Patriot League Announces Baseball Academic Honor Roll *Forty-Six Student-Athletes Named To The Honor Roll, Led By Army's Schuyler Williamson*

CENTER VALLEY, Pa. – Army junior catcher **Schuyler Williamson**, the 2004 Baseball Scholar-Athlete of the Year, notched a 3.39 grade-point average (GPA) during the spring semester, while five other student-athletes tallied a perfect 4.00 GPA in the second term. To be eligible, a student-athlete must earn a 3.20 grade-point average in the spring semester and be awarded a varsity letter in one of the League's six winter or nine spring championship sports.

A total of 829 student-athletes were named to the League's Winter/Spring Academic Honor Roll, including 38 with perfect 4.00 GPAs. The Winter/Spring Academic Honor Roll includes the sports of men's and women's basketball, men's and women's swimming & diving, men's and women's indoor track & field, baseball, golf, men's and women's lacrosse, men's and women's outdoor track & field, softball and men's and women's tennis.

Patriot League Announces Women's Track & Field Academic Honor Roll *One Hundred Fifty-Five Student-Athletes Named To The Honor Roll, Led By American's Keira Carlstrom*

CENTER VALLEY, Pa. – American sophomore **Keira Carlstrom**, the winner of both 2004 Women's Track & Field Scholar-Athlete of the Year awards, notched a 3.94 grade-point average (GPA) during the spring semester and leads the list of 155 student-athletes named to the 2004 Patriot League Women's Track & Field Academic Honor Roll, announced today by **Carolyn Schlie Femovich**, Patriot League Executive Director. Four female track & field student-athletes had perfect 4.00 GPAs in the second term.

To be eligible, a student-athlete must earn a 3.20 grade-point average in the spring semester and be awarded a varsity letter in one of the League's six winter or nine spring championship sports.

A total of 829 student-athletes were named to the League's Winter/Spring Academic Honor Roll, including 38 with perfect 4.00 GPAs. The Winter/Spring Academic Honor Roll includes the sports of men's and women's basketball, men's and women's swimming & diving, men's and women's indoor track & field, baseball, golf, men's and women's lacrosse, men's and women's outdoor track & field, softball and men's and women's tennis.

Bucknell led the way with 196 candidates on the League's Winter/Spring Academic Honor Roll. The Bison landed a League-best 41 student-athletes on the Women's Track & Field Academic Honor Roll, while Holy Cross came in second with 34 recipients.
