Buckeyes play two ranked opponents this weekend



A new season begins on Friday for the Ohio State field hockey team. Riding a season-high three game winning streak, the Buckeyes (3-3) open Big Ten play today when it closes out a five-game homestand against No. 15 Northwestern (4-2). Less than 48 hours later, the Buckeyes take on another ranked opponent when it travels to No. 6 Louisville (6-0) for a 1 p.m. contest against the Cardinals.

BUCKEYES IN A NUTSHELL

- Following a come-from-behind 2-1 overtime victory against Miami, Ohio State is 3-3 on the season.
- Junior **Maddy Humphrey**, who had at least one point in all six games thus far, leads the way offensively with 14 points (six goals, two assists). Next in line are a pair of freshmen – **Esther Clotet Alsina** (three goals, one assist, seven points) and **Adelaide Penzone** (three goals, two game-winning goals, six points).

• Nine different players have at least one point this season and four of those players are newcomers – Clotet Alsina, Penzone, **Irene Fritschy** (two assists) and **Maartje Bongers** (two assists).

• On defense, junior goalie **Liz Tamburro** owns a 2.81 goals-against average, .630 save percentage and Big Ten-best 29 saves. She's complemented by a back line that includes **Caroline Rath**, **Whitney Harris** and Bongers.

• Ohio State's defense has allowed by two goals in the last three contests and is limiting opponents to less than 11 shots per game.

SCOUTING NORTHWESTERN

The Wildcats have won four out of their last five games and most recently defeated Colgate 8-0 on Sunday behind a 46-shot effort. One of the top offenses in the nation, Northwestern is averaging 3.83 goals/game and 21.8 shots/contest. Isabel Flens (six goals, four assists, 16 points) and Dominique Masters (four goals, two assists, 10 points) lead a group that have seen contributions from 15 different players. Goalie Lindsey von der Luft owns a 1.19 goals-against average and .806 save percentage.

SCOUTING LOUISVILLE

Unbeaten this year at 6-0, Louisville is tied for fourth nationally averaging 4.64 goals per game. On defense, the Cardinals have allowed just three scores over six games, making them the top scoring defense in the country. Minout Mink leads the offense with eight goals and one assist for 17 points while goalie Ayeisha McFerran had a 0.41 goals-against average and .857 save percentage.

BIG TEN OPENERS

The Buckeyes have won three of their last five Big Ten openers, including a 2-1 triumph over Northwestern in Columbus in 2011. Last year, Ohio State traveled to Michigan State to begin conference play and came away with a 2-1 victory.

ALL-TIME VS. NU/LOUISVILLE

Friday will mark the 60th all-time meeting between Ohio State and Northwestern (NU holds a 27-30-2 edge in the series). Last year, the two teams met twice – Oct. 23 in Columbus and Nov. 6 in the opening round of the Big Ten Tournament. The last Ohio State win in the series came in the 2013, as the seventh-seeded Buckeyes upset No. 2 need Northwestern in the Big Ten Tournament quarterfinals.

Ohio State holds a 16-9 all-time advantage over Louisville. The Buckeyes won the first 10

meetings in the series, which began in 1989. Last year's match-up in Columbus was a 1-0 decision in favor of the Cardinals.

COMING UP CLUTCH

Freshman Adelaide Penzone has a shown a knack for being in the right place at the right time. And, the result last week was two game-winning goals. A Powell, Ohio native and graduate of St. Francis DeSales, Penzone is the third leading scorer among Big Ten freshmen.

THE LAST THREE

During its current three-game winning streak, the Buckeyes:

- Are outshooting opponents by nearly six shots/game (16.3-10.7).
- Have given up just two goals.
- Goalie Liz Tamburro has a .867 save percentage and 0.66 goals-against average.
- Have outshot opponents by a 49-32 margin.
- Have registered over twice as many penalty corners (30) as their opponents (14).

PACKING BUCKEYE VARSITY FIELD

Sunday's crowd of 691 set a single-game attendance record, topping the previous mark of 533 on Nov. 8 against Michigan State in the Big Ten Tournament semifinals. Through four games, the Buckeyes are averaging 358 fans/game, which would set a single-season attendance record.

2016 RECAPS

DELAWARE 5, OHIO STATE 2

August 27 | Newark, Del.

A flurry of first half goals - including three by Delaware's Greta Nauck - was too much for Ohio State (0-1) to overcome on Saturday as the Buckeyes dropped their season opener to the 14th-ranked Blue Hens (1-0), 5-2, at Fred P. Rullo Stadium.

The first 10 minutes of action in the opening half was full of offensive fireworks, as the teams combined to score five times in the first 13 minutes. The Blue Hens struck twice in the span of a minute and a half, building a 2-0 lead on the strength of an Ally Pollak score (unassisted) and Nauck's first goal of the afternoon (she finished with four goals on the game).

Already in a two-goal hole with over 25 minutes still to play in the first half, the Buckeyes sliced UD's lead in half when Casey Cole scored unassisted in the 10th minute. The sophomore from Crestwood, Pa. played in all 19 games last year as a freshman and finished with four points (one goal, two assists).

From there, Delaware would score twice more in a 38 second span, making the score 4-1 with just over 13 minutes gone in the opening half. Nauck found the back of the cage both times. Just before the end of the half, junior Maddy Humphrey brought the Buckeyes back to within two, scoring off a pass from sophomore Irene Fritschy with 2:25 left to play before the break. For Humphrey, it was her 23rd career goal and continued a trend of strong early-season starts - last year, she began the season by scoring in each of the first eight games that she played.

DELAWARE 6, OHIO STATE 3

August 28 | Newark, Del.

Six unanswered goals propelled No. 14 Delaware past Ohio State, 6-3, on Sunday at Fred P. Rullo Stadium in Newark, Del. With the loss, the Buckeyes are 0-2 on the young season while Delaware improves to 2-0.

Turning the tables on the Blue Hens from just 24 hours previously when Delaware jumped out to a quick 2-0 lead, the Buckeyes generated scoring opportunities early and cashed in - twice. Junior Maddy Humphrey knocked home the game's first goal when she tapped in freshman Esther Clotet Alsina's shot from five yards out over the shoulder of UD goalie Sydney Rhodes.

Not satisfied, Ohio State struck again two minutes later. This time, Clotet Alsina got into the act when she snuck a shot past Rhodes from five yards out. The quick flurry resulted in a 2-0 lead just 10 minutes in to the first half, although the Blue Hens would make a push over the remaining 25 minutes that would eventually result in a tied game at the half.

With just under 11 minutes to play in the first half, Greta Nauck knocked home her fifth goal of the weekend, an eight yard shot from the left side that got past Ohio State goalie Liz Tamburro. The Blue Hens then cashed in on the equalizer after time had expired in the first half via a penalty corner off the stick of Marjelle Scheffers. She redirected a shot from Ally Pollak.

WAKE FOREST 4, OHIO STATE 2

September 2 | Columbus, Ohio

Despite a goals by freshman Adelaide Penzone and junior Maddy Humphrey, the Ohio State field hockey team dropped a hard-fought 4-2 decision to No. 7 Wake Forest on Friday afternoon in the opening game of this year's Buckeye Invitational.

Wake Forest attacked from on onset of the first half, getting four quick penalty corners in the first 10 minutes of the contest. Those chances were all snuffed out by the Ohio State defense, however, including a defensive save early in the contest by junior defender Caroline Rath.

The Demon Deacons finally converted on an opportunity when Heather Wiley sent a ball in from deep in the corner, setting it up for Karlee Spirit to tap it in from close range.

A two-goal effort by Maddy Humphrey on offense and stingy defensive play on the back end of the field guided the Ohio State field hockey team to a 3-0 shutout of in-state rival Ohio and Sunday afternoon before a season high crowd of 407 at Buckeye Varsity Field.

Humphrey, who now has at least one goal in each of the first four games, scored on a penalty stroke late in the first half and again midway through the second half for all the offense Ohio State would need. Her effort was backed up by a defense that allowed just five total shots to Ohio. It was the Buckeyes' first shutout of the season as goalie Liz Tamburro turned away the only OU shot that made it on cage.

Freshman Esther Clotet Alsina, one of six newcomers who saw playing time today, netted her second collegiate goal when she opportunistically gathered up a loose ball from five yards out in front of the cage and poked it past OU goalie Lina Trucco in the 21st minute. That scored capped off a series of good scoring opportunities for the Scarlet and Gray early in the contest, as Ohio State generated four penalty corners and nine total shots in the opening 35 minutes.

Humphrey cashed in on a key insurance goal with just 32 seconds to play in the first half when she was fouled in front of the goal and converted a penalty stroke for a 2-0 Buckeye lead. That's the way the score would stay through halftime and deep into the second half.

In the second half, Ohio State continued to have the better of play on its offensive end of the field. The Buckeyes had four penalty corners in the first 16 minutes of the half, but were turned away by the Bobcat defense each time. Finally, in the 54th minute, Maggie Reddecliff and Humphrey connected on a nicely timed goal that gave Ohio State all the breathing room it would need. Reddecliff feed the ball into the circle to a waiting Humphrey, who backhanded a shot to the upper left corner of the cage.

An opportunistic goal by freshman Adelaide Penzone - her second in the last three games - lifted the Ohio State (2-3) field hockey team to a 2-1 victory over UC Davis (1-3) on Wednesday afternoon at Buckeye Varsity Field.

Penzone broke a 1-1 tie late in the second half when she corralled a ball originally sent into the circle by Casey Cole and poked it past Aggie goalkeeper Beth Lee. From there, the Ohio State defense didn't allow a shot for the final 6:41 of regulation to preserve the lead.

After a first half that saw both teams combine for just nine shots, Ohio State finally broke through in the 41st minute thanks to another new face - Esther Clotet Alsina. A freshman from Barcelona, Spain, Clotet Alsina cleaned up a scramble in front of the goal after a pass was sent in by Maddy Humphrey, giving the Buckeyes a 1-0 lead with 29:50 remaining. It was the second straight game Clotet Alsina has scored the first goal of the game.

That lead, however, proved to be short lived. UC Davis made its first penalty corner opportunity of the afternoon count as Courtney Hessler was in the right place at the right time to redirect a ball off the stick of Agustina Singh past Liz Tamburro and into the goal.

Knotted a 1-1 late in the final minutes, Penzone collected a ball sent into the circle by Cole and found the back of the cage from close range. A freshman from nearby Powell, Ohio, Penzone also scored last Friday against No. 7 Wake Forest and has started each of the last three contests.

For freshman Adelaide Penzone, it was the right place at the right time. And just like on Wednesday, the result was a game-winning goal.

Penzone tapped in a pass from Brooke Hiltz three and a half minutes into overtime that sent the Ohio State field hockey team to its third straight victory, a 2-1 triumph over Miami on Sunday on a sun soaked day at Buckeye Varsity Field in front of a season-high crowd of 691.

The Buckeye played catch-up to extend their winning streak, coming from down 1-0 midway through the second half behind a game-tying goal from Maddy Humphrey in the 51st minute and then the winner from Penzone shortly into overtime. Ohio State was able to hold a high-scoring Redhawk offense to just one goal and successfully fended off 11 corners by Miami, including seven in the second half.

After a scoreless first half that saw 13 combined shots and a pair of Liz Tamburro saves, Miami got on the scoreboard first as Paul Portugal dribbled into the circle and sent a shot past Tamburro from six yards out, giving the Redhawks a 1-0 advantage.

Nearly seven minutes later, an attacking Buckeye offense was rewarded when Humphrey positioned herself perfectly in front of the goal to receive a pass from Maggie Reddecliff and knot the game at 1-1. Humphrey collected the ball and poked it past Miami goalie Alysa Xavier for her team-leading sixth goal of the year. Reddecliff, who earned her first start of the season on Sunday, has a team-best three assists.

At the end of the regulation, the Redhawks had two penalty corners after time expired but were unable to convert. Just seconds earlier, Portugal had a shot hit the top cross bar and bounce out, preserving the 1-1 tie.
