### Starting Five

Ohio State has shot better from the field than its opponent in all eight games this season and are 4-4 to date. Ohio State outshot 23 opponents a year ago and were 23-0 in those games. In the Matta era, the Buckeyes have outshot foes 294 times and are 266-28 in those games (.905).

Opponents are shooting 77.9 percent (113-145) from the foul line against the Buckeyes, the sixth best nationally. Miami (Ohio) foes are shooting 81.3 percent to lead the country. Only three power five conference teams are among the Top 20 in free throw percentage defense--Ohio State at No. 6, Kansas at No. 20 (.754) and Auburn at No. 25 (.750).

Thad Matta has coached 401 games at Ohio State, the third most in school history. Harold G. Olsen (1923-46) and Fred Taylor (1959-76), have reached 400 or more games at Ohio State. Olsen coached 456 (259-197) and Taylor 455 (297-158).

Streaks: Marc Loving has made at least one 3-pointer in all eight games this season and in the last nine games dating to last season ... Loving has scored 10 or more points in all eight games this season and has recorded a double-double in each of the last two contests ... JaQuan Lyle leads Ohio State with 44 assists with at least four helpers in six of the last seven games ... Bates-Diop has been to the foul line at least twice in seven of eight games ... he leads the team making 92 percent on the year at the stripe (22-24) ... as a team Ohio State has rejected at least five opposing shots in each of the last seven games.

Marc Loving needs eight points to reach 600 for his career...he's averaged 7.9 points a game over the last three seasons but is leading the team with 17.1 points per game this season ... Jae'Sean Tate reached 400 career points (401) with 11 tallied vs. Air Force the last time out.

### Buckeyes Have Most Home Wins Since 2010

Ohio State has the most home wins nationally with a 110-13 (.894) record since the 2009-10 season. Maryland is the next-best Big Ten team at No. 13<sup>th</sup> with 95-17 record. Going back to the 2008-09 season to the present, the Buckeyes also own the national lead in home victories with 125 wins over 141 games (125-16). The Buckeyes also have played the third-most ranked teams in the country during the Thad Matta era (2005-present). Ohio State has played 112 opponents ranked among the *Associated Press* Top 25 since Matta became head coach. That total trails only Michigan State (122) and West Virginia (117) during that span (*see page 7 for more information*).

## Matta Reaches Career, Ohio State History

Thad Matta has made a habit of achieving records and milestones over his coaching career, which spans 16 years. After a season at Butler, three at Xavier and the last 12 in Columbus, Matta coached his 500th career game as a head coach Dec. 13 vs. Morehead State. As an Ohio State head coach, the 13th in the history of the program, Matta set the all-time wins record, surpassing Fred Taylor's 297 career victories over 18 seasons from 1959-1976, with a 79-73 win vs. Minnesota March 12, 2015 in Chicago. The Minnesota victory also gave him his 400th career win (405-128). Matta teams have never failed to win at least 20 games. His Ohio State teams have averaged 27.2 victories over his 11 full years in Columbus. He coached in his 400th career game (303-98) at Ohio State when the Buckeyes defeated VMI Dec. 5 (89-62).

## Scouting Connecticut

Connecticut enters the game with the Buckeyes with a 5-3 overall record. The Huskies opened the season 4-0 but have dropped three of the last four outings. Losses have come to Syracuse, Gonzaga and most recently to Maryland. Wins this season have been against Maine, New Hampshire, Furman, Michigan and Seton Hall. Four Huskies average 10 or more points offensively led by sophomore guard Daniel Hamilton (13.9 ppg.) and junior guard Rodney Purvis (13.8 ppg.). Graduate forward Shonn Miller (12.1 ppg.) and graduate guard Sterling Gibbs (11.9 ppg.) are the others. Hamilton is the team's leading rebounder at 8.8 boards a game.

## Last Time vs. Connecticut

Ohio State and the Huskies have officially battled four times all-time. The Buckeyes won the first two meetings 74-67 (12/3/83) in Columbus and 72-65 (12/8/84) in Hartford, Conn., as part of a home-and-home series. The teams have met twice in postseason play with the Huskies winning 72-67 March 30, 1988 in the NIT semifinals at Madison Square Garden in New York and Ohio State earning a 78-55 win March 21, 1992 in the NCAA Second Round in Cincinnati, Ohio. Jim Jackson led the Buckeyes with 23 points and 11 rebounds in the most recent meeting. He was named the 1992 National Player of the Year that season. Current UConn head coach Kevin Ollie played in that games as well. He scored six points in 17 minutes. Ohio State's 1999 meeting with Connecticut in the Final Four was vacated.

## Ohio State vs. The American Athletic Conference

of college basketball, including the NCAA Division I Men's Basketball Championship. Havlicek, a 1962 All-American under Coach Fred Taylor at Ohio State, helped the Buckeyes win the NCAA title in 1960. He went on to play his entire 16-year professional career with the Boston Celtics, winning eight NBA championships and earning 13 All-Star selections. Named one of the NBA's 50 greatest players, Havlicek was inducted into the Naismith Memorial Basketball Hall of Fame in 1984.

## Ohio State Newcomer Notes

**JaQuan Lyle:** Logs 30 minutes a game, most among Ohio State rookies ... has started all eight games this season ... leads Buckeyes with 44 assists ... career-high eight helpers vs. UT Arlington Nov. 20 and Memphis Nov. 27 ... averages 10 points a game and a bit under four rebounds a contest ... owns five double-digit outings offensively with a career-best 18 points vs. Memphis Nov. 27. **Daniel Giddens:** Averages 5.5 points and 5.7 rebounds over first six games of Ohio State career ... 15-of-34 total rebounds are on the offensive end ... six of 20 blocks were against UT Arlington Nov. 20 ... the six rejections are tied for No. 4 all-time in a single game among Ohio State freshman ... leads the Big Ten in total blocks and blocks per game (3.3) ... connects on 56 percent of his field goal attempts (14-25) ... averages 23 minutes a game with three starts ... missed last two games with flu and left hamstring strain.

**Austin Grandstaff:** 10 of his 14 made field goals and 30-of-35 attempts have come from 3-point range (10-30/.333) ... averages 13 minutes a game ... has yet to attempt a free throw. **A.J. Harris:** Adds a spark off the bench at the point guard position ... scored five of his 14 points to date vs. Grambling Nov. 17 ... first-career assist was against Louisiana Tech Nov. 24... career high five helpers in win over Air Force Dec. 8. **David Bell:** Redshirted a season ago ... 10 of 14 points to date have come at the foul line (10-12) ... first career field goal came against Air Force Dec. 8 ... played in five games this season ... grabbed four rebounds vs. VMI Dec. 5.

## Experience Tops Buckeyes Early

Despite the influx of seven freshmen and one transfer, Ohio State is led by three returning players from 2014-15. The Buckeyes' lone junior, Marc Loving, leads Ohio State in scoring with 17.1 points per game. Sophomores Keita Bates-Diop (12.1 ppg.) and Jae'Sean Tate (11.6 ppg.) also contribute double digits offensively to lead the team. Loving tops the squad with 7.0 rebounds a game with Bates-Diop adding 5.3 rpg. and Tate 6.9 boards a contest.

## Matta Earns Win No. 300 at Ohio State

When the Buckeyes defeated Minnesota in the 2015 Big Ten Tournament in Chicago, Thad Matta became the all-time wins leader in Ohio State history with victory No. 298 over his 12-year tenure with the Buckeyes. Matta passed Fred Taylor for the Ohio State wins record. Taylor amassed 297 triumphs from 1959-1976. Matta added another win a year ago in the second round of the 2015

NCAA Tournament, a 75-72 overtime affair over VCU in Portland, Oregon. The first victory of the 2015-16 season, a 76-54 win vs. Mount St. Mary's Nov. 15, was No. 300 for Matta at Ohio State. He has 405 career victories over his 16 seasons as a head coach, which includes one year at Butler, three at Xavier and 12 with the Buckeyes.

## Buckeyes Open 116th Season, 104th in B1G

This is the 104th season of Big Ten membership in men's basketball for the Buckeyes and the 116th overall for the sport at Ohio State. The Buckeyes are 91-22 in season openers and 96-17 in the first home game of the season. Ohio State is 54-57 in the first true road game of the season. In Big Ten Conference play, the Buckeyes are 55-44 in league openers, 67-32 in the first conference home game of the season and 36-63 in league road openers. Ohio State is 36-20 when the first conference game of the year is at home and 19-24 when opening conference play on the road. Thad Matta is 12-0 in season openers at Ohio State and is 8-3 in conference openers. In the last 12 years under Matta, the Buckeyes have opened league play at home six times (5-1) and have a 3-2 road opener mark.

### Buckeyes Face 3-of-4 2015 Final Four Teams

Ohio State will play a total of four games vs. three of the teams that qualified for the 2015 Final Four. The Buckeyes face Kentucky Dec. 19 in Brooklyn, New York, before a home-and-home series with Michigan State and a road game at Wisconsin during 2016 Big Ten regular-season play. The Buckeyes will face Illinois, Maryland, Michigan State, Northwestern and Rutgers twice this season. Iowa, Michigan, Minnesota and Penn State only travel to Columbus this year. Ohio State has lone road games in league play against Indiana, Nebraska, Purdue and Wisconsin.

### Matta Continues to Build Impressive Ohio State Resume

Thad Matta has accomplished a remarkable list of accomplishments in 12 years as head coach of the Buckeyes. Matta's teams have never failed to win 20 games, a record streak (11 seasons) in Ohio State history. In fact, Matta has never failed to reach the 20-win plateau in 15 years as a head coach. The Buckeyes finished 24-11 in 2014-15, advancing to their seventh-consecutive NCAA Tournament. Ohio State has reached 30 or more wins three times, all with Matta at the helm. Back-to-back seasons with 30 wins in 2010-11 (34) and 2011-12 (31) only trail the 35 wins recorded in 2006-07, the Ohio State record for single-season victories. In addition, Matta has five Big Ten regular-season titles, including three of the last six (2010-12), four Big Ten postseason tournament crowns in seven title game opportunities, nine NCAA Tournament appearances, including four-consecutive runs to the "Sweet 16," from 2010-13, a pair of Final Four trips (2007, 2012) and a title game appearance in

### Roster Turns Over After 2014-15, Rookies Abundant in 2015-16

Six players, five seniors and a freshman, departed the Ohio State program following the 2014-15 season. Four graduated (Sam Thompson, Shannon Scott, Trey McDonald and Amir Williams). Anthony Lee completed a one-year tenure with the Buckeyes as a fifth-year transfer and freshman D'Angelo Russell departed after his lone season in Columbus. Russell was the No. 2 overall pick in the 2015 NBA Draft. He went to the Los Angeles Lakers after an extraordinary freshman season. When the Buckeyes opened the season Nov. 15 vs. Mount St. Mary's in Columbus, the Ohio State roster featured eight newcomers to the program, six true freshmen, one redshirt freshman (David Bell) and one transfer (Trevor Thompson) will begin eligibility with the Buckeyes.

## Four Buckeyes Look to Build on 2014-15 Experience

Junior Marc Loving, Ohio State's lone upperclassman, along with three sophomores who experienced college basketball for the first time as rookies return to form the nucleus of the 2015-16 Buckeyes. Loving has the most game experience on the roster with 75 appearances and 27 career starts. He is a proven long-range scorer and consistent free throw shooter. He made 47 of 102 3-pointers as a sophomore (.461) and is a career 77 percent shooter (139-181) from the foul line. Jae'Sean Tate broke into the starting lineup midway through his rookie season. He earned a spot on the Big Ten All-Freshman team with an 8.8 points per game scoring average to go with 5.0 rebounds per game. Also back is redshirt sophomore Kam Williams, who demonstrated the ability to score from long range and the foul line (22-24/.917), and Keita Bates-Diop, another 3-point threat with the ability to block shots and rebound.

## Bell, Thompson Start Ohio State Careers After Year on Sidelines

Thompson is a 6-11 center from Indianapolis, Indiana. He played his freshman season of collegiate basketball at Virginia Tech. He sat out the 2014-15 season to satisfy NCAA transfer rules and will have three years of eligibility with the Buckeyes. As a freshman, Thompson competed in 30 games with 11 starts for the Hokies. He made 50 of 122 shots from the field (.410) and 49 of 75 from the foul line (.653). He averaged 5.0 points and 4.7 rebounds with a pair of double-doubles as a rookie. In 486 total minutes (16.2 mpg.), he was credited with 28 blocks and eight steals. Bell began his Ohio State academic career last year, working out with the team while gaining strength and sitting out games. The 6-10 center from Garfield Heights, Ohio, will have four years of eligibility starting this season. Thompson started the 2015-16 season opener vs. Mount St. Mary's while Bell came off the bench.

## Ohio State Opponents Highly Ranked Early

Thad Matta's Buckeyes, who have faced the third-most ranked opponents nationally (112) since he became head coach at Ohio State in 2005, will again battle the nation's best teams in 2015-16. The Buckeyes are scheduled to go against No. 1 Michigan State, No. 5 Kentucky, No. 6 Maryland, No. 10 Virginia and No. 11 Purdue for a total of seven games vs. ranked foes this season.

## CBS Sports Classic-Year 2

CBS Sports is bringing together four of the nation's most prestigious college basketball teams: Kentucky, North Carolina, Ohio State and UCLA, for a college basketball showcase, the CBSSPORTS CLASSIC. CBS Sports will broadcast a doubleheader in 2015 and 2016 following the first year of the event a year ago in Chicago. These four schools have combined to win 25 national championships and are among the winningest college basketball programs of all-time. The event debuted at the United Center in Chicago Dec. 20, 2014. North Carolina faced Ohio State and UCLA took on Kentucky. The CBS SPORTS CLASSIC moves to Barclays Center in Brooklyn,

New York, Dec. 19, 2015 and then travels to Las Vegas in December 2016.

## 104 Years in Big Ten

Ohio State will celebrate 104 years as a member of the Big Ten Conference in men's basketball in 2016. The Buckeyes finished in the No. 6 spot in the 1913 conference standings, the first season of league play. Over the 103 previous seasons, Ohio State has earned 20 Big Ten regular-season titles with 27 NCAA tournament appearances, one national championship (1960) and 10 trips to the Final Four. Ten former coaches and players are members of the Naismith Memorial Basketball Hall of Fame while 51 student-athletes have been drafted by National Basketball Association teams, including 24 in the first round.

## Dials Elected to Ohio State Athletics Hall of Fame

Terence Dials became the 37th men's basketball player in Ohio State history to be elected to the Athletics Hall of Fame. Dials lettered in 2002, was sidelined with a back injury in 2003 and then returned to action to complete his eligibility from 2004-06. The 2006 Big Ten Player of the Year, Dials rates among the Top 10 all-time at Ohio State in career field goal percentage (No. 4/.604), free throws attempted (No. 3/552) and career rebounds (No. 5/876). The two-time captain was a first team All-Big Ten selection in 2006 and was named the Chicago Tribune Big Ten Most Valuable Player that same year.

## Buckeye Bullets

- Sophomore Jae'Sean Tate set a career high with 22 points vs. Nebraska Feb. 26. He has four 20-point games to his credit, three in Big Ten Conference play and one in the 2015-16 opener vs. Mount St. Mary's (21 pts.). In the league games a year ago at Indiana (9-10 shooting/20 pts.), at Rutgers (8-11/20 pts.) and vs. Nebraska at home (8-9/22 pts.), he made a combined 25-of-30 field goals (.833). He made 8 of 12 shots vs. the Mountaineers Nov. 15 ... recorded first career double-double vs. Louisiana Tech Nov. 24 with 10 points and career high 12 rebounds.

- Tate finished his rookie season in the No. 4 spot among freshmen in Ohio State history in season field goal shooting percentage at 58.9 pct. (126-214). His father, Jermaine Tate, is No. 5 at 56.9 pct. (115-202). Jermaine played his freshman season at Ohio State in 1996. Tate is shooting .552 so far this season (37-67) including 6-of-13 from 3-point range. He made a total of three 3-pointers all of last season.

- Ohio State is 52-44 in Big Ten road games since Thad Matta took over the program at the start of the 2004-05 campaign. Only Wisconsin (55-41) has been more successful away from home in the last 11 years. Michigan State is No. 3 at 51-45.

- This year, Ohio State will play Illinois, Maryland, Michigan State, Northwestern and Rutgers both home and away. The Buckeyes will travel only to Indiana, Nebraska, Purdue and Wisconsin. Single home games will be against Iowa, Michigan, Minnesota and Penn State.

## Ohio Natives Join Ohio State Basketball Program

Thad Matta and the Ohio State men's basketball program inked a pair of recruits from the state of Ohio Nov. 11. Derek Funderburk, a 6-foot-9-inch forward from Lakewood and Micah Potter, a 6-9 center from Mentor, signed with Ohio State and will join the program for the 2016-17 season. Funderburk played at St. Edward High School before transferring to Hargrave Military Academy (Chatham, Virginia) for his senior season. Potter is playing his senior year at Montverde (Florida) Academy after playing for three years at Mentor High School. "These two signees bring versatility, size and rebounding to our program," Matta said. "With Micah we get a big who can play with his back to the basket as well as stretch the defense and face-up. With Derek we are getting an athletic, high energy guy who can impact both ends of the floor. I'm excited to have two high quality kids who have a deep appreciation for The Ohio State University."

Since Thad Matta took over the Ohio State program the Buckeyes have competed against 112 opponents ranked in the *Associated Press* Top 25, the third-most games against ranked foes in all of NCAA Division I men's basketball. ### Matta Extends Streak vs. Non-Conference Foes

Thad Matta has directed Ohio State to at least 10 wins during non-conference play in each of his 11 seasons in Columbus. Matta is 149-31 vs. non-conference competition at Ohio State and 154-67 vs. Big Ten foes (regular season and Big Ten tournament games) for an overall record of 303-98. In 16 seasons as a head coach (1 at Butler, 3 at Xavier and 12 at Ohio State) Matta is 159-70 vs. the current roster of Big Ten teams. He has winning records vs. 11-of-13 league opponents: ILL (15-5), IND (12-9), IOWA (12-7), MICH (18-7), MINN (13-6),

NW (17-1), PSU (19-2), PUR (18-7), NEB (8-1), MD (2-1) and RUT (1-0). He is a game under .500 vs. Michigan State (11-12) and is tied with Wisconsin (12-12).

### Matta's Big Ten Tenure

Thad Matta took over the head coaching duties at Ohio State in July of 2004. His 12 years in Columbus have been a successful stint, both nationally and in the Big Ten Conference.

**Matta vs. the Big Ten:** Matta's Buckeyes have played in the second most games (401) with more victories (303) than any other Big Ten program in the last 12 years. Michigan State is next in victories (298) and is the leader in total games (407).

**Matta in the B1G Regular Season:** The Buckeyes have won 132 Big Ten regular-season games, with 10-consecutive years winning at least 10 conference games. The Buckeyes have won 81 percent of league games decided by 10 or more points (78-18) in the Matta era. In games decided by less than 10 points, Ohio State is 54-42 (.584).

**B1G Titles in the Matta Era:** Ohio State has more overall conference titles (9) than any other league school over the last 12 years. Five of those are regular-season titles while four are conference tournament crowns. Michigan State is the next closest with five titles, three in the regular season and two conference tournament titles.

### Defending the 3 in Matta Era

Over the 12 years with Thad Matta as the head coach in Columbus, Ohio State is 93-21 (.816) when holding opponents to less than five made 3s. When foes make between 5-9 from distance, Ohio State is 165-61 (.730) and when opponents make 10 or more, the Buckeyes are 45-16 (.738). Ohio State is 240-65 (.787) when making at least five 3-pointers, 63-11 when making 10 or more (.851) and 63-32 (.663) when connecting on four or fewer.

Ohio State defeated the Wildcats and Golden Gophers in back-to-back games Feb. 19 and 22 of 2014. The Buckeyes downed Maryland 80-56 Jan. 26 in Columbus and won 79-60 at Rutgers Feb. 8.

## Matta Has Faced, Defeated Top Active Coaches

Ohio State's Thad Matta has faced 21 of the Top 25 active coaches by wins entering the 2015-16 season and has wins against all 19. Of the Top 10 coaches, Matta has faced and defeated eight. Matta entered the season No. 5 among active coaches in win percentage at .762 (401-125). In addition to owning wins vs. the top active coaches, Matta has a victory vs Coach Bob Knight, the No. 3 all-time winningest coach in NCAA history. Ohio State defeated Texas Tech, where Knight finished his coaching career, 77-71 Dec. 16, 2004 in Dallas. That game was Matta's ninth as Ohio State's head coach.

This is Matta's 16th year as a head coach and the 12th at Ohio State. He spent three seasons at Xavier (2002-2004) and one season at Butler (2001).

In the 19 most recent wins vs. the Top 24 active coaches by wins, Matta teams have been ranked among the Top 10 in 10 of the wins, were unranked in seven, faced Top 25 teams eight times and matched up against unranked opponents on 11 occasions. Opponents were ranked among the Top 10 four times.

Since taking over the Ohio State program for the start of the 2004-05 season, Thad Matta has the Big Ten's best overall record with a winning percentage of 76 percent. He also has directed the Buckeyes to the second-most regular-season Big Ten Conference wins with 132 and most overall wins with 301. Ohio State's 192 home wins in the Matta era rates No. 1 nationally and his home win percentage of .900 (192-22) also is No. 4 among all Division I programs.

## Buckeyes Own Four 1-Loss/Perfect Home Seasons Under Matta

Thad Matta has won at least 15 home games in each of his 11 seasons in Columbus. The 2006-07 squad finished with a perfect 18-0 record while the 2005-06 (16-1) and 2009-10 teams (18-1) squads each finished with a single loss at home. Matta is 192-22 overall in Columbus, the most home wins among Big Ten schools, during his tenure after finishing the 2013-14 season 17-3 at home and finishing 2014-15 at 18-2. Ohio State was 16-2 in 2012-13. Ohio State is 112-6 at home vs. non-conference opponents and 80-16 vs. Big Ten competition. Over the last seven seasons Ohio State is 110-13 in Columbus.

## Matta Owns Top Win Percentage Among Ohio State Coaches

Thad Matta, now in his 12th season as head coach of the Buckeyes, has an overall win percentage of 75.6 (303-98) at Ohio State. That winning mean is the highest among the 11 head coaches in the history of the Ohio State men's basketball program with three or more seasons on the sidelines. Matta's 132-60 (192 games) record in Big Ten regular-season play (.688) also has produced the highest winning percentage in conference play among any previous Ohio State coach. Fred Taylor (1959-76) is second in both overall win percentage (.653/297-158) and Big Ten win percentage (.608/158-102) in 18 seasons.

## The Buckeyes vs. Unranked (AP) Opponents - Matta Era

- Thad Matta is 169-6 in Columbus vs. unranked opponents. The Buckeyes have lost just three times to an unranked non-conference opponent during his 12 years at Ohio State. The losses were at the hands of West Virginia Dec. 27, 2008, UT Arlington Nov. 21, 2015 and Louisiana Tech Nov. 24, 2015.
- The Buckeyes are 109-3 vs. unranked non-conference opponents at home under Matta.
- Ohio State is 61-3 in Columbus with Matta at the helm vs. unranked Big Ten opponents.
- Ohio State had won 62-consecutive games vs. unranked non-conference opponents at home before the loss to UT Arlington Nov. 20.
- Matta began his career with a 45-game win streak vs. unranked non-conference opponents at home before the lone loss to West Virginia in 2008.
- After an overtime loss to Minnesota (1/19/2005) in Matta's first game vs. an unranked Big Ten foe at home in 2005, the Buckeyes won their next 53 games vs. unranked league foes before another overtime loss in 2014 vs. Penn State in Columbus (71-70/Jan. 29, 2014). The loss (71-65) to Iowa Dec. 30, 2014 is the only regulation loss to an unranked Big Ten foe in the Matta era.
- Ohio State was ranked among the Top 25 in 58-consecutive wins vs. unranked non-conference opponents at home before the 2015-16 home opener vs. Mount St. Mary's (11/15/15). The Buckeyes and Mountaineers were both unranked. Ohio State won 76-54.

## MATTA REACHES 400 GAMES COACHED AT OHIO STATE, NOW CLOSING ON OSU CAREER GAMES RECORD

The Buckeyes defeated VMI Dec. 5, 2015 in the 400th game for Thad Matta as head coach of the Buckeyes. He is the third coach to reach 400 or more games at Ohio State's helm. In the seventh game of his 12th season, Matta reached game No. 400. When Ohio State played at Illinois Jan. 5, 2013, Matta coached in game No. 300 at Ohio State. Only two previous coaches, Harold G. Olsen (1923-46) and Fred Taylor (1959-76), have reached 400 or more games at Ohio State. Olsen coached 456 (259-197) and Taylor 455 (297-158). His winning percentage after 100 games was second only to Taylor. At 200 games, Matta tied Taylor for best winning percentage to that point in OSU history. Matta's winning mean of .773 at 300 games topped Taylor and Olsen at the 300-game plateau. Ohio State's 75.5 winning percentage after 400 games under Matta is the best in school history.

**Ohio State 76,**  
**Mount St. Mary's 54**  
**Nov. 15, 2015, Columbus**

**Columbus** -- Sophomore Jae'Sean Tate scored a game-high 21 points to go with nine rebounds to lead Ohio State (1-0) to a 76-54 win over Mount St. Mary's (0-2) in the season opener for the Buckeyes. The win was No. 300 for Ohio State under the direction of Thad Matta, now in his 12th season in Columbus. A pair of Buckeyes posted their first career double doubles with junior Marc Loving scoring 15 points to go with 11 rebounds. Sophomore Keita Bates-Diop tallied 10 points and 10 rebounds. In all, Ohio State players reached double figures offensively and the team recorded 50 rebounds. Freshmen JaQuan Lyle, Daniel Giddens and Austin Grandstaff all scored on their first shots as Buckeyes. Four true freshmen saw action and combined to make 10 of 18 shots from the field. Ohio State scored on 50 percent of its shots (28-56) and 82 percent from the free throw line (14-17). The Buckeye defense held the Mountaineers to 33 percent shooting (21-63) and 28 percent from the 3-point line (7-25). Mount St. Mary's was outrebounded 50-22. Matta teams are 12-0 in season openers at Ohio State. He is 16-0 all-time in the first game of the season as a head coach, which includes three seasons at Xavier and one at Butler.

- Matta, the winningest coach in Ohio State history, earned his 300th win as head coach of the Buckeyes and has posted a 300-94 career record in Columbus.
  - Ohio State has won both series meetings with the Mountaineers.

  - Ohio State is 96-17 all-time in home openers. When the Buckeyes open the season at home, OSU is 91-22.

  - Freshmen JaQuan Lyle, Daniel Giddens and Austin Grandstaff all made their first shots from the field as Buckeyes. Lyle and Grandstaff both knocked down 3s while Giddens scored in the paint. Jae'Sean Tate, D'Angelo Russell and Keita Bates-Diop all made their first shots as Buckeyes, all 2 pointers, a season ago vs. UMass-Lowell. Amedeo Della Valle was the last rookie to connect on a 3-pointer as his first attempt as a Buckeye (Kansas City, Nov. 23, 2012).

**Ohio State 82,**  
**Grambling State 55**  
**Nov. 17, 2015, Columbus**

**Columbus** -- The Buckeyes showed Tuesday they are not opposed to spreading the wealth. In its 82-55 win against the Grambling State Tigers, Ohio State saw three players score in double figures: Keita Bates-Diop, Marc Loving and Kam Williams. Williams led the way with 22 points off the bench on 9-of-12 shooting and career-highs five rebounds and four steals. Bates-Diop and Loving each had 14 points. The 14 points tied a career high for Bates-Diop. The Buckeyes scored 40 of their 82 points off the bench. The Buckeyes outshot the Tigers 59 percent to 37 percent, shooting 65 percent in the second half. Freshman guard JaQuan Lyle tallied a career-high seven assists. Grambling had four players in double digits offensively, led by Nigel Ribiero and Remond Brown with 12 each.

**Columbus** -- Ohio State fell to UT-Arlington, 73-68, at Value City Arena. The Buckeyes held a 34-32 lead at halftime but the Mavericks opened the second half with a 12-2 run to make it a 44-36 contest. Ohio State cut the lead to three at 69-66 with 13 seconds remaining but the Buckeyes couldn't overcome the deficit as Erick Neal and Jorge Bilbao sealed it with four late free throws. JaQuan Lyle scored 15 points to go along eight assists and six boards while Keita Bates-Diop totaled 16 points and five rebounds for the Buckeyes. Kevin Hervey paced the Mavericks with 18 points and seven rebounds while Neal scored 17.

**Columbus** -- Ohio State dropped an 82-74 decision to Louisiana Tech in the third game of the Basketball Hall of Fame Invitational at Value City Arena. The Bulldogs held a 42-32 lead at the half before the Buckeyes (2-2) knotted the score at 55-all at the 11:26 mark of the second half. Louisiana Tech then went on a 10-2 run to take a 65-57 lead with 8:54 left and Ohio State couldn't get closer than four the remainder of the way as the Bulldogs stayed perfect on the year. Alex Hamilton paced Louisiana Tech with 24 points while Erik McCree added 17 points and 10 boards. Marc Loving posted a career-high 25 points while Jae'Sean Tate earned his first-career double-double with 10 points and 12 rebounds for the Buckeyes.

- This matchup marks the third meeting all-time between Ohio State and Louisiana Tech. Ohio State is now 1-2 in the series.
  - Both previous meetings were in postseason play as the Buckeyes fell 79-67 in the first round of the 1985 NCAA Tournament and defeated the Bulldogs 79-66 in the semifinals of the 1986 National Invitation Tournament
  - The Buckeyes are 7-4 all-time against current members of Conference USA
  - Ohio State is 109-12 (.901) at home since the 2009-10 season, the most home wins in the country.

  - Marc Loving reached 500 career points with his fourth of the game. Loving finished with a career high 25 points and now has 521 total.
  - Loving recorded a career-high 25 points. Loving had reached his previous high of 19 twice, with the last time coming vs. Maryland Jan. 29, 2015
  - Loving recorded six rebounds and reached 200 for his career with his fifth of the game
  - Jae'Sean Tate posted 10 points and 12 rebounds to record his first-career double-double
  - Tate tallied his 16th career game with double-digit points after posting 14 as a freshman a season ago
  - Tate recorded a career-high 12 rebounds with the fifth being number 20 for his career. Tate's previous high was nine rebounds vs. Mount St. Mary's Nov. 15, 2015
  - Daniel Giddens tallied four blocks and now has recorded 13 blocks through four games.
  - Giddens notched his first career start recording four points, eight rebounds and a career-high three steals

**MIAMI, Fla.** -- Shaq Goodwin scored 23 points and put Memphis ahead to stay with a basket to open overtime, helping the Tigers beat Ohio State 81-76 in the HoopHall Miami Invitational. Detric Lawson and Ricky Tarrant Jr. each scored 16 points for Memphis, which held Ohio State to 0-for-6 shooting in the extra session. Avery Woodson scored 11 for the Tigers. JaQuan Lyle scored 18, Marc Loving finished with 17 and Keita Bates-Diop added 10 for Ohio State. Memphis went up 75-70 with 2:25 left in regulation on Goodwin's three-point play, before Ohio State rallied in a game that was back and forth throughout. Tate scored at the rim to get the Buckeyes within three, and Bates-Diop's 3-pointer with just under a minute remaining knotted the game at 75.

Thompson matched his season average with seven points in the first half, helping the Cavaliers to 26-24 lead at the break.

## Game 7 Ohio State 89, VMI 62 Dec. 5, 2015, Columbus

**Columbus** -- Marc Loving, Jae'Sean Tate, Keita Bates-Diop and Trevor Thompson all scored in double figures as Ohio State snapped a four-game losing streak with an 89-62 win over VMI. Thompson, a sophomore transfer from Virginia Tech, scored seven points during a 15-2 run that gave Ohio State control of the contest midway through the first half. He finished with 13 points, the most he has scored in Buckeye uniform. JaQuan Lyle had a basket, two assists and a steal during the decisive run. He posted a line of eight points, seven assists and six rebounds. Tate had 19 points, while Loving tallied 17 and Bates-Diop added 12. QJ Peterson led the Keydets with 23 points while Tim Marshall and Julian Eleby added 12 and 11, respectively. Thanks largely to their big run, the Buckeyes took a 42-31 lead into the locker room at halftime, enjoying an advantage not only in points but also rebounds, assists, turnovers, blocks and steals. They scored 20 of their 42 points in the paint, and turned six offensive rebounds into nine second-chance points. The Keydets never got closer than 10 points in the second half. The Buckeyes took advantage of a VMI roster that had no one over 6-6, posting a 40-14 advantage in points in the paint and winning the battle of the boards 48-27.

## Game 8 Ohio State 74, Air Force 50 Dec. 8, 2015, Columbus

**Columbus** -- Marc Loving had 18 points and 10 rebounds and Ohio State beat Air Force 74-50. The Buckeyes never trailed while picking up their second consecutive win. JaQuan Lyle scored 12 points and Jae'Sean Tate added 11 for Ohio State. Trevor Lyons led Air Force with 13 points. Ohio State outscored the Falcons 24-5 over the last 13:19 of the first half, including a scoreless stretch of 6:44 until CJ Siples' put-back with 3.1 left. To show what kind of first half it was for Air Force, Loving answered with a running 3-pointer at the first-half buzzer, giving the Buckeyes a 37-16 halftime lead. Air Force scored the first four points of the second half, but the Falcons did not get closer than 17 points the rest of the way. The Buckeyes shot 47 percent from the floor in the first half while holding the Falcons to 22 percent. Ohio State dominated in the paint, outscoring the Falcons 24-6 in the first half and 38-18 for the game. The Buckeyes improved to 10-7 against teams currently in the Mountain West.
