Patriot League Announces Baseball Academic Honor Roll

54 student-athletes receive Honor Roll recognition

Center Valley, Pa. – Army's Tyler Anderegg, the 2009 Patriot League Baseball Scholar-Athlete of the Year, is one of 54 baseball student-athletes named to this year's Patriot League Academic Honor Roll.

Anderegg earned a 3.69 GPA in the spring semester in his Life Science major at Army, and the Grand Junction, Colorado native will attend the Colorado School of Medicine following graduation. He was named to the Patriot League Academic Honor Roll in all four of his seasons, and was also tabbed an *ESPN the Magazine*/CoSIDA Second-Team Academic All-American this year.

Lafayette senior Ryan Hanna earned a perfect 4.0 GPA in the spring semester as an English and Spanish major.
