THIS WEEK: Oregon State (5-3, 3-2 in Pac-10) travels to Berkeley to play the No. 23 California Golden Bears (6-2, 3-2). The game will be televised live nationally by FSN beginning at 4 p.m. A victory would make Oregon State bowl eligible, joining already qualified Pac-10 brethren Cal, Oregon and USC. Arizona and Stanford could also win game number six this week.

BOWL STREAK: If Oregon State qualifies for a bowl game it will be its fourth consecutive year – a school record. The program under then head coach Dennis Erickson went to the 2002 Insight Bowl, followed by current head coach **Mike Riley's** 2003 Las Vegas and 2004 Insight Bowl years. Riley has led the last three teams to two Sun Bowls and an Emerald Bowl. The Beavers have won five straight bowl games, the second-longest streak in the nation – Utah has an eight-game streak. And, oh by the way, Riley is undefeated in bowl games as a head coach (5-0) and as the offensive coordinator at USC (3-0) – Howard Schnellenberger (Florida Atlantic/Miami) is the only active head coach to win more bowl games (6) without losing.

SERIES: The series dates back to 1905 with Cal holding a 33-28 advantage. The Beavers have narrowed the gap of late by winning eight of the last 10 meetings, including four straight in Berkeley. Last season then No. 23 OSU defeated Cal 34-21 at Reser Stadium in a matchup that featured eventual Pac-10 Offensive Player of the Year **Jacquizz Rodgers** rushing for 144 yards and one touchdown and fellow first team all-conference back **Jahvid Best** going for 116 and a score.

MIKE RILEY**



- The second-longest active bowl win streak (5 games) in the nation
- The second-best record in the Pac-10 Conference over the last three seasons (33-15)
- Three consecutive Associated Press Top-25 rankings
- 2008 Pac-10 Coach of the Year.

Ninth-year head coach Mike Riley is well on his way, if not already, to being the most successful head football coach in the history of Oregon State University. He ranks third on the school's all-time career victories list with 61 wins, trailing only Lon Stiner (74 wins/1933-48) and College Hall of Fame coach Tommy Prothro (63 wins/1955-64).

Riley, in addition the 2008 American Football Coaches Association (AFCA) Regional Coach of the Year, is rightfully credited with the rebirth of the Oregon State football program when he was first hired in January of 1997. He has led the Beavers to unparalleled success during his second tenure that began in 2003.

Starting with the 2003 season Oregon State has won all five bowl games it has appeared in, finished with four winning marks in the Pac-10 Conference and overall has won 48 games (56 victories counting his tenure in 1997 and '98).

Riley is the first coach in OSU history to win more than one NCAA-sanctioned bowl game at OSU, capturing the 2003 Las Vegas Bowl, the 2004 Insight Bowl, the 2006 and 2008 Sun Bowls, and the 2007 Emerald Bowl titles. He also is the first coach to lead the program to more than one winning conference season (5-3 in '04, 6-3 in '06, 6-3 in '07 and 7-2 in '08) since 1969. The victory in last year's Sun Bowl improved Riley's bowl record as a coach to 8-0; 5-0 as the leader of the Oregon State program and 3-0 as the offensive coordinator at USC. His 5-0 record in postseason games ranks second in the nation, trailing only the 6-0 mark by former Miami and current Florida Atlantic head coach Howard Schnellenberger.

The 2008 Beavers had to overcome a loss of their entire defensive front seven, two experienced offensive linemen, the program's second all-time leading rusher and the school's best-ever kicker (OSU lost more starters than any other Pac-10 team). Riley and his staff found replacements within the program to turn what was expected to be a rebuilding year into a 9-4 season and the program's second-best ever mark in the Pac-10 Conference at 7-2 (tied for second). All of this while playing a schedule that was considered one of the toughest in the nation that included three BCS teams (USC, Utah, Penn State). The keynote victory of the season was a 27-21 win over then No. 1 USC Sept. 25 – at the time the Beavers were unranked. The season culminated with a 3-0 victory over No. 18 Pittsburgh in the Sun Bowl, a game OSU played without two of the team's top three offensive weapons – Pac-10 Offensive MVP and All-America running back Jacquizz Rodgers and his brother receiver James Rodgers. The team ended the year No. 18 in the final Associated Press Poll and No. 19 in the USA Today.

Those same two meet again this week. Last season's victory for OSU snapped a bizarre five-game streak of the road team winning. The Beavers won the 2007 game when linebacker Joey LaRocque tackled Bear QB Kevin Riley inbounds as time expired (Cal was in fg range) preserving a 31-28 win over No. 2 Cal – the Bears were poised to move to No. 1 as the top-ranked team lost earlier in the day.

BEAVERS VS. RANKED TEAMS: Oregon State has won six of its last 12 games against nationally ranked opponents, including three on the road – at No. 24 Hawai'i in 2006 (35-32), at No. 2 Cal in 2007 (31-28) and at No. 18 Oregon in '07 (38-31, OT).

GETTING IN THE OFFENSIVE GROOVE: Several teams within the Pac-10 have seen noticeable improvements in terms of offensive production over the last three games, and OSU and Cal are two of those clubs. The Beavers are averaging 469 yards (409 season avg.) in offense over the last three games while Cal is at 487 (427).

222 vs. 221: What's so special about those numbers? 222 is the number of times **Jacquizz Rodgers** has touched the ball this year after eight games and 221 is the number he touched the ball last year at the same point of the season. Take away Rodgers' touchdown pass out of the "Wild Beaver" formation last week against UCLA and the numbers are identical on the surface. Here's the difference, and it's a point that head coach **Mike Riley** said prior to the year – "we need to get Quizz more involved in the passing game." Quizz has 49 receptions this season, as compared to 24 last year at this point. Thus, he has carried the ball 25 fewer times.

THEY LIKE THE SETTING: Beaver running backs apparently like the setting of Strawberry Canyon, as they have put together some impressive performances on the Bears' home field. Here is a closer look:

- Nov. 11, 2001 – Ken Simonton – 17 att., 125 yds, 3 TDs
- Oct. 4, 2003 – Steven Jackson – 35 att., 227 yds, 2 TDs
- Oct. 15, 2005 – Yvenson Bernard, 42 att, 194 yds, 2 TDs
- Oct. 13, 2007 – Yvenson Bernard -- 33 att.,110 yds, 2 TDs

PAYDIRT PAIR: Last season's Pac-10 First Team running backs **Jacquizz Rodgers** of OSU (Pac-10 Offensive MVP) and Jahvid Best of Cal have each scored a league-high 15 touchdowns – tied for second in the nation with Lance Dunbar of North Texas. Navy's Ricky Dobbs has 16 scores.

KICKING STAR: OSU junior **Justin Kahut** has been named as the Pac-10 Special Teams Player of the Week and also is one of three kickers recognized as a Lou Groza Kicking Award "Star of the Week" following his four field goal effort against UCLA. Kahut added a pair of PATs to score 10 points for the second straight week. He is tied for sixth in the nation with 15 field goals converted in 2009.

BIG TACKLERS: Two of the league leaders for tackles will be in action Saturday. Cal junior line-backer Mike Mohamed has a Pac-10 high 74 tackles while OSU senior linebacker **Keaton Kristick** is fourth with 63.

THOSE TEAMS ARE PRETTY GOOD: Oregon State's three losses this season (USC, Arizona, Cincinnati) have come to teams that have a combined record of 19-4 (83%). Cincinnati is No. 4 in this week's Associated Press Poll, USC is No 12 and Arizona is No. 21.

WIN THE TURNOVER BATTLE, WIN THE

GAME: Over the last 70 games, Oregon State is 29-4 when committing fewer turnovers than its opponent, 9-18 when committing more and 6-4 when even. Oregon State has lost just five turnovers this season, second in the nation, trailing the four committed by Cincinnati. The Beavers are also tied for second with Colorado State for fumbles lost with one, while Cincinnati has lost zero. Sophomore running back **Jacquizz Rodgers** has never fumbled at OSU – 431 rushes, 71 receptions, 1 pass attempt. Oddly, on the other side of the ball OSU is tied for 114th in turnovers gained with eight – only Fresno State (7) and Georgia (6) have fewer.

LEFTY ON RECORD PACE: Senior quarterback **Sean Canfield** is on pace to shatter the OSU record for completion percentage for a season. The left-hander has completed 68.9 percent (188-273) of his attempts, including 11 touchdowns – the season record is by Matt Moore in 2006 at 60.6 (229-378) percent. Canfield is third in the nation for completion percentage, trailing Colt McCoy (Texas, 72.0), and Christian Ponder (Florida State, 69.4). He is averaging 68 pass attempts per interception this season after entering the year with an interception every 22 pass attempts. He also is fifth all-time at OSU with 4,738 passing yards and for touchdown passes with 28 – he needs one to tie Moore for fourth. He is averaging a Pac-10 high 254.9 yards per game passing and has not thrown an interception in his last 117 attempts – last was in the third quarter at Arizona State Oct. 3. The last Beaver to lead the conference for passing is current Cleveland Brown Derek Anderson in 2004 at 301.2 yards.

QUIZZ ALSO ON RECORD PACE: Sophomore running back **Jacquizz Rodgers** is on record pace for the most points for a season by a Beaver, currently held by Steven Jackson in 2003 with 132. "Quizz" has 90 with four regular season games to play. His 15 total touchdowns are tied for second in the nation, trailing only the 16 by Ricky Dobbs of Navy. For overall rushing he is already sixth at OSU with 2,175 yards and if he gains 59 yards Saturday he will move into fifth place on the chart. Quizz also needs just five rushing scores to tie for the single season school record with 19 by Jackson in 2003 and Ken Simonton in 1999 and 2000.

JAMES IS ALSO ON RECORD WATCH:

Beaver junior receiver **James Rodgers** is averaging 187.4 yards per game for all-purpose yards (Rec, PR, KR) which ranks first in the Pac-10 and fifth in the nation. At his current pace, James would set the school record for all-purpose yards with 2,436 – the current record is Steven Jackson in 2003 with 2,015. His brother, sophomore **Jacquizz Rodgers**, is second in the conference at 161.6 and 12th nationally. James leads the Pac-10 for receptions per game at 7.5 and for receiving yards per game at 88.2. "Quizz" at 6.1 receptions per outing is second in the conference. The last time a player led the Pac-10 for all-purpose yards, receptions per game and receiving yards per game was Bobby Wade of Arizona in 2002

Game Day — Beaver Sports Properties (BSP), a division of Learfield Sports, produces game-day radio broadcasts and special programming, syndicated on the Beaver Sports Radio Network. The 8-hour broadcasts consist of over 30 stations across Oregon and is anchored by the Portland flagship station KPAM 860, KPAM also airs daily Beaver segments on its “Bob Miller in the Morning” show with sports director Ron Callan.

There will continue to be several options to complement local radio with football and men’s basketball games available on XM Satellite Radio (official partner of the Pac-10 Conference), internet audio through Beaver Nation Online’s audio/visual service and www.kpam.com. Beaver Nation Online (BNO) links are available at www.osubeavers.com (via several subscription-based plans).

Beavers in Spanish — In 2003, Oregon State Athletics, through BSP, became the first Northwest school to offer Spanish-language broadcasts to the Latino community. For the sixth consecutive year every football game will be offered in Spanish and in 2009 it will be available by a first-year partnership with KWIP-AM, a 5,000-watt station in Dallas, Ore., covering the Willamette Valley. — prior to that Gyn Milburn of Stanford in 1990 and Vincent White of the Cardinal in 1982. Last season the Rodgers’ combined for 3,333 all-purpose yards, this year they are on pace to accumulate 4,053 yards in the regular season.

RUSHERS: Since the 2002 season, Oregon State is second in the Pac-10 for the number of times a player has reached the 1,000-yard rushing plateau with six (missing only 2004). California leads the league with seven, followed by the Beavers, Oregon (5), USC (3), UCLA (2) and Stanford, Arizona, Arizona State, Washington and Washington State with one each.

WE LIVE FOR THIS: If the season only started in October – that’s been a traditionally good sign for the Beavers. Since the 2006 campaign OSU is 25-6 (81%) in games played in October, November and December.

IN THE (RED) ZONE: The Beavers are second in the Pac-10 for redzone scoring percentage at 94.1 percent (Oregon 94.3) and tied for eighth in the nation. OSU has scored on 32 of 34 attempts, 23 via touchdowns and nine via field goals. See more details on redzone scoring in the statistics portion of the notes.

HAS ANYBODY LOST MORE? From the start of practice, OSU fans knew there were a lot of vacancies to fill on the defense. In fact, the Beavers have lost 16 starters on defense over the last two seasons. Those starters account for four of OSU’s top 10 players for tackles for loss and two of the top four players for sacks. Six of those 16 starters lost were drafted, including current NFL players and Beavers last season Al Afalava (Bears/starter), Keenan Lewis (Steelers), Brandon Hughes (Chargers), Victor Butler (Cowboys) and Slade Norris (Raiders).

COMMANDING FIRST QUARTER: Oregon State has outscored its opponents 259-85 in the first quarter over the last 48 games, including 224-61 in the last 24. The Beavers have allowed just 17 points (USC-7, Ariz-7, ASU-3) in the last nine first quarters combined, dating back to last year.

1,000 x 2: Junior receiver **James Rodgers** is the second Beaver in school history to amass 1,000 yards rushing and 1,000 yards receiving. James has 1,200 career yards rushing and 1,521 career yards receiving and has joined Pat Chaffey (1986, 88-89), who accumulated 1,421 yards rushing and 1,293 yards receiving.

100-PLUS USUALLY A W: When a Beaver rushes for 100-plus yards it usually equals a victory. OSU has won 17 of its last 19 games (89%) when a rusher gains 100 – the only two losses in that period was Oct. 2, 2008 at Utah (**Jacquizz Rodgers** 101

yds) and to USC Oct. 24, 2009 (Jacquizz 113). Quizz, his brother **James Rodgers**, Yvenson Bernard and Matthew Sieverson are the individuals who have accounted for the 100 yard outings.

WINNING SEASONS: If Oregon State can achieve a 7-5 regular season or better it would mark its fourth consecutive winning season – the longest streak since a five-year run from 1966-70.

STRESS! WHAT STRESS? Beaver fans have learned to deal with the stress of close football games, and for the most part, the outcomes have been favorable. OSU is 15-4 since the start of the 2006 season in games decided by seven points or less.

THE FIRST SINCE 1997: In the season's opening game, true freshman offensive tackle **Michael Philipp** became the first true freshman offensive lineman to start a game at Oregon State since Keith DiDomenico did at right guard in 1997 vs. USC and Oregon.

TRUE FRESHMEN MAKE A MARK: Oregon State played eight true freshmen in the season opener against Portland State; the most in modern history – up until the late 1980s true freshmen played in junior varsity games. The eight freshmen to play so far this season are OT **Michael Philipp**,

WR **Markus Wheaton**, OT **Geoff Garner**, Safety **Jordan Poyer**, LB **Rueben Robinson**, RB **Jovan Stevenson**, and linebackers **"Feti"** and **"Uani"** **Unga**. It should be noted that Garner and the 'Unga brothers came to OSU after two-year LDS Missions, and Stevenson enrolled at OSU during winter term of 2009 and was thus a greyshirt.

ACADEMICS: It's a small but successful class of seniors on and off the field for the Beavers this year. Players such as **Sean Canfield**, **Tim Clark**, **Patrick Henderson**, **Taylor Kavanaugh**, **Keaton Kristick**, **Lyle Moevao**, **Gregg Peat** and **John Reese** could at least, if not played, suited up for four bowl games. Academically, **Kavanaugh** has graduated in construction engineering management. The following players will graduate in December – **Sean Canfield** (philosophy), **Patrick Henderson** (sociology), **Lyle Moevao** (sociology), **Sioeli Nau** (liberal studies) and **John Reese** (speech communication). Graduating in March 2010 are **Tim Clark** (human development/family studies), **Howard Croom** (sociology), **Latu Moala** (liberal studies) and **Gregg Peat** (double major in accounting and finance). March graduates include **Damola Adeniji** (liberal studies) and **Keaton Kristick** (business), and in July **Ben Terry** (sociology). OSU tied with Washington State for the most Pac-10 All-Academic selections last season with 15.

GOOD WORKS GUY: Beaver senior receiver, punt returner, holder **Taylor Kavanaugh** is one of 12 Football Bowl Subdivision (FBS) student-athletes to be recognized by the American Football Coaches Association (AFCA) on its "Good Works Team." The honor is given to players that embody the true spirit of "teamwork" and "giving back" through commendable acts of kindness and community service. Kavanaugh is involved in many community service events and last spring break visited Guatemala with a team of student engineers to build a house for a needy family.

FOUR IN A ROW?: Can the Beavers finish higher than Pac-10 media predicted for the fourth consecutive year? This year's media, that regularly cover the conference, predicted OSU for fourth place. Here is a closer look at the last three years:

- 2006 – prediction 7th – actual finish 3rd
- 2007 – prediction 5th – actual finish 3rd
- 2008 – prediction 6th – actual finish T2nd

RUNNING BACK U?: Former Oregon State running backs Ken Simonton, Yvenson Bernard (Winnipeg Blue Bombers) and Steven Jackson (St. Louis Rams) all rank in the top 11 of the Pac-10 Conference for career rushing. USC is the only other school in the league with more – Charles White, Marcus Allen, Anthony Davis and Ricky Bell. If sophomore **Jacquizz Rodgers** averages his 2008 total (1,253 yards) for the next three seasons he would finish his career third on that chart with 5,012 yards, trailing only White (6,245) and Simonton (5,044).

BEAVERS UP FOR NATIONAL AWARDS: Sophomore running back **Jacquizz Rodgers** enters the year on the “watch” lists for the Walter Camp and Doak Walker awards; linebacker **Keaton Kristick** is on the Lott Trophy and Bednarik Award lists; defensive end **Stephen Paea** is on the Nagurski list, and **Johnny Hekker** is up for the Ray Guy Award.

WALK-ONS: Wide receiver Mike Hass (2005 Biletnikoff Award winner) was one; placekicker Alexis Serna (2005 Groza Award recipient) was one; punter **Johnny Hekker** (2008 Sun Bowl Special Teams MVP) was one; quarterback Jonathan Smith (2001 Fiesta Bowl Off. MVP) was one. That is just a small sample of walkons at Oregon State that had or having great careers at Oregon State. This season opened with former walkons **Mike Remmers** (RT) and **Damola Adeniji** (WR) starting, and current walkon **Grant Johnson** (LG). Senior receiver/holder/punt returner **Taylor Kavanaugh** also was a walkon until recently and Adeniji learned he had earned a scholarship on Sept. 4, the eve of the season opener.

TEAM CAPTAINS: By a vote of the team, this year’s team captains are seniors **Keaton Kristick, Sean Canfield, Lyle Moevao, Gregg Peat** and junior **Stephen Paea**.

OH BROTHER (S): The Beavers have a FBS high five sets of brothers on the team. The **LaGrones** (Matt and Josh), **Krebs** (Kameron and Kaulin), **Rodgers** (Jacquizz and James), **Watkins** (Anthony and Brian) and **Ungas** (Devin and Kevin). Virginia Tech has four sets of brothers.

NOT A FREQUENT FLYER MILE TEAM: The Beavers will stay close to the dam this year as the team does not have a road game that is played outside of the Pacific Time Zone (Oct. 3 at Arizona State is a Pacific Time game). The last time that happened was 2003 – since the program has made trips to LSU, Boise State (twice), Louisville, Penn State, Utah, Hawai’i, Cincinnati, Arizona (in 2002) and two Sun Bowl appearances in El Paso.

RECORD-SETTING NFL DRAFT FOR OSU: Oregon State had its best-ever showing in April’s NFL Draft when seven former players were selected. The selections of Andy Levitre (2nd - Buffalo Bills), Keenan Lewis (3rd - Pittsburgh Steelers), Victor Butler (4th - Dallas Cowboys), Slade Norris (4th - Oakland Raiders), Brandon Hughes (5th - San Diego Chargers), Al Afalava (6th - Chicago Bears), Sammie Stroughter (7th - Tampa Bay Buccaneers) amounted to a tie for the second-most (Ohio State) players taken from a single school in the 2009 draft ... With those seven additions to the league, there are now 21 former Beavers playing in the NFL.
