Ohio State at No. 16/15 Illinois Game Notes

Kickoff slated for 3:30 p.m. ET on ABC

FIRST AND 10

- Ohio State is 0-2 in the Big Ten for just the second time since 1993.
- Ohio State lost back-to-back games for the first time in 88 games (2004), snapping the nation's longest streak without consecutive losses.
- The Buckeyes rank sixth in the NCAA with 27.4 yards per kickoff return.
- Ohio State is tied for 17th nationally in fewest points allowed at 17.8 ppg.
- Freshman QB **Braxton Miller** racked up 186 yards of total offense in his third career start at Nebraska in two and a half quarters of play.
- Sophomore RB **Carlos Hyde** recorded the first 100-yard rushing game of his career and the first for the Buckeyes this season with 104 yards and two TDs at Nebraska.
- In his first game back from injury, WR **Corey Brown** caught three passes for 61 yards.
- No. 16/15 Illinois is the third of four straight ranked opponents for the Buckeyes in October.
- Kicker **Drew Basil** has connected on seven consecutive field goal attempts.
- Senior LB **Andrew Sweat** leads the Buckeyes with 43 tackles.

ABOUT THE ILLINI

At 6-0, The Fighting Illini are off to their best start under head coach Ron Zook and their best since 1951 when the Illini started the season 7-0. Illinois has now won seven in a row dating back to its Texas Bowl victory to end 2010.

Offensively, Illinois is led by quarterback Nathan Scheelhaase who is fifth nationally and second in the Big Ten in passer efficiency (175.83).

Biletnikoff Award candidate A.J. Jenkins is fifth in the nation with 135.8 yards receiving per game. He caught six passes for 182 yards and two touchdowns Saturday at IU, marking his fourth 100-yard receiving game this season and the seventh of his career. Jenkins has 450 yards over the past two games, the most by an Illinois receiver in consecutive games.

Defensively, Illinois ranks first in the Big Ten and sixth nationally in sacks with 3.67 per game, with Whitney Mercilus second in the NCAA with 1.42 sacks per game. Tavon Wilson was named the Big Ten defensive player of the week after Saturday's win over Indiana. Wilson returned a fumble 66 yards for a touchdown to give the Illini a lead they would not relinquish in the 21-point win. Wilson also recorded a team-high 11 tackles, including nine solos, a career-high 3.5 tackles for loss, one sack and one pass break-up in the game.

Head coach Ron Zook is in his seventh season in Champaign with a record of 34-45 and his 10th overall (57-59) as a head coach. Prior to Illinois Zook spent three seasons at the University of Florida from 2002-04 where he went 23-14. Zook was named the 2007 National and Big Ten Coach of the Year after leading the Illini to the 2008 Rose Bowl.

SERIES HISTORY

Ohio State and Illinois will be meeting for the 97th time since the series was inaugurated in 1902. Until the series was interrupted in 2003, the two teams had played every year from 1914 to 2002.

Ohio State leads the series 62-30-4 and has a 33-12 advantage in Champaign. Between 1968 and 1982, the Buckeyes put together a 15-game winning streak against the Illini, the longest streak in the series by either team. Illinois won five in a row between 1988 and 1992.

Ohio State has won five of the last six meetings, but Illinois was a 28-21 winner in 2007 in Columbus. (*Note: the 2010 season was vacated by The Ohio State University*)

ILLIBUCK TROPHY

Illibuck is a wooden replica of a turtle presented to the winner of the Ohio State-Illinois football game. The tradition began with a live turtle in 1925. Illibuck is the second oldest trophy exchanged in the Big Ten, behind the Little Brown Jug between Minnesota and Michigan.

NOT SINCE 2004

This week against unbeaten Illinois Ohio State will seek to stop a two-game Big Ten losing streak. The Buckeyes have not lost three games consecutively nor started 0-3 in the Big Ten since 2004. Both occurred concurrently. Ohio State finished 8-4 overall and 4-4 in the Big Ten (T4th) that season.

FIVE CONSECUTIVE LEADERS GAMES

The game this week against the Illini will start a stretch of five consecutive games against Leaders Division opponents for the Buckeyes before closing out with the traditional season-ender vs.

Michigan, which is situated in the Legends Division.

IT'S THE OVERALL RECORD

The winner of the respective Legends Division and Leaders Division will be the team with the best overall record in all Big Ten games, and not the team with the best divisional record. Leaders Division leaders are Wisconsin, Illinois, Penn State and Purdue, which are all unbeaten through the first two weeks of Big Ten play.

BRAXTON'S FINEST HOUR CUT SHORT

Freshman quarterback **Braxton Miller** was enjoying his finest game as a Buckeye through two-and-a-half quarters vs. Nebraska. His rushing – career-high 91 yards – and passing – 5 of 8 for 95 yards with one touchdown – had staked the Buckeyes to a 27-6 lead against No. 14 Nebraska in wet and louder than loud Memorial Stadium. His third quarter fumble just inside of the 8 minute mark led to a quick Cornhusker score and he left the game for good on his next series with a sprained ankle. The Cornhuskers eventually rallied with 28 consecutive points to claim a 34-27 victory.

Miller is expected to start this weekend vs. Illinois.

NO. 2 THIS YEAR IN TOTAL OFFENSE

Ohio State's 351 yards of offense vs. the 'Huskies was a five-game high and was topped only by a 517-yard effort in the opening game of the season vs. Akron. Nebraska was held to 117 yards in the first half as the Buckeyes built a 20-6 lead, but the Cornhuskers had 306 after intermission to finish with an Ohio State opponents' season-high of 423 yards.

HYDE WAS HOT, TOO

No, that wasn't current NFL running back Banie Wells scooting wide right to score on a thrilling 60-plus yard touchdown, as he did vs. LSU in the 2008 national championship game. That was another fast, bruising running back, 6-2, 235-pound sophomore **Carlos Hyde**, whose career-long 63-yard touchdown run gave the Buckeyes a 17-3 lead. Tight end **Reid Fragel** had the key block and right tackle **J.B. Shugarts** helped seal off the edge for Hyde's huge burst.

RUSH KEY'S 100-YARD GAME

Carlos Hyde's 63-yard touchdown run was one of two touchdowns against Nebraska for the sophomore. His one-yard bull into the end zone on Ohio State's first series of the third quarter extended Ohio State's lead to 27-6. Hyde finished with his first 100-yard rushing game – 104 yards – and his TDs increased his rushing total to a team-high five this season. Hyde also leads the team with 400 rushing yards and a 5.3 per carry average.

SOLID ONE-TWO

Ohio State's top-two tailback tandem of **Jordan Hall** and **Carlos Hyde** are combining for 132.9 yards per game. Hyde just barely has the edge with 66.7 yards per game while Hall, who had 49 hard-earned yards against the Cornhuskers, averages 66.2 yards per game.

STONEBURNER'S SEVEN EQUALS SEVENTH

Jake Stoneburner has moved into sole possession of seventh place among Ohio State tight ends with seven career touchdown receptions. The junior caught his fifth touchdown this season – a 32-yard screen pass from **Braxton Miller** with blocking assistance from **Mike Brewster** and **Mike Adams** – in the first quarter against Nebraska. It was Stoneburner's first TD reception since catching two vs. Toledo. He also caught two vs. Akron.

SPEAKING OF SEVENS

Kicker **Drew Basil**, after missing the first four attempts of his career (including two from over 50 yards last year), has now made seven consecutive field goals. His latest makes came against Nebraska from 41 and 35 yards out. He is 7 of 9 in field goals this season plus 17 for 17 on extra points.

ANOTHER CAREER-HIGH FOR BRYANT

Christian Bryant is averaging better than eight tackles per game in the last three games since he became a starter in the secondary. Included was a career-best 10-tackle game vs. Nebraska. His six solos vs. the Huskers was also a career high. His 10 topped the nine he recorded vs. Michigan State.

SWEAT STILL LEADS

Nine more tackles by senior linebacker **Andrew Sweat** has increased his team-leading total to 43 on the season. He ranks 14th in the Big Ten with his average of 7.2 tackles per game. **Christian Bryant's** 28 stops is next. Johnathan Hankins leads all down linemen with 27, including six vs. the Cornhuskers.

BUCKS ADD SIX TO BIG PLAY TOTAL

Six rushes and receptions over 20 yards vs. Nebraska was the most since the team had seven vs. Akron. The six big plays last week included 27- and 21-yard receptions by **Philly Brown**, 29- and 24-yard rushes by **Braxton Miller**, a 32-yard **Jake Stoneburner** reception and a 63-yard **Carlos Hyde** run. Each of the big plays either went for a touchdown (Hyde and Stoneburner) or led to a field goal or a touchdown.

BUILDING BLOCKS

A new-look offensive line paved the way for a season-high 243 yards rushing by the Buckeyes against the Cornhuskers. **Mike Adams** came off his five-game suspension to start and play well alongside senior All-America center **Mike Brewster**, fellow senior tackle **J.B. Shugarts** and a pair of sophomore guards, **Jack Mewhort** and **Andrew Norwell**. Mewhort played at right guard after starting the first five games to Brewster's left. Norwell moved from left tackle, where he made his first five career starts this season, to left guard. The season-high total came after an atypical 35-yard rushing game vs. Michigan State.

HALL SET TO RETURN

Marcus Hall, a starter at right guard for the first five games of the season, can return to action this weekend against Illinois after sitting out the Nebraska game because of an NCAA suspension. The red-shirt sophomore has started six times in his career, including once in 2009 as a freshman, and will back up **Andrew Norwell** at left guard.

COUPLE MORE NOTES FROM LINCOLN

A couple of young defensive linemen – sophomore **Johnathan Hankins** and freshman **Michael Bennett** – each recorded sacks of Nebraska's Taylor Martinez. The sacks were the second for each player, respectively, and each is now tied with **Etienne Sabino** for the team lead with two ... The last time two rushers topped 100 yards vs. Ohio State in the same game – Rex Burkhead and Taylor Martinez netted 119 and 102, respectively – was the 1988 season when Michigan's Leroy Hoard (158) and Tony Boles (103) each went over 100 ... that No. 13 making a couple of special teams plays was Jeremy Cash, who had been wearing No. 17 through the first five games.

C.J. 2ND IN BIG PDS

Sophomore safety **C.J. Barnett** ranks second in the Big Ten conference with six passes defended, trailing only Iowa's Micah Hyde, who has seven. Barnett has four pass break-ups and two interceptions. Freshman cornerback **Bradley Roby** is also among the Big Ten's Top 20 in passes defended with four (two PBUs and two INTs).

WELCOME BACK

Receiver **Corey "Philly" Brown** and full-back **Adam Homan** returned to action against the Cornhuskers. Brown was a spark at receiver, catching three passes for 61 yards after missing the previous three games with an ankle injury. Homan played on special teams and backed up **Zach Boren** after also missing three games due to a knee issue.

BOOM'S BACK

Dan "Boom" Herron will be active this week vs. the Illini after missing the first six games of the season while serving an NCAA suspension. Herron was a first-team all-Big Ten running back last year after rushing for 1,155 yards and scoring 16 touchdowns. The senior has 2,194 career rush-

ing yards – 17th at Ohio State – and 29 rushing touchdowns.

Herron had three 100-yard performances in the final five games of last season. He had 114 at Minnesota, a career-high 190 at Penn State and 175 in the win over Michigan, including a penalty-shortened 89-yard run that was the longest play from scrimmage in school history. Herron rushed for at least one touchdown in each of the final 12 games of the 2010 season.

MORE ON BOOM ...

- Ohio State is 20-3 in the 23 games in which **Dan Herron** has scored a rushing touchdown.
- The Buckeyes are 18-1 in Herron's career when he has rushed for at least 55 yards. He totaled 91 yards on 19 carries in the loss on Oct. 16, 2010 at Wisconsin.
- Coming into the season Herron led all active Big Ten players with 2,104 rush yards and 29 rushing touchdowns.

BUCHANAN NOW AT 15 I20

Another fine punting game by **Ben Buchanan** in the rain at Nebraska – 42.3 net average – included two more punts inside the 20. Buchanan ranks fourth nationally and leads the Big Ten with 15 punts inside the 20. He also leads with 35 punts. His 41.6 yard average ranks sixth in the Big Ten.

IN OCTOBER

The Buckeyes boast an all-time record of 360-128-28 in October games. Ohio State is 247-64-20 in October home games and 114-64-8 on the road that month.

MILLER SOLID IN STARTING DEBUT

Braxton Miller, just the third freshman to start at quarterback for Ohio State, rushed for 83 yards, passed for 83 yards and threw two touchdown passes to **Devin Smith** to lead Ohio State to a 37-17 win over Colorado Sept. 24 at Ohio Stadium. Miller and Smith hooked up on a 32-yard score in the second quarter to increase the lead to 17-0 and a 17-yard TD connection in the third to extend the lead to 27-7. Miller was 5 of 13 passing and he gained all of his rushing yards in the first half as he staked the Buckeyes to a 20-7 halftime lead. He did not have any turnovers despite constant blitzing from the Colorado defenders.

Miller has played in five games thus far in his Buckeye career, completing 25 of 47 passes for 386 yards with four TDs and one INT. He also has carried 49 times for 209 yards. He totaled a season-high 186 yards of total offense at No. 14 Nebraska through two and a half quarters before leaving the game with an ankle injury.

Miller led Wayne High School to the Division

I state title game in 2010 while passing for 2,167 yards and 17 TDs while rushing for 658 yards and 17 TDs as a senior. He had a career record of 31-7 over three seasons and was a finalist for Ohio's Mr. Football. A first team all-state selection, he also played in the 2010 Under Armour All-American Game.

BREWSTER REACHES 42 STRAIGHT

All-American center **Mike Brewster** started his 42nd consecutive game Saturday at Nebraska. The senior from Orlando, Fla. made his first start in Game 4 of the 2008 season vs. Troy and started the final 10 games of the season. He started all 13 games in 2009 and 2010, respectively, in addition to the first six games this year.

Only two other active players have at least 20 starts to their credit: senior RT **J.B. Shugarts** has made 29 career starts and junior FB **Zach Boren** has started 25 times.

RED ZONE EFFICIENCY

Ohio State has scored 16 of 19 times (84.2 percent) this season inside the 20 with 11 touchdowns and five field goals. The only three times the Buckeyes have failed to score came on a fumble and on two end-of-game possessions against Akron and Colorado while running out the clock.

Since Rod Smith's fumble in the first quarter against Akron, Ohio State has scored on 15 consecutive red zone possessions if you don't count the two possessions in which the Buckeyes took a knee to run out the clock.

NOTING THE BUCKEYES

- After the loss to Miami in week 3 the Buckeyes fell out of the AP Top 25 for the first time since Nov. 20, 2004 -- nearly 7 years and ending the nation's longest current streak of appearances in the Top 25 (103 straight weeks).
- Tight end **Jake Stoneburner** set a modern day Ohio State record for tight ends by catching three touchdown passes vs. Akron Sept. 3, from 28, 11 and 2 yards out with Bauserman throwing all three. Stoneburner, who came into the game with two career touchdowns, finished with four catches for 50 yards. The Ohio State record for career touchdowns by a tight end: 10 by John Lumpkin from 1996-98.
- Senior All-America center **Mike Brewster** is regarded by some as the best center in college football. He is a four-year starter with 42 career starts. In 2010 he was the only junior to rank among finalists for the Rimington Trophy, was a first team all-Big Ten selection and a FWAA and Phil Steele first team All-American. This season Brewster was named to the preseason Playboy All-America team, the Rimington and Outland Trophy watch lists and was voted one of 12 "players to watch" by a Big Ten media panel.
- Junior defensive lineman **John Simon** was named one of 12 "players to watch" at the Big Ten media days in July. Simon has 75 career

tackles and 15.5 TFL. A promising defensive star with power and strength, Simon was an honorable mention all-Big Ten selection and Lott Trophy nominee in 2010 as a true sophomore.

- Senior linebacker **Andrew Sweat** leads the Buckeyes with 43 tackles this season. He recorded a team-high six tackles, including 2.0 TFL, a forced fumble and an interception against Akron in the season opener and had five and 1.0 TFL against Toledo. He is coming off a 9 tackle performance at Nebraska and a 10-tackle, 1.5 TFL performance against Michigan State. He now has a team-best 104 career tackles, 9.0 TFL and three INTs.

THE SILVER BULLET DEFENSE

The Buckeyes have a long-standing tradition of producing the best defenses in the Big Ten and the nation year in, year out and rank in the top 25 nationally in several defensive categories in 2011. Here are some bullets that put into perspective the Silver Bullets dominance:

- Ohio State has featured a Top 20 scoring defense in each of the last nine seasons, including a top 6 in each of the last six.

- Since the beginning of the 2005 season, the Ohio State defense has allowed only 13 100-yard rushers during a span of 84 games and only nine since the start of the 2007 season. Both of those marks are the third best among FBS schools during those spans.

- Ohio State has allowed just one 100-yard rusher in the past 26 games at Ohio Stadium.
- Since the 2005 season, Ohio State has finished either first or second in scoring defense among Big Ten teams all six years. The Buckeyes were first in 2010, 2007 and 2005 and second in 2009, 2008 and 2006.
- Among FBS teams in 2010, Ohio State ranked fourth in total defense (262.2 ypg), third in rushing defense (96.7 ypg), eighth in pass defense (165.5 ypg), fifth in scoring defense (14.3 ppg) and fourth in TO margin (+1.15).
- Ohio State has held 65 opponents to 21 points or fewer since the start of the 2005 season, the most among FBS teams with TCU.
- Ohio State has allowed 123 touchdowns from scrimmage since the start of the 2005 season, the fewest by any FBS team in this span.
- Ohio State has surrendered 52 rushing touchdowns since the start of the 2005 season. That mark is second fewest behind Alabama (49) for the fewest among FBS teams during that span.
- Ohio State has allowed fewer than 10 points 30 times since the start of the 2006 season.
- Ohio State has allowed an average of 13.6 points over the last six full seasons. That is the best scoring defense among FBS teams in this span. TCU is second at 14.2 points per game.
- Ohio State had 30 takeaways last season. It was the second straight season that the Buckeyes forced at least 30 turnovers. The Buckeyes forced 35 in 2009.

HEAD COACH LUKE FICKELL

- Head coach Luke Fickell is backed by nine assistant coaches who have 184 years combined working as college assistant coaches or staff assistants in their careers.
- Fickell is among four first-year head coaches in the Big Ten. The last time the Big Ten featured four first-year coaches: 1997. Illinois (Ron Turner), Indiana (Cam Cameron), Minnesota (Glen Mason) and Purdue (Joe Tiller) were hired that season.

• Fickell was the first Ohio State coach to face a defending Big Ten champion in his conference opener (Michigan State) since the Buckeyes began Big Ten competition in 1913. Since 1913, Ohio State coaches are 6-5-1 in their Big Ten debuts.

• In guiding OSU to a season-opening win in his first game as coach, Fickell joins 20 other Buckeye coaches with a first-game win. OSU has had only 23 head coaches in 122 years of football and that group is 21-1-1 in first games.

TEAM/MISCELLANEOUS NOTES

- Ohio State is tied with Oklahoma with eight BCS bowl appearances. USC is third with seven.
- Ohio State is 1-2 in national title games since the inception of the BCS in 1998. The three national title game appearances match Florida State for the second-most all-time. Only Oklahoma has more with four.
- Ohio State is 5-3 in BCS bowls, tied for second with Florida (5-1) for the most BCS Bowl wins all-time. USC is first at 6-1.
- Ohio State has not finished with a losing record since finishing 4-6-1 in 1988 (John Cooper's first season leading the Buckeyes). Ohio State's run of 21 straight seasons without a losing record is the third-longest among active FBS teams. Florida State has gone 34 straight seasons since finishing 5-6 in 1976 and Florida has gone 31 seasons since going 0-10-1 in 1979. Virginia Tech and Texas Tech have the fourth-longest runs at 18 seasons each.
- In Ohio State's eight BCS bowl appearances, they have only been the Big Ten's automatic BCS bowl qualifier four times (2002, 2006, 2007, 2009). They have received an at-large berth three times (1998, 2003, 2008) and were an automatic participant by the '3-4 rule' in 2005.
- Ohio State has won the Fiesta Bowl three times, the Sugar Bowl once and the Rose Bowl once in the BCS era. The Buckeyes join Oklahoma (Orange, Rose and Fiesta), Florida (Orange, Sugar and BCS title game) and Miami (Sugar, Rose and Orange) as the only teams to win three different BCS bowls.

• Ohio State is among three different programs to have appeared in at least four different BCS bowls, joining Oklahoma and Miami. The Buckeyes only need to play in the Orange Bowl to join Oklahoma as the only program to appear in five different BCS bowls. While Miami has won the BCS title (2001 season), they have not played in a bowl game specifically called the BCS title game.

- Ohio State has appeared in a bowl game in 15 of the last 17 seasons. Fourteen of those bowl appearances have taken place in January (2004 Alamo Bowl). Ohio State has appeared in a January bowl in five of the past six seasons.
- Ohio State (19) is tied with Michigan (19) for the most bowl wins all-time by a Big Ten team. Nebraska is 24-23 in bowl games, but has not represented the Big Ten in the postseason.

- Ohio State has featured 14 NFL Draft first-round picks since 2004. That is the most by any college team in this span.
- Ohio State has had 67 consecutive crowds of more than 100,000 at Ohio Stadium.
- Ohio State has not lost a home opener in 34 years - Sept. 16, 1978 to be exact when No. 6 Ohio State suffered a 19-0 loss to No. 5 Penn State in Woody Hayes' final season.
- Ohio State has an all-time opening game record of 105-12-4. The Buckeyes' last opening day loss away from Columbus was to Miami in the 1999 Kickoff Classic in East Rutherford, N.J.



- All-time, the Buckeyes are 109-8-4 in home openers since 1890. The largest opening day crowd at Ohio Stadium was 105,092 in the 2009 opener vs. Navy.

NOT SINCE 1922-24

Ohio State ranks second among all NCAA Div. I programs with 85 consecutive seasons since last posting back-to-back losing records. The Buckeyes have not been under .500 for two or more consecutive seasons since 1922-24, which trails only Tennessee; the Vols have not had back-to-back losing seasons since 1909-11, a span of 98 consecutive seasons.

OHIO STATE TO WEAR ADVANCED NIKE UNIFORMS FOR WISCONSIN GAME

Ohio State will be one of nine college football programs donning uniquely designed, highly advanced Nike uniforms for at least one game during the 2011-12 season.

The teams selected to sport the 2011 Nike Pro Combat system of dress uniforms include the United States Military Academy (Army), Boise State University, University of Georgia, Louisiana State University, Michigan State University, the United States Naval Academy, The Ohio State University, University of Oregon, and Stanford University.

The uniforms will hit the field on opening day of the 2011-12 college football season and throughout the year during some of fiercest rivalries in college football. Dates include Oregon vs. LSU at Cowboys Stadium (9/3), Boise State vs. Georgia at the Georgia Dome (9/3), Michigan State vs. Michigan (10/15), LSU vs. Auburn (10/22), Ohio State vs. Wisconsin (10/29), Stanford vs. Notre Dame (11/27) and the annual service academy bragging rights matchup between two of the nation's most prestigious football programs - Army vs. Navy (12/10).

This year marks the 50th anniversary of The Ohio State University's undefeated 1961 championship season -- a distinctive milestone that provides a source of inspiration for a program steeped in tradition and rooted in pride. The 2011 Nike Pro Combat system of dress design for the Buckeyes harkens back to that team, whose offensive power lived in its backfield, led by the 6'0, 227 pound All-American fullback, Bob Ferguson. The Heisman runner-up was a power runner and contributed immensely to the team's noteworthy speed, aggression and smarts. This uniform acknowledges the dominance of the 1961 team and will deliver an undeniable motivation for the current Buckeyes when they face off against Wisconsin on October 29.

Distinctive white block lettering on Ohio State's bold scarlet jersey is accompanied by gray sleeve and collar accents that provide a retro look high in contrast. An inscription of the year "1961" on the inner neckline, socks and sleeves act as a silent reminder of the indisputable determination of that year's lineup. A steel gray baselayer and matching arm sleeves feature a print reminiscent

of a buckeye tree. These two pieces are patterned after Buckeye Grove - home to a collection of buckeye trees planted in honor of each first team All-American player, like Ferguson, whose presence always commanded respect. Dark gray pants complement the baselayer design, emblazoned with a prominent block 'O' on the hip alongside a scarlet streak on the pant leg.

BIG TEN ANNOUNCES 2013-14 FOOTBALL SCHEDULE

The Big Ten Conference has announced its 2013 and 2014 conference football schedules. Ohio State, a member of the Leaders division, will play four home and four away league contests in each of those seasons.

In 2013, OSU opens Big Ten play hosting Wisconsin Sept. 28. Other Big Ten games in 2013: Oct. 5 at Northwestern; Oct. 19 vs. Iowa; Oct. 26 vs. Penn State; Nov. 2 at Purdue; Nov. 16 at Illinois; Nov. 23 vs. Indiana; Nov. 30 at Michigan.

Ohio State has two non-conference dates confirmed for the 2013 season: Aug. 31 vs. Vanderbilt at Ohio Stadium; and Sept. 14 at California.

In 2014, Ohio State begins Big Ten action hosting Purdue Oct. 4. Other Big Ten contests in 2014: Oct. 18 at Iowa; Oct. 25 vs. Northwestern; Nov. 1 at Wisconsin; Nov. 8 vs. Illinois; Nov. 15 at Penn State; Nov. 22 at Indiana; Nov. 29 vs. Michigan.

The Buckeyes' non-conference games for 2014 are Aug. 30 vs. Navy in Baltimore; followed by three games at Ohio Stadium: Sept. 6 vs. Cincinnati; Sept. 13 vs. Kent State; and Sept. 20 vs. Virginia Tech.

BIG TEN TO PLAY NINE CONFERENCE GAMES BEGINNING WITH 2017 SEASON

The Big Ten will move to a nine-game conference schedule beginning with the 2017 season.

Three teams each from the Legends Division and Leaders Division will feature five conference home games during odd-numbered years, while the other three schools from each division will host five conference contests during even-numbered years. The 2017 schedule will include five conference home outings for Iowa, Michigan State and Nebraska from the Legends Division and Illinois, Indiana and Ohio State from the Leaders Division. The 2018 schedule will feature five Big Ten home games for Michigan, Minnesota and Northwestern of the Legends Division and Penn State, Purdue and Wisconsin of the Leaders Division. The Big Ten will return to a full nine-game conference schedule for the first time since the 1983 and 1984 seasons. Eight of 10 conference schools played nine-game schedules during the 1981 and 1982 seasons, while two of 10 teams featured nine-game schedules from 1971-72 and 1977-80.

On May 30, 2011, Luke Fickell was promoted to the position of head coach of the Ohio State football team. The team's former assistant head coach, co-defensive coordinator and linebackers coach thus becomes the 23rd head coach in 121 years of Buckeye football. Fickell is only the fifth Ohio State head coach in the last 60 years, after Woody Hayes (28 seasons; 1951-78), Earle Bruce (nine seasons; 1979-87), John Cooper (13 seasons; 1988-2000) and Jim Tressel (10 seasons; 2001-10).

The 2011 season will be Fickell's 10th on the Ohio State football staff. Prior to Fickell's appointment to head coach he was promoted to assistant head coach in March 2011. He also coached the Buckeye linebackers and served as co-defensive coordinator. He was named to the latter position in April 2005. In that role, he was actively involved in game planning and strategy.

Fickell is a Columbus native (DeSales High School, where he was a state wrestling champion) and a 1997 graduate of Ohio State where he was a four-year starter at nose guard while earning his degree in exercise science. Post-graduation, Fickell spent a year on the injured reserve list with the New Orleans Saints before beginning his coaching career.

During his first two years at Ohio State, Fickell was in charge of the special teams and assisted with the defensive front. In his role as special teams coordinator, Fickell had specific responsibility for the punting team. Under his tutelage, that unit has excelled, leading the Big Ten in net punting in three of the past five years.

Fickell played for the Buckeyes from 1992-96, redshirting the first year and then starting the next four seasons at nose guard. He started a school-record 50 consecutive games between 1993 and 1996.

Fickell concluded his Ohio State career with 212 total tackles, including 26 tackles-for-loss and six sacks. During his four years in the starting lineup, the Buckeyes posted a combined record of 41-8-1 overall and were 26-5-1 in Big Ten play with a pair of Big Ten co-championships to their credit. With the win over Arizona State in the Rose Bowl, the Buckeyes finished the 1996 season with a sparkling 11-1 record and were second in the nation in both major polls in the final rankings.

Luke and his wife, Amy (an Ohio State physical therapy graduate), have four children: Landon, Luca, and twins Aydon and Ashton.

Luke Fickell Facts & More:

- **Luke is the 23rd head coach in Ohio State history.** He is only the fourth Ohio State graduate (undergraduate degree) to coach the Scarlet and Gray. Sam Willaman (first year was 1929), Wesley Fesler (1947) and Earle Bruce (1979) are the others.
- **Luke is the sixth former Ohio State assistant coach to assume the school's head coaching position.** Willaman (assisted between 1926-28), Fesler (1931-32), Carroll Widdoes (1941-43; 1946-48), Earle Bruce (1966-72) and Jim Tressel (1983-85) are the others.
- **Luke is the recipient of a national honor.** In 2010 he was named the American Football Coaches Association's assistant coach of the year.
- **Luke is a Columbus native.** He attended Robert Frost Elementary School, Walnut Springs Middle School and graduated in 1992 from DeSales H.S.
- **Growing up, Luke wanted to be an Olympic wrestling champion.** His dad was involved in the sport, helping out Luke's uncle, Wayne, who was a wrestling coach at Bishop Watterson.
- **Luke was a three-time undefeated state wrestling champion for DeSales.** He posted records of 36-0, 31-0 and 39-0 as a sophomore, junior and senior, respectively. He was Division II Ohio state champ at 189 pounds as a sophomore and as a heavyweight as a junior and senior.
- **Luke is married with children.** He and his wife, Amy, have four kids under the age of 10: a son Landon, daughter Luca and twin boys Aydon and Ashton.
- **Luke and Amy were college sweethearts at Ohio State.** Luke is a 1997 Ohio State grad with a degree in exercise science. Four times he was named Academic all-Big Ten Conference. Amy graduated in 1999 with a degree in physical therapy.
- **Luke started a school-record 50 consecutive football games for Ohio State.** After a red-shirt year in 1992, he started every game at nose guard for coach John Cooper between 1993-96.
- **Luke played on two Big Ten champion squads.** Ohio State was Big Ten co-champion in 1993 (10-1-1; 6-1-1) and 1995 (11-2; 7-1).
- **Luke played in four bowl games:** the 1993 Holiday Bowl, the 1995 Florida Citrus Bowl, the 1996 Citrus Bowl and the 1997 Rose Bowl.
- **Luke tore his left pectoral muscle days before the 1997 Rose Bowl.** He started and played against Arizona State anyway. He recorded two tackles despite the shoulder being immobilized.
- **Luke started a foundation to help "tackle illiteracy."** It is called the Second and Seven Foundation and was developed by Fickell and former Buckeye teammates Mike Vrabel and Ryan Miller. The foundation sponsored its inaugural FUNDamental Football Camp for kids in 2000 and proceeds from the camp were used to purchase books for second graders in seven Central Ohio schools.

OHIO STADIUM • "THE HORSESHOE"



Ohio Stadium, home to Ohio State football since 1922, underwent upgrades for the 2009 season, presenting fans with new signage displays and scoreboards in the north endzone and on the east and west fascias of the stadium's C-Deck.

For the first time in the Horseshoe's history, the scoreboard in the north endzone offers fans a video screen. At 17-feet-by-44-feet, the LED board offers fans replays and other game-day features typically only seen on the video board in the south endzone.

The ribbon boards on the east and west side have been replaced and expanded to reach endzone-to-endzone and feature an improved LED display.

In addition to the new boards, tribute signage for Ohio State's seven national championship teams (1942, '54, '57, '61, '68, '70, 2002) is on display near the new scoreboard in the north endzone, accenting the seven currently retired Ohio State jersey numbers of Chic Harley (17), Les Horvath (22), Eddie George (27), Vic Janowicz (31), Howard "Hopalong" Cassady (40), Bill Willis (99) and Archie Griffin (45) also displayed on the north end.

As a result of the expanded ribbon boards, the Woody Hayes tribute signage has been moved to the SE corner of the C-Deck. All three signage areas are backlit for more prominent display during prime-time telecasts.

Ohio State has had 67 consecutive crowds of more than 100,000 at Ohio Stadium.

LAST YEAR VS. ILLINOIS IN CHAMPAIGN

No. 2/2 Ohio State Improves to 5-0 with 24-13 Win at Illinois

Terrelle Pryor rushes for 104 yards, throws 2 TDs; Herron 95 yards and 1 TD

CHAMPAIGN, Ill. – Dan Herron gained 54 of his 95 yards in the fourth quarter and scored the decisive touchdown with 1:49 left to play to lift No. 2 Ohio State to a 24-13 road win over Illinois in the Big Ten opener for both teams. The win, its 11th consecutive dating back to last year, improved Ohio State's record to 5-0 on the season and 1-0 in the Big Ten. Illinois falls to 2-2 and 0-1.

On a windy afternoon in Champaign, neither team presented much of a passing game as Ohio State's Terrelle Pryor managed just 76 yards and Illini signal caller Nathan Scheelhaase threw for 109 yards.

Pryor, who left the game for a few minutes in the third quarter and went into the locker room to get attended for a thigh bruise, did throw two touchdown passes and he also gained 104 yards off 11 carries.

Herron's fourth-quarter heroics were simply huge. With Pryor limited somewhat in his movement after returning, Herron rushed 12 times in the fourth quarter with three of his rushes resulting in first downs. He scored his fifth rushing touchdown of the season from six yards out to seal the victory.

The points were not nearly as attainable for Ohio State against an Illinois team that always plays the Buckeyes tough and had a week off to prepare for this encounter. The Buckeyes came into the 11 a.m. local start game averaging 33.2 points per first half through the first four games of the season, but the first half yielded just two Buckeye scores... just enough for the team to hold 14-10 lead on the strength of two Pryor touchdown passes.

Pryor was 6 of 12 passing for 48 yards in the first half and he also threw one interception. He found Brandon Saine and Dane Sanzenbacher for short touchdown pass plays that were each set up by his own long runs of 66 and 35-yards. Pryor's 100-yard afternoon was the sixth 100-yard rushing game of his career and his third of the season. He now has 1,783 career yards rushing and has passed Rex Kern (1,714) for second place among Ohio State quarterbacks.

After Illinois took a quick 7-0 lead with a touchdown on its first possession, Pryor marched the Buckeyes for a game-tying touchdown in four plays. He started the drive with a career-long 66-yard run on first down that set the Buckeyes up with a first and goal. Pryor then found Saine in the end zone for the score.

The Illini had a fine opportunity to kick the pressure up a notch on Ohio State early in the second quarter. Its defense held Ohio State on downs inside the Buckeye 5 yard line and the ensuing punt set Illinois up with a first down at the Ohio State 34. But the drive stalled and a 41-yard field goal attempt by Derek Dimke was short.

The Illini defense did its part by holding the Buckeyes scoreless on the ensuing drive that had

reached its 30. And then on Ohio State's next possession, Trulon Henry intercepted Pryor – one of two Henry interceptions on the day – on first down to give the Illini a first down at the Ohio State 24. Dimke converted on a 27-yard field goal to give the Illini a 10-7 lead.

Pryor then went 35 yards down the right sideline on Ohio State's next possession that was capped by his 11-yard toss to Sanzenbacher, giving the Buckeyes their 14-10 lead.

Devin Barclay kicked a 32-yard field goal for the only third-quarter points, giving Ohio State a 17-10 lead.

Ohio State's defense was led by 10 tackles from Brian Rolle and a career-high nine from Nathan Williams. Jermale Hines recorded his third career interception, a second half pick of Scheelhaase. That trio was part of a unit that allowed just 251 total yards and 11 first downs, including just one first down in the second half and only three points. The defense also broke Illinois back Mikel Leshoure's streak of five consecutive 100-yard rushing games.

Illinois had 251 total yards. Ohio State netted 290 offensive yards and was 4-of-4 in the red zone with three touchdowns and one field goal.

No. 18/16 Ohio State begins Fickell era with 42-0 shutout

Buckeyes hold Akron to 90 total yards, gain 517 yards of total offense

COLUMBUS, Ohio - Joe Bauserman and Jake Stoneburner connected on three touchdown passes and the Buckeyes offense rolled to 517 total yards as No. 18 Ohio State opened the Luke Fickell era in fine fashion with a 42-0 shutout of Akron in front of 105,001 sunburned fans at Ohio Stadium.

In his first career start, Bauserman looked sharp and confident, completing 12 of 16 passes for 163 yards, including the three TDs to Stoneburner, who became the first Buckeye tight end to find the end zone three times in a single game. Freshman quarterback Braxton Miller would add 132 yards in the second half on 8 of 12 passing, while on the ground, Ohio State rumbled to 224 total yards, highlighted by 93 from sophomore Carlos Hyde.

The Silver Bullet defense was equally impressive, holding the Zips to 90 total yards and forcing eight three-and-outs. The defensive line put constant pressure on Akron's quarterbacks, with five different players recording sacks and Ohio State totaling 10 tackles-for-loss. Senior linebacker Andrew Sweat led the Buckeye in tackles, collecting six total and two for loss.

Ohio State struck first at the 7:24 mark of the first quarter as Bauserman weaved his way through the Akron defense for a 15-yard touchdown run - the first of his career - and a 7-0 lead. The Buckeyes, who amassed 125 yards of offense in the opening stanza, threatened to extend the lead late in the quarter, but Akron's John Griggs forced a Rod Smith fumble that was recovered by Emmanue Lartey at the 4 yard line.

Bauserman upped the Buckeye lead to 14-0 at 5:45 in the second quarter with a 28-yard touchdown pass to junior tight end Jake Stoneburner, capping a bruising 13-play, 64-yard drive. After an Akron three-and-out, the offense once again moved the ball into Zips territory, but a missed field goal from sophomore Drew Basil kept the lead at 14-0 with 4:30 to play in the half.

Stoneburner and Bauserman combined for the second time late in the quarter, connecting for an 11-yard touchdown on third and 10 to give the Scarlet and Gray a 21-0 lead with just over a minute left in the second quarter. Senior linebacker Sweat set up the final seven points of the half with an acrobatic interception at the Akron 34 yard line.

Akron responded with a 10 play, 61-yard drive - crossing midfield for the first time in the game - but T.J. Marchese missed from 41 yards to close the first 30 minutes.

Sophomore wide receiver Corey Brown opened the second half with a 44-yard kickoff return to position the Buckeyes at their own 49. The offense cashed in on the excellent starting position with an eight play, 51-yard drive, capped by a 2-yard TD pass from Bauserman to Stoneburner.



Carlos Hyde rushed for 93 yards on 19 carries in his first career start at running back.

Bauserman passed the torch to Miller midway through the third. Miller, who played briefly in the first half, engineered a six-play, 59-yard drive capped by a 9-yard TD pass to freshman wide receiver Devin Smith that pushed the lead to 35-0 with 14:26 left in the game.

Smith closed the scoring with a 2-yard touchdown run with 5:51 to play. Freshman wide receiver Evan Spencer used one hand to corral a 33-yard pass from Miller and put the Buckeyes in the red zone.

No. 15/15 Ohio State holds off Toledo, 27-22

Running back Carlos Hyde runs for 76 yards and two touchdowns in the win

COLUMBUS, Ohio - In a back-and-forth battle between in-state rivals, No. 15/15 Ohio State came from behind to down Toledo, 27-22, in front of a crowd of 105,016 at Ohio Stadium.

Generating 301 offensive yards to Toledo's 338, a slew of Rocket penalties made the difference for the young Buckeyes. Toledo, who looked to give Ohio State its first in-state loss in 90 years, gave up 102 yards over 14 penalties.

"First thing for us was to be fundamentally sound and physical," Luke Fickell, head coach, said. "They did a good job of challenging us with those things. We tried to make them one dimensional and with tackling we knew we had to do a great job. Those were the biggest areas that stood out to me. We're excited about how the guys fought and kept their chins up, but that's how you challenge yourself to get better."

In his second career start, Joe Bauserman completed 16 of 30 attempts for 189 yards, with three Buckeyes scoring.

Ohio State would strike first and early, making good on a 7-play, 67-yard opening drive at the 11:45 mark of the first quarter. Connecting up the middle, Bauserman found tight end Jake Stoneburner for a 26-yard touchdown pass to put the Buckeyes on the board at 7-0.

With cornerback Kishon Wilcher blocking a Buckeye punt at the 23, defensive end T.J. Fatinikun recovered and ran the ball 22 yards to the Rocket 1-yardline, swinging momentum in Toledo's favor. A middle pass from Austin Dantin to receiver Eric Page and a successful two-point conversion would put the Rockets on the board and leave Ohio State trailing for the first time this season.

Still firing offensively, Toledo struck again when quarterback Terrance Owens found Page along the sideline. Running 66 yards into the endzone, Page helped to close the first quarter at 15-7 in the Rockets' favor.

At a critical time for the Scarlet and Gray, sophomore Carlos Hyde elected to have his first career touchdown. Bringing the Buckeye deficit to one, the tailback from Naples, Fla., rushed for 36 yards to score. With the Rockets forced to punt at the one-minute mark heading into halftime, wideout Chris Fields was the next Buckeye to shine, helping Ohio State regain the lead with a 69-yard return.

But Toledo would not go quietly. Rushing up the middle on a 4-yard play, running back Adonis Thomas put the Rockets back on top, 22-21, at 12:56 in the third quarter.

Ohio State still had an answer, though. Completing a pass to freshman receiver Devin Smith for 36 yards to enter the redzone, Bauserman fed the ball to Hyde, a favorite target of the day, who rushed it in for his second touchdown. However, a missed two-point attempt left the Buckeyes with

a slim 5-point lead at 27-22.

Forcing an Ohio State fumble to regain possession, Toledo threatened in the final minutes with the ball on the Ohio State 16, but came up short on fourth down and turned the ball over to the Buckeyes who let the clock tick down.

With the win, Ohio State moves to 2-0 on the season while the Rockets fall to 1-1.

Buckeyes fall on the road at Miami, 24-6

Jordan Hall runs for 87 yards on a career-high 14 carries

MIAMI - Ohio State dropped its first-ever regular season game in the state of Florida Saturday to unranked Miami, 24-6. The Hurricanes powered for two quick first-quarter touchdowns to build a 14-0 lead and held firm the rest of the way as Ohio State managed just a 4-for-18 day passing for 35 yards with one interception. The Buckeyes gained 190 rushing yards with Jordan Hall a spark with 87 yards rushing in his first game of the season and Carlos Hyde ramming for 54 more yards.

Drew Basil kicked two second-quarter field goals - from 22 and 24 yards out - to trim the Miami lead to 14-6, but a late first-half field goal gave the Hurricanes its 14-point lead at halftime. Miami completed the scoring with 33 seconds left to play for the final margin. Basil's field goals were his first as a collegian.

Ohio State head coach Luke Fickell was counting on a quick start from his troops, but Miami was the team that came out hot. Sophomore tailback Lamar Miller secured the right edge and went 54 yards on the Hurricanes' first play from scrimmage to set the home team up on the Ohio State 9. Three plays later Jacory Harris found Allen Hurns for the first of two three-yard TD hookups to give the 'Canes a quick 7-0 lead.

A second three-and-out by the Ohio State offense ensued and Harris followed with an 11-play drive that he and Hurns capped from three yards out again.

"The thing we wanted to do the most was start fast," Ohio State coach Luke Fickell said. "The number one thing we didn't do on defense was start fast."

His defense held serve, for the most part, for the rest of the game. After giving up 116 yards to the Hurricanes in those first two drives, the team allowed only 247 the rest of the way and kept the home team, playing in front of its second-largest crowd at Sun Life Stadium (66,279), out of the end zone until that final minute.

Sophomore C.J. Barnett and freshman Bradley Roby recorded their first career interceptions, but the Buckeyes managed just three points off the two miscues. Linebackers Andrew Sweat, Etienne Sabino and Storm Klein led the team with nine, eight and six tackles apiece.

Hall was certainly a spark. His first four rushes of the season all went for first downs and covered 13, 13, 15 and 12 yards. His 87 yards rushing was just three short of his career high (90 vs. New Mexico State in 2009) and his 14 carries - all but one in the first half as he experienced cramping in the second half - did represent a career high.

Fifth-year senior quarterback Joe Bauserman, in just his third start, was just 2 of 14 passing for 13 yards and true freshman backup Braxton Miller was 2 of 4 for 22 yards, including an interception on a tipped first attempt.

Punter Ben Buchanan had his second-best day

in terms of average: 46.5 yards per kick off six punts, including three inside the 20. He averaged 50.0 yards off three punts in the win over Indiana last year.

Buckeyes Overpower Buffaloes, 37-17

Braxton Miller makes first career start; Defense holds Colorado to 91 yards rushing

COLUMBUS, Ohio - Ohio State got back on the winning track Saturday afternoon, defeating Colorado 37-17 in front of 105,096 fans at Ohio Stadium.

Balance was the name of the game for the Buckeyes (3-1), who rebounded nicely from a 24-6 setback last weekend at Miami. Solid performances from both the defense and special units provided the OSU offense with outstanding field position throughout the contest, and gritty rushing and improved passing attacks proved difficult for the Buffaloes (1-3) to defend.

Freshman quarterback Braxton Miller was effective in his first career start, completing 5 of 13 passes for 83 yards and two touchdowns - both to freshman wide receiver Devin Smith - while adding 84 yards on the ground. Junior running back Jordan Hall provided a spark to the Buckeye rushing attack, toting the ball 18 times for 84 yards and a touchdown. Hall had 231 all-purpose yards in the contest, with 135 on kickoff returns.

"I think our number one thing going into this game was special units had to make plays. I mean, that was the top of the list," head coach Luke Fickell said. "We did a good job there making some plays and trying to use that as a weapon. I think the next thing we had that poise on defense. We had to tackle better. Obviously we can always get better, but I think we had some poise. We gave up a touchdown on a play. You would hope you could make a play there. But we didn't panic, we just kept under control. So we're excited there."

"Offensively went in thinking we have to run the football. I know there's some different ways we have to run it. But people are going to make it difficult on you. But when you look at it we did a good job running the football."

"And then the last thing, as I said, we had to play with some emotion. I think that's what we wanted, to get back home and get that feel of emotion, get those guys on the sideline, get the students into it. And I think that's what we saw out there today from the beginning of the game, really, to all the way to the end. We're excited about those things."

Defensively, the Buckeyes stifled the Colorado rushing attack, limiting the Buffaloes to 76 yards on the ground.

Ohio State struck first, scoring on its second possession of the game. After a CU three-and-out and 20-yard punt, the Buckeye ground attack marched 43 yards in seven plays, capped by a 1-yard TD run from Hall for a 7-0 lead midway through the first quarter.

Sophomore defensive end Adam Bellamy put the Buckeye offense in prime position on its next drive by recovering a Rodney Stewart fumble at the Colorado 22. Sophomore kicker Drew Basil cashed in on the turnover with a 28-yard field goal to give the Buckeyes a 10-0 lead with 4:49 to play

in the first.

Miller and Smith connected for a 32-yard touchdown on the first drive of the second quarter to up the Buckeye lead to 17. Colorado countered on its next drive as Tyler Hansen hit Toney Clemons with an 11-yard TD on fourth down to put the finishing touches on a 10 play, 83-yard drive that cut the Ohio State advantage to 10.

Momentum would swing back in favor of the Buckeyes late in the second quarter. With 23 seconds left before halftime, the Buffaloes fumbled a Ben Buchanan punt that junior defensive back Zach Domicone recovered at the 11-yard line. Basil connected from 18 yards for a 20-7 Ohio State lead heading into the locker room.

Smith hauled in a 17-yard TD pass from Miller on the opening drive of the third quarter for a 27-7 Buckeye advantage. CU responded on its following possession with an eight play, 60-yard drive that ended in a 47-yard field goal by Will Oliver.

Hall sent the Ohio Stadium crowd into frenzy on the ensuing kickoff, dashing 90 yards down the sideline to set up the Buckeye offense at the Colorado 5. Sophomore running back Carlos Hyde cruised into the end zone on the following play to make the score 34-10.

Basil's third field goal of the game - a career of 47 yards - extended the Ohio State lead to 27 (37-10) early in the fourth quarter. The Buffaloes tacked on a late TD - a 14-yard strike from Hansen to Tyler McCulloch - to provide the final margin.

GAME 5: #25 MICHIGAN STATE

Spartans Edge Ohio State, 10-7, in Big Ten Opener

Buckeyes held scoreless until the final minutes; defense forces three MSU turnovers

COLUMBUS, Ohio - No. 25 Michigan State withstood a late rally from the Buckeyes to escape Ohio Stadium with a 10-7 win in the conference opener for both teams.

A Big Ten defensive battle was witnessed by 105,306 fans at Ohio Stadium as the Spartans (4-1, 1-0 Big Ten) and their aggressive, blitzing defense limited the Buckeye offense to 178 total yards and sacked the OSU quarterbacks nine times on the day. Ohio State (3-2, 0-1 Big Ten) countered with an inspired defensive performance of its own, forcing three Spartan turnovers while repeatedly rising to the occasion with their backs to the wall.

"You have to give a lot of credit to Michigan State," head coach Luke Fickell said. "They came in here and outplayed us. And we knew it was going to be a physical football game. And we just didn't get it done."

Despite the best efforts of the OSU defense, the Scarlet and Gray failed to sustain a consistent offensive attack. The Spartans stuffed the Buckeyes on the ground, holding Ohio State to 35 yards on 39 attempts, while freshman Braxton Miller (5 of 10) and senior Joe Bauserman (7 of 14) combined for only 143 yards passing.

Michigan State never trailed, jumping out to an early first quarter lead as Kirk Cousins and B.J. Cunningham connected from 33 yards at the 7:44 mark for a 7-0 advantage.

Ohio State mounted its first significant drive of the game on its first possession of the second quarter. Miller hit sophomore wide receiver Chris Fields for a 33 yard gain to the Spartan 33, but an interception by MSU defensive back Darqueze Dennard squashed the Buckeye threat.

MSU threatened late in the second, but once again came away empty handed. With a first and 10 at the OSU25, Cousins mishandled a ball that sophomore defensive lineman Johnathan Hankins recovered for the Buckeyes at the 38.

The Spartans advanced the ball to the Buckeye 31-yard line on its second drive of the third quarter but stalled once again. In an attempt to extend the lead to two possessions, Dan Conway fell short from 51 yards.

MSU appeared to break the game open near the end of the third. Facing a third and 6 at their own 31-yard line, Cousins found a wide open Cunningham for 52 yards to the Ohio State 17. After Edwin Baker gave the Spartans a first and goal at the Buckeye 5, the Silver Bullets held on three-consecutive plays to set up a fourth down early in the fourth quarter. On the following play, sophomore defensive back Bradley Roby tipped a Cousins' fade pass to Cunningham that C.J. Barnett intercepted in the endzone.

Bauserman entered the game on the following series but was unable to generate any offense, going three-and-out. Michigan State would add a

Conway field goal from 50 yards on the next possession to extend its lead to 10.

An interception by Roby at the Ohio State 24 kept the Buckeyes alive with just over four minutes to play. After the teams traded possessions, Bauserman found freshman wide receiver Evan Spencer open in the middle of the field for a 33-yard TD, making the score 10-7 with 10 seconds remaining on the clock. MSU would recover the ensuing onside kick to close the game.

Nebraska Rallies Past Ohio State, 34-27

Ohio State can't hold on to 21-point lead; Hyde rushes for 104 yards and two TDs

LINCOLN, Neb. - Taylor Martinez ran for a touchdown and passed for two others while bringing No. 14 Nebraska back from a 21-point second-half deficit, and the Cornhuskers defeated Ohio State 34-27 in the first Big Ten game at Memorial Stadium.

Rex Burkhead scored the go-ahead touchdown on a 17-yard run with 5:10 left.

Ohio State (3-3, 0-2 Big Ten) built a 27-6 lead behind freshman quarterback Braxton Miller, who sprained his right ankle in the third quarter and did not return.

Miller ran for 91 yards and went 5 of 8 passing for 95 yards before he got hurt.

Huskers linebacker Lavonte David stripped the ball from Miller in the middle of third quarter to start the rally.

Then Martinez ran 18 yards for a touchdown, threw a 36-yard TD pass to Quincy Enunwa and tied it with a 30-yard catch-and-run to Burkhead after Stanley Jean-Baptiste intercepted Bauserman in his first game at cornerback after moving from receiver.

Martinez ran for 102 yards and was 16 of 22 passing for 191 yards for Nebraska (5-1, 1-1). Burkhead ran 26 times for 119 yards.

Carlos Hyde led the Buckeyes with 104 yards rushing -- Ohio State's first 100-yard rusher of the season -- and two touchdowns, including a career-long 63-yarder in the second quarter.

The biggest deficit Nebraska had overcome previously was 17 points, most recently against Texas A&M in 2002.

An upset looked to be brewing in the first half, and the Buckeyes' momentum continued to roll when Hyde scored from a yard out to give Ohio State a 27-6 lead early in the third quarter.

David, who made 13 tackles, changed the game with his biggest play of the night. As Miller fought for yards up the middle, he stuck his arms in and pulled the ball away from the quarterback.

Martinez scored two plays later, going untouched up the middle on a zone read to pull the Huskers to 27-13.

The Buckeyes did a good job containing Martinez in the first half, but the sophomore broke loose for 93 yards on the ground after halftime.

Martinez's passing and decision-making had been skewered after the loss at Wisconsin, but he threw a perfect strike to Enunwa to pull the Huskers within a touchdown. Martinez freelanced in the backfield before dumping off to Burkhead, who dodged a tackler and went 30 yards for the tying touchdown with 7:35 left.

C.J. Barnett was called for a facemask on Martinez during the Huskers' winning drive, and Burkhead ran for 22 yards before he broke free for the go-ahead score.

- Ohio State went 2-of-2 in the red zone against Nebraska and is now 16 of 19 on the season. The only three times Ohio State has failed to score inside the red zone was on a fumble and on two end-of-game possessions to run out the clock against Akron and Colorado.
- Corey "Philly" Brown hauled in a career-long 27-yard reception in the third quarter.
- Braxton Miller rushed 10 times for 91 yards before leaving the game in the third quarter. He also had a career-long 24-yard run in the first quarter.
- Jake Stoneburner hauled in a career-long 32-yard TD reception in the first quarter.
- Carlos Hyde's 63-yard TD run in the second quarter was a career long and Ohio State's longest play from scrimmage this season. Hyde finished with a career high 104 yards on 13 carries and 2 TDs.
- Carlos Hyde's 104 yards rushing represented Ohio State's first 100-yard rusher this season.
- Michael Bennett recorded his second sack of the season in the second quarter.
- Orhian Johnson recorded his first INT of the season and the second of his career late in the second quarter, setting up a 35-yard field goal by Drew Basil going into halftime.
- C.J. Barnett recorded a career-high 10 tackles.
- Drew Basil finished 2-for-2 on FGs and has now made seven in a row on the season.
