Starting Five, Plus One

• The family of junior Keita Bates-Diop is working to give back after Kai, Keita's younger brother, suffered cardiac arrest and was revived by athletic trainers last year at a high school practice. The family is working to raise funds for organizations to purchase automated external defibrillators (AED), a device used by University High School (Bloomington, Ill.) athletic trainers Maddie Biehl and Emily Martz, to revive Kai last February. • The Big Ten games last weekend were scheduled to accommodate the Big Ten Tournament at Madison Square Garden in New York Feb. 28-March 4, a week earlier than normal. Ohio State has played a league game earlier than the games this weekend. The Buckeyes and Penn State played Nov. 20, 1998 because a suitable date during the traditional conference season was not available that year.

• Evan Turner, who was Ohio State's 38th Hall of Fame inductee a season ago, was recognized Sept. 9 during Ohio State's matchup with Oklahoma on the gridiron for his donation of \$500,000 to the men's basketball program. The donation will be used for graphics and to name the hallway outside the men's basketball practice facility. Turner was the National Player of the Year in college basketball in 2010 and was the No. 2 pick in the NBA Draft that year (Philadelphia).

• Keita Bates-Diop opened the season with three-consecutive double-doubles (10+Pts/10+Rebs) vs. Robert Morris, Radford and Texas Southern. Bates-Diop has 12 career D-Ds and six this season after recording a pair in Portland at the PK80 event and then most recently at Wisconsin.

• Keita-Bates Diop reached 400 rebounds for his career with seven vs. Clemson...he's averaging 9.9 boards a game this season with 99 caroms in 10

Buckeyes Among Leaders in Home Wins

Ohio State has the second most home wins nationally with a 139-23 (.858) record since the 2009-10 season. Maryland is the next-best Big Ten team at No. 15 with 123 wins. Going back to the 2008-09 season to the present, the Buckeyes are second in home victories as well with 154 wins over 180 games (154-26). The Buckeyes also have played the third-most ranked teams in the country since 2005. Ohio State has played 128 opponents ranked among the *Associated Press* Top 25 during that span. That total trails only Michigan State (139) and West Virginia (140).

games...Jae'Sean Tate reached 1,200 career points with 16 at Wisconsin (1,227)...he's averaging 13.3 points a game this season and 11.7 ppg. for his career...he passed Ohio State great John Havlicek on the career scoring list with 16 points against Michigan the last time out...Tate ranks No. 35 all-time in career scoring behind Larry Siegfried (1,228) and Ron Stokes (1,240).

C.J. Jackson has seven games this season with 10 or more points, including six in the last seven games... he tallied a career-high 23 points vs. Stanford at PK80 before a 19-point effort vs. Butler Nov. 26.

• Tate is one of just four players in the NCAA this season to make every field goal attempt in a game in which they took double-digit shots after connecting on all 10 field goal attempts vs. Northeastern...Tate is 10th nationally in field goal percentage (.554) among players 6-4 or shorter... Tate 24th nationally and second among Power 5 conference players 6-4 or shorter with 6.2 rebounds per game...Keita Bates-Diop is tied for fifth nationally with six double-doubles.

Hot Start to Big Ten Campaign

Ohio State last started 2-0 in the Big Ten during the 2016 conference season with wins at home vs. Minnesota and Illinois. The Buckeyes then won at Northwestern before a loss at Indiana. The last Ohio State coach to start his tenure with a 2-0 league mark was Randy Ayers in the 1990 Big Ten season.

Ohio State downed Indiana at home and Iowa on the road before a loss at Michigan State. No former Ohio State coach has started the conference season 3-0 in his first year in Columbus.

The Next Four

After a pair of Big Ten Conference wins against Wisconsin on the road and Michigan at home, Ohio State returns to the non-conference schedule for home games vs. William & Mary Dec. 9 (noon/BTN+), Appalachian State Dec. 16 (BTN/6 p.m.), The Citadel Dec. 19 (BTN/7 p.m.) and against North Carolina Dec. 23 in New Orleans (CBS/1:30 p.m.). The game against the Tar Heels is part of the 2017 CBSSports Challenge.

Rookie Recognized

Freshman Kaleb Wesson was named the Big Ten Freshman of the Week by the Big Ten Conference Dec. 4 following a spit with Clemson and Wisconsin. In the win vs. the Badgers on the road, Wesson scored a career-high 19 points while connecting on 6-8 shots from the field and 6-7 foul shots. He made 65 percent of his shots over the two games (11-17) and 10-12 free throws. Over the first nine games of his career, he averaged 11.7 points 4.3 rebounds and went to the foul line a team-high 57 times, making 41 (.719).

Early Leaders

Junior Keita Bates-Diop paced the Buckeyes over the first 10 games of the season with 17.4 points a game with a total of 99 rebounds (9.9 rpg.). He is one of three regulars shooting better than 50 percent from the field (64-126/.508). He also led the Buckeyes with 22 made 3-pointers and was the team leader in blocked shots with 14. Senior Jae'Sean Tate connected on 55 percent of his shots (56-101) for an average of 13.3 ppg. He topped the Buckeyes with 12 steals and was second with 30 assists. In four starts over nine games, freshman center Kaleb Wesson scored on 31 of 54 field goal attempts (.574) and led the team in both made (41) and attempted (57) free throw attempts.

Ohio State vs. William & Mary Series

The game vs. William & Mary is the first for the Buckeyes against the Tribe. Ohio State owns a 10-2 record all-time vs. teams representing the Colonial Athletic Conference following a, 80-55 win over Northeastern Nov. 19 in Columbus.

Ohio State vs. The Big Ten

The Buckeyes own an overall record of 804-713 against current league members. Chris Holtmann is new to the Big Ten but no stranger to Big Ten competition. He faced six league opponents during his six years as a head coach prior to taking over for the Buckeyes this year. He entered his first year of Big Ten competition with a 4-5 record vs. conference foes. He is 6-5 vs. conference opponents in seven years as a head coach.

In his young career to date, Holtmann already has earned coach of the year honors in both the Big South Conference (2013), where he spent three seasons coaching Gardner-Webb (2001-13), and in the Big East (2017) in the final of three seasons with the Bulldogs. His first game in Columbus, a win over Robert Morris, was the 200th of his head coaching career (121-88).

Buckeyes Open 119th Season, 106th in B1G

This is the 106th season of Big Ten membership in men's basketball for the Buckeyes and the 119th overall for the sport at Ohio State. The Buckeyes are 97-21 in season openers and 100-17 in the first home game of the season. Ohio State is 54-62 in the first true road game of the year. In Big Ten Conference play, the Buckeyes are 58-46 in league openers, 71-33 in the first conference home game of the season and 38-65 in league road openers. Ohio State is 39-20 when the first conference game of the year is at home and 19-26 when opening conference play on the road.

Buckeyes In Midst of Best Decade in History

With 217 wins in the last nine seasons (2010-18), Ohio State already has more victories this decade than in any other in the program's history. Ohio State won 189 games from 1980-1989 and 188 contests from 1960-69. The winning percentage of .731 (217-80) in the last nine years is the best previous winning percentage in a decade in Ohio State history.

Noting the Michigan Game

- The game marked the 173rd meeting between Ohio State and Michigan.
- The Buckeyes lead the series 97-76 in the series all-time including a 56-27 record in games played in Columbus.
- Ohio State has won three-consecutive games and four of the last five meetings in the series.
- Ohio State is 13-2 vs. Michigan in Value City Arena all-time.
- Ohio State is 5-1 at home this year, 1-0 in Big Ten play.
- Against Big Ten competition at Value City Arena all-time, Ohio State is 102-33.
- Against all-opponents at VCA, Ohio State is 240-45.
- Ohio State completed its first 20+ point comeback victory since defeating the Tennessee Volunteers in the 2007 NCAA Tournament. OSU trailed 49-29 in the first half vs. the Vols

and came back to win 85-84. The Buckeyes trailed Michigan 43-23 in the first half Monday and won 71-62

- The Buckeyes picked up their first win of the season when trailing at the half as well as their first win of the season when trailing with five minutes to play in regulation.

- The Buckeyes ended the game on a 14-2 run while holding Michigan to two points in the last 4:54 of play.

- The Buckeyes are 7-0 this season when scoring 70-plus points.

- Ohio State held Michigan to just 19 second-half points, the first time holding a Big Ten opponent to 20 or fewer points in a half since holding Penn State to 20 Jan. 26, 2016.

- Ohio State is now 71-33 in Big Ten home openers.

- The last time Ohio State overcame a 10+ point deficit at the half was against Purdue (-12/35-23) March 1, 2015. OSU won that game 65-61. The Buckeyes trailed Michigan 43-30.

- Ohio State made 12 of 16 shots inside the arch in the second half (.750) and 17-21 foul shots (.810)

- The game marked the second time Chris Holtmann has squared off against the Wolverines. Holtmann holds a 1-1 record against Michigan for his career and 1-0 at the helm of the Buckeyes.

- Keita Bates-Diop racked up 18 points, nine rebounds, an assist, a block, and a steal on the day.
- Bates-Diop has led the Buckeyes in scoring in five of their 10 contests on the year.

- The Buckeyes are 4-1 in games in which Bates-Diop leads the team in scoring this season.

- Jae'Sean Tate scored 14 points to go along with four rebounds and an assist.

- His 14 points moved him to 35th in all-time scoring at Ohio State with (1,227). He passed John Havlicek (1,223) and is two points away from passing Larry Siegfried (1,228) for 34th on the list.

- C.J. Jackson scored 17 points while adding four assists and six rebounds while going 7-8 from the free throw line.

- Kyle Young scored a career-high six points in the contest on a perfect 3-3 while also grabbing a career-high four rebounds.

Ohio Mr. Basketball at Ohio State

Freshman Kaleb Wesson, a 6-9 rookie from nearby Westerville, Ohio, was named Mr. Basketball in the state of Ohio following his senior year at Westerville South High School in 2017. Wesson earned the 12th Ohio Mr. Basketball award among nine players to sign with the Buckeyes out of high school and the 13th among those to play for Ohio State. Ohio State Faces Several in AP Top 25

The Buckeyes will face five opponents in 2017-18 ranked among the nation's Top 25 in the current *Associated Press* Poll. The Buckeyes opened the PK80 event in Portland, Oregon, vs. No. 12 Gonzaga, the runner-up in the 2017 NCAA Tournament, Nov. 23 (L 86-59). North Carolina, the 2017 National Champion, also is on Ohio State's schedule and ranked nationally. The Tar Heels, ranked No. 11, will meet the Buckeyes Dec. 23 in New Orleans as part of the 2017 CBSSports Classic. In Big Ten play, the Buckeyes meet No. 3 Michigan State (H) and No. 14 Minnesota (N) and No. 21 Purdue (A) once this season.

Veterans to Lead Host of Newcomers

Seniors Kam Williams, now in his fifth year, and Jae'Sean Tate are the most experienced Buckeyes on the 2017-18 roster with 111 and 104 games played, respectively. Keita Bates-Diop, who sat out the majority of the 2016-17 season with a stress fracture, is next at 84 games played. Heading into the 2017-18 campaign, Ohio State has seven players new to the program.

Bates-Diop Returns

After sitting out all but nine games in 2016-17 with a stress fracture in his left leg, Keita Bates-Diop is back healthy and expected to make significant contributions to the Buckeyes this season. Bates-

Diop has two seasons of eligibility remaining after receiving a medical redshirt after last season. Bates-Diop averages 9.1 points and five rebounds a game in 85 career appearances. His ability to block shots (86 career rejections) and convert at the foul line (123-161/.764) also adds balance to the Ohio State offensive and defensive efforts this year.

Ohio Well Represented on 2017-18 Roster

The Top 2 Ohio high school basketball players during the 2016-17 season are part of The Buckeyes' 2017-18 roster in Chris Holtmann's first year in Columbus. The state's top player, forward Kaleb Wesson of nearby Westerville, Ohio, signed with the Buckeyes in November of 2016. The No. 2 player in the state from a year ago, forward Kyle Young, took a different route to becoming a Buckeye. Young, a Massillon, Ohio, native, committed to Butler while Holtmann was coaching in Indianapolis last year. Once Holtmann and his three assistants from Butler agreed to take over the Ohio State program, Young decided to return to his home state and play for the Buckeyes. In all, seven players on Ohio State's current roster hail from the state of Ohio.

Buckeyes Add One of Indiana's Best

Chris Holtmann and his staff wasted no time working to build Ohio State's roster for the 2017-18 season upon taking the job in Columbus in early June. Seven players returned from the 2016-17 roster with one freshman (Kaleb Wesson) set to join the 2017-18 Buckeyes when Holtmann settled in as Ohio State's 14th head coach in men's basketball. Soon after, another highly-touted regional prospect elected to join Ohio State's 2017-18 roster. Musa Jallow, a 6-5 Bloomington, Indiana, native completed requirements to graduate from Bloomington North High School early and reclassify from the class of 2018-19 to 2017-18 and become a Buckeye. One of

top players in the state of Indiana, Jallow gives the Buckeyes a quality scorer, rebounder and defender.

Bench Gets Deeper

In addition to adding a pair of scholarship student-athletes in the freshman class, the Buckeyes also grew the roster with a graduate transfer and three additional walk-ons for a roster of 14 heading into the 2017-18 season. Andrew Dakich took an unconventional route to Columbus through Ann Arbor, Michigan, where he played for the Wolverines before electing to transfer to Ohio State after completing his degree (history) at Michigan with a year of eligibility remaining. He is studying sports coaching at Ohio State in a master's program. Connor Fulton, a freshman guard from Salt Lake City had planned to join Butler as a preferred walk-on before Chris Holtmann and his staff took over at Ohio State. Fulton elected to alter his path to Columbus in the same capacity once Holtmann became a Buckeye. A pair of local products also elected to don the Scarlet and Gray after starting their careers elsewhere. Juniors Matt Lehmann, who prepped locally at Bishop Watterson, and Danny Hummer, from nearby Upper Arlington, completed the Ohio State roster for this season. Lehmann played briefly for West Virginia before transferring to Ohio State to continue his academic pursuits. Hummer played for Air Force before electing to return to Columbus and join the Buckeyes.

Schedule to Test Buckeyes in 2017-18

Chris Holtmann inherited one of the more difficult schedules in recent memory at Ohio State. The season tipped off officially Nov. 10 vs. Robert Morris (W, 95-64) to begin the Chris Holtmann era in Columbus.

* The Buckeyes took part in the annual Big Ten/ACC Challenge Nov. 29. Ohio State fell to Clemson in Columbus 79-65.

* In honor of Nike's Phil Knight's 80th birthday, Ohio State traveled to Portland, Oregon, for three games the week of Thanksgiving after a home game vs. Northeastern Nov. 19 for the PK80 Invitational Nov. 23-26. Ohio State opened the event in Portland vs. No. 17 Gonzaga Nov. 23.

* Now in its fourth year, Ohio State will again play in the CBS Sports Classic. The event will take place in New Orleans this season Dec. 23. The Buckeyes take on defending national champion North Carolina while Kentucky takes on UCLA. The Buckeyes face both teams that squared off for the 2017 NCAA title this season (Gonzaga and UNC).

* Two Big Ten Conference games were played in early December this year as the conference showcases its annual postseason tournament a week earlier than normal at Madison Square Garden in New York (Feb. 28-March 4). Ohio State travelled to Wisconsin Dec. 2 (W, 83-58) and defeated Michigan Dec. 4 (71-62) in Columbus.

* Two of Ohio State's nine league road games will be played in non-traditional venues this season. Ohio State faces Northwestern Jan. 17 at Allstate Arena in Rosemont, Illinois, while renovations take place at the Wildcats' Welsh-Ryan Arena. The Buckeyes and Minnesota will play at Madison Square Garden in New York Jan. 20 as part of the 2018 Big Ten Super Saturday double-header with the hockey programs from Minnesota and Michigan State.

* The Buckeyes will have 18 home games in 2017-18 plus an exhibition contest vs. the College of Wooster Nov. 5.

* Eight Big Ten Conference opponents take on the Buckeyes once this year. Ohio State plays host to Illinois, Maryland, Michigan State and Nebraska and travel only to Minnesota (neutral site), Northwestern (Allstate Arena, Rosemont, Illinois), Purdue and Wisconsin. The Buckeyes play Indiana, Iowa, Michigan, Penn State and Rutgers both home and away.

* Ohio State will play 17 regular-season games against 14 teams that advanced to postseason play in 2017. Eleven games are scheduled vs. 2017 NCAA Tournament teams (Wisconsin, Gonzaga, Northwestern, Maryland, Minnesota, Texas Southern, North Carolina, Michigan (2), Purdue and Michigan State) while six contests pit the Buckeyes vs. 2017 NIT squads (Illinois, Clemson, Indiana (2) and Iowa (2)).

* Every Ohio State game will be available on BTN, ESPN, FOX or CBS platforms. At least one home game (Michigan State) and a neutral site game (North Carolina) are scheduled for CBS.

Two on Pace for 1,000 Career Points

Jae'Sean Tate became the 54th player to accomplish the feat of scoring 1,000 career points at Ohio State with 20 points at Maryland Feb. 11. He has 1,227 points (11.7 ppg.) 105 career appearances. This year, fifth-year senior Kam Williams (842 career points) and redshirt junior Keita Bates-Diop (774) are within striking distance or reaching 1,000 points. Williams scored 300 points as a junior and 290

Tate in Exclusive Club, Bates-Diop on Pace
Ohio State senior Jae'Sean Tate entered both the 1,000 career-point and 500 career-rebound club last season with 458 points and 205 boards. He currently owns 1,227 points and 621 rebounds. Keita Bates-Diop could become the 28th Buckeye in history with both 1,000 points and 500 rebounds with a strong junior campaign. In 85 career games, Bates-Diop has 774 points and 424 boards. Off the Bench

• Keita Bates-Diop had season-ending surgery Jan. 25, 2017 on his left leg to repair a stress fracture he had been battling since missing about two months of 2016 summer workouts with the injury. Bates-Diop played in nine games last season around illness, a right ankle sprain sustained in the Providence game (Nov. 17, 2016) and lingering pain from the left-leg stress fracture. He averaged 9.7 points and 5.2 rebounds last season. Ohio State applied for a medical redshirt season on Bates-Diop's behalf following the 2016-17 campaign. it was granted and he has two seasons of eligibility remaining (2017-18 and 2018-19).

• The Buckeyes were 7-7 in 2016-17 in games decided by five or fewer points. Wins were against Michigan (70-66), Providence (72-67), Connecticut (64-60), UNC Asheville (79-77), Michigan State (72-67), at Nebraska (67-66) and at Penn State (71-70). Losses were to Indiana (96-92), Virginia (63-61) on the road, Florida Atlantic (79-77), at Illinois (75-70), Purdue (76-75), Northwestern (74-72) and Nebraska (58-57).

• Jae'Sean Tate was the only Power 5 Conference player 6-4 or shorter who averaged more than six rebounds per game in 2016-17. Overall, Tate tied for 18th nationally among players 6-4 or shorter with 6.4 rebounds per game...he also was ninth nationally among players 6-4 or shorter with 1.9 offensive rebounds per game.

Holtmann vs. the Ranked

In seven seasons as a head coach, three at Gardner Webb (2011-13), three at Butler (2015-17) and one at Ohio State, Chris Holtmann is 13-16 overall against opponents ranked among the *Associated Press* Top 25. He was 0-2 at GW and 13-13 at Butler. His teams were 6-9 vs. Top 10 foes at Butler and 3-4 vs. Top 5 opponents. He is 0-1 at Ohio State after a loss to No. 17 Gonzaga in Portland, Oregon, Nov. 23.

HEAD COACH CHRIS HOLTMANN

Chris Holtmann took over the Ohio State men's basketball head coaching position June 12, 2017 after a successful three-year stint as head coach at Butler (2015-2017). He was an assistant at Butler during the 2013-14 season after a three-year run as head coach at Gardner-Webb (2011-13).



Holtmann was named conference coach of the year at both his previous stops earning the honor in 2013 in the Big South and then in 2017 in the Big East following a 25-9 campaign with the Bulldogs.

The 14th head coach in Ohio State history, Holtmann is a 1994 graduate of Taylor University, where he majored in Psychology. He also has a master's degree in Athletics Administration from Ball State (2000).

As a player at Taylor, he earned NAIA All-America status in 1994 under the direction of Paul Patterson.

Prior to becoming a head coach, Holtmann was an assistant for John Groce (Ohio U.) and Brandon Miller (Butler). Both Groce and Miller were former Ohio State assistant coaches.

Ohio State 95, Robert Morris 64 Nov. 10, 2017, Columbus

COLUMBUS. -- Keita Bates-Diop had 19 points and 11 rebounds to help Ohio State beat Robert Morris 95-64 Friday in the season opener for both teams. Kam Williams scored 16 points, Kaleb Wesson added 13 and seven rebounds and Musa Jallow scored 11 points, including three dunks. Williams hit a 3-pointer during a 14-2 run that gave Ohio State an 18-8 with 12:16 remaining in the first half and the Buckeyes led by at least eight points the rest of the way. The Colonials struggled to hit shots and deal with Ohio State's size. The Buckeyes shot 60 percent from the field, outscored the Colonials 66-18 in the paint and outrebounded them 51-23. Robert Morris shot just 35 percent from the field. Matty McConnell and freshman Koby Thomas scored 22 points apiece and combined to hit 7 of 13 from 3-point range for Robert Morris. The game marked the first win for Chris Holtmann as head coach of the Buckeyes. It also served as the 200th game coached in seven seasons as a head coach, which includes three seasons each at Gardner-Webb and Butler.

Notes:

- Ohio State and Robert Morris have met four times with the Buckeyes winning all four matchups.
- Buckeyes are 13-0 against teams representing the Northeast Conference.
- Ohio State is 100-17 all-time in home openers.
- The Buckeyes' 95 points were the highest since Nov. 25th, 2016 against Marshall.
- Ohio State now has 623 wins when one or more players record a double-double.
- Chris Holtmann recorded his 115th win as a head coach for his career. The win was the first of his Ohio State career. The contest also marked the 200th as a head coach.
- Holtmann is the 11th head coach in Ohio State history to win his first game.
- Keita Bates-Diop led the Buckeyes scoring efforts against Robert Morris with 19 points along with 11 rebounds. He has recorded a double double in both the last two season openers for the Buckeyes. He also reached double digits in both scoring and rebounding (14/14) vs. Navy last year in Annapolis before missing most of the season with a stress fracture in his left leg.
- Bates-Diop recorded his first double-double of the season and his seventh of his career.
- Bates-Diop finished with a career-high seven offensive rebounds.
- Kam Williams recorded 16 points to make him the second leading scorer for the Buckeyes.
- Kaleb Wesson, a freshman, started his Buckeye career with 13 points and seven rebounds off the bench.
- Wesson was 5-7 from the field and 3-5 on free throw attempts.

Game 2

Ohio State 82, Radford 72 Nov. 12, 2017, Columbus

COLUMBUS. -- Keita Bates-Diop had his second strong performance on his path to injury recovery with 22 points and 10 rebounds when Ohio State defeated Radford 82-72. C.J. Jackson added 19 points and Jae'Sean Tate had 13 points and 10 rebounds for the Buckeyes (2-0), who led 44-34 at the half. OSU was up by 26 in the second half before Radford had a late flurry. Carlk Jones led Radford (1-1) with 19 points and Randy Phillips scored 12. Ohio State led 44-34 at the half but the Highlanders presented problems with their press although they failed to take advantage in the first half. Radford in its opener Friday vs. Georgia Southwestern trailed by two at half-time but started the second half on a 21-5 run that led to a 72-63 win. The Highlanders had the role reversed against the Buckeyes by being outscored 17-1 in the first 6 1/2 minutes after the break. Jackson's point total set a career high for the junior college transfer, now in his second season with the Buckeyes.

- This game marks the third time Ohio State and Radford have met. The Buckeyes have won all three matchups.
- The Buckeyes are 15-0 against teams representing the Big South Conference.
- The Buckeyes are now 8-0 when Keita Bates-Diop has a double-double.
- Chris Holtmann is now 2-0 as the head coach of the Buckeyes.
- Holtmann-coached teams are now 4-2 record against Radford.
- Jae'Sean Tate moves to No. 43 in all-time scoring at Ohio State with 13 points today for a total of 1,114 points. He passes Ron Sepic (1,107) and now trails Curtis Wilson (1,120).
- Tate earned his first double-double of the season with 13 points and 10 rebounds. This is the 11th of his career.

Game 3

Ohio State 82, Texas Southern 64 Nov. 16, 2017, Columbus

COLUMBUS. -- Keita Bates-Diop, Jae'Sean Tate and Micah Potter scored 17 points apiece to help Ohio State hold off Texas Southern for an 82-64 win. Bates-Diop added 12 rebounds. Musa Jallow had 13 points and four steals in his first career start and C.J. Jackson scored eight with nine assists for Ohio State (3-0). The Buckeyes held a 39-30 rebounding edge. Jallow punctuated a 16-2 run with his third 3-pointer to give the Buckeyes a 75-59 lead with 3:55 remaining in the game. Ohio State led by 18 points with 17:12 to go, but Texas Southern used a 24-8 run to pull within four points with 6:58 left. Donte Clark scored eight points during the stretch. He finished with 17 points, hitting 8-of-9 free throws. Both teams struggled to find consistent offense early. But Ohio State began to pull ahead when Jallow's dunk sparked a 16-2 run which made it 33-17 lead with 3:57 remaining in the half. The Tigers made just 1 of 8 field-goal attempts during the stretch. The Buckeyes entered the half leading 42-29.

Ohio State 80, Northeastern 55

Nov. 19, 2017, Columbus

COLUMBUS -- Jae'Sean Tate made all 10 of his shots from the floor and had a career-high 24 points to lead Ohio State to a 80-55 win against Northeastern. Tate also was 4 for 6 from the free-throw line. Keita Bates-Diop added 19 points for the Buckeyes, who lead 53-19 with 17:55 to play. Donnell Gresham had 16 points for Northeastern. Bates-Diop and Tate each had 15 points in the first half, making a combined 12 of 14 field goals, when OSU led 47-17. The game is part of the Phil Knight (PK80) Invitational celebrating the 80th birthday of Nike founder Phil Knight. Northeastern opened event-play with a 73-59 loss at Stanford on Friday. This was the Buckeyes first game in the event before traveling to Portland, Oregon for the remaining three games, which will be in a tournament format. Tate's effort from the field was an Ohio State record for single game field goal percentage. It also set a Value City Arena record for single game efficiency.

- The game marked the second meeting between Ohio State and Northeastern.
The series is now tied 1-1.
The Buckeyes held their opponent to under 20 points in the first half for the first time since Dec. 20, 2016 when they held Youngstown State to 14.
Ohio State is now 138-11 at Value City Arena when facing non-conference opponents and 239-44 in all games at VCA since 1998-99.
The Buckeyes had a 30-point halftime lead for the first time since Nov. 23, 2012 against UMKC (53-18).
Ohio State leads the NCAA with 138 home wins since start of 2009-10 season.
Nine different players scored points for the Buckeyes in the contest.
Ohio State has outrebounded its opponent in all four games this season.
Four Buckeyes scored in double-figures: Jae'Sean Tate (24), Keita Bates-Diop (19), Kaleb Wesson (12), and C.J. Jackson (10).
Chris Holtmann has started his tenure at Ohio State with a 4-0 record.
Jae'Sean Tate scored a career-high 24 points in the contest, shooting a perfect 10-10 from the floor.

Game 5

No. 17 Gonzaga 86, Ohio State 59

Nov. 23, 2017, Portland

PORTLAND, Oregon -- Johnathan Williams had 21 points and No. 17 Gonzaga was boosted by an enthusiastic crowd during an 86-59 victory over Ohio State in the Phil Knight Invitational. Josh Perkins added 20 points for the Bulldogs, who improved to 4-0 after playing in last season's NCAA Tournament championship game. C.J. Jackson and Jae'Sean Tate each scored 12 points for Ohio State. The Buckeyes took an early 14-10 lead in this one on Jackson's 3 pointer, but Gonzaga responded with an 11-2 run to go up 21-16, capped by Perkins' 3. Ohio State climbed back into it, pulling briefly in front 22-21 on Kam Williams' 3-pointer. It didn't last long and the Zags pushed their lead to 33-27 on Williams' dunk. Perkins' 3-pointer at the end of the first half put the Gonzaga fans on their feet and the Bulldogs went into halftime with a 44-31 lead. It was the second meeting between the teams. Ohio State defeated Gonzaga 73-67 in the second round of the 2012 NCAA Tournament.

- The game marked the second meeting between Ohio State and Gonzaga. The Buckeyes are 7-6 all-time vs. members of the West Coast Conference.
The series is now tied 1-1.
Kaleb Wesson made his first career start and responded with 10 points and four rebounds. He replaced sophomore Micah Potter, who did not play because of a left high-ankle sprain suffered in the second half of the Northeastern game.
Senior Jae'Sean Tate tallied 12 points to increase his career point total to 1,167. He is currently No. 38 on the all-time Ohio State scoring list behind No. 37 Lawrence Funderburke (1,179).
Junior Keita-Bates Diop grabbed 10 rebounds, marking the fourth time in five games he has reached double-digits in rebounding on the year. He averages a double-double on the year with 16.8 points and 10.0 rebounds a game.

Game 6

Ohio State 79, Stanford 71

Nov. 24, 2017, Portland

PORTLAND, Oregon -- C.J. Jackson had 23 points while Keita Bates-Diop added 18 points and 11 rebounds, and Ohio State beat Stanford 79-71 in the Phil Knight Invitational. Daejon Davis had 15 points and Reid Travis had 14 points before both fouled out for Stanford (3-4), which led by as many as 10 points in the first half but trailed by as many as 10 in the second. Stanford closed within 63-57 on Travis' layup with 3:54 left, but it was as close as the Cardinal could get until Oscar Da Silva's jumper made it 70-65 with 46 seconds to go. Ultimately they couldn't catch the Buckeyes. The Cardinal led by as much as 31-21 late in the first half, but Ohio State closed the gap with an 11-1 run and the two teams went into halftime tied at 32. Stanford didn't make a shot from the field for the last 4:11. Bates-Diop led all scorers with 10 points for the Buckeyes at the break. Stanford scored just six points in the first six minutes of the second half to trail 48-38. Bates-Diop's layup gave the Buckeyes their biggest lead of the game to that point.

Notes:

- The game marked the fourth meeting between Ohio State and Stanford. The Buckeyes are 39-38 all-time vs. members of the Pac-12 Conference.
Ohio State won its first game vs. the Cardinal in the series (1-3).
Kaleb Wesson made his second career start and responded with 10 points and three rebounds. He had 10 points and four boards vs. Gonzaga in his first career start. He replaced sophomore Micah Potter, who did not play vs. Gonzaga because of a left high-ankle sprain suffered in the second half of the Northeastern game. Potter returned to action vs. Stanford (2pts/2 rebs/6 mins). off the bench.
Senior Jae'Sean Tate tallied 14 points to increase his career point total to 1,181. He is currently No. 37 on the all-time Ohio State scoring list behind ahead of No. 38 Lawrence Funderburke (1,179) and behind No. 36 Luke Witte (1,211).
Tate reached 600 career rebounds with 10 vs. the Cardinal. He now has 603 over 101 career appearances (6.0 rpg.).
Junior Keita-Bates Diop grabbed 11 rebounds, marking the fifth time in six games he has reached double-digits in rebounding on the year. He averages a double-double on the year with 17.0 points and 10.2 rebounds a game.
With 18 points, Bates-Diop eclipsed the 700-career point mark for his career. He is averaging 17 points a game for the Buckeyes this season and averages 8.7 points a game for his career.
Bates-Diop and Tate each recorded double-doubles in the win. Bates-Diop (18/11) has 10 career games with 10 or more points and rebounds and four this season. Ohio State is 10-0 when he records a double-double. Tate has 12 career double-doubles. OSU is 9-3 on this contests.
Ohio State has had a player record a double-double (10+ points, rebounds, assists, steals or blocks) in 897 games. The Buckeyes are 626-271 in those contests (.698). Keita Bates-Diop (18/11) and Jae'Sean Tate are the last to record a double-double (Stanford, 11/24/17) for the Buckeyes.
Junior C.J. Jackson recorded a career-high with 23 points in the win vs. Stanford. He connected on 7 of 14 shots from the field and 4-of-6 from 3-point range. He also added six rebound, three assists and a steal in 36 minutes vs. the Cardinal.

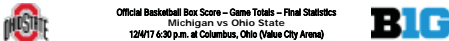
Ohio State 71, Michigan 62

COLUMBUS -- Keita Bates-Diop scored 18 and C.J. Jackson added 17 as Ohio State rallied in the second half to beat Michigan 71-62. The Buckeyes trailed by as many as 20 points in the first half and didn't lead until 7 1/2 minutes had ticked off in the second, when Bates-Diop hit a pair of foul shots to make it 47-46. Ohio State turned on the defense in the second half while sprinting out on a blistering 19-3 run, following a 7-0 burst to end the first half. A Kam Williams jumper with 3:32 left in the game tied it at 60, and Ohio State hit 11 free throws and pulled away, thanks in part to some poor Michigan shooting. Moritz Wagner led the way for Michigan with 14 points, and Zavier Simpson and Muhammad-Ali Abdur-Rahkman each added 11. The Wolverines led 43-30 at the half with six different players hitting a 3-pointer, and Wagner hitting 2 of 3 attempts. Michigan led by as many as 20 in the half, but the 7-0 run - capped by a monster dunk by JaeSean Tate - pulled it closer.

Notes:

- The game marked the 173rd meeting between Ohio State and Michigan.
 - The Buckeyes lead the series 97-76 in the series all-time including a 56-27 record in games played in Columbus.
 - Ohio State has won three straight games and four of the last five meetings in the series.
 - Ohio State is 13-2 vs. Michigan in Value City Arena all-time.
 - Ohio State is 5-1 at home this year, 1-0 in Big Ten play.
 - Against Big Ten competition at Value City Arena all-time, Ohio State is 102-33.
 - Against all-opponents at VCA, Ohio State is 240-45.
 - Ohio State completed its first 20+ point comeback victory since defeating the Tennessee Volunteers in the 2007 NCAA Tournament. OSU trailed 49-29 in the first half vs. the Vols and came back to win 85-84. The Buckeyes trailed Michigan 43-23 in the first half Monday and won 71-62
 - The Buckeyes picked up their first win of the season when trailing at the half as well as their first win of the season when trailing with five minutes to play.
 - The Buckeyes ended the game on a 14-2 run while holding Michigan to two points in the last 4:54 of play.
 - The Buckeyes are 7-0 this season when scoring 70-plus points.
 - Ohio State held Michigan to just 19 second-half points, the first time holding a Big Ten opponent to 20 or fewer points in a half since holding Penn State to 20 Jan. 26, 2016.
 - Ohio State is now 71-33 in Big Ten home openers.
 - The last time Ohio State overcame a 10+ point deficit at the half was against Purdue (-12/35-23) March 1, 2015. OSU won that game 65-61. The Buckeyes trailed Michigan 43-30.
 - Ohio State made 12 of 16 shots inside the arch in the second half (.750) and 17-21 foul shots (.810)
 - The game marked the second time Chris Holtmann has squared off against the Wolverines.
- Holtmann holds a 1-1 record against Michigan for his career and 1-0 at the helm of the Buckeyes.
- Keita Bates-Diop racked up 18 points, nine rebounds, an assist, a block, and a steal on the day.
 - Bates-Diop has led the Buckeyes in scoring in five of their 10 contests on the year.
