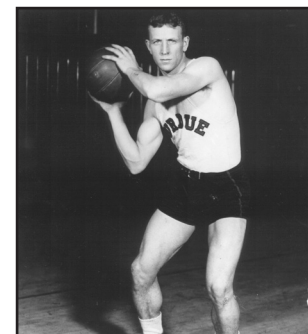
BIG TEN MEDAL OF HONOR 100TH ANNIVERSARY SPOTLIGHT

Purdue's John Wooden



One of the most successful basketball coaches in NCAA history, John Wooden earned the Big Ten Medal of Honor in 1932. Wooden was a three-time consensus All-American at Purdue from 1930-32 and the National Player of the Year in 1932. He led the Boilermakers to a pair of Big Ten Championships (1930, 1932). Wooden was named UCLA's head coach in 1948. During his tenure, he led the Bruins to 10 NCAA Championships in 12 years, including a record seven straight from 1967-73. In his 29-year career, Wooden accumulated a 664-162 record for an .804 winning percentage,

which ranks third all-time in Division I. Wooden was named National Coach of the Year six times and was part of the founding class of the College Basketball Hall of Fame in 2006.

Following the conclusion of the fall season, the Big Ten recognized a total of 869 fall sports student-athletes who were named to the Academic All-Conference team.

BIG TEN. BIG NEWS.

Nine Big Ten Teams Selected for Postseason Play:

Nine Big Ten teams will see their seasons continue in the postseason. Iowa, Michigan, Michigan State, Nebraska, Ohio State and Wisconsin were selected for the NCAA Tournament. Illinois and Minnesota accepted bids to the National Invitation Tournament (NIT) and Penn State will play in the College Basketball Invitational (CBI).

Six Advance to NCAA Tournament:

Six Big Ten teams were selected to the NCAA Tournament. This marks the seventh year in the last nine that the Big Ten has had six or more teams in the bracket and the sixth straight year the Big Ten has had five or more teams in the NCAA Tournament. Michigan State received the conference's automatic bid after winning the Big Ten Tournament, while Iowa, Michigan, Nebraska, Ohio State and Wisconsin received at-large berths.

A Look at the History:

Below is a summary of each Big Ten team's history in the NCAA Tournament:

- **Iowa:** Iowa is making its 23rd appearance in the NCAA Tournament, and the first since 2006. The Hawkeyes have produced three Final Four appearances.
- **Michigan:** Michigan will make its 21st official trip to the tournament and its fourth consecutive appearance. The Wolverines won the 1989 national title and advanced to the national championship game last season, their fifth official Final Four appearance.
- **Michigan State:** Michigan State earned its 17th straight trip to the NCAA Tournament and will make its 28th overall appearance, the third-most among Big Ten schools. The Spartans won national titles in 1979 and 2000, and have appeared in the Final Four eight times.
- **Nebraska:** Nebraska will be making its first appearance in the NCAA Tournament as a Big Ten member, and its seventh trip in program history.
- **Ohio State:** Ohio State is making its 26th official trip to the tournament and sixth straight appearance. The Buckeyes won the 1960 national title, and have made 10 trips to the Final Four.
- **Wisconsin:** Wisconsin is making its 20th NCAA Tournament appearance and its 16th consecutive trip. The Badgers made a run to the Final Four in 2000, their second national semifinal appearance.

Roaming the Sidelines:

Big Ten head coaches have recorded impressive numbers during their careers in the Division I NCAA Tournament. The six participating coaches (Iowa's **Fran McCaffery**, Michigan's **John Beilein**, Michigan State's **Tom Izzo**, Nebraska's **Tim Miles**, Ohio State's **Thad Matta** and Wisconsin's **Bo Ryan**) have combined for a 94-52 record in NCAA Tournament play (.644 winning percentage). The six coaches have led their teams to nine total Final Four appearances, including five in the last seven years.

Final Four Mettle:

Three Big Ten coaches lead their teams into the NCAA Tournament with Final Four experience. Michigan State's **Tom Izzo** is one of four active coaches, and eight all-time, to have appeared in at least six Final Fours, joining Duke's Mike Krzyzewski, Louisville's Rick Pitino and North Carolina's Roy Williams as the other active mentors with six or more berths. Ohio State's **Thad Matta** has recorded two Final Four appearances with the Buckeyes, including the 2012 squad that advanced

to the national semifinals. Michigan's **John Beilein** guided Michigan to an appearance in the national championship game last season.

NCAA Tournament Preparation:

- Since the inception of the Big Ten Tournament in 1998, the conference has sent 12 teams to the Final Four and has won more than 62 percent of its NCAA Tournament games.
- Since 2005, four Big Ten teams have advanced to the NCAA Tournament championship game. Michigan advanced to the title game last season, Michigan State played for the national championship in 2009, Ohio State played in the 2007 title game and Illinois reached the final in 2005.
- Over the last nine years, the Big Ten has sent seven different teams to the Final Four.

Michigan State Wins Big Ten Tournament Title:

Third-seeded Michigan State captured the Big Ten Tournament title in Indianapolis last weekend, defeating Northwestern in the quarterfinals, Wisconsin in the semifinal round and Michigan in the championship game. It marked the Spartans' fourth Big Ten Tournament Championship and their second in the past three years.

Spartans' Dawson Leads All-Tournament Team:

Michigan State's **Branden Dawson** was named the Most Outstanding Player of the Big Ten Tournament, leading a five-member All-Tournament Team that included three Spartans. The team was comprised of Michigan's **Nik Stauskas**, Michigan State's **Dawson**, **Gary Harris** and **Adreian Payne** and Ohio State's **LaQuinton Ross**. Sellout in Indy:

For the second consecutive year, the Big Ten Men's Basketball Tournament sold out. Over the four-day tournament, 111,592 people attended the event, an average of 18,599 patrons per session. The total attendance was the highest in the nine years that the event has been held in Indianapolis.

Illinois and Minnesota Earn Bids to NIT:

Illinois and Minnesota both accepted bids to the NIT. Minnesota is a No. 1 seed in the field, and will host High Point in the first round. Illinois earned a No. 2 seed, and will travel to Boston University for its first round matchup. Due to the ongoing renovations at State Farm Center, the Illini were unable to host an opening round NIT contest. Illinois will be making its fifth appearance in the NIT, and boasts a 7-4 all-time record in the event. Minnesota will appear in the NIT for the 13th time. The Golden Gophers are 22-12 in the tournament, and won the NIT title in 1993.

Penn State Accepts CBI Bid:

Penn State accepted an invitation to compete in the CBI. The Nittany Lions will host Hampton in the first round on Wednesday at the Bryce Jordan Center.

Big Ten Standouts Garner All-America, All-District Honors:

Michigan's **Nik Stauskas** was named a second-team All-American by the Sporting News and a third-team honoree by the USA Today, while Michigan State's **Gary Harris** and Wisconsin's **Sam Dekker** were named to the USA Today Honorable Mention All-America Team. In addition, 13 Big Ten players were named All-District performers.

Craft and Crawford Named Academic All-Americans:

Northwestern's **Drew Crawford** and Ohio State's **Aaron Craft** were named first team Capital One Academic All-Americans. In addition, Craft became just the third student-athlete to repeat as Division I men's basketball Academic All-America of the Year. A three-time Academic All-Big Ten honoree, Crawford graduated from Northwestern University in spring 2013. Craft was named the 2013 Capital One Academic All-America of the Year and was a first-team Academic All-American in 2012 and 2013. He became the fourth Big Ten student-athlete to earn first team honors three times.

Big Ten Standouts:

The Big Ten men's basketball All-Conference teams and individual award winners were announced on March 10, with Michigan's **Nik Stauskas** earning Big Ten Player of the Year honors from the conference's coaches and a media panel. Michigan head coach **John Beilein** claimed Coach of the Year laurels from the media while Nebraska head coach **Tim Miles** was named Coach of the Year by his peers. Indiana's **Noah Vonleh** picked up Freshman of the Year accolades from the coaches and media. Ohio State's **Aaron Craft** was named the Defensive Player of the Year while Wisconsin's **Nigel Hayes** was voted the Sixth Man of the Year by the coaches. HONORING LEGENDS. BUILDING LEADERS.

In 2012, Big Ten institutions had over \$9.5 billion in research expenditures, \$3 billion more than any other conference.

Piling Through the Turnstiles:

Heading into the postseason, the Big Ten is on pace to record the conference's highest average attendance figure since at least 1971-72. The Big Ten enters postseason play averaging 13,570 fans per contest, which would surpass 13,400 or more fans for just the third time in at least the last 40 years. The current record for average attendance is 13,455, set during the 1989-90 season. The conference surpassed the 13,000 mark in average attendance last season for the first time since 2001-02 on the way to setting the attendance record of more than 2.9 million. The Big Ten has led the nation in men's basketball attendance in each of the last 37 years.

Four Teams Ranked in Top 25 of Both Polls:

The Associated Press (AP) and USA Today Coaches polls were released on Monday, and the Big Ten was represented with four teams among the top 25 of both polls, including three in the top 15. In the AP poll, Michigan was ranked No. 7, followed by No. 11 Michigan State, No. 12 Wisconsin and No. 22 Ohio State. In the coaches' ballot, Michigan was ranked No. 8, followed by No. 13 Michigan State, No. 15 Wisconsin and No. 24 Ohio State. Nebraska and Iowa both received votes in the coaches poll.

Filling it Up:

Big Ten teams have posted 99 games scoring at least 80 points heading into the postseason. Four of the six Big Ten teams that garnered berths to the NCAA Tournament are averaging at least 73 points per game (Iowa, 82.0 ppg; Michigan State, 75.9 ppg; Michigan, 74.4 ppg; Wisconsin, 73.5 ppg).

Statistically Speaking:

Several standouts secured statistical titles in Big Ten conference games only at the conclusion of the regular season:

- Nebraska's **Terran Petteway** became the first Cornhusker to lead the Big Ten in scoring (18.6 ppg).
- Indiana's **Noah Vonleh** became the first freshman since Ohio State's Greg Oden in 2006-07 to lead the conference in rebounding (8.8 rpg) and the first Hoosier to lead the Big Ten in caroms since D.J. White in 2007-08.
- Minnesota's **Maurice Walker** led the Big Ten in field goal percentage (.626), becoming the first Gopher to accomplish the feat since Spencer Tollackson in 2005-06.
- Ohio State's **Aaron Craft** became the second Big Ten player in the past three years to lead the conference in both assists (4.6 apg) and steals (2.7 spg), joining **Tim Frazier** in 2011-12.
- Craft also became the second Big Ten player since at least 1982-83 to lead the conference in steals in three different seasons, a feat also accomplished by Illinois' Bruce Douglas from 1984-86. Craft also passed Douglas for the Big Ten career steals record and enters the NCAA Tournament with 333 thefts.
- Purdue's **A.J. Hammons** led the conference in blocks (2.6 bpg) for the second straight season.
- Wisconsin's **Josh Gasser** paced the Big Ten in three-point field goal percentage (.492), becoming the first Badger to accomplish the feat since Kirk Penney in 2000-01.
- Indiana's **Yogi Ferrell** led the conference in three-point field goals (51), becoming the first Hoosier to do so since Robert Vaden in 2005-06.

2014 BIG TEN ALL-TOURNAMENT TEAM

Nik Stauskas, MICH: Averaged 18.0 points per game in leading the Wolverines to their first official appearance in the Big Ten Tournament Championship game.

Branden Dawson, MSU: Averaged 15.0 points and 7.3 rebounds per game on 75.0 percent shooting (21-of-28) in leading the Spartans to their second Big Ten Tournament title in the past three years.

Gary Harris, MSU: Averaged 13.3 points and 2.0 steals per game during Michigan State's run to its fourth Big Ten Tournament Championship.

Adreian Payne, MSU: Averaged 13.7 points and 6.3 rebounds per contest during Michigan State's run to the Big Ten Tournament title.

LaQuinton Ross, OSU: Averaged 21.3 points and 11.3 rebounds per game in leading fifth-seeded Ohio State to a berth in the Big Ten Tournament semifinals.

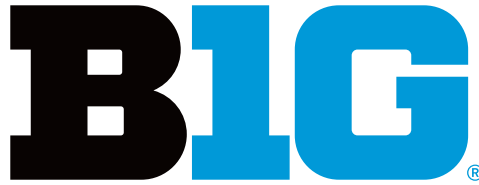

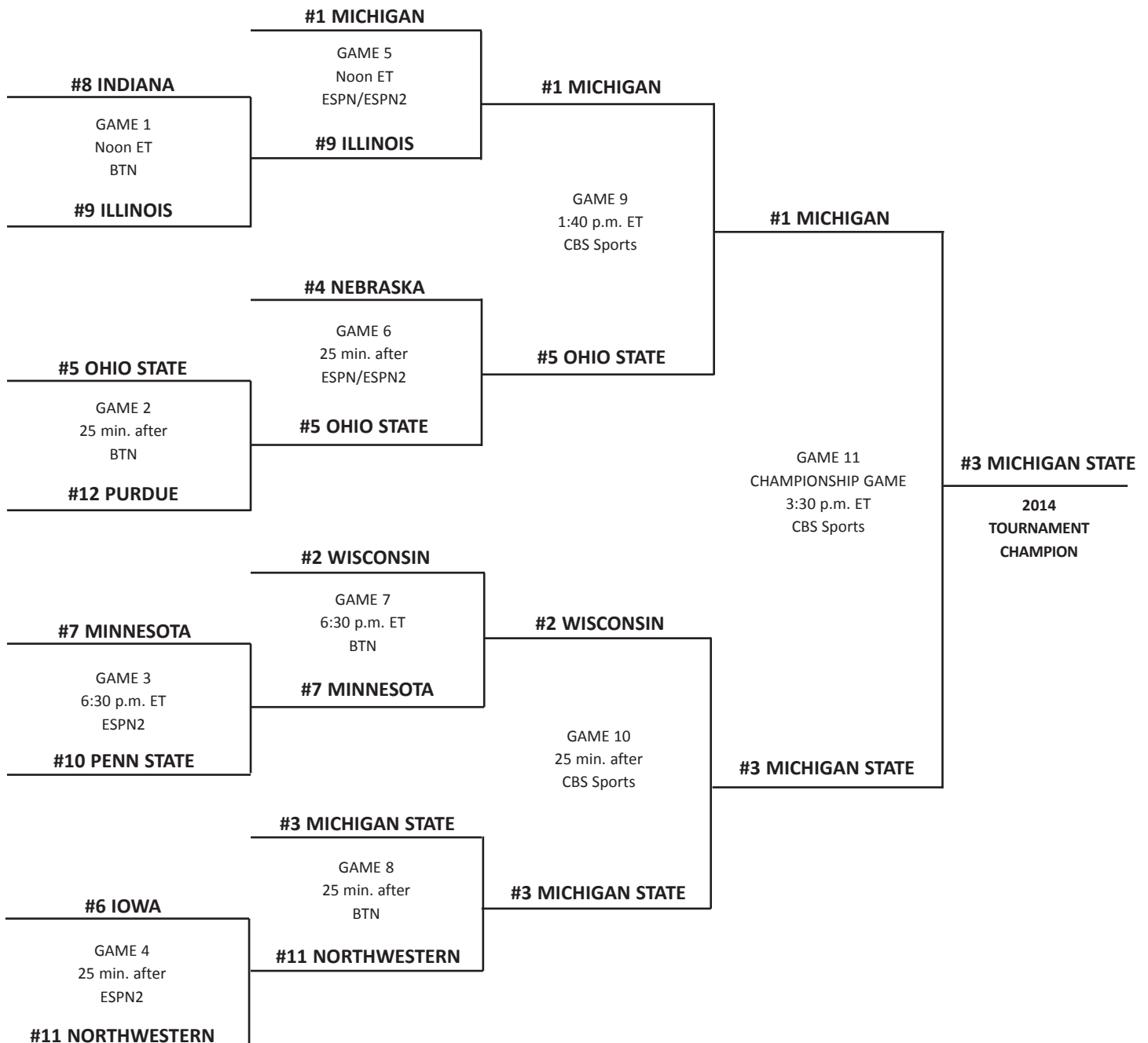

BIG TEN MEDAL OF HONOR 100TH ANNIVERSARY SPOTLIGHT

This year, the Big Ten is celebrating 100 years of the Big Ten Medal of Honor. The conference's most prestigious award, the Big Ten Medal of Honor was first awarded in 1915 to one student-athlete from the graduating class of each university who had "attained the greatest proficiency in athletics and scholastic work." In the 99 years of the Medal of Honor, over 1,300 student-athletes have earned this distinction, including 173 men's basketball players. Throughout the course of the season, the conference highlighted previous Big Ten Medal of Honor recipients, featuring some of the legends of the Big Ten who have earned this prominent achievement.

Illinois' Dee Brown

Brown won the Big Ten Medal of Honor in 2006 following a stellar four-year career at Illinois. The Maywood, Ill., native won the Bob Cousy Award as the nation's top point guard as a senior in 2006, along with collecting Consensus Second-Team All-America honors. In 2005, Brown led the Fighting Illini to the national championship game and was named a Consensus First-Team All-American. Brown collected first or second-team All-Big Ten honors all four years of his career and was a two-time Academic All-Big Ten honoree. He was named a finalist for Illinois' Male Athlete of the Year in 2006 and was also recognized as a Senior CLASS Award finalist.

Wisconsin's Mike Kelley

Kelley, the 1999 Big Ten Defensive Player of the Year, won the Big Ten Medal of Honor in 2001. The Menomonee Falls, Wis., native was an integral part of the Badgers' 2000 Final Four Team, earning All-Region honors during the tournament that season. He still holds Wisconsin's all-time record in career steals with 275, a mark that also ranks third in the Big Ten career record books. Kelley was a three-time Academic All-Big Ten selection, collecting the honor in 1999, 2000 and 2001.

Iowa's Andre Woolridge

Woolridge, who was the first player in Big Ten history to lead the conference in scoring and assists in the same season, won the Big Ten Medal of Honor in 1997. He was a first-team All-Big Ten selection and was named a third-team All-American by the Associated Press his senior season after averaging 20.2 points and six assists per game. After graduating from Iowa in 1997, the Omaha, Neb., native enjoyed an extensive career playing professional basketball overseas. He was inducted into the Nebraska High School Sports Hall of Fame in 2007 and the Nebraska Black Sports Hall of Fame in 2011.

Purdue's Robbie Hummel

A 2012 recipient of the Big Ten Medal of Honor, Hummel was a three-time first-team All-Big Ten selection, finishing his collegiate career with 1,772 points, 862 rebounds and 268 assists. The three-time Academic All-Big Ten honoree was Purdue's first-ever Senior CLASS Award winner, and also helped lead Team USA to the bronze medal at the 2009 World University Games. A two-time Associated Press Honorable Mention All-American, Hummel played internationally for one year before signing with the NBA's Minnesota Timberwolves in September 2013. The Valparaiso, Ind., native has played in 11 games during his rookie season. Hummel's father, Glenn, was Illinois' 1976 Big Ten Medal of Honor winner.

Indiana's Steve Alford

Alford was Indiana's Big Ten Medal of Honor winner in 1987 after leading the Hoosiers to the NCAA Championship. He finished his career as Indiana's all-time scoring leader with 2,438 points, a record that held until 1993. Alford was a two-time All-American, a three-time first-team All-Big Ten selection and was named the Big Ten Most Valuable Player in 1987. He is still the Big Ten's career leader in three-point field goal percentage (.530), and ranks fifth overall in points and field goals (898). Alford, who also played in the NBA for four seasons before beginning his coaching career, was named UCLA's 13th head coach on March 30, 2013. As Iowa's head coach from 2000-07, he helped guide the Hawkeyes to seven consecutive winning seasons and six postseason appearances. He was inducted into the Indiana University Athletics Hall of Fame in 1997, and was one of 15 players named to Indiana's All-Century Team in 2001.

Penn State's John Amaechi

A 1995 Big Ten Medal of Honor recipient, Amaechi scored 1,310 points in three seasons during his career at Penn State, the most points scored for a Nittany Lion in less than four seasons. He was a first-team All-Big Ten selection in 1995, a three-time Academic All-Big Ten selection, a two-time Academic All-American and was named the Academic All-American of the Year in 1995. One of just five players to post at least 1,300 points and 700 rebounds at Penn State, Amaechi played five seasons in the NBA with the Cleveland Cavaliers, Orlando Magic and Utah Jazz. After his NBA career, Amaechi helped England earn the bronze medal at the 2006 Commonwealth Games in Melbourne. The Manchester, England native was the first and only Briton to have his jersey hung in the U.S. Basketball Hall of Fame. Amaechi is currently an organizational consultant, a New York Times best-selling author and a social entrepreneur in America and Europe.

Michigan's Rob Pelinka

Pelinka was Michigan's Big Ten Medal of Honor winner in 1993. During his career with the Wolverines, Pelinka played in 117 games and was a member of the 1989 NCAA National Championship team. He was a three-time Academic All-Big Ten selection and earned the Michigan Athletic Academic Achievement Award in 1991, 1992 and 1993. The Lake Bluff, Ill., native was an NCAA Post Graduate Scholar and was named the Walter Byers Student-Athlete of the Year in 1993.

Northwestern's Shon Morris

A 1988 recipient of the Big Ten Medal of Honor, Morris is Northwestern's only three-time Academic All-American. The leading scorer for the Wildcats in 1985-86, 1986-87 and 1987-88, Morris scored 1,407 points during his career at Northwestern. Morris' 371 free throws rank fourth in program history, and his 712 rebounds are sixth all-time. A four-year letterwinner and three-time Academic All-Big Ten selection, Morris was also a three-time Northwestern MVP and was named All-Big Ten second team in 1988. The Altoona, Iowa, native serves as both a studio host and game analyst for the Big Ten Network and regularly appears on BTN Basketball Report, Tip-Off Show and The Finale. He has been an analyst for the network's Big Ten Tournament broadcasts since 2007.

Michigan State's Greg Kelsner

Kelsner, who earned the Big Ten Medal of Honor in 1979, was the leading scorer and rebounder on Michigan State's 1979 NCAA Championship team. He was the first Spartan to score more than 2,000 points and collect at least 1,000 rebounds in his career. Kelsner's 2,014 points rank fourth at Michigan State and his 1,092 rebounds are second all-time. In 1979, he earned All-America honors, was a first-team All-Big Ten selection and was named to the Wooden Award All-America Team. He also collected Academic All-America honors in 1979. Kelsner was a first-round draft pick of the Detroit Pistons and played six seasons in the NBA. He is the lead analyst for the Pistons on Fox Sports Detroit and also serves as a college basketball analyst on BTN. Kelsner earned the Michigan State University Distinguished Alumni Award in 2004 and was inducted into the Michigan Sports Hall of Fame in 2006.

Minnesota's Jim Brewer

Brewer earned the Big Ten Medal of Honor in 1973. He ranks among Minnesota's career leaders in several categories, ranking first in rebounding average (12.09) and third in rebounds (907). He was named the Big Ten-Chicago Tribune MVP in 1972 after helping guide the Gophers to the Big Ten Championship. Brewer was also tabbed first-team All-Big Ten in 1973, All-Big Ten honorable mention in 1972 and was a second-team All-Big Ten selection in 1971. During his final season at Minnesota, he was named to the U.S. Basketball Writers Association All-America first team. The three-time Minnesota MVP was also a member of the 1972 U.S. Olympic Team. A first-round draft pick of the Cleveland Cavaliers in 1973, Brewer played nine seasons in the NBA and was a member of the 1982 Los Angeles Lakers NBA Championship team. He is the uncle of former NBA player and current Los Angeles Clippers head coach Doc Rivers.

Illinois' Trent Meacham

Meacham, who earned the Big Ten Medal of Honor in 2009, scored 866 points, handed out 231 assists and recorded 74 steals during his career at Illinois. A co-captain during his senior year, Meacham led the Illini and ranked second in the Big Ten in three-point field goal shooting at 42.1 percent during the 2008-09 season. He currently ranks fifth at Illinois in career three-point field goal percentage (.408) and 11th in three-point field goals made (178). The Champaign, Ill., native was a three-time Academic All-Big Ten selection and won the Lou Henry Courage Award in 2009. He graduated with a bachelor's degree in sport management and is currently in his second season with JSF Nanterre of the LNB Pro A in France.

Ohio State's Jerry Lucas

Lucas, who received the Big Ten Medal of Honor in 1963, was the leading scorer and rebounder on Ohio State's 1960 NCAA Championship team. He was a two-time National Player of the Year, three-time first-team consensus All-American and three-time Big Ten MVP. During his college career, the Buckeyes posted a 78-6 record and won three Big Ten titles. Lucas led the nation in field goal shooting for three consecutive years and still holds Ohio State's career records in field goal percentage (.624), free throws made (438) and rebounds (1,411). The Middletown, Ohio, native was also the youngest player on the USA Basketball team that won the gold medal at the 1960 Olympics. During his 11 seasons in the NBA, Lucas was a seven-time All-Star and five-time All-NBA selection. He was inducted into the Basketball Hall of Fame in 1980 and was named one of the 50 Greatest Players in NBA History. Lucas was the first men's basketball player to have his number retired at Ohio State.

Wisconsin's Kirk Penney

Penney, who received Wisconsin's Big Ten Medal of Honor in 2003, was the first Badger to earn back-to-back first-team All-Big Ten honors (2002-03) since 1951-52. In 2002, Penney helped Wisconsin clinch a share of its first Big Ten title in 55 years, and he was just the fifth Badger to earn unanimous first-team honors since 1948. He currently ranks second at Wisconsin in career three-point field goals made (217) and attempted (561), ninth in points (1,454) and 10th in field goals made (503). The Auckland, New Zealand native also ranks first in school history in total NCAA Tournament games (11). A four-year letterwinner, Penney earned Academic All-Big Ten honors in 2002 and was named an Associated Press honorable mention All-American in 2003. Penney played two seasons in the NBA with the Miami Heat and Los Angeles Clippers and currently plays for Trabzonspor of the Turkish Basketball League.

Iowa's Greg Brunner

Brunner earned the Big Ten Medal of Honor in 2006. He is Iowa's all-time leading rebounder (990) and ranks seventh in blocked shots (104) and ninth in field goals made (553). During the 2005-06 season, Brunner helped lead Iowa to the Big Ten Tournament Championship and earned All-Tournament honors. The Hawkeyes finished 25-9 during his senior season, marking the second-highest wins in school history. Brunner was also tabbed first-team All-Big Ten and third-team CoSIDA Academic All-America in 2005-06. The four-year letterwinner and two-time Iowa MVP won the gold medal with Team USA at the 2005 World University Games. Brunner was an Academic All-Big Ten selection and has been playing internationally since 2008-09. He currently plays for Grissin Bon Reggione Emilia of Italy.

Indiana's Uwe Blab

Blab was Indiana's Big Ten Medal of Honor recipient in 1985. He led the Hoosiers in blocked shots for four seasons and currently ranks fourth at Indiana in career blocked shots (196). Blab scored 1,357 points during his career and led the Hoosiers in rebounding in 1984 and 1985. He was an Academic All-American, a first-team All-Big Ten selection in 1985 and a three-time Academic All-Big Ten honoree. Blab was named the Indiana MVP in 1985 alongside teammate Steve Alford, and he was a member of the 1982-83 Big Ten Championship team. A first-round draft pick, Blab played five seasons in the NBA with the Dallas Mavericks, Golden State Warriors and San Antonio Spurs.

Michigan's Steve Grote

Grote earned the Big Ten Medal of Honor in 1977. He was a four-year starting guard for Michigan from 1973-77 and is one of four players in Big Ten history to be a first-team Academic All-American for three consecutive years. Grote became the first collegian to ever play in four consecutive NCAA Tournaments, and was an instrumental member of two Big Ten Championship teams in 1974 and 1977. A four-year letterwinner, he played in 116 games, scored 1,330 points and led the Wolverines in field goal percentage (.489) in 1973-74. Grote was a second-team All-Big Ten selection and three-time All-Big Ten honorable mention honoree. He was selected by the Cleveland Cavaliers in the third round of the 1977 NBA Draft. In 1977, Michigan established the Steve Grote Hustle Award, given annually to the player who displays the greatest effort on the court, both in practice and games.
