Patriot League Announces Baseball Academic Honor Roll

Lafayette's James Conrad named Scholar-Athlete of the Year and headlines 51 student-athletes on the Academic Honor Roll.

Center Valley, Pa. – Lafayette's James Conrad was tabbed the 2007 Patriot League Baseball Scholar-Athlete of the Year and was one of 51 student-athletes named to the 2007 Patriot League Baseball Academic Honor Roll, announced Executive Director Carolyn Schlie Femovich Thursday. Also included on this year's list were Army's Tyler Anderegg and Holy Cross' Andrew Tenaglia who achieved a 4.0 grade-point average or better during the spring semester.

Conrad graduated from Lafayette with a degree in mathematics and a 3.58 cumulative grade-point average. The three-time Patriot League Academic Honor Roll member was named an *ESPN The Magazine* Academic All-American on the third team at the conclusion of the 2007 season. He was a member of both Sigma Xi, a national research honor society, and Pi Mu Epsilon, a mathematics honor society.

As a member of the 2007 Patriot League Baseball Championship team from Lafayette, Conrad ranked first in the Patriot League in runs (67), hits (75) and stolen bases (49) and second in batting average (.369). The First-Team All-Patriot League centerfielder ended his career third all-time in the Patriot League record books with 85 career stolen bases and closed out the season third in the nation in stolen bases per game. He earned two all-tournament team spots this season one at the Patriot League Championship and one at the NCAA Charlottesville Regional.

Conrad is the third Leopard to win the Patriot League Baseball Scholar-Athlete of the Year honor, joining Bob Osipower (1999) and Tye Gonser (2002).

To be eligible for the Academic Honor Roll, a student-athlete must earn a 3.20 grade-point average in the spring semester and be awarded a varsity letter in one of the Patriot League's six winter or 10 spring championship sports.

Navy's Chris Renninger named Scholar-Athlete of the Year and headlines 42 student-athletes on the Academic Honor Roll.

Center Valley, Pa. – Navy's Chris Renninger was voted the 2007 Patriot League Golf Scholar-Athlete of the Year and was one of 42 student-athletes named to this year's Patriot League Golf Academic Honor Roll, announced Executive Director Carolyn Schlie Femovich Monday. Renninger, along with Bucknell's Jeff Pike and Charlie Waddell, earned 4.0 grade-point averages during the spring semester.

Renninger, a junior chemistry major, has posted a 4.0 grade-point average in seven consecutive semesters, including summer 2006, to hold a perfect cumulative GPA. The three-time Patriot League honor roll member is first in his class of 1,073 members at the Naval Academy. He has been named to the Commandant's List five times, the Dean's List four times and the Superintendent's List twice.

The First-Team All-Patriot League selection finished second at the 2007 Patriot League Golf Championship. Throughout the season he was Navy's top finisher four times, including two top-five finishes, and owned the team's low average (75.6).

Navy's Kirsten Andrews named Scholar-Athlete of the Year and headlines 167 student-athletes on the Academic Honor Roll.

Those achieving 4.0 spring grade-point averages included American's Kate Lilley and Greta Wicklund, Bucknell's Melanie Buczko, Courtney Lynch and Beverly Rogers, Colgate's Jessica Kielty, Holy Cross' Clarice Ferolito and Colleen Spilka, Lafayette's Amanda Lalley, Lehigh's Rachel Stewart and Navy's Andrews, Vicki Moore and Jenny Rubin.

Andrews collected three Patriot League Scholar-Athlete of the Year awards during her career, earning the honor for the 2006-07 indoor season and during both the 2006 and 2007 outdoor seasons. An *ESPN The Magazine* First-Team Academic All-America selection, Andrews graduated 41st in her class with a 3.90 cumulative grade-point average as a quantitative economics major. The three-time Patriot League Academic Honor Roll member posted four-straight perfect semester grade-point averages up to and including Spring 2007.
