Buckeyes Cap Another Stellar Season in 2016-17

Ohio State set the school's single-season scoring record the 2nd-straight year



NOTING THE BUCKEYES

- The Buckeyes won 28 games in a season for the eighth time in program history and the first since the 2009-10 season.
- Ohio State won its 15th Big Ten championship this season by finishing the regular season with a mark of 15-1 in the conference. It was the Buckeyes' first title since 2011 and the 15 titles are the most by any Big Ten school.
- OSU advanced to the Sweet 16 for the second-straight season and the 11th time overall.
- The second-straight Sweet 16 appearance marked the first back-to-back trips since a stretch of five-straight appearances from 1985-89.
- The Buckeyes set three single-season school records as a team this season:
 - 2,999 points
 - 1,101 field goals made
 - 2,426 field goals attempted
- The Buckeyes also made and attempted the second-most three-pointers in a single-season in school history to go along with 1,554 rebounds, 213 blocks and an 85.7 scoring average which was all also the second-highest marks.
- Six Buckeye took home All-Big Ten honors this season. Kelsey Mitchell was named the Big Ten Player of the Year for the second time in her career. She was a unanimous first team selection. Shayla Cooper and Stephanie Mavunga each claimed second team honors while Tori McCoy was named to the All-Freshman Team and Lianne Harper was named the Sixth Player of the Year.
- OSU had 20 or more assists in a game 14 times this season and was 13-1 in those games.

- The Buckeyes won a season-high 12-straight prior to its B1G Tournament loss to Purdue. That was the longest streak since opening the 2011-12 season with 15-straight wins.
- OSU finished the year ranked 11th in the AP poll and 10th in the coaches poll.
- The Buckeyes made 10 or more three-pointers in a game eight times this season.
- The win over No. 2 Maryland on Feb. 20 was the Buckeyes first over a No. 1 or No. 2 ranked team since March 7, 1993.
- Kelsey Mitchell led the Big Ten in scoring at 22.6 points per game and made 115 three-pointers which was second in the conference.
- Mitchell has scored 2,535 career points and is third all-time in OSU history and fifth all-time in Big Ten history in scoring.
- Mitchell has scored 20 or more points 25 times this season and now has hit that mark 80 times in her 104 career games.
- Mitchell is also the Ohio State and Big Ten all-time three-point leader with 368 career three-pointers.
- Despite missing 13 games this season, Stephanie Mavunga led the country in rebounding percentage, grabbing 20.2 percent of all available rebounds.
- Mavunga also averaged a double-double with 11.4 points and 10.8 rebounds per game. The last time a Buckeye averaged a double-double was Jantel Lavender in 2011 when she averaged 22.8 points and 10.9 rebounds.
- This was just the third Buckeye team in school history to grab 50 or more rebounds in a game 10 times in a season.

ALL-BIG TEN ACCOLADES

- The Buckeyes had quite the haul when the Big Ten awards were announced as in addition to Mitchell earning Player of the Year honors, five other Buckeyes earned Big Ten accolades.
- **Linnae Harper** was named the conference's Sixth Player of the Year.
- **Mitchell** was a unanimous first team selection for the second-straight season and her third overall.
- **Shayla Cooper** and **Stephanie Mavunga** were both named to the All-Big Ten second team.
- **Tori McCoy** was also named to the All-Freshman Team.

MITCHELL BIG PLAYER OF THE YEAR

- For the second time in her career, Kelsey Mitchell has been named the Big Ten's Player of the Year.
- She also won the award as a freshman in 2014-15.
- Mitchell is the fourth Buckeye to earn B1G POY honors multiple times joining Tracey Hall (1986-87), Jessica Davenport (2005-07) and Jantel Lavender (2008-11).
- A Buckeye has now been named POY 14 times which is eight more than the next closest program (Purdue).
- This is also the 10th time a Buckeye has been named Player of the Year in the last 13 seasons.
- Mitchell leads the conference in scoring at 23.0 ppg and has made 107 three-point goals.
- Mitchell has made a three-pointer in every game so far this season.
- She earned Big Ten Player of the Week honors four times this year.

13-STRAIGHT YEARS WITH 1ST TEAM ALL-BIG TEN

- Dating back to the 2005 season, at least one Buckeye has earned first team All-Big Ten honors each year.
- The streak of 13-straight years with at least one honoree is the longest streak by any school in the history of the Big Ten.
- Since 2005, the only other school with a significant streak was Penn State with a stretch of six-straight years from 2009-14.
- This year, Kelsey Mitchell earned the award for the third-straight year.

MOST BIG TEN CHAMPIONSHIPS

- Ohio State won its 15th Big Ten championship this season by finishing the regular season with a mark of 15-1 in the conference.
- The Buckeyes shared the regular season title with Maryland who also finished 15-1 with its lone loss coming to the Buckeyes in the final week of the regular season.
- This was Ohio State's first title since winning the last of six-straight titles in 2010.
- No other team in the conference has won more than nine championships.

MAVUNGA AVERAGES A DOUBLE-DOUBLE

- Stephanie Mavunga made her Buckeye debut this season and all she did was average a double-double with 11.4 points and 10.8 rebounds in 22 games.
- She is just the third Buckeye to average a double-double for an entire season. She joins Martha Baker who averaged 14.6 points and 13.0 rebounds in the 1975-76 season and Jantel Lavender who averaged a double-double in three-straight season from 2009 to 2011.
- Mavunga notched a team-high 11 double-doubles this season.
- She had a double-double in her Buckeye debut against Duquesne, finishing with 15 points and 14 rebounds.

12-STRAIGHT WINS

- With its win over Northwestern in the quarter-finals of the Big Ten Tournament, Ohio State won its 12th-straight game.
- That was the longest win streak for the Buckeyes since opening the 2011-12 season with 15-straight wins.

KELSEY MITCHELL NUGGETS

- Big Ten career 3-point leader
- 2-time Big Ten Player of the Year
- Has 2 of the top-3 seasons with the most three-point field goals made in NCAA history
- Was the first freshman to ever lead the country in scoring 24.9 (2014-15)
- Unanimous first team All-American in 2015-16
- Has scored in double-figures in all but two games in her career
- Has scored 20 or more points 80 times
- Made a three-pointer in every game this season
- Has failed to make a three in just three career games

FASTEST PLAYER TO 2,000 POINTS

- Kelsey Mitchell became the fastest player in NCAA history (*since 1981*) to record 2,000 career points.
- Mitchell reached the mark in her 79th career game, besting Jackie Stiles who scored her 2,000th point in 83 games. Stiles is the NCAA's all-time leading scorer.
- The Cincinnati, Ohio native was also the fastest player in Big Ten history to 1,000 points as it took her 41 games to score her first 1,000 points.
- Kelly Mazzante of Penn State had been the fastest Big Ten player to 2,000 points as she hit the mark in her 88th game.

MOVING ON UP

- Kelsey Mitchell has quickly risen to the top of the OSU record books.
- Mitchell has scored 2,553 career points which is the 3rd most in school-history and the fifth-most in Big Ten history.
- Mitchell has made an OSU and Big Ten career record 368 three-pointers. That topped Caitly Matter's old OSU mark of 270 and Maggie Lucas's (PSU) old B1G record of 365.
- She scored an OSU and Big Ten record 873 points as a freshman and broke the school's mark again last season with 889 points.
- Mitchell is 5th with 521 career free throw makes and her current .836 career free throw percentage is third-best in school-history.
- Mitchell has attempted 965 three-point field goals which is also the most in school history. Caitly Matter held the previous record at 657.

THROWING IT IN FROM DEEP

- Kelsey Mitchell made an NCAA single-season record 127 three-point field goals as a freshman and followed that by making 126 last season.
- She has made 368 three-pointers which is an OSU career record, smashing the old mark of 270 which was set by Caitly Matter's from 2001-05.
- Mitchell is also the Big Ten career three-pointer.
- The NCAA career record for three-pointers made is 398 by Kaleena Mosqueda-Lewis of UConn.
- Mitchell has made 38.1 percent of her three-point attempts in her career.

- Linnæ Harper's first trip back to Memorial Coliseum to play in a game was a memorable one.
- After helping the team to a win in the opening round over Western Kentucky, Harper faced her former team, the Kentucky Wildcats for the first time.
- All she did was nearly recorded a triple-double en route to leading the Buckeyes to an 82-68 victory.
- Harper scored 12 points, grabbed 10 rebounds and dished-out a career-high eight assists.
- She then scored eight points and had four assists in her first game back at Rupp Arena in the Sweet 16 vs. Notre Dame.
- Harper played in 69 games with 17 starts and averaged 9.2 points and 4.9 rebounds over the two season.
- She was named to the SEC All-Freshman Team in 2014 and then the SEC All-Defensive Team in 2015.
- She averaged 11.4 points and led the team in rebounding at 7.1 rpg as a sophomore.

8-STRAIGHT AT 87 OR MORE

- Two different times this season, the Buckeyes set the school record by scoring 87 points or more in eight straight Big Ten games.
- The first stretch combined the last four Big Ten regular season games of last season with the first four of this season.
- The streak was stopped in a 94-75 loss at Michigan State on Jan. 10.
- The second streak hit the eight-game mark with a 98-point effort against No. 2 Maryland who had been allowing just 61.9 ppg.
- That streak was stopped at Rutgers in the Buckeyes Big Ten Championship clinching 73-45 victory.

EVERYONE GETTING INVOLVED

- The Buckeyes have had seven games this season in which every player who was active and available for the game scored at least one point.
- In the wins over Illinois and Nebraska, all 12 active players on the roster notched a point.
- The most recent came in the win at Wisconsin on Feb. 4.
- The previous four games came in non-conference play and featured nine or 10 active players netting points.

BUCKEYES AGAINST THE TOP-5

- The Buckeyes are 12-55 all-time against teams ranked in the AP Top-5.
- Ohio State knocked-off No. 5 Maryland two times last season and the No. 2 Maryland this season.
- Before the wins over Maryland, the most recent win over a top-5 team with a 74-67 win over No. 3 Oklahoma on Dec. 20, 2006 in Norman.
- That win was the Buckeyes' lone win over a team ranked No. 3 in the polls.
- Prior to this year's win over No. 2 Maryland, the last win over a No. 2 ranked team was March 7, 1993 over No. 2 Iowa.
- The Buckeyes have knocked-off a No. 1-ranked team two times and both came during the 1987-88 season.

WINS OVER THE TOP-10

- The Buckeyes have 29 wins all-time against teams ranked in the AP top-10 and 32 wins overall against the top-10 when factoring in the Coaches Poll.
- Ohio State notched three victories last season and one this year over teams ranked in the top-10.

- With a three-pointer in the opening quarter at Rutgers on Feb. 26, Ohio State senior Shayla Cooper recorded her 1,000th career point.
- The Norcross, Ga., native finished the game with 12 points and now has 1,061 points for her career.
- She also became the 33rd player in Ohio State history to record 1,000 career points as she 1,008 as a Buckeye.
- Cooper started her career at Georgetown in 2013 where she played in two games and scored 32 points.

ENJOYING SENIOR NIGHT

- The Buckeyes have one senior on this year's team and Shayla Cooper certainly made the most of her Senior Night.
- Cooper matched her season-high with 20 points, grabbed nine rebounds and dished-out five assists.
- She was also made all three of her three-point attempts.
- Not the mention the fact that it all game in a 98-87 win over No. 2 Maryland on national television.

FIRST WIN OVER A NO. 2 IN A LONG TIME

- The win over No. 2 Maryland on Feb. 20 was the first Buckeye win over a No. 1 or No. 2 ranked team since they beat No. 2 Iowa on March 7, 1993.
- That was also the same year the Buckeyes made their only Final Four appearance.
- Prior to the win over Maryland, Ohio State had lost 13-straight games against No. 1 or No. 2 ranked teams.
- That was just the fourth win all-time for Ohio State over a No. 1 or No. 2 ranked team.

ON FIRE VS. THE TERPS

- The Buckeyes shot a season-best 63.3 percent (36-of-57) from the floor in the win over No. Maryland on Feb. 20.
- That was the best shooting percentage against a Big Ten team since also shooting 63.3 percent against Penn State almost 10 years ago to the day on Feb. 22, 2007.
- The last time OSU shot 63.3 percent of better in a game was against Evansville on Dec. 1, 2012 when it again matched the same 63.3 percent.
- The Buckeyes also shot a season-best 55.6 percent (10-of-18) from long range against Maryland.

BIG BLOW

- Ohio State was dealt a blow on Feb. 9 when center Stephanie Mavunga suffered a right foot injury in practice.
- The Brownsburg, Ind., native missed the final four games of the regular and the first four games of the postseason before returning for the Sweet 16 game against Notre Dame.
- At the time of her injury, Stephanie Mavunga led the Big Ten and was eighth in the country in rebounds per game at 11.3.
- She had grabbed 11 or more rebounds in 14 games this season.
- According to NatStat.com, Mavunga was pulling down 20.4 percent of the available rebounds when she's in the game which was tops in the country.

GET THAT WEAK STUFF OUTTA HERE

- Ohio State blocked 45 shots in the last five games of the season.
- In three of the games, the Buckeyes notched an opponent season-high -- 10 vs. Northwestern, 14 vs. Purdue and 9 vs. WKU.
- OSU had 10 blocks vs. Kentucky which was the second time all season for UK with double-digit shots blocked and one-off the season-high.

COOPER STEPPING UP

- When Stephanie Mavunga went out of the lineup with an injury, someone needed to step up and the team's lone senior Shayla Cooper assumed that role.
- In the first game without Mavunga on Feb. 12 vs. Iowa, Cooper scored a season-high 20 points on 7-of-12 shooting. She also grabbed eight rebounds and dished-out a season-high five assists in a season-high 33 minutes.
- She also tied her season-high with 20 points to go with nine rebounds and five assists in the win over No. 2 Maryland.
- In the eight games Mavunga was out, Cooper averaged 14.0 ppg, 9.6 rpg, and 3.6 apg.
- She grabbed 15 boards in the opening round NCAA Tournament game vs. W. Kentucky.
- Prior to Mavunga's injury, Cooper had scored in double-figures just once the previous nine games and averaged just one assist per game over that stretch.

- The Buckeyes trailed by 16 points early in the second quarter at Purdue on Jan. 15 and would comeback to win the game.
- That marked the largest comeback victory since erasing a 16-point deficit in the Big Ten Tournament championship game against Iowa on March 7, 2010.
- In that game, the Buckeyes fell behind by 16 points early in the second half before a 10-0 run sparked a thrilling comeback win.

50 OR MORE REBOUNDS

- The Buckeyes grabbed 50 or more rebounds 10 times this season.
- Last year, the team only reached the 50-rebound mark three times all season.
- This is the first season with 10 or more games of 50 or more rebounds since the 1981-82 team hit the mark a school-record 12 times.
- This team is only the third in school history to record 50 or more rebounds in a game 10 times.

MAGIC NUMBER 70

- Head coach Kevin McGuff's style of fast paced offense leads to more possessions and hopefully more points.
- Since he took over at the start of the 2013-14 season, the Buckeyes are 67-9 when scoring at least 80 points and 85-19 when scoring at least 70 points.

- Under head coach Kevin McGuff, the Buckeyes have dished-out 20 or more assists in a game 22 times and are 21-1 in those games.
- This season, the Buckeyes hit the 20-assist mark 14 times.
- Dating back to the 2009-10 season, the Buckeyes have won 50 of the last 53 games when sharing on 20 or more of their field goals.

HITTING THE GLASS

- When the Buckeyes win the battle on the boards, they usually end up winning the game.
- Ohio State was 10-0 last season when grabbing more rebounds than the opponents and are now 53-4 under McGuff.
- The Buckeyes out-rebounded 22 of 35 opponents this season.

145-STRAIGHT WITH A THREE

- Ohio State has made at least one three-point field goal in 145-straight games.
- The last time the Buckeyes failed to make a three-pointer in a game was on Feb. 10, 2013 at Northwestern. OSU was 0-of-6 from long range that game.
- Over the streak, the Buckeyes have made 10 or more threes in a game 29 times.
- Ohio State has made 34.7 percent (1,011-2,915) of its shots from beyond the arc and is averaging 6.9 threes per game during the streak.

SCORING INSIDE = WINS

- The Buckeyes have one of the best back court scorers in the country in Kelsey Mitchell but when Ohio State puts up more points in the paint than its opponent, good things happen.
- Over the last two seasons, Ohio State is 57-6 when outscoring the opponent in the paint including 22-2 this season.
- OSU held LIU Brooklyn to zero points in the paint on Nov. 19, while scoring 62 itself.

MAVUNGA NETS 1,000

- Stephanie Mavunga scored her 1,000th collegiate point in her 13-point effort against No. 1 UConn on Dec. 19.
- The Brownsburg, Ind., native scored 900 points in her first two seasons at North Carolina before transferring to Ohio State prior to last season.
- Her 1,000th point came on a lay-up early in the third quarter against the Huskies.

MCCOY DROPS 25 IN RECORD FASHION

- Freshman Tori McCoy scored a season-high 25 points in the win over Southern on Dec. 7 but it was how she did it that put her in the record books.
- McCoy tied the OSU single-game shooting percentage record by going 10-of-10 from the floor. She matched Jessica Davenport who was 10-of-10 against West Virginia on March 20, 2004.
- McCoy was also 5-of-8 from the foul line to go along with a season-best three blocks.

GETTING DEFENSIVE

- Defensive wasn't the Buckeyes strong suit this season but on the road against Purdue on Jan. 15, they won the game on the defensive end.
- OSU limited Purdue to just 56 points, 36.1 percent shooting and forced 18 turnovers in a 61-56 victory.
- It was the first time holding a Big Ten opponent to 56 points or fewer (and just the fourth under McGuff) since allowing just 49 points at Indiana on Jan. 8, 2015.
- The win was just the fourth win under McGuff when scoring 61 points or fewer and the first since a 61-50 victory at Michigan on Jan. 23, 2014.

TWO IN A ROW

- After allowing over 82 points in four-straight conference games, the Buckeyes have held their last two opponents under their scoring average.
- Purdue scored just 56 points on Jan. 15 which was 10 points its average.
- Wisconsin made a late run and finished with 61 points which was also under its average.
- The Buckeyes nearly made it three-straight as Illinois just topped their average of 62.9 ppg with a 25-point fourth quarter en route to 64 points.

MCCOY NATIONAL FROSH OF THE WEEK

- Thanks to a week in which she missed just one shot, Tori McCoy was named the Big Ten and National Freshman of the Week on Dec. 13.
- McCoy went a school-record 10-of-10 from the floor against Southern and finished with a season-high 25 points.
- She then notched her first double-double as a Buckeye as she went 7-of-8 for 17 points and 11 rebounds against Canisius.
- McCoy was the first Buckeye since Kelsey Mitchell two years ago to receive National Freshman of the Week honors.

BUCKEYES GET STINGY

- In the second half against Cincinnati on Dec. 4, the Buckeyes allowed just 10 points including just one point in the fourth quarter.
- The 10 points were the fewest points surrendered by OSU in a second half in program history and tied for the fifth-fewest in either half.
- The one point in the fourth, which came on a free throw with 42 seconds left, was the fewest points allowed in a quarter since the NCAA switched to the quarter format prior to last season.
- Cincinnati was 3-of-37 shooting (8.1 percent) in the second half and 0-of-19 in the fourth quarter.
- Going back to the 3:11 mark of the second quarter when UC held its largest lead of the game at 28-17, the Buckeyes out-scored Cincinnati 63-10 over the final 23:11 of the game.
- Another interesting fact from the game was the Bearcats held the lead for longer in the contest (19:36-18:34) than the Buckeyes despite OSU's 35-point victory.

SHOWING OFF FOR THE FAM

- Playing in her home state for the first time in her career, Stephanie Mavunga had great games at both Indiana and Purdue.
- Mavunga grabbed nearly every rebound against IU, snatching a career-high 17 to go along with 14 points.
- She was 6-of-8 shooting and also registered a block and an assist.
- Against Purdue, she also notched a double-double with 11 points and 12 rebounds. Eight of her 11 points game in the final 5:32 of the game which helped seal the Buckeyes 61-56 victory.
