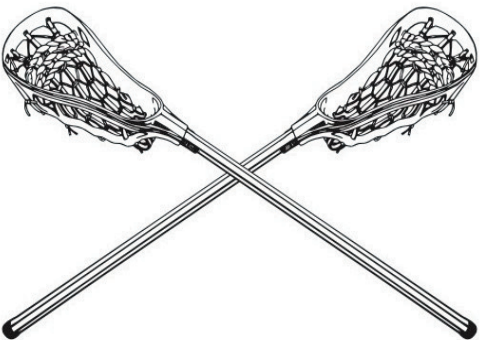

Sue Stahl, Head Coach/Camp Director



Sue Stahl, head coach of the Lady Monarch lacrosse team, is serving as director of the camp. She was head coach of the 1989, '93, '97 and 2001 United States World Cup Championship teams, as well as the 1992 Australian Touring Team. Stahl coached the 2005 World Cup team to a second place finish. She was a member of both the U.S. lacrosse team and the U.S. field hockey team during her collegiate career at Ursinus. Lacrosse Magazine named Stahl to its All-Century Women's Lacrosse team as the squad's coach.

Currently, Stahl is starting her 15th year as head coach of the Lady Monarchs, where she has coached four All-Americans and six Academic All-Americans. She led Old Dominion to the 1995 Colonial Athletic Association title, and was named CAA Coach of the Year in 1993, 2002 and '03.

Heather Holt, Assistant Coach



Heather Holt is starting her eighth season as the assistant coach of the Lady Monarchs. She was the goalie for Old Dominion's 1995 CAA Championship squad. Holt was the assistant lacrosse coach at the College of William and Mary during the 1997-98 season, where she was a goalkeeping specialist.

While playing for Old Dominion, she was selected to the All Regional Team, All CAA Team, 1996 USWLA National Tournament and is ranked third all-time in saves for Old Dominion University.

LOCATION

Campers will be lodged in air-conditioned and private-bath dormitories on the University campus. Two campers will be assigned to each room. A full staff of camp coaches provide around-the-clock supervision. Meals for residents include breakfast, lunch and dinner; commuters will NOT receive breakfast. All meals are served in a campus dining hall.
