No. 4 Ohio State vs. No. 19/20 Michigan Game Notes

Buckeyes and Wolverines meet for the 109th time and for the 95th consecutive year

FIRST AND 10

- Ohio State has wins in eight of the last 10 games in the series.
- Michigan defeated Ohio State last year in Michigan Stadium, 40-34.
- Members of Ohio State's 2002 national championship team will be recognized between the first and second quarters on the 10-year anniversary of their historic season.
- John Simon has 14.5 TFLs, 9.0 sacks and is this week's Big Ten defensive player of the week.
- Corey Brown's 68-yard punt return touchdown vs. Wisconsin, his second punt return TD of the season, netted him Big Ten special team's player of the week honors.
- Twenty-one Ohio State seniors will be experiencing their last game as players in Ohio Stadium.
- Urban Meyer, the 24th head coach in Ohio State football history, is 115-23 in his 11th season as a head coach.
- Meyer has guided six of his 11 teams to 10-or-more win seasons.
- Brady Hoke is in his second year at Michigan (19-5) and is in his 10th year as a collegiate head coach (64-55).

- Ohio State is playing its 100th season in the Big Ten conference, having joined the league in 1912 and playing its first season of Big Ten football in 1913.

THE GREAT WEEK

One of the great weeks in all of sports is upon us with the 109th meeting between the Ohio State Buckeyes and the Michigan Wolverines set to take place at 12 noon Saturday in what will be a swollen, Ohio Stadium and where the school record crowd of 106,102 will certainly be threatened. The game will close out the first season of the Urban Meyer era and his Buckeyes, at 11-0 and 7-0 in the Big Ten Leaders Division, are seeking to become only the sixth team in 123 years of Ohio State football to finish unbeaten and untied. Michigan is 8-3 overall and 6-1 in the Big Ten Legends Division.

ABC will televise the game to a national audience with Sean McDonough, Chris Spielman and Quint Kessinich describing the action.

BIG RAMIFICATIONS

Ohio State is already the Big Ten Leaders Division champion. Michigan needs a win today coupled with a Nebraska loss at Iowa on Friday to claim the Legends title and represent the division against Wisconsin at the Big Ten championship game Dec. 1 in Indianapolis.

THE RIVALRY

It simply doesn't get much better than the emotional drama, the fierceness of the struggle and, to quote Jim McKay, "the thrill of victory...and the agony of defeat," that comes each time Ohio State and Michigan meet on the gridiron. The 2012 game will

be the 109th meeting and the 95th consecutive year the teams have played. While Michigan leads the all-time series with 58 wins against 43 losses and six ties, Ohio State has been victorious in eight of the last 10 meetings.

A CAUSE FOR DISCORD

Michigan spoiled undefeated seasons for Ohio State in 1969 (Ohio State was ranked No. 1 and 8-0), 1973 (No. 1 and 9-0), 1993 (No. 5 and 10-0-1), 1995 (No. 2 and 11-0) and 1996 (10-0 and No. 2). Ohio State has spoiled Michigan's undefeated seasons in 1970 (No. 4 and 9-0), 1972 (No. 3 and 10-0), 1974 (No. 3 and 10-0), 1975 (No. 4 and 8-0-2) and 2006 (No. 2 and 11-0).

THIS SERIES ... SINCE WOODY

Michigan won 19 of the first 24 games (with two ties) in this series, which dates to 1897, but since the 1951 season and the arrival of Woody Hayes, Ohio State leads the series 31-27-2 (Note: Ohio State's 2010 victory over UM in Columbus, 37-7, was vacated. All series records, streaks, etc., in this release do not include the result of the 2010 game).

SOME SERIES STREAKS

Michigan snapped a six-game losing streak to Ohio State last year in Ann Arbor, 40-34. Those six consecutive wins by the Buckeyes represented the longest winning streak for Ohio State against Michigan. It tied the second-longest winning streak for either team in this series and it was the longest streak in 84 years. Michigan owns the longest such streak – nine games between 1901-09.

FIRST-YEAR OHIO STATE COACHES: 5-11-1

Ohio State first-year coaches are 5-11-1 in games against Michigan. Sam Willaman (1929), Francis Schmidt (1934), Carroll Widdoes (1944), Earle Bruce (1979) and Jim Tressel (2001) are the Ohio State coaches to have their first Ohio State team defeat Michigan.

LORE AND MORE

Since Ohio State's first win over Michigan in 1919, the series is virtually even with Michigan holding a two-win lead, 45-43-4. Here's more good stuff through the years ...

- Ohio State vs. Michigan has been the regular season ender every year since 1935 except one: in 1942 the team ended with a game against the Iowa Seahawks;
- In 1950 the famous "Snow Bowl" game with Michigan was played in Columbus. Michigan won, 9-3, scoring a safety and a touchdown off blocked punts. Michigan's Chuck Ortmann punted 24 times; Ohio State's Heisman winning Vic Janowicz punted 21 times;
- In 1963 Ohio State defeated Michigan in Ann Arbor, 14-10, in a game that was delayed a week while the nation mourned the death of President John F. Kennedy;
- Defending national champion Ohio State rolled through the 1969 season with a 9-0 record, but Michigan ended the team's 22-game winning streak and bid for consecutive national titles with a 24-12 win.

MORE OSU/UM FB FACTS

The Ohio State vs. Michigan rivalry was named the greatest rivalry of the 20th century by ESPN.com in 1999. Ali vs. Frazier was No. 2 ... Michigan has a Big Ten-best 42 conference championships; Ohio State is second with 34 ... Ohio State has the longest winning streak of Big Ten games (20 between 2005-07) and Michigan is second with 19 ... The two schools are tied for the Big Ten record with 28-game regular season winning streaks.

HOME VS. AWAY

Ohio State is 23-27-2 vs. Michigan in Columbus and 20-31-4 vs. Michigan in Ann Arbor.

THE 10-YEAR WAR

The Big Ten Conference championship was on the line for all 10 games between Ohio State and Michigan between 1969-78. The name for this era was The 10-Year War.

GAME GEAR

Ohio State will be outfitted for the game in special Nike uniforms. This year's model hints back to the uniform style worn by the Buckeyes starting in the 1967 season but that are typically referenced as the uniforms worn by the 1968 national champion Ohio State squad. SENIOR DAY

Twenty-one seniors will make their final appearance in Ohio Stadium. This group may have had its 12-1 2010 season that included a Big Ten and a Sugar Bowl championship vacated, but it does have Rose Bowl and Big Ten championships to its credit, 28 wins in 37 games, 15 weeks ranked as a Top 10 team and re-establishing Ohio State as a proud force once again after a rough 2011. WELCOME HOME 2002 CHAMPIONS

Ten years ago this year – the 2002 season – the Ohio State Buckeyes captured their first national championship since 1968 with a 13-0 regular season and a double overtime victory over Miami in the national championship game in Tempe, Ariz. Captained by Michael Doss and Donnie Nickey, and with Chris Gamble and Craig Krenzel sharing team MVP honors, the 2002 Buckeyes:

- Set an NCAA Division I record with a 14-0 record;
- Began the season ranked 13th but worked their way up to No. 2 heading into the title game;
- Won five games by six points or less;
- Defeated defending national champion Miami, and snapped its 34-game winning streak, with a 31-24 double overtime victory; and
- Claimed the Big Ten's first unanimous national championship since 1968.

The 2002 Big Ten and national champions will be recognized in between the first and second quarters at the north end of the field.

SEEKING PERFECTION

The 2002 team was the most recent of five previous unbeaten and untied teams in school history. The 2012 Buckeyes will attempt to become the sixth...in 123 years of football. Four other years – 1899, 1917, 1961 and 1973 – Ohio State finished unbeaten but with a tie.

15th DOUBLE DIGIT WIN STREAK

Ohio State's 11-game winning streak represents the 15th winning streak in school history of 10-or-more games. The streak still has a way to go – it would need to double – to tie the longest streak in school history. Just getting the streak to 12 will be an achievement. Michigan has snapped a lengthy Ohio State winning streak three times already: the school-record 22-game streak in 1969; an 11-game streak in 1995 and a 10-game streak in 1996.

FIVE 10-PLUS WIN STREAKS FOR MEYER

Urban Meyer is in the midst of his third-longest winning streak for both a single season and multi-years. The only active coach – and one of only nine all-time – to have multiple 20-game winning streaks, Meyer won his last game at Florida – 37-24 over Penn State in the 2011 Outback Bowl – and he has the Buckeyes 11-0 for a current 12-game winning streak. He has coached teams to winning streaks of 10 or more games five times.

MEYER EQUALS SECOND-BEST START

Urban Meyer's 11-0 start ties his mentor – Earle Bruce – for the second-best start for a head coach all-time in Ohio State history. Bruce opened the 1979 season 11-0. Only Carol Widdoes, who went 9-0 in 1944 and eventually won his first 12 games, has opened a coaching career at Ohio State with more wins.

AND THEN THERE WERE TWO

Ohio State and Notre Dame are the only two unbeaten teams in the Football Bowl Subdivision. Both teams are 11-0 and Ohio State is riding its longest winning streak in six years (the 2006 team opened 12-0). A look at Ohio State's season-long resume reveals:

- Zero losses;
- A 4-0 record on the road with three most impressive wins: at No. 20 Michigan State, at Penn State and at Wisconsin;
- A signature, 25-point win over No. 21 (at the time) Nebraska, now 9-2 on the season and ranked 14th;
- An improving defense that has not only proved it can win games, but has also given up just 14.2 points per game over the last four games;
- A five-win and seven-loss improvement over last season's 6-7 team;
- An offense that has consistently ranked in the nation's Top 10 all season in rushing;
- An offense that is 18 points away from an all-time Top 5 scoring season in school history; and
- Zero losses.

BUCKEYES STOP BADGERS

Carlos Hyde scored two touchdowns, including a game-winning TD in overtime, Ohio State's defense came up with all kinds of big plays, and Corey Brown scored on a 68-yard punt return to key the Buckeyes to a 21-14 victory over Wisconsin at Camp Randall Stadium to clinch the outright Big Ten Conference Leaders Division title. After Brown returned the punt late in the first quarter, Hyde scored from 15-yards out early in the second to give the Buckeyes a 14-0 lead. A Montee Ball, NCAA-record tying TD closed the margin to seven and then the Badgers tied it with 8 seconds to play when Curt Phillips hit Jacob Pederson with a five-yard touch-

down pass. Hyde and Miller had two runs apiece in the overtime with Hyde scoring from the 2. The Ohio State defense then held on fourth down with Christian Bryant batting away a Phillips pass.

SIMON SETS & TIES SACKS RECORDS

Senior John Simon, who earlier this season had a school-record tying five tackles for loss in the win over Nebraska, sacked Wisconsin quarterback Curt Phillips a school-record tying four times, for a school-record 36 yards in losses. Simon now ranks seventh in school history in both TFLs and quarterback sacks. He was named the Big Ten's defensive player of the week and the College FB Performance Awards national defensive player of the week this week for his efforts.

30 TACKLES BY LBS

Sophomore linebacker Ryan Shazier and Zach Boren led the Buckeyes with 12 tackles apiece vs. the Badgers. Shazier added three TFLs, a pass break-up and he forced a fumble on a fourth-and-inches play at the goal line when he went airborne to collide with Montee Ball, who was trying for an NCAA record-breaking 79th touchdown. Boren's career-best day included seven solo tackles and a forced fumble. Etienne Sabino returned to the starting lineup at LB after missing four games with a lower leg injury to record six tackles, including a tackle for a two-yard loss on Ball in overtime.

BEST OF C.J. SPARKS SECONDARY

C.J. Barnett's "best game of the season," according to coach Urban Meyer, sparked an Ohio State secondary that was in on 26 tackles and consistently set the edge and forced play inside. Barnett had a personal season-high 11 tackles. Bradley Roby had seven stops and a pro-style pass break-up at the goal line late in the game. Christian Bryant recovered a fumble at the OSU 6 inside of three minutes to play, and he batted down the final pass attempt of the game.

HYDE TIES 10-YEAR HIGH...

Carlos Hyde has scored 15 rushing touchdowns this season to tie Chris "Beanie" Wells for the most in the last 10 years. Wells had 15 rushing touchdowns in 2007. The high before that was 16 by Maurice

Clarett in 2002. Hyde's 16 touchdowns this season has the junior ranked first in the Big Ten and 11th nationally with 96 points and 10.7 points per game.

AND NEARS 1,000 YARDS

Carlos Hyde has played in nine games this season but has rushed for 824 yards for a 91.6 yards per game average. In Big Ten play, Hyde averages 102.1 yards per game. He needs 176 yards to join Braxton Miller (1,214 yards) as a 1,000-yard rusher for the season.

BROWN, SPECIAL TEAMS DELIVER AGAIN

Corey Brown returned his second punt return of the season for a score, going 68 yards up the middle for the opening salvo in the battle with the Badgers. The Big Ten Conference named him its special teams player of the week. Brown, who took a punt back 76 yards for a score vs. Nebraska, is now tied for second in single season punt return TDs (Ted Ginn had four in 2004) and tied for fourth in career TDs at Ohio State. Ohio State has four special teams touchdowns and six blocks so far this season, while opponents have three blocks and four scores.

BRAXTON CONTINUES TO CLIMB CHARTS

Braxton Miller had just 145 yards of total offense vs. Wisconsin, but he still averages an impressive 278.5 yards per game to rank second in the Big Ten and 34th nationally. His season average and career average (214.7) are set to top the school records of 270.6 by Joe Germaine in 1998 (season) and 185.2 by Terrelle Pryor (career). Miller's 4,938 career yards

are good for 11th place on Ohio State's all-time career records list. He needs just 159 yards to climb into Ohio State's Top 10.

TOTAL OFFENSE RECORD IN REACH

Braxton Miller has 3,064 yards of total offense this season – the third-most in school single season history – and he needs 227 yards to break Bobby Hoying's 1995 record of 3,290 yards.

DEFENSE: 57 POINTS ALLOWED LAST 4

Ohio State's improving defense has allowed only seven touchdowns to be scored on it in the last four games and has surrendered just 57 points, or 14.2 points per game.

39 TACKLES FOR BOREN

Zach Boren has been the team's second-leading tackler since moving from fullback to linebacker during Week 7 of the season. Since his first LB action against Indiana, Boren has 39 tackles, including a career-best 12 last week vs. Wisconsin, to trail only Ryan Shazier (52 tackles) in that time.

BOREN TO PLAY DEFENSE

Zach Boren entered the season having played in 39 games and with 27 starts at fullback. He knows linebacker, though, having played it in high school. And his dad, Mike, played the position at Michigan and finished second on the school's all-time charts with 332 tackles.

- Second in tackles with 110 total and 10.0 tackles per game;
- First in tackles for loss (actually, he is tied with teammate John Simon) with 14.5;
- Sixth in passes defended with 12 (11 PBUs and one interception);
- Tied for second with three forced fumbles; and
- 11th in quarterback sacks with 4.0.

SHAZIER: FIRST SINCE LAURINAITIS

Ryan Shazier has had six double-digit tackling games this season and his latest – 12 vs. Wisconsin – moved the sophomore over the 100-tackle mark for the season. With 110 stops, Shazier is the first sophomore at Ohio State since James Laurinaitis in 2006 to top 100 tackles in a season.

BACK-TO-BACK PoWs FOR LB SHAZIER

A 14-tackle performance, including a career-best 11 solo tackles and two tackles-for-loss, earned Ryan Shazier the Big Ten's defensive player of the week award following the Illinois game. It was the second consecutive week that Shazier had been honored by the Big Ten. He was co-defensive player of the week after recording eight tackles, two sacks and intercepting a pass for a touchdown in the Buckeyes' win over Penn State.

THORPE CONTENDER ROBY LEADS NATION

Sophomore CB Bradley Roby continues to lead the nation with 19 passes defended (17 pass break-ups and two interceptions), despite only playing in 10 games. One of 15 semifinalists for the Thorpe Award, Roby's 17 PBUs are tied with Ahmed Plummer for the school record and include a personal best four in the win over Penn State.

The effort is led by Bradley Roby's 17 and with help from Ryan Shazier (11 PBUs), Christian Bryant (10), Orhian Johnson (seven) and Travis Howard and C.J. Barnett with six apiece.

HOWARD T19th IN INTERCEPTIONS

Interception No. 4 on the season against Illinois for team leader Travis Howard keeps him in a tie for first in the Big Ten Conference and moved him into a tie for 19th nationally.

BUCHANAN: WUERFFEL FINALIST

For the second consecutive year, punter Ben Buchanan has been named a finalist for the Wuerffel Trophy, presented to the college football player who best combines exemplary community service with athletic and academic achievement. The winner will be chosen Dec. 4.

IN THE RED ZONE

Ohio State is efficient, offensively and defensively, in the red zone. The offense ranks second in the Big Ten with an 88.9 pct. (40 of 45) and it is first with 36 red zone touchdowns. The defense is second in the Big Ten, allowing opponents to score on 71.4 pct. of its trips (25 of 35), and its 17 touchdowns allowed are third-fewest in the league.

MILLER: 3RD BIG QB TO TOP 1,000

Braxton Miller, 19th nationally with 110.3 rushing yards per game, is only the third quarterback in Big Ten history to top 1,000 yards rushing in one campaign. He is the 27th Ohio State player to rush for 1,000 in a season and the first since Chris "Beanie" Wells in 2008.

- Trailing Nebraska 17-7, he came into the game for two plays to finish off a touchdown drive.
- His third quarter shovel pass to Carlos Hyde went for 14 yards and a score and gave the Buckeyes a two-touchdown lead in the three-point win over Indiana.
- He completed 6 of 11 passes for 77 yards and one touchdown vs. Purdue. His efforts included a game-winning, 6q-yard TD drive that featured a 39-yard completion to Devin Smith for a first down at the Purdue 22 with 33 seconds to play; an eight-yard completion to the sideline to Evan Spencer; a two-yard touchdown pass to Chris Fields with three seconds left to play; a two-point conversion completion to Jeff Heurman that tied the score; and a 17-yard completion in overtime to Jake Stoneburner to the Purdue eight. Three rushes later Ohio State was in the end zone.

His 32 receptions through the first five games of the season tied Terry Glenn's total in 1995 as the most catches through the first five games.

- Has led Ohio State to a score EVERY TIME team has needed it most:
 - 1) after now 8-2 UCF tied score at 10;

TEAM/MISCELLANEOUS NOTES

"MAKE THE GREAT STATE OF OHIO PROUD"

Back home in Ohio to live for the first time in nine years, Urban Meyer addressed publicly early in his tenure that his goal was for his coaches and players and program to "make the great state of Ohio proud."

EIGHT ASSISTANTS WITH OHIO TIES

Meyer's coaching staff includes eight assistants who were either born, raised and/or schooled in the great football state of Ohio. Like Meyer, seven of his assistants grew up in the state.

- CB coach Kerry Coombs is from Colerain, graduated from the University of Dayton and has coached in the state for 30 years; 24 years in the high school ranks and five years collegiately.
- RB coach Stan Drayton is from Cleveland, graduated from Allegheny College and is in his fourth year coaching in the state.
- Def. coord./LB coach Luke Fickell is from Columbus, graduated from Ohio State and has been a college coach in the state for 14 years.
- Off. coord./QB coach Tom Herman was born in Cincinnati.
- FB/TE coach Tim Hinton is from Amanda, graduated from Wilmington College and has coached collegiately or in the high school ranks in the state for 28 years.
- WR coach Zach Smith, the grandson of Earle Bruce, grew up in the Columbus suburb of Dublin.
- DL coach Mike Vrabel is from Akron, graduated from Ohio State and is in his second year coaching at his alma mater.
- Co-off. coord./OL coach Ed Warinner is from Strasburg and graduated from Mount Union.

199 YEARS OF COACHING EXPERIENCE

Meyer's Ohio State coaching staff has 199 combined years of NFL, college and high school coaching experience. The total includes three coaches on staff with college head coaching experience (Meyer, Luke Fickell and Everett Withers), two with a combined 32 years of high school head coaching experience (Kerry Coombs and Tim Hinton), two with 12 years of offensive coordinator experience on the collegiate level (Tom Herman and Ed Warinner) and two with 15 years of collegiate defensive coordinator or co-defensive coordinator experience (Withers and Fickell).

LUKE: FOURTH DC RETAINED BY MEYER

Urban Meyer has held four head coaching positions and at each school he has retained the previous staff's defensive coordinator. It's an impressive list that now includes Luke Fickell, co-defensive coordinator for six years previously at Ohio State. The others: Tim Beckman at Bowling Green (Beckman is now head coach at Illinois); Kyle Whittingham at Utah (he is entering his seventh season as Utah head coach); and Charlie Strong at Florida (Strong is in his third season as head coach at Louisville).

123RD FOOTBALL SEASON

The 2012 football season is the 123rd season for the Ohio State football program. Football became a varsity sport at Ohio State in 1890. Ohio State ranks fifth all-time in NCAA Division I history with 835 wins. Ohio State's all-time record is 836-315-53.

100TH BIG TEN SEASON

The 2012 season is Ohio State's 100th season of play in the Big Ten Conference. Ohio State joined the former Western Conference during the 1912-13 academic year, but it could not compete in the conference in football until 1913. Ohio State ranks second in all-time Big Ten wins with a record of 464-171-24. Ohio State also ranks second with 34 outright or shared Big Ten championships.

90TH YEAR IN OHIO STADIUM

Ohio Stadium, grand and venerable and registered on the National Register of Historic Places, will host its 90th football season in 2012. Ohio Stadium is endearingly nicknamed the "Horeshoe" or the "Shoe" because of its open south end. It is also referred to as the "House that Harley Built" after Chic Harley, Ohio State's first three-time All-American who fans flocked to see at Ohio Field in 1916-17-19. Just one year after Harley's career at Ohio State was over, things were in motion for a new stadium for the Buckeyes.

From authors Marv Homan, a former Ohio State radio announcer and sports information director, and reporter Paul Hornung, who co-wrote "Ohio State – 100 Years of Football," the stadium took shape this way:

1919 – Led by Harley, Ohio State recorded its first win over Michigan, 13-3, and the program was becoming a major force in the Western Conference. Ohio Field could not support the legions of fans that wanted to see the team play.

1920 – Professor and athletic board member Paul French, and Director of Athletics Lynn St. John, started an extensive stadium fund raising campaign while interest was soaring. The goal was to raise the "unrealistic" amount of \$600,000 for the stadium campaign. Five weeks later more than \$900,000 had been pledged. Ohio State went undefeated that season and received its first invitation to the Rose Bowl, further raising interest in the program.

1921 – A ground-breaking ceremony was held Aug. 3 with Ohio Governor Harry Davis part of a crowd of over 2,500 at the event. It was speculated the stadium would hold 35,000 fans. Upon completion, it would seat over 60,000.

1922 – The \$1.5 million dollar stadium, of which more than \$1.0 million was donated by proud and dedicated Ohio State football fans, was christened when Ohio State defeated Ohio Wesleyan, 5-0, in front of a crowd of 25,000. Ohio Stadium was dedicated prior to the Oct. 21 game against Michigan. With temporary stands in the south end of the stadium, a crowd of 72,500 was on hand.

1928 – L.W. St. John announces that all stadium debt has been paid, a remarkable achievement

considering Ohio Stadium had only been standing for eight years.

OHIO STADIUM STATS

Ohio State has an all-time record of 403-109-20 in Ohio Stadium and the stadium has an official capacity of 102,329. The Buckeyes have not played before fewer than 100,000 fans in the last 76 games, or since the completion of a three-year renovation project in 2001 that restored and improved the stadium but also boosted attendance from an 88,000-plus capacity to over 100,000. Ohio State has played before more than 105,000 fans 50 times with a record crowd of 106,102 vs. Nebraska on Oct. 6, 2012.

OHIO STADIUM SIGHTS AND SOUNDS

A \$7 million improvements project this summer replaced the 11-year-old Ohio Stadium scoreboard and audio system with a larger, high definition screen flanked by two clusters of speakers with new LED ribbon boards running the length of the south stands. The new Panasonic scoreboard is 42-feet-by-124-feet. The improvements project also included the conversion of 223 standard televisions in the stadium to HD sets.

FIVE CAPTAINS

Captaining the Buckeyes in 2012 will be a handful of seniors: FB Zach Boren; DL Garrett Goebel; RB Jordan Hall; LB Etienne Sabino; and DL John Simon.

SIMON 8TH TWO-TIME CAPTAIN

John Simon is just the seventh two-time captain in Ohio State history and the first since All-American linebacker and St. Louis Ram James Laurinaitis was so honored in 2007 and 2008.

IT'S ALL ABOUT THE TEAM STATS

Urban Meyer's 10 previous collegiate teams have been extremely balanced in all phases of the game. His teams have led their respective conference in a statistical category 43 times, including in 17 offensive categories, 12 defensive, nine special teams and five times in turnover margin. Some highlights:

- His team's have led in total offense four times, including three times by Florida;
- Four times his teams have led in scoring offense and passing efficiency;
- His defenses have led a league three time against the rush and twice in scoring;
- His return teams – punt and kickoff – have led a total of five times; and

- His teams have led in net punting three times.

Meyer's teams have been ranked among the nation's Top 10 in team statistical categories 49 times, including NCAA statistical champions in passing efficiency (Florida; 2009) and kickoff returns (Utah; 2003).

LOGOS

The FieldTurf at Ohio Stadium will wear the logo of the Big Ten Conference this season. B1G logos will be at both ends of the field between the 20 and 30 yard lines and facing the press box. This year the team's jerseys will also sport the B1G logo on the front right chest.

100

In honor of the 2012 season being Ohio State's 100th season playing football in the Big Ten Conference, team members will be sporting a decal on the back of their helmets with the number 100 on it.

NO BIG CHAMPIONSHIP OR BOWL IN 2012

Due to an NCAA major infraction, the Ohio State University football program is ineligible for post-season play during the 2012 season. This penalty was imposed by the NCAA Committee on Infractions in response to extra benefits and preferential treatment violations involving institutional memorabilia and apparel. Additional penalties for the football program include the imposition of a three year probationary period from December 20, 2011 to December 19, 2014; the reduction of scholarships from 85 to 82 during the 2012-13, 2013-14, and 2014-15 academic years; and the vacation of all wins from the 2010 season.

In response to the major infraction, the institution has increased its compliance educational and monitoring efforts regarding preferential treatment, extra benefits, institutional memorabilia and apparel. Further, a greater emphasis has been placed on the education of the Columbus community, local businesses, boosters and other constituents to ensure knowledge of NCAA, Big Ten, and institutional regulations. The Ohio State University continues to strive to create a compliance conscience within the university and throughout Buckeye Nation.

NOT SINCE 1922-24

Ohio State ranks first among all NCAA Div. I programs with 86 consecutive seasons since last posting back-to-back losing records. The Buckeyes have not been under .500 for two or more consecutive seasons since 1922-24. Tennessee had been first until last season; the Vols hadn't had back-to-back losing seasons since 1909-11, a span of 98 consecutive seasons, until going 6-7 and 5-7 in 2010 and 2011, respectively.

On the morning of November 28, 2011, Ohio native Urban Meyer returned home. It was at that time when the then-47-year-old Meyer, born in Toledo, raised in Ashtabula and with degrees from the University of Cincinnati and The Ohio State University, signed a six-year agreement to become the 24th head coach in the storied history of Ohio State football.

The only candidate interviewed by a five-member search committee of senior Ohio State leaders, headed by President E. Gordon Gee and Director of Athletics Gene Smith, Meyer, now 48, returns to collegiate coaching after sitting out the past year to devote time to his family – wife Shelley, college-age daughters Nicki and Gigi and 13-year-old son Nathan – and to work as an analyst for ESPN.

It's easy to see why he was the No. 1 choice of the search committee. Through 10 full seasons as a head coach, Meyer has the tenth-best winning percentage in major college football history with a winning rate of .833 (115-23). He is No. 2 among current major college coaches with that percentage, trailing only the .911 percentage owned by Boise State's Chris Petersen.

Meyer has already won two national championships – in 2006 and 2008 with the University of Florida – and no less than three national coach of the year honors, including *The Sporting News* honor in 2003 and the Eddie Robinson and Home Depot Coach of the Year awards, respectively, in 2004.

Meyer has not only won big at each of his three previous head coaching positions, but he has won immediately. He led Bowling Green to the best turnaround season in the nation in 2001 with an 8-3 record and he went 9-3 in Year 2. He was 22-2 in two seasons at Utah, including a 16-game winning streak and a 12-0 campaign in 2004 when he led the first-ever non-Bowl Championship Season program into a BCS game.

He was 65-15 in his six seasons at Florida with the two national titles, two Southeastern Conference championships and three 13-win seasons, including consecutive 13-win seasons in 2008 and 2009 to become the first coach ever to accomplish that feat.

And now he brings his coaching talents home to Ohio, the state where he has lived for 25 of his 48 years and where he met his wife, the former Shelley Mather, who grew up in Frankfort, Ohio.

Ohio State cruises past Miami in Urban Meyer's debut, 56-10

Braxton Miller rushes for and Ohio State QB-record 161 yards; throws for 207

COLUMBUS, Ohio (AP) — Braxton Miller made Urban Meyer's debut even more memorable.

Miller rushed for 161 yards, a record for an Ohio State quarterback, and threw for two scores to lead the 18th-ranked Buckeyes to a 56-10 victory over Miami (Ohio).

The slow-starting Miller, who stutter-stepped for a 65-yard score just 17 seconds into the second half, was 14-of-24 passing for 207 yards. He connected with Devin Smith for one highlight-reel score and also hit Corey Brown on a 5-yard TD pass.

After Miller's long run made it 28-3, Bradley Roby recovered a high Miami punt snap in the end zone and the rout was on.

Travis Howard had two interceptions and Carlos Hyde scored on 4- and 8-yard runs for Ohio State.

Miller and Hyde, who had 82 yards on 17 carries, helped the Buckeyes roll up 294 yards on the ground and 244 through the air.

Much like during the early spring the Buckeyes struggled at the outset. With Miller completing just one of his first seven passes, Ohio State was outgained 172-48 in the opening quarter before a stunned crowd of 105,039 at Ohio Stadium which came expecting to see a refurbished and cutting-edge offense. The first four possessions ended with punts.

Meanwhile, the RedHawks bumbled despite taking a 3-0 lead after the first 15 minutes.

Zac Dysert, who completed 31 of 53 passes for 303 yards and one touchdown with the two interceptions, was victimized by dropped catches again and again. Three times it appeared the RedHawks had a first down after a catch when the ball abruptly came loose.

Taking over at their own 17 after a punt, the Buckeyes needed just four plays to cover the distance and take the lead for good. Miller used a play-action fake to freeze the defense before hitting Brown for a 38-yard gain to the Miami 23. Miller then threw high and hard into the right corner of the end zone where Smith leaped, snagged the ball with his right hand and, while twisting, tucked it in as he crashed to the ground.

Once they figured out how to score, the Buckeyes kept it up.

Miller rolled right and flipped a short pass to Brown for a TD before Hyde burst in off right tackle for a 21-3 lead.

A 44-yard throw from Miller to Evan Spencer with 3 seconds left in the half gave Ohio State the ball at the 1, but Hyde was stopped by Miami's Justin Bowers short of the goal line.

Miller scored just 17 seconds into the second half, juking and then speeding past the Redhawks' D.J. Brown down the left sideline for the lengthy score. Moments later, a high snap tipped off the fingertips of Miami punter Zac Murphy, with Roby winning a scrum in the end zone for the touchdown and a 35-3 lead.

Miami's Nick Harwell, fourth in the nation a year ago in yards receiving per game, had a couple of the drops

but still finished with 120 yards on eight receptions. Harwell caught a 44-yarder from Dysert for the RedHawks' touchdown early in the third quarter.

The RedHawks had taken advantage of Ohio State's early offensive misplays to take the lead on freshman Kaleb Patterson's 22-yard field goal - not long after he had missed a chip shot from almost the same distance.

Miller's rushing total eclipsed the previous record of 146 yards set by Cornelius Greene against Wisconsin in 1974.

Brown finished with seven catches. The Buckeyes' leading receivers a year ago had 14 receptions in 13 games.

GAME 2: UCF**Miller leads No. 14 Ohio State past stingy UCF squad, 31-16***QB rushes for 141 yards and 3 TDs, throws for 155 on 18 of 24 passing*

COLUMBUS, Ohio -- No. 14 Ohio State downed UCF 31-16 in front of a crowd of 104,745 Sept. 8 at Ohio Stadium. The game marked the first meeting between the two teams.

Sophomore quarterback Braxton Miller became the first Ohio State quarterback in 34 years to rush for three touchdowns in a game and finished with 141 yards rushing. He ran for over 100 yards in the first half for the second consecutive week.

"I like to give credit to a very good team we faced in Central Florida," head coach Urban Meyer said. "We knew going in they would try to run downhill on us. I think this is the second week in a row we held a team under 100 yards rushing. However, pass defense, we have a long way to go. Getting pressure on the quarterback.

"Offensively, we're down to our third tailback, and it looked like it. We have to get better. The guys carrying the ball are talented, just terrible mistakes. Penalties and turnovers are not in the first game, very minimal penalties and zero turnovers."

Miller, who last weekend broke the single-game record for rushing yards by a Buckeye quarterback, went over 1,000 yards for his collegiate career on a run in the third quarter. He also opened up the game completing his first seven pass attempts and his 18 completions tied a career best set last season against Florida.

Miller rushed for 42 yards on the Buckeyes opening drive, including a 37-yard scamper up the middle for a touchdown. The point after by junior kicker Drew Basil put Ohio State up early, 7-0. A 28-yard field goal from UCF sophomore kicker Shawn Moffitt cut the score to 7-3 at the end of the first quarter.

Basil hit on his first field goal attempt of the season, a 24-yard try, to put the Buckeyes back up by seven with 9:58 remaining in the first half.

The Knights pulled even with the Buckeyes with 6:54 left in the half as sophomore tight end Justin Tukes hauled in a one-yard pass from redshirt-sophomore quarterback Blake Bortles. Central Florida sophomore running back Storm Johnson broke off a 48-yard run to put Central Florida into scoring position. Johnson finished the day with 75 yards rushing.

Miller ran in from six yards out with 15 seconds remaining in the second quarter to give the Buckeyes a 17-10 halftime lead. Senior cornerback Travis Howard intercepted his third pass of the season to set up the scoring drive.

Ohio State opened up the second half with a 12-play, 76-yard drive, capped off by a 12-yard touchdown pass from Miller to senior Jake Stoneburner. The touchdown was the 10th of Stoneburner's career. The success on the ground continued for Miller as he put Ohio State up 31-10 on an eight-yard run with 8:08 remaining in quarter number three.

UCF scored on a two-yard pass from Bortles to senior fullback Billy Giovanetti with 46 seconds remaining in the third quarter, but Ohio State freshman Adolphus Washington blocked the Knight's point after try to keep the score at 31-16.

The Buckeyes finished with 411 yards of total offense, 256 of that coming on the ground. Junior wide-out Corey "Philly" Brown had 48 yards receiving on six catches and another 33 yards on two carries. Sophomore receiver Devin Smith also had six receptions for 57 yards.

No. 12 Ohio State Holds Off Cal, 35-28

Braxton Miller accounts for 324 yards of total offense and 5 touchdowns

COLUMBUS, Ohio - No. 12 ranked Ohio State got all it could handle from California, hanging on for a 35-28 non-conference victory in front of 105,232 fans at Ohio Stadium.

California had 512 yards of offense compared to 412 for Ohio State, outgaining the Buckeyes both on the ground and through the air, but three missed field goals and some big plays by sophomore quarterback Braxton Miller and his receiving group doomed the Golden Bears in the end.

Miller accounted for all five scores on the day for Ohio State, including a personal-best four passing touchdowns. The game featured numerous big plays from both teams, with each squad having two touchdowns over 50 yards. Not one of the nine scoring drives took more than four minutes off the clock.

Following a turnover on downs forced by the Ohio State defense, Miller broke off a 55-yard touchdown run to put the Buckeyes out front with 5:11 to play in the first quarter. A failed point after attempt kept the score at 6-0.

California did not take long to respond as it marched 75 yards in just 2:38 on its next possession to jump ahead 7-6. Chris Harper hauled in a screen pass from quarterback Zach Maynard and took it 19 yards for the score.

Sophomore wide receiver Devin Smith beat his defender to bring in a 25-yard strike from Miller to put the Buckeyes back in the lead. Drew Basil's point after made the score 13-7 with 1:11 to play in the first quarter. Miller hit senior Jake Stoneburner on a 40-yard pass down the middle of the field to set up the score on the next play.

The next drive by Ohio State put the Buckeyes up 20-7. This time they were set up by a 35-yard Smith reception and finished off by a Stoneburner touchdown, a 1-yard connection from Miller.

Brendan Bigelow dashed 81 yards for California to cut the Buckeye lead to six with 9:34 to play in the third quarter. The run was the third longest by an OSU opponent and the longest against the Buckeyes in Ohio Stadium history.

Maynard punched in a 1-yard touchdown run to put the Golden Bears out front 21-20 with 12:26 remaining in quarter number four.

Ohio State answered with an 11-play, 75-yard scoring drive, capped off by a 3-yard pass from Miller to Stoneburner. The second touchdown of the game for Stoneburner was the 12th of his career. Miller rushed in for a successful two-point conversion attempt and the Buckeyes held a 28-21 advantage.

Cal answered quickly with a 59-yard touchdown run from Bigelow to even things up with 8:10 to play in regulation.

Following the third missed field goal of the afternoon for California, Miller hooked up on a 72 yard score with Smith to put the Buckeyes back on top for good, 35-28,

with 3:26 left on the clock. For Smith it was his second touchdown of the game and seventh of his career.

Junior Christian Bryant sealed the win for the Buckeyes with his first career interception.

Miller finished with 249 yards through the air and 75 rushing on 12 carries. Leading the way on the ground for the Buckeyes was senior Jordan Hall who had 87 yards on 17 rush attempts. Devin Smith ended up with five receptions for 145 yards.

Sophomore linebacker Ryan Shazier led the way defensively for Ohio State. Shazier had 13 tackles (with one sack), including 10 solos, on the day. The Buckeyes had six sacks total vs. the Golden Bears. Juniors C.J. Barnett and Johnathan Hankins each had 10 tackles for the Buckeyes.

Miller, Hall lead Buckeyes past UAB, 29-15

Senior RB rushes for a career-best 105 yards in the win

COLUMBUS, Ohio - Braxton Miller ran for two touchdowns and No. 16 Ohio State overcame a slow start to hold off UAB, 29-15, Sept. 22 in the Buckeyes' final tuneup before Big Ten play.

UAB (0-3) more than held its own against the Buckeyes (4-0), who committed drive-killing penalties, had a punt blocked for a touchdown and had trouble scoring at times.

The Blazers scored on special teams and started the second half by recovering an onside kick, but were undone by four chop-block penalties and a giveaway that led to a score.

Miller completed passes for 12, 14 and 18 yards and ran for 26 yards to set up his own clinching 1-yard TD run with 5:03 left.

Miller completed 12 of 20 passes for 143 yards and rushed for 64 yards on 11 carries. Jordan Hall, meanwhile, was another bright spot for Ohio State, gaining a career-high 105 yards on 17 carries.

Ohio State was a 37-point favorite against UAB, which had lost at home to in-state rival Troy 39-29 in its opener and then been pounded 49-6 by No. 8 South Carolina a week ago.

UAB outgained the Buckeyes, 403-347 and had more first downs, 22-20.

Austin Brown completed 21 of 35 passes for 196 yards with one interception, while Jonathan Perry hit on 7 of 11 passes for 63 yards before leaving after the opening quarter for UAB. Darrin Reaves rushed for 72 yards on 16 carries.

The Blazers, down by nine points at the half, showed some moxie against a ranked opponent by kicking onside and recovering.

They then dominated the statistics in a scoreless third quarter, running 25 plays to Ohio State's 12. The Buckeyes had an interception nullified by a defensive offside penalty.

Ty Long booted his third field goal of the afternoon for UAB to cut the gap to 21-15 early in the fourth quarter.

Ohio State's offense sputtered at times. The Buckeyes lost a yard on three plays and punted, UAB driving to the Ohio State 28 before Long finally misfired on a 47-yard attempt.

After foundering for the entire half, the Buckeyes finally got untracked to put the lead out of reach, embarking on a 71-yard drive that ended with Miller picking his spot and bulling in off left tackle on a 1-yard carry. Miller then raced around left end for the two-point conversion and a 29-15 lead.

Doran Grant's interception ended the next UAB possession and the Blazers' hopes.

UAB quickly grabbed a 9-0 lead, quieting a crowd of 105,019.

Meyer, who has taken over coaching Ohio State's special teams, was particularly miffed after the Blazers broke through easily and snuffed a punt before it got to the toe of Ben Buchanan. Linebacker Jesse Parrish

was credited with the block, with receiver Nick Adams scooping up the loose ball and running 20 yards for the touchdown.

The Buckeyes were able to punt after each of their next two possessions - a mark of how well UAB's defense was playing and how sporadic the offense looked with several dropped passes and missed assignments.

After Long's 47-yard field goal pushed the lead to nine points, the Buckeyes woke up and went 75 yards to score on a 1-yard plunge by Rod Smith, his second career touchdown. But the Blazers came right back to make it 12-7 with just 3:44 left in the half when Long converted a 54-yard field goal - the longest in UAB history and the third longest by an Ohio State opponent at Ohio Stadium.

From there, however, everything unraveled for the Blazers.

It took just 2:42 for the Buckeyes to grab a 21-12 lead.

Miller completed four straight passes and then covered the last 12 yards himself - pirouetting to leave linebacker Greg Irvin grasping at air at the 7 - to give Ohio State its first lead of the day.

Two snaps later, Brown tossed a quick pass in the right flat to tight end Kennard Backman, who was upended by Christian Bryant and Grant - Backman leaving the ball on the ground where Grant fell on it.

It took just three plays for the Buckeyes to cover the 32 yards, with Zach Boren going the last 2 for the score.

No. 14 Buckeyes move to 5-0 with 17-16 win

Urban Meyer collects his first Big Ten and road victory at Ohio State

EAST LANSING, Mich. (AP) -- Urban Meyer's first Big Ten game as Ohio State coach turned out to be a classic welcome to the conference.

His quarterback got shaken up twice, but Braxton Miller kept coming back on the field, and in the end the Buckeyes played just well enough defensively to come away with a bruising victory.

"This was a war. This was two sledgehammers going at each other," Meyer said. "I know the Big Ten has taken some heat. That was a great game. Great atmosphere, a bunch of great players on the field that are going to be playing at the next level, and that was good for college football and good for the Big Ten."

Miller threw for 179 yards and ran for 136, and No. 14 Ohio State held off No. 20 Michigan State 17-16 on Saturday. Miller put Ohio State ahead 17-13 with a 63-yard touchdown pass to Devin Smith in the third quarter, and the Buckeyes' maligned defense held Le'Veon Bell and the Michigan State running game in check.

Meyer becomes the third coach to start 5-0 in his first season at Ohio State. Carol Widdoes and Earle Bruce also did it in 1944 and 1979, respectively.

Michigan State (3-2, 0-1) has lost four home games in a row against Ohio State.

The Buckeyes (5-0, 1-0) aren't eligible to win the Big Ten title because of sanctions, but they handed the Spartans an early loss.

Michigan State took a 13-10 advantage in the third on a terrific individual effort by Keith Mumphery. With the ball on the Ohio State 29 after a personal foul call on the Buckeyes, Mumphery took Andrew Maxwell's short pass and eluded four tacklers before dragging a couple more Buckeyes into the end zone.

The lead didn't last long. Miller managed to pick up a first down, just barely, with a run on third-and-1, then lofted a deep pass on the next play to Smith, who beat Johnny Adams along the right sideline to put Ohio State ahead to stay.

Miller turned the ball over three times in Michigan State territory, including a fumble early in the fourth -- but the Buckeyes actually caught a break on that play. The ball bounced right to Kurtis Drummond of the Spartans, who began running down the right sideline before the play was blown dead and Miller was ruled down.

The call was reversed after a review, giving Michigan State the ball at its own 32 -- but the Buckeyes were saved from a big return that almost would surely have followed if the call had been correct to begin with.

The Buckeyes then appeared to have stopped the Spartans when Maxwell underthrew a pass on fourth-and-1 from the Ohio State 44, but Travis Howard was called for defensive holding on the opposite side of the field, keeping the drive alive.

Dan Conroy's 48-yard field goal pulled Michigan State within a point with 7:07 remaining.

Miller remained down holding his left knee after his fumble but was able to come back the next time Ohio State had the ball. The Spartans forced a three-and-out anyway and took over at their own 20 with 5:39 left, down 17-16.

They could manage only one first down before having to punt, and they never got the ball back.

Miller was 16 of 23 with an interception. Maxwell went 22 of 42 for 269 yards.

"Braxton Miller is a very exciting player," Michigan State coach Mark Dantonio said. "We knew that coming into the game. He took a lot of bad plays and made them good ones.

"A great team win," Meyer said. "We found out something about our team today, to go on the road in a hostile environment against a quality, quality football team and find a way to win."

Ohio State drove 75 yards in eight plays to open the game, taking a 7-0 lead on Jordan Hall's 1-yard scoring run. Miller had runs of 20 and 13 yards on the drive, but he was hit along the sideline at the end of the latter one and was shaken up.

He had to leave the game but was back for his team's next possession.

The Spartans answered immediately with a 34-yard field goal by Conroy, and that was all the scoring for the half. Miller threw an interception and lost a fumble in second quarter, but Conroy missed a 42-yard attempt in the final minute.

No. 12 Buckeyes run past No. 21 Huskers, 63-38

Ohio State rushes for 371 yards and six TDs in front of a record crowd of 106,102

COLUMBUS, Ohio -- Braxton Miller broke his own school record for a quarterback by rushing for 186 yards, zig-zagging 72 yards on one run and passing for another TD, to lead the 12th-ranked Buckeyes past No. 21 Nebraska 63-38 before the largest crowd ever at Ohio Stadium.

Corey Brown returned a punt 76 yards for a TD, Bradley Roby brought back an interception 41 yards and Carlos Hyde rushed for career highs of 140 yards and four touchdowns before a raucous crowd of 106,102 in the Horseshoe's 90th season.

Taylor Martinez ran for two scores and completed 15-of-23 passes for 214 yards and a score but was intercepted three times for defenseless Nebraska (4-2, 1-1). Leading rusher Rex Burkhead injured his left knee early in the third quarter after rushing for 119 yards on 14 carries, but did not return.

Incredibly, Ohio State got off to a slow start but more than made up for it by scoring on six of seven possessions over one span -- with the punt return touchdown thrown in.

It was the most points given up by the Cornhuskers since a 65-51 loss at Colorado in the final game of the 2007 season.

The Buckeyes hadn't had so much production since beating Eastern Michigan 73-20 two years ago. The combined 101 points was the most in a Big Ten game involving Ohio State since an 83-21 win over Iowa in 1950. It was the most points scored by the Buckeyes in a Big Ten game since a 69-18 win over Minnesota in 1983.

The win extended Ohio State's fast start in its first year under Meyer, winner of two national titles during his six years at Florida. The Buckeyes, still eligible to win a Big Ten division title even though on NCAA probation and banned from the postseason, are tied with Penn State atop the Leaders Division standings.

Ahead by 11 points at the half, the Buckeyes watched the Huskers cut the lead to 35-31 on Martinez's 3-yard pass to tight end Ben Cotton, but countered on Hyde's third TD run and Brown's lightning-fast burst through traffic on the punt return to build the lead to 49-31.

Burkhead, averaging 91 yards rushing a game, injured a knee on a 24-yard gain on the fourth play of the second half.

Rod Smith also rushed for a 33-yard touchdown and Miller completed 7 of 14 passes for 127 yards.

It was the fourth meeting between the teams, but the first in Columbus since 1956.

The first half -- really the second quarter -- was the determining factor for the Buckeyes.

They didn't have a first down in the opening period, gaining just 17 yards on 13 plays while falling behind 14-7 as the crowd went quiet.

In the second quarter, however, they amassed 242 yards and scored 28 points.

Down 17-7 after a Nebraska field goal, the Buckeyes scored on their next four possessions.

It all started when Miller was confronted by Courtney Osborne in the backfield but juiced him and then raced

down the right sideline for a 72-yard gain, pushed out of bounds at the Nebraska 3. Miller limped off the field and was replaced by Kenny Guiton, who handed off twice to Hyde, the second resulting in a 1-yard dive for the score.

Martinez had been intercepted by Roby on the Huskers' second possession, with Roby bringing it back 41 yards for the Buckeyes' only points of the first 19 minutes.

On third and 5 at the Nebraska 20, Martinez threw the ball directly to Roby. His 8-yard return put the Buckeyes right back in business at the Nebraska 20. Two plays later, with Miller now back in, he had a nifty play-action fake before tossing a short pass in the right flat to Jeff Heurman for an 18-yard score and Ohio State's first lead on a cool, crisp night, 21-17.

Despite starting their next drive with two false-start penalties, the Huskers came right back. Martinez was hit late but completed a post pass to Kenny Bell, who twice straight-armed defenders on a 74-yard gainer. Martinez stayed in and ended up scoring on a 9-yard run to make it 24-21.

But the Buckeyes weren't done. Sticking mainly to the ground, they rolled downfield. The key play was Miller's 32-yard hook-up with TE Nick Vannett for 32 yards. Hyde finished it off with a 7-yard TD run, bouncing outside for a 28-24 Ohio State lead.

After a Nebraska punt, the Buckeyes moved to a fourth and 1 at the Nebraska 30. Miller followed a big block by Hyde, skipped around the outstretched arms of a defender and coasted untouched the last 30 yards to make it 35-24 at the half.

No. 8 Ohio State outlasts Indiana, 52-49

Miller and Hyde each rush for 100+ yards for second consecutive game

BLOOMINGTON, Ind. (AP) -- After rushing for 149 yards, scoring on a 67-yard run and throwing TD passes of 60 and 46 yards, Braxton Miller sat helplessly on the sideline waiting for Corey Brown -- or anybody else -- to pounce on a bouncing onside kick that finally sealed a wacky 52-49 victory Saturday night.

Miller finished 13 of 24 for 211 yards with two touchdowns and one interception, averaged 6.6 yards on 23 carries and even recovered a teammate's fumble in the third quarter that just may have saved the game. Miller finished with his third straight 100-yard rushing effort, topped his average of 303.8 yards in total offense and helped the Buckeyes (7-0, 3-0 Big Ten) become the first ranked team with seven wins.

And the Buckeyes needed every bit of Miller's productivity to escape the gritty Hoosiers (2-4, 0-3), who rallied for 15 points in a 35-second span in the last 2 minutes. Indiana even had a chance to score again when their second onside kick started rolling around on the ground with 1:05 left.

Brown, who scored the game's first touchdown on a 12-yard run, got twisted around before finally securing the ball at the Ohio State 31 and allowing Miller to kneel down twice to run out the clock.

The game was topsy-turvy fest of big plays.

Each team turned blocked punts into touchdowns in the first half.

Indiana scored on TD passes of 76 and 25 yards, a 59-yard TD run and made a field goal after a 60-yard kickoff return.

Ohio State relied primarily on Miller's game-changing plays, though he did have some help.

Hyde ran 22 times for 156 yards and a touchdown and caught a 14-yard shovel pass for a TD from Kenny Guiton when Miller left briefly after he was hit out of bounds. Devin Smith caught two passes for 106 yards -- both for touchdowns. Bradley Roby recovered the Hoosiers' blocked punt in the end zone for a touchdown.

And although the Buckeyes finished with 353 yards rushing and went home with a win, first-year coach Urban Meyer wasn't satisfied.

"We are not good in certain areas and we were exposed," Meyer said. "Spread offenses right now are really exposing us. We have got to get something fixed."

The Hoosiers took a 14-10 lead in the second quarter when Stephen Houston scored on a 7-yard run following the blocked punt. Houston ran 11 times for 91 yards and two scores.

But the Buckeyes responded with two TDs before halftime to make it 24-14.

After the Hoosiers closed to 24-17, Miller took control.

He kept the ball on the Buckeyes' next offensive play, found a seam, split the Hoosiers safeties and sprinted 67 yards to make it 31-17.

When Indiana cut the lead to 31-24, Miller led the



Braxton Miller totaled 360 yards of offense against the Hoosiers -- 211 through the air and 149 on the ground.

Buckeyes on a 75-yard drive, giving way to Guiton and Hyde. Miller then drove the Buckeyes 78 yards, setting up Hyde for a 1-yard run to make it 45-27 early in the fourth quarter and appeared to put the game away with a 46-yard TD pass to Smith with 6:47 left.

Indiana got a 12-yard pass from Nate Sudfeld to Duwyce Wilson with 1:40 left, a 25-yard TD pass from Sudfeld to Houston with 1:05 to go and a 2-point conversion run by Cody Latimer to make it 52-49.

Sudfeld was 6 of 10 for 77 yards and two TDs, but they couldn't recover the onside kick.

"We have got to get back to work," Meyer said. "We go back 7-0 and we have got to find a way to get better as Purdue rolls in next week."

No. 7 Buckeyes prevail in overtime, 29-22

Ohio State drives 61 yards in the final 47 seconds to tie the game in regulation

COLUMBUS, Ohio -- Many in a crowd of 105,290 thought No. 7 Ohio State had no chance of winning after star quarterback Braxton Miller went out with an injury late in the third quarter.

Backup Kenny Guiton had other ideas.

Guiton came off the bench in relief to lead touchdown drives in the final minute of regulation and in overtime, with Carlos Hyde scoring on a 1-yard run to clinch No. 7 Ohio State's 29-22 victory over Purdue.

Purdue (3-4, 0-3 Big Ten) led 22-14 when Ohio State got the ball with just 47 seconds left in regulation. Guiton, inserted when Miller went out with an undisclosed injury, hit Chris Fields on a 2-yard touchdown pass with 3 seconds remaining. Guiton then found freshman Jeff Heurman on the conversion pass to tie it at 22.

Hyde scored on a short plunge for Ohio State (8-0, 4-0) before Purdue's Caleb TerBush, who had two TD passes, misfired on four passes in the overtime.

Purdue had earlier scored on TerBush TD passes of 83 yards to Akeem Shavers - on the first offensive play of the game - and 31 yards to Gary Bush in the third quarter, along with Akeem Hunt's 100-yard kickoff return. The Boilermakers also picked up a safety when Ohio State was called for an illegal block in the end zone in the fourth quarter.

Miller completed 9 of 20 passes for 113 yards with an interception and ran for 47 yards on 12 carries before leaving the game on the next-to-last play of the third quarter.

After Ohio State got the ball on Bradley Roby's blocked field goal, Miller took the ball on first down from the 24, stiff-armed a defender and sped around right end before being caught by cornerback Josh Johnson, who threw him hard to the turf on his left shoulder.

The teams had traded touchdowns in the third quarter, with Ohio State taking a 14-13 lead on Hyde's 2-yard run, set up by a 35-yard Miller-to-Chris Fields pass on which the Boilermakers blew the coverage.

Purdue answered by retaking the lead on TerBush's quick pass to the right flank where Bush picked up a key block from Crosby Wright while racing untouched 31 yards for the score and a 20-14 lead.

The Buckeyes drove to a fourth down at the Purdue 33, where Drew Basil's 50-yard field goal attempt hit the left upright flush and bounced away on the third play of the fourth quarter.

Ohio State took over at its own 39 with 47 seconds left in regulation. On first down, Guiton - who almost quit the team earlier this year - threw a long pass to a wide-open Devin Smith for a 39-yard gain on first down.

Battling the clock, the Buckeyes eventually faced a first and goal at the Purdue 2 with 3 seconds left. Guiton rolled to his left and fired a low pass to Fields. The play was reviewed but was allowed to stand.

Now down by two points, the Buckeyes set up for the conversion. Guiton lofted a soft toss over the linebackers to Heurman to tie it.

Guiton led the Buckeyes steadily and Hyde gave them their biggest lead of the game on a 1-yard burst.

TerBush, who finished 19 of 30 passing for 230 yards

with one interception, had a pass dropped to start the overtime and then threw three incompletions. Fans flooded on the field in celebration after his fourth-down pass hit the ground.

Guiton hit on 6 of 11 passes for 77 yards and the one touchdown with one interception. Hyde ended up with 91 yards on 19 carries and two touchdowns.

On the first snap of the game, TerBush floated a pass into the left flat to Shavers who had slipped behind the coverage of linebacker Storm Klein. Shavers had to wait for the pass, caught it, then left Klein grasping at air as he completed the play untouched.

The Buckeyes, who have gotten off to slow starts all season on offense, did so again. They punted after each of their first two possessions before mounting a drive to take the lead.

On fourth and 2 at the Purdue 46, Hyde bounced off a teammate and cut off left tackle for a 21-yard gain and a first down. On third and 10 at the 25, Miller then hit Corey Brown on a crossing pattern for 17 yards. On the next play, Miller used a nifty fake on a handoff to Hyde and skirted right end for the 8-yard touchdown.

The Buckeyes held the lead for exactly 12 seconds. Hunt took the ensuing kickoff 2 yards deep in the end zone and appeared to slightly hesitate before cutting to the right sideline while picking up blocks. He cut back to the right hash, then outran two defenders thanks to another slick cut to the right sideline to complete the 100-yard return for the 13-7 lead.

GAME 9: AT PENN STATE**Buckeyes Remain Undefeated, Down Penn State 35-23***Defense holds Penn State to 32 rushing yards; Miller rushes for 134 and two TDs*

STATE COLLEGE, Pa. (AP) -- Braxton Miller ran for 134 yards and accounted for three touchdowns, leading the Buckeyes to a 35-23 victory against Penn State.

Ryan Shazier returned an interception 17 yards for a score early in the third quarter that gave the Buckeyes (9-0, 5-0 Big Ten) the lead for good, and the Nittany Lions (5-3, 3-1) and coach Bill O'Brien had their five-game winning streak snapped.

Miller reached 100 yards rushing for the sixth time this season, carrying 25 times, and only avoiding contact when it was convenient. He also was 7 for 19 for 143 yards passing.

"I was so excited I missed a lot of throws," he said. "I was so excited to come back on the field from my injury. The crowd was energetic."

He added to his highlight reel with his first touchdown run in the second half.

Miller pulled the ball back just as teammate Carlos Hyde was engulfed by Penn State's Sean Stanley, did a two-step -- one forward and jump back -- to allude a defender, and then dived past another into the end zone. Officially, the play covered a yard, and it made the score 21-10 Ohio State with 3:30 left in the third quarter.

The Buckeyes proved their mettle at maybe the toughest place to play in the Big Ten.

Miller's second 1-yard touchdown run late in the third quarter put Ohio State up 28-10.

McGloin and Penn State then rolled to an 18-play touchdown drive he finished with a 2-yard pass to Matt Lehman to make it 28-16 with 9:49 left in the fourth quarter. The 2-point conversion try was stopped.

McGloin finished 27 for 45 for a career-high 327 yards.

With plenty of time to pull off a comeback, the Penn State crowd roared and waved pom-poms as Ohio State started its next drive backed up to its 8.

A couple of tough runs by Miller got the Buckeyes off the goal line. Then on third-and-3 from the 28, Miller hit Jake Stoneburner in stride over the middle, and the wide receiver was gone. The 72-yard touchdown made it 35-16.

The Nittany Lions added one more touchdown, almost as a thank you to all of the fans -- and there were plenty in the crowd of 107,818 -- who stayed to the end.

The Big Ten will give the Buckeyes a trophy if they win the Leaders Division, a race which they have firmly under control.

Other than that, all Ohio State can do is win 'em all and hope for the best when the final AP poll of the season comes out in January. Though an idle December would make it easier for Miller to attend the Heisman Trophy ceremony.

"I just think he's an excellent player," O'Brien said. "One of the top five players in the country."

Two of the better offenses in the Big Ten traded punts for most of the first half.

Penn State turned one of those punts into points.

Mike Hull cut through the Ohio State protection and blocked Ben Buchanan's kick a couple of yards away from the goal line. Michael Yancich recovered for a 7-0 lead with 6:15 left in the half.

Penn State forced another punt, but a holding penalty on the Nittany Lions converted the fourth down for Ohio State and Miller took advantage. His 33-yard keeper got the Buckeyes a first-and-goal at the 6, and Hyde scored from a yard out to make it 7-all.

No. 6 Buckeyes move to 10-0 with 52-22 win over Illinois

Miller accounts for 299 yards of offense; Hyde rushes for 137 and 3 TDs

COLUMBUS, Ohio (AP) -- Carlos Hyde rushed for 137 yards and three touchdowns and Braxton Miller burnished his Heisman credentials by passing for two scores and running for another in the Buckeyes' 52-22 victory over Illinois on Saturday.

Miller carried 18 times for 73 yards, and completed 12 of 20 passes for 226 yards.

It was the sixth consecutive loss for the Illini (2-7, 0-5) and their 11th consecutive Big Ten loss.

Little went right for the Illini and first-year coach Tim Beckman, a former assistant to Ohio State's Urban Meyer when Meyer was the head coach at Bowling Green from 2001-2002.

Beckman was also a former Ohio State assistant under Jim Tressel, forced out in the wake of a memorabilia-for-tattoos scandal that ultimately led to Meyer taking over the Buckeyes last November.

After racing to quick touchdowns with short drives while outscoring the visitors 24-0 in the second quarter, the Buckeyes stretched their lead to 38-6 in the third quarter by taking their time, going 73 yards on 11 plays, capped by Miller's 2-yard scramble.

Miller tossed TD passes of 51 yards to Rod Smith and 37 yards to wide receiver Corey Brown.

Illinois quarterback Nathan Scheelhaase, dogged all day by Ohio State's aggressive front line, completed 19 of 34 passes for just 91 yards with one interception. He also led the Illini in rushing with 15 carries for 36 yards. But there wasn't much else going on for the Illini, who finished with only 170 total yards.

Ahead 7-6 after a quarter, they blew the game open with four scoring drives.

Drew Basil's 31-yard field goal made it 10-6 before a short Illinois punt gave the Buckeyes decent field position at their 36. Five plays later, Hyde's second short TD run of the day made it 17-6.

Illinois, which settled for Nick Immekus field goals after first downs at the Ohio State 29- and 10-yard lines in the first quarter, wasn't able to get anything going on offense as Scheelhaase was continually harassed and forced to run wide before picking his options.

After another punt, Miller's pass was nearly intercepted before Hyde gained 10 yards. Miller then rolled right and then looked back to the left sideline where backup running back Rod Smith was several yards behind safety Supo Sanni. Smith pulled in the pass to complete the 51-yard score.

An 18-yard punt and a penalty put the Buckeyes right back in control at midfield. On consecutive plays, Miller juke and spun for 11 yards, Hyde picked up 11, Miller found tight end Nick Vannett for 14 yards, Miller scrambled for 11 more and Hyde then collected his third score of the day on a sweep around right end.

Ohio State will have plenty to work on during its week off. The Buckeyes had several costly personal-foul penalties, surrendered yardage on kickoff and punt returns and also gave up a big play off a turnover.

The Buckeyes gave up the ball on Smith's fumble, with the Illini getting help from two Ohio State late hits to score on Jon Davis' 1-yard run.

The Illini's defense, allowed 567 yards (7.2 per snap) did come up with one big play. Ashante Williams picked up Ohio State backup quarterback Kenny Guiton's bad option pitch and raced 77 yards for the touchdown in the final minutes.

The Illini had won three of the past five and seven of the past 11 meetings at Ohio Stadium.

Buckeyes Outlast Badgers, 21-14, in Overtime

Ohio State clinches Leaders Division outright with the win

MADISON, Wis. (AP) -- Ohio State clinched one title, and kept its slim hopes for another alive.

The Buckeyes won the Leaders Division crown outright, beating Wisconsin 21-14 on Carlos Hyde's 2-yard scoring run in overtime. Buckeyes safety Christian Bryant batted down Curt Phillips' pass on fourth down to preserve the win.

Ohio State is ineligible for the postseason. The best the Buckeyes can hope for is to finish the regular-season unbeaten, then have the teams above them all lose at least once to give them a shot at playing spoiler for *The Associated Press* title.

"We have a saying, 'A team that refuses to be beat, won't be beat,'" Ohio State coach Urban Meyer said. "Somehow, someday."

Wisconsin, meanwhile, blew its chance to show it deserves its spot in next month's Big Ten title game. The Badgers are third in the Leaders Division, but they'll be playing for a trip to the Rose Bowl because neither the Buckeyes nor Penn State are eligible for the postseason. No one else in the division will even finish with a winning record.

At least the Wisconsin fans got to see Monte Ball get the major college record for career touchdowns in his final home game. Or, part of the record anyway. Ball scored his 78th TD in the second quarter, tying the mark set by Travis Prentice of Miami (Ohio) in 1999.

But he fumbled what would have been the record-breaker with 2:46 left in regulation. Ball held the ball in front of him as he leaped over the pile on the goal line, and Buckeyes linebacker Ryan Shazier met him with both fists and punched the ball loose.

Ball finished with 191 yards on a career-high 39 carries.

The Ohio State-Wisconsin rivalry hasn't reached the heights of "The Game" between the Buckeyes and Michigan. But it is not exactly warm and fuzzy, either, especially not after the previous two games.

Two years ago, Wisconsin ended Ohio State's hopes of a making a run at the national title, handing the then-No. 1 Buckeyes their first loss at Camp Randall. (Ohio State's 2010 season was later erased by the NCAA sanctions.) Last year it was the Buckeyes stunning the Badgers, with Braxton Miller dancing around like a jitterbug before launching a 40-yard, game-winning heave with 20 seconds left.

Though there wasn't any obvious chippiness Saturday, the brutal physicality of the game left no doubt the teams have begun to use each other as a measure. Wisconsin's defense was downright nasty, limiting the high-powered Buckeyes to a mere 236 yards of offense, more than 200 yards below their average. The Buckeyes crossed the midfield only once after halftime, and the Badgers largely kept the dynamic Miller in check.

But Miller made plays when he needed to, and Hyde continued to impress.

"We're certainly not a finished product on offense,

and it showed," Meyer said. "But to come down in that overtime. I think we need to give (Hyde) the ball a little bit more."

After Ball's goal-line fumble, the Badger defense came up with one more big stop, a quick three-and-out that ensured the offense would have good field position. It was the first two-minute drill for Curt Phillips, the third-string quarterback who was making his second start, and he got off to a rough start, sacked on the first play.

He settled down from there, though, converting a fourth down with a 14-yard pass to Jared Abbrederis and finding him for another long gain to set up Jacob Pedersen's 5-yard scoring catch that tied the game with eight seconds left.

"Everybody kept the faith. We drove right down and scored," Phillips said. "I was very confident going into the overtime."

But overtime was all Buckeyes. Hyde ripped off a run of 11 yards on the first play and, two plays later, strolled virtually untouched into the end zone for the go-ahead score.

He also had a 15-yard scoring run in the second quarter, and finished with 87 yards on 15 carries. Miller was 10-of-18 passing for 97 yards, and had another 48 yards rushing. He also was sacked three times for a loss of 27 yards.

The Badgers have a good back of their own, but the Buckeyes knew the game was theirs.
