084 fans at Memorial Stadium. Webb threw for a career-high 281 yards and three touchdowns in the victory, while Beshears recorded career highs in receptions, receiving yards, touchdowns and kickoff return yards. Beshears finished the game with seven catches for 70 yards with two touchdowns while adding 197 yards on seven kickoff returns and an 18-yard rush for 285 all-purpose yards. Beshears not only completed the game-winning drive, but he initially set it up with a 51-yard kickoff return down the left sideline to begin the possession at NIU's 47-yard line. Kansas erased an early 21-7 deficit by scoring on its final two possessions of the first half to tie the game at 21 at the break. From that point, the contest became a back-and-forth affair. Each team scored two touchdowns in the third quarter, tying the game at 28 and 35 points each. For the contest, there were four different ties and four lead changes. NIU opened the second half with a touchdown drive that went 66 yards in less than two minutes and was capped off by a 26-yard run by quarterback Chandler Harnish, but KU responded with a quick score of their own on a seven-play, 75-yard drive that only took 2:21. Sims finished the drive with an eight-yard run to tie the score at 28. Kansas then took a 35-28 lead on its next possession with a long, sustained drive that took 5:45 to complete, covering 72 yards on 14 plays. Sims punched it over the goal line from the one-yard line for his second touchdown of the game and the 10th rushing touchdown of his career.

Georgia Tech used a combination of big plays and a stifling running attack to set the tone, defeating Kansas, 66-24, at Bobby Dodd Stadium. In an impressive offensive display, the Yellow Jackets collected a total of 604 rush yards and 164 pass yards, which combined for the most offensive yards ever given up by a Kansas defense. The Jayhawks finished with 362 total yards of offense, compared to 768 for the Yellow Jackets. Georgia Tech's 604 yards on the ground was the most ever allowed by a Kansas defense. The Yellow Jackets set the tone from the start, scoring on their first offensive play of the game, a 95-yard touchdown from junior running back Orwin Smith. The run was the longest touchdown rush in the program's history and was the third-consecutive game the Yellow Jackets scored on their first offensive play. The Jayhawks kept the game close through the first half though, scoring on a pair of rushing touchdowns by freshman running back Darrian Miller. After an Alex Mueller field goal to end the first half, the Jayhawks entered the locker room trailing 24-17. The Yellow Jackets entered the second half on a mission, scoring on the first six drives of the half and capitalizing on a 42-0 run that would prove to be insurmountable. Senior quarterback Quinn Mecham and freshman wide receiver Andrew Turzilli helped break the KU scoring drought with a nine-play, 63-yard drive that ended when Mecham found Turzilli in the end zone from ten yards out with 2:24 left in the fourth quarter. Kansas sophomore Jordan Webb found five different receivers and finished 11-of-19 for 148 passing yards, while Miller and sophomore James Sims led the Kansas rushing attack, combining for 93 of the Jayhawks' 151 rushing yards.

Kansas sophomore quarterback Jordan Webb had an unusually rough day as he threw his first interceptions (three) on the year. On the day, Webb finished 16-of-22 for 239 yards and three touchdowns, one of which was the result of the only points in the second half, a 10-yard pass to tight end AJ Steward with 3:30 to play. Despite 316 yards passing from sophomore quarterback Jordan Webb, Kansas could not slow down a potent Oklahoma State offense on Saturday at T. Boone Pickens Stadium as the Jayhawks fell, 70-28. Kansas turned the ball over four times (two fumbles and two interceptions) for the second-straight week, to fall to 2-3 on the year and 0-2 in Big 12 play. No. 6/7 Oklahoma State improved to 5-0 and 2-0 in the Big 12. Saturday's game marked the first of four-straight conference games against a ranked opponent. Webb finished the game 25-for-36 for a career-best 316 yards and two touchdowns, one of which came on a 68-yard pitch and catch to freshman wide receiver JaCorey Shepherd with 10:52 left in the game. Webb is the first quarterback to surpass 300 yards passing since Todd Rensing threw for 498 versus Missouri in 2009. The Jayhawks drove down the field on their opening possession of the game, going 80 yards in 10 plays to take a 7-0 lead. Webb found senior tight end Tim Biere crossing through the middle of the end zone from 10 yards out for the senior's first touchdown of the season. Biere led the Jayhawks with career-highs in catches (six) and yards (81) and hauled in a touchdown reception. For the first time this season Kansas could not get the running game on track as the Jayhawks were held to only 153 rushing yards. However, Oklahoma State wasted little time answering with a touchdown of its own. Oklahoma State scored on its first seven offensive possessions of the game, to lead 56-7 at the end of the first half.
