Ohio State TaxSlayer.com Gator Bowl Game Notes

Buckeyes making their 11th consecutive bowl appearance

FIRST AND 10

- Ohio State is making its first appearance in the Gator Bowl since 1978 when No. 20 Ohio State lost to No. 6 Clemson, 17-15, in Woody Hayes' final game as head coach of the Buckeyes.
- This will be Ohio State's first bowl game in the State of Florida since the 2002 Outback Bowl.
- This is Ohio State's 11th consecutive bowl appearance. The last time Ohio State did not go to a bowl was after the 1999 season.
- The school record for consecutive seasons going to a bowl game is 15 (1972-86). The current streak will end after this year.
- Ohio State is meeting Florida for just the second time in the series -- the first being the 2007 BCS National Championship game in Glendale.
- Freshman quarterback Braxton Miller was named Big Ten freshman of the year.
- Ohio State has had seven freshmen make starts while 14 have played in at least one game.
- All-American center Mike Brewster has made 48 consecutive starts for the Buckeyes.
- Dan Herron was voted by his teammates following the regular season as the team MVP.
- Three different Buckeyes (Herron, Miller and Carlos Hyde) rushed for at least 100 yards in the win over Indiana Nov. 5.

BUCKEYES IN BOWLS

Ohio State has a 19-22 record in bowl games, dating back to the 1921 Rose Bowl, where the Buckeyes were defeated 28-0 by California. The Buckeyes have appeared in 11 different bowl games during their storied history.

The Buckeyes are 5-3 in eight BCS game appearances. Ohio State holds a 15-19 record in bowl games played on New Year's Day or later.

BUCKEYES IN THIS BOWL

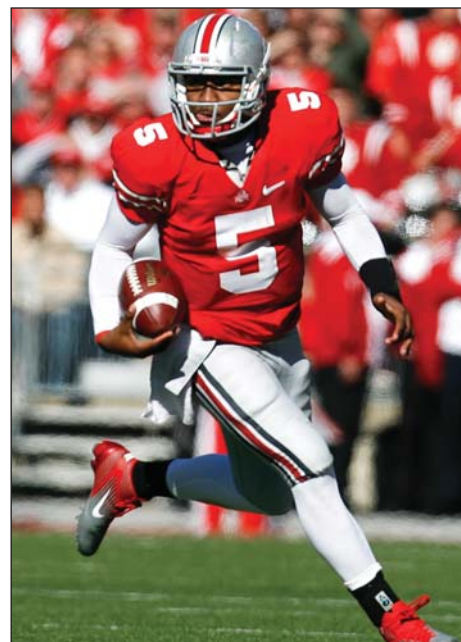
The ending of the last Gator Bowl the Buckeyes played in is well documented. Regarding that episode, coach Luke Fickell said during a Gator Bowl interview session that "We'd like to put a completely different spin on Ohio State's Gator Bowl history" [this year].

BRAXTON MILLER NAMED BIG TEN FRESHMAN OF THE YEAR

Freshman quarterback Braxton Miller, from Huber Heights, Ohio, was named the Big Ten Conference's Thompson-Randle El Freshman of the Year.

Miller, who became Ohio State's starting quarterback in the fourth game of the season, threw for 997 yards this season with 11 touchdowns and only four interceptions. He completed 50 percent of his attempts (67 of 134), and he capped his season with a 14-for-25 effort for 235 yards with two touchdowns -- all season highs -- in the regular season finale against Michigan.

Dangerous as a runner, Miller led the Buckeyes with 695 rushing yards and seven touchdowns. He averaged 4.8 yards per carry. Included was a school-record (by a quarterback) 81-yard touchdown run vs. Indiana.

Miller rushed for more than 100 yards a team-best three times with 105 yards against Indiana and Penn State, respectively, and 100 vs. Michigan. He accounted for 13 rushing and passing touchdowns in the last five games of the season, including all seven of his rushing scores and six of his 11 passing touchdowns.

Miller was named Big Ten Freshman of the Week twice. The first time was after the dramatic win over Wisconsin when he completed a 40-yard touchdown pass to Devin Smith with 40 seconds to play and rushed for 99 yards and two touchdowns.

More on Miller:

- In the regular season finale he earned the Big Ten's top frosh award again after his 335 yards of total offense vs. Michigan.
- His late-game heroics also included leading the Buckeyes to a game-tying touchdown with 55 seconds left to play against Purdue. On fourth-and-13 he found Jordan Hall in the end zone for the dramatic score.
- He led the Buckeyes on a five-play, 80-yard touchdown drive midway through the fourth quarter to help the Buckeyes close to 37-34 against Michigan.

JOHN SIMON NAMED THIRD TEAM ALL-AMERICA

John Simon was named a third-team Associated Press All-American.

Simon, a first-team all-Big Ten Conference selection by the conference head coaches, leads the Buckeyes with seven quarterback sacks and 15 tackles for loss (for minus-58 yards), figures that rank tied for second and sixth, respectively, in the Big Ten.

The Youngstown, Ohio, native (Cardinal Mooney) and 2010 honorable mention all-Big

Ten selection recorded 50 tackles this season for the Buckeyes to rank sixth on the team. He also broke up three passes while starting all 12 contests. He was named Big Ten player of the week after a nine-tackle (and four TFL) game against Illinois.

Simon, who was a semifinalist this year for the Lott IMPACT Trophy, enters the 2012 TaxSlayer.com Gator Bowl with 27 career TFLs and 11.5 career sacks.

SIMON HEADLINES ALL-BIG TEN BUCKEYES

John Simon was named to the 2011 All-Big Ten First Team by the coaches.

Senior center Michael Brewster, senior linebacker Andrew Sweat and junior safety C.J. Barnett earned second team All-Big Ten honors by the coaches while Simon and senior offensive tackle Mike Adams garnered second team laurels from the media.

In addition, Johnathan Hankins, Dan Herron, Jack Mewhort and Jake Stoneburner earned honorable mention All-Big Ten honors from the coaches while Barnett, Brewster, Hankins, Mewhort, Tyler Moeller, Andrew Norwell, Stoneburner and Sweat were named honorable mention All-Big Ten by the media.

BUCKEYE AWARD WINNERS

- Chris Maxwell, who will graduate this winter with a degree in mechanical engineering, was named the John Galbreath Award winner for academic success.
- Talented freshman Ryan Shazier, who played in all 12 games, started twice and totaled 47 tackles, was named the recipient of the Agonis Club Rick Meyer Award for his outstanding play in the Penn State game (15 tackles).
- Braxton Miller was the recipient of the First-Year Offensive Player Award.
- The First-Year Defensive Player Award was presented to Bradley Roby, the only freshman to start all 12 games and who tied for the team lead in interceptions (three) and PBUs (eight).
- Nate Ebner earned the Ike Kelly Award for his outstanding play on special teams (10 tackles).
- The Randy Gradishar Award, presented to the team's outstanding linebacker, went to senior

Andrew Sweat. A second-team all-Big Ten Conference honoree, Sweat totaled 68 tackles in 10 games plus had three pass break-ups, a forced fumble and an interception.

- Johnathan Hankins was named the Jack Stephenson Award winner as the team's outstanding defensive lineman. "Big Hank" ranks third on the team with 64 tackles and is second with 11.0 TFLs and 3.0 quarterback sacks.
- The Arnie Chonko Award, presented to the team's outstanding defensive back, was awarded to sophomore C.J. Barnett, a second-team all-Big Ten selection who leads the team with 69 tackles and has two interceptions among his eight pass break-ups.
- Sophomore Corey Brown, who tied for the team lead with 14 receptions and ranked second with 205 receiving yards, earned the Paul Warfield Award as the team's outstanding receiver.
- Punishing blocker and talented junior Zach Boren was presented with the Rex Kern Award as the team's outstanding offensive back.
- A pair of talented senior leaders on the offensive line - Mike Adams and Michael Brewster - were each named the recipient of the Jim Parker Award as the team's outstanding offensive linemen. Both players were named second-team all-Big Ten.
- Returning to the field to play in all 12 games this season after two season-ending injuries, senior "star" Tyler Moeller was presented with the Jim Marshall Warrior Award. Moeller, already an Ohio State graduate (consumer affairs), has a full resume of on-field achievements: 90 career tackles, 9.5 TFLs, four forced fumbles, three PBUs and a quarterback sack.
- Simon was named the Bill Willis Award winner as the team's outstanding defensive player.
- Miller received the Archie Griffin Award as the team's outstanding offensive player.
- The Bo Rein Award, voted on by the players and given to the most inspirational player on the team, went to Ebner.
- And the team's Most Valuable Player award, also voted on by the players, was presented to Dan Herron.

SHAZIER NAMED BIG TEN FRESHMAN OF THE WEEK - NOV. 21

In his first career start, true freshman linebacker Ryan Shazier earned himself Big Ten freshman of the week honors with his 15-tackle performance against Penn State. Filling in for the injured Andrew Sweat, Shazier recorded seven solo tackles and had a large role in Ohio State's goal line stand in the third quarter.

MILLER HITS 100 AGAIN

Braxton Miller topped 100 yards rushing for the third time in four games vs. Michigan, rushing for 100 yards on 16 carries and one TD while also adding a career-high 235 yards through the air. Against Penn State the week prior, he tied his personal best with 105 yards off 18 carries. He leads the Buckeye rushers with 695 yards on the season.

BOOM CLIMBS INTO TOP 10 IN RUSHING

Dan "Boom" Herron had his streak of 100-yard rushing games this season end at three at Purdue. In his six games this season, Herron averaged 98.8 yards per game (4.9 ypc). Herron moved into Ohio State's all-time Top 10 rushers with 2,787 yards. He needs 159 to pass Antonio Pittman (2,945 yards) for ninth.

"O" YES!

Orhian Johnson recorded his third interception of the season and the fourth of his career vs. Penn State. He is now tied with Travis Howard for the most among Buckeye defenders.

SHUGARTS START STREAK SNAPPED

J.B. Shugarts had started 24 consecutive games at right tackle before missing the Purdue game with a leg issue. Antonio Underwood started in Shugarts' place and Corey Linsley also spent considerable time at the position. Ohio State had started the same offensive line crew of LT Mike Adams, LG Andrew Norwell, C Mike Brewster, RG Jack Mewhort and LG Shugarts four consecutive games – since Adams' return – and had averaged 267.0 rushing yards per game in that stretch.

SEVEN FROSH HAVE NOW STARTED

Ohio State had seven different freshmen start a game this season. RS frosh Bradley Roby led all with 12 starts at CB. He is followed by QB Braxton Miller (9), WR Verlon Reed (five before season-ending knee surgery), DE J.T. Moore (three), Ryan Shazier (2), T.Y. Williams and Antonio Underwood.

A MOUNTAIN OF YOUTH

All those freshmen starters only begin to tell the story of the number of young Buckeyes seeing playing time in 2011. Fourteen true freshmen have played in at least one game (10th-most nationally) and seven red-shirt freshmen have played for a mountain of youth totaling 21 freshmen (19th nationally) who have played this season.

15-YEAR BEST 346-YARDS RUSHING

Dan Herron (141), Braxton Miller (105) and Carlos Hyde (105) each ran for 100 yards against Indiana and the end result was a 15-year best 346-yard rushing game by the Buckeyes. The last time an Ohio State team rushed for more was Nov. 9, 1996 at Illinois when Pepe Pearson, no doubt running behind Outland Trophy and Lombardi Award winner Orlando Pace all day, led a 348-yard team effort with 165 rushing yards.

MILLER BIG TEN FRESHMAN OF THE WEEK OCT. 31

A huge game vs. Wisconsin - three TDs accounted for including a game-winning TD pass with 20 seconds to play - earned Braxton Miller the Big Ten Conference Freshman of the Week honor Oct. 31. Ohio State defeated No. 15 Wisconsin, 33-29. Miller scored the first two touchdowns of his career before capping the game with his most important TD pass to date. He coasted in from the 1 yard line in the third quarter for his first collegiate score to give Ohio State a 10-7 lead. Then he burst off the left edge for a 44-yard

sprint in the fourth quarter to extend the lead to 26-14. And then after Wisconsin scored two touchdowns inside of the final four minutes to take a 29-26 lead, Miller threw his sixth touchdown pass of the season, a 40-yarder to fellow freshman Devin Smith with 20 seconds to play to give Ohio State the come-from-behind victory. For the game, Miller rushed for a career high 99 yards and passed for 89 on 7 for 12 passing for a career high total offense day of 188 yards.

SIMON NAMED BIG TEN DEFENSIVE POW OCT. 17

John Simon's aggressive, relentless pursuit of all things Blue and Orange Oct. 15 in Champaign, Ill., earned the junior defensive tackle from Youngstown, Ohio, with the Defensive Player of the Week Award from the Big Ten Conference. The Big Ten award, the first by a Buckeye this season, was one of numerous awards for Simon last week. On a national scale, Simon was named the Lott IMPACT Player of the Week and the College Football Performance Award's National Defensive Lineman of the Week. Simon spearheaded an Ohio State defense with a career-high eight tackles, including a career-high four tackles-for-loss, in the team's 17-7 road win over 16th-ranked and previously unbeaten Illinois. Simon's TFLs included two quarterback sacks and totaled 16 yards in losses.

STONEBURNER SECOND IN CAREER TDS

Jake Stoneburner is tied for second place among Ohio State tight ends with nine career touchdown receptions. The junior caught his fifth touchdown this season – a 32-yard screen pass from Braxton Miller with blocking assistance from Mike Brewster and Mike Adams – in the first quarter against Nebraska and his sixth with a 17-yarder from Miller at Illinois. His seventh was a 7-yarder from Miller vs. Penn State.

BREWSTER REACHES 48 STRAIGHT

All-American center Mike Brewster has started 48 consecutive games. The senior from Orlando, Fla. made his first start in Game 4 of the 2008 season vs. Troy and started the final 10 games of the season. He started all 13 games in 2009 and 2010, respectively.

RED ZONE EFFICIENCY

Officially, Ohio State has scored 32 of 36 times (88.9 percent) this season inside the 20 with 23 touchdowns and nine field goals. The only four times the Buckeyes have failed to score came on a fumble and on three end-of-game possessions against Akron, Colorado and Indiana while running out the clock. So if you take out those three instances, Ohio State is really 32 of 33 (97.0 percent).

Since Rod Smith's fumble in the first quarter against Akron, Ohio State has scored on 30 consecutive red zone possessions if you don't count the three possessions in which the Buckeyes took a knee to run out the clock.

BUCHANAN A WUERFFEL AWARD FINALIST

Junior punter Ben Buchanan, a strategic communications major from Westerville, Ohio, was a finalist for the Wuerffel Trophy, which is presented by the All Sports Association of Fort Walton Beach, Fla. The award is presented to the college football player who best combines exemplary community service with athletic and academic achievement.

SIMON A LOTT IMPACT TROPHY SEMIFINALIST

John Simon was among eight semifinalists for the annual Lott IMPACT Trophy, which was announced by the Pacific Club IMPACT Foundation.

THE SILVER BULLET DEFENSE

The Buckeyes have a long-standing tradition of producing the best defenses in the Big Ten and the nation year in, year out. Here are some bullets that put into perspective the Silver Bullets dominance:

- Ohio State has featured a Top 20 scoring defense in each of the last nine seasons, including a top 6 in each of the last six.

- Since the beginning of the 2007 season, the Ohio State defense has allowed only 11 100-yard rushers. That mark is third best among FBS schools.

- Ohio State has allowed just one 100-yard rusher in the past 29 games at Ohio Stadium.
- Since the 2005 season, Ohio State has finished either first or second in scoring defense among Big Ten teams all six years. The Buckeyes were first in 2010, 2007 and 2005 and second in 2009, 2008 and 2006.
- Ohio State has held 68 opponents to 21 points or fewer since the start of the 2005 season, the most among FBS teams with TCU.

- Ohio State has allowed fewer than 10 points 31 times since the start of the 2006 season.

- Ohio State has allowed an average of 13.6 points over the last six full seasons. That is the best scoring defense among FBS teams in this span. TCU is second at 14.2 points per game.

COACH LUKE FICKELL

- Coach Luke Fickell has been backed by nine assistant coaches who have 184 years combined working as college assistant coaches or staff assistants in their careers.

- Fickell went 2-4 against ranked teams this season (AP and Coaches poll).

- Fickell was among four first-year head coaches in the Big Ten. The last time the Big Ten featured four first-year coaches: 1997. Illinois (Ron Turner), Indiana (Cam Cameron), Minnesota (Glen Mason) and Purdue (Joe Tiller) were hired that season.

- Fickell picked up his first win over a ranked opponent with the 17-7 win at No. 16/15 Illinois Oct. 15 in Champaign. He won is second with the thrilling 33-29 win over No. 15 Wisconsin Oct. 29.

TEAM/MISCELLANEOUS NOTES

- After the loss to Miami in week 3 the Buckeyes fell out of the AP Top 25 for the first time since Nov. 20, 2004 -- nearly 7 years and ending the nation's longest current streak of appearances in the Top 25 (103 straight weeks).

- Tight end **Jake Stoneburner** set a modern day Ohio State record for tight ends by catching three touchdown passes vs. Akron Sept. 3, from 28, 11 and 2 yards out with Bauserman throwing all three. Stoneburner, who came into the game with two career touchdowns, finished with four catches for 50 yards. The Ohio State record for career touchdowns by a tight end: 10 by John Lumpkin from 1996-98. Stoneburner has nine entering the Michigan game.

- Senior All-America center **Mike Brewster** is regarded by some as one of the best centers in college football. He is a four-year starter with 48 career starts. In 2010 he was the only junior to rank among finalists for the Rimington Trophy, was a first team all-Big Ten selection and a FWAA and Phil Steele first team All-American. This season Brewster was named to the preseason Playboy All-America team, the Rimington and Outland Trophy watch lists and was voted one of 12 "players to watch" by a Big Ten media panel.

- Ohio State is tied with Oklahoma with eight BCS bowl appearances. USC is third with seven.

- Ohio State is 1-2 in national title games since the inception of the BCS in 1998. The three nation-



al title game appearances match Florida State for the second-most all-time. Only Oklahoma has more with four.

- Ohio State is 5-3 in BCS bowls, tied for second with Florida (5-1) for the most BCS Bowl wins all-time. USC is first at 6-1.
- Ohio State has not finished with a losing record since finishing 4-6-1 in 1988 (John Cooper's first season leading the Buckeyes). Ohio State's run of 21 straight seasons without a losing record is the third-longest among active FBS teams. Florida State has gone 34 straight seasons since finishing 5-6 in 1976 and Florida has gone 31 seasons since going 0-10-1 in 1979. Virginia Tech and Texas Tech have the fourth-longest runs at 18 seasons each.
- In Ohio State's eight BCS bowl appearances, they have only been the Big Ten's automatic BCS bowl qualifier four times (2002, 2006, 2007, 2009). They have received an at-large berth three times (1998, 2003, 2008) and were an automatic participant by the '3-4 rule' in 2005.
- Ohio State has won the Fiesta Bowl three times, the Sugar Bowl once and the Rose Bowl once in the BCS era. The Buckeyes join Oklahoma (Orange, Rose and Fiesta), Florida (Orange, Sugar and BCS title game) and Miami (Sugar, Rose and Orange) as the only teams to win three different BCS bowls.
- Ohio State is among three different programs to have appeared in at least four different BCS bowls, joining Oklahoma and Miami. The Buckeyes only need to play in the Orange Bowl to join Oklahoma as the only program to appear in five different BCS bowls. While Miami has won the BCS title (2001 season), they have not played in a bowl game specifically called the BCS title game.
- Ohio State has appeared in a bowl game in 16 of the last 18 seasons. Fifteen (including the Gator Bowl) of those bowl appearances have taken place in January (2004 Alamo Bowl). Ohio State has appeared in a January bowl in six of the past seven seasons.
- Ohio State (19) is tied with Michigan (19) for the most bowl wins all-time by a Big Ten team. Nebraska is 24-23 in bowl games, but has not represented the Big Ten in the postseason.
- Ohio State has won 34 Big Ten titles. Only Michigan has more with 42.

- Ohio State has 825 wins all-time, the sixth-most among FBS teams.

- Ohio State has featured 14 NFL Draft first-round picks since 2004. That is the most by any college team in this span.
- Ohio State has had 70 consecutive crowds of more than 100,000 at Ohio Stadium.
- Ohio State has not lost a home opener in 34 years - Sept. 16, 1978 to be exact when No. 6 Ohio State suffered a 19-0 loss to No. 5 Penn State in Woody Hayes' final season.

NOT SINCE 1922-24

Ohio State ranks second among all NCAA Div. I programs with 85 consecutive seasons since last posting back-to-back losing records. The Buckeyes have not been under .500 for two or more consecutive seasons since 1922-24, which trails only Tennessee; the Vols have not had back-to-back losing seasons since 1909-11, a span of 98 consecutive seasons.

URBAN MEYER NAMED HEAD COACH

Sometime during the morning of November 28, 2011, Ohio native Urban Meyer returned home. It was at that time when the 47-year-old Meyer, born in Toledo, raised in Ashtabula and with degrees from the University of Cincinnati and The Ohio State University, signed a six-year agreement to become the 24th head coach in the storied history of Ohio State football.

The only candidate interviewed by a five-member search committee of senior Ohio State leaders, headed by President E. Gordon Gee and Director of Athletics Gene Smith, Meyer returns to collegiate coaching after sitting out the past year to devote time to his family – wife Shelley, college-age daughters Nicole and Gisele and 13-year-old son Nathan – and to work as an analyst for ESPN.

It's easy to see why he was the No. 1 choice of the search committee. Through 10 full seasons as a head coach, Meyer has the tenth-best winning percentage in major college football history with a winning rate of .814 (104-23). He will leap all the way to No. 2 among current major college coaches with that percentage, trailing only the percentage owned by Boise State's Chris Peterson.

BUILDING HIS STAFF

Meyer is still assembling his coaching staff, which as of press time included four coaches from the 2011 coaching staff – Luke Fickell, Mike Vrabel and Taver Johnson from the defensive side of the ball and Stan Drayton from the offense. Meyer has also hired Tom Herman (Iowa State) as offensive coordinator/quarterbacks coach, Everett Withers (North Carolina) as co-defensive coordinator/assistant head coach, and Zach Smith (Temple) as wide receivers coach.

HEAD COACH **LUKE FICKELL**

On May 30, 2011, Luke Fickell was promoted to the position of head coach of the Ohio State football team. The team's former assistant head coach, co-defensive coordinator and linebackers coach thus becomes the 23rd head coach in 121 years of Buckeye football. Fickell is only the fifth Ohio State head coach in the last 60 years, after Woody Hayes (28 seasons; 1951-78), Earle Bruce (nine seasons; 1979-87), John Cooper (13 seasons; 1988-2000) and Jim Tressel (10 seasons; 2001-10).

The 2011 season was Fickell's 10th on the Ohio State football staff. Prior to Fickell's appointment to head coach he was promoted to assistant head coach in March 2011. He also coached the Buckeye linebackers and served as co-defensive coordinator. He was named to the latter position in April 2005. In that role, he was actively involved in game planning and strategy.

Fickell is a Columbus native (DeSales High School, where he was a state wrestling champion) and a 1997 graduate of Ohio State where he was a four-year starter at nose guard while earning his degree in exercise science. Post-graduation, Fickell spent a year on the injured reserve list with the New Orleans Saints before beginning his coaching career.

During his first two years at Ohio State, Fickell was in charge of the special teams and assisted with the defensive front. In his role as special teams coordinator, Fickell had specific responsibility for the punting team. Under his tutelage, that unit has excelled, leading the Big Ten in net punting in three of the past five years.

Fickell played for the Buckeyes from 1992-96, redshirting the first year and then starting the next four seasons at nose guard. He started a school-record 50 consecutive games between 1993 and 1996.

Fickell concluded his Ohio State career with 212 total tackles, including 26 tackles-for-loss and six sacks. During his four years in the starting lineup, the Buckeyes posted a combined record of 41-8-1 overall and were 26-5-1 in Big Ten play with a pair of Big Ten co-championships to their credit. With the win over Arizona State in the Rose Bowl, the Buckeyes finished the 1996 season with a sparkling 11-1 record and were second in the nation in both major polls in the final rankings.

Luke and his wife, Amy (an Ohio State physical therapy graduate), have four children: Landon, Luca, and twins Aydon and Ashton.

Luke Fickell Facts & More:

- **Luke is the 23rd head coach in Ohio State history.** He is only the fourth Ohio State graduate (undergraduate degree) to coach the Scarlet and Gray. Sam Willaman (first year was 1929), Wesley Fesler (1947) and Earle Bruce (1979) are the others.
- **Luke is the sixth former Ohio State assistant coach to assume the school's head coaching position.** Willaman (assisted between 1926-28), Fesler (1931-32), Carroll Widdoes (1941-43; 1946-48), Earle Bruce (1966-72) and Jim Tressel (1983-85) are the others.
- **Luke is the recipient of a national honor.** In 2010 he was named the American Football Coaches Association's assistant coach of the year.
- **Luke is a Columbus native.** He attended Robert Frost Elementary School, Walnut Springs Middle School and graduated in 1992 from DeSales H.S.
- **Growing up, Luke wanted to be an Olympic wrestling champion.** His dad was involved in the sport, helping out Luke's uncle, Wayne, who was a wrestling coach at Bishop Watterson.
- **Luke was a three-time undefeated state wrestling champion for DeSales.** He posted records of 36-0, 31-0 and 39-0 as a sophomore, junior and senior, respectively. He was Division II Ohio state champ at 189 pounds as a sophomore and as a heavyweight as a junior and senior.
- **Luke is married with children.** He and his wife, Amy, have four kids under the age of 10: a son Landon, daughter Luca and twin boys Aydon and Ashton.
- **Luke and Amy were college sweethearts at Ohio State.** Luke is a 1997 Ohio State grad with a degree in exercise science. Four times he was named Academic all-Big Ten Conference. Amy graduated in 1999 with a degree in physical therapy.
- **Luke started a school-record 50 consecutive football games for Ohio State.** After a red-shirt year in 1992, he started every game at nose guard for coach John Cooper between 1993-96.
- **Luke played on two Big Ten champion squads.** Ohio State was Big Ten co-champion in 1993 (10-1-1; 6-1-1) and 1995 (11-2; 7-1).
- **Luke played in four bowl games:** the 1993 Holiday Bowl, the 1995 Florida Citrus Bowl, the 1996 Citrus Bowl and the 1997 Rose Bowl.
- **Luke tore his left pectoral muscle days before the 1997 Rose Bowl.** He started and played against Arizona State anyway. He recorded two tackles despite the shoulder being immobilized.
- **Luke started a foundation to help "tackle illiteracy."** It is called the Second and Seven Foundation and was developed by Fickell and former Buckeye teammates Mike Vrabel and Ryan Miller. The foundation sponsored its inaugural FUNDamental Football Camp for kids in 2000 and proceeds from the camp were used to purchase books for second graders in seven Central Ohio schools.

OHIO STADIUM • "THE HORSESHOE"



Ohio Stadium, home to Ohio State football since 1922, underwent upgrades for the 2009 season, presenting fans with new signage displays and scoreboards in the north endzone and on the east and west fascias of the stadium's C-Deck.

For the first time in the Horseshoe's history, the scoreboard in the north endzone offers fans a video screen. At 17-feet-by-44-feet, the LED board offers fans replays and other game-day features typically only seen on the video board in the south endzone.

The ribbon boards on the east and west side have been replaced and expanded to reach endzone-to-endzone and feature an improved LED display.

In addition to the new boards, tribute signage for Ohio State's seven national championship teams (1942, '54, '57, '61, '68, '70, 2002) is on display near the new scoreboard in the north endzone, accentuating the seven currently retired Ohio State jersey numbers of Chic Harley (17), Les Horvath (22), Eddie George (27), Vic Janowicz (31), Howard "Hopalong" Cassady (40), Bill Willis (99) and Archie Griffin (45) also displayed on the north end.

As a result of the expanded ribbon boards, the Woody Hayes tribute signage has been moved to the SE corner of the C-Deck. All three signage areas are backlit for more prominent display during prime-time telecasts.

Ohio State has had 70 consecutive crowds of more than 100,000 at Ohio Stadium.

75 Mike Adams

Senior Offensive Tackle

Mike, majoring in criminology, has been one of the best left tackles in the Big Ten Conference for the past two seasons. He was named first-team all-Big Ten as a junior and he picked up second-team honors in 2011 by both the coaches and media while playing in only seven games. He was a game captain this year vs. Indiana. Named (with Mike Brewster) as the team's 2011 JIm Parker Award winner as the team's outstanding offensive lineman. A three-year starter, Mike will cap his collegiate career by starting in his 25th game at the TaxSlayer.com Gator Bowl. It will be his 32nd game played as a Buckeye.

4 C.J. Barnett

Sophomore Safety

A hard-hitting safety who leads the Buckeyes with 69 tackles on the season. Named second-team All-Big Ten Conference by the league's coaches. Has successfully come back from knee surgery after the second game in 2011 to start all 12 games this season. Has 14 starts in 14 career games. C.J. ranks 12th in the Big Ten with eight total passes defended. His six pass break-ups are second on the team. Recorded interceptions vs. Miami and Michigan State. Had a career-best 12 tackles vs. Michigan. Also had eight vs. Illinois and seven four times, including against Nebraska. His six solo stops vs. the Cornhuskers was a career high. Presented with the Arnie Chonko Award as the team's outstanding defensive back at the conclusion of the regular season.

24 Drew Basil

Sophomore Place Kicker

Drew has seasoned nicely into a fine and dependable kicker in his first year as the Buckeyes' every-placement kicker. He leads the team in scoring and ranks 10th in the Big Ten with 79 points. He is second in the Big Ten in field goal pct. (15-18; 83.3 pct.) and fourth with 15 field goals and 1.25 field goals per game. After missing the first four field goals he attempted as a Buckeye (two in 2010 and two in 2011), Basil hit 12 consecutive field goals before missing a 50-yarder against Purdue. His only extra point blemish in 35 tries was a blocked kick in the overtime loss at Purdue. Basil also had 14 touchbacks which helped Ohio State lead the Big Ten in kickoff coverage net average. Drew also made three tackles in kickoff coverage.

14 Joe Bauserman

Senior Quarterback

Joe is a fifth-year senior who started the first three games this season at quarterback and was 2-1 as a starter. This terrific athlete – he played three years of minor league baseball in the Pittsburgh Pirates' organization before transitioning back to the sport of football – has played in 30 games and will earn his third varsity letter this season. He has thrown for 812 yards and seven touchdowns in his Buckeye career. He graduated last June with a degree in fisheries and wildlife.

This year he threw for 492 yards with five touchdowns and one interception. He threw three touchdown passes in his first career start vs. Akron – all to Jake Stoneburner – and was 12-for-16 for 163 yards. He was 16-for-30 for 189 yards (all single game career highs) against Toledo.

93 Adam Bellamy

Sophomore Defensive Tackle

Adam, a third-year sophomore who played in 13 games last season, was a nine-game starter for the Buckeyes in 2011 at one defensive tackle position. He recorded 22 tackles this season, including a career-best four against Miami. He had a sack (-7) of Russell Wilson in the big win over Wisconsin and he also had a pass break-up and a fumble recovery.

63 Michael Bennett

Freshman Defensive Tackle

Michael Bennett is a true freshman who has a bright future ahead of him. He played in all 12 games this season and made 16 tackles, including 13 solos, from the defensive tackle position. In limited playing time he was tied for third on the team in tackles-for-loss with five. His 27 TFL yards trailed only John Simon's 58. He had two TFLs, for minus-10 yards, among his season-high five tackles at Nebraska. He had quarterback sacks vs. Akron, Nebraska and Indiana. Only Simon's seven sacks topped the three that Bennett recorded in 2011.

44 Zach Boren

Junior Fullback

Zach, although not having a carry all season, was honored as the team's Rex Kern Award winner as the team's outstanding offensive back. That's because he is selfless in fulfilling his role as a blocking back – and a tremendous one, at that – and as an occasional pass catcher out of the backfield (five receptions for 52 yards and a 10.4 average). Last carry was for two yards in the 2010 win over Michigan. Zach's 19 career receptions rank fourth on the team. Which goes to show that this 31-game starter at fullback – virtually from Day 1

when he arrived on campus – is really a terrific athlete, and he has even considered playing baseball for the Buckeyes. Zach is the younger brother of former Buckeye Justin Boren (now with the Baltimore Ravens scout team) and the older brother of Jacoby Boren, a high school senior who is champion at the bit to enroll early at Ohio State this spring on a football scholarship.

50 Mike Brewster

Senior Center

Mike, who graduated Dec. 11 with his degree in strategic communications, is one of the finest centers to ever suit up for the Scarlet and Gray. He has also been a strong leader of this program, one who was always willing to speak on behalf of his team. A 2010 All-American and first-team all-Big Ten Conference performer, Mike is a four-year starter for the Buckeyes. Named (with Mike Adams) as the team's 2011 JIm Parker Award winner as the team's outstanding offensive lineman. One of four team captains as voted on by the players. He will cap his Buckeye career in the TaxSlayer.com Gator Bowl by making his 49th consecutive start, the second-longest streak in school history (Luke Fickell started 50 consecutive games). He was named a game captain a team-high eight times this season, including in six of the last seven games. Named to the Rimington and Outland Trophy watch lists at the beginning of the season.

10 Corey Brown

Sophomore Wide Receiver

Corey Brown the receiver, from Upper Darby, Pa., just outside of Philadelphia, likes to be called by his name "Corey," but most everyone calls him "Philly" to distinguish him from the other Corey Brown on the team: Corey "Pittsburgh" Brown the defensive back from Monroeville, Pa. Anyway, this Corey Brown won the Paul Warfield Award as the team's outstanding receiver this year after tying for the team lead with 14 receptions for 205 yards and one touchdown. Corey had games of three receptions for 61 yards vs. Nebraska, four-for-34 vs. Wisconsin and he capped the season with two catches for 76 yards, including a 54-yard touchdown reception. He started eight times this season, missing four other games with an ankle issue. He enters the TaxSlayer.com Gator Bowl with 22 career receptions for 310 yards and two scores.

2 Christian Bryant

Sophomore Safety

Christian brings a physical presence to the field every game. This true sophomore played in 11 games this season, missing only the Michigan game with a shoulder injury. He started eight times and he has now played in 15 games with nine starts. This season, he ranked second in the Big Ten with eight



pass break-ups, and his eight total passes defended (PBUs and INTs) ranked seventh in the league. He is fourth on the team with 59 tackles, a figure that includes 10 vs. Nebraska and nine vs. both Michigan State and Purdue.

17 Ben Buchanan

Junior Punter

We will never know, but it would not have been a surprise for Ben Buchanan to have received votes from his teammates as the team MVP this year. He was that clutch as a punter...all season long. His average was fifth-best in the Big Ten (40.8) and Ohio State ranked fourth in the league in net punting average (37.7). Where Ben really starred, though, was in the placement of his kicks. He punted 65 times - the most in seven years, so far - with just over a third, only, returned for a 5.2 yard average. Ben also had 24 of his punts fair caught. He ranks 10th nationally with 24 punts inside the 20 and he ranks third with 13 inside the 10. He's had just two touchbacks, as well. As

As good as Ben is on the field, he is even better off of it. A three-time Academic All-Big Ten Conference honoree majoring in strategic communications, Ben was a finalist this year for the Wuerffel Trophy, which is presented to the college football player who best combines exemplary community service with athletic and academic achievement. His many community service projects include three medical missions to Honduras, Central America, including his most recent after his freshman year at Ohio State (summer of 2009).

5 Dominic Clarke

Sophomore Cornerback

Dominic played in 11 games this season. He started twice at cornerback, including his first collegiate start in Game 1 vs. Akron. Dominic totalled 12 tackles this season, including a career-best four vs. Akron. He also had two of his four pass break-ups this season against Akron. He is a veteran of 24 Ohio State games.. Was named an Academic All-Big Ten Conference honoree this season; his second such honor.

9 Nate Ebner

Senior DB/Special Teams Force

Nate didn't play high school football - he was a rugby player in high school and still is a world-class rugby player - yet he was such a terrific athlete and had such a physical nature that he made the Ohio State team as a walk-on three years ago and today he is on scholarship. Was voted by his teammates as the team's most inspirational player and was presented with the Bo Rein Award. Also picked up the Ike Kelley Award as the team's outstanding special teams player. Nate was chosen as

a team captain for the Toledo game this year and he will play in his 38th game at the TaxSlayer.com Gator Bowl. He has 30 career tackles. An exercise science major, Nate is a three-time Academic All-Big Ten honoree.

39 Derek Erwin

Senior Holder/Punter

Derek, from tiny Tiro, Ohio, was an all-conference performer in high school, but he had never been a holder for placements. After making the team as a walk-on and as a back-up punter three years ago, he picked up the art of holding for placements and he has done so flawlessly this season - 53 consecutive successful holds - and is on his way to earning his first varsity letter. He is majoring in civil engineering.

80 Chris Fields

Sophomore Wide Receiver

Chris played in all 12 games this season and started eight times at receiver. He caught seven passes for 101 yards and a 14.4 yards per catch average. Had two catches vs. Akron and two for 45 yards vs. Michigan. Has 10 career receptions. Also is a talented return specialist. Had five punt returns for 88 yards and a 17.6 per return average. Scored on a 69-yard punt return just before halftime in the Buckeyes' six-point win over Akron.

88 Reid Fragel

Junior Tight End

Reid has played in all 38 games the past three years and has started seven times. He is a tall tight end target - he's 6-8 - with five catches this season for 64 yards and 14 career receptions for 185 yards. He uses his size - 280 pounds - and leverage-inducing length to his advantage on the line, where he is a most valuable and effective blocking tight end. He's like another tackle, in many respects, until he sneaks out for a reception and a gain of 20 yards - his 2011 season long catch vs. Colorado - or 42 yards, which he did last year vs. Arkansas in the Sugar Bowl.

53 Garrett Goebel

Junior Nose Tackle

Garrett settled into the trenches of Ohio State's defensive line at the beginning of the season and he started all 12 games in his first year as a starter. A former two-time state wrestling champion in the state of Illinois, Garrett had 32 tackles this season including four tackles for losses totalling 13 yards. He also had a sack and two pass break-ups. He had a career-high seven tackles vs. Indiana. The TaxSlayer.com Gator Bowl will be his 39th game as a Buckeye.

7 Jordan Hall

Junior Running Back

Jordan is a talented, talented running back, receiver and kick returner. He leads the Buckeyes with 1,175 all-purpose yards this season and ranks second in the Big Ten with 130.6 all-purpose yards per game. He has 2,413 career all-purpose yards. This season he ranks fourth on the team with 384 yards rushing and fifth with nine receptions for 102 yards. He has scored two rushing and two receiving touchdowns this season. Both of his receiving TDs came against Purdue. He produced back-to-back 87- and 84-yard rushing efforts vs. Miami and Colorado, respectively. Ranks fourth in the Big Ten with his 28.1 kickoff return average. Jordan has started three times this season and has played in 28 games for the Buckeyes.

79 Marcus Hall

Sophomore Offensive Lineman

A third-year sophomore who played in 11 games this season and has played in 20 for his career. Started the first five games this season at right guard and then was a back-up at the left guard position the rest of the season once Mike Adams returned to the offensive line lineup.

52 Johnathan Hankins

Sophomore Defensive Tackle

Johnathan, like D-line teammate John Simon, is a rising star who will be a force on the collegiate game next season. This massive - 330 pounds - yet agile and very athletic performer ranked third on the team in tackles this season with 64, trailing the team leader by only five...and "Big Hank" is a defensive tackle! He had 29 solo tackles among his 64 tackles, a figure that included 11 tackles for losses totalling 24 yards and three quarterback sacks. He had a career-high 10 tackles vs. Nebraska and recorded nine vs. Illinois. He was named the team's Jack Stephenson Award winner as the team's outstanding defensive lineman. Also named honorable mention all-Big Ten by the conference coaches and media.

1 Dan "Boom" Herron

Senior Running Back

Boom is an inspirational leader of this team. A fifth-year senior, he sparked the Buckeyes with his return this season and his play has been exceptional: 593 yards rushing and five touchdowns in six games. He will rank among the Top 10 rushers in school history at the conclusion of his career, and he enters his final game with 2,787 career rushing yards with 32 touchdowns. His career-high is a 190-yard game in 2010 vs. Penn State. He also rushed for 175 yards, including a school-record



tying 89-yard rush, against Michigan in 2010. In fact, he was outstanding in three wins vs. Michigan, rushing for 358 of his yards and scoring three touchdowns. Boom also has caught 40 passes in his 40 games played. He graduated in December with a degree in African-American studies.

Herron started all six games he played in this year (and he has 23 career starts). His return coincided with a three-game winning streak for the Buckeyes with wins over Illinois, Wisconsin and Indiana. In those games Herron rushed for 114, 160 and 141 yards, respectively. He was named honorable mention All-Big Ten after earning first-team honors in 2010 following a 1,155-yard season with 16 touchdowns. Was voted by the players as the team's 2011 MVP. One of four team captains as voted on by the players.

49 Adam Homan

Junior Fullback

Adam is a reserve fullback who is also used on special teams. He has played in nine games this season - he missed three with a knee situation - and in 34 over his career. He is an outstanding definition of the term student-athlete who is majoring in exercise science and has been named an Academic All-Big Ten Conference honoree twice and an OSU Scholar-Athlete twice.

34 Carlos Hyde

Sophomore Running Back

Carlos is a big, bruising running back with lots of speed. This year he took advantage of his opportunities to play and rushed for 549 yards with a team-best 5.4 yards per carry average. He was second on the team with six rushing touchdowns. He also caught nine passes for 65 yards. Made first career start in the season opener, vs. Akron, and rushed for a then-career-high 93 yards. Also had 76 yards and two touchdowns in the six-point victory over Toledo. Had his breakout game against Nebraska with 104 yards rushing and two touchdowns, including a career-long 63-yard TD. Topped his career best total with 105 yards rushing vs. Indiana, one of three Ohio State backs to top 100 yards that game.

7 Travis Howard

Junior Cornerback

Travis has started the last 10 games at one cornerback spot for the Buckeyes, and he has played in 30 games so far through his career. He has two interceptions this season and he is tied with Orhian Johnson for the team lead with four career interceptions. His seven passes defended this season rank ninth in the Big Ten Conference. His 37 tackles include a career-high 10 vs. Michigan State. He had huge, fourth-quarter interceptions

in the wins over Illinois and Indiana this year. He tied for the team lead with two forced fumbles and he also recovered a fumble.

41 Tony Jackson

Senior Linebacker

Tony, who is also known in the locker room by the name Barrie, is a quality young man who has a bright, bright future ahead of him. A valuable member of the team for five seasons, Tony has been a regular on numerous special teams this season and he is on his way to earning his second varsity letter. He has played in every game as a senior and will make his 30th Buckeye appearance in the TaxSlayer.com Gator Bowl. Tony graduated last weekend with a degree in marketing.

19 Orhian Johnson

Junior Safety

Orhian, one of nine Buckeyes from the state of Florida, is an experienced playmaker at safety. He has played in 36 games in his Ohio State career and he has started 15 times, including four times this season. He had 32 tackles and three interceptions (vs. Nebraska, Purdue and Penn State, respectively) and he has as many career interceptions - four - as anyone on the team. His three interceptions this season tied for the team lead. Had a career-high nine tackles in the win over Toledo.

32 Storm Klein

Junior Linebacker

Storm, a true junior, has played in 36 games in his three season with Ohio State. He cracked the starting lineup this season for the first time and ended up starting 10 times at middle linebacker. He totalled 45 tackles on the season, including a pair of TFLs (-11) and he also added a sack (vs. Colorado) and an interception vs. Toledo. Klein had a career-high six tackles vs. Penn State. He assisted on all four tackles when the Buckeyes stopped Penn State four times when it had a first-and-goal from the 2 yard line.

71 Corey Linsley

Sophomore Offensive Lineman

Corey is another of the versatile players on the Buckeyes' offensive line. He can play virtually any position, including center. He played in 10 games this season, mostly as a back-up at right guard. A third-year sophomore, he has played in 16 games as a Buckeye.

74 Jack Mewhort

Sophomore Offensive Lineman

Jack is a talented third-year player who can play any position along the offensive line. He has played in 22 games as a Buckeye and he started all 12 games this season. Opened the year as the starter at left guard (five games) and then started the final seven games at right guard. Even played some right tackle down the stretch. Named honorable mention All-Big Ten Conference by the league's head coaches this season.

5 Braxton Miller

Freshman Quarterback

Miller, who took over the starting quarterback duties in the fourth game, truly was the team's outstanding offensive player, and he was presented with the team's Archie Griffin outstanding offensive player award at the end of the season. He simply got better and better each week, and he ended up throwing for 997 yards with 11 touchdowns and only four interceptions. He also led the team's rushers with 695 rushing yards and seven touchdowns. He was named the team's outstanding first-year player as well, this coming after the Big Ten Conference had named him its Thompson-Randle El Freshman of the Year. Here's more on Miller:

- He rushed for more than 100 yards a team-best three times with 105 yards against Indiana and Penn State, respectively, and 100 vs. Michigan.
- He accounted for 13 rushing and passing touchdowns in the last five games of the season, including all seven of his rushing scores and six of his 11 passing touchdowns.
- He was named Big Ten Freshman of the Week twice. The first time was after the dramatic win over Wisconsin when he completed a 40-yard touchdown pass to Devin Smith with 40 seconds to play and rushed for 99 yards and two touchdowns.
- He earned the award again after his 335 yards of total offense vs. Michigan.
- His late-game heroics also included leading the Buckeyes to a game-tying touchdown with 55 seconds left to play against Purdue. On fourth-and-13 he found Jordan Hall in the end zone for the dramatic score.
- He led the Buckeyes on a five-play, 80-yard touchdown drive midway through the fourth quarter to help the Buckeyes close to 37-34 against Michigan.



26 Tyler Moeller

Senior Star (DB/LB)

Tyler will cap his senior season by playing in his 13th game this season and the 40th of his career, which is quite simply remarkable considering the terrible head injury he suffered three years ago on top of a shoulder injury last year. Already an Ohio State graduate (consumer affairs), Tyler has a full resume of on-field achievements: 90 career tackles, 9.5 TFLs, four forced fumbles, three PBUs, a sack and a forced fumble. He is a three-time Academic All-Big Ten selection and a three-time OSU Scholar-Athlete.

Tyler, who was granted a rare sixth season of eligibility following the 2010 season, was named an Ohio State game captain six times in 2011. He earned honorable mention all-Big Ten Conference honors after his 44-tackle campaign that also included a pass break-up and a forced fumble. He was honored with the team's Jim Marshall Warrior Award at the conclusion of the regular season. The award honors a player who has displayed exceptional physical and mental toughness and has a persistence of a warrior.

78 Andrew Norwell

Sophomore Guard/Tackle

Andrew is fine young offensive lineman who can play virtually anywhere on the line. Concentrated on the left side this season after backing up J.B. Shugarts at right tackle last year. Despite not having the luxury of a red-shirt season, Andrew has already played in 23 Ohio State games and he started every game this season. He opened the season as the starter at left tackle for the first five games and then he moved inside to guard and started the final seven games at left guard. Named honorable mention All-Big Ten Conference this season. Hasn't had a haircut in 16 months (August 2010 was his last).

20 Nate Oliver

Senior Defensive Back/Linebacker

Nate, a fifth-year senior from Cleveland, was the first member of his recruiting class to commit to Ohio State, and he has been one terrific representative of the team. A sport and leisure studies major, Nate has been a valuable special teams performer and he will compete in his 45th career game at the TaxSlayer.com Gator Bowl. He has 29 career tackles plus a forced fumble and a fumble recovery.

8 DeVier Posey

Senior Wide Receiver

DeVier has been an outstanding player for the Buckeyes in his four seasons. He enters the TaxSlayer.com Gator Bowl with 131 career receptions for 1,917 yards, numbers that rank eighth and ninth, respectively, all-time among Ohio State receivers. He has also scored 17 touchdowns, and he is averaging a fine 17.7 yards per reception so far this year. Was clearly the best receiver on the field in his two games this year with seven receptions for 124 yards, including a one-handed catch vs. Penn State and a touchdown catch vs. Michigan. Had four receptions for 66 yards vs. PSU and three for 58 vs. UM. From Cincinnati, he will graduate this spring with his degree in communications.

25 Bradley Robey

Freshman Cornerback

Talented red-shirt freshman started all 12 games at cornerback this season. Tied for the team lead with three interceptions and also was in on 41 tackles. His 57 interception return yards topped the team and included a 36-yard return vs. Illinois to the 12 that set the Buckeyes up for a score in a 17-7 win. Ranked 12th in the Big Ten Conference with eight passes defensed. He set a season-high with six solo tackles in his first game as a Buckeye - vs. Akron - and he matched that total vs. Purdue. Bradley was presented with the 1st Year Defensive Player Award as the outstanding first-year player on defense by the Ohio State coaches.

6 Etienne Sabino

Junior Linebacker

Etienne played in all 12 games for the Buckeyes this season and started four times at linebacker. One of the team's top five tacklers with 58 stops this season, Sabino had high games of eight tackles three times: vs. Toledo, Miami and Michigan. He also had four tackles for loss (-20), including two sacks vs., vs. Akron and Toledo, respectively. The TaxSlayer.com Gator Bowl will be his 39th game as a Buckeye.

10 Ryan Shazier

Freshman Linebacker

People are going to hear the name "Ryan Shazier" a lot in the next three years. A true freshman linebacker who sports a shaved head and has a deep voice came on at the end of the season and finished seventh on the team in tackles with 48. He made 30 of his tackles in the last three games after starting "will" linebacker Andrew Sweat went out with a concussion. Shazier made his first career start - vs. Penn State - memorable with a team two-year best 15 tackles. He was named the Big Ten's freshman

of the week for his effort and later was awarded the team's Agonis Club Rick Meyer award for his play against Penn State. Shazier, who played in all 12 games, made noise all year with big special teams hits and blocks. His block of a Wisconsin punt led to a Buckeye touchdown from the 1, a game Ohio State would eventually win, 33-29.

76 J.B. Shugarts

Senior Offensive Tackle

J.B., a family resource management major, made an immediate impact on this team as a true freshman four seasons ago and he will cap his Ohio State career as a three-year starter at right tackle. Despite battling through a number of injuries, J.B. will start his 35th game when the Buckeyes play Florida in the TaxSlayer.com Gator Bowl, and it will represent his 44th game as a Buckeye. He started 11 times this season. Was chosen as a game captain for the season opener vs. Akron.

54 John Simon

Junior Defensive Lineman

John Simon is an aggressive, relentless force along the defensive line. A third-team Associated Press All-American, he was also named first-team All-Big Ten Conference by the league's coaches and he won Ohio State's Bill Willis Award as the team's outstanding defensive player. While playing a number of positions on the line, including tackle and end, Simon leads the Buckeyes with seven quarterback sacks and 15 tackles for loss (for minus-58 yards), figures that rank tied for second and sixth, respectively, in the Big Ten. He also accumulated 50 tackles and broke up three passes. He was named the Big Ten defensive player of the week after a nine-tackle performance against Illinois that included four TFLs and two sacks. He had a career-best 10 tackles vs. Indiana. Coach Luke Fickell: "John Simon's 75th play of a game is as good as his first." Simon was a semifinalist this year for the Lott IMPACT Trophy, and he enters the 2012 TaxSlayer.com Gator Bowl with 27 career TFLs and 11.5 career sacks.

15 Devin Smith

Freshman Wide Receiver

Devin played in all 12 games this season as a true freshman receiver. He ranked third on the team with 12 receptions but he ranked first with 247 receiving yards and he was first among wide receivers with four touchdowns. He had season highs of three receptions (vs. Akron) and 67 receiving yards (vs. Toledo). Also had a huge day with three receptions for 64 yards and two touchdowns vs. Colorado. He was on the receiving end of the highlight play of the year for the Buckeyes, calmly hauling in Braxton Miller's 40 yard aerial with 20 seconds left for a game-winning touchdown in the 33-29 win over a fine Wisconsin team.



16 Evan Spencer

Freshman Wide Receiver

Evan played in 10 games this season as a true freshman. He had three receptions for 78 yards and one touchdown this season. His first catch as a Buckeye was considered as a national play of the week: a leaping, one-handed grab of a Joe Bauserman pass for a 33-yard gain vs. Akron. He also had a 33-yard touchdown reception - in traffic and over the middle - vs. Michigan State, the Buckeyes' only score in a 10-7 loss. And he also had a catch for 12 yards vs. Purdue. Evan's father, Tim, is the third-leading rusher in Ohio State history with 3,553 yards.

11 Jake Stoneburner

Junior Tight End

Jake Stoneburner is kind of like the college version of the New England Patriots' tight ends: big, fast and strong, with outstanding pass-catching abilities who can cause matchup problems all game. Jake led the team with 14 receptions this season, half of which went for touchdowns, and he earned honorable mention all-Big Ten Conference honors by the league's head coaches and media. His seven touchdown receptions ranked fourth nationally among tight ends. Jake had eight receptions and four TDs in the team's first two games of the season, including a modern-day record three TD receptions vs. Akron. Also scored TDs vs. Nebraska - on a sweet, 32-yard screen pass, Illinois and Penn State. Jake needs just one more TD to tie the Ohio State tight ends record of 10 TD receptions, held by John Lumpkin (1996-98). He enters the TaxSlayer.com Gator Bowl with 37 career receptions for 445 yards. Has played in 36 games and made 24 career starts.

42 Andrew Sweat

Senior Linebacker

Andrew Sweat is not only a fine, fine football player, but he is also an excellent student-athlete. A native of Washington, Pa., and a graduate of Trinity High School, Andrew will graduate this spring from Ohio State with his degree in finance. He is in Ohio State's Fisher College of Business, one of the most prestigious schools at the university. A three-time Academic All-Big Ten Conference selection and a four-time OSU Scholar-Athlete, Andrew got a jump on his career plans by interning this summer in downtown Columbus at Merrill Lynch.

Sweat has also been very interested in making plays on the football field, something he has done for the past four seasons for the Buckeyes. This past year his efforts earned him second-team all-Big Ten Conference honors. He was named the team's Randy Gradishar Award winner as the outstanding linebacker on the squad. He ranks second among Buckeyes with 68 tackles on the season, numbers that included a career-high 10 tackles vs. Michigan State and a career-high seven solo tackles vs. Indiana. He also had an interception, vs. Akron. He had nine tackles vs. both Miami and Indiana. Sweat, who played as a true freshman in nine games in 2008, has started for the Buckeyes in parts of three years (19 career starts and 38 games played). He is the team leader in career tackles with 129. Selected as a game captain by the OSU coaches seven times this season, his peers voted him one of four season captains at the end of the regular season.

98 Solomon Thomas

Senior Defensive End

Solomon has been a vital member of the defensive line unit for the past five years. He will earn his fourth varsity letter this season and will end his career having played in 31 games for the Buckeyes. He has 27 career tackles, and Buckeye fans will always remember a game-saving interception at the OSU 17-yard line late in the 2010 Allstate Sugar Bowl against Arkansas.

GAME 1: AKRON

No. 18/16 Ohio State begins Fickell era with 42-0 shutout

Buckeyes hold Akron to 90 total yards, gain 517 yards of total offense

COLUMBUS, Ohio - Joe Bauserman and Jake Stoneburner connected on three touchdown passes and the Buckeyes offense rolled to 517 total yards as No. 18 Ohio State opened the Luke Fickell era in fine fashion with a 42-0 shutout of Akron in front of 105,001 sunburned fans at Ohio Stadium.

In his first career start, Bauserman looked sharp and confident, completing 12 of 16 passes for 163 yards, including the three TDs to Stoneburner, who became the first Buckeye tight end to find the end zone three times in a single game. Freshman quarterback Braxton Miller would add 132 yards in the second half on 8 of 12 passing, while on the ground, Ohio State rumbled to 224 total yards, highlighted by 93 from sophomore Carlos Hyde.

The Silver Bullet defense was equally impressive, holding the Zips to 90 total yards and forcing eight three-and-outs. The defensive line put constant pressure on Akron's quarterbacks, with five different players recording sacks and Ohio State totaling 10 tackles-for-loss. Senior linebacker Andrew Sweat led the Buckeye in tackles, collecting six total and two for loss.

Ohio State struck first at the 7:24 mark of the first quarter as Bauserman weaved his way through the Akron defense for a 15-yard touchdown run - the first of his career - and a 7-0 lead. The Buckeyes, who amassed 125 yards of offense in the opening stanza, threatened to extend the lead late in the quarter, but Akron's John Griggs forced a Rod Smith fumble that was recovered by Emmanue Lartey at the 4 yard line.

Bauserman upped the Buckeye lead to 14-0 at 5:45 in the second quarter with a 28-yard touchdown pass to junior tight end Jake Stoneburner, capping a bruising 13-play, 64-yard drive. After an Akron three-and-out, the offense once again moved the ball into Zips territory, but a missed field goal from sophomore Drew Basil kept the lead at 14-0 with 4:30 to play in the half.

Stoneburner and Bauserman combined for the second time late in the quarter, connecting for an 11-yard touchdown on third and 10 to give the Scarlet and Gray a 21-0 lead with just over a minute left in the second quarter. Senior linebacker Sweat set up the final seven points of the half with an acrobatic interception at the Akron 34 yard line.

Akron responded with a 10 play, 61-yard drive - crossing midfield for the first time in the game - but T.J. Marchese missed from 41 yards to close the first 30 minutes.

Sophomore wide receiver Corey Brown opened the second half with a 44-yard kickoff return to position the Buckeyes at their own 49. The offense cashed in on the excellent starting position with an eight play, 51-yard drive, capped by a 2-yard TD pass from Bauserman to Stoneburner.



Carlos Hyde rushed for 93 yards on 19 carries in his first career start at running back.

Bauserman passed the torch to Miller midway through the third. Miller, who played briefly in the first half, engineered a six-play, 59-yard drive capped by a 9-yard TD pass to freshman wide receiver Devin Smith that pushed the lead to 35-0 with 14:26 left in the game.

Smith closed the scoring with a 2-yard touchdown run with 5:51 to play. Freshman wide receiver Evan Spencer used one hand to corral a 33-yard pass from Miller and put the Buckeyes in the red zone.

A Tunnel of Pride featuring former players, organized by OSU legend John Hicks, welcomed the Buckeyes onto the field prior to kickoff. As part of Alumni Band Day, the fanfare continued at halftime as The Ohio State Marching and Alumni Bands celebrated the 75th anniversary of Script Ohio by dotting-the- I on four full-sized Scripts for the first time in history. Leslie H. Wexner, chairman of The Ohio State University Board of Trustees, was an honorary "I-dotter" on the home side of the field.

No. 15/15 Ohio State holds off Toledo, 27-22

Running back Carlos Hyde runs for 76 yards and two touchdowns in the win

COLUMBUS, Ohio - In a back-and-forth battle between in-state rivals, No. 15/15 Ohio State came from behind to down Toledo, 27-22, in front of a crowd of 105,016 at Ohio Stadium.

Generating 301 offensive yards to Toledo's 338, a slew of Rocket penalties made the difference for the young Buckeyes. Toledo, who looked to give Ohio State its first in-state loss in 90 years, gave up 102 yards over 14 penalties.

"First thing for us was to be fundamentally sound and physical," Luke Fickell, head coach, said. "They did a good job of challenging us with those things. We tried to make them one dimensional and with tackling we knew we had to do a great job. Those were the biggest areas that stood out to me. We're excited about how the guys fought and kept their chins up, but that's how you challenge yourself to get better."

In his second career start, Joe Bauserman completed 16 of 30 attempts for 189 yards, with three Buckeyes scoring.

Ohio State would strike first and early, making good on a 7-play, 67-yard opening drive at the 11:45 mark of the first quarter. Connecting up the middle, Bauserman found tight end Jake Stoneburner for a 26-yard touchdown pass to put the Buckeyes on the board at 7-0.

With cornerback Kishon Wilcher blocking a Buckeye punt at the 23, defensive end T.J. Fatinikun recovered and ran the ball 22 yards to the Rocket 1-yardline, swinging momentum in Toledo's favor. A middle pass from Austin Dantin to receiver Eric Page and a successful two-point conversion would put the Rockets on the board and leave Ohio State trailing for the first time this season.

Still firing offensively, Toledo struck again when quarterback Terrance Owens found Page along the sideline. Running 66 yards into the endzone, Page helped to close the first quarter at 15-7 in the Rockets' favor.

At a critical time for the Scarlet and Gray, sophomore Carlos Hyde elected to have his first career touchdown. Bringing the Buckeye deficit to one, the tailback from Naples, Fla., rushed for 36 yards to score. With the Rockets forced to punt at the one-minute mark heading into halftime, wideout Chris Fields was the next Buckeye to shine, helping Ohio State regain the lead with a 69-yard return.

But Toledo would not go quietly. Rushing up the middle on a 4-yard play, running back Adonis Thomas put the Rockets back on top, 22-21, at 12:56 in the third quarter.

Ohio State still had an answer, though. Completing a pass to freshman receiver Devin Smith for 36 yards to enter the redzone, Bauserman fed the ball to Hyde, a favorite target of the day, who rushed it in for his second touchdown. However, a missed two-point attempt left the Buckeyes with

a slim 5-point lead at 27-22.

Forcing an Ohio State fumble to regain possession, Toledo threatened in the final minutes with the ball on the Ohio State 16, but came up short on fourth down and turned the ball over to the Buckeyes who let the clock tick down.

With the win, Ohio State moves to 2-0 on the season while the Rockets fall to 1-1.

Buckeyes fall on the road at Miami, 24-6

Jordan Hall runs for 87 yards on a career-high 14 carries

MIAMI - Ohio State dropped its first-ever regular season game in the state of Florida Saturday to unranked Miami, 24-6. The Hurricanes powered for two quick first-quarter touchdowns to build a 14-0 lead and held firm the rest of the way as Ohio State managed just a 4-for-18 day passing for 35 yards with one interception. The Buckeyes gained 190 rushing yards with Jordan Hall a spark with 87 yards rushing in his first game of the season and Carlos Hyde ramming for 54 more yards.

Drew Basil kicked two second-quarter field goals - from 22 and 24 yards out - to trim the Miami lead to 14-6, but a late first-half field goal gave the Hurricanes its 14-point lead at halftime. Miami completed the scoring with 33 seconds left to play for the final margin. Basil's field goals were his first as a collegian.

Ohio State head coach Luke Fickell was counting on a quick start from his troops, but Miami was the team that came out hot. Sophomore tailback Lamar Miller secured the right edge and went 54 yards on the Hurricanes' first play from scrimmage to set the home team up on the Ohio State 9. Three plays later Jacory Harris found Allen Hurns for the first of two three-yard TD hookups to give the 'Canes a quick 7-0 lead.

A second three-and-out by the Ohio State offense ensued and Harris followed with an 11-play drive that he and Hurns capped from three yards out again.

"The thing we wanted to do the most was start fast," Ohio State coach Luke Fickell said. "The number one thing we didn't do on defense was start fast."

His defense held serve, for the most part, for the rest of the game. After giving up 116 yards to the Hurricanes in those first two drives, the team allowed only 247 the rest of the way and kept the home team, playing in front of its second-largest crowd at Sun Life Stadium (66,279), out of the end zone until that final minute.

Sophomore C.J. Barnett and freshman Bradley Roby recorded their first career interceptions, but the Buckeyes managed just three points off the two miscues. Linebackers Andrew Sweat, Etienne Sabino and Storm Klein led the team with nine, eight and six tackles apiece.

Hall was certainly a spark. His first four rushes of the season all went for first downs and covered 13, 13, 15 and 12 yards. His 87 yards rushing was just three short of his career high (90 vs. New Mexico State in 2009) and his 14 carries - all but one in the first half as he experienced cramping in the second half - did represent a career high.

Fifth-year senior quarterback Joe Bauserman, in just his third start, was just 2 of 14 passing for 13 yards and true freshman backup Braxton Miller was 2 of 4 for 22 yards, including an interception on a tipped first attempt.

Punter Ben Buchanan had his second-best day

in terms of average: 46.5 yards per kick off six punts, including three inside the 20. He averaged 50.0 yards off three punts in the win over Indiana last year.

Buckeyes Overpower Buffaloes, 37-17

Braxton Miller makes first career start; Defense holds Colorado to 91 yards rushing

COLUMBUS, Ohio - Ohio State got back on the winning track Saturday afternoon, defeating Colorado 37-17 in front of 105,096 fans at Ohio Stadium.

Balance was the name of the game for the Buckeyes (3-1), who rebounded nicely from a 24-6 setback last weekend at Miami. Solid performances from both the defense and special units provided the OSU offense with outstanding field position throughout the contest, and gritty rushing and improved passing attacks proved difficult for the Buffaloes (1-3) to defend.

Freshman quarterback Braxton Miller was effective in his first career start, completing 5 of 13 passes for 83 yards and two touchdowns - both to freshman wide receiver Devin Smith - while adding 84 yards on the ground. Junior running back Jordan Hall provided a spark to the Buckeye rushing attack, toting the ball 18 times for 84 yards and a touchdown. Hall had 231 all-purpose yards in the contest, with 135 on kickoff returns.

"I think our number one thing going into this game was special units had to make plays. I mean, that was the top of the list," head coach Luke Fickell said. "We did a good job there making some plays and trying to use that as a weapon. I think the next thing we had that poise on defense. We had to tackle better. Obviously we can always get better, but I think we had some poise. We gave up a touchdown on a play. You would hope you could make a play there. But we didn't panic, we just kept under control. So we're excited there."

"Offensively went in thinking we have to run the football. I know there's some different ways we have to run it. But people are going to make it difficult on you. But when you look at it we did a good job running the football."

"And then the last thing, as I said, we had to play with some emotion. I think that's what we wanted, to get back home and get that feel of emotion, get those guys on the sideline, get the students into it. And I think that's what we saw out there today from the beginning of the game, really, to all the way to the end. We're excited about those things."

Defensively, the Buckeyes stifled the Colorado rushing attack, limiting the Buffaloes to 76 yards on the ground.

Ohio State struck first, scoring on its second possession of the game. After a CU three-and-out and 20-yard punt, the Buckeye ground attack marched 43 yards in seven plays, capped by a 1-yard TD run from Hall for a 7-0 lead midway through the first quarter.

Sophomore defensive end Adam Bellamy put the Buckeye offense in prime position on its next drive by recovering a Rodney Stewart fumble at the Colorado 22. Sophomore kicker Drew Basil cashed in on the turnover with a 28-yard field goal to give the Buckeyes a 10-0 lead with 4:49 to play

in the first.

Miller and Smith connected for a 32-yard touchdown on the first drive of the second quarter to up the Buckeye lead to 17. Colorado countered on its next drive as Tyler Hansen hit Toney Clemons with an 11-yard TD on fourth down to put the finishing touches on a 10 play, 83-yard drive that cut the Ohio State advantage to 10.

Momentum would swing back in favor of the Buckeyes late in the second quarter. With 23 seconds left before halftime, the Buffaloes fumbled a Ben Buchanan punt that junior defensive back Zach Domicone recovered at the 11-yard line. Basil connected from 18 yards for a 20-7 Ohio State lead heading into the locker room.

Smith hauled in a 17-yard TD pass from Miller on the opening drive of the third quarter for a 27-7 Buckeye advantage. CU responded on its following possession with an eight play, 60-yard drive that ended in a 47-yard field goal by Will Oliver.

Hall sent the Ohio Stadium crowd into frenzy on the ensuing kickoff, dashing 90 yards down the sideline to set up the Buckeye offense at the Colorado 5. Sophomore running back Carlos Hyde cruised into the end zone on the following play to make the score 34-10.

Basil's third field goal of the game - a career of 47 yards - extended the Ohio State lead to 27 (37-10) early in the fourth quarter. The Buffaloes tacked on a late TD - a 14-yard strike from Hansen to Tyler McCulloch - to provide the final margin.

GAME 5: #25 MICHIGAN STATE

Spartans Edge Ohio State, 10-7, in Big Ten Opener

Buckeyes held scoreless until the final minutes; defense forces three MSU turnovers

COLUMBUS, Ohio - No. 25 Michigan State withstood a late rally from the Buckeyes to escape Ohio Stadium with a 10-7 win in the conference opener for both teams.

A Big Ten defensive battle was witnessed by 105,306 fans at Ohio Stadium as the Spartans (4-1, 1-0 Big Ten) and their aggressive, blitzing defense limited the Buckeye offense to 178 total yards and sacked the OSU quarterbacks nine times on the day. Ohio State (3-2, 0-1 Big Ten) countered with an inspired defensive performance of its own, forcing three Spartan turnovers while repeatedly rising to the occasion with their backs to the wall.

"You have to give a lot of credit to Michigan State," head coach Luke Fickell said. "They came in here and outplayed us. And we knew it was going to be a physical football game. And we just didn't get it done."

Despite the best efforts of the OSU defense, the Scarlet and Gray failed to sustain a consistent offensive attack. The Spartans stuffed the Buckeyes on the ground, holding Ohio State to 35 yards on 39 attempts, while freshman Braxton Miller (5 of 10) and senior Joe Bauserman (7 of 14) combined for only 143 yards passing.

Michigan State never trailed, jumping out to an early first quarter lead as Kirk Cousins and B.J. Cunningham connected from 33 yards at the 7:44 mark for a 7-0 advantage.

Ohio State mounted its first significant drive of the game on its first possession of the second quarter. Miller hit sophomore wide receiver Chris Fields for a 33 yard gain to the Spartan 33, but an interception by MSU defensive back Darqueze Dennard squashed the Buckeye threat.

MSU threatened late in the second, but once again came away empty handed. With a first and 10 at the OSU25, Cousins mishandled a ball that sophomore defensive lineman Johnathan Hankins recovered for the Buckeyes at the 38.

The Spartans advanced the ball to the Buckeye 31-yard line on its second drive of the third quarter but stalled once again. In an attempt to extend the lead to two possessions, Dan Conway fell short from 51 yards.

MSU appeared to break the game open near the end of the third. Facing a third and 6 at their own 31-yard line, Cousins found a wide open Cunningham for 52 yards to the Ohio State 17. After Edwin Baker gave the Spartans a first and goal at the Buckeye 5, the Silver Bullets held on three-consecutive plays to set up a fourth down early in the fourth quarter. On the following play, sophomore defensive back Bradley Roby tipped a Cousins' fade pass to Cunningham that C.J. Barnett intercepted in the endzone.

Bauserman entered the game on the following series but was unable to generate any offense, going three-and-out. Michigan State would add a

Conway field goal from 50 yards on the next possession to extend its lead to 10.

An interception by Roby at the Ohio State 24 kept the Buckeyes alive with just over four minutes to play. After the teams traded possessions, Bauserman found freshman wide receiver Evan Spencer open in the middle of the field for a 33-yard TD, making the score 10-7 with 10 seconds remaining on the clock. MSU would recover the ensuing onside kick to close the game.

Nebraska Rallies Past Ohio State, 34-27

Ohio State can't hold on to 21-point lead; Hyde rushes for 104 yards and two TDs

LINCOLN, Neb. - Taylor Martinez ran for a touchdown and passed for two others while bringing No. 14 Nebraska back from a 21-point second-half deficit, and the Cornhuskers defeated Ohio State 34-27 in the first Big Ten game at Memorial Stadium.

Rex Burkhead scored the go-ahead touchdown on a 17-yard run with 5:10 left.

Ohio State (3-3, 0-2 Big Ten) built a 27-6 lead behind freshman quarterback Braxton Miller, who sprained his right ankle in the third quarter and did not return.

Miller ran for 91 yards and went 5 of 8 passing for 95 yards before he got hurt.

Huskers linebacker Lavonte David stripped the ball from Miller in the middle of third quarter to start the rally.

Then Martinez ran 18 yards for a touchdown, threw a 36-yard TD pass to Quincy Enunwa and tied it with a 30-yard catch-and-run to Burkhead after Stanley Jean-Baptiste intercepted Bauserman in his first game at cornerback after moving from receiver.

Martinez ran for 102 yards and was 16 of 22 passing for 191 yards for Nebraska (5-1, 1-1). Burkhead ran 26 times for 119 yards.

Carlos Hyde led the Buckeyes with 104 yards rushing -- Ohio State's first 100-yard rusher of the season -- and two touchdowns, including a career-long 63-yarder in the second quarter.

The biggest deficit Nebraska had overcome previously was 17 points, most recently against Texas A&M in 2002.

An upset looked to be brewing in the first half, and the Buckeyes' momentum continued to roll when Hyde scored from a yard out to give Ohio State a 27-6 lead early in the third quarter.

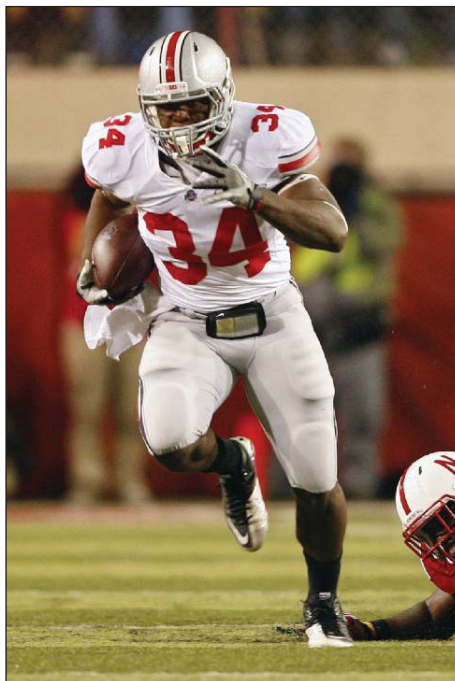
David, who made 13 tackles, changed the game with his biggest play of the night. As Miller fought for yards up the middle, he stuck his arms in and pulled the ball away from the quarterback.

Martinez scored two plays later, going untouched up the middle on a zone read to pull the Huskers to 27-13.

The Buckeyes did a good job containing Martinez in the first half, but the sophomore broke loose for 93 yards on the ground after halftime.

Martinez's passing and decision-making had been skewered after the loss at Wisconsin, but he threw a perfect strike to Enunwa to pull the Huskers within a touchdown. Martinez freelanced in the backfield before dumping off to Burkhead, who dodged a tackler and went 30 yards for the tying touchdown with 7:35 left.

C.J. Barnett was called for a facemask on Martinez during the Huskers' winning drive, and Burkhead ran for 22 yards before he broke free for the go-ahead score.

Buckeyes Upset Illini in Herron's Return, 17-7

Head coach Luke Fickell picks up his first win over a ranked opponent; Herron rushes for 114 and a TD

CHAMPAIGN, Ill. - Daniel Herron ran for 114 yards in his first game back and the Buckeyes (4-3, 1-2 Big Ten) forced three turnovers - two of them setting up the Buckeyes' only touchdowns - in a 17-7 upset of the Illini (6-1, 2-1).

Desperate for a way to end a two-game losing streak, coach Luke Fickell drew up a game plan that was about as conservative as it gets.

True freshman quarterback Braxton Miller threw just four passes, while Herron carried the ball 23 times and punched in the third-quarter touchdown that was the game winner.

"It was hard staying at home and watching the games," said Herron, who missed the season's first six games. "Now that I'm back out here, I'm doing everything I can to help this team, be a leader and get some more wins."

The Buckeyes didn't throw their first pass until the 7:22 mark of the second quarter. Miller, in fact, didn't complete a pass until he hit tight end Jake Stoneburner on a 17-yard TD pass with 13:06 left in the game for a 17-0 lead.

"Up 10-0, we were on the sideline saying, 'Man, we haven't made a pass yet,'" Stoneburner said. "It was kind of funny, but we were all saying, 'Who cares?' We're up, and if we complete one pass, I'll take the catch."

No Ohio State team had gone through a game with just one completion since 1976, a 22-21 loss to Missouri with Rod Gerald under center.

That Ohio State team was ranked No. 2, while this one was just trying to get its head above water, end the two-game losing streak and chalk up its first Big Ten win.

Enter Herron, who had to sit out six games as a result of his role in a cash-for-memorabilia scandal - the mess that cost ex-coach Jim Tressel his job - and then for taking too much money for a summer job.

Fickell said during the week he wasn't sure how much the senior tailback would play and he wasn't listed as the starter.

But Herron was in the backfield from the beginning, and carried the bulk of the load on the opening drive, one that on a day of gusty 20-plus mph winds delivered a 45-yard Drew Basil field goal. It was the only score of the half.

"They have a pretty good offensive line, a pretty good running back and I think one of the things they were excited about was having (Herron) back," Illinois coach Ron Zook said.

The Ohio State defense, meanwhile, played big, holding an Illini offense that was averaging almost 450 yards and 34.7 points a game to 285 yards and, until the 6:22 mark of the fourth quarter, no points.

Illinois quarterback Nathan Scheelhaase was 20 of 34 for 169 yards, with two interceptions and a late 3-yard touchdown pass to Evan Wilson that finally put the Illini on the board.

Stoneburner's touchdown was set up by an A.J. Jenkins fumble at the Illinois 37 while Herron's 12-yard touchdown run - which gave the Buckeyes a 10-0 lead - followed an interception by Bradley Roby that he returned to the Illinois 12. Scheelhaase threw to Jenkins and the receiver appeared to ruin a shorter route than Scheelhaase anticipated. The ball flew 10 yards past Jenkins and right at Roby.

In addition to stifling Scheelhaase, the Buckeyes also held Illinois other big weapon in check.

Illinois senior tailback Jason Ford left the game in the third quarter with an injured left shoulder after a big hit on a first-down carry. He finished with 30 yards on six carries.

Scheelhaase was Illinois' leading rusher with 16 carries for 49 yards.

Late Touchdown Pass Gives Buckeyes 33-29 Win

Braxton Miller finds classmate Devin Smith for a 40-yard TD pass with 20 seconds left

COLUMBUS, Ohio - Freshman quarterback Braxton Miller found classmate Devin Smith wide open for a game-winning 40-yard touchdown pass with 20 seconds left to give Ohio State a thrilling 33-29 Homecoming win over No. 15 Wisconsin in front of 105,511 at Ohio Stadium.

It was an exciting finish to a game that featured 31 fourth quarter points and an extraordinary rally by the Badgers (7-2, 2-2 Big Ten) in the final minutes. With the win, the Buckeyes (5-3, 2-2 Big Ten) vaulted themselves back into the race in the Big Ten Leaders Division.

"This is what Ohio State is about," Luke Fickell, Ohio State head coach, said after the game. "This is a huge win, a signature win for this team. This will give us some confidence and momentum heading into the final weeks of the season."

Miller finished the game with 188 all-purpose yards and two touchdowns -- 89 yards through the air and 99 on the ground - as three different Buckeyes found the endzone. The Buckeye defense rose to the occasion as well, holding Wisconsin to 342 total yards, 169 below its season average.

Wisconsin opened up a 7-0 lead on its second possession of the night. Facing third and 8 at the OSU 22, Russell Wilson found Montee Ball out of the backfield for a TD to cap an eight-play, 69-yard drive. Christian Bryant nearly came up with an interception on the play for Ohio State, but the sophomore safety mistimed his jump on the pass allowing Ball to run into the endzone untouched.

Ohio State drove into Badger territory twice in the second quarter but came away with only three points. Drew Basil put the Buckeyes on the board at the 2:55 mark of the second quarter, knocking in a 39-yard field goal off the left post.

Dan Herron opened the second half with a bang for Ohio State, dashing 57 yards to the Wisconsin 18 on the first play of the third quarter. Six plays and 18 yards later, Miller faked a handoff and juke past a Badger defender into the endzone on fourth and goal from the 1-yard line for the first rushing TD of his career and a 10-7 Buckeye lead.

A huge play on special teams set up the Buckeyes in prime position on their next offensive possession. Following a Badger three-and-out, Ryan Shazier broke through the Wisconsin line to block Brad Nortman's punt. Curtis Grant recovered at the 1-yard line and three plays later, Jordan Hall punched the ball in to give Ohio State a 10-point lead at the 9:26 mark of the third quarter.

After holding the Badgers to their second three-and-out of the half, Jordan Hall muffed a punt that Wisconsin's Jon Budmayr recovered at the OSU 27. Ball converted from 1-yard out six plays later to cut the Buckeye lead to three.

After Basil added his second field goal of the game to extend the Ohio State lead to 20-14 with 10:39 to play, the Silver Bullets stepped up. With

Wisconsin facing a fourth and 2 at the OSU 38, Andrew Sweat and Etienne Sabino combined on a tackle that left the Badgers a yard short of the first down. Miller appeared to put the game away on the ensuing offensive possession, converting three third downs - the third a 44-yard TD run - to give the Buckeyes a 26-14 lead with 4:39 to go after an unsuccessful two-point attempt.

Wisconsin refused to go quietly, however, cutting the Buckeye lead to five less than a minute later when Wilson connected with Jared Abbrederis from 17 yards out. Following an OSU three-and-out, Abbrederis struck again, breaking free of the Buckeye coverage for a 49-yard TD that put the Badgers up 29-26 with 1:18 remaining after a successful two-point conversion.

The Badgers had one final attempt to win the game following Miller's touchdown pass, but Sweat hit Wilson in his throwing motion to send the ball into the ground.

Buckeyes Outlast Hoosiers, 34-20

Three Buckeyes rush for 100-plus yards; John Simon records 10 tackles and 3.0 TFL in the win

COLUMBUS, Ohio - Daniel "Boom" Herron, Braxton Miller and Carlos Hyde combined for 346 yards on the ground to propel Ohio State to a 34-20 win over Indiana before a crowd of 105,195 at Ohio Stadium.

It was the first time Ohio State had a trio of backs - Herron (141 yards), Miller (105) and Hyde (105) - each run for more than 100 yards in a game since 1989 when Dante Lee, Scottie Graham, and Carlos Snow accomplished the feat in a game against Northwestern. Miller added 55 yards through the air on 5 of 11 passing for 401 yards of total offense.

"Most importantly we came out with win," Ohio State head coach Luke Fickell said after the game. "We did a nice job of regrouping in the second half, but we didn't play with enough poise and energy early on. Give Indiana credit, they played well and are much better than their record indicates."

Defensively, the Buckeyes (6-3, 3-2 Big Ten) were tested by Indiana's balanced attack as the Hoosiers (1-9, 0-6 Big Ten) totaled 333 total yards - 174 passing and 159 rushing - and converted on 10-of-17 third down attempts. John Simon and Andrew Sweat led the Buckeyes with 10 and nine tackles, respectively, while four other players added seven apiece.

Indiana scored on its first two possessions of the game for a quick 10-0 lead. After Mitch Ewald connected on a 35-yard field goal to cap the opening drive, the Hoosier defense recovered a Miller fumble at the OSU 41. Six plays later, Stephen Houston ran the ball in from five yards out to put the Buckeyes in an early hole.

Miller responded on the following drive for the Buckeyes, gashing the IU defense for an 81-yard touchdown on the ground to cut the Indiana lead to three with 7:12 to play in the first. The run was the longest in school history by an OSU quarterback and the longest play from scrimmage this season.

Drew Basil evened the score at 10 at the start of the second quarter with a 36-yard field goal. The teams would trade 3-pointers - Basil connecting from 45 and Ewald from 25 - to make the score 13-all at the half.

Ohio State jumped ahead for the first time in the game five minutes into the second half on a 15-yard touchdown run from Herron. Indiana was quick to respond, marching 64 yards in seven plays on the ensuing drive to tie the game at 20 on a 34-yard play action touchdown pass from Tre Roberson to Kofi Hughes with 6:56 remaining in the quarter.

Miller gave the Scarlet and Gray a 27-20 lead heading into the fourth quarter with a 20-yard touchdown run on third and goal. It was Miller's second touchdown of the game. Indiana answered with a 49-yard drive, but a 40-yard field goal at-

tempt by Ewald was wide left.

Indiana got the ball back with just under six minutes to play and advanced to the OSU 44 before Travis Howard intercepted a Roberson pass intended for Hughes. Carlos Hyde would take over from there, scoring on a 2-yard touchdown run with 2:41 to play after racing 47 yards down the right sideline to set up the seven points.

The Hoosiers had one final comeback attempt, but were stopped on downs inside their own 10 with just under two minutes to play.

Buckeyes Fall in Overtime at Purdue, 26-23

Buckeyes suffer blocked extra point in the final seconds of regulation

WEST LAFAYETTE, Ind. - Robert Marve's 1-yard touchdown on a quarterback sneak in overtime gave Purdue a 26-23 win over Ohio State.

Ohio State (6-4, 3-3 Big Ten) took the ball first in overtime, and Drew Basil's 33-yard field goal gave the Buckeyes a 23-20 lead.

Marve completed a 14-yard pass to Gary Bush on third-and-12 from the 15, then scored the game-winner on the next play.

Ohio State, who is now 5-2 all-time in overtime, drove down the field trailing 20-14 in the final minutes behind freshman QB Braxton Miller. On a fourth-and-3 from the Purdue 13, Miller scrambled, leaped over one of his teammates, looked back across the field and found Jordan Hall behind the secondary for a touchdown to tie the game, but Purdue's Bruce Gaston blocked Basil's extra point try.

Marve threw an interception in the final minute, but quickly redeemed himself. He stepped in for starter Caleb TerBush and completed 10 of 13 passes for 94 yards. Ralph Bolden ran for 80 yards on 18 carries for the Boilermakers.

Miller passed for 132 yards and ran for 43 yards on 16 carries.

Daniel "Boom" Herron ran for 62 yards on 18 carries as Ohio State's winning streak ended at three games.

Carson Wiggs' 19-yard field goal on Purdue's opening drive opened the scoring.

On its second possession, Purdue went 60 yards on 11 plays, and Akeem Shavers scored from 4 yards out to bump the Boilermakers' lead to 10-0. The Buckeyes were held to 11 yards and no first downs in the first quarter.

Ohio State finally got going early in the second quarter as Miller began creating passing opportunities with his ability to scramble. His 38-yard touchdown pass to Hall cut Purdue's lead to 10-7.

Marve then took the Boilermakers 88 yards on 13 plays. Bolden's 7-yard touchdown run pushed Purdue's lead to 17-7 with 3:19 left in the second quarter.

Basil missed a 50-yard field-goal try wide right as time expired, and the Boilermakers led 17-7 at the break. Purdue outgained the Buckeyes 242-97 in the first half and held the Buckeyes to 18 yards on 17 carries before the break. Herron was held to 16 yards on eight carries in the first half.

Purdue had a chance to perhaps put the Buckeyes away, but the Boilermakers went three-and-out to start the second half. Ohio State then moved right down the field, and Miller's 5-yard touchdown run cut Purdue's lead to 17-14 with 9:52 left in the third quarter.

Wiggs' 44-yard field goal with 13:06 to play put the Boilermakers up 20-14.

GAME 11: #21 PENN STATE

Turnovers Cost Buckeyes in 20-14 Loss to Nittany Lions

Braxton Miller rushes for 105 yards and a TD; Ryan Shazier season-high 15 tackles

COLUMBUS, Ohio - No. 21 Penn State defeated Ohio State 20-14 before a Senior Day crowd of 105,493 at Ohio Stadium.

Following an exciting back-and-forth first half, both defenses rose to the occasion in a scoreless second stanza. Penn State (9-2, 6-1 Big Ten) stifled the Buckeye offense after halftime, forcing a pair of fumbles and holding on fourth down twice in the fourth quarter as Ohio State tried in vain to make a comeback. The Buckeyes (6-5, 3-4 Big Ten) fell behind 10-0 for the third-consecutive game and struggled to move the ball consistently against the stout Nittany Lion defense.

"Obviously, falling behind 10-0 is not what we planned on doing," Ohio State head coach Luke Fickell said after the game. "When you fall behind early, it makes it really difficult to do the things you want to. We fought and battled, but it's just not good enough."

Offensively, Ohio State was led by quarterback Braxton Miller, who totaled 188 all-purpose yards, 105 on the ground and 83 through the air on 7-of-17 passing. Daniel 'Boom' Herron added 76 yards rushing on 18 carries in his final home game as a Buckeye.

The OSU defense struggled against the Penn State ground game throughout the contest, surrendering 239 yards and two rushing touchdowns. Ryan Shazier enjoyed a breakout game playing in place of injured linebacker Andrew Sweat, totaling a team season-high 15 tackles.

Penn State held a 10-0 advantage after one quarter. The Nittany Lions marched 80 yards in five plays on their opening drive of the game, taking a 7-0 lead on a 39-yard TD run by Stephfon Green. Anthony Fera added a field goal on the following offensive possession to put the Buckeyes in an early 10-point hole.

Miller put the Buckeyes on the board at the beginning of the second quarter with a 24-yard touchdown run that cut the Nittany Lion lead to three. Penn State would respond on its next drive, however, as Green added his second TD of the game - this time from four yards out - for a 17-7 lead with 10:05 remaining in the first half.

The Buckeyes caught a break two possessions later. After a three-and-out on offense, Orhian Johnson intercepted a Matt McGloin pass and returned the ball to the PSU 37. Miller capitalized on the Nittany Lion mistake, finding Jake Stoneburner in the back of the end zone for a 7-yard TD.

Fera added his second field goal of the game - a 46-yarder - as time expired in the first half to make the score 20-14 in favor of Penn State at halftime.

The Nittany Lions had a golden opportunity to add to their lead midway through the third quarter following a Jordan Hall fumble at the OSU 11, but the Buckeye defense held on fourth and goal

from the 1 as Storm Klein and Michael Bennett combined to stop Silas Redd short of the goal line.

Ohio State had a number of opportunities in the fourth quarter to get back into the game, but the Penn State defense rose to the occasion each time. Miller advanced the Buckeyes into opposing territory with a little more than three minutes to play, but the Nittany Lions held on fourth down. OSU had one final attempt at a comeback after a PSU three-and-out, but an intentional grounding penalty and three incomplete passes sealed the win for Penn State.

Prior to kickoff, 24 Buckeye seniors were honored for their contributions to the football program in their final home game at Ohio Stadium. At halftime, Dr. Jon R. Woods, retiring director of OSU Marching Band, dotted the 'I' in Script Ohio in honor of his 38 years of service to the band and University community.

Buckeyes Fall to Wolverines for first time since 2003

Braxton Miller throws for 235 yards and rushes for 100 in the loss

ANN ARBOR, Mich. - Ohio State's late comeback attempt fell short as the Buckeyes dropped a 40-34 decision to No. 15 Michigan in front of 114,132 fans at Michigan Stadium in Ann Arbor. The loss snaps Ohio State's six-game win streak over Michigan while the Buckeyes conclude the regular season with a 6-6 record, 3-5 in the Big Ten, and the Wolverines improve to 10-2, 6-2 in conference play.

Braxton Miller scrambled for seven yards on 4th-and-6 to start the Buckeyes' final possession but was intercepted on the following fourth down when his pass deflected off the hands of Devin Smith and was caught by Courtney Avery.

Miller threw for a career-high 235 yards, ran for 100 and accounted for three touchdowns but a dinged up Buckeye defense could not slow down a Denard Robinson, who threw for 167 yards, ran for 170 and had a hand in all five Michigan touchdowns.

The Buckeyes took an early 7-0 lead with a six play, 80-yard drive capped by a 54-yard touchdown pass from Miller to a wide open Corey "Philly" Brown.

Michigan answered right back on its second drive of the game when Robinson found room along the left sideline for 41 yards to tie the game at seven. The Wolverines then took the 9-7 lead on a holding call in the end zone after the Buckeyes were forced into a third and 27 from their own 3-yard line. On the ensuing drive, Robinson found Junior Hemingway for a 26-yard touchdown pass to give Michigan a 16-7 advantage.

Drew Basil then cut the Michigan lead to 16-10 with a 45-yard field goal on the Buckeyes' first drive of the second quarter. After Travis Howard forced and recovered a Robinson fumble at the Michigan 31-yard line on the next Wolverine possession, Miller gave the Buckeyes the lead with a 19-yard touchdown scamper to make it 17-16 Ohio State.

However, Michigan answered back with a nine play, 80-yard drive capped by a six-yard touchdown run by Robinson to give the Wolverines the 23-17 lead.

The Buckeyes then responded with a 43-yard touchdown pass from Miller to DeVier Posey to cap a back-and-forth first half that resulted in a five lead changes and a 24-23 Ohio State advantage.

Michigan opened the second half with an 11 play, 80-yard drive that resulted in a 20-yard touchdown pass from Robinson to Martavious Odoms to regain the lead at 30-24.

With just over a minute remaining in the third quarter and Michigan about to punt from its own 49-yard line, Wolverine punter, Will Hagerup dropped the snap and was tackled by Tyler

Moeller at the Michigan 32. The Buckeyes were able to move the ball inside the Michigan 5-yard line and were able to muster a 21-yard field goal by Basil to make it 30-27 in favor of the Maize and Blue.

The Wolverines answered right back when Robinson found Kevin Koger with a four-yard touchdown pass to cap an eight play, 75-yard drive to take a 37-27 lead to open the fourth quarter.

Ohio State was able to cut the lead to 37-34 with an 80-yard touchdown drive in which Miller completed three passes for 72 yards and Daniel "Boom" Herron punched it in from four yards out with 7:09 remaining.

Michigan advanced the ball to the Ohio State 1-yard line on the following drive only to have a touchdown run by Robinson negated by holding and personal foul penalties as Brendan Gibbons connected on a 43-yard field goal to extend the lead to 40-34 with 1:59 left in the game.
