**THIS WEEK:** Oregon State (4-2, 2-1 in Pac-10) travels to the fabled Los Angeles Memorial Coliseum to challenge the No. 4 (AP/Coaches) USC Trojans (5-1, 2-1). The game will be televised live by ABC beginning at 5 p.m. Saturday marks the 25th consecutive live televised appearance for the Beavers – the fifth-longest active streak in the Pac-10.

**SERIES:** The series dates back to 1914 with USC holding a commanding 58-10-4 advantage, but Oregon State has won two of the last three games, including last year's 27-21 victory over the then No. 1 Trojans – marked the second time in school history the Beavers have beaten a No. 1 team – also knocking off the Trojans 3-0 in 1967 – both games in Corvallis. The Beavers' 2006 victory (33-31) over the then No. 3 Trojans ended USC's 27-game Pac-10 winning streak. OSU has not won at USC since 1960 (see next note). Last season OSU jumped to a 21-0 lead at halftime and then held on for the victory. Freshman RB **Jacquizz Rodgers** had a then career-high 186 yards rushing (had 189 in last game vs. Stanford) and two touchdowns and his brother James had two touchdowns receiving.

**50/50:** Oregon State has won five of its last 10 games against nationally ranked opponents, including over No. 1 USC (2008), No. 2 California (2007) and No. 3 USC (2006). The other victories are over No. 19 Pittsburgh (2008 Sun Bowl) and No. 24 Hawai'i (2006).

**HEAD COACH  
MIKE RILEY**



- The second-longest active bowl win streak (5 games) in the nation
- The second-best record in the Pac-10 Conference over the last three seasons (31-14)
- Three consecutive Associated Press Top-25 rankings
- 2008 Pac-10 Coach of the Year.

Ninth-year head coach Mike Riley is well on his way, if not already, to being the most successful head football coach in the history of Oregon State University. He ranks third on the school's all-time career victories list with 59 wins, trailing only Lon Stiner (74 wins/1933-48) and College Hall of Fame coach Tommy Prothro (63 wins/1955-64).

Riley, in addition the 2008 American Football Coaches Association (AFCA) Regional Coach of the Year, is rightfully credited with the rebirth of the Oregon State football program when he was first hired in January of 1997. He has led the Beavers to unparalleled success during his second tenure that began in 2003.

Starting with the 2003 season Oregon State has won all five bowl games it has appeared in, finished with four winning marks in the Pac-10 Conference and overall has won 48 games (56 victories counting his tenure in 1997 and '98).

Riley is the first coach in OSU history to win more than one NCAA-sanctioned bowl game at OSU, capturing the 2003 Las Vegas Bowl, the 2004 Insight Bowl, the 2006 and 2008 Sun Bowls, and the 2007 Emerald Bowl titles. He also is the first coach to lead the program to more than one winning conference season (5-3 in '04, 6-3 in '06, 6-3 in '07 and 7-2 in '08) since 1969. The victory in last year's Sun Bowl improved Riley's bowl record as a coach to 8-0; 5-0 as the leader of the Oregon State program and 3-0 as the offensive coordinator at USC. His 5-0 record in postseason games ranks second in the nation, trailing only the 6-0 mark by former Miami and current Florida Atlantic head coach Howard Schnellenberger.

The 2008 Beavers had to overcome a loss of their entire defensive front seven, two experienced offensive linemen, the program's second all-time leading rusher and the school's best-ever kicker (OSU lost more starters than any other Pac-10 team). Riley and his staff found replacements within the program to turn what was expected to be a rebuilding year into a 9-4 season and the program's second-best ever mark in the Pac-10 Conference at 7-2 (tied for second). All of this while playing a schedule that was considered one of the toughest in the nation that included three BCS teams (USC, Utah, Penn State). The keynote victory of the season was a 27-21 win over then No. 1 USC Sept. 25 — at the time the Beavers were unranked. The season culminated with a 3-0 victory over No. 18 Pittsburgh in the Sun Bowl, a game OSU played without two of the team's top three offensive weapons — Pac-10 Offensive MVP and All-America running back Jacquizz Rodgers and his brother receiver James Rodgers. The team ended the year No. 18 in the final Associated Press Poll and No. 19 in the USA Today.

**THE LAST TIME:** The last time Oregon State won against USC at the Coliseum was 1960 — the streak has reached 21 games. To put into perspective here are some interesting facts the last time the Beavers won on that season opening Sept. 16, 1960:

- President: Dwight D. Eisenhower
- Vice President: Richard M. Nixon
- OSU Head Coach: Tommy Prothro
- Gallon of Gas: \$0.31
- Avg. home cost: \$16,500
- 1st Class Stamp: \$.04
- Gallon of Milk: \$0.49
- Billboard Top Song: "It's Now or Never" by Elvis Presley
- Age of Mike Riley: 7
- Super Bowl winner: 2,312 days from the first one (6-plus years)
- Most of the current OSU players' parents were not born.

**THAT'S ONE BIG POLTERGEIST:** Since the beginning of the Beaver football renaissance with the hiring of head coach and former USC offensive coordinator **Mike Riley** in the winter of 1997, many ghosts of Beaver football past have vanished, except the streak at USC. Here is a closer look at a few others:

- Bowl Drought: Jan. 1, 1965 Rose Bowl to Dec. 24, 1999 O'ahu Bowl (34 seasons)\*
- Winning Seasons Drought: 1970-1999
- 0 or 1 win seasons: 8

**OSU HAS HAD CHANCES TO BREAK . . .** the streak at USC. In 2001 OSU placekicker Ryan Cesca missed a 35-yard field goal (wide left) with 6:04 remaining and then missed a 29-yard boot (wide right) with 33 seconds remaining, before USC won in overtime 16-13. Cesca hit a 29-yarder in the first OT, but USC quarterback Carson Palmer answered with a 4-yard run to end the game. In 1999 the Beavers committed four turnovers, but still had a chance down 37-29 when USC's Chad Morton fumbled late in the game at OSU's 41-yard line; the Beavers moved to the Trojan 31 before a fourth-down Terrance Bryant pass went incomplete in the final seconds. The Beavers also had narrow losses in 1963 (28-22) and 1968 (17-13), but in both games the score was closer than the actual game — the Beavers scored twice in the final 90 seconds of each and failed to recover the following onside kick. The Coliseum has also been the locale for OSU's worst loss ever, 63-0 in 1985.

**SHOULDER DERAILS LEFTY:** Senior starting quarterback **Sean Canfield** was playing the best football of his career, prior to this season, when he hurt his left (passing) shoulder at USC in the 2007 game while attempting to slide to avoid a Trojan tackler. He would miss the rest of the regular season before replacing the injured **Lyle Moevao** during the Emerald Bowl victory. He had offseason shoulder surgery to repair the strain before the 2008 slate.

**GIVE THAT RILEY GUY AN EXTRA WEEK**

...: Oregon State has won its last seven games after a bye week and since **Mike Riley's** return in 2003 is 8-2. Even in his first two years of a major rebuilding process in 1997-98 he was 1-1 following a bye. Here is a closer look at the results after a bye week in the Riley tenure:

**KEY TO WINS - THIRD DOWN CONVERSION DEFENSE?**

The Beavers have held their last two opponents (ASU & Stan) to 5 of 27 (19%) on third down conversions as compared to the previous two (Cinn & UA) to 10 of 25 (40%). In the last two victories, the opponents have been at 3rd-and-5 or less just twice, failing to convert on either. Those same two opponents have been also unsuccessful at 3rd-and-9 or more at 0-for-5. On the other side the Beavers have converted 13 of 26 (50%) in the last two contests as opposed to 12 of 32 (38%) in the previous two.

**"PASS"...**: Maybe it's partly because of the relatively inexperienced left side of the Beaver offensive line, as the team has been more successful gaining first downs via the air - a Pac-10 leading 76. The Beavers have 41 on the ground, near the bottom of the league. The Beaver opponents have managed 81 (2nd most allowed in the Pac-10) first downs passing, but only 34 on the ground.

**RUSHERS:** Since the 2002 season, Oregon State is second in the Pac-10 for the number of times a player has reached the 1,000-yard rushing plateau with six (missing only 2004). California leads the league with seven, followed by the Beavers, Oregon (5), USC (3), UCLA (2) and Stanford, Arizona, Arizona State, Washington and Washington State with one each.

**RUNNING BACK U?:** Former Oregon State running backs Ken Simonton, Yvenson Bernard (Winnipeg Blue Bombers) and Steven Jackson (St. Louis Rams) all rank in the top 11 of the Pac-10 Conference for career rushing. USC is the only other school in the league with more - Charles White, Marcus Allen, Anthony Davis and Ricky Bell. If sophomore **Jacquizz Rodgers** averages his 2008 total (1,253 yards) for the next three seasons he would finish his career third on that chart with 5,012 yards, trailing only White (6,245) and Simonton (5,044).

**WE LIVE FOR THIS:** If the season only started in October - that's been a traditionally good sign for the Beavers. Since the 2006 campaign OSU is 24-5 (83%) in games played in October, November and December.

**BEAVER SPORTS RADIO NETWORK**

**Game Day** — Beaver Sports Properties (BSP), a division of Learfield Sports, produces game-day radio broadcasts and special programming, syndicated on the Beaver Sports Radio Network. The 8-hour broadcasts consist of over 30 stations across Oregon and is anchored by the Portland flagship station KPAM 860, KPAM also airs daily Beaver segments on its "Bob Miller in the Morning" show with sports director Ron Callan.

There will continue to be several options to complement local radio with football and men's basketball games available on XM Satellite Radio (official partner of the Pac-10 Conference), internet audio through Beaver Nation Online's audio/visual service and www.kpam.com. Beaver Nation Online (BNO) links are available at www.osubeavers.com (via several subscription-based plans).

**Beavers in Spanish** — In 2003, Oregon State Athletics, through BSP, became the first Northwest school to offer Spanish-language broadcasts to the Latino community. For the sixth consecutive year every football game will be offered in Spanish and in 2009 it will be available by a first-year partnership with KWIP-AM, a 5,000-watt station in Dallas, Ore., covering the Willamette Valley. Juan De Dios Andrade handles play-by-play and Jose Luis Lupercio provides analysis.

**IS THAT RIGHT?** Oregon State has the longest road winning streak in the Pac-10 Conference at five games (Arizona State and UNLV this season, and Arizona, UCLA and Washington last year). The Beavers haven't won six straight road games since capturing five in a row in 1969 (Iowa, ASU, UW, Cal, UO) and the first road tilt of 1970 (Oklahoma).

**WIN THE TURNOVER BATTLE, WIN THE GAME:**

Over the last 68 games, Oregon State is 29-3 when committing fewer turnovers than its opponent, 9-18 when committing more and 5-4 when even. Oregon State has lost just four turnovers this season, tied for ninth in the nation. OSU and Cincinnati, are the only teams to not have lost a fumble this season and the Beavers four lost turnovers overall is tied for the fewest in the nation with Cincinnati and Air Force. Sophomore running back Jacquizz Rodgers has never lost a fumble at OSU - 387 rushes and 67 receptions. Oddly, on the other side of the ball only one team (Nevada-4) has caused fewer turnovers than the Beavers with six. Last season OSU was sixth in the country forcing 34 turnovers. Since 2001 ranks 11th in turnovers forced, the OSU defense trails USC (276), Virginia Tech (260), Oklahoma (258), West Virginia (248), Boston College (246), Washington State (240), Southern Miss (239), Hawai'i (237), Texas (236), and Boise State (232).

**IN THE (RED) ZONE:**

The Beavers lead the Pac-10 and are tied for third in the nation for redzone scoring percentage at 95.8 percent, scoring on 23 of 24 opportunities. Seventeen via touchdowns and six via field goals. See more details on redzone scoring in the statistics portion of the notes.

**PRETTY GOOD QBs:**

Saturday features two of the top quarterbacks statistically in the Pac-10 in OSU's Sean Canfield and USC's Matt Barkley. Canfield ranks third in the league for passing yards per game at 234.2 while Barkley is first at 267.6. Canfield is on school record pace for single season passing completion percentage (currently at 67.9%) that is held by Matt Moore (60.6%) in 2006.

**SIX BETWEEN THEM:**

The dynamic brother combination of James and Jacquizz Rodgers has captured six Pac-10 Players of the Week honors in their careers. James had one from last year and was the league's offensive player of the week for Oct. 5. Quizz had three last year and was the Off. Player of the Week for Oct. 12.

**STOPPING THE RUN:**

The Beavers enter this week ranked third in the Pac-10 for rush defense, allowing 97.7 yards per game. The defense has kept each of the previous six opponents leading rusher under their average. USC enters the week second allowing 67.7 yards.

**HAS ANYBODY LOST MORE?**

From the start of practice, OSU fans knew there were a lot of vacancies to fill on the defense. In fact, the Beavers have lost 16 starters on defense over the last two seasons. Those starters account for four of OSU's top 10 players for tackles for loss and two of the top four players for sacks. Six of those 16 starters lost were drafted, including current NFL players and Beavers last season Al Afalava (Bears/starter), Keenan Lewis (Steelers), Brandon Hughes (Chargers), Victor Butler (Cowboys) and Slade Norris (Raiders).

**ALL-PURPOSE BROTHERS:** Beaver junior receiver **James Rodgers** is averaging 180.2 yards per game for all-purpose yards (Rec, PR, KR) which ranks first in the Pac-10 and eighth in the nation. His brother, sophomore **Jacquizz Rodgers**, is third in the conference at 161 and 15th nationally. James leads the Pac-10 (T14th nationally) for receptions per game at 7.2 and for receiving yards per game at 90.7. "Quizz" at 6.3 receptions per outing is second in the conference. The last time a player led the Pac-10 for all-purpose yards, receptions per game and receiving yards per game was Bobby Wade of Arizona in 2002 - prior to that Gyn Milburn of Stanford in 1990 and Vincent White of the Cardinal in 1982.

**WHEN IN DOUBT, GIVE IT TO QUIZZ:** **Jacquizz Rodgers** is second in the nation for touchdowns scored rushing with 13 (Ricky Dobbs, Navy, 17). He is only six short of the school record for TDs scored on the ground for a season. James has four receiving, meaning the Rodgers' have accounted for 17 of the team's 21 (81%) touchdowns.

**SECOND BEST:** Oregon State has won 32 games (lost 14) since the start of the 2006 season, the second best mark in the Pac-10 Conference (see boxed table). USC is the only program that has more in that timeframe with 39 victories against six losses (two to OSU).

**GOOD IN THE CLUTCH:** Oregon State has won 14 of its last 17 games decided by seven points or less.

**COMMANDING FIRST QUARTER:** Oregon State has outscored its opponents 250-78 in the first quarter over the last 46 games, including 215-54 in the last 22. The Beavers have allowed just 10 points (Ariz-7, ASU-3) in the last seven first quarters combined, dating back to last year.

**1,000 x 2:** Junior receiver **James Rodgers** is the second Beaver in school history to amass 1,000 yards rushing and 1,000 yards receiving. James has 1,178 career yards rushing and 1,359 career yards receiving and has joined Pat Chaffey (1986, 88-89), who accumulated 1,421 yards rushing and 1,293 yards receiving. For more on James and the rest of the Beaver players see the individual player notes section.

**BOWL STREAK:** If Oregon State qualifies for a bowl game in 2009 it will be its fourth consecutive year - a school record. The program under then head coach Dennis Erickson went to the 2002 Insight Bowl, followed by current head coach **Mike Riley's** 2003 Las Vegas and 2004 Insight Bowl years. Riley has led the last three teams to two Sun Bowls and an Emerald Bowl. The Beavers have won five straight bowl games, the second-longest streak in the nation - Utah has won eight in a row. And, oh by the way, Riley is undefeated in bowl games as a head coach (5-0) and as the offensive coordinator at USC (3-0) - Howard Schnellenberger (Florida Atlantic/Miami) is the only active head coach to win more bowl games (6) without losing.

**100-PLUS USUALLY A W:** When a Beaver rushes for 100-plus yards it usually equals a victory. OSU has won 16 of its last 17 games when a rusher gains 100 - the only loss in that period was Oct. 2, 2008 at Utah (**Jacquizz Rodgers** 101 yds). Quizz, his brother **James Rodgers**, Yvenson Bernard and Matthew Sieverson are the individuals who have accounted for the 100 yard outings.

**WINNING SEASONS:** If Oregon State can achieve a 7-5 regular season or better it would mark its fourth consecutive winning season - the longest streak since a five-year run from 1966-70.

**THE FIRST SINCE 1997:** In the season's opening game, true freshman offensive tackle **Michael Philipp** became the first true freshman offensive lineman to start a game at Oregon State since Keith DiDomenico did at right guard in 1997 vs. USC and Oregon.

**TRUE FRESHMEN MAKE A MARK:** Oregon State played eight true freshmen in the season opener against Portland State; the most in modern history – up until the late 1980s true freshmen played in junior varsity games. The eight freshmen to play so far this season are OT **Michael Philipp**, WR **Markus Wheaton**, OT **Geoff Garner**, Safety **Jordan Poyer**, LB **Rueben Robinson**, RB **Jovan Stevenson**, and linebackers “**Feti**” and “**Uani**” “**Unga**. It should be noted that Garner and the ‘Unga brothers came to OSU after two-year LDS Missions, and Stevenson enrolled at OSU during winter term of 2009 and was thus a greyshirt.

**ACADEMICS:** It's a small but successful class of seniors on and off the field for the Beavers this year. Players such as **Sean Canfield**, **Tim Clark**, **Patrick Henderson**, **Taylor Kavanaugh**, **Keaton Kristick**, **Lyle Moevao**, **Gregg Peat** and **John Reese** could at least, if not played, suited up for four bowl games. Academically, **Kavanaugh** has graduated in construction engineering management. The following players will graduate in December – **Sean Canfield** (philosophy), **Patrick Henderson** (sociology), **Lyle Moevao** (sociology), **Sioeli Nau** (liberal studies) and **John Reese** (speech communication). Graduating in March 2010 are **Tim Clark** (human development/family studies), **Howard Croom** (sociology), **Latu Moala** (liberal studies) and **Gregg Peat** (double major in accounting and finance). March graduates include **Damola Adeniji** (liberal studies) and **Keaton Kristick** (business), and in July **Ben Terry** (sociology). OSU tied with Washington State for the most Pac-10 All-Academic selections last season with 15.

**GOOD WORKS GUY:** Beaver senior receiver, punt returner, holder **Taylor Kavanaugh** is one of 12 Football Bowl Subdivision (FBS) student-athletes to be recognized by the American Football Coaches Association (AFCA) on its “Good Works Team.” The honor is given to players that embody the true spirit of “teamwork” and “giving back” through commendable acts of kindness and community service. Kavanaugh is involved in many community service events and last spring break visited Guatemala with a team of student engineers to build a house for a needy family.

**FOUR IN A ROW?:** Can the Beavers finish higher than Pac-10 media predicted for the fourth consecutive year? This year's media, that regularly cover the conference, predicted OSU for fourth place. Here is a closer look at the last three years:

- 2006 – prediction 7th – actual finish 3rd
- 2007 – prediction 5th – actual finish 3rd
- 2008 – prediction 6th – actual finish T2nd

**BEAVERS UP FOR NATIONAL AWARDS:** Sophomore running back **Jacquizz Rodgers** enters the year on the “watch” lists for the Walter Camp and Doak Walker awards; linebacker **Keaton Kristick** is on the Lott Trophy and Bednarik Award lists; defensive end **Stephen Paea** is on the Nagurski list, and **Johnny Hekker** is up for the Ray Guy Award.

**TEAM CAPTAINS:** By a vote of the team, this year's team captains are seniors **Keaton Kristick**, **Sean Canfield**, **Lyle Moevao**, **Gregg Peat** and junior **Stephen Paea**.

**WALK-ONS:** Wide receiver Mike Hass (2005 Biletnikoff Award winner) was one; placekicker Alexis Serna (2005 Groza Award recipient) was one; punter **Johnny Hekker** (2008 Sun Bowl Special Teams MVP) was one; quarterback Jonathan Smith (2001 Fiesta Bowl Off. MVP) was one. That is just a small sample of walkons at Oregon State that had or having great careers at Oregon State. This season opened with former walkons **Mike Remmers** (RT) and **Damola Adeniji** (WR) starting, and current walkon **Grant Johnson** (LG). Senior receiver/holder/punt returner **Taylor Kavanaugh** also was a walkon until recently and Adeniji learned he had earned a scholarship on Sept. 4, the eve of the season opener.

**OH BROTHER (S):** The Beavers have a FBS high five sets of brothers on the team. The **LaGrones** (Matt and Josh), **Krebs**' (Kameron and Kaulin), **Rodgers**' (Jacquizz and James), **Watkins**' (Anthony and Brian) and **'Ungas** (Devin and Kevin). Virginia Tech has four sets of brothers.

**NOT A FREQUENT FLYER MILE TEAM:** The Beavers will stay close to the dam this year as the team does not have a road game that is played outside of the Pacific Time Zone (Oct. 3 at Arizona State is a Pacific Time game). The last time that happened was 2003 – since the program has made trips to LSU, Boise State (twice), Louisville, Penn State, Utah, Hawai'i, Cincinnati, Arizona (in 2002) and two Sun Bowl appearances in El Paso.

**RECORD-SETTING NFL DRAFT FOR OSU:** Oregon State had its best-ever showing in April's NFL Draft when seven former players were selected. The selections of Andy Levitre (2nd - Buffalo Bills), Keenan Lewis (3rd - Pittsburgh Steelers), Victor Butler (4th - Dallas Cowboys), Slade Norris (4th - Oakland Raiders), Brandon Hughes (5th - San Diego Chargers), Al Afalava (6th - Chicago Bears), Sammie Stroughter (7th - Tampa Bay Buccaneers) amounted to a tie for the second-most (Ohio State) players taken from a single school in the 2009 draft ... With those seven additions to the league, there are now 21 former Beavers playing in the NFL.
