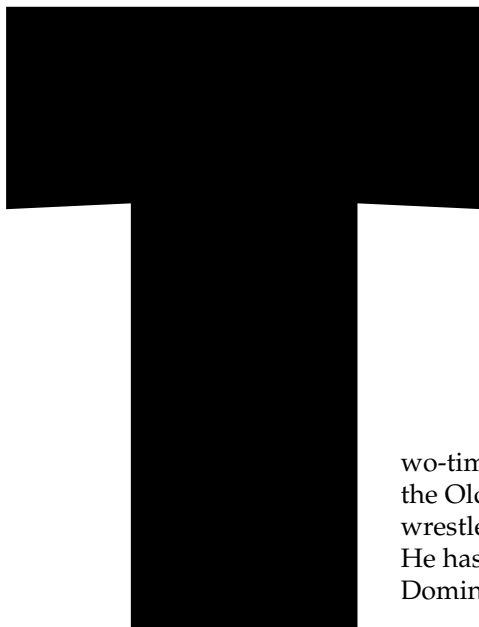

Two-time Olympian Gray Simons enters his seventeenth year as head coach of the Old Dominion University wrestling team. Simons, one of the greatest wrestlers in United States history, is in his 36th season of collegiate coaching. He has amassed a 322-191-5 career record and an 129-104-2 record while at Old Dominion.

In the seventeen years that Simons has been at Old Dominion, he has coached 27 wrestlers who have qualified for nationals, and five All-Americans. Last year his squad finished with a 6-10 record and a ninth place finish at the CAA Championships.

Simons enjoyed an unparalleled wrestling career at Lock Haven in Lock Haven, Pa. During Simons' freshman year, he was defeated twice in his first nine matches, but never lost again throughout his collegiate career. He garnered a record of 91-2, including 84 straight victories, before graduating from Lock Haven. In four years (1959-62), he won four NAIA Championships, three straight NCAA National Championships, was twice voted as the Outstanding Wrestler at the NCAA Tournament and was named outstanding wrestler in six of seven national meets, an accomplishment that has never been repeated.

In an article in Sports Illustrated, Simons was referred to as "the best wrestler in America...a bowlegged, scrawny 5-foot 5-inch transplanted Southerner." He has been named to the Helms Foundation (1971), the NAIA Hall of Fame (1975), the National Wrestling Hall of Fame (1978), Lock Haven State Hall of Fame (1981), the United States Achievement Hall of Fame (1982), the Pennsylvania State Wrestling Hall of Fame (1983) and the All-Time Collegiate Wrestling Team by Amateur Wrestling News. (1988). In the spring of 1992, Simons was inducted into the Virginia Sports Hall of Fame. He was also named the 33rd most important athlete of the century from the state of Virginia by Sports Illustrated in December of 1999.

Simons is equally respected for his experience in the coaching ranks. In 1964, he returned to his alma mater and led the Bald Eagles to a 10-2 record. He remained at Lock Haven until 1970, winning two NAIA Championships, earning Coach-of-the-Year honors (1966 and 1967) and amassing a 59-10-1 record. He then moved to Indiana State, where he led the Sycamores to a 42-21-0 record from 1970-75. Simons next post was in the hills of Tennessee. While coaching the Volunteers (1975-86), he compiled a 92-56-2 record and trained ten All-Americans before the sport was eliminated from Tennessee's program. The year that the Vols program was dropped, the team was ranked eighth in the nation.

Eason had an outstanding wrestling career at Cornell University. He went undefeated in dual meet competition during his final two years and compiled 78 career victories, placing him seventh on the school's career wins list. Eason was also a three-time New York State Champ and four-time EIWA championship contender. During his stay at Cornell he received the James Meidrim Memorial award for outstanding sportsmanship, character, scholarship and contribution to the wrestling program.

Jeff Rusak

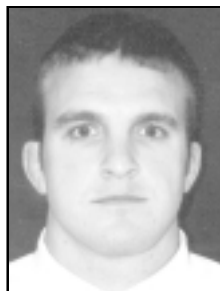
FIRST SEASON ■ OLD DOMINION UNIVERSITY '02



Jeff Rusak returns to ODU for his first season as an assistant coach. He was a two-time CAA wrestling champion and a four-time NCAA tournament qualifier. Rusak completed his career 33-0 in the CAA and was undefeated in dual meets. He was 35-2 with 19 pins as a senior in 2002 and reached the NCAA Championships as the number five seed, where he went 2-2. A two-time Virginia Intercollegiate state champion, Rusak completed his career with a 135-19 record. He graduated with a degree in computer science in 2002.

Jamie Kelly

Jamie Kelly joins the coaching staff this season, returning to his alma-mater. Kelly completed his four-year career with a 90-38 record, including a 28-8 mark as a senior in 1998. As a senior, Kelly qualified for the NCAA Championships, with a wild card selection. He won the Virginia Intercollegiate state championship twice at 158 pounds and took second at the CAA championships. Kelly previously coached at local Cox High School in Virginia Beach. The four-time Old Dominion Invitational champion and two-time runner-up at the Virginia State High School Wrestling Championships graduated in 1998 with a degree in history and secondary education.

2003-04 SEASON OUTLOOK



Derrell Lorthridge

The Old Dominion wrestling team will bring six returning starters to the mat for the 2003-04 season to provide the necessary experience and leadership to have a successful season and make a strong run in the Colonial Athletic Association. Alongside the veteran starters is a strong class of freshmen who should be able to make significant contributions throughout the season.

During the preseason, ODU was picked to finish 8th in the CAA. Three Monarch wrestlers are ranked in the CAA: **Chris Buckner (Chesapeake, VA)** is ranked 4th in the 133 weight class, **Dennis Whitby (Lanoke Harbor, NJ)** is ranked 5th at 149 and **Derrell Lorthridge (Wilmington, DE)** is ranked 2nd at Heavyweight.

John Starkes (Chesapeake, VA) at the 125 weight class, **Dennis Whitby** at 149, **Jesse Pearce (Norfolk, VA)** at 157, and **Derrell Lorthridge** at Heavyweight will be the nucleus of the 2003-04 team and will bring the experience to the team. Also returning to this year's team are **Chris Buckner** at 133 and **Adam Wright (Bridgewater, VA)** at 184. "With our six returning starters," Head Coach Gray Simons says, "we should have six strong weights."

Along with the experienced veterans of the team, is an outstanding recruiting class of freshmen. At 125, **Andy Lacroix (Salem, NH)** is a three-time New Hampshire state wrestling champion and a 2-time New England champion. Two freshmen will compete to start in the 141 weight class: **Donald Motley (Chesapeake, VA)** and **Jason Earnhardt (Yorktown, VA)**. Motley made the National Team twice, the districts four times, the regionals four times and the state championship twice. Earnhardt had a 76-25 record in high school, placing first in the district and 3rd in the region in 2001 at Tabb High School.

At 149, **Brian Roznowski (Yorktown, VA)**, who was the runner-up in the state last year, should make some contributions. There should be great depth at the 133 class, with transfer **Bill Hayduk (Chattanooga, TN)** along with **Mike Davis (Herndon, VA)** joining the Monarchs.

"We should have a good year," Simons says, "if we can keep our best guys healthy. It'll depend on how much our new starters improve at the 141, 165, 174 and 197 weight classes, how we'll do."

Along with the new wrestlers are changes to the coaching staff. Former Monarch standouts **Jeff Rusak** and **Jamie Kelly** are returning to ODU as assistant coaches, joining Carlos Eason, who is returning for his fifth season. Legendary wrestler **Gray Simons** returns for his 17th season as the ODU coach.

The Monarchs will open the season again with the Old Dominion Invitational before taking on the Carolina Open in Chapel Hill, NC and the Beast of the East at Newark, DE. The UNC-Greensboro-Southern Scuffle, the Virginia Duals, the Virginia State Intercollegiate Meet and the CAA Duals. These tournaments will provide early tests for ODU.

The Monarchs will compete with ACC schools NC State, Virginia and Maryland along with CAA foes George Mason, Campbell and James Madison. Other tough non-conference competition will come at the hands of Delaware State, UNC-Greensboro and VMI.

Last year's squad finished 6-10 overall and 2-5 in the CAA to finish 9th. The Monarchs' season was plagued with injuries throughout, and ODU was unable to see its full potential. With a perfect blend of seasoned veterans and exciting freshmen, this year's Monarch wrestling squad proves to be one of the CAA teams to watch this year if the team can stay healthy.

THE MONARCHS BY WEIGHT CLASS:

125: **John Starkes (Chesapeake, VA)** will start at this weight class. Last year, Starkes split time with **Chris Buckner (Chesapeake, VA)** who has moved up to 133 this year. **Andy Lacroix (Salem, NH)** and **Jared Smith (Newport News, VA)** will provide extra depth in this class.

133: **Chris Buckner** is a returning starter after starting at 125 last year. The redshirt sophomore will bring his experience to his new weight class. Buckner will be challenged by redshirt freshman transfer **Bill Hayduk (Chattanooga, TN)**, who should add significant depth to the spot.

141: Both **Jason Earnhardt (Yorktown, VA)** and **Donald Motley (Chesapeake, VA)** will compete for the starting spot here.

149: **Dennis Whitby (Lanoke Harbor, NJ)** is the returning starter in this class, but freshman **Brian Roznowski (Yorktown, VA)** will challenge for starting time this year.

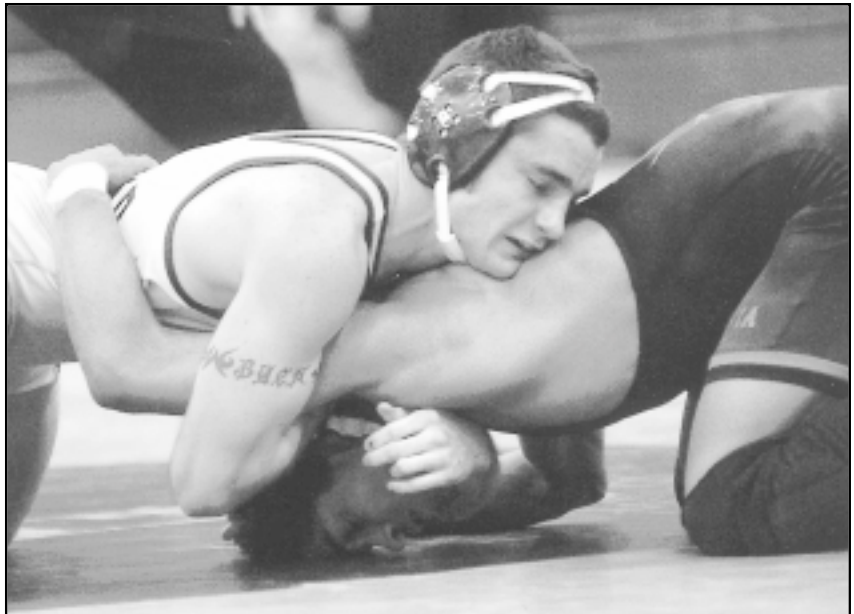
157: **Jesse Pearce (Norfolk, VA)** will be the starter in this class. Freshman **David Golt (Chesapeake, VA)** will be a solid back-up this season.

165: Returning starter **John Adams (Chesapeake, VA)** will be the starter here, but **Robby Gosnell (Warrenton, VA)** will also provide much depth and will challenge for starting time. **Travis Posey (Mardela, MD)** should also contribute.

174: Sophomore **Matt Ulrey (St. Mary's, MI)** is the starter at 174. **Joshua Howland (Virginia Beach, VA)** will be the backup in this class.

184: Returning Sophomore **Adam Wright (Bridgewater, VA)** will be starting here.

197: **John Dolida (Bridgewater, NJ)** will start here in his sophomore year. Freshman **Robert Valentine (Alexandria, VA)** may see some time either at the 184 or the 197 weight classes.

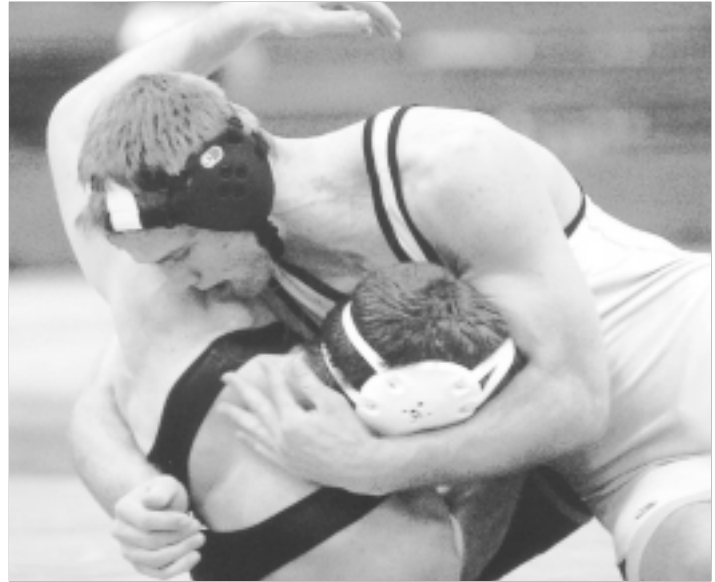

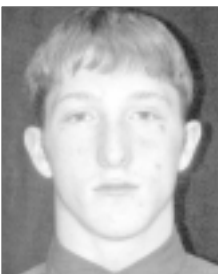

2002-03 SEASON REVIEW

The Old Dominion wrestling team finished the 2002-03 season with a 6-10 overall record, with a 2-5 Colonial Athletic Association (CAA) mark and a ninth place finish at the CAA Tournament. The Monarchs had several wrestlers put together impressive seasons as three ODU grapplers finished the campaign with more than 20 wins.

Once again the Monarchs opened the year with a dominating performance at the ODU Invitational by winning six of ten weight classes. They then took part in two of the more competitive tournaments in the nation, the Carolina Wrestling Open and the Beast of the East.

At the Carolina Open junior heavyweight Derrell Lorthridge took fourth in his class and senior 174-pounder Ben Summerlin finished fifth. Lorthridge also highlighted the team's performance at the Beast of the East with a second place showing while freshman Adam Wright turned heads as he placed third in the 184-pound class.

Summerlin and redshirt freshman Chris Buckner (133) both brought home titles at the Virginia State Intercollegiate meet hosted by VMI in January. Summerlin recorded pins in all three of his matches to win the state title. Wright, Lorthridge and freshman Matt Ulrey (165) each finished second for Old Dominion.

The Monarchs opened their dual slate with a road win over Greensboro and then defeated the Apprentice School at the Va. Duals. They dropped their final two Va. Dual matches before picking up a victory over American heading into the first annual CAA Duals. ODU's 22-17 triumph over Sacred Heart was their lone CAA Dual win as they lost by one to Binghamton and then fell to Boston and Rider.

Next the Monarchs played host to N.C. State in front of the largest crowd ever at Old Dominion. They lost to the Wolfpack but went on to drop Campbell, 21-16. Old Dominion, however, would win just one more match the rest of the way, dropping four of their last five. They closed the season with a ninth place showing at the CAA Championships. Summerlin

finished fourth while Lorthridge took third and was selected as an alternate for the NCAA Tournament.

Ben Summerlin led the team with a 29-8 record with 14 pins, which are the most by any 174-pounder in the nation. He concluded his collegiate career with a 112-32 mark. Lorthridge went 28-6 with a team-high 14 decisions while Wright finished with a 24-10 record, leading the squad with six major decisions in his first season.

Boasting a roster of 10 well-respected academic institutions, the Colonial Athletic Association continues to build on a proud history as one of the nation's top collegiate conferences.

With a geographic footprint that stretches from the shadow of the Statue of Liberty to the beaches of North Carolina, the landscape of the CAA is dotted with major metropolitan areas that include four of the nation's top 25 media markets – New York (1), Philadelphia (4), Washington, D.C. (8) and Baltimore (24).

The CAA showcases the athletic and academic skills of some of the nation's top student-athletes. On the playing field, the conference has produced 15 national team champions in four different sports, 28 individual national champions, 11 national coaches of the year and 10 national players of the year. In 2002-03, the conference sent two or more teams to the NCAA Tournament in seven different sports. The CAA has ranked as the top Division I non-football conference in the Sears Directors Cup standings in recent years.

Even more impressive, however, are the honors accumulated away from competition, which include five Rhodes Scholars, 11 NCAA post-graduate scholars and 12 Honda Award winners. Last year, the CAA had 17 Verizon Academic All-Americans, including six who were selected to the first team. Nearly 1,000 CAA student-athletes posted at least a 3.2 grade point average while lettering in a varsity sport and received the CAA Commissioner's Academic Award in 2002-03.

The CAA conducts championships in 21 sports. Male athletes compete for championships in baseball, basketball, cross country, golf, lacrosse, soccer, swimming & diving, tennis, track & field and wrestling. Female athletes battle for conference titles in basketball, cross country, field hockey, golf, lacrosse, soccer, softball, swimming & diving, tennis, track & field and volleyball.

In men's basketball, the CAA has earned a reputation as a "giant killer" in the NCAA Tournament. Since 1981, CAA schools have posted 12 wins over higher-seeded teams, including UNC Wilmington's upset of Southern California in 2002. Nine of the conference's 10 teams have made at least two NCAA Tournament appearances since 1990. In women's basketball, Old Dominion has captured three national championships (1979, 1980, 1985) and reached the title game again in 1997. In 2002, the Lady Monarchs advanced to the Elite Eight.

The conference has also excelled in many other sports. CAA squads have won 10 field hockey national titles since the championship began in 1981, which is not only more than any other conference but represents nearly half of all titles won. In baseball, the CAA has ranked as one of the nation's top five conferences in four of the past six seasons. The CAA is annually ranked among the nation's top 10 conferences in men's and women's soccer, and has traditionally sent

multiple teams to the NCAA Tournament. The conference finished the 2002-03 campaign with teams ranked among the top 25 nationally in cross country, field hockey, men's soccer, wrestling, men's and women's tennis and men's and women's lacrosse. CAA member institutions are also committed to excellence in the classroom. The Colonial Academic Alliance was created in 2002 by the league's presidents with a goal of expanding their partnership to all aspects of university life outside of intercollegiate athletics. Among the programs already established is granting visiting academic status to student-athletes traveling to an away contest so that they have access to libraries, academic resource centers and computer labs.

In 2002, two faculty members from CAA institutions were awarded academia's most coveted distinction – the Nobel Prize. John B. Fenn, a research professor in the Department of Chemistry at Virginia Commonwealth University was one of three recipients of the Nobel Prize in chemistry, and Vernon Smith, a professor of economics and law at George Mason University, shared the Nobel Prize in economic sciences.

Under the direction of Commissioner Thomas E. Yeager, who has guided the CAA since its inception, the league recently expanded to 10 members. The University of Delaware, Drexel University, Hofstra University and Towson University were introduced as the conference's newest members on December 13, 2000, joining George Mason University, James Madison University, the University of North Carolina at Wilmington, Old Dominion University, Virginia Commonwealth University and the College of William & Mary.

The CAA traces its roots back to 1983 when three of its current members- George Mason, James Madison, and William and Mary - were aligned with East Carolina University, the United States Naval Academy and the University of Richmond as a basketball league (ECAC South). During the next two years, the league added 11 sports, acquired two new members (UNC Wilmington and American University) and decided to form a new association. The transformation from ECAC South to CAA took place on June 6, 1985. By the fall of 1986, the league gained automatic bids to NCAA Championships in men's basketball, soccer, baseball and women's basketball and formed an officials' bureau. Old Dominion became a member of the CAA in 1991-92 and Virginia Commonwealth University joined the conference prior to the 1995-96 season.

From all-star athletes to Nobel prize winning faculty, the CAA takes great pride in producing performers who stand out both on the playing field and in the classroom.

ADMINISTRATION

Dr. Roseann Runte UNIVERSITY PRESIDENT



Dr. Roseann Runte became the seventh president of Old Dominion University in the summer of 2001. Runte, who has 21 years of experience as a professor and academic administrator, became only the third woman to head a four-year college or university in Virginia.

Runte previously served as president of Victoria University in Toronto, principal of Glendon College (York University), president of l'Université Sainte-Anne in Nova Scotia and assistant dean of arts and science at Dalhousie University.

She is an associate to the Council of the Royal College of Physicians and Surgeons of Canada, a board member of the National Bank of Canada and a member of the executive committee of the Club of Rome.

Runte has served as president of the Canadian Commission for UNESCO for two terms, as president of the Humanities Federation of Canada, as a member of the advisory board of the National Library, as founding president of ACFAS-Toronto, as a board member for the Art Gallery of Nova Scotia and of the board of Associated Medical Services, as chair of the board of the Foundation for International Training, and as vice chair of the board of the Gardiner Mu-

seum of Ceramic Art.

The author of five volumes of creative writing, she has edited nine books and has written more than 100 articles and book chapters on topics ranging from literature and education to economic and cultural development.

Runte has a Ph.D. in French from the University of Kansas and has received honorary degrees from Acadia University, Memorial University and the universities of Timisoara and Arad in Romania. She received the prix François Coppée from the Académie française as well as the Palmes Académiques and the Order of Merit from the French government, the Order of Canada, the Queen Elizabeth Jubilee medal, and is a Fellow of the Royal Society of Canada and of the World Academy of Arts and Sciences.

Dr. Jim Jarrett ATHLETIC DIRECTOR



When Jim Jarrett arrived on the campus of Old Dominion University in the fall of 1967 as a Health and Physical Education professor, he had little idea that his tenure would be counted in decades. During that time span, he has led the program from a well respected NCAA Division II member to a nationally respected Division I power that has captured 25 national championships.

Jarrett began his 33rd year as athletic director in 2003, taking over the reigns in 1970 when Bud Metheny stepped down from that position. As one of the youngest athletic directors in the nation at that time, Jarrett quickly began to make a name for himself and ODU. He committed early on to a philosophy of "selective excellence," whereby the department "selected" its competitive sports and committed itself financially, academically and competitively to the sports it felt the University could best excel.

In 1974, Jarrett became the first athletic director in the state of Virginia to award grant-in-aids to women student-athletes. It was a bold move at the time for a young athletic director and equally young University, but one that paid great dividends. Just five years later, in 1979, the Lady Monarchs won the first of three national championships in women's basketball, and

led the nation in attendance.

Under his leadership, the department's athletic venues have tripled and are considered state of the art facilities. They include the construction of the 2,500-seat Bud Metheny Baseball Complex in 1983, the Sailing Center in 1981, the Outdoor Tennis Complex which has been expanded to 15 lighted courts and a championship court with seating for 1,000-plus, the 4,000-seat ODU Soccer Stadium in 1990, renovations to Foreman Field, which included Astro-Turf and new locker room facilities, and the planning and construction of the 8,500 seat Constant Convocation Center.

For all his efforts, Jarrett's has been honored many times by national and local groups. Most recently, Jarrett was named the 2003 Southeast Regional Athletic Director of the Year by NACDA. Other awards he has received include the Collegiate Director's Award from the Women's Basketball Coaches Association, and the Norfolk Sports Club Man of the Year. He served as a member of the NCAA Women's Basketball Committee and is a past president of the Colonial Athletic Association and the Virginia Sports Hall of Fame.

An avid golfer and tennis player, Jarrett and his wife Sugie reside in Norfolk.

Athletic

OLD DOMINION UNIVERSITY prides itself on being able to offer the student-athlete the best possible facilities to achieve maximum potential on the field.

The Intercollegiate Athletics Building, opened in 1991, houses both strength training and athletic training facilities which are always at the full disposal of the student-athlete.

The athletic training room ranks as one of the top facilities in the nation, providing the best in modern rehabilitation equipment for athletic injuries. The seven-foot deep running pool, located in the hydrotherapy room, along with three whirlpools and one jacuzzi, provides Old Dominion athletes the opportunity to rehabilitate through exercise in water. The room also includes nine training tables, a Kinkom rehabilitation machine, and a traction table. The athletic training room is under the supervision of Head Athletic Trainer Marty Bradley, M.S., A.T., C., and his two full-time assistants, along with a staff of graduate assistants and student assistants.

Adjacent to the athletic training room is the strength training room, built specifically for student-athlete use. The room includes the most up-to-date nautilus and free weight equipment, all under the supervision of Strength and Conditioning Coach Andy Zucker.

The Intercollegiate Athletics Building also houses the administrative staff including the athletic director, the associate and assistant athletic directors, the offices of sports information, athletic development and promotions, and the ticket office. The Athletic Support Office and Buildings and Grounds offices are also located in the Intercollegiate Athletics Building.

The Intercollegiate Athletics Building is located in the middle of the athletic quadrant of the campus that includes the 4,000 seat Old Dominion Soccer Stadium, the 2,500 seat Bud Metheny Baseball Complex, the 15-court Tennis Complex that includes a 1,000 seat championship court, and the Health & Physical Education Building.

The H&PE Building contains the 5,500 seat Old Dominion Fieldhouse, which serves as the "home floor" for the Monarch wrestlers for most of their home duals and tournaments. The Fieldhouse also serves as the home court for the Lady Monarch and Monarch basketball squads. The J.C. "Scrap" Chandler Pool is also located in the H&PE Building, with seating for approximately 1,500 people.

Foreman Field, located behind Rollins Hall on the northern edge of the campus, is home to the field hockey and lacrosse teams, as well as being the site for much of Old Dominion's intramural sports program.

The Old Dominion Sailing Center, located on the Elizabeth River on the western side of the campus, was opened in 1985, and serves as home to the Monarch sailing program.

"THE MAT ROOM" - Home of the Monarch Wrestlers

THE stereotypical dark and dingy wrestling room became a thing of the past for the Old Dominion wrestling program in 1995.

A newly refurbished mat room, along with remodeled offices and a locker room, were opened in the summer of that year, giving Old Dominion wrestlers the most modern of facilities in which to practice and train.

The new mat room, located in the northeast corner of the Health & Physical Education Building, features approximately 4,800 square feet of floor area covered with Resilite mats. Existing windows were left in place, making the Old Dominion mat room an uncharacteristically well lit place to practice.

Separate offices for the head coach and the assistant coaches are accessible from either the outside hallway or the mat room itself, as is the wrestlers' locker room.



Old Dominion



Old Dominion University opened its doors 73 years ago in an abandoned public school building with 206 students as the Norfolk Division of the College of William and Mary, and became an independent institution in 1962. Today, the University enrolls more than 20,000 students, including approximately 6,000 graduate students. Its 188-acre Norfolk campus is the primary hub of activity, along with four additional higher education centers (Virginia Beach Center, Peninsula Center, Tri-Cities Center and Northern Virginia Center).

Old Dominion is a versatile university, committed to its students, their education, personal development and overall success. The University offers 66 bachelor's degrees, 67 master's degrees and 24 doctoral degrees, and consists of six colleges: Arts and Letters, Business and Public

Administration, Education, Engineering and Technology, Health Sciences, and Sciences.

Students who live on campus may choose residence hall or apartment-style living. The attractive Webb University Center offers a food court, cyber café, video arcade, lounge areas and other shops to serve the student body.

Old Dominion is one of Virginia's leading Ph.D. research institutions and is a Carnegie Doctoral Research Extensive University, the highest research classification for the nation's higher education institutions. The University contributes approximately \$600 million a year to the Hampton Roads economy and provides the community with a variety of programs and services, including the Bank of America Entrepreneurial Center, Technology Applications Center and Military Career Transition Program. Old

Dominion is a leader in space-related research and operates one of the largest wind tunnels in the world at NASA's Langley Research Center. The University's Coastal Physical Oceanography, Physical Therapy, Nuclear Physics, and Engineering Management and Systems Engineering programs are considered among the best in the country.

Old Dominion's planned renovation of a 75-acre tract of land along the east side of Hampton Boulevard is yet another economic spark for the region. The 8,600-seat Ted Constant Convocation Center, which opened in fall 2002, is the centerpiece of the project. The first set of student residences opened nearby in fall 2003, and will soon be followed by a variety of shops.

In the classroom, Old Dominion students continue to earn high marks. Former student-athlete and 1996 graduate Samantha Salvia became the University's first Rhodes Scholar, and the University has had three recent USA Today Academic All-Americans.

An international leader in delivering interactive instructional television, the University operates TELETECHNET, a distance learning system that offers students an opportunity to earn one of 20 baccalaureate or eight master's degrees without leaving their area of residence. TELETECHNET is the largest televised, interactive distance learning program of its kind in the United States.

Old Dominion is also well known for its international focus in both its curricula and student population. More than 1,200 international students from 100 countries are enrolled at the University. Old Dominion also contributes to the cultural life of Hampton Roads by presenting music and dance concerts, art exhibits, and annual literary and film and video festivals. In addition, the President's Lecture Series brings a variety of nationally known speakers to campus each year.

The University is located about 200 miles south of Washington, D.C., and is but a short drive to Virginia Beach, Williamsburg and the Outer Banks of North Carolina.
