MATTA COACHES GAME 400

Thad Matta has a career record of 310-91 (401 career games) over 12 years as a head coach, which includes a 208-60 record in eight seasons at Ohio State. Matta coached for one season at Butler and three at Xavier before taking over the Ohio State program for the 2004-05 season. In his time with the Buckeyes, Matta has four Big Ten regular season titles and three Big Ten tournament crowns. The Buckeyes have been to five NCAA tournaments with Matta at the helm. He has taken nine teams to NCAA tournament play and won the 2008 National Invitational Tournament with Ohio State.

BUCKEYES ACHIEVE 2ND PERFECT HOME SEASON UNDER MATTA

Thad Matta has won at least 15 home games in each of his seven seasons in Columbus. The 2006-07 squad finished with a perfect 18-0 record while the 2005-06 (16-1) and 2009-10 teams (17-1) squads each finished with a single loss at home. Matta is 134-10 overall in Columbus during his tenure after finishing the 2010-11 season 20-0 at home.

HOMECOURT ADVANTAGE

Since Thad Matta took over Buckeye program in 2004-05, Ohio State is 134-10 in Columbus, the most home wins among Big Ten schools. Over the last three seasons Ohio State is 52-1 in Columbus.

MATTA HAS BEST RECORD SINCE 2004-05

Since taking over the Ohio State program for the start of the 2004-05 season, Thad Matta has the Big Ten's best overall record with a winning percentage of 78 percent. He also has directed the Buckeyes to the most regular-season conference wins with 91 and most overall wins with 208.

BUFORD REACHES 100 WINS AS A BUCKEYE

Senior William Buford reached career win No. 100 as a Buckeye at Iowa Jan. 7. David Lighty (2007-11) holds the Ohio State record for wins with 129. Walk-ons Mark Titus and Danny Peters were part of Ohio State's program for 110 victories over their careers (2007-10). The four-year record for victories by scholarship players was originally set by Jamar Butler and Matt Terwilliger from 2005-08 with 105. The 2009 team had 107 wins from 2006-09 but there were no four-year seniors on that squad.

SULLINGER NAMED BIG PLAYER OF THE WEEK

Sophomore Jared Sullinger was named the Big Ten Player of the Week Jan. 9 after averaging a double-double in wins over Nebraska and Iowa with 23.5 points and 10.0 rebounds per game. He recorded 19 points and 12 rebounds in Ohio State's 71-40 win over Nebraska before pouring in 28 points, eight rebounds and four steals in the Buckeyes' 76-47 road win at Iowa. This is Sullinger's fifth career Player of the Week award and first this season.

CRAFT IN TOP 20 FOR COUSY AWARD

Sophomore Aaron Craft is among 20 candidates for the Bob Cousy Award after the list was trimmed from an initial pool of 60 candidates. The annual honor, named for Hall of Famer and former Boston Celtic Bob Cousy, recognizes the top point guards in college basketball. This current list of candidates will be narrowed down to a final 10 by Feb. 1 and final five by March 1. Craft currently leads the Buckeyes in assists (105) and steals (50).

THE BUCKEYES IN THE BIG TEN

The Buckeyes rank No. 2 in both scoring offense (78.0 ppg.) and scoring defense (55.9 ppg.) after a 18-3 overall start. Ohio State's scoring margin of 22.0 ppg. leads the league while the .494 field goal shooting percentage rates in the No. 2 spot. Led by Jared Sullinger, Ohio State is among the Top 2 teams in rebounding offense (37.2 rpg., No. 2) and rebounding defense (29.7 rpg., No. 1). Overall, the Buckeyes are No. 2 in rebound margin (+7.6 rpg.). Behind Aaron Craft, Ohio State is No. 2 in assists (16.7 apg.), No. 3 in steals (8.2 spg.) and No. 1 in turnover margin (+6.4) on the year among Big Ten teams.

100 YEARS IN BIG TEN

Ohio State celebrates 100 years as a member of the Big Ten Conference in men's basketball in 2012. The Buckeyes finished in the No. 6 spot in the 1913 conference standings, the first season of league play. Over the 99 previous seasons, Ohio State has earned 19 Big Ten regular-season titles with 23 NCAA tournament appearances, one national championship (1960) and nine trips to the Final Four. Eight former coaches and players are members

OHIO STATE VS. MICHIGAN

Ohio State owns the lead in the all-time series vs. Michigan 90-71. The Buckeyes are 51-26 vs. the Wolverines in Columbus. Ohio State has won the last five overall and 14 of the last 16 in the series. Michigan has lost its last seven games in Columbus. As a ranked team, the Buckeyes are 32-4 vs. Michigan. When the Wolverines are ranked, Ohio State is 12-22 vs. Michigan. When both teams carry an Associated Press Top 25 ranking into the game, Ohio State is 4-2. Ohio State has won the last 11 games vs. Michigan as a ranked team. The last time both teams were ranked at the same time was Feb. 9, 2006, a 94-84 win in Ann Arbor for the Buckeyes. Ohio State was ranked 19th in that game. Michigan was No. 22. The Buckeyes are currently ranked No. 4. Michigan comes in at No. 20. In 11 of the last 14 games in which Ohio State has entered the game ranked, the Buckeyes have been among the Top 5 nationally. In three games last season vs. Michigan, Jared Sullinger averaged

LAST TIME VS. MICHIGAN

Jared Sullinger had 14 points and 13 rebounds as Ohio State advanced with a 68-61 victory over rival Michigan in the Big Ten semifinals. Jon Diebler scored 16 points and William Buford had 14 for the Buckeyes. The Wolverines were led by Darius Morris with 16 points and Tim Hardaway Jr. with 15. Michigan got as close as 47-45 with 9:51 left, but the Buckeyes answered with 16 straight points and held off a late charge that got the Wolverines within four in the final minute. Since losing two of three in mid-February, the Buckeyes had reeled off six straight wins. It looked as though Ohio State had put the game away when Buford hit a 15-footer to end an 11-0 run that gave Ohio State a 38-27 lead early in the second half. But Morris rallied the Wolverines. They used an 8-2 run to get within 47-45. Ohio State answered quickly. Sullinger opened the decisive spurt with a 5-foot jumper and a free throw, and by the time it ended, the Buckeyes had scored 16 straight points to make it 63-45. The Wolverines scored 13 straight points in the closing minutes, getting as close as 65-61 with 21.4 seconds to go. But Ohio State made three of its last four free throws to finally seal it. The Buckeyes won all three meetings against the Wolverines last season.

"Everybody loves to be around him, he's got personality and he's got bounce. He's unselfish ... he's arguably a leading candidate for National Player of the Year ... THOMAS NAMED BIG PLAYER OF WEEK

Ohio State sophomore Deshaun Thomas made 17-consecutive shots from inside the 3-point line in games vs. South Carolina Upstate (Dec. 14) and at South Carolina (Dec. 17). He made his last six attempts against S.C. Upstate and then all 11 2-pointers in the road win at South Carolina. For the season he is shooting 62 percent from 2-point range (101-162). He was 19-21 from short range the week of Dec. 12 while shooting 74 percent overall (23-31), including a 13-16 shooting effort at South Carolina, where he tallied a career-high 30 points. He averaged 26.5 points in the two games. His efforts earned him the Big Ten Player of the Week honor. The last Ohio State player to earn the honor was Jon Diebler March 7, 2011. Thomas was named the league's freshman of the week once last season.

THE THIRD TO 200 AS A BUCKEYE

Two previous coaches have reached the 200-win plateau at Ohio State. Thad Matta became the third with the 74-66 win at South Carolina Dec. 17. Fred Taylor recorded 297 career victories from 1959-1976 while also earning 158 Big Ten Conference regular-season victories. Harold G. Olsen tallied 259 all-time wins from 1923-46. He accumulated 154 Big Ten victories. Matta has 208 wins as a Buckeye over eight seasons with 91 wins in Big Ten regular-season play. His winning percentage of 77.6 overall and 71.1 in conference play are tops among the 13 head coaches in Ohio State history.

ROSS RETURNS TO OHIO STATE ROSTER

LaQuinton Ross, a 6-foot-8-inch freshman forward from Jackson, Miss., was added to the Ohio State roster for the remainder of his freshman season. Ross attended classes and worked out with the Buckeyes over the summer before leaving the team just prior to the start of official practice in October to work on meeting NCAA academic qualification

Thad Matta has directed Ohio State to at least 10 wins during non-conference play in each of his eight seasons in Columbus. MATTA OWNS TOP WIN PERCENTAGE AMONG OHIO STATE COACHES

Thad Matta, now in his eighth season as head coach of the Buckeyes, has an overall win percentage of 77.6 (208-60) at Ohio State. That winning mean is the highest among the 11 head coaches in the history of the Ohio State men's basketball program with three or more seasons on the sidelines. Matta's 91-37 (128 games) record in Big Ten regular-season play (.711) also has produced the highest winning pct. in conference play among any previous Ohio State coach. He also became the 16th player all-time to reach both 1,500 points and the 500-rebound mark (570) with five boards vs. Duke Nov. 29.

SULLINGER MOVING UP CAREER DOUBLE-DOUBLE CHARTS

Sophomore Jared Sullinger has recorded at least 10 points and 10 rebounds in nine games this season for a career total of 27. He tied the Ohio State freshman record with 18 double-doubles a season ago. His career total is tied for 11th all-time. Evan Turner was the most recent Buckeye to reach 20 or more career double-doubles with 27 from 2008-10. That total is tied for No. 11 all-time with John Havlicek (1960-62). Through 19 games, Sullinger is averaging 17.2 points and 9.3 rebounds a game. He tallied 17.2 points and 10.2 rebounds a game as a freshman.

BUCKEYES OPENED WITH EIGHT AT HOME

The Buckeyes played the last of their first eight games at home, the longest streak of home games to start a season since the 1909-10 team began the campaign with 10-consecutive games in Columbus, vs. UTPA Dec. 3. That run was the longest to start a season since the opening of Value City Arena for the 1998-99 season. The Buckeyes opened with six at home (6-0) in 2006-07 at VCA and seven games (5-2) at St. John Arena in 1997-98. The Buckeyes made their first road trip of the season this year to Kansas Dec. 10.

SULLINGER CLOSING ON 1,000 POINT CLUB

Jerry Lucas reached the 1,000 point total in just 38 games. It took Michael Redd 49 contests. Jared Sullinger has played in 56 games to date with 963 points to his credit for an average of 17.2 a game. Only six players in history have reached 1,000 career points in fewer than 60 games played.

- Buford had nine rebounds to push his career total to 570. He is one of 17 former Buckeyes in the prestigious 1,500 point and 500 rebound club.
- Buford has scored in double figures 17 times this season and 95 times in his career, including 58 games with at least 15 points.
- Buford became the fifth player in Ohio State history to join the 400 (made field goals) and 4,000 (minutes played) Club. After the Penn State game, Buford has now tallied 657 made field goals and 4,079 minutes played in 127 career games (J. Diebler, D. Lighty, J. Butler and H. Williams are the other Buckeyes to achieve this feat).
- Buford had two assists in the game for a career total of 327. He has had at least three assists in 17 games this season. This was the fifth game he has had at least five assists.
- Sullinger had 20 points for the Buckeyes. It is the 18th time this season and 52nd time in his career he has scored in double figures.
- With 20 points, Sullinger is 36 from joining the 1,000 point club.
- Sullinger had 13 rebounds, pushing his career total to 553.
- With 20 points and 13 rebounds, Sullinger

BUCKEYES 20-WIN STREAK LEADS B1G

The 34 wins recorded in 2010-11 extended Ohio State's streak of 20-win seasons to seven, the longest active streak in the Big Ten. Thad Matta has recorded at least 20 wins in every year as a head coach (11).

earned his ninth double-double of the season and 27th of his career. It was his 14th double-double vs. a Big Ten opponent.

- Aaron Craft had 11 points. It is the ninth time this season he has scored in double figures.
 - Craft had three assists to push his season total to 105 and his career total to 282. He has had at least three in 20 of his previous 21 games played. \
- Craft passed the 200-point mark in B1G games. With 11 points, he has now scored 210 points in conference action.
- Sam Thompson tied a career high with three assists (3X).
 - Amir Williams had three blocks in his first three minutes in the game.

MATTA LOOKS FOR ANOTHER 20-WIN SEASON

For each of the last 11 seasons, all as a head coach, Thad Matta has guided teams to at least 20 victories. Only Mark Few, among active coaches, has more consecutive 20-win seasons to start a career (12). Matta set the Ohio State record for consecutive 20-win campaigns in 2008-09 with a 22-11 record and extended it with a 34-3 campaign in 2010-11, the seventh-consecutive Ohio State season with 20+ victories. The previous record was four held by the 1960-63 teams under legendary head coach Fred Taylor. Matta also has won at least 10 Big Ten regular-season games in each of the last six seasons. That effort eclipsed Taylor's mark of 10+ league wins in each of the seasons from 1960-64. Those were during 14-game regular-season slates. The Big Ten played a 16-game schedule in Matta's first three seasons (8, 12, 15 league wins) and an 18-game schedule the last four (10, 10, 14, 16). Ohio State also is the two-time defending Big Ten regular-season champion. The last time the Buckeyes won three or more consecutive titles was from 1960-64, a string of five-consecutive conference crowns.

BUCKEYES SET RECORD FOR HOME WINS

Ohio State finished 20-0 at home after its win vs. Wisconsin March 6, 2011. The win total set the school record for home wins and a Value City Arena record with a 19-0 record. The 2006-07 squad previously set the VCA record with 18 wins in a season. The Buckeyes played one game last year at St. John Arena. Ohio State currently is on a 37-game home win streak, tied for the second-longest home win streak in school history. The Buckeyes again have 20 scheduled home games in 2011-12 with 19 played at VCA and one at Nationwide Arena (Dec. 22 vs. Miami (Ohio)). The game at Nationwide satisfies an NCAA requirement for the host school of the NCAA Second and Third Rounds (March 16, 18, 2012) to play at least one game at the NCAA tournament site.

400 AND 4,000 CLUB

Senior William Buford has scored 657 career field goals and logged 4,079 career minutes in 127 games. He joined a small group of former Buckeyes with more than 400 field goals and 4,000 minutes played. David Lighty was added to an exclusive club following the game vs. Illinois Jan. 22, 2011. The former Buckeye reached 4,000 minutes played with more than 400 field goals in the Illinois win in Champaign. Lighty made 516 career field goals and logged 4,582 career minutes during his 157-game career. Lighty's classmate Jon Diebler had 473 made baskets (374 of which are 3s) while playing a total of 4,687 minutes in 144 games. He reached 400/4,000 with a triple and 36 minutes vs. Iowa Jan. 19.

Herb Williams and Jamar Butler also logged 4,000+ minutes at Ohio State. Williams made 834 career field goals over 114 games and 4,216 minutes. Butler connected on 420 FGs (242 3FGs) over 139 games and 4,213 minutes played.

BUFORD JOINS TURNER, JACKSON, LIGHTY

Evan Turner (1,517 pts., 682 rebs., 414 asts.) became just the second player in recorded history to reach 1,000 points, 500 rebounds and 300 assists with eight helpers vs. Northwestern Jan. 19, 2010. Jim Jackson was the only other Buckeye to do so with 1,785 career points, 552 career rebounds and 372 career assists from 1990-92. David Lighty joined the duo last season. He finished with 1,458 points, 577 rebounds and 374 assists to his credit. Only 22 players in Ohio State history have scored more than 1,000 points and collected 500+ rebounds. Lighty was added to the list with five rebounds vs. Iowa Jan. 19. William Buford currently has 1,743 points, 570 rebounds and 327 assists. He handed out four assists vs. Miami (Ohio) to join the quartet.

DOUBLE DIGIT 3S

Ohio State has made 10 or more 3-pointers in a game 79 times since the shot was instituted for the 1986-87 season. The Buckeyes are 68-11 in those games after knocking down 10-of-20 treys vs. Northwestern Dec. 28. Opponents have made double-digit 3s 92 times and are 37-55 in those games vs. the Buckeyes. Matta's Ohio State teams are 53-9 when making 10 or more 3s in a game. Opponents are 9-29 against Matta-coached teams when making 10 or more treys.

SULLINGER EARNS ALL-AMERICA HONORS

The *Associated Press* is the latest (Oct. 31) to select Ohio State sophomore Jared Sullinger as a 2011-12 preseason first team All-American. The Columbus, Ohio, native was a 2011 All-American as well after averaging 17 points and 10 rebounds as a rookie. Those numbers helped earn Sullinger the 2011 National Freshman of the Year award following Ohio State's 34-3 overall record a year ago.

BIG TEN MEDIA PICK BUCKEYES, SULLINGER

Ohio State was picked as the preseason favorite to win the league regular-season title by a vote of the conference media (Oct. 27). Sophomore Jared Sullinger also was tabbed as the favorite to earn conference player-of-the-year accolades. He also was selected to represent Ohio State on the preseason all-conference squad. Ohio State has won back-to-back league titles and is in position to win a third-consecutive title for the first time since the Buckeyes won five-consecutive titles from 1960-64. The last Buckeye to enter the season as the player of the year selection was guard Scoonie Penn before the 1999-2000 campaign.

JENT RETURNS TO OHIO STATE SIDELINE

Chris Jent left the professional ranks to return to his alma mater as an assistant basketball coach. Jent, who played and coached at the NBA level, played for the Buckeyes from 1988-92 and coached most recently for the Cleveland Cavaliers. As an Ohio State player, he helped the Buckeyes to back-to-back Big Ten titles and three-consecutive appearances in the NCAA tournament. He spent 10 seasons in the professional ranks overseas, in the CBA and NBA. He was an assistant and interim head coach with the Orlando Magic before most recently coaching with the Cavaliers.

BUFORD WORKING ON RECORD SEASON

William Buford is the lone senior on the Ohio State roster this season. In fact, he is just one of two upperclassmen and the only player with more than a year of experience in an Ohio State uniform. After transfer Evan Ravenel, who transferred to Ohio State from Boston College and sat out the 2010-11 campaign, there are 11 freshmen (5) and sophomores (6) on the Ohio State roster. Buford has 1,743 career points over 127 career games (13.7 ppg.). Dennis Hopson (1984-87) is the all-time leading scorer in Ohio State history with 2,096 points over 125 career games played (16.8 ppg.). Buford is currently No. 8 spot on the Ohio State all-time scoring list.

Game 1 No. 3 Ohio State 73, Wright State 42

Nov. 11, 2011, Columbus

COLUMBUS-Preseason All-America Jared Sullinger had 19 points and nine rebounds to lead Ohio State to a 73-42 victory over Wright State in the Global Sports Shootout. William Buford had nine of his 13 points to lead a second-half charge for the Buckeyes. Point guard Aaron Craft had 10 points and just one turnover in 28 minutes in the opener for both teams. A.J. Pachter had 13 points and Reggie Arceneaux added 11 for Wright State. Ohio State was 26 of 38 at the free-throw line compared to Wright State being 10 of 15. Up by 14 at halftime, the Buckeyes pulled away on field goals by Buford, Deshaun Thomas and Sullinger to push the lead to 40-20. Buford, the Buckeyes' second-leading scorer last season, added two more field goals in the 10-0 run. The lead hovered around 30 points for most of the second half as both teams emptied their benches. The Buckeyes led 34-20 at halftime with Sullinger picking up nine of his 13 points at the line. Wright State had 16 turnovers at halftime and finished with 25. Ohio State never trailed from the moment Craft hit a 3-pointer from the right corner to open the scoring. Ahead just 19-14 after the Raiders' John Balwigaire hit a 3-pointer at the 8:26 mark, the Buckeyes went on a 13-3 run over the next 6 minutes with Sullinger scoring six points. The loudest roar of the game from a crowd of 15,645 at Value City Arena came on a backdoor, alley-oop dunk by J.D. Weatherpoon off a pass by Buford.

Notes:

- The Buckeyes are 91-18 in home openers and 87-22 in season openers all-time after defeating Wright State.
- Ohio State is now 3-0 vs. Wright State and is 55-11 all-time vs. members of the Horizon League. The most recent meeting between the Buckeyes and Raiders took place Dec. 16, 1992 in Columbus; a 76-55 Ohio State victory. Ohio State has faced all 10 current Horizon League members.
- The win vs. WSU was the 100th win for an unranked opponent in Value City Arena.
- The win was the 23rd-consecutive victory at home for Ohio State, dating back to a 66-55 win over Michigan Feb. 27, 2010. It's the fourth longest streak in Buckeye history
- Five newcomers made their collegiate debut in the win vs. Wright State. Freshmen Shannon Scott, Sam Thompson, Trey McDonald and Amir Williams along with transfer Evan Ravenel all put on the Scarlet and Gray for the first time.
- Thad Matta now owns a record of 12-0 in season openers as a head coach. He was 1-0 at Butler, 3-0 at Xavier and is 8-0 at Ohio State.
- William Buford scored 13 points for the Buckeyes, improving his career total to 1,437, passing Paul Ebert (1,136) for 21st place all-time in Ohio State career scoring. He is four behind Bill Hoskett (1,441), for 20th place.
- Buford was 1-3 from behind the 3-point arc to improve his career 3-point field goals made to 154, which is third in Ohio State history.
- The start was Buford's 99th donning the Scarlet and Gray.
- Sullinger had 19 points to lead the Buckeyes in scoring. It is the 35th time he has scored in double figures in his career.

Game 2 No. 3 Ohio State 81, No. 7 Florida 74

Nov. 15, 2011, Columbus

COLUMBUS-William Buford scored 21 points and No. 3 Ohio State weathered Florida's fast start to beat the seventh-ranked Gators 81-74. Jared Sullinger added 16 points, Deshaun Thomas had 15 and Aaron Craft 13 points and seven assists for the Buckeyes, who forced 16 turnovers and hit 27 of 34 free throws to pull away in the second half. Freshman Bradley Beal had 17 points, Kenny Boynton 15 and Patric Young and Erik Murphy 14 apiece for the Gators, who have never beaten a top-3 team in a true road game. Down as much as 16 points, they got as close as five with under a minute left before Buford sealed it with two foul shots. The game matched teams that won their conferences a year ago but were trying to replace three lost starters. By scoring 13 of 18 points at the end of the half, the Buckeyes took a 35-32 lead. With Sullinger controlling the lane, Buford scoring from both outside and inside, and Craft seeming to get a hand on every Florida pass and have a hand on every Ohio State assist, they pulled away. They scored the first five points of the half for an eight-point edge and never let the Gators cut into the lead. Still, Sullinger picked up his third foul with 13:58 left and soon after headed to the bench. With Evan Ravenel filling in and Buford and Craft setting the pace on offense, the Buckeyes didn't blink at the loss of their preseason All-American.

Notes:

- Ohio State is now 8-4 vs. Florida and is 32-27 all-time vs. members of the Southeastern Conference (SEC).
- The Buckeyes are 5-0 all-time vs. Florida in Columbus.
- The game was the first time since 2007 Ohio State has faced a Top 10 ranked team (No. 1 North Carolina, 11/28/07).
- The last time Ohio State faced a ranked non-conference opponent in Columbus was 1/3/07 (No. 5 Ohio State 68, No. 16 Tennessee 66).
- This is the first time since 12/22/60 that a Top 10 Ohio State team has faced Top 10 ranked non-conference opponent in Columbus (No. 1 Ohio State 84, No. 8 Detroit 73).
- The start was William Buford's 100th donning the Scarlet and Gray.

Game 3 No. 3 Ohio State 85, Jackson State 41

Nov. 18, 2011, Columbus

COLUMBUS-Jared Sullinger had 20 points and 11 rebounds in little more than a half and No. 3-ranked Ohio State used an 18-0 blitz to roll to an 85-41 victory over Jackson State. Deshaun Thomas, William Buford and Jordan Sibert each had 11 points for the Buckeyes. All 12 players on the roster saw action, with 11 scoring and all 12 grabbing at least one rebound. Kelsey Howard scored 17 points for Jackson State, which had 26 turnovers. Down 11-10 in the first half, the Buckeyes scored the next 18 points and never looked back. The Tigers are being outscored by 36 points a game so far this season. The Buckeyes scored 32 of the first 45 points in the second half while substituting liberally. Sullinger had 16 points and 10 rebounds at the break as the Buckeyes built a 29-point lead. He finished 7 of 9 from the field and 6 of 7 at the line. The Tigers still led by a point after 6 minutes, but then the Buckeyes turned the game into a dunk-a-thon. With the Buckeyes picking up 23 points off of Jackson State's turnovers, they took control and never looked back to build a 46-17 lead at the half. The turning point was the 18-0 run covering a 5-minute span with Sullinger scoring nine points and Jordan Sibert adding five. Aaron Craft only had two points in the spurt, but the Buckeyes' guard forced five turnovers and had two assists. He finished with four assists, five steals and one bucket in 17 minutes, and helped turn the game into a rout.

Notes:

- This was the first meeting between Ohio State and Jackson State. The Buckeyes improve to 4-0 all-time vs. members of the Southwestern Athletic Conference (SWAC).
- The 44 point margin-of-victory is the largest of the season and biggest since 12/27/10, when Ohio State def. UT Martin 100-40.
- This is the 265th-consecutive game Ohio State has made at least one 3-point field goal (1/10/04 vs. Penn State was the last game with zero made).
- Ohio State has now had a player record a double-double in 825 games. The Buckeyes are 566-259 in those contests. Jared Sullinger had his 19th career double-double (20 points, 11 rebounds) vs. Jackson State.

The Buckeyes were in the bonus for the final 15 minutes. The game was part of the Global Sports Shootout. The Buckeyes didn't play crisply in the opening half, yet still maintained a 45-26 lead. They missed their first four free throws and first three shots from the field. But, as usual, their defense helped provide points. The Ospreys were guilty of turning over the ball - 13 times in the opening half, leading to 16 points. Meanwhile, the Buckeyes had just four turnovers and North Florida didn't get a point off of those mistakes. Up 24-19, Ohio State went on an 11-2 run with Sullinger scoring five points and Thomas hitting two buckets.

Game 5 No. 3 Ohio State 107, VMI 74

Nov. 23, 2011, Columbus

COLUMBUS-William Buford scored 23 points and Jared Sullinger added 17 points and 12 rebounds to lead No. 3 Ohio State past VMI 107-74. Aaron Craft had 13 points and eight assists, Deshaun Thomas 11 points and J.D. Weatherspoon 10 points for the Buckeyes, who shot 68 percent from the field. Buford, the only senior on Ohio State's roster, had hit just 8 of 23 field-goal attempts in Ohio State's last two games and was shooting just 41.7 percent from the field on the season. He made 10 of 16 shots from the field, including both 3-point attempts and his only foul shot. Keith Gabriel led VMI with 21 points, with Ron Burks adding 19 and Stan Okoye 12. The Keydets were playing their first ranked opponent since a 107-69 loss to then-No. 4 Ohio State Nov. 10, 2006. That Buckeyes team went on to the national championship game before falling to defending NCAA champion Florida, 84-75. The Keydets, who prefer a fast-paced game, came in averaging 88.2 points a game (allowing 82) while pumping up a shot every 34 seconds. Early on, the Buckeyes beat them at their own game by hurrying back against the press for easy baskets. Sullinger made all four first-half field-goals, all from within a step of the basket. They finished 46 of 68 from the field for 68 percent, hit half of their 10 3-point attempts and were 10 of 17 at the line. Ohio State led by 13 at the half after shooting 70 percent from the field in the opening 20 minutes.

Notes:

- The win was the 27th-consecutive victory at home for Ohio State, dating back to a 66-55 win over Michigan Feb. 27, 2010. It is the fourth-longest streak in Buckeye history. Ohio State is one win away from tying the 2006-07 Buckeyes for the third-longest streak in history.
- The Buckeyes move to 3-0 all-time vs. VMI. The Buckeyes improve to 13-0 all-time vs. members of the Big South Conference. As a ranked team Ohio State is 400-108 overall and when ranked in the AP Top 10, the Buckeyes are 279-59.
- The game vs. VMI was the 72nd time in Ohio State history the Buckeyes have scored more than 100 points and 52nd time at home. The Scarlet and Gray are 71-1 in those contests, including a perfect 52-0 at home.
- The 30 assists are tied for the second most in a game in Ohio State history and first since Chicago State, 12/8/90. 31 is the record (Michigan State, 1/6/75).
- The 57 points in the first half were a season high (46 vs. Jackson State).
- Ohio State shot an impressive 69.7 percent from the field in the first half and 67.6 percent for the game.
- Ohio State began the second half on a 21-4 run to pull ahead 78-48.
- The 107 points scored by Ohio State is a season high (85 vs. North Florida, 11/21/11).
- The 46 made field goals are a season high (34 vs. Jackson St., 11/18/11).
- The 30 assists were a season high (22 vs. Jackson St., 11/18/11) and the most since the Buckeyes produced 29 vs. Alcorn State in 2009.

Game 6 No. 3 Ohio State 80, Valparaiso 47

Nov. 25, 2011, Columbus

COLUMBUS-William Buford scored 17 of his 25 points in the second half and No. 3 Ohio State routed Valparaiso 80-47. Aaron Craft added 15 points and eight assists for the Buckeyes. Jared Sullinger had 14 points and 13 rebounds and Deshaun Thomas chipped in with 12 points. Jay Harris led the Crusaders with 18 points. Buford had four points in Ohio State's 19-2 surge right after the break. Ohio State had just six turnovers and scored 24 points off of Valparaiso's 18 miscues. The Crusaders also shot just 34 percent from the field against Ohio State's opportunistic defense. Kevin Van Wijk, a 6-foot-8 post from the Netherlands, came in averaging 17.8 points a game but was held scoreless with four fouls. No. 2 scorer Ryan Broekhoff was averaging 15.5 points and had just seven. The game clearly tilted at the outset of the second half. The Buckeyes brought a four-point lead into the final 20 minutes, but they quickly asserted themselves at both ends of the floor. The Crusaders had the ball first via alternate possession, but Craft came in out of nowhere to steal the ball out of Van Wijk's hands when he was about to score on a backdoor pass. Sullinger then popped out for a 15-foot jumper and the Buckeyes were off and running. Lenzelle Smith Jr. hit a 15-footer, then assisted on a Buford layup before Buford passed inside to Sullinger for another bucket. After Broekhoff hit a driving layup to break the ice for the Crusaders.

- The win was the 28th-consecutive victory at home for Ohio State, dating back to a 66-55 win over Michigan Feb. 27, 2010. The 28 wins in a row tie the 2006-07 Buckeyes for the third-longest streak in history.
- The Buckeyes move to 2-0 all-time vs. Valpo. The Buckeyes improve to 55-11 all-time vs. members of the Horizon League.
- The Buckeyes limited Valpo to 1-2 shooting from the free throw line.
- Ohio State held Valpo to a season low 33.9 percent from the field, including just 22.6 percent in the second half (7-31 shooting).
- Before scoring just 47 points vs. Ohio State, Valpo's previous season low was 62.
- William Buford scored 25 points for the Buckeyes, improving his career total to 1,530, passing Evan Turner (1,517) for 16th place, Tony Campbell (1,529) for 15th and tying Gary Bradds (1,530) for 14th all-time in Ohio State career scoring. He is six behind John Diebler (1,536) for 13th place.

Nov. 29, 2011, Columbus

COLUMBUS-Jared Sullinger scored 21 points and three teammates were close behind as No. 2 Ohio State roared out to an 11-0 lead and never looked back in beating third-ranked Duke 85-63 in the ACC/Big Ten Challenge. The Buckeyes never trailed, weathering a Duke rally later in the first half and then leading by 20 for most of the second half. Austin Rivers had 22 points and Mason Plumlee 16 for the Blue Devils. William Buford scored 20, Deshaun Thomas 18 and Aaron Craft 17 for the Buckeyes. Craft also had eight assists and five rebounds for the Buckeyes, who built a double-digit lead in the first half and were never really threatened the rest of the way. They led by 24 with 15 minutes left after Craft banked in a 3. The Blue Devils responded with a 7-0 run to get as close as 58-41 but Ohio State continued to control the paint. Sullinger was fouled and hit two foul shots, then powered up a shot off the backboard for a 66-43 lead shortly before clock trouble allowed both teams to take a breather with 8:42 remaining. On consecutive possessions, Ohio State got a dunk by Sullinger and a 3 by Craft thanks to around-the-horn passing that found an open player. It was a festive, capacity crowd of 18,809 at Value City Arena. The half was a shocker, with Ohio State setting the pace early, struggling aside a Duke comeback and then pulling away for a gaping 47-28 lead at the break.

Notes:

- The win vs. Duke was the 29th-consecutive victory at home for Ohio State, dating back to a 66-55 win over Michigan Feb. 27, 2010. It's the third longest home win streak in Ohio State history.
- The ESPN televised game averaged a 2.6 rating and 3,422,000 viewers, ESPN's highest-rated and most-viewed Big Ten/ACC Challenge game ever.
- With the win, Ohio State has now defeated two AP Top 10 non-conference opponents at home this season for the first time in history.
- The Buckeyes move to 3-3 all-time vs. Duke and improve to 38-26 all-time vs. members of the ACC.
- Ohio State moved to 5-5 in the ACC/Big Ten Challenge with four consecutive wins.
- The Buckeyes began the first half on an 11-0 run and ended the opening 20 minutes on a 13-2 run.
- In the first half, Ohio State scored on every offensive rebound (10 points on five rebounds).
- Ohio State ended Duke's November win streak. Duke's last loss in November was in 2006 vs. Marquette.
- The loss vs. Ohio State was only Coach Krzyzewski's 16th in 65 career games vs. Big Ten opponents.
- The loss vs. Ohio State was Duke's worst vs. a Big Ten school since losing by 25 vs. Michigan State during the 1958-59 season.
- With the win, Matta has now defeated the Top 2 winningest coaches in men's Division I history. Matta previously defeated Bob Knight's Texas Tech team on 12/16/04 in Dallas, Texas, 77-71.
- With the win, Ohio State is 39-5 in November under Coach Matta.
- Matta is now 1-1 vs. Duke and 5-3 in the ACC/Big Ten Challenge.

Game 8 No. 2 Ohio State 64, Texas-Pan American 35

Dec. 3, 2011, Columbus

COLUMBUS-Evan Ravenel scored a career-high 11 points in place of Jared Sullinger and No. 2 Ohio State beat Texas Pan-American 64-35 to give coach Thad Matta his 300th career win. Sullinger had back spasms during the Buckeyes' win over third-ranked Duke. Deshaun Thomas also had 11 points for the Buckeyes. He is 300-88 over 12 seasons, the last eight at Ohio State where he is 198-57. Jared Maree scored 13 points for the Broncs. Ravenel, a transfer from Boston College, also tied a career high with 7 rebounds. Ohio State took a 31-14 lead into halftime when Aaron Craft hit a looping runner at the buzzer. The Buckeyes shot 46 percent from the floor while the Broncs shot 25 percent and had nearly as many turnovers (11) as attempts (16). The Buckeyes also extended home court winning streak to 30 games, tied for the second-longest in Ohio State history. The game vs. the Broncs was the final of eight-consecutive home games for the Buckeyes to start the 2011-12 season.

Game 9 No. 13 Kansas 78, No. 2 Ohio State 67

Dec. 10, 2011, Columbus

LAWRENCE, Kan.-Thomas Robinson scored 21 points, Elijah Johnson added 15 and No. 13 Kansas never trailed in a 78-67 victory over second-ranked Ohio State, which played without star forward Jared Sullinger, who was out with back spasms. Freshman forward Kevin Young came off the bench to score a career-high 14 points, and Tyshawn Taylor had nine points and a career-best 13 assists for the Jayhawks, who extended their winning streak to 47 games over non-conference opponents at Allen Fieldhouse. William Buford had 17 of his 21 points in the second half for Ohio State, which was playing on the road for the first time this season. Deshaun Thomas added 19 points. The Buckeyes were missing Sullinger, a preseason All-American, for the second straight game because of back spasms. He tried to get his back stretched out before the game but didn't participate in the shoot-around, ultimately spending the afternoon on the bench in jeans and a sweater. It was a big loss for the Buckeyes. Not only does Sullinger average better than 19 points and 10 rebounds, he also would have been tasked with guarding Robinson, another All-America candidate. Robinson was quiet much of the first half, but he came through down the stretch, scoring 10 of his points in the final four minutes to help wrap up the win. Kansas wound up shooting 58.3 percent from the field, while the Buckeyes made 39 percent.

COLUMBUS-Deshaun Thomas scored 23 points and No. 2 Ohio State welcomed back star forward Jared Sullinger in an 82-58 victory over South Carolina Upstate. Sullinger took his time getting into the pace of the game, finishing with 12 points and 10 rebounds, his fifth double-double of the season, first off the bench and 23rd in his career. Torrey Craig had 20 points for Upstate. The win was Ohio State's 31st straight at home, the second-longest streak ever at the school behind only the 50 in a row from 1959-64 while Jerry Lucas, John Havlicek and Gary Bradds were the stars. That made it 47-36 and the lead never dropped below nine points again. It was Upstate which set the pace for most of the first half, playing sticky defense at one end and patiently distributing the ball at the other.

COLUMBIA, S.C.-Deshaun Thomas scored a career-high 30 points and No. 2 Ohio State overcame the loss of star Jared Sullinger to defeat South Carolina 74-66 and give Thad Matta his 200th win as Buckeyes coach. Sullinger left in the first half after getting kicked in the left foot. X-rays showed no fracture. Thomas hit 13 of 16 shots and surpassed his previous high of 24 points set last season against North Carolina A&T. William Buford added 17 points for Ohio State. Malik Cooke led South Carolina with 21 points. Matta, in his ninth season with Ohio State, became just the third coach in school history to reach 200 wins, joining Fred Taylor (279 wins 1959-76) and Harold G. Olsen (254 from 1923-46). Ohio State trailed 35-29 as Lakeem Jackson started the second half with all-too easy inside bucket. Then the Buckeyes began a 20-8 charge to take control. Thomas got the run started with a jumper. Lenzelle Smith Jr. had a basket and a 3-pointer to put Ohio State in front for good, 41-37. Thomas added a 3-pointer and finished the surge with a short jump shot for a 49-43 lead. The Buckeyes eventually built the lead to 11 points. South Carolina cut things to 70-63 in the in the final minute. But Buford answered with a 3-pointer with 48.2 seconds to go to restore Ohio State's edge.

- The Buckeyes move to 3-1 vs. South Carolina all-time and 33-27 all-time vs. members of the SEC.
- The win vs. South Carolina was Coach Thad Matta's 200th career win at Ohio State.
- Matta's career record moves to 302-89 overall and 200-58 at Ohio State.

COLUMBUS-Jared Sullinger bounced back from his latest injury to score 18 points and grab 11 rebounds, leading No. 2 Ohio State past Lamar 70-50. Deshaun Thomas, chosen as the Big Ten's player of the week, added 16 points for the Buckeyes. Devon Lamb and Stan Brown each had 10 points for Lamar. The win was Ohio State's 32nd straight at home, extending the second-longest streak in school history. Lamar coach Pat Knight's father, Hall of Fame coach Bob Knight, was honored at halftime with an alumni award. A 1962 graduate of Ohio State, he was a member of the 1960 team that won the school's only national championship. The Buckeyes trailed just once, 4-3, and slowly took over the game. A 3-pointer by Lenzelle Smith Jr. made it 6-4 and touched off an 11-2 run that put the Buckeyes in command to stay. Thomas hit a 3 from the left corner late in the half to give Ohio State a 34-21 lead. They maintained a double-figure lead the rest of the way while mixing in subs. Aaron Craft had his usual all-around game for Ohio State with four points, six assists and three steals. The Buckeyes improved to 77-2 against nonconference opponents in Columbus in coach Thad Matta's tenure. Bob Knight received a University Ambassador Medal, presented by the president and CEO of Ohio State's alumni association, two-time Heisman Trophy winner Archie Griffin.

COLUMBUS-- William Buford scored 18 points and Aaron Craft dominated at both ends as No. 2 Ohio State started fast and never looked back to beat Miami of Ohio 69-40. Deshaun Thomas added 15 points and Jared Sullinger 11 for the Buckeyes, who won their 33rd straight at home. The game was played at Nationwide Arena, home of the NHL's Blue Jackets. The building will host second- and third-round NCAA tournament games in March. Julian Mavunga led the RedHawks with 19 points and 10 rebounds. Craft had just four points but set the tempo at both ends with eight assists, two steals, three rebounds and several other plays that led to points. The Buckeyes ran off the first 11 points and never trailed. On their first possession, Buford fed Sullinger with a bounce pass behind the defender for an easy layup and Ohio State was off and running. Buford hit a 3, Thomas scored on fast-break layup, Sullinger scored again on a short jumper and Buford was on the receiving end of Craft's assist to make it 11-0. The RedHawks were scoreless for the first 4:16, missing their first four shots with two turnovers. After the Buckeyes hit five of their first six shots, they went into a malaise - missing 16 of the next 22. They led 26-17 at halftime, a lead that was narrowed to just seven after Josh Sewell hit a layup for the RedHawks to open the second half. But Ohio State sprinted away by scoring 15 of the next 17 points.

Game 14 No. 2 Ohio State 87, Northwestern 54 Dec. 28, 2011, Columbus

COLUMBUS-- William Buford had career-highs of 28 points and five 3-pointers as No. 2 Ohio State showed off its perimeter shooting in an 87-54 victory over Northwestern in the Big Ten opener for both teams. Jared Sullinger added 17 points and 14 rebounds for the Buckeyes, who dominated the boards 49-30. Deshaun Thomas had 16 points for Ohio State, which broke the game open with a 13-0 first-half run fueled by 3-pointers. Jordan Sibert added 12 points, all on 3s. The conference's top two scorers, John Shurna and Drew Crawford, were held below their averages. They were held to 11 and 13 points, respectively, on a combined 9-for-30 shooting. The loss was the 28th straight for the Wildcats in Columbus, dating to 1977. Ohio State came in 11th in the Big Ten in 3-pointers per game at 4.8. They had hit more than six in only one game, when they made 8 of 14 in the 85-63 defeat of then-No. 3 Duke on Nov. 29. Yet they were 7 of 14 behind the arc in the first half alone Wednesday to build a lead they never lost. The Buckeyes finished 10 of 20 on 3-pointers. Freshman point guard Dave Sobolewski had 10 points and five assists for the Wildcats, who were beginning a seven-game span in which they play five ranked teams. Northwestern, down by as many as 19 points in the first half, took advantage of foul trouble for Sullinger and point guard Aaron Craft which forced them to the bench early in the second half. The Wildcats kept the deficit in the 12- to 15-point range.

- The win vs. Northwestern was the 34th-consecutive victory at home for Ohio State dating back to the game vs. Michigan on Feb. 27, 2010. The streak is the third-longest in the country behind Duke and Kentucky.

- In its 100th year as a member of the Big Ten, Ohio State improves to 66-30 in conference season openers. The mark moves to 52-44 overall in Big Ten openers.
- The Buckeyes move to 110-45 all-time vs. Northwestern, having won four in a row in the series. The 110 wins are the most victories by Ohio State against any opponent in team history.
- In Columbus, Ohio State owns an impressive 64-14 mark vs. the Wildcats, including a 28-game home win streak. Northwestern's last victory in Columbus was an 83-72 win in St. John Arena on 2/24/77.
- As a ranked team, the Scarlet and Gray is 33-2 vs. Northwestern. Ohio State has won 13 consecutive as a ranked team in the series.
- The game vs. Northwestern was the 68th sellout in Value City Arena history. The Buckeyes own a 55-13 record in those contests, including a 44-9 mark vs. Big Ten opponents. They are 2-0 this year (Duke, 11/29/11). The 19,049 capacity will be the largest crowd of the year because students occupying the remaining home games decrease capacity to 18,809.
- The 33 point win was the largest vs. Northwestern since a 102-62 win in Evanston, Ill., on 1/10/91.
- William Buford scored a career high 28 points for the Buckeyes, improving his career total to 1,657, which is eighth all-time in Ohio State career scoring. He is 99 points behind Jay Burson (1,756).

BLOOMINGTON -- Victor Oladipo scored the go-ahead basket on a fast-break layup with 36 seconds left and Indiana defeated No. 2 Ohio State 74-70, the first time Indiana has defeated the nation's top two teams in the same season. The Hoosiers forced 17 turnovers and, even with Cody Zeller sitting out with foul trouble, somehow managed to outscore the bigger Buckeyes 38-34 in the paint. Aaron Craft led the Buckeyes with 16 points. Jared Sullinger had 15 points and nine rebounds, and William Buford finished with eight points but missed a possible go-ahead 3-pointer with about 5 seconds to play. Ohio State, which spent most of the game in foul trouble, never really looked like itself. Sullinger, Buford and Deshaun Thomas combined to play only 29 minutes in the first half after each picked up their second fouls. Buford picked up two more in the first 3:32 of the second half, and Thomas picked up his third with 17:21 left in the game. That forced coach Thad Matta to mix-and-match his rotations in hopes of keeping a five-game winning streak alive. Jordan Hulls, who had 17 points, and Verdell Jones, who had 14 points, just wouldn't let Ohio State pull away. When the Buckeyes rallied from a 33-32 halftime deficit to take a 44-41 lead, it looked like they might get rolling. Instead, the Hoosiers fought back. And when Lenzelle Smith Jr. made Ohio State's first 3-pointer of the game, to give the Buckeyes a 51-47 lead with 10:39 to go, Indiana answered with four straight points to tie it.

COLUMBUS -- Jared Sullinger had 19 points and 12 rebounds, and No. 6 Ohio State shook off its most recent loss with a 71-40 victory over Nebraska. Deshaun Thomas added 15 points and William Buford had 13 for the Buckeyes, who won their 35th consecutive home game. Toney McCray had 13 points and Bo Spencer 10 for Nebraska, which was playing its first Big Ten road game. The Cornhuskers were out rebounded 44-21 and had more turnovers (17) than field goals (16). Spencer came in leading the Cornhuskers in scoring at 15.1 points a game. Already up big at the break, Ohio State flexed its muscles in the opening minutes of the second half before coach Thad Matta emptied his bench. In the opening 2 minutes, Sullinger was fouled while releasing a 15-foot baseline jumper - and it went in. Thomas also was fouled while tossing up a spinning, over-the-head bank shot that also found the bottom of the net. The lead hovered around 30 for most of the half. The Cornhuskers got out to a miserable start. From a 4-all tie, Ohio State ran off the next 13 points. Five players scored in the 13-0 run for the Buckeyes, with Buford hitting two baskets and Lenzele Smith Jr. adding a 3-pointer. McCray, who had nine points in the half, scored on a drive to cut the gap to 28-15 at the 5:09 mark, but Ohio State took off again with a 16-5 run to close the half. After an inbound play broke down in the closing seconds, the pass went to Sullinger, who poured in a 3 for a 44-20 halftime lead.

- The game between Ohio State and Nebraska was the first meeting between the two schools as members of the Big Ten.

IOWA CITY, Iowa -- Jared Sullinger scored a season-high 28 points and sixth-ranked Ohio State pounded Iowa 76-47. Deshaun Thomas added 10 points for the Buckeyes. Ohio State went on a 16-2 run sandwiched around halftime to jump ahead 38-21 early in the second half. The Buckeyes steadily built that lead to 60-33 with just under eight minutes left and cruised to their third Big Ten win by at least 29 points. Eric May had nine points to lead Iowa. The Hawkeyes, like most teams before them, had few answers for Sullinger. Thomas, who'd been quiet early, hit a jumper and a layup to push Ohio State ahead 50-29. Aaron Craft then dished through a pair of Iowa defenders and led Sullinger to the basket. William Buford finished with eight points and 11 rebounds for the Buckeyes, who shot 64.5 percent from the field in the second half. But Buford couldn't buy a basket in the first half, missing his first 10 shots. Sullinger picked him up, outscored cold-shooting Iowa by himself in the first 13 minutes as the Buckeyes jumped ahead 28-19 by halftime. The Hawkeyes hit just five field goals in the first 20 minutes and had 12 turnovers against just one assist. Had Buford been able to hit a few shots, Ohio State might have put the game away much earlier than it did. Buford finally broke through with a layup that gave Ohio State a 33-19 lead, forcing Iowa coach Fran McCaffery to call a quick timeout in an effort to keep things from getting worse. It didn't work. The Buckeyes pushed their edge to 38-21 two minutes into the second half as Craft cut to the hoop for a quick layup.

CHAMPAIGN -- Brandon Paul scored a career-high 43 -- the third best scoring performance in Illinois basketball history -- to lead the Illini past the No. 5 Buckeyes 79-74. The most important of Paul's shots was an off-balance 3-pointer that, with 43 seconds left, gave Illinois a 74-70 lead that all but finished the Buckeyes. Buckeye coach Thad Matta said Paul's night -- and the Illinoi win it guaranteed -- was among the best he's seen anyone have against Ohio State. Paul scored the final 15 points for the Illini. Ohio State led 39-34 at halftime, and was up 64-61 with just over five minutes to play. But with the game tied at 66 with just over two minutes to play, Joseph Bertrand swiped the ball from William Buford, putting the ball in Paul's hands for a baseline 3-pointer that put the Illini up 69-66. Paul's 43 points was the third-highest scoring performance in Illini history and he tied a school record with eight 3-pointers. He also had a team-high eight rebounds Leonard added 14 for Illinois and Bertrand and D.J. Richardson scored 10 each. Deshaun Thomas scored 23 points and Jared Sullinger added 21 for Ohio State. Buford had 15 points for the Buckeyes and Aaron Craft added 12. Ohio State looked ready to put the Illini away early in the second half, stretching its lead to 48-37 in the opening two minutes on an efficient run that yielded nine points over four possessions. COLUMBUS -- Lenzelle Smith Jr. more than doubled his career high with 28 to lead No. 5 Ohio State to a 80-63 victory over seventh-ranked Indiana. Jared Sullinger added 16 points, William Buford scored 12 and Deshaun Thomas had 11 for the Buckeyes. Cody Zeller had 16 points, Christian Watford 13 and Jordan Hulls 11 for the Hoosiers. Smith, who came in scoring above five points per game, erased almost every offensive high-water mark he had ever had in a game. He hit 10 of 12 shots from the field including 4 of 5 3-pointers. He also had seven rebounds, an assist and a steal. The game was the first Indiana has played against another top 10 team since 2002 and the Hoosiers' first visit to an opponent also ranked in single digits since 1992. Smith's previous career best was 12 in the earlier meeting against the Hoosiers in Bloomington. He had surpassed that with almost 3 minutes left in the opening half in the Columbus meeting. The Buckeyes had the game well in hand throughout the second half after finishing the half on a 15-2 run. Yet they energized a raucous capacity crowd of 18,809 at Value City Arena with several plays in the final 20 minutes. Sullinger wrestled the ball away from a driving Hulls and tossed an outlet pass while lying on the floor - Smith threw down a thunderous dunk at the other end to make it 47-23 with 15:23 left. The lead never fell below 16 after halftime.

- The win vs. Indiana was the 36th-consecutive victory at home for Ohio State dating back to the game vs. Michigan on Feb. 27, 2010. The streak is the third-longest in the country behind Duke and Kentucky.

LINCOLN, Neb. -- Ohio State felt right at home in this road game. William Buford scored 15 points, Jared Sullinger and Deshaun Thomas had 14 apiece, and the sixth-ranked Buckeyes defeated Nebraska for the second time this month with a 79-45 victory. The Buckeyes swept their games against Nebraska by a combined 65 points. Brandon Ubel and Bo Spencer had eight points apiece for Nebraska, which had two field-goal droughts of longer than eight minutes. The Huskers, who upset Indiana (No. 13 ESPN/USA Today, No. 11 AP) 70-69 on Wednesday, were looking for consecutive wins over ranked opponents for the first time since February 2008. They never had a chance, committing a season-high 27 turnovers and shooting a season-low 29.5 percent from the floor. The Buckeyes took their first double-digit lead 10 minutes into the game, going on a 13-0 run after the first media timeout to erase an 8-5 deficit. Nebraska scored only 12 points on 4-of-20 shooting the last 15½ minutes of the half. Sullinger, who had 19 points and 12 rebounds in the first game against Nebraska, took only three shots and was held to four points in the first half. Ubel and Jorge Brian Diaz took turns guarding him, and Spencer doubled him whenever he touched the ball in the post. Sullinger shook loose in the second half, scoring 10 points and even making a 3-pointer.

Notes:

- The Buckeyes move to 6-2 all-time vs. Nebraska and 2-1 in Lincoln. It was the first game Ohio State has played in Lincoln since Dec. 5, 1987.
- As a ranked team, the Buckeyes are 3-0 vs. the Cornhuskers.
- The Buckeyes had 13 team assists vs. Nebraska. They are averaging 17.0 app.
- This is the second time this season Ohio State has not let an opponent have a player score in double figures (Iowa, 1/7/12).
- Ohio State has defeated Nebraska by an average of 32.5 points in both wins first the newest Big Ten member.
- The Buckeyes scored 23 points off a season high 27 forced turnovers.
- The win vs. Nebraska was Coach Matta's 207th win at Ohio State and his 103rd Big Ten victory since beginning his Ohio State career. It was the 400th game he has coached in his career.
- The start was William Buford's 118th donning the Scarlet and Gray, tying Jamar Butler for fifth place in career games started at Ohio State.
- Buford scored a game high 15 points for the Buckeyes, improving his career total to 1,728, which is eighth all-time in Ohio State career scoring. He is 28 points behind Jay Burson (1,756) for seventh place.
- Jared Sullinger had 15 points for the Buckeyes. It is the 17th time this season and 51st time in his career he has scored in double figures.
- With 15 points, Sullinger is 56 from joining the 1,000 point club.
- Craft had two steals. He has 121 for his career. He has had at least one steal in all 18 games this season. He has had at least three steals or more in 10 games this season.
- Sam Thompson had a career high three blocks (two vs. USC Upstate, 12/14/11).

Game 21 No. 4 Ohio State 78 Penn State 54

Jan. 25, 2012, Columbus

COLUMBUS -- Jared Sullinger had 20 points and 13 rebounds, and No. 4 Ohio State took advantage of Penn State's slow start to roll to a 78-54 victory. William Buford added 15 points and Aaron Craft had 11 - all in the first half - as the Buckeyes built a lopsided lead. Big Ten scoring leader Tim Frazier had 16 points and Jermaine Marshall 14 for Penn State, which has lost its last 17 meetings with Ohio State. The Buckeyes improved to 15-0 at home this season while running their home winning streak to 37 in a row - the second-longest streak in the country behind Kentucky's 47 straight. Already ahead 38-18 at halftime, Ohio State benefited from a flagrant foul and a technical foul against the Nittany Lions in the opening 2 minutes of the second half. Frazier was called for the flagrant foul when he swung an elbow that caught Craft in the jaw. Moments later, first-year coach Patrick Chambers was whistled for yelling at the officials. Sullinger had a layup and a dunk - both off assists from swingman Sam Thompson - in a 7-0 run that swelled the Buckeyes' lead to 56-29. Penn State endured a poor shooting first half, shooting just 22 percent (7 of 32) and falling behind by as many as 23 points. The Nittany Lions had just one field goal and two points over the first 8 minutes and were outscored 15-2. They came in shooting 39 percent from the field for the season but made only one of their first 14 field goals.

Notes:

- The win vs. Penn State was the 37th-consecutive victory at home for Ohio State dating back to the game vs. Michigan on Feb. 27, 2010. The streak is the second-longest in the country behind Kentucky.
- The 37-consecutive home game win streak is the second-longest in Ohio State history. The Buckeyes won 50 in a row from 12/1/59 - 12/11/64.
- The Buckeyes move to 28-12 all-time vs. Penn State and 15-3 in Columbus (9-0 in Value City Arena).
- Ohio State extended its winning streak vs. Penn State to 17 games, dating back to 1/1/04.
- As a ranked team, the Buckeyes are 15-2 vs. the Nittany Lions.
- Ohio State moved to 156-23 (.871) all-time at Value City Arena.
- The Buckeyes are 117-2 vs. unranked opponents at home over Matta.
- Ohio State is 174-21 overall vs. unranked opponents since the 2004-05 season, including a 134-10 mark in Columbus.
- Ohio State moves to 730-664 overall in the Big Ten, including a 66-18 record at Value City Arena vs. conference foes.
- Ohio State is 39-7 in their last 46 Big Ten matchups, dating back to 3/8/09.
- As a ranked team, Ohio State is 413-111 overall in Ohio State and ranked in the AP Top 10, the Buckeyes are 292-62.
- As the Associated Press No. 4 team, Ohio State is 32-5 overall.
- The Buckeyes have now won by double figures in 16 of their 18 victories this year. Fourteen of their wins have been by 22 or more points. Ohio State's 22.0 average margin of victory is No. 1 nationally.
- Three players scored in double figures for Ohio State. So far this season, seven Buckeyes have scored in doubles figures a total of 68 times.

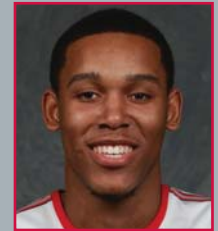
