Sixty Named To Men's Cross Country Academic Honor Roll *Army Sr. Michael Baskin Tallies A 3.73 GPA In The Fall Semester*

CENTER VALLEY, Pa. – Army senior **Michael Baskin**, the 2001 Men's Cross Country Scholar-Athlete, recorded a 3.73 grade-point average (GPA) during the fall semester and was among the 60 student-athletes named to the 2001 Patriot League Men's Cross Country Academic Honor Roll, announced today by Carolyn Schlie Femovich, Patriot League Executive Director.

To be eligible, a student-athlete must earn a 3.20 grade-point average in the fall semester and be awarded a varsity letter in one of the seven League-sponsored fall championship sports.
