FORDHAM RAMS CLOSE OUT 2004 SEASON BY HOSTING COLGATE ON SATURDAY

THE GAME: The Fordham University Rams close out their 2004 Patriot League schedule as they host the Colgate University Raiders on Jack Coffey Field on Saturday, November 20th at 12:00 p.m.

Fordham enters the game with a 5-5 record, 2-3 in the Patriot League, and is coming off a 21-14 Patriot League loss to Lehigh last Saturday in Bethlehem, Pennsylvania. Colgate enters the game with a 6-3 record, 3-2 in the conference, and is coming off a 42-7 Patriot League loss at Lafayette last Saturday.

THE SERIES: This will be the 16th meeting between Fordham and Colgate on the gridiron... The Raiders lead the all-time series, which started in 1989, 12-3... Colgate has won six of the past seven meetings, including a 14-3 win last year on November 15th in Kerr Stadium as Jamaal Branch rushed 31 times for 131 yards and both touchdowns as Colgate clinched at least a share of the Patriot League crown... The last Fordham win in the series came in the 2002 season when the Rams defeated the Raiders 40-31 on Jack Coffey Field, breaking a six-game losing streak for Fordham against Colgate... Fordham is 3-12 against Colgate since joining the Patriot League with the Raiders winning the first four meetings... The Rams are 2-5 against Colgate in the Bronx and 1-7 at Colgate.

FORDHAM HEAD COACH – ED FOLEY: The Rams will be led into today's game by first-year head coach **Ed Foley (Bucknell '89)**, who served as the Fordham Offensive Coordinator under Dave Clawson the past five years. Under Foley's guidance, the Fordham offense set numerous school records including most career rushing and passing

yards. The offense also produced an All-American the past two years, including wide receiver Javarus Dudley who was a consensus First Team All-American last fall.

Foley served as the Offensive Coordinator at Jacksonville University for two years prior to coming to Fordham, as the Dolphins fielded a team for the first time in 1998.

Foley is 5-5 overall as a head coach and 0-0 against Colgate.

COLGATE HEAD COACH – DICK BIDDLE: Colgate's **Dick Biddle (Duke '71)** is in his ninth season as the head coach of the Raiders. He has a 75-31 career record over the past nine-plus years at Colgate, including a 6-4 mark this fall. He led the Raiders to a perfect 11-0 regular season mark last fall and was named the Patriot League Coach of the Year. Colgate advanced all the way to the NCAA I-AA championship game where the Raiders fell to Delaware. The 2003 Patriot League title was the fourth won by the Raiders, all under Biddle's direction, and Colgate has made four NCAA I-AA Playoff appearances under Biddle.

Biddle is 7-1 against Fordham.

WHAT TO LOOK FOR: Fordham will look for its sixth win of the 2004 season and will look to win its third Patriot League game of the year...A win would also give the Rams of their fourth straight winning season...Both teams will look to rebound after losses last week...The Rams have won 14 of their last 22 dating back to last year.

The Fordham offense did most of its damage through the air last week at Lehigh, gaining 89 yards rushing and 262 yards passing...The Rams are averaging 128.5 yards/game rushing and 182.0 yards/game passing in 2004 after averaging 138.1 rushing yards/game and 260.2 passing yards/game last year...Colgate had a well balanced attack at Bucknell last week, gaining 145 rushing yards and 146 passing yards...The Raiders are averaging 147.9 rushing yards/game and 197.1 passing yards/game this season after averaging 203.5 rushing yards/game and 179.3 yards/game through the air in 2003...Fordham is averaging 26.0 points per game this fall after averaging 32.2 points/game last fall while the Colgate offense is averaging 22.1 points/game this fall after averaging 30.0 points/game last fall.

The Rams surrendered 139 rushing yards and 166 passing yards against Lehigh last week and are allowing an average of 166.6 rushing yards/game and 153.2 passing yards/game in 2004 after allowing 184.3 rushing yards and 171.7 passing yards per game last year...The Colgate defense surrendered 278 yards rushing and 32 yards passing against Bucknell last week and is averaging 155.3 rushing yards/game and 152.7 passing yards/game this year after giving up 95.8 rushing and 207.4

KORNEGAY & TAYLOR EARN PATRIOT LEAGUE WEEKLY HONORS

Fordham University senior defensive back **Tad Kornegay** was named Patriot League Special Teams Player of the Week and freshman wide receiver **Darrell Taylor** was named Rookie of the Week for games of November 13th. This is the second weekly award for Kornegay this fall, who was named Defensive Player of the Week on October 9th, and the first for Taylor.

In the Lehigh game, **Kornegay** returned three kickoffs for 89 yards, including a long return of 48 yards, while also making three tackles on return coverage and recovering an onside kick with just over two minute remaining as the Rams drove to the Lehigh 25 before being stopped on downs.

Defensively, Kornegay made eight total tackles, seven solo, and he also broke up a pass.

Taylor caught three passes for 85 yards and one touchdown at Lehigh. He took a screen pass from quarterback Derric Daniels and turned it into a 35-yard touchdown with 1:32 remaining to bring the Rams to within a touchdown, 21-14.

On the season, Taylor has made six receptions for 87 yards and two touchdowns.

RAMS JOIN 700 CLUB

With their win over Georgetown on October 5, 2002, the Fordham University Rams reached the 700 win club in their 104th season. The Rams are the fifth I-AA team, and the first non-Ivy League school, to record 700 varsity wins. Overall, there are nine Division I-A teams with over 700 wins as well as four I-AA teams (Yale, Princeton, Harvard and Pennsylvania). Here is a complete list of schools with 700 wins:

passing yards per game in 2003...The Fordham defense is allowing 23.0 points per game this year after allowing 20.9 points/game in 2003 while the Colgate defense is allowing 19.7 points per game this fall after allowing 18.9 points/game last fall.

WHO'S HOT?: Fordham: Sophomore quarterback **Derric Daniels** completed 17 of 35 passes for 262 yards and two touchdowns at Lehigh after completing 15 of 31 passes for 179 yards and two touchdowns at Bucknell...He is second in the Patriot League with 21 touchdown passes on the year...Junior running back **James Prydatko** rushed 14 times for 55 yards at Lehigh after rushing for a career-high 93 yards on eight carries at Bucknell...Sophomore running back **Jamaal Hunte** gained 31 yards on 13 carries last Saturday while also catching four passes for 16 yards, after picking up 51 yards on 15 carries in the Bucknell game...Freshman wide receiver **Darrell Taylor**, the Patriot League Rookie of the Week, made three catches for 85 yards and one touchdown at Lehigh while sophomore **Mike Melvin** made three catches for 83 yards, including a 64-yard scoring reception...Senior wide receiver **Steve Porco** hauled in three passes for 47 yards at Lehigh after making four catches for 63 yards and two touchdowns at Bucknell...He leads the Rams with seven touchdown catches...Defensively, the Fordham defense held Lehigh, who entered the game averaging a league-high 400 yards/game, to 305 yards...The defense was led by senior linebacker **NaQuinton Gainous**, who leads the Patriot League in tackles/game, who made 12 total tackles, ten solo...Senior defensive back **Tad Kornegay** added eight tackles last week along with one pass deflection, while sophomore defensive back **Tommie Stephens** also finished with eight, including one for a loss...Senior defensive lineman **Edward Gordon** also had a strong day defensively, notching six tackles, three solo, including three for a loss, 1.5 sacks and he forced a fumble and intercepted a pass.

Colgate: Senior wide receiver **Luke Graham** caught eight passes for 81 yards to become Colgate's all-time leading receiver with 213 career receptions...Senior quarterback **Chris Brown** completed three of five passes for 31 yards in the first quarter before suffering a leg injury that sidelined him for the rest of the day...Freshman quarterback Lee Sloan replaced Brown, completing 14 of 28 passes for 115 yards and a touchdown...Senior running back **Jamaal Branch**, the 2003 Payton Award winner and 2004 Patriot League Preseason Offensive Player of the Year, gained 96 yards on 29 carries while senior wide receiver **DeWayne Long** made five catches for 36 yards...Defensively, senior defensive lineman **Adam Leeman** led Colgate last week with six tackles, five solo tackles, and one for a loss while junior nose tackle **Chris Petrone** had five solo stops, including three for a loss and he forced a fumble.

COLSANT CLIMBING FIELD GOALLIST: Sophomore placekicker **Micah Clukey** has booted eight field goals this year, bringing his career total to 19, good for fourth place on Fordham's all-time list.

GORDON NAMED ACADEMIC ALL-DISTRICT: Fordham University senior defensive lineman **Edward Gordon** was named First Team CoSIDA Academic All-District I by the College Sports Information Directors of America. He will now be placed on the national ballot for CoSIDA Academic All-America® consideration.

In order to be considered for CoSIDA Academic All-District, a student-athlete must be a starter or important reserve, maintain a 3.20 GPA or better and have reached sophomore athletic or academic standing.

RAMS ON THE AIRWAVES AND INTERNET

All 2004 Fordham University football games will be broadcast live by WFUV (90.7 FM), home of the longest-running sports talk radio show, One-on-One. The 50,000 watt public radio station reaches the entire tri-state area 24 hours a day, 365 days a year. Greg Giombarrese will handle the play-by-play duties with Frank Montesana on color commentary for the Colgate game. Peter Draney will be on the sidelines for the WFUV broadcast crew while Tom Winter will serve as the producer/engineer. The broadcast will begin with the pregame show, 15 minutes before kickoff and will conclude with a 15 minute post-game report.

Gordon, a two-year starter who has started all nine games this year for the Rams, is fourth on the team with 45 total tackles, 15 solo, including five tackles for a loss and two quarterback sacks. He leads the Fordham defense, a squad that is the number one ranked defense against the pass in the Patriot League in 2004.

A team captain, Gordon carries a 3.29 GPA in Business Administration and has been named to the Patriot League Commissioner's Honor Roll the past two years. He is the first football player to earn Academic All-District honors since Brian Colsant in 2000.

DEFENSE HOLDS OPPONENT SCORELESS FOR THIRD TIME

IN 2004: The 2004 Fordham defense held an opponent scoreless for the third time this season when the Rams defeated Georgetown 36-6 on October 30th on Jack Coffey Field. The lone Georgetown score came on a 30-yard interception return.

Earlier this year, Fordham shutout Albany 14-0 and then defeated Columbia 17-14 with the two Columbia scores coming on a blocked punt return for a touchdown and a fumble return for a touchdown.

LONG SNAPPERS IN DEMAND: Due to injuries and suspensions, the Rams were forced to use three long snappers against Georgetown on October 30th. The Rams started the day without the services of their starting long snapper Mario Rossi who was suspended for a violation of team rules. That left the duties to back-up Michael Johnson. But Johnson was injured in the first quarter, sending the long snapping responsibilities to starting center Jared Amatuzzo. The only problem is that Amatuzzo is sporting an arm brace as a result of an injury in the Lafayette game and found that he could not long snap with the brace. So the Rams went to option four, junior Marcus Taylor who performed admirably despite having no practice as a long snapper.

Taylor also handled the long snapping duties at Lehigh as Rossi dressed for the game but did not play and Johnson is out for the season with a knee injury.

GETTING THE JOB DONE: A quick look at the Patriot League team stats show the Rams as the sixth team (of seven) in total offense, averaging 310.5 yards/game. However, the Rams know what to do when they have the ball in the red zone as the Rams are third in the league in red zone offense, scoring on 26 of the 30 possessions inside the opponents 20 (19 touchdowns, seven field goals). The Rams are averaging 26.0 points per game, fourth best in the league.

MAKING YOUR FIRST ONE COUNT: Fordham sophomore wide receiver **Mike Melvin** will always remember his first varsity reception. The catch came at Holy Cross on October 2nd and was the game-winner as Melvin hauled in a 42-yard scoring strike from Derric Daniels with 11 seconds left to give the Rams a 42-35 win.

Melvin's second touchdown reception was almost as memorable, as he hauled in a long pass from Daniels and broke away from a defender for a 64-yard scoring play to tie the Lehigh game at seven late in the third quarter.

CARDIAC RAMS: The 2004 Fordham football Rams certainly like to make games exciting. In four of the five Fordham wins this year, the average margin of victory for the Rams has been 7.8 points. The only games that were decided by more than a touchdown were the 14-0 win over Albany and the 36-6 win over Georgetown. The other three wins were 17-14 over Columbia, 41-34 to Duquesne and 42-35 at Holy Cross. Even four of the five Fordham losses this fall were close as the Rams fell to Rhode Island, 37-36, on a late Rhode Island touchdown, lost 27-20 in overtime to Brown, fell by a point, 21-20, at Bucknell, and were defeated by a touchdown, 21-14, at Lehigh.

DANIELS CLIMBING TOUCHDOWN LIST: Sophomore quarterback **Derric Daniels**, who hadn't thrown a pass in a collegiate game prior to this year, is quickly climbing the Fordham single season touchdown passes list. Through ten games, Daniels has thrown 21 scoring strikes, placing him in fourth place on the Fordham single season list.

KORNEGAY SETS FORDHAM INTERCEPTION RECORD,

TWICE: With his three interceptions against Duquesne on September 25th, senior defensive back **Tad Kornegay** set the Fordham varsity record for most interceptions in a game. Tom Harter and Joe Kirsrok were the only other two Rams to pick off three passes in a game, that coming in 1969 when Fordham was a club team.

Kornegay repeated the feat against Brown on October 9th with three more interceptions.

DANIELS TIES JACK COFFEY FIELD RECORD:

Sophomore quarterback Derric Daniels tied a Jack Coffey Field record against Duquesne on September 25th when he threw five touchdown passes. He was actually one of two quarterbacks to tie the record that day as Duquesne's Niel Loebig also threw five scoring passes. Four

other players have thrown five touchdown passes on Jack Coffey Field, the last being Fordham's Mark Carney against Georgetown on September 29, 2002.

DEFENSE SHUTOUT STREAK ENDED: The Fordham defense saw its shutout streak ended early in the Duquesne game, after going more than two games without allowing a score. Fordham's defense had gone 126 minutes and 48 seconds without allowing a point when the dukes scored with 9:31 left in the first quarter. In the Albany and Columbia game, the Fordham defense displayed its experience, not surrendering a defensive point (the 14 points in the Columbia game came on a blocked punt which was returned for a touchdown and a fumble recovery returned for a score). The last time a Fordham defense went two straight games without allowing a score was in 1988 when the Rams opened the year with back-to-back shutouts of the U.S. Merchant Marine Academy (17-0) and Catholic University (27-0).

DiFINO PINNIN' THEN IN: A quick look at junior **Anthony DiFino's** punting numbers won't impress many people. After all, he is averaging a respectable 37.3 yards/punt, second best in the Patriot League. But a closer look reveals DiFino's true worth. 15 of his 69 punts have landed inside the opponent's 20 (24.6%).

HUNTE RUSHES FOR 100: When sophomore running back **Jamaal Hunte** gained 105 yards rushing at Albany on September 11th, it marked his first career 100-yard rushing game. It also marked the first 100-yard rushing game for a Fordham player who is not named Kirwin Watson since 2000. Watson finished his career with 20, 100-yard rushing games. The last player before Watson to gain 100 yards in a game was Arthur Gaskin in 2000.

Hunte now has three 100-yard games in 2004 after gaining 139 yards on the ground at Holy Cross and then gaining 116 against Georgetown.

INJURY UPDATES: The Rams are currently without the services of senior running back **Seann Farrell**, senior wide receiver **Aaron Dennis**, and junior defensive back **Chris Anzano** who all suffered injuries during summer camp. All are out for the Colgate game. Joining them on the injured list is sophomore defensive back **Carl Garritano** who was injured in the Brown game and junior defensive lineman and long snapper **Michael Johnson** who was injured in the Georgetown game.

NEWCOMERS WELCOME: The loss of over 20 seniors to graduation from the 2003 squad can easily be seen in the two-deep. The current two-deep features five freshmen and six starters with little or no experience with the varsity. This is in contrast to the 2003 two-deep which had only three freshmen listed and only one starter with limited varsity experience.

RAMS BREAK NIGHT LOSING STREAK: With their 14-0 win over Albany on September 11th, the Rams broke a six-game night losing streak dating back to the 1990 season. Fordham then followed that with a 17-14 win at Columbia in a game played under the lights. The last Fordham win in a game that started after 6:00 p.m. prior to the Albany win was a 46-15 win over St. John's on September 30, 1988 at St. John's.

TAD KORNEGAY NAMED PATRIOT LEAGUE PRESEASON DEFENSIVE PLAYER OF THE YEAR/MICAH CLUKEY NAMED SPECIAL TEAMS PLAYER OF THE YEAR: Fordham University senior defensive back **Tad Kornegay** was named the Patriot League Preseason Defensive Player of the Year by a vote of the league's Head Coaches and Sports Information Directors. Joining Kornegay in receiving preseason recognition in the Patriot League was sophomore kicker Micah Clukey, who was named Preseason Special Teams Player of the Year.

Earlier this summer, Kornegay was also named a First Team Preseason All-American by CollegeSportsReport.com and The Sports Network as well as being named the Patriot League Pre-

season Defensive Player of the Year and Second Team Preseason All-America by Lindy's Sports Annuals. Joining Kornegay on the Lindy's Second Team was senior defensive lineman Aki Jones.

Kornegay, a 2004 team captain, is a two-year starter in the defensive backfield at cornerback. A 2003 First Team All-Patriot League pick, he led the defensive backs with four interceptions and was second on the team with 72 total tackles, 49 solo. He also registered a league-best 17 pass break-ups last year, ninth best in the NCAA I-AA.

Kornegay helped the Fordham defense finish the season as the number one ranked passing defense in the Patriot League last year.

Clukey, the 2003 Patriot League Freshman of the Year and Second Team All-Patriot League, came in as a freshman and replaced All-Patriot League kicker Matt Fordyce. He led the Patriot League in field goal percentage (78.6%) and was third in field goals/game (0.92) while setting a school record for most PATs in a season with 47 and most PATs in a game (nine at Rhode Island). Clukey was twice named Patriot League Freshman of the Week in 2003.

KORNEGAY NAMED TO BUCHANAN BATTLE LIST: A total of 32 players have been chosen by The Sports Network, I-AA college football's most widely recognized information service, as official

The "Payton Watch" and "Buchanan Battle" pages, which can be found at The Sports Network's website (www.sportsnetwork.com) keep track of the quest for the 18th Walter Payton Award, presented annually to the top player in I-AA football, and the 10th Buck Buchanan Award, which goes to the top defensive player in I-AA. The honors will be presented at the 18th annual I-AA College Football Awards on Thursday, December 16th in Chattanooga, TN, on the eve of the 2004 I-AA National Championship.

Fordham senior defensive back **Tad Kornegay**, the 2004 Patriot League Preseason Defensive Player of the Year, was one of the 32 players named to the "Buchanan Battle" list. A 2004 team captain, Kornegay is a two-year starter in the defensive backfield at cornerback. A 2003 First Team All-Patriot League pick, he led the defensive backs with four interceptions and was second on the team with 72 total tackles, 49 solo. He also registered a league-best 17 pass break-ups last year, ninth best in the NCAA I-AA.

CLUKEY NAMED PATRIOT LEAGUE SPECIAL TEAMS PLAYER OF THE WEEK (Oct. 30th): Fordham University sophomore placekicker **Micah Clukey** was named Patriot League Special Teams Player of the Week for games of October 30th. It is the first weekly award of the season for Clukey and the third of his career (he was named Freshman of the Week twice last year).

On special teams against Georgetown, Clukey was a perfect 3-for-3 on field goals, hitting from 32, 32 and 41 yards. He was also a perfect 3-for-3 on extra points.

PRYDATKO NAMED PATRIOT LEAGUE SPECIAL TEAMS PLAYER OF THE WEEK (OCT. 23rd): Fordham University junior running back/kick returner **James Prydatko (Mt. Sinai, NY/Mt. Sinai)** was named Patriot League Special Teams Player of the Week for games of October 23rd. It is the first weekly award from Prydatko in his collegiate career.

On special teams, Prydatko returned four punts for 68 yards, including a 50-yard return late in the third quarter, and one kickoff for 15 yards. He also carried the ball 11 times for 35 yards in the game on Saturday.

KORNEGAY NAMED PATRIOT LEAGUE DEFENSIVE PLAYER OF THE WEEK/LONEY NAMED ROOKIE OF THE WEEK (OCT. 9th): Fordham University senior defensive back **Tad Kornegay (Trenton, NJ/Hamilton West)** was named Patriot League Defensive Player of the Week and freshman running back/kick returner **Raymond Loney (Richmond, VA/Huguenot)** was named Rookie of the Week for games of October 9th.

In the Brown game, **Kornegay** intercepted three passes tying a Fordham varsity record which he set earlier this year against Duquesne (Sept. 25th). The third interception was on the final play

of regulation which he almost returned for a touchdown, returning the pick 63 yards before going down on the Brown 27. Kornegay also made three solo tackles on the day.

Loney, a running back who returns kickoffs, returned three kickoffs for 138 yards against Brown. He returned one kickoff 97 yards for a touchdown to give Fordham a 17-10 lead in the third quarter. The 97-yard kickoff return tied Loney for the second longest return in Fordham football history.

DANIELS NAMED PATRIOT LEAGUE OFFENSIVE PLAYER OF THE WEEK/COVEN NAMED ROOKIE OF THE WEEK (SEPT. 25th): Fordham University sophomore quarterback **Derric Daniels** was named Patriot League Offensive Player of the Week while freshman running back **Jonte Coven** was named Patriot League Rookie of the Week for games of September 25th. This is the third week in which Coven earned the weekly honor.

In the Duquesne game, Daniels completed 16 of 25 passes for 251 yards and five touchdowns. Daniels, who also gained 13 yards on four carries, threw TD passes of 5, 10, 36, 13 and 4 yards, raising his season total to 10 scoring strikes in four contests. The five touchdown passes ties a Jack Coffey Field record, held by five different players. The last person to throw five touchdown passes on Jack Coffey Field was Fordham's Mark Carney, who threw for five scores against Georgetown on September 29, 2002.

Against Duquesne, Coven rushed seven times for 42 yards. On the year, Coven has rushed 30 times for 155 yards, an average of 5.2 yards/rush.

COVEN NAMED ROOKIE OF THE WEEK (Sept. 11th): Fordham University freshman running back **Jonte Coven** was named Patriot League Rookie of the Week for games of September 11th. This is the second consecutive week in which Coven earned the weekly honor.

Against Albany, Coven rushed ten times for 53 yards. He set up Fordham's first touchdown of the game by rushing for 32 yards on a 49-yard Fordham drive as the Rams scored on a 3-yard pass from Derric Daniels to Darrell Taylor late in the first quarter. The big play was a 26-yard Coven carry that put the ball on the Albany 10.

COVEN NAMED ROOKIE OF THE WEEK (Sept. 4th): Fordham University freshman running back **Jonte Coven** was named Patriot League Rookie of the Week for games of September 4th.

Fordham opened their 2004 season, under first-year head coach Ed Foley, with a 37-36 loss to the University of Rhode Island on Jack Coffey Field last Saturday.

Coven, making his collegiate debut, rushed eight times for a team-high 58 yards. He set up Fordham's second touchdown of the game by rushing for 43 yards on an 80-yard Fordham drive as the Rams scored on a 23-yard pass from Derric Daniels to Rashawn Haynes to tie the game at 14 midway through the second quarter.

LOST OFFENSE: With the graduation of **Kirwin Watson**, **Javarus Dudley** and **Kevin Eakin**, Fordham's all-time leading rusher, receiver and passer, respectively, the Rams lost a lot of offense.

The Rams lost 100% of their passing offense from the quarterback's position, 89.2% of their rushing offense and 66.3 of their receiving offense (all percentage are total yards gained by 2003 players who are not back for 2004).

The good news for the Rams is that they return seven starters on defense, a defense that led the Patriot League in passing defense in 2003.

RAMS ENJOY THREE STRAIGHT WINNING SEASONS: With their 9-3 record last year, the Fordham Rams have enjoyed three straight winning seasons. It is the first time the Rams have recorded three straight winning seasons on the I-AA level. The last time a Fordham football team registered three straight winning seasons was from 1976-78.

CLUKEY SETS FORDHAM PAT RECORDS/TIES PATRIOT LEAGUE MARK: With his 47 PATs last year, sophomore kicker **Micah Clukey** set a Fordham school record for most PATs in a season. He broke the record of 44 set by Matt Fordyce, currently on the Arizona Cardinals roster, in 2002.

Clukey also set a Fordham record with nine PATs in the Rhode Island win last year, breaking the former record of eight set by John Kennedy against Georgetown in 1985. Clukey also tied the Patriot League record for PATs in a game, set by Scott Kania of Holy Cross against Dartmouth in 1987 and tied by Ryan Rolfert of Holy Cross against Lafayette in 2001.

MEET THE CAPTAINS: The 2004 Rams will be led by four captains this fall, senior center **Jared Amatuzzo**, senior linebacker **NaQuinton Gainous**, senior defensive lineman **Ed Gordon**, and senior defensive back **Tad Kornegay**.

LAST YEAR OF NATURAL GRASS ON COFFEY FIELD: The 2004 Fordham University Rams are playing their final season on a natural grass surface on Jack Coffey Field. Following the season, the surface will be replaced with state of the art FieldTurf®, the playing surface currently used by a host of National Football League teams, including the New York Jets and Giants at the New Jersey Meadowlands, as well as by numerous collegiate teams, including the University of Nebraska, the University of Washington and the University of Oregon.

In addition to the new surface, Coffey Field will also receive a new scoreboard along with lights and the baseball field will get a new grandstand. As a result of the work, the Baseball Rams will be without a home field this spring.

This past summer, the Rams had their practice field, Murphy Field, resurfaced with FieldTurf®.

RAMS GETTING STRONGER, QUICKER: Despite losing a solid nucleus of players to graduation, the 2004 Rams proved that they aren't ready to rest on their laurels, tying the team power clean record in the preseason testing, having a school record 19 players turn in a total lift of over 1,100 pounds.

Even though no individual records were broken, there were some records set by category:

Category: Semi Skill (LB's, TE's, and FB's) - NaQuinton Gainous, LB - 594 lb Squat and 1323 lbs 3 lift total (Bench Press, Power Clean, & Squat).

Category: Skill (DB's, WR's, QB's, TB's & Specialists) - Carl Garritano, DB - 380 lb Bench Press and 1197 lb 3 lift total.

The speed testing results were affected by the new surface on Murphy Field. The old artificial turf was replaced by state of the art FieldTurf®, the playing surface currently used by a host of National Football League teams, including the New York Jets and Giants at the New Jersey Meadowlands, as well as by numerous collegiate teams, including the University of Nebraska, the University of Washington and the University of Oregon.

In the strength department, 27 players turned in a bench press of 350 pounds, while 10 players registered a squat of 500 pounds. Twelve Rams turned in a 300-pound power clean, matching last year's school record, 34 had a three-lift total of 1,000 pounds and 19 registered a three-lift total of 1,100 pounds, up from 18 in 2003.

WATSON SUITING UP FOR THE NEW YORK JETS: Former Fordham running back **Kirwin Watson** is currently employed by the New York Jets, only not on the field. Watson, Fordham's all-time leading rusher, was hired by the Jets as a Player Personnel Assistant.

Watson graduated as the school's all-time leading rusher with 4,617 yards while also setting the school single season rushing record, first in 2002 with 1,467 yards and then breaking the record last year with 1,477 yards. He was a two-time First Team All-Patriot League selection and was named 2002 Patriot League Offensive Player of the Year.

FORDHAM'S LAST GAME (Lehigh 21, Fordham 14): In a battle of the top two ranked offenses in the Patriot League, the game turned out to be a defensive struggle as eighth ranked Lehigh University (9-1, 5-0) defeated Fordham University (5-5, 2-3), 21-14, in a Patriot League game in Goodman Stadium. The win is the seventh straight for the Mountain Hawks over the Rams and Lehigh now leads the all-time series 16-1.

The Fordham defense held Lehigh, who entered the game averaging a league-high 400 yards/game, to 305 yards, while the Fordham offense was able to gain 351 yards against the top ranked defense in the conference, a defense that had limited opponents to 291.8 yards/game.

Lehigh pulled out to a 21-7 lead on an Eric Rath one-yard touchdown plunge with 3:16 remaining but the Rams battled back, moving 60 yards on seven plays on the ensuing possession with Derric Daniels hitting Darrell Taylor with a screen pass that Taylor turned into a 35-yard touchdown to pull Fordham to within seven, 21-14, with 1:32 left.

Fordham's Tad Kornegay then recovered the onside kick for the Rams on the Fordham 46. On the first play of the drive, Daniels hit Mike Melvin for a five yard gain but the Rams picked up another 15 yards on a roughing the passer penalty to put the ball on the Lehigh 34. Daniels then found Taylor for a six yard gain but threw incomplete on second down to Steve Porco. On the third down play, James Prydatko ran the ball on a sweep to the left and appeared to have picked up enough for a first down before he went out of bounds. But an official ruled that he stepped out of bounds on the 25, one yard short of the first. On fourth down, Prydatko ran the same play but was tackled short of the first down marker with 25 seconds remaining.

Lehigh jumped out to a 7-0 lead on their first possession of the game, moving 40 yards on six plays with Rath scoring on a 30-yard rush with 10:33 remaining in the first.

The Mountain Hawks threatened to score just before the half, moving to the Fordham 25 with 31 seconds left. Mark Borda then attempted a pass to Rath over the middle but Fordham linebacker NaQuinton Gainous nailed Rath just as the ball arrived, causing the ball to pop up and it was intercepted by a diving Edward Gordon.

The game would remain 7-0 until late in the third quarter when the Rams took over on their own 34 following a punt. Three plays later, Daniels hit Melvin with a long pass down to the Lehigh 20 and

Melvin broke away from his defender for a 64-yard touchdown pass to tie the game at seven with 1:49 left in the third.

The Mountain Hawks responded immediately, moving 64 yards on just four plays with Borda finding Adam Bergen with a 46-yard scoring strike to put Lehigh up 14-7 just over a minute later.

Early in the fourth, the Rams took over on their own 30 following a punt. Four rushes, three by Prydatko, gained 23 yards, putting the ball on the Lehigh 47. Daniels then connected with Taylor with a 44-yard pass that brought the ball down to the Mountain Hawks' three. But on first and goal from the three, Daniels was flushed out of the pocket and had his pass intercepted in the endzone by Brannan Thomas, who returned it to the Lehigh four.

The Mountain Hawks then drove the 96 yards on 12 plays to take a 21-7 lead with 3:16 left in the contest.

But the Rams wouldn't give up, with Daniels completing five of seven passes on the ensuing possession, including the 35-yard scoring pass to Taylor to make it a seven-point game, 21-14, with 1:32 remaining.

Daniels finished the game completing 17 of 35 passes for 262 yards and two touchdowns with Jamaal Hunte leading the Rams with four catches for 16 yards while Taylor (85 yards), Melvin (83 yards) and Porco (47 yards) each made three catches. Prydatko finished with 55 yards on 14 carries.

Gainous, who entered the game leading the Patriot League in tackles, led the Fordham defense with 12 total tackles, ten solo, while Tad Kornegay added eight and one pass deflection and Tommie Stephens also finished with eight, including one for a loss. Gordon also had a strong day defensively, notching six tackles, three solo, including three for a loss, 1.5 sacks and he forced a fumble and intercepted a pass.

NEW YORK CITY'S NOT JUST FOR BASKETBALL: Seven players on the 2004 Fordham roster hail from New York City? They include **Aki Jones**, **Jon-Ray Johnson** and **Rayon Richards** from Queens; **Jared Amatuzzo** and **Michael Sabatini** from Staten Island; and **Ray Kogolo**, **Tyrone Thorne** from the Bronx. Additionally, six members are from Long Island. They include **Erik Conroy** (Lindenhurst), **Robert Fioravanti** (Hempstead), **Edward Gordon** (Freeport), **Chris Hidalgo** (Deer Park), **James Prydatko** (Mt. Sinai) and **Erasmus Troia** (Manhasset).

TEAMING UP: There are eight sets of former high school teammates on the 2004 Fordham roster: **Jay Edwards** and **Tommy Holloway** (Ely - Florida); **Alex Colson** and **NaQuinton Gainous** (Lincoln - Tallahassee, FL); **Adrian Beason**, **Zlatko Sator** and **Cary Williams** (Chaminade Madonna - Florida); **Mario Rossi** and **Greg Whalen** (Cardinal Newman - Florida); **Steve Porco** and **Anthony Silvestro** (New Canaan); **Adam Ackerman** and **Ricky Bencivenni** (Bergen Catholic); **Bruce Lee** and **Evan Taylor** (Princess Anne-Virginia) and brothers **Samuel** and **Patrick Orah** (Gaithersburg-Maryland).

WHAT'S NEXT?: The Rams will open their 2005 schedule on Saturday, September 3rd as they travel to Kingston, Rhode Island to face the University of Rhode Island.

It was a sweet Homecoming for Fordham head football coach Ed Foley. Returning to the University at Albany where he coached his first collegiate game as an assistant coach, Foley led the Rams to a 14-0 win over the Great Danes for his first win as a collegiate head coach.

The Fordham defense was the story of the game, holding Albany to 186 total yards and forcing three turnovers to recorded Fordham's first shutout since a 43-0 win over Saint Peter's on September 7, 2002.

Jamaal Hunted led the Fordham offense, carrying 25 times for 105 yards and a touchdown. He is the first Fordham running back not named Kirwin Watson to rush for over 100 yards in a game since Arthur Gaskin in 2000.

The Rams got on the board first, driving 49 yards on seven plays to take a 7-0 lead on a three-yard touchdown pass from Daniels to freshman Darrell Taylor with 2:39 left in the first.

The Great Danes threatened in the second quarter, taking over on the Fordham 13 when Chris Stellato intercepted a Derric Daniels pass. The Fordham defense held Albany to three plays and a 30-yard field goal attempt by Chris Lynch was wide left.

Fordham took advantage of an Albany turnover early in the fourth as Nicholas Bazan fumbled a snap on the Albany 21 which was recovered by Patrick Orah. Five plays later, Hunte took it in from the one for a 14-0 Rams' lead with 9:43 left in the fourth.

Later in the fourth, the Great Danes drove from their own 41 to the Fordham 10 but a fourth down pass from Delgado to Topher Davey fell incomplete.

Gainous led the Fordham defense with nine total tackles, five solo, including one for a loss while Kornegay made seven total tackles, five solo, and broke up two passes. Tyrone Thorne made four tackles, including two for a loss and one sack, and he broke up three passes and had one interception.

Sophomore quarterback Derric Daniels completed 16 of 25 passes for 251 yards and five touchdowns, junior tight end James Caffarello made five catches for 105 yards and a score and junior running back Jamaal Hunte rushed 27 times for 91 yards and a touchdown to lead Fordham to a 41-34 win over Duquesne. The five Daniels' touchdown passes ties a Jack Coffey Field record, held by five different players, including Duquesne senior quarterback Niel Loebig who also threw for five scores on the day. The last person to throw for five scores on Jack Coffey Field was Fordham's Mark Carney, who threw for five scores against Georgetown on September 29, 2002.

Another Fordham record was set by senior defensive back Tad Kornegay who intercepted three passes, establishing the Fordham varsity record for most interceptions in a game. Tom Harter and Joe Kirsrok were the only other two Rams to pick off three passes in a game, that coming in 1969 when Fordham was a club team.

The Rams jumped out to a 28-6 lead in the second quarter and led 28-12 at the half but had to hold on as the Dukes mounted a comeback in the third quarter, scoring 20 points to pull to within three at the end of three quarters, 35-32.

After the Bears used two time outs in an attempt to ice Clukey, the sophomore connected on the 34-yard field goal to send the game to extra time.

The Rams also had a chance to win the game on the final play of regulation as Brown quarterback Joe DiGiacomo's Hail Mary pass was intercepted by Fordham's Tad Kornegay on the Fordham ten and he returned the ball to the Brown 27 before tripping. The interception was the third of the day for Kornegay, who recorded his second three-interception game of the year. The three picks ties the school varsity record that Kornegay set against Duquesne on September 25th.

In a battle of the top two ranked offenses in the Patriot League, the game turned out to be a defensive struggle as eighth ranked Lehigh defeated Fordham, 21-14, in a Patriot League game in Goodman Stadium. The win is the seventh straight for the Mountain Hawks over the Rams and Lehigh now leads the all-time series 16-1.

The Fordham defense held Lehigh, who entered the game averaging a league-high 400 yards/game, to 305 yards, while the Fordham offense was able to gain 351 yards against the top ranked defense in the conference, a defense that had limited opponents to 291.8 yards/game.

Lehigh pulled out to a 21-7 lead on an Eric Rath one-yard touchdown plunge with 3:16 remaining but the Rams battled back, moving 60 yards on seven plays on the ensuing possession with Derric Daniels hitting Darrell Taylor with a screen pass that Taylor turned into a 35-yard touchdown to pull Fordham to within seven, 21-14, with 1:32 left.
