Starting Five, Plus One

• The family of junior Keita Bates-Diop is working to give back after Kai, Keita's younger brother, suffered cardiac arrest and was revived by athletic trainers last year at a high school practice. The family is working to raise funds for organizations to purchase automated external defibrillators (AED), a device used by University High School (Bloomington, Ill.) athletic trainers Maddie Biehl and Emily Martz, to revive Kai last February. • Keita Bates-Diop was selected to the **Naismith Trophy Late Season Watch List** Feb. 15 by the Atlanta Tipoff Club as well as the **John R. Wooden Midseason Watch List** Feb. 5. He is one of 20 players who remain in the running for the Wooden Award and among the final 30 for the Naismith Trophy. Bates-Diop was one of 14 players nationally selected to the **U.S. Basketball Writers Association Oscar Robertson Trophy Midseason Watch List** Jan. 22. The award is given to the USBWA's college basketball player of the year. The Naismith Memorial Basketball Hall of Fame announced Feb. 7 Bates-Diop is one of 10 candidates for the **2018 Julius Erving Small Forward of the Year Award**.

• Chris Holtmann is the first Big Ten coach to record a 9-0 record in conference play during his first season since Sam Barry went 11-0 to start the 1923 campaign at Iowa 95 years ago. Holtmann is the third coach in conference history to start his career in league play at 9-0 or better. He also is the first Ohio State coach to win 20 or more (22) regular-season games in his first season in Columbus. Holtmann has won 20 or more games in each of his last five years as a head coach (Final year at Gardner-Webb, three at Butler and this season in Columbus).

Buckeyes Among Leaders in Home Wins

Ohio State is No. 1 nationally for the most home wins with a 149-24 (.861) record since the 2009-10 season. Maryland is the next-best Big Ten team at No. 15 with 133 wins. Going back to the 2008-09 season to the present, the Buckeyes own the most home victories with 164 wins over 191 games (164-27). The Buckeyes also have played the fifth-most ranked teams in the country since 2005. Ohio State has played 131 opponents ranked among the *Associated Press* Top 25 during that span. That total trails only West Virginia (144), Michigan State (140), North Carolina (134) and Texas (134).

• Both Jae'Sean Tate and Keita Bates-Diop, along with fifth-year transfer Andrew Dakich, are college graduates. Tate (sport industry) and Bates-Diop (economics) earned Ohio State degrees after three and a half years when they went through graduation ceremonies Dec. 17 in Columbus. Dakich (history) is a graduate of Michigan playing his final year of eligibility at Ohio State as a graduate transfer. Both Dakich and Tate are working on graduate degrees in coaching. Bates-Diop is now working on a minor in psychology. As a team, the Buckeyes posted a team GPA of 3.1 last semester with 10 student-athletes earning a 3.0 and five earning a 3.5 GPA.

• **By the Numbers:** Keita Bates-Diop reached 1,100 points for his career with a 35-point effort vs. Illinois Feb. 4 (1,148)...he is the 55th player in Ohio State history to reach 1,000 points for his career... he reached 500 (572) career rebounds with eight at Northwestern Jan. 17...after scoring 17 points to reach 1,000 for his career against Minnesota, Bates-Diop is the 28th player in Ohio State history to record 1,000 points and 500 rebounds...he reached 500 points this season (548) with 35 vs. Illinois... Thirty three former Buckeyes have scored 500 or more points in a season at least once for a total of 50 campaigns with a player scoring 500 or more in

a season...Bates-Diop is 39th on the all-time Ohio State scoring list.

C.J. Jackson reached 500 points for his career with five at No. 3 Purdue Feb. 7 (530)...Jackson played his 50th career game for the Buckeyes vs. Maryland Jan. 11...Jackson has 21 games this season with 10 or more points, including 20 in the last 25 games...he has 57 assists and 26 turnovers in the last 14 games. Jae'Sean Tate scored 16 points vs. Indiana to reach 1,400 career points (1,442)...he is averaging 12.4 points a game this season and 11.7 ppg. for his career...Tate ranks No. 22 all-time in career scoring (1,442). David Lighty is 21st with 1,458 career points.

In addition to his abilities on offense, Tate joined the 700 club in career rebounding at Ohio State with six boards vs. Indiana...he has 720 over 123 contests for an average of 5.9 a game...he became the 14th Buckeye all-time to reach 700 career boards...the game against the Hoosiers Jan. 30 was his 100th career start in an Ohio State uniform. Ohio State played in its 300th game this decade (2010-18) vs. The Citadel and is 232-83 after the loss the last time out vs. Penn State. The Buckeyes have put together the winningest decade in Ohio State history.

• Tate is one of just nine players in the NCAA this season to make every field goal attempt in a game in which they took double-digit shots after connecting on all 10 field goal attempts vs. Northeastern...Tate is second nationally in field goal percentage (.551) among players 6-4 or shorter...Bates-Diop is tied for fifth nationally among players 6-7 or shorter with 45 blocked shots...among players with at least 45 blocks, Bates-Diop has the third-highest PAR (points+assists+rebounds) nationally at 30.0...that 30.0 PAR is the third-highest among all Buckeyes since 1996-97, behind Evan Turner in 2009-10 (35.5) Michael Redd in 1997-98 (31.4) and ahead of D'Angelo Russell in 2014-15 (29.9) and Jared Sullinger in 2010-11 (28.5).

Bates-Diop Earns Fourth B1G POW

Keita Bates-Diop was named the Big Ten Conference Player of the Week for the fourth time Feb. 5 after wins over Indiana and Illinois. The Bloomington, Illinois, native averaged 24 points

and 13 rebounds vs. the Hoosiers and Illini. He scored a career-high 35 points vs. Illinois Feb. 4 to go with 13 boards. He scored 13 points, grabbed 13 rebounds, handed out five assists and blocked four shots vs. Indiana Jan. 30. The last Buckeye to earn four B1G honors in the same season was Jared Sullinger in 2011. Evan Turner claimed the award seven times in 2010. Sullinger was the national and Big Ten freshman of the year in 2011 and Turner was the National and Big Ten Player of the Year in 2010. Bates-Diop was selected B1G POW Jan. 15 after earning the honor the week before as well on Jan. 8. The 6-7 forward also earned the honor Dec. 11, 2017. Bates-Diop averaged 23 points and 8.5 rebounds in a home win over Maryland and a road victory at Rutgers. He averaged 29.5 points and 10 rebounds in wins at Iowa and at home vs. No. 1 Michigan State. He poured in a then career-high 32 points vs. the Spartans after a 27-point effort at Iowa. His earlier award also followed a pair of Ohio State victories. In the 97-62 win over William & Mary Dec. 9, Bates-Diop scored 27 points after an 18-point, nine-rebound effort against Michigan Dec. 4. For that week, Bates-Diop connected on 62 percent of his shots from the field (16-26), 50 percent from 3-point range (4-8) and 90 percent at the foul line (9-10). Against William & Mary, the Buckeyes made 10-consecutive field goal attempts early in the second half, Bates-Diop made five of those buckets, all from inside the arc, to help Ohio State to a commanding lead.

Sharing the Rock

The Buckeyes currently have seven players with 25 or more assists on the year. C.J. Jackson leads the team with 116 helpers with Jae'Sean Tate next at 80. The last time an Ohio State team finished with seven players with 25 or more assists was the 2011-12 Final Four squad that finished the year 31-8 overall (13-5 in the Big Ten.).

Double-Digit Conference Wins

Chris Holtmann has won 10 or more regular-season conference games in each of the last five years as a head coach. He won 11 games in the Big South Conference in his final year at Gardner-Webb in 2013. At Butler, Holtmann teams won 12, 10 and 12 league games in the Big East from 2015-17. Ohio State is 13-2 in Big Ten play this season, the first in Columbus for Holtmann.

Five Seasons with 20 Wins

Holtmann teams also have won 20 or more games in each of his last five full years as a head coach. Ohio State is 22-6 overall heading into the game at Michigan Sunday. Gardner-Webb won 21 games in

2013 with Holtmann at the helm. Butler reached 23, 22 and 25 wins over the last three seasons before Holtmann took over at Ohio State. Of Ohio State's 14 head coaches in the history of men's basketball, only Gary Williams and Thad Matta won 20 games in their first season in Columbus. Williams was 20-13 in 1987 and took the Buckeyes to the NCAA Tournament, where the team defeated Kentucky for its 20th win of the season before losing to Georgetown. Matta was 20-12 in 2005 but the Buckeyes were ineligible for postseason competition that year. The Buckeyes won their 20th game in the Big Ten Tournament over Penn State before ending the season with a loss to Wisconsin. Holtmann is the first Ohio State coach in history to win 20 regular-season games in his first year in Columbus. The 22 wins this year is an Ohio State record for most wins by a first-year coach.

Less Stress in League Wins

Ohio State has won eight regular-season Big Ten conference games this season by 10 or more points. Prior to the Buckeyes downing Wisconsin in Madison to open the 2018 Big Ten regular season (83-58), Ohio State had gone a span of 40 regular-season league games with eight wins by 10 or more points starting with a 24-point win vs. Nebraska Feb. 26, 2015 through the end of the 2017 regular season vs. Indiana March 4, 2017 (L96-92) in Columbus. The Buckeyes owned eight double-digit conference wins during the 2015 league season when the Buckeyes were 11-7 in conference play. In the 16-2 2011 Big Ten season, Ohio State won nine league games by 10 or more points and six games by five or fewer.

Hot Starts to Big Ten Campaign

Ohio State last started 9-0 in the Big Ten during the 2011 conference season with 11-consecutive wins to start the league season. Chris Holtmann is the first Ohio State coach to start the conference season 9-0 in his first year in Columbus.

* The last time Ohio State won nine-consecutive conference games was at the end of the 2010 season (4) and the start of the 2011 campaign (11). Seven of those games were on the road and four were against ranked teams (at No. 11 Michigan State, at No. 23 Illinois, vs. No. 12 Purdue and at No. 18 Minnesota).

COLUMBUS -- Keita Bates-Diop scored 18 and C.J. Jackson added 17 as Ohio State rallied in the second half to beat Michigan 71-62. The Buckeyes trailed by as many as 20 points in the first half and didn't lead until 7 1/2 minutes had ticked off in the second, when Bates-Diop hit a pair of foul shots to make it 47-46. Ohio State turned on the defense in the second half while sprinting out on a blistering 19-3 run, following a 7-0 burst to end the first half. A Kam Williams jumper with 3:32 left in the game tied it at 60, and Ohio State hit 11 free throws and pulled away, thanks in part to some poor Michigan shooting. Moritz Wagner led the way for Michigan with 14 points, and Zavier Simpson and Muhammad-Ali Abdur-Rahman each added 11. The Wolverines led 43-30 at the half with six different players hitting a 3-pointer, and Wagner hitting 2 of 3 attempts. Michigan led by as many as 20 in the half, but the 7-0 run - capped by a monster dunk by JaeSean Tate - pulled it closer.

Rookie Recognized, Again

Freshman Kaleb Wesson was named the Big Ten Freshman of the Week by the Big Ten Conference Jan. 22 after earning the honor first Dec. 4. Wesson averaged 11.5 points and 7.0 rebounds in wins at Northwestern and vs. Minnesota in New York last week.

Ohio State Leaders

Junior Keita Bates-Diop has paced the Buckeyes over the first 28 games of the season with 19.6 points a game with a total of 247 rebounds (8.8 rpg.). He is one of three regulars shooting better than 50 percent from the field (203-403/.504). He also leads the Buckeyes with 45 blocks. Senior Jae'Sean Tate connects on 55 percent of his shots (140-254) for an average of 12.4 ppg. He is second with 80 assists. In 24 starts over 27 games, freshman center Kaleb Wesson has scored on 101 of 180 field goal attempts (.561). As a team, Ohio State has scored at least 80 points in 12 games this season (3 in 2016-17) and has made 50 percent or better in 12 games (11 in 2016-17).

Ohio State vs. Michigan Series

Ohio State leads the all-time series with Michigan 97-76. The Buckeyes are 37-46 in Ann Arbor and 56-27 in Columbus. The teams have met six times on neutral courts with the Buckeyes winning four. Ranked Ohio State teams are 35-9 against the Wolverines. When both teams are ranked nationally in the AP Top 25, Ohio State is 7-6. Seniors Jae'Sean Tate and Kam Williams along with junior Keita Bates-Diop have the most experience among the current Buckeyes with five games played against the Wolverines by Tate and Williams and four by

Bates-Diop. Tate averages 11.0 points and 4.8 boards in the series. He has made 24-40 field goals (.600) in 26.4 minutes per game vs. Michigan. Williams contributes 5.4 points. Bates-Diop averages 9.0 points and 5.0 rebounds. Junior C.J. Jackson averages 12.5 points and 7.0 rebounds in two career meetings against the Wolverines. The Buckeyes are 6-4 in the last 10 meeting with Michigan. Ohio State is 5-5 in the last 10 games at the Crisler Center. The last time both team teams were ranked when facing one another at Crisler was a Top 10 matchup Feb. 5, 2013 when No. 10 Ohio State fell to No. 3 Michigan in overtime 76-74. The last time both teams were ranked against each other was March 15, 2014 when No. 24 Ohio State fell at Bankers Life Arena in Indianapolis to the No. 8 Wolverines 72-69 in the Big Ten Tournament.

Scouting the Wolverines

Michigan enters the Ohio State game with a 21-7 record to go with a 10-5 Big Ten record. Junior forward Moritz Wagner leads the team offensively with 14.6 points per game. He also leads the squad in rebounding with 7.3 boards a contest. Sophomore guard Charles Matthews contributes 13.8 points a game ahead of senior guard Muhammad-Ali Abdur-Rahkman's 11.7 a contest.

Ohio State vs. The Big Ten

The Buckeyes own an overall record of 815-715 against current league members. Chris Holtmann is new to the Big Ten but no stranger to Big Ten competition. He faced six league opponents during his six years as a head coach prior to taking over for the Buckeyes this year. He entered his first year of Big Ten competition with a 4-5 record vs.

conference foes. He is 17-7 vs. conference opponents in seven years as a head coach.

Holtmann Era in Columbus

June 9, 2017 marked the first day of the Chris Holtmann era at Ohio State. After six seasons as a head coach, including the last three at Butler, Holtmann became the 14th head coach in Ohio State men's basketball history. In his young career to date, Holtmann already has earned coach of the year honors in both the Big South Conference (2013), where he spent three seasons coaching Gardner-Webb (2001-13), and in the Big East (2017) in the final of three seasons with the Bulldogs. His first game in Columbus, a win over Robert Morris, was the 200th of his head coaching career (136-91).

Buckeyes In Midst of Best Decade in History

With 232 wins in the last nine seasons (2010-18), Ohio State already has more victories this decade than in any other in the program's history. Ohio State won 189 games from 1980-1989 and 188 contests from 1960-69. The winning percentage of .737 (232-83/315) in the last nine years is the best previous winning percentage in a decade in Ohio State history.

Noting the Penn State Game

- The game marked the 50th meeting between Ohio State and Penn State.
- The Buckeyes lead the series 34-16 all-time against the Nittany Lions.
- Ohio State is 13-9 on the road against Penn State.
- The Buckeyes are 18-6 when they enter the game ranked in the Top 25 vs. Penn State.

Chris Holtmann, Ohio State first-year head coach, announced the signing of four recruits for the 2018-19 season Nov. 8, 2017.

Justin Ahrens, a 6-foot-5-inch forward from Versailles, Ohio, Jaedon LeDee, a 6-foot-9-inch forward from Houston, Texas, Luther Muhammad, a 6-foot-3-inch guard from Jersey City, N.J., and Duane Washington, a 6-foot-3-inch guard from Chatsworth, Calif., signed their National Letter of Intent to join the Buckeyes as part of Holtmann's first full recruiting class in Columbus.

"We are very excited about the addition of Justin, Jae, Luther and Duane," Holtmann said. "Our staff did an outstanding job working tirelessly and diligently to add these four young men who we feel can make an early impact in our program and who exemplify what we want to be as a Buckeye. They all provide versatility and they complement each other very well. Ohio State Faces Several in AP Top 25

The Buckeyes will face six opponents in 2017-18 ranked among the nation's Top 25 in the current *Associated Press* Poll. The Buckeyes opened the PK80 event in Portland, Oregon, vs. No. 9 Gonzaga, the runner-up in the 2017 NCAA Tournament, Nov. 23 (L 86-59). No. 14 North Carolina, the 2017 National Champion, defeated the Buckeyes 86-72 Dec. 3 in New Orleans. Clemson, No. 11 in the poll this week, downed the Buckeyes 79-65 Nov. 29 in the Big Ten/ACC Challenge in Columbus. In Big Ten play, the Buckeyes topped current No. 22 Michigan at home Dec. 4 71-62 and then No. 1/current No. 2 Michigan State (H) 80-64 Jan. 7. The Buckeyes defeated No. 6 Purdue (A) 64-63 Feb. 7 in West Lafayette.

Veterans Lead Host of Newcomers

Seniors Kam Williams, now in his fifth year, and Jae'Sean Tate are the most experienced Buckeyes on the 2017-18 roster with 127 and 123 games played, respectively. Keita Bates-Diop, who sat out the majority of the 2016-17 season with a stress fracture, is next at 103 games played. This season, Ohio State has seven players new to the program.

Bates-Diop Returns

After sitting out all but nine games in 2016-17 with a stress fracture in his left leg, Keita Bates-Diop is back healthy and expected to make significant contributions to the Buckeyes this season. Bates-Diop has two seasons of eligibility remaining after receiving a medical redshirt after last season. Bates-Diop averages 11.1 points and 5.6 rebounds a game in 103 career appearances. His ability to block shots (117 career rejections) and convert at the foul line (190-243/.782) also adds balance to the Ohio State offensive and defensive efforts this year.

Ohio Well Represented on 2017-18 Roster

The Top 2 Ohio high school basketball players during the 2016-17 season are part of The Buckeyes' 2017-18 roster in Chris Holtmann's first year in Columbus. The state's top player, forward Kaleb Wesson of nearby Westerville, Ohio, signed with the Buckeyes in November of 2016. The No. 2 player in the state from a year ago, forward Kyle Young, took a different route to becoming a Buckeye. Young, a Massillon, Ohio, native, committed to Butler while Holtmann was coaching in Indianapolis last year. Once Holtmann and his three assistants from Butler agreed to take over the Ohio State program, Young decided to return to his home state and play for the Buckeyes. In all, seven players on Ohio State's current roster hail from the state of Ohio.

Buckeyes Add One of Indiana's Best

Chris Holtmann and his staff wasted no time working to build Ohio State's roster for the 2017-18 season upon taking the job in Columbus in early June. Seven players returned from the 2016-17 roster with one freshman (Kaleb Wesson) set to join the 2017-18 Buckeyes when Holtmann settled in as Ohio State's 14th head coach in men's basketball. Soon after, another highly-touted regional prospect elected to join Ohio State's 2017-18 roster. Musa Jallow, a 6-5 Bloomington, Indiana, native completed requirements to graduate from Bloomington North High School early and reclassify from the class of 2018-19 to 2017-18 and become a Buckeye. One of top players in the state of Indiana, Jallow gives the Buckeyes a quality scorer, rebounder and defender.

Bench Gets Deeper

In addition to adding a pair of scholarship student-athletes in the freshman class, the Buckeyes also grew the roster with a graduate transfer and three additional walk-ons for a roster of 14 heading into the 2017-18 season. Andrew Dakich took an unconventional route to Columbus through Ann Arbor, Michigan, where he played for the Wolverines before electing to transfer to Ohio State after completing his degree (history) at Michigan with a year of eligibility remaining. He is studying sports coaching at Ohio State in a master's program. Connor Fulton, a freshman guard from Salt Lake City had planned to join Butler as a preferred walk-on before Chris Holtmann and his staff took over at Ohio State. Fulton elected to alter his path to Columbus in the same capacity once Holtmann became a Buckeye. A pair of local products also elected to don the Scarlet and Gray after starting their careers

elsewhere. Juniors Matt Lehmann, who prepped locally at Bishop Watterson, and Danny Hummer, from nearby Upper Arlington, completed the Ohio State roster for this season. Lehmann played briefly for West Virginia before transferring to Ohio State to continue his academic pursuits. Hummer played for Air Force before electing to return to Columbus and join the Buckeyes.

Schedule to Test Buckeyes in 2017-18

Chris Holtmann inherited one of the more difficult schedules in recent memory at Ohio State. The season tipped off officially Nov. 10 vs. Robert Morris (W, 95-64) to begin the Chris Holtmann era in Columbus.

* The Buckeyes took part in the annual Big Ten/ACC Challenge Nov. 29. Ohio State fell to Clemson in Columbus 79-65.

* In honor of Nike's Phil Knight's 80th birthday, Ohio State traveled to Portland, Oregon, for three games the week of Thanksgiving after a home game vs. Northeastern Nov. 19 for the PK80 Invitational Nov. 23-26. Ohio State opened the event in Portland vs. then-No. 17 Gonzaga Nov. 23.

* Now in its fourth year, Ohio State played in the CBSSports Classic. The event took place in New Orleans this season Dec. 23. The Buckeyes take on defending national champion North Carolina (L, 86-72) while Kentucky faced UCLA. The Buckeyes battled both teams that squared off for the 2017 NCAA title this season (Gonzaga and UNC).

* Two Big Ten Conference were played in early December this year as the conference showcases its annual postseason tournament a week earlier than normal at Madison Square Garden in New York (Feb. 28-March 4). Ohio State travelled to Wisconsin Dec. 2 (W, 83-58) and defeated Michigan Dec. 4 (71-62) in Columbus.

* Two of Ohio State's nine league road games were played in non-traditional venues this season. Ohio State faced Northwestern Jan. 17 at Allstate Arena in Rosemont, Illinois, while renovations take place at the Wildcats' Welsh-Ryan Arena. The Buckeyes and Minnesota played at Madison Square Garden in New York Jan. 20 as part of the 2018 Big Ten Super Saturday double-header with the hockey programs from Minnesota and Michigan State. Ohio State defeated both Northwestern and Minnesota.

* The Buckeyes will have 18 home games in 2017-18 plus an exhibition contest vs. the College of Wooster Nov. 5.

* Eight Big Ten Conference opponents take on the Buckeyes once this year. Ohio State plays

host to Illinois, Maryland, Michigan State and Nebraska and travel only to Minnesota (neutral site), Northwestern (Allstate Arena, Rosemont, Illinois), Purdue and Wisconsin. The Buckeyes play Indiana, Iowa, Michigan, Penn State and Rutgers both home and away.

* Ohio State will play 17 regular-season games against 14 teams that advanced to postseason play in 2017. Eleven games are scheduled vs. 2017 NCAA Tournament teams (Wisconsin, Gonzaga, Northwestern, Maryland, Minnesota, Texas Southern, North Carolina, Michigan (2), Purdue and Michigan State) while six contests pit the Buckeyes vs. 2017 NIT squads (Illinois, Clemson, Indiana (2) and Iowa (2)).

* Every Ohio State game will be available on BTN, ESPN, FOX or CBS platforms. At least one home game (Michigan State) and a neutral site game (North Carolina) are scheduled for CBS.

Williams On Pace for 1,000 Career Points

Jae'Sean Tate became the 54th player to accomplish the feat of scoring 1,000 career points at Ohio State with 20 points at Maryland Feb. 11. He has 1,442 points (11.7 ppg.) in 123 career appearances. Keita Bates-Diop, the 55th Buckeye all-time to score 1,000 career points (1,148/11.1 ppg.), did so with 17 points vs. Minnesota Jan. 20 at Madison Square Garden. Fifth-year senior Kam Williams (974 career points) is close to reaching 1,000 points. Williams scored 300 points as a junior and 290 during his sophomore season.

106 Years in the Big Ten

Ohio State celebrates 106 years as a member of the Big Ten Conference in men's basketball in 2018. The Buckeyes finished in the No. 6 spot in the 1913 conference standings, the first season of league play. Over 105 seasons, Ohio State has earned 20 Big Ten regular-season titles with 27 NCAA tournament appearances, one national championship (1960) and 10 trips to the Final Four. Ten former coaches and players are members of the Naismith Memorial Basketball Hall of Fame while 51 student-athletes have been drafted by National Basketball Association teams, including 24 in the first round.

Tate in Exclusive Club, Bates-Diop Joins

Ohio State senior Jae'Sean Tate entered both the 1,000 career-point and 500 career-rebound club last season with 458 points and 205 boards. He currently owns 1,442 points and 720 rebounds. Keita Bates-Diop became the 28th Buckeye in history with both 1,000 points and 500 rebounds with a 17-point effort vs. Minnesota Jan. 20. In 103 career games, Bates-Diop has 1,148 points and 572 boards.

Off the Bench

- Keita Bates-Diop had season-ending surgery Jan. 25, 2017 on his left leg to repair a stress fracture he had been battling since missing about two months of 2016 summer workouts with the injury. Bates-Diop played in nine games last season around illness, a right ankle sprain sustained in the Providence game (Nov. 17, 2016) and lingering pain from the left-leg stress fracture. He averaged 9.7 points and 5.2 rebounds last season. Ohio State applied for a medical redshirt season on Bates-Diop's behalf following the 2016-17 campaign. it was granted and he has two seasons of eligibility remaining (2017-18 and 2018-19).
- The Buckeyes were 7-7 in 2016-17 in games decided by five or fewer points. Wins were against Michigan (70-66), Providence (72-67), Connecticut (64-60), UNC Asheville (79-77), Michigan State (72-67), at Nebraska (67-66) and at Penn State (71-70). Losses were to Indiana (96-92), Virginia (63-61) on the road, Florida Atlantic (79-77), at Illinois (75-70), Purdue (76-75), Northwestern (74-72) and Nebraska (58-57).
- Jae'Sean Tate was the only Power 5 Conference player 6-4 or shorter who averaged more than six rebounds per game in 2016-17. Overall, Tate tied for 18th nationally among players 6-4 or shorter with 6.4 rebounds per game...he also was ninth nationally among players 6-4 or shorter with 1.9 offensive rebounds per game.

Holtmann vs. the Ranked

In seven seasons as a head coach, three at Gardner Webb (2011-13), three at Butler (2015-17) and one at Ohio State, Chris Holtmann is 15-17 overall against opponents ranked among the *Associated Press* Top 25. He was 0-2 at GW and 13-13 at Butler. His teams were 6-9 vs. Top 10 foes at Butler and 3-4 vs. Top 5 opponents. He is 2-2 at Ohio State after a win over No. 3 Purdue Jan. 7 in West Lafayette (64-63).

- The Buckeyes are 39-69 vs. Top 5 opponents all-time. The Buckeyes knocked off No. 1 Michigan State 80-64 in Columbus and No. 3 Purdue 64-63 in West Lafayette this year. Ohio State's last non-conference game vs. a Top 5 opponent was in New Orleans vs. No. 5 North Carolina in the CBSSports Classic (L, 86-72, 12/23/17). Ohio State's last win vs. a nonconference Top 5 opponent was 74-67 in the CBS event over No. 4 Kentucky in Brooklyn, New York, Dec. 19, 2015. Ohio State was unranked vs. Michigan State, the Tar Heels and Wildcats. Against the nation's No. 1 team, Ohio State is 9-11 all-time, including a 6-5 record in Columbus. At Value City Arena, Ohio State is 28-23 vs. ranked opponents, 24-19 vs. ranked Big Ten foes, 6-3 vs. Top 5 teams and 3-2 against No. 1 ranked competition.

Buckeyes Battle the Best of 2017

Ohio State has played both teams that competed for the 2017 NCAA title last year. The Buckeyes fell to No. 17 Gonzaga (86-59) in Portland, Oregon, in the PK80 Invitational Nov. 23. The Bulldogs fell to North Carolina in the 2017 National Championship game. The Buckeyes faced the Tar Heels Dec. 23 in New Orleans in the 2017 CBSSports Classic. No. 5 North Carolina won that game 86-72.

The last time Ohio State played both teams that participated in the national title game from the previous season was in 1993-94 when the Buckeyes traveled to No. 2 North Carolina and fell to the Tar Heels 81-68 Dec. 18, 1993 and faced Michigan twice, home and away. Ohio State fell in overtime at No. 10 Michigan 86-75 Jan. 13, 1994 and at home to No. 11 Michigan 72-70 Feb. 13, 1994. North Carolina defeated Michigan for the 1993 National Championship.

The last time Ohio State played a pair of Final Four participants from the previous season was in 2015-16 when Ohio State played Kentucky, Wisconsin and Michigan State, all three were Final Four participants in 2015. Ohio State defeated

No. 4 Kentucky 74-67 in the CBSSports Classic (12/19/15). The Buckeyes were 0-3 vs. No. 2 Michigan State and 0-1 vs. Wisconsin, the national runner-up in 2015, during the 2016 Big Ten season.

CBS Sports Classic-Year 4

CBS Sports has brought together four of the nation's most prestigious college basketball teams the last three years and will do so again over the next three. Kentucky, North Carolina, Ohio State and UCLA, will again meet for a college basketball showcase, the CBSSPORTS CLASSIC in 2017, 2018 and 2019. These four schools have combined to win 26 national championships and are among the winningest college basketball programs of all-time. The event debuted at the United Center in Chicago Dec. 20, 2014. North Carolina faced Ohio State and UCLA took on Kentucky. The CBS SPORTS CLASSIC moved to Barclays Center in Brooklyn, New York, Dec. 19, 2015, where the Buckeyes knocked off No. 4 Kentucky 74-67. The teams travelled to Las Vegas in 2016 where the Buckeyes faced UCLA. Ohio State played North Carolina Dec. 23 in New Orleans. The event will be held in Chicago in 2018. The Buckeyes are 1-3 in the event to date with a win over Kentucky and losses to North Carolina (2) and UCLA.

HEAD COACH CHRIS HOLTMANN

Chris Holtmann took over the Ohio State men's basketball head coaching position June 12, 2017 after a successful three-year stint as head coach at Butler (2015-2017). He was an assistant at Butler during the 2013-14 season after a three-year run as head coach at Gardner-Webb (2011-13).



Holtmann was named conference coach of the year at both his previous stops earning the honor in 2013 in the Big South and then in 2017 in the Big East following a 25-9 campaign with the Bulldogs.

The 14th head coach in Ohio State history, Holtmann is a 1994 graduate of Taylor University, where he majored in Psychology. He also has a master's degree in Athletics Administration from Ball State (2000).

As a player at Taylor, he earned NAIA All-America status in 1994 under the direction of Paul Patterson.

Prior to becoming a head coach, Holtmann was an assistant for John Groce (Ohio U.) and Brandon Miller (Butler). Both Groce and Miller were former Ohio State assistant coaches.

COLUMBUS -- Keita Bates-Diop scored 18 and C.J. Jackson added 17 as Ohio State rallied in the second half to beat Michigan 71-62. The Buckeyes trailed by as many as 20 points in the first half and didn't lead until 7 1/2 minutes had ticked off in the second, when Bates-Diop hit a pair of foul shots to make it 47-46. Ohio State turned on the defense in the second half while sprinting out on a blistering 19-3 run, following a 7-0 burst to end the first half. A Kam Williams jumper with 3:32 left in the game tied it at 60, and Ohio State hit 11 free throws and pulled away, thanks in part to some poor Michigan shooting. Moritz Wagner led the way for Michigan with 14 points, and Zavier Simpson and Muhammad-Ali Abdur-Rahkman each added 11. The Wolverines led 43-30 at the half with six different players hitting a 3-pointer, and Wagner hitting 2 of 3 attempts. Michigan led by as many as 20 in the half, but the 7-0 run - capped by a monster dunk by JaeSean Tate - pulled it closer.

He sat the game out with his right foot wrapped and was using crutches.

Game 20 No. 22 Ohio State 71, Northwestern 65 Jan. 17, 2018, Rosemont

ROSEMONT, Ill. -- Chris Holtmann, head coach of the Buckeyes, became the first coach in 95 years to go 7-0 in his first season coaching in the Big Ten Conference after No. 22 Ohio State defeated Northwestern 71-65 Wednesday at the Allstate Arena in Rosemont, Ill. Micah Potter came off the bench to score 13 points on 5 of 5 shooting from the field. C.J. Jackson scored 12 points and handed out eight assists to go with three steals for the Buckeyes. He knocked down 3 of 4 free throws in the final 26 seconds of the game to ice the win for Ohio State, which tied its 2017 Big Ten total of seven wins in as many tries in 2018. The Buckeyes' 16 overall wins is one shy of the 17 victories posted by Ohio State a season ago. Ohio State led 33-25 after the first 20 minutes and fought off Northwestern's second half comeback to secure the win. Keita Bates-Diop, who entered the game leading the Big Ten in scoring, tallied 10 points to go with eight rebounds for Ohio State. He is just four points shy of scoring his 1,000th career point for the Buckeyes. He reached 500 career rebounds in the win over the Wildcats.

NEW YORK -- Keita Bates-Diop had 17 points and 12 rebounds for his eighth double-double of the season, leading No. 22 Ohio State over Minnesota 67-49 at Madison Square Garden for its seventh consecutive win. Ohio State's first-year coach Chris Holtmann is the third Big Ten coach to win his first eight conference games. Sam Barry won 11 straight for Iowa in 1923 and Walter Meanwell holds the record with 12 for Wisconsin in 1912. The Buckeyes used a 24-2 burst to overcome a 10-point deficit midway through the first half. They stayed in control, and went on to match last season's win total - with 10 regular season game remaining. Minnesota was held to just six field goals (28.6 percent) in the second half with 10 turnovers. Kaleb Wesson added 15 points and eight rebounds for Ohio State. Bates-Diop reached 1,000 career points, with his fourth point against Minnesota, to become the 55th Buckeye to do so. Jae Sean Tate had 10 points, six rebounds and five assists and trails Brent Darby (1,368) by 14 points for the 26th spot on the school's scoring list.

Penn State 79, No. 8 Ohio State 56

STATE COLLEGE, Pa. -- Tony Carr scored 30 points and Penn State topped No. 8 Ohio State 79-56 to sweep the Buckeyes. Mike Watkins added 11 points and 10 rebounds for his 10th double-double of the season, and Shep Garner and Josh Reaves added 13 and 10 points apiece for the Nittany Lions. C.J. Jackson led Ohio State with 13 points and Keita Bates-Diop added 10 for the Buckeyes. The Nittany Lions took control in the first half with a 12-0 run over 5:06 as the Buckeyes went 0-for-5 in that span. Carr tossed an alley-ooop Watkins' way and the forward jammed home the run's second basket to give Penn State the lead for good just 3:20 in. Penn State added a pair of 7-0 runs and a 6-0 spurt later in the half and Carr buried an awkward layup off a full-court inbounds pass and an ensuing free throw to give Penn State a 45-21 halftime lead. The Buckeyes trailed by as many as 30 early in the second but used an 18-4 run to cut Penn State's lead to 16 with 10:32 to play. Bates-Diop hit a 3-pointer to pull the Buckeyes to 58-42 but they wouldn't get any closer.

Notes:

- The game marked the 50th meeting between Ohio State and Penn State.
- The Buckeyes lead the series 34-16 all-time against the Nittany Lions.
- Ohio State is 13-9 on the road against Penn State.
- The Buckeyes are 18-6 when they enter the game ranked in the Top 25 vs. Penn State.
- The Buckeyes outscored the Nittany Lions in the paint 38-24.
- The Buckeyes are now 5-3 when they are outrebounded by their opponents.
- Keita Bates-Diop scored 10 points while adding six rebounds, two assists, and two blocks in the contest.
- Bates-Diop's 10 points bring his career total to 1,148 and elevate him to the 39th spot on the Ohio State all-time scoring list.
- Jae'Sean Tate scored six points, while adding four rebounds, an assist, and a steal.
- Tate's six points give him 1,442 for his career and move him past Bill Hosket (1,441) for the 22nd spot on the Ohio State all-time scoring list.
- C.J. Jackson led the Buckeyes with 13 points, adding three rebounds and an assist.
- The game marked the 21st double figure scoring effort for Jackson on the season.
