Lehigh's Clabby tabbed Field Hockey Scholar-Athlete of the Year *Seventy-six named to Field Hockey Academic Honor Roll*

CENTER VALLEY, Pa. – Lehigh senior **Sheila Clabby**, the 2004 Field Hockey Scholar-Athlete of the Year, posted a 3.92 grade-point average (GPA) during the fall term. Holy Cross' **Sony Kuhn** and Lafayette's **Virginia Foulkrod** each achieved a perfect 4.0 in the first semester of the academic year. These three were among the 76 student-athletes named to the 2004 Patriot League Field Hockey Academic Honor Roll, announced today by **Carolyn Schlie Femovich**, Patriot League Executive Director.

Clabby boasted the second highest GPA on the Mountain Hawks' field hockey team this past fall and holds a 3.83 cumulative average. The senior Fine Arts/Psychology major was awarded the Lehigh Field Hockey 2004 Scholar-Athlete award for her efforts both in the classroom and on the field. The Dean's List member has also been named to the Patriot League Honor Roll and the NFHCA National Academic Squad.

Clabby started all 19 games for the Brown and White this past season and was second on the team in both points and goals, with 18 and eight, respectively, while chipping in two assists. The 2004 All-League first team member led the Mountain Hawks and was second in the League with her four game-winning goals. This year she was key to leading Lehigh to its first appearance in the Patriot League Tournament since 1996.

To be eligible for the Academic Honor Roll, a student-athlete must earn a 3.20 grade-point average in the fall semester and be awarded a varsity letter in one of the seven League-sponsored fall championship sports.

A total of 502 student-athletes were named to the League's Fall Academic Honor Roll, including 20 with 4.00 GPAs. The Fall Academic Honor Roll includes the sports of men's and women's cross country, field hockey, football, men's and women's soccer and volleyball.

Bucknell led the way with 101 candidates on the League's Fall Academic Honor Roll. On the Field Hockey Academic Honor Roll, American earned top honors with 19 selections, followed closely by Bucknell and Lehigh with 15 and 14, respectively.

The Patriot League, which was founded on the principles of admitting athletes who are academically representative of their class, is in its second decade of academic and athletic excellence. Participation in athletics at Patriot League institutions is viewed as an important component of the undergraduate experience. Holy Cross' Agostinacchio earned Volleyball Scholar-Athlete of the Year honors in 2004

Forty-three named to Volleyball Academic Honor Roll

CENTER VALLEY, Pa. – Holy Cross senior **Caitlin Agostinacchio**, the 2004 Volleyball Scholar-Athlete of the Year, earned a 3.48 grade-point average (GPA) during the fall semester. Agostinacchio was one of 43 student-athletes named to the 2004 Patriot League Volleyball Academic Honor Roll, announced today by **Carolyn Schlie Femovich**, Patriot League Executive Director.

Agostinacchio was named to the Holy Cross Dean's List in the fall of 2001 and the spring of 2002. The two-sport student-athlete has been named to the Patriot League Academic Honor Roll for seven-straight seasons.

Agostinacchio becomes only the second Crusader to be honored as the Volleyball Scholar-Athlete of the Year in League history. The senior outside hitter was named to the All-Patriot League first team in 2004, after a season that saw her set numerous career marks. Her team-leading 396 kills put her career total at 1,063, becoming the first Holy Cross player to surpass the 1,000 kills clip. She also holds the single-season record in kills at Holy Cross and ranks first in kills per game, after averaging 4.17 this season. She posted 250 digs this past season, ranking her third all-time at Holy Cross with 906 digs.

American's Carlstrom named 2004 Women's Cross Country Scholar-Athlete of the Year

Sixty-three placed on Women's Cross Country Academic Honor Roll

CENTER VALLEY, Pa. -- American junior **Keira Carlstrom**, the 2004 Women's Cross Country Scholar-Athlete of the Year, earned a 3.46 grade-point average (GPA) during the fall semester, while Bucknell freshman **Connie Barko** was the only women's runner to complete the opening term with a perfect 4.00 GPA. They were among the 63 student-athletes named to the 2004 Patriot League Women's Cross Country Academic Honor Roll, announced today by **Carolyn Schlie Femovich**, Patriot League Executive Director.

Carlstrom is no stranger to her award, having picked up three scholar-athlete honors last year as a sophomore. She was named the Cross Country and Indoor and Outdoor Track and Field Scholar-Athlete last academic year; just the second female athlete with that distinction in Patriot League history. The Mathematics major is a two-time member of American's Dean's List and has been a member of the League's Honor Roll every semester in which she has been eligible.

Carlstrom capped off her 2004 cross country season with a 17th place finish in the NCAA Cross Country Championship, earning her second-consecutive All-American honor. She was the Eagles' top individual finisher in each of the five races she ran this past season, including the top spot at the Patriot League Championship, which was one of three first place finishes for the junior runner in 2004. Her 17:37.35 finish at the Mount St. Mary's Duals on Sept. 4 was a personal best.

Army's Strozier selected as the 2004 Men's Cross Country Scholar-Athlete of the Year

Sixty-two named to Men's Cross Country Academic Honor Roll

CENTER VALLEY, Pa. – Army senior **Paul Strozier**, the 2004 Men's Cross Country Scholar-Athlete of the Year, earned a 3.86 grade-point average (GPA) during the fall semester, while two men's runners took home perfect 4.00 GPAs in the opening term. They were among the 62 student-athletes named to the 2004 Patriot League Men's Cross Country Academic Honor Roll, announced today by **Carolyn Schlie Femovich**, Patriot League Executive Director.

Strozier has collected numerous academic honors in his seven semesters at the United States Military Academy, having been a member of the Dean's List in each of his semesters of attendance. He has also been named to the Patriot League Honor Roll all four of his years at the Academy. The Systems Engineering major was awarded the Superintendent's Wreath, an award given to cadets in recognition of a high GPA in his/her concentration.

The two-time All-Patriot League selection ran to a ninth place finish at the NCAA Northeast Regional this past season, coming in as the top finisher for Army at that competition. He was the Black Knights' highest individual finisher four times in 2004, including a season-high second place finish against archrival Navy with a season-best time of 25:06.2. The senior runner finished sixth at the 2004 Patriot League championship, for his second career All-League mention.

To be eligible for the Academic Honor Roll, a student-athlete must earn a 3.20 grade-point average in the fall semester and be awarded a varsity letter in one of the seven League-sponsored fall championship sports.

A total of 502 student-athletes were named to the League's Fall Academic Honor Roll, including 20 with 4.00 GPAs. The Fall Academic Honor Roll includes the sports of men's and women's cross country, field hockey, football, men's and women's soccer and volleyball.

Bucknell led the way with 101 candidates on the League's Fall Academic Honor Roll. On the 2004 Men's Cross Country Academic Honor Roll, American earned top honors with 12 recipients, while Bucknell finished second with 11 selections.

Patriot League announces 2004 Men's Soccer Academic Honor Roll; names Bucknell's Hemmert Scholar-Athlete

CENTER VALLEY, Pa. – Patriot League Executive Director **Carolyn Schlie Femovich** announced the 2004 Men's Soccer Academic Honor Roll Thursday, with 66 student-athletes earning distinction. Bucknell senior midfielder **Jonathan Hemmert** (Westerville, Ohio/St. Charles Prep) earned top honors as the League's Scholar-Athlete in the sport.

To be eligible for the Academic Honor Roll, a student-athlete must earn a 3.20 grade-point average in the fall semester and be awarded a varsity letter in his or her respective sport. A total of 502 student-athletes were named to the League's Fall Honor Roll, including 20 with perfect 4.00 GPAs.
