Fifty-Seven Named To Baseball Academic Honor Roll

Navy's Dean Farmer Headlines The Baseball List With A Perfect 4.00 GPA In The Spring Term

CENTER VALLEY, Pa. -- Navy junior **Dean Farmer**, the 2003 Patriot League Baseball Scholar-Athlete of the Year, recorded a perfect 4.00 grade-point average (GPA) during the spring semester, as did Bucknell sophomore **Matt Belmont**. The duo are among the 57 student-athletes named to the 2003 Patriot League Baseball Academic Honor Roll, announced today by **Carolyn Schlie Femovich**, Patriot League Executive Director.

To be eligible, a student-athlete must earn a 3.20 grade-point average in the spring semester and be awarded a varsity letter in one of the six winter or nine spring championship sports.

A total of 778 student-athletes were named to the League's Winter/Spring Academic Honor Roll, including 39 with 4.00 GPAs. The Winter/Spring Academic Honor Roll includes the sports of men's and women's basketball, men's and women's track & field, men's and women's swimming & diving, baseball, golf, men's and women's lacrosse, softball and men's and women's tennis.

Bucknell led the way with 186 student-athletes on the League's Winter/Spring Academic Honor Roll. On the Baseball Academic Honor Roll, the Bison gained top honors with 18 honorees, followed by Holy Cross (11) and Lafayette (10).
