The Pacific-10 Conference has agreements with six bowl partners. The lineup is led by the Rose Bowl, which is the destination for the Pac-10 champion, unless said champion is ranked No. 1 of No. 2 in the final Bowl Championship Series rankings. If that were the case, the Pac-10 champion would play in the BCS National Championship Game which this year will be played in Arizona following the Tostitos Fiesta Bowl.

Regardless of the disposition of the Pac-10 champion, a second Pac-10 team may be selected for an at-large berth in the Bowl Championship Series in any given year and other Pac-10 bowl partner arrangements provide for that occurrence.

In addition to the Rose Bowl, Pac-10 bowl partners include the Pacific Life Holiday Bowl, Vitalis Sun Bowl, Pioneer PureVision Las Vegas Bowl, Emerald Bowl and Sheraton Hawai'i Bowl. Following is a summary of the Pac-10 bowl arrangements for the 2006-07 season:





**BCS schedule following the 2006 regular season:**

Monday, January 1, 2007 - Rose Bowl, Tostitos Fiesta Bowl  
 Tuesday, January 2, 2007 - FedEx Orange Bowl  
 Tuesday, January 3, 2007 - Allstate Sugar Bowl  
 Monday, January 8, 2007 - BCS National Championship

The BCS will use a “double hosting” format beginning with the games played after the 2006 regular season. Under this model there will be five (5) BCS games annually, including the National Championship game.

The four BCS bowl games (Orange, Fiesta, Sugar, Rose) will be held annually, in addition to a National Championship game that will rotate among those four bowl sites each year. Once every four years, one of the aforementioned bowls will host two BCS games: its traditional bowl game and the National Championship game.

Under the double hosting format, the champions of the Atlantic Coast, Big East, Big Ten, Big 12, Pacific-10 and Southeastern Conferences will continue to play annually in one of the BCS bowls through the post-season following the 2007 regular season.

In addition, one conference champion from among Conference USA, Mid-American, Mountain West, Sun Belt, and Western Athletic Conferences will automatically qualify to play in a BCS bowl if it is: (1) ranked among the top 12 teams in the final BCS Standings; or (2) ranked among the top 16 teams in the final BCS Standings and ranked higher than the champion of one of the conferences whose champion has an annual automatic berth in a BCS bowl.

# The Rose Bowl

At the end of the 1901 season, Michigan was prevailed upon to play Stanford in an “East-West” game at Pasadena’s Tournament Park. The contest took place on January 1, 1902, with Michigan winning by a score of 49-0. Following this, the game was discontinued until the first day of 1916 when Washington State defeated Brown University, 14-0.

The contest continued to be known as the “East-West” game until the 1923 game was played at the newly-constructed Rose Bowl, and the University of Southern California defeated Penn State, 14-3.

The original Tournament Park (in 1902) held about 10,000 fans, although only 8,500 attended the Stanford-Michigan contest. Prior to the 1917 game the seating capacity was increased to 30,000.

The new Rose Bowl originally was a horseshoe affair running north and south with the opening at the south end. It seated 57,000. The capacity was then progressively increased in 1929 to 76,000; in 1932 to 83,677; and in 1938 to 90,000. Another increase in capacity took place during the year 1949, the funds being raised by public subscription. The 1950 Rose Bowl game set a record of 100,983 fans.

The present Rose Bowl was actually dedicated on October 28, 1922, with a football game between the University of California and the University of Southern California before a crowd of 35,000. California won the game 12-0.

Prior to 1935 the Western team in the game was invited by the Tournament of Roses Association.

The Tournament also selected the Eastern team until 1923. From 1923 through 1946 the Western team selected its Eastern opponent. From 1946 until 1959 the old Pacific Coast Conference and the Big Ten selected representatives.

Under a new agreement, starting with the 1960 game, the Pacific-10 selected a representative from among its Conference members. The Conference also selected its opponent for the 1961 and 1962 games. Following 1962 a new contract was signed with the Big Ten for it to provide the Pac-10’s opponent.

The 2001 Game marked the 55th Anniversary of the Pac-10 - Big Ten partnership in the Rose Bowl. Since the series began in 1947, the Big Ten and Pac-10 are even, having won 28 games each. A new era began in 1999 when the Rose Bowl became part of the Bowl Championship Series Rotation. The Rose Bowl has hosted the National Championship Game twice - most recently in 2006 when Texas defeated USC, 41-38, and in 2002, when Miami defeated Nebraska, 37-14.
