Last Meeting

Wisconsin won, 31-18, on Oct. 16, 2011 in Madison

Key Notes to Consider

► The Badgers lead the Big Ten in both scoring offense and rank second in scoring defense. Wisconsin and Stanford are the only two teams in the country to rank among the top 10 in both scoring offense and scoring defense.

► Wisconsin's 27-6 record over the last three seasons is the fifth-best record in the country. Only Boise State (33-1), Alabama (32-3) and TCU (30-3) and Oregon (28-5) have better records.

► Wisconsin and Nevada are the only teams in the country averaging at least 240.0 yards rushing and receiving this season. UW has 1,817 passing yards and 1,765 rushing yards this season.

► Junior RB Montee Ball leads the nation with 19 TDs. That is eight more than any other Big Ten player. Only two players in school history have scored more than 19 touchdowns in a season. Ron Dayne scored 21 in 1996 and 20 in 1999. Brian Calhoun holds the school record with 24 TDs in 2005.

► UW ranks among the top 10 nationally in 16 categories: fewest fumbles lost (tied for first), third-down conversions (second), punt returns (second), passing efficiency (second), fewest turnovers lost (tied for second), passing defense (fourth), fewest tackles for loss allowed (fourth), scoring offense (fifth), scoring defense (sixth), red zone offense (sixth), fourth-down conversions (tied for seventh), rushing offense (eighth), total offense (eighth), total defense (ninth), red zone defense (tied for ninth) and first downs allowed (10th).

General Notes

- ▶ Wisconsin has won 13-straight home games, the fourth-longest streak in school history. It is tied for the fifth-longest current home win streak in the country.
- ▶ Bret Bielema became the sixth-fastest Big Ten coach since 1946 to reach 50 career wins. Only Bo Schembechler, Joe Paterno, Earle Bruce, Lloyd Carr and Jim Tressel reached 50 wins faster than Bielema.
- ▶ The 20-point mark has become significant for UW under Bielema. The Badgers are 37-2 in his tenure, including 14-straight wins, when limiting its opponent to 20 points or less. Conversely, Wisconsin is 50-6 when scoring more than 20 points.
- ▶ Seven teams have beaten top-10 teams this year. Wisconsin beat Nebraska by 31 points. The combined margin of victory in the other four games was 36.
- ▶ The Badgers elected four team captains during fall camp, all seniors: DT Patrick Butrym, FB Bradie Ewing, FS Aaron Henry and QB Russell Wilson.
- ▶ One year after having five players named as finalists for major individual awards and three players win awards, nine different Badgers were named to 2011 National College Football Awards Association Watch Lists. That is the highest number of players of any Big Ten school and tied for sixth-most in the country.
- ▶ Wisconsin has made a bowl game and an NCAA tournament men's basketball appearance every season since the 2002-03 academic year. The Badgers are the only school in Division I that can make that claim.

MoneyBall

- ▶ Junior RB Montee Ball, a Doak Walker Award candidate, leads the Big Ten in rushing, averaging 109.7 yards per game. Dating back to last season, he has gone over the 100-yard mark in seven-straight conference games, averaging 150.4 yards per game during that stretch.
- ▶ Ball has scored at least one TD in each of his last 13 games. Over that span, he has scored 34 TDs. The next highest total in the FBS is LaMichael James of Oregon with 22.
- ▶ Entering last Saturday's game, Michigan State ranked third in the country in rushing defense, allowing just 67.0 yards per game on the ground and an average of 2.25 yards per carry. Ball rushed for 68 yards in the first half and finished with 115 yards on 18 carries (6.39 ypc.) and a TD.
- ▶ Ball accounted for 213 yards of total offense (142 rushing, 46 receiving and 25 passing) and four TDs (three rushing, one passing) against Indiana, earning Big Ten Offensive Player of the Week honors. He attempted his first career pass, completing a 25-yard TD pass to QB Russell Wilson. It was the first TD pass for a Badger non-QB since Al Toon threw a 40-yard TD pass to Jeff Nault against Illinois on Oct. 23, 1982 on the play known as "the bounce pass."
- ▶ Ball ran for 151 yards and four touchdowns on a career-high 30 carries in the win over Nebraska. It was his third career four-TD game. He was the first Big Ten player to rush for four TDs vs. an AP Top-10 team since Ron Dayne did it in 1999 Rose Bowl vs. UCLA.
- ▶ Ball has 39 career rushing TDs (despite starting just 11 games in his career), which is third among active FBS players and ranks sixth in UW history.
- ▶ Ball ranks leads the Big Ten in all-purpose yards, averaging 136.9 yards per game. In addition to his rushing totals, he has caught nine passes for 190 yards (21.1 yards per catch) and two TDs.
- ▶ Ball has 2,155 rushing yards for his career, placing him 11th all-time at Wisconsin. He is averaging 5.58 yards per rush in his career, which is second all-time at UW (min. 300 attempts).

Whiteout

- ▶ A year after being named Big Ten Freshman of the Year and leading the Badgers with 1,052 rushing yards, RB James White is second on the team and ninth in the Big Ten with 458 rushing yards.

► White became the third Big Ten Freshman of the Year under Bielema, joining RB P.J. Hill (2006) and LB Chris Borland (2009). White was Wisconsin's sixth Big Ten Freshman of the Year since 1996, twice as many as the next-closest team in that span (Michigan, 3).

► White was fourth among all FBS freshmen in rushing yards last year. He trailed only San Diego State's Ronnie Hillman (1,532), South Carolina's Marcus Lattimore (1,197) and Auburn's Michael Dyer (1,093).

► White's 6.7 yards per carry was second among FBS players who had at least 150 carries last season. Only Nevada quarterback Colin Kaepernick (7.0) averaged more. This year he ranks third among the Big Ten's top rushers, second among running backs, averaging 6.0 yards per carry. The school record for average yards per carry for a career is 5.84 by Ron Dayne. White is at 6.40 with 212 career carries.

Like Father, Like Son

► Senior WR Nick Toon is on pace to have the most productive season of his career. Toon ranks fourth in the Big Ten in receiving yards per game (84.2 yards per game) and is eighth in the country among WRs with at least 20 catches, averaging 18.7 yards per reception.

► Toon is tied for third in the conference (19th in the country) with a career-high six receiving TDs. He had caught at least one TD pass in four straight games, the longest streak of his career, before being shut out against MSU. Wisconsin is 10-0 in games when Toon scores a touchdown.

► Toon tied a career high with seven catches for a career-best 155 yards and two TDs against South Dakota, his second career game with at least 100 receiving yards (123 yards at Indiana on Nov. 7, 2009). His receiving total of 155 yards was the most by a UW player since Travis Beckum's 160 yards at Illinois on Oct. 6, 2007.

► For his career, Toon has 134 catches for 2,026 yards and 14 TDs. He is in fourth place on UW's all-time receptions list, three catches ahead of his father, Al. He also ranks fifth in UW annals for career receiving yards, just 77 yards behind his father. His 14 career TDs are good for ninth in school history.

Walking Towards Success

► Sophomore walk-on WR Jared Abbrederis leads the Badgers with 30 catches and is second on the Badgers and seventh in the conference in receiving yardage. Over the last five games, he has 26 catches for 433 yards (86.6 ypg.) and two touchdowns.

► Abbrederis recorded his first career 100-yard game against South Dakota, catching five passes for 101 yards with one TD. Combined with Toon's 155-yard effort, it was the first time two Badger wide receivers each went over the 100-yard mark in the same game since Lee DeRamus and J.C. Dawkins against Minnesota in 1993.

► In addition to starting every game at wide receiver this season, Abbrederis leads the country in punt returns, averaging 22.3 yards per return. Against Indiana he returned a punt 60 yards for a TD. He had a career-high 204 all-purpose yards against Michigan State (91 receiving, 41 on punt returns and 39 on kickoff returns).

Don't forget about the tight end

► Sophomore TE Jacob Pedersen is tied for the team lead and is tied for second among TEs in the country with six touchdown receptions this season. He has 27 career catches and eight of them have gone for a touchdown.

► Pedersen ranks third on the Badgers with 19 catches for 262 yards. A tight end has led the Badgers in receiving yards in four of the last five years (Lance Kendricks in 2010, Garrett Graham in 2008, Travis Beckum in 2006 and 2007).

Wisconsin Offense

► The Badgers rank fifth in the country in scoring offense, averaging 47.4 points per game. Last year, UW averaged a school-record 41.5 points per game.

► RBs Montee Ball and James White have scored touchdowns in the same game eight times over the past two seasons and the Badgers are 8-0 in those games.

► Wisconsin is averaging 7.7 yards per play, trailing only Houston (7.8) in the country. Last year, with the most prolific offense in school history, the Badgers averaged 6.7 yards per play.

▶ The Badgers rank second in the country in third-down percentage, converting 48 of their 82 third-down attempts (58.5 percent). UW has also converted four of its five fourth-down attempts, resulting in just 19 punts. Only three teams in the country have punted fewer times (Baylor, Stanford and Navy).

▶ QB Russell Wilson is a big part of that success. On third down this season, he is 33-for-42 (.786) for 390 yards, eight TDs and one interception. That translates to a pass efficiency of 214.7. On third-and-long (5+ yards) he is 22-for-27 for 266 yards and UW has converted 16 of those 27 third downs (59.3 percent).

▶ Wisconsin has converted 32 of its 38 red zone attempts into touchdowns, leading the country with a .842 TD percentage in the red zone. Overall, UW is sixth in the country in red-zone scoring (36-of-38, .947). On third-and-goal, Wilson is 4-of-4 for 15 yards and four TDs (461.5 pass efficiency).

▶ A year after leading the country and setting a school record with just nine turnovers, UW is tied for second nationally with just five giveaways this season.

▶ The last time a UW running back fumbled was James White against San Jose State in the second game of last season. Since then, Badger running backs have carried the ball 713 times, caught 59 passes and returned 34 kickoffs (806 total touches) without putting the ball on the turf (not just fumbles LOST, they have not fumbled at all).

▶ On the season, Badger running backs have 27 receptions for 450 yards. Last year, Wisconsin running backs combined to catch 36 passes for 307 yards.

▶ The Badgers have been explosive on offense this season. They have 18 scoring drives that have lasted less than two minutes and already have 46 plays of longer than 20 yards through seven games. Last season UW had 55 20+ yard plays in 13 games and 24 scoring drives that lasted less than two minutes. Wisconsin has had at least four plays of 20 yards in every game this season.

Wisconsin Defense

▶ UW is sixth in the country in scoring defense, allowing just an average of 13.6 points per game. Wisconsin has allowed fewer than 15.0 points per game just three times since 1963 (1998, 1999, 2006).

▶ The Badgers are fourth in the country in pass defense, allowing just 165.6 yards per game through the air. Michigan State is the only team to pass for more than 200 yards against UW this season.

▶ Wisconsin did not have an interception in the first three games of the season and had forced just one turnover. In the last four games, the Badgers have seven INTs and two fumble recoveries. UW has converted its last seven turnovers gained into touchdowns, all during Big Ten play.

▶ Wisconsin's defense has been on the field for 83 possessions this season. Of those, the opposing offense has failed to get a first down 35 times (42.2 percent). The Badgers have recorded 27 3-and-outs, they have forced five turnovers and three drives ended halves.

▶ Through seven games, UW's defense has allowed just 56 total yards on the first drive of the game. Oregon State, Nebraska and Indiana are the only teams to get a first down against the Badgers on their initial possession.

▶ Wisconsin limited Northern Illinois to just seven points and 237 yards of offense. In its other seven games, NIU is averaging 43.0 points and 495.7 yards. NIU senior quarterback Chandler Harnisch was held to just 162 total yards. He is averaging 324.7 yards in the other three games.

▶ Wisconsin limited Nebraska to 17 points and just 159 yards rushing. In their other six games this season, the Huskers are averaging 41.0 points and 278.0 rushing yards per game.

▶ With their 35-0 win over Oregon State, the Badgers recorded their first shutout since a 37-0 over Purdue on Oct. 31, 2009. It marked the third time UW shut out an opponent under Bret Bielema.

▶ The Badgers rank ninth in the country in total defense and have five of their seven opponents under 300 yards of total offense. They did that just three times last year. UW is 28-2 under head coach Bret Bielema when holding its opponent to less than 300 yards.

▶ Sophomore LB Chris Borland leads the Big Ten and is tied for 14th in the country with 71 tackles. He has three double-digit tackle games this season, including the last two. In his first season at middle linebacker, Borland also leads UW with 10.0 tackles for loss, good for fourth in the conference.

▶ Junior LB Mike Taylor has been named Big Ten Defensive Player of the Week twice this season and is second on the Badgers and tied for third in the conference with 64 tackles. He had 14 tackles, a TFL and an interception in the win over Nebraska. He has forced two fumbles this season, including one on MSU's opening possession.

▶ Senior CB Devin Smith suffered a season-ending foot injury against Oregon State. Junior Marcus Cromartie took his place and is tied for fourth on the team in tackles with 22 tackles. He recovered his first career fumble against Michigan State, setting up Wisconsin's second TD.

▶ Despite losing its leading sack producer from last year (J.J. Watt), Wisconsin is fourth in the Big Ten with 14 QB sacks. Nine different players have combined on the 18 sacks.

▶ Senior DE Louis Nzegwu leads the Badgers and ranks fourth in the Big Ten with 4.5 sacks. He has 11.5 sacks in his career.

▶ The two seniors in Wisconsin's defensive backfield, free safety Aaron Henry and cornerback Antonio Fenelus, have combined for 12 interceptions in their careers. They have combined for four picks this season, each intercepting passes vs. Nebraska and vs. Indiana.

▶ LB Derek Landisch recovered a fumble in the end zone for the first defensive touchdown by the Badgers this season. It was the first defensive touchdown for UW since Aaron Henry's interception return for a TD against Northwestern last season.

Wisconsin Special Teams

▶ Senior punter Brad Nortman has handled every punt for Wisconsin over the last four years, starting as a true freshman. He ranks third in school history with a career punting average of 42.2 yards and sits fifth in UW history with 7,216 career punting yards. Nortman has punted just 18 times this season and has had just three returned.

▶ Senior kicker Philip Welch returned to action vs. Nebraska after missing the first four games with a quad injury. Sophomore Alec Lerner has handled 54 of the 57 kickoffs with seven touchbacks. In Welch's absence, redshirt freshman Kyle French was 26-of-27 on extra points and 2-of-4 on field goals (both misses from 50).

▶ Now healthy, Welch is poised to make an assault on the UW and Big Ten record books. He made his first FG of the season against Indiana, connecting on a 38-yarder. He ranks third in school history in career field goal percentage at .767, and second in career field goals made with 56 and career points with 339. His 339 career points are fourth-most among active players in the country while his 56 career field goals are tied for fourth-best in the country. Welch's 118 points in 2010 was most ever by a UW kicker and fourth-best for one season at UW. He needs 95 points to surpass Ron Dayne as Wisconsin's and the Big Ten's all-time leading scorer.

Taking it to the Next Level

▶ With J.J. Watt going No. 11 to Houston and Gabe Carimi at No. 29 to Chicago in the 2011 NFL Draft, UW was one of just five schools in the country to have multiple first-round picks (Alabama, Auburn, Colorado, Missouri). Alabama was the only other school in the country with at least three players drafted among the top 50 (Watt, Carimi and Lance Kendricks).

▶ Wisconsin has had 10 first-round picks in the 2000s, tied for second-most in the Big Ten.

▶ UW had three offensive linemen drafted this year. That gives the Badgers 13 NFL Draft selections on the offensive line since 1999. That is tied with Boston College for the second-most of any school in this span. Only Notre Dame (15) has more. Wisconsin and Florida were the only two schools in the country with multiple offensive linemen selected in 2011 (both had three).

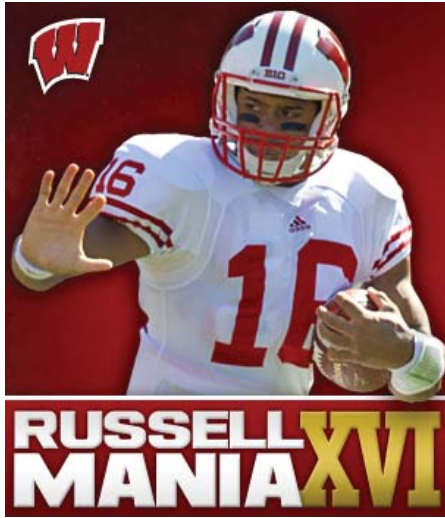
▶ Lance Kendricks was the fifth Wisconsin tight end selected in the NFL Draft since 2006. It's a list that consists of Owen Daniels, Jason Pociask, Travis Beckum, Garrett Graham and Kendricks.

▶ A total of 20 former Badgers made opening-day NFL rosters (see chart on this page). Of those 20, 12 started during the NFL's opening weekend (Carimi, Daniels, Evans, Kendricks, Leonhard, Levy, Moffitt, Nagy, Shaughnessy, Thomas, Urbik, and Watt) and four others saw action (Casillas, Graham, Pressley and Schofield).

▶ At the start of NFL training camp, 11 Badgers from last year's team were in camp with pro teams (QB Scott Tolzien, RB John Clay, WR David Gilreath, WR Isaac Anderson, TE Lance Kendricks, OL John Moffitt, OL Gabe Carimi, OL Bill Nagy, DE J.J. Watt, LB Blake Sorensen and CB Niles Brinkley). Eight of those players made NFL rosters.

- ▶ QB Russell Wilson ranks second in the country in pass efficiency (204.9) and is third in the country in completion percentage (.732). The NCAA record for single-season pass efficiency is 186.0 by Colt Brennan of Hawaii in 2006. Scott Tolzien shattered the Wisconsin school record in both those categories a year ago with a pass efficiency of 165.9 and a completion percentage of 72.9 percent. In his three seasons at NC State, Wilson's pass efficiency was 135.5 and his completion percentage was .578.
- ▶ Wilson has thrown at least one TD pass in 31-straight contests, the longest active streak in the country. The NCAA record is 36 by Graham Harrell of Texas Tech. He has 16 TD passes through seven games. The school record is 21 (John Stocco, 2005).
- ▶ Wilson passed for 347 yards against Northern Illinois then had 345 yards the next week vs. South Dakota. He is the first Badger to throw for at least 325 yards twice in the same season.
- ▶ Wilson is 76-of-99 for 1,260 yards with 12 touchdowns and one interception in the first half of games this season. That equates to a pass efficiency of 221.7.
- ▶ Wilson is averaging 12.0 yards per pass attempt. That is tops in the country, more than a yard better than Baylor's Robert Griffin III. The FBS record is 11.1 yards per attempt set by BYU Heisman Trophy winner Ty Detmer in 1989.
- ▶ Wilson also leads the country, averaging 11.0 yards per play. Houston's Case Keenum is second in the country at 9.3 yards per play. Colt Brennan of Hawaii set the NCAA record in 2006 with 9.2 yards per play.
- ▶ Wilson's pass efficiency of 292.5 in his Badger debut vs. UNLV was a school record for a quarterback in his first start and the third-best performance by a quarterback this season.
- ▶ Wilson ranks third among active FBS players in total offense. Wilson has 11,620 yards in his career, trailing only Keenum (17,173) and Kellen Moore of Boise State (12,798).
- ▶ Wilson has started 43 career games between Wisconsin and NC State, going 25-18 in those performances. Wilson leads all active Big Ten players in quarterback starts. Kirk Cousins of Michigan State is second with 32 starts.
- ▶ Wilson has thrown 92 touchdown passes in his career. That trails only Keenum (130) and Moore (123) for the most among active FBS players. Wilson leads all current major conference players.
- ▶ Wilson's 10,325 career passing yards ranks fourth among active FBS players, trailing only Keenum (16,271), Moore (12,877) and San Diego State's Ryan Lindley (10,822).
- ▶ Wilson has accounted for 113 touchdowns in his career with 92 passing, 20 rushing and one receiving. That is third among active FBS players, trailing only Keenum (150) and Moore (127).
- ▶ Wilson has thrown at least one touchdown pass in 40 of his 43 career starts games. He has thrown for at least two touchdowns 30 times and at least three touchdown passes 15 times.
- ▶ Wilson holds the NCAA record for most consecutive passes without an interception (379), set at the end of his freshman season through the beginning of his sophomore year. His interception on his final pass attempt against Northern Illinois broke a personal streak of 150 attempts without an INT.
- ▶ Wilson has directed 69 drives as UW's quarterback, with the Badgers scoring on 46 of those (66.7 percent). UW has scored 42 touchdowns and kicked four field goals. That is 4.4 points per drive and a touchdown percentage of .609.
- ▶ On third down this season, Wilson is 33-for-42 (.786) for 390 yards, eight TDs and one interception. That translates to a pass efficiency of 214.7. On third-and-long (5+ yards) he is 22-for-27 for 266 yards and UW has converted 16 of those 27 third downs (59.3-percent).
- ▶ On third-and-goal, Wilson is a perfect 4-of-4 for 15 yards and four TDs (461.5 pass efficiency).

Gilreath's 97-yard touchdown return on the game's opening kickoff set the tone, but it was a late scoring drive that sealed the deal as the Badgers scored a 31-18 win over No. 1 Ohio State inside a raucous Camp Randall Stadium.

Junior tailback John Clay - who became the first player to rush for 100 yards on Ohio State in 29 games - finished the day with 104 yards on 21 carries and rushed for two scores.

Freshman backfield mate James White added another rushing score in addition to 75 yards on the ground. Through the air, senior quarterback Scott Tolzien was nearly unflappable as he completed 13 of 16 passes for 152 yards.

OSU trimmed a 21-0 deficit to 21-18, but the Badgers' counter-punch came in the form of a 10-play drive that covered 73 yards on the way to a 12-yard rushing touchdown from White.

The Wisconsin-Ohio State Notebook

► This will be the 77th meeting between the two teams with Ohio State leading the series 53-18-5. The Buckeyes lead the series 28-7-3 in Columbus.

► Since 1999, the teams have split the last 10 meetings, with the Badgers winning three of the five meetings in Columbus.

► In the last game in Columbus, in 2009,

► This will be just the second time since 1974 that Wisconsin will go to Columbus as a ranked team. The last time was 2004 when the Badgers were ranked 15th and won 24-13.

► UW tight ends coach Joe Rudolph got his coaching start at Ohio State, serving two seasons as an offensive graduate assistant and one year as the strength coordinator.

► This will be the first time since 1963 that Wisconsin will square off with Ohio State as the only ranked team. The Buckeyes had been ranked in the last 12 meetings between the teams.

Background on Bielema

- ▶ Bielema has compiled a 55-17 (.764) record in his five seasons at Wisconsin, the fourth-best winning percentage among active FBS head coaches.
- ▶ With 55 wins in his first six seasons, Bielema already ranks third in Badger history for head coaching victories (among 27 coaches in UW history).
- ▶ For leading last year's Badgers to an 11-2 record and their first Big Ten title since 1999, Bielema was named a finalist for the Eddie Robinson, Bear Bryant and Home Depot Coach of the Year awards as well as a semifinalist for the Joseph V. Paterno Coach of the Year Award.
- ▶ Bielema's 55-16 record is second-best among the 11 head coaches hired prior to the 2006 season. He trails only Chris Petersen of Boise State (68-5). Bielema and Peterson are the only two of those 11 head coaches to have led their teams to five straight bowl appearances.
- ▶ Wisconsin has won at least 10 games seven times in school history. Bielema has been a part of four of those seasons (head coach in 2006, 2009 and 2010, defensive coordinator in 2005). He has coached UW to the only two 11-win regular-seasons in school history (2006 and 2010).
- ▶ Bielema was just the third rookie head coach in NCAA Division IA history to guide his team to 12 victories. The 12 wins also were a Wisconsin record.
- ▶ Bielema was named 2006 Big Ten Coach of the Year and was one of five finalists for the Bear Bryant National Coach of the Year Award. He also was a finalist for the 2006 Schutt Sports Division IA Coach of the Year Award.
- ▶ Wisconsin is 74-23 (.763) since Bielema arrived in Madison as defensive coordinator in 2004. He served in that role for two years before taking over as head coach in 2006. That is the 11th-best record in the country and second-best in the Big Ten over that time span.

▶ Bielema was 40 years old when he led the Badgers to the Big Ten title last season. He was the youngest coach to win the Big Ten title since Michigan's Bo Schembechler in 1969.

▶ Bielema coached Wisconsin to wins in 17 of his first 18 games. That represents the second-best start to a head coaching career in Big Ten history. Only Michigan's legendary Fielding Yost, went 55-0-1 from 1901-05, had a better beginning to a career.

Camp Randall Facts, Folklore and Traditions

- ▶ Since the start of the 2004 season (when head coach Bret Bielema joined the UW coaching staff as defensive coordinator) the Badgers have compiled a 48-4 record at Camp Randall Stadium. That is the best home record in the Big Ten over that span and the third-best in the country (behind only Boise State and Oklahoma).
- ▶ Wisconsin is 37-3 in home games since Bielema became coach in 2006. The only three teams to win road games at Camp Randall Stadium in this span all went to BCS Bowls (Ohio State and Penn State in 2008 and Iowa in 2009).
- ▶ Including its 31-18 win over Ohio State last season, Wisconsin owns a 4-5 record all-time against No. 1 teams in Camp Randall Stadium.
- ▶ Including last season, UW has compiled a 7-0 record at Camp Randall Stadium just four times (1898, 2006, 2007 and 2010).
- ▶ Wisconsin won 16 consecutive games at Camp Randall Stadium from Sept. 9, 2006 to Sept. 6, 2008. That was the second-longest home winning streak in school history, trailing only the 25 in a row the Badgers won from 1900-03.
- ▶ The Badgers have allowed fewer than 10 points at home on 15 occasions over the past six seasons.
- ▶ Wisconsin's only four shutouts since 1999 (65-0 vs. Temple in 2005, 14-0 vs. San Diego State in 2006, 37-0 vs. Purdue in 2009 and 35-0 vs. Oregon State) have occurred at Camp Randall Stadium.
- ▶ Camp Randall Stadium, which opened in 1917, is the fourth-oldest Bowl Subdivision stadium in the nation. The only older on-campus facilities are: Georgia Tech (1913), Mississippi State (1914) and Cincinnati (1916).
- ▶ The Camp Randall grounds were used as a Civil War training site. It also held Confederate soldiers, many of whom died and were laid to rest on the west side of Madison. The area known as "soldiers rest" is the northernmost Confederate cemetery in the United States.
- ▶ Camp Randall Stadium served as a living quarters for students and military personnel during the 1940s. Dormitories were built underneath the east-side stands. Approximately 150 men lived there. In addition, there was a rifle range, as well as boxing and wrestling rooms.
- ▶ One of the newest traditions at Camp Randall Stadium is "Jump Around." Between the third and fourth quarters, the song "Jump Around" by House of Pain is played in the facility and the 80,000-plus fans delight in doing as the tune instructs.

MADISON, Wis. -- Russell Wilson threw two touchdown passes and ran for another in his Wisconsin debut and Montee Ball scored four times to lead the 11th-ranked Badgers over UNLV 51-17. Wilson shined, taking off on a 46-yard TD run that had him slipping into the end zone untouched just before halftime. He finished 10 of 13 for 255 yards and had two rushes for 62 yards. Ball caught Wilson's first TD pass as a Badger from 4 yards out. Wisconsin made it 13-0 when Ball took a handoff, busted through two arm tackles and high-stepped to avoid Quinton Porter's desperation dive for a 22-yard touchdown. It was 20-0 when Wilson found top target Nick Toon for completions of 39 and 15 yards before White punched it into the end zone from a yard out. Ball, who finished with 63 yards rushing, also scored on a pair of 1-yard runs, making it 51-3 midway through the third quarter.

Sept. 10 (Camp Randall Stadium / 80,337)

MADISON, Wis. -- Wisconsin pounced on special teams mistakes and leaned on Russell Wilson and the defense to do the rest in a 35-0 victory at Camp Randall Stadium over Oregon State. In his second start for the Badgers (2-0), Wilson was 17 of 21 for 189 yards and the three touchdowns, including a pair to tight end Jacob Pedersen. Wisconsin's running game eventually wore down Oregon State, and Montee Ball had a pair of touchdowns in the second half. It was Wisconsin's first shutout since a 37-0 defeat of Purdue in October 2009, a point of pride for the defense. Wilson and the offense certainly got some unintended help from Oregon State. The first special teams mistake came on the Beavers' second possession, when punter Johnny Hekker bizarrely shanked a ball out of bounds for a four-yard loss that gave the ball back to the Badgers deep in Oregon State territory. Oregon State's defense held on first and second down, then gave up a 17-yard touchdown from Wilson to a wide-open Pedersen.

#7 Wisconsin 49, Northern Illinois 7 Sept. 17 (Soldier Field / 41,068)

CHICAGO, Ill. -- Russell Wilson threw for 347 yards and three scores, Montee Ball rushed for another two touchdowns and No. 7 Wisconsin piled up more than 600 yards of total offense in a 49-7 rout of Northern Illinois at Soldier Field. Ball finished with 91 yards on 18 carries, James White added 100 yards and another score, and Nick Toon had two touchdown catches for the Badgers (3-0), who have won 31 straight against non-conference opponents in the regular season. Wilson was 23-for-32, threw for 347 yards -- the seventh-best total in UW history -- and tallied three touchdowns. Wilson accounted for 384 total yards, a total that ranks as the fifth-highest total offense total in school annals. While the offense was racking more than 600 yards, the Badgers' defense responded with an equally impressive effort. UW limited the Huskies to 237 total yards -- including just 64 on the ground. Sophomore linebacker Chris Borland led the effort with a game-high 11 tackles, including a pair of tackles-for-loss.
