Friars All-Time Vs. Ohio State: The Friars have posted a 0-1 mark all-time versus the Buckeyes. In the only game ever between the two teams, Ohio State earned an 84-83 win in Salt Lake City, Utah on March 15, 1990 in the NCAA Tournament.

Friars vs. The Big Ten: The Friars have recorded a 31-26 mark all-time versus teams from the Big Ten, including a 1-1 record last season. The Friars' last win against a Big Ten opponent was the team's 60-59 victory over Illinois on November 18, 2015 in the inaugural Gavitt Games. The team's most recent loss was a 77-64 defeat versus Michigan State at the Wooden Legacy in Anaheim, Calif., on November 29, 2015. The last time the Friars played at a Big Ten school was on December 29, 1997 when the squad was defeated at Purdue, 81-79.

Scouting the Buckeyes: Ohio State enters the game versus the Friars with a 2-0 mark on the season. The Buckeyes opened the season with wins at Navy (78-68) on Nov. 11 and versus North Carolina Central (69-63) on Nov. 14. Ohio State posted a 21-14 mark last season and an 11-7 record (sixth) in the Big Ten. The team advanced to the Second Round of the NIT. Ohio State returns all five starters from last season and eight of its 11 letterwinners. Junior guard Kam Williams is leading the team in scoring at 16.0 ppg. Senior forward Marc Loving was the squad's top scorer last season, averaging 14.0 ppg.

Gavitt Tipoff Games Year Two: The Gavitt Tipoff Games is an annual early-season series played between the BIG EAST and the Big Ten and named in honor of Dave Gavitt, a former Providence coach and commissioner of the BIG EAST and basketball visionary. This is the second year of the Gavitt Games. Last season,

Dave Gavitt Transformed Friar Basketball: Dave Gavitt led Providence College and Eastern basketball into the modern age. In 10 seasons as the head coach of the Friars, Gavitt led PC to 209 wins, including eight consecutive 20-win seasons, five NCAA appearances, three NIT appearances and five New England Coach of the Year honors. He led the Friars to 23 wins over Top-20 teams. His 1973 team made it to Final Four. In 1971, Gavitt was named Director of Athletics at PC, a position he held until 1982 when he resigned to be the director of the BIG EAST Conference. He also was named Head Coach of the 1980 USA Olympic basketball team. He was elected to the Naismith Basketball Hall of Fame in 2006.

Last Time In Columbus: The Friars are returning to Columbus for the first time since they were defeated by Dayton, 66-53, in the NCAA Tournament on March 20, 2015 at Nationwide Arena.

On Deck: The Friars will return to action on Saturday, November 19 when they play the first of consecutive home games. The Friars will play at home versus Grambling State on November 19 and St. Francis Brooklyn on November 21.

Friars Defeat University of Vermont: The Friars (1-0) opened the 2016-17 regular season with an 80-58 win over Vermont (1-1) at the Dunkin' Donuts Center on Nov. 14. With the win, the Friars improved to 79-11 all-time in season openers. Junior forward Emmitt Holt (Webster, N.Y.) made his Friartown debut and scored a game-high 22 points to lead all scorers. The junior college transfer from Indian Hills Community College shot an efficient 8-of-12 from the field and was 5-of-6 from the free throw line. He also grabbed five rebounds and had three blocks in 31 minutes. Junior forward Rodney Bullock (Hampton, Va.) added 18 points in just 25 minutes, while junior guard Kyron Cartwright (Compton, Calif.) dished out a career-high 12 assist and scored nine points. The Friars opened the game with back-to-back baskets from beyond the arc, juniors Rodney Bullock (Hampton, Va.) and Jalen Lindsey (Murfreesboro, Tenn.) sank both three-point attempts to put the Friars ahead 6-2 in the first minutes of the half. Kalif Young (Vaughn, Ontario) recorded his first career steal in the 10th minute which resulted in two back-to-back three point conversions by Emmitt Holt (Webster, N.Y.) and Lindsey. The Friars held the lead for 19 minutes of the first half, the only deficit came in the first minute of play when Vermont recorded the first basket of the game. The Friars greatest lead of the half was off of a jump shot from freshman Maliek White (Richmond, Va.) to improve the score to 27-15 in the 16th minute of play. At the half, the Friars led 34-28. Holt led the Friars on 12 points, converting on 5-of-6 field goal attempts. Bullock recorded five points and four assists. Vermont's Payton Henson posted a team high nine points on the half and was 4-for-11 from the field. The Friars grew their lead to a game-high 25 points, 80-55, in the second half with 37 seconds left. PC sophomore Ryan Fazekas (Chesterton, Ind.) recorded 11 points on the game and was 3-of-6 from beyond the three-point arc. Vermont Peyton Henson led the Catamounts with 21 points and six rebounds.

Bullock Top Returning Scorer: Junior forward Rodney Bullock (Hampton, Va.) is the team's top returning scorer. In his first season of collegiate action in 2015-16, Bullock was third on the team in scoring (11.4 ppg) and second in rebounding (6.8 rpg). He registered a team-high eight double-doubles last season and scored a career-high 23 points in a 73-69 win over Georgetown on February 13, 2016. In the Friars' first game this season, he scored 18 points and was 3-5 from three-point territory in an 80-58 win over Vermont on November 14.

Cartwright Gets The Point: Junior guard Kyron Cartwright (Compton, Calif.) takes over the point guard duties this season. Cartwright, who served as the back up for All-American Kris Dunn '16 for the last two seasons, averaged 5.9 ppg last season. He was second on the team in assists with 139. He was first in the Big East in assist to turnover ratio at 2.8.

Career High 12 Assists For Cartwright: Junior guard Kyron Cartwright (Compton, Calif.) registered a career-high 12 assists in the Friars' win over Vermont on November 14. It marked the 44th time in the 90-year history of Friar basketball that a player recorded 12 or more assists in a game.

Holt Registers 22 Points In Debut: Junior forward Emmitt Holt (Webster, N.Y.) recorded 22 points, five rebounds and three blocks in his Friar debut -- an 80-58 win over Vermont on November 14. He registered 19 points and 10 rebounds in the team's 87-69 exhibition win over Carleton on October 29. Holt, who started his college career at Indiana in 2014-15, played for Indian Hills Community College last year and ranked second in the nation in field goal percentage (68.9 percent). He also averaged 11.6 points and 6.4 rebounds.

Two Friars in NBA: The Friars had two players chosen in the 2016 NBA Draft. Kris Dunn was selected fifth overall by the Minnesota Timberwolves and Ben Bentil was selected with the 51st pick by the Boston Celtics. Dunn became the highest Friar selected in the NBA Draft since Marvin Barnes was picked second overall in the 1974 Draft. He also is the 11th Friar all-time to be drafted in the First Round of the NBA Draft. This also marked the first time two Providence players were selected in the NBA Draft in the same



year since 1997 when Austin Croshere (first round, 12th) and God Shammgod (second round, 46th) were both picked.

How The Friars Got To The NCAA Tournament Last Season: The Providence College Friars earned an at-large bid to their 18th NCAA Tournament overall and third consecutive after posting a 23-10 mark and a 10-8 record (fourth place) in BIG EAST play entering the NCAA Tournament First Round game in 2015-16. Providence had an RPI of 40 entering the NCAA Tournament and was a ninth seed.

Friars Looking To Make Fourth Consecutive NCAA Tournament Appearance For The First Time Ever: This season, the Friars are looking to make their fourth consecutive trip to the NCAA Tournament. Friars have never made four consecutive NCAA Tournament appearances. In 2015-16, the Friars made their third consecutive NCAA Tournament appearance. The team advanced to the NCAA Tournament in each of the previous three seasons (2014, 2015 and 2016). Providence has made three consecutive trips to the NCAA Tournament three times in the history of Friar basketball (1964-66, 1972-74 and 2014-16).

Friars All-Time In The NCAA Tournament: The Friars made their 18th appearance all-time in the NCAA Tournament in 2016, posting a 1-1 mark. The No. 9 seed Friars defeated Southern California, 70-69, at PNC Arena in Raleigh, N.C. The Friars lost in the Second Round to No. 1 seed North Carolina, 85-66. It was the Friars' third consecutive trip to the NCAA Tournament. In the 2014-15 season, the Friars were a No. 6 seed and were defeated by No. 11 seed Dayton, 66-53, at Nationwide Arena in Columbus, Ohio in the Second Round. In 2014, the Friars, a No. 11 seed, were defeated in the Second Round of the NCAA Tournament by No. 6 seed North Carolina, 79-77, at the AT&T Center in San Antonio, Texas. The Friars have posted a 15-19 mark all-time in NCAA Tournament play. The team has made two trips to the Final Four (1973 and 1987), four appearances in the Elite Eight (1965, 1973, 1987 and 1997) and five trips to the Sweet Sixteen (1965, 1973, 1974, 1987 and 1997).

Friars Earn First NCAA Tourney Win Since 1997: On March 17, 2016, the Friars defeated USC, 70-69, in the NCAA Tournament First Round. It marked the Friars' first NCAA Tourney win since 1997. The team was on a 0-5 streak in NCAA Tourney action prior to the win over USC. Providence had last earned a win in the NCAA Tournament when it defeated UT-Chattanooga, 71-65, on March 21, 1997 to advance to the Elite Eight.

Cooley And Friars Looking For Fifth Straight Post Season Appearance: This season, Head Coach Ed Cooley will look to bring the Friars to their fifth straight post-season appearance for the first time since 1993-97. When Cooley was hired in 2011, the Friars had finished under .500 in six of the 10 previous seasons and had been to just one NCAA Tournament (2004) in that 10-year span. In 2016, the Friars made their fourth consecutive post season appearance, including their third straight NCAA Tournament berth. In his second season as the Friars' coach, Cooley led the Friars to the 2013 NIT Quarterfinals. In 2014, 2015 and 2016, Cooley guided the team to the NCAA Tournament. It marked the first time the Friars had been selected to participate in four consecutive post seasons since 1997 (NCAA), 1996 (NIT), 1995 (NIT), 1994 (NCAA) and 1993 (NIT).

Friars Won 24 Games: The Friars' 24-11 record in 2015-16 marked the most wins for the Friars since the 1996-97 squad posted a 24-12 record and advanced to the Elite Eight. The last time the Friars won 25 games in a season was in 1987, when the team recorded a 25-9 record and advanced to the Final Four.

Friars Reached 22 Wins In Regular Season For First Time Since 1978: With a 22-9 mark after the 2015-16 regular season, the Friars reached 22 wins in the regular season for the first time since the 1977-78 season. Only five teams in the 89-year history of Friar basketball have registered 22 or more wins in the regular season (1965-66, 1972-73, 1973-74, 1976-77 and 1977-78).

Friars Earned 20th Win For Third Consecutive Season: The Friars posted a 24-11 record in 2015-16. It marked the third consecutive season the team earned 20 or more wins. The last time the Friars posted three consecutive 20-win seasons was 1977-78 (24-8), 1976-77 (24-5) and 1975-76 (21-11). Providence has recorded 20 or more wins in 26 of its 89 seasons of basketball. With a 22-12 mark in 2014-15, the Friars recorded 20 or more wins in consecutive seasons for the first time since the 1992-93 (20-13) and 1993-94

(20-10) seasons. In 2014-15, the Friars finished with a 23-12 mark and advanced to the NCAA Tournament.

Dunn Helped Create A Winning Culture At Providence: Guard Kris Dunn (New London, Conn.) graduated from Providence last spring but not before he helped change the culture of the Friar program. The team made the post-season each of his four years as a Friar. During Dunn's four year career at Providence, the team posted an 88-50 (.642) overall record. In BIG EAST play, the team registered a 40-32 (.556) record. The Friars went 19-15 in 2012-13 (NIT), 23-12 in 2013-14 (NCAA), 22-12 in 2014-15 (NCAA), and 24-11 in 2015-16 (NCAA).

Bentil Captured League Scoring Title: Forward Ben Bentil (Wilmington, Del.) became the seventh Friar all-time to earn the league scoring title when he averaged 22.9 ppg in league play in 2016. He became the fourth Friar in the last six years and the seventh overall to accomplish the feat. The six other Friars who have led the BIG EAST in scoring are LaDontae Henton in 2015 (20.1 ppg), Bryce Cotton in 2013 (18.3 ppg), Marshon Brooks in 2011 (26.0 ppg), Herbert Hill in 2007 (19.9 ppg), Ryan Gomes in 2005 (23.2 ppg) and Eric Murdock in 1991 (27.2 ppg).

Friars 40-1 In Non-Conference Action At The Dunk Under Ed Cooley: On November 14, 2016, the Friars defeated Vermont, 80-58, in the team's season opener. With the win, the team improved to 40-1 in six seasons under Ed Cooley in non-conference home games at the Dunkin' Donuts Center.

Cooley Earned Win No. 100 With PC: The Friars' 70-66 win over Creighton on March 2, 2016 was Ed Cooley's 100th victory as a Friar head coach. He joined Joe Mullaney (319-164), Dave Gavitt (209-84), Al McClellan (147-65), Tim Welsh (160-143) and Rick Barnes (108-76) as PC coaches who have 100 or more wins. He has a 104-67 mark in six seasons as the Friars head coach.

Friars In Close Games: The Friars posted a 9-1 record in 2015-16, including a 5-1 mark in BIG EAST games, in contests decided by four points or less. In two of those games, the Friars won with a shot at the buzzer - a 74-72 win at Rhode Island on Dec. 5 (Ben Bentil tip in) and a 50-48 victory at Creighton on Jan. 12 (Kris Dunn jumper).

First Top-10 Clash Ever At The Dunkin' Donuts Center: The Friars have played their home games at the Dunkin' Donuts Center since it opened in 1972. The team's 750th game all-time in the arena was its first ever top-10 matchup. On January 26, 2016, the No. 10/10 Friars were defeated by No. 7/8 Xavier, 75-68.

Friars All-Time Versus Top-25 Teams: The Friars have posted a 110-249 (.306) mark all-time versus top-25 teams, including a 4-6 record last season. In the Friars' first game versus a ranked squad last season, Providence earned a 69-65 win over No. 11/10 Arizona on Nov. 27 at the Wooden Legacy in Fullerton, Calif. In the team's second game versus a ranked opponent, the Friars were defeated by No. 3/4 Michigan State, 77-64, on Nov. 29 in Anaheim, Calif. In the Friars' third game against a ranked opponent, PC won at No. 9/10 Butler. It marked the team's first road win over a Top-10 team since 2004. In the squad's third game versus a ranked team, Providence earned a 71-68 victory over No. 18/24 Butler on Jan. 19. In the teams's fifth game against a ranked opponent, the Friars won at No. 4/4 Villanova, 82-76, on Jan. 24. It was the team's first win at a top-5 opponent since 2004. In the team's sixth game versus a ranked team the Friars were defeated by No. 7/8 Xavier, 75-68, in Providence. It marked the first time the Friars have been ranked in the top 10 and have hosted a top-10 team. The Friars were defeated by No. 3/4 Villanova, 72-60, on Feb. 6. On Feb. 17, the Friars were defeated at No. 8/7 Xavier, 85-74. The Friars were defeated by No. 3/2 Villanova, 76-68, on March 11 in the BIG EAST Semifinals. In the team's most recent game versus a ranked team, on March 19th, the University of North Carolina defeated the Friars 85-66 in the round of 32 of the NCAA tournament.

Providence College To Build Ruane Friar Development Center: It was announced on December 15 that a new gift from former Providence College Board of Trustees Chair Michael A. Ruane '71 & '13 Hon. and his wife, Elizabeth Ruane, will enable Providence College to begin construction of the Ruane Friar Development Center, a new multi-purpose facility that will significantly enhance Friar athletics, student services, and College community life. The College held a ground breaking ceremony on Oct. 1 to commence

Friars In Overtime: The Friars posted a 1-1 mark in overtime games last season. The team won in overtime at No. 4/4 Villanova, 82-76, on Jan. 24. In the team's second overtime game in 2015-16, the Friars were defeated at Marquette, 96-91, in double overtime. The Friars have registered a 59-62 mark all-time in overtime games.

"DG" Patch On Friar Uniforms: In memory of former Friar Head Coach Dave Gavitt the Friars have worn a "DG" patch on their uniforms since the 2011-12 season. Gavitt led PC and Eastern basketball into the modern age. In 10 seasons as the head coach of the Friars, Gavitt led PC to 209 wins, including eight consecutive 20-win seasons, five NCAA appearances, three NIT appearances and five New England Coach of the Year honors. He led the Friars to 23 wins over Top-20 teams. His 1973 team made it to Final Four. In 1971, Gavitt was named Director of Athletics at PC, a position he held until 1982 when he resigned to be the director of the BIG EAST Conference. He also was named Head Coach of the 1980 USA Olympic basketball team. He was elected to the Naismith Basketball Hall of Fame in 2006.

Providence College Basketball: The 2016-17 campaign marks the 90th season of basketball at Providence College. Since the program started in 1926-27, Providence has posted a 1,405-941 mark, good for a .599 winning percentage. The Friars have made the NCAA Tournament 18 times and the National Invitation Tournament on 19 occasions.



On March 22, 2011, Ed Cooley became the 15th head coach at Providence College. He came to Providence College after spending five seasons as the head coach at Fairfield University.

"When Bob and I sat down with Mike Tranghese and we talked about what we were looking for in our next coach, we quickly agreed that the No. 1 candidate for Providence College is Ed Cooley," Providence College President Fr. Brian Shanley, O.P. said. "I wanted a coach that could teach our players about the game of life. I also wanted a relationship builder and Ed is a relationship builder. He will connect with our players, our fans and the entire state of Rhode Island. I could not be more thrilled to have Ed Cooley as our basketball coach."

In five seasons at Providence College, Head Coach Ed Cooley has posted a **104-67 mark (.608)**. In 11 seasons as a head coach, Cooley has a **196-136 (.590)** record. When Cooley was hired in 2011, the Friars had finished under .500 in six of the 10 previous seasons and had been to just one NCAA Tournament (2004) in that 10-year span. Cooley has led the Friars to four consecutive post-season tournament berths, including three straight NCAA Tournament appearances (2014-16), and he guided the team to 2014 BIG EAST title.

Most recently, Cooley led the Friars to a 24-11 mark and a 10-8 record (fourth) in the BIG EAST in 2015-16. After finishing fourth in league standings for the third straight season, Providence advanced to the BIG EAST Semifinals for the third consecutive year, which has only occurred one other time in the history of Friar basketball. Most importantly, the Friars earned their third-consecutive berth in the NCAA Tournament, where the team registered a 1-1 mark, which included a First Round win over Southern California. It marked just the third time in the history of Friar basketball that the team reached the NCAA Tournament in three consecutive seasons. The squad also recorded 24 wins, which is the most since the 1996-97 season. With 24 wins, the Friars posted their third-consecutive season with 20 or more victories. It is the first time Providence has had three-consecutive 20-win seasons since 1975-78. Another milestone for the Friars was that they finished the regular season with 22 wins, which was the most since 1978 and just the sixth team all-time at PC to accomplish the feat. Cooley's Friars also were ranked for 13 weeks during the season, including a No. 8 national ranking on January 4. It marked the Friars' highest ranking in the Associated Press Poll since March 1, 1977 when the team was ranked No. 8.

Two of Cooley's players earned significant honors in 2015-16 and were both drafted as junior guard Kris Dunn (New London, Conn.) and sophomore Ben Bentil (Wilmington, Del.) earned All-BIG EAST accolades. Dunn also earned his second-consecutive BIG EAST Player of the Year and Defensive Player of the Year honors. He also earned numerous All-America accolades and was named a Consensus All-American. Bentil became the seventh Friar all-time and the third under Cooley to lead the BIG EAST in scoring, averaging 22.9 points per game. For his efforts, he was named BIG EAST Most Improved Player - the second time a Friar has received the honor in Cooley's five seasons at Providence.

Dunn was the fifth pick overall by the Minnesota Timberwolves and became the fourth highest Friar drafted all-time in the history of the NBA. Bentil was selected 51st overall in the second round by the Boston Celtics.

During his time at Providence, Cooley has coached three All-Americans. He also has had players earn two BIG EAST Player of Year honors, two BIG EAST Defensive Player of the Year accolades, two BIG EAST Most Improved Player awards, one BIG EAST Tournament MVP, three BIG EAST All-Tournament Team accolades, and seven All-BIG EAST honors.

In 2015, the Friars were picked fifth in the Preseason BIG EAST Coaches Poll. The team exceeded expectations when the squad placed fourth with an 11-7 record. It marked just the third time ever and the first time since 2004 that the Friars registered 11 conference wins. Overall, the squad posted a 22-12 mark and advanced to the NCAA Tournament in consecutive seasons for the first time since the 1988-89 and 1989-90 seasons. The team also posted its second consecutive season with 20 or more wins for the first time since 1992-93 and 1993-94 seasons.

Senior LaDontae Henton (Lansing, Mich.) and sophomore Kris Dunn (New London, Conn.) paced the Friars in 2015. Both players earned First Team All-BIG EAST honors and Associated Press Honorable Mention All-America accolades. Dunn, who led the BIG EAST in assists, ranked third in the nation in assists and fifth in the nation in steals. He was named the 2015 BIG EAST Player of the Year and he also earned BIG EAST Defensive Player of the Year accolades. Dunn became the first guard in the history of the league to win both honors in the same year. Henton, who led the BIG EAST in scoring in 2015 (20.1 ppg), finished his career

ranked second all-time in scoring at Providence (2,059 points) and fifth all-time in rebounding (1,054). He is just the second player ever at Providence to score more than 2,000 points and grab more than 1,000 rebounds.

Cooley's 2014 team was picked to finish sixth in the Preseason BIG EAST Coaches Poll, but overcame losses of personnel during the season to finish 10-8 and fourth overall. The Friars went on a run in the league tournament, posting three straight wins, including a thrilling 65-58 victory over No. 14 Creighton in title game. With the win, the Friars earned the league's automatic berth in the NCAA Tournament and made their first trip to the Tournament since 2004.

His 2014 squad was led by senior All-American Bryce Cotton (Tucson, Ariz.). Cotton had an amazing senior season in which he led the BIG EAST in assists (5.8) and finished second in scoring (21.8). He also led the nation in minutes played (39.9). He earned BIG EAST Tournament Most Outstanding Player honors and garnered his second consecutive First Team All-BIG EAST accolade. He finished his career ranked fifth overall in scoring at Providence with 1,975 points. His teammate, senior Kadeem Batts (Boston, Mass.) also was recognized for his stellar play as he was named All-BIG EAST Second Team.

It did not take long for Cooley to turn the Friar fortunes around. In his second season, he led the Friars to a 19-15 record overall and a 9-9 mark in league play. Included in the 9-9 BIG EAST record in 2012-13 was a 7-2 mark over the last nine games of the conference season. That impressive record marked the second best turnaround over the second half of the season in BIG EAST history. He then guided the Friars to the NIT where the squad posted a 2-0 record before losing in the quarterfinals to eventual NIT Champion Baylor.

Leading the way for the Friars in the 2012-13 season were Cotton and Batts. Cotton was named All-BIG EAST First Team after he led the league in scoring. His teammate, Batts was recognized as a co-winner of the league's Most Improved Award and earned All-BIG EAST Honorable Mention accolades.

In his first season at Providence, Cooley led the Friars to a 15-17 mark overall. The team posted an impressive 11-3 mark in non-conference action, which included an 8-0 record at home. In league action, the Friars defeated No. 14/15 Louisville, 90-59. The 31-point win marked the Friars' largest margin of victory ever over a ranked team. The squad also posted a 72-70 win over defending national champion Connecticut.

Two of Cooley's players earned BIG EAST honors in his first season. Point guard Vincent Council was named All-BIG EAST Third Team and one of his first recruits, forward LaDontae Henton earned BIG EAST All-Rookie Team accolades.

Cooley also has been involved with USA Basketball. In 2013, he served as a court coach during the USA U19 Training Camp for the World Championships. In 2014, Cooley served as an assistant coach for the USA U18 Team which captured a Gold Medal at the FIBA Americas Championship. Most recently, he was an assistant coach for the USA U19 Team at the World Championships in Greece in 2015. Cooley helped the team win a Gold Medal, his second in as many years.

Prior to coming to Providence, Cooley guided Fairfield to a school-record 25 wins and a Metro Atlantic Athletic Conference regular season title in 2010-11. He was named the 2011 MAAC Coach of the Year. He also earned United States Basketball Writers Association (USBWA) District I Coach of the Year honors. His 2011 squad finished the season with a 25-8 mark (15-3 MAAC) and advanced to the second round of the NIT.

In five seasons at Fairfield, Cooley's teams posted a 92-69 mark, including a 58-32 record in MAAC action. Cooley became the first Fairfield head coach to guide the team to a .500 or better mark in MAAC action in each of his first five seasons. In 2009-10, he led the Stags to a 23-11 mark and the team's first post-season berth since 2003. For his efforts in 2010, Cooley was the first recipient of the Ben Jobe Award, presented annually to the top minority men's basketball coach in the nation. Prior to taking the Fairfield position, Cooley spent 10 seasons as an assistant coach for Al Skinner. He coached for one season at Rhode Island under Skinner (1996-97) and nine seasons as an assistant at Boston College (1997-06), where the Eagles posted a 175-108 mark and advanced to five NCAA Tournaments and one NIT. Cooley also helped lead the Eagles to the 2001 BIG EAST Tournament title and three BIG EAST regular season titles (2001, 2003 and 2005). In 2004-05, Boston College started the season with a school-record 20 consecutive wins. In 2005-06, the Eagles advanced to the Atlantic Coast Conference championship game against Duke. At BC, Cooley was instrumental in the recruitment of Troy Bell, a two-time BIG EAST Player of the Year. Bell also went on to play professional basketball after leaving Boston College, which included a stint in the NBA with the Memphis Grizzlies.

A 1994 graduate of Stonehill College, where he was a three-time captain for the basketball team, Cooley began his coaching career at UMass-Dartmouth. He helped lead UMass-Dartmouth to a 25-4 mark and a No. 3 national ranking (1994-95). He returned to his alma mater, Stonehill, and served as an assistant coach for one season (1995-96) before joining Skinner's staff at URI. Cooley, a native of Providence, attended Central High School and earned two Rhode Island High School Player of the Year honors. He also did a post-graduate year (1988-89) at New Hampton Prep. before attending Stonehill. He and his wife, Nurys, have one daughter, Olivia, and one son, Isaiah.

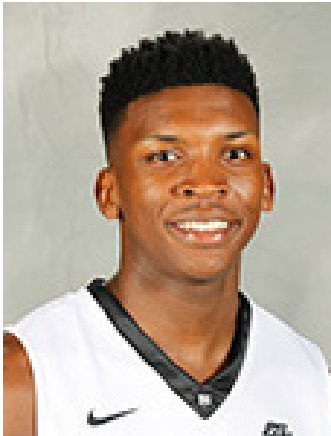

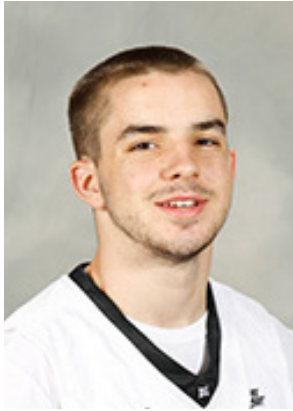
