2008 PATRIOT LEAGUE SEASON OFF AND RUNNING

All seven Patriot League teams are in action as the 2008 season fully kicks off on Saturday. Lehigh takes the field first, hosting Drake at 12:30 p.m., while Holy Cross, Bucknell and defending Patriot League champion Fordham will also play their home openers. Holy Cross has the marquee matchup of the weekend as it takes on No. 4 Massachusetts, while Bucknell hosts Duquesne and Fordham faces Rhode Island. Lafayette begins the season at Marist, while Georgetown opens up at Howard. Colgate will try to get in the win column when it visits Coastal Carolina. The Raiders started their season on a tough note on Saturday when they fell at Stony Brook, 42-26.

Defending Patriot League champion Fordham has been picked to repeat its title in 2008 in a poll of the League's head coaches and sports information directors. Fordham earned a first-place selection on nine of the 14 ballots, and received 68 points overall. Holy Cross had four first-place votes and 56 overall points to claim the second position, followed by Colgate with the remaining first-place vote and 53 points in third place. Lafayette placed fourth with 48 points, with Lehigh (35), Bucknell (18) and Georgetown (16) rounding out the preseason poll.

THREE PATRIOT LEAGUERS ON MAJOR FCS AWARDS LISTS

After receiving honors and acclaim throughout the preseason, Holy Cross senior quarterback Dominic Randolph, Colgate senior running back Jordan Scott and Lafayette senior linebacker Andy Romans have all earned a place among the elite in the Football Championship Subdivision after being named to the watch lists for the two major individual FCS awards presented by The Sports Network.

Randolph, the Patriot League Preseason Offensive Player of the Year, and Scott are among 16 players in contention for the Walter Payton Award, given to the Most Outstanding Player in the FCS. Romans, the League's Preseason Defensive Player of the Year, is on the list of 16 competitors for the Buck Buchanan Award, which honors the Most Outstanding Defensive Player in the nation. The awards will be presented on the eve of the FCS national championship game in Chattanooga, Tennessee on Dec. 18.

Randolph and Scott finished the 2007 season on the ballot for the Walter Payton Award, and placed 12th and 14th, respectively, in the voting. They are two of eight players to return to the list in 2008. Romans makes his first appearance on the Buck Buchanan Award watch list.

PATRIOT LEAGUE NOTEBOOK

BIDDLE GETS ANOTHER SHOT AT MILESTONE

Colgate Head Coach Dick Biddle is still sitting in a tie for the program's career wins record after Saturday's loss at Stony Brook. Biddle's 95 wins place him in a tie for the top spot on Colgate's all-time wins list with Andy Kerr (1929-46). Biddle, the Patriot League career wins and League wins leader, will try once again to earn sole possession of the top spot when the Raiders visit Coastal Carolina Saturday.

FAMILIAR, UNFAMILIAR FOES

Fordham, Bucknell, Lafayette and Holy Cross will all open the season with the same opponent that they did a year ago. Fordham (vs. Rhode Island), Bucknell (vs. Duquesne) and Lafayette (at Marist) will all look for another win this year, while Holy Cross tries to pay back Massachusetts for a loss to open the 2007 campaign. The other opponents are new to the Patriot League teams. Colgate is the first League team to face Coastal Carolina, while Lehigh (vs. Drake) and Georgetown (at Howard) play their first-ever meeting against teams that last faced a Patriot League squad when they lost to Towson in 2000.

LEOPARDS LOOK TO EXTEND WINNING STREAK

A three-game winning streak might not look like anything special, but it gives the Lafayette Leopards one of the longest streaks in the nation as they start the 2008 season. Lafayette's three-game streak is currently tied for the sixth-longest stretch in the country. Lafayette closed the 2007 season with three Patriot League wins, and will put the mark on the line on Saturday at Marist.

HISTORIC GAME FOR HOYAS

When Georgetown visits Howard on Saturday, the game will hold more significance than a typical matchup with a regional rival. Separated by just three miles, the Hoyas and Bison will play in the first Division I football game pitting teams from Washington, D.C. since Georgetown played George Washington in 1950. The DC Challenge Cup on Saturday will mark the first meeting between the schools, and also provide the first matchup for Georgetown against an opponent from one of the Historically Black Colleges and Universities (HBCU).

25 PATRIOT LEAGUE GAMES FEATURED IN TELEVISION PACKAGES

Twenty-five contests involving Patriot League squads will be televised in the 2008 season, including 12 of the 21 Patriot League games. Lafayette will have all 11 of its contests televised, while Lehigh will have nine, Colgate will feature seven and Holy Cross will have four. The coverage begins with three televised games on the first full slate of Patriot League football action on Saturday. Holy Cross will host No. 4 Massachusetts on WCTR-TV 3 Central Massachusetts, Lehigh hosts Drake on Service Electric 2 Sports and Lafayette visits Marist in a game broadcast by the Lafayette Sports Network and shown live on RCN-4 and WBPB-60.

IT'S A BIG ONE IN WORCESTER

Broadcaster Marketing Services will produce a radio call of an FCS game of the week for the second year in a row, and they'll start the season with a showdown in Worcester as Holy Cross hosts No. 5 Massachusetts on Saturday. Frank Santore, who calls the Patriot League men's basketball package on SIRIUS, will have the call at Holy Cross. The game will be broadcast on Saturday evening on WCKY AM 1530 in Cincinnati, which can be heard throughout the eastern half of the United States.

JORDAN SCOTT RECORD WATCH

Colgate running back Jordan Scott set or tied five Patriot League season or career records in 2007, including a season-best 170.45 rushing yards per game. Now, he has a chance to go out as one of the top players in League and NCAA history. Scott is 362 yards away from breaking the all-time Patriot League rushing mark of 4,834 (Lafayette's Erik Marsh, 1991-94), and is within 59 points of becoming the League's all-time leading scorer. He enters the year with 13 consecutive 100-yard rushing games and 24 total 100-yard efforts, both four games away from tying the League marks of Bucknell's Rich Lemon (1993-96). Scott's 1,019 carries are just eight shy of Marsh's Patriot League mark and 196 from a Division I record. Scott has already tied League records with six 200-yard games and three 1,000-yard seasons in his career. Another 1,000-yard campaign would make Scott the first Patriot Leaguer and only the seventh player in FCS history to reach the feat all four of his seasons..

PATRIOT LEAGUE NOTEBOOK

LEAGUE BOASTS TOP PASSER, RUSHER IN NATION

The Patriot League is home to the top quarterback and running back in the Football Championship Subdivision. Holy Cross quarterback Dominic Randolph leads all qualified NCAA players with 292 passing yards and 303 yards of total offense per game in his career. Colgate running back Jordan Scott has top marks with 4,473 rushing yards and 135.5 rushing yards per game.

PATRIOT LEAGUE FACES OFF WITH SEVEN FCS CONFERENCES

Every Patriot League team will once again take on a schedule entirely composed of FCS opponents, and the League will square off with seven different conferences. The slate features 18 games against Ivy League opponents and five against teams from the Colonial Athletic Association.

PATRIOT LEAGUE TEAMS, PLAYERS RECEIVE PRESEASON HONORS

Fordham and Colgate represent the Patriot League in various top 25 lists released in the preseason. The defending League champion Rams are ranked by three different outlets, while the Raiders receive the No. 20 ranking from Phil Steele's 2008 College Football Preview. Fordham also sits No. 27 in Monday's FCS Coaches poll. Eight Patriot League players received at least one All-America nod heading into the year, including multiple nominations for Holy Cross senior quarterback Dominic Randolph, Colgate senior running back Jordan Scott, Lehigh senior defensive tackle Brian Jackson, Lafayette senior linebacker Andy Romans and Colgate senior offensive tackle Nick Hennessey. MAJOR AWARD WINNERS BACK IN 2008

All of the Patriot League's 2007 individual award winners return for the 2008 campaign. Holy Cross quarterback Dominic Randolph is back after placing in the top five nationally in most major categories a year ago and winning the Offensive Player of the Year honor. Lafayette linebacker Andy Romans, the 2007 Defensive Player of the Year, returns after helping the Leopards to the No. 1 national rank in total defense a year ago. Fordham running back Xavier Martin enters his sophomore season after taking Rookie of the Year honors in 2007, while his head coach, Tom Masella, has the reigns for a third year after his 2007 Coach of the Year award.

25 ALL-LEAGUE PERFORMERS RETURN IN 2008

Randolph, Scott and Romans headline a group of 25 student-athletes that earned 2007 All-League honors and come back to the field in 2008. Nine First-Team All-League performers are part of that group, with Scott, Romans and Lehigh's Brian Jackson returning after earning All-America or ECAC recognition a year ago.

COACHING STABILITY

Each Patriot League head coach enters at least his third season at the helm, with Colgate's Dick Biddle the elder statesman of the group in his 13th year in Hamilton. Biddle has already set Patriot League records for overall wins (95), League games coached (73) and League wins (57). He trails only Lafayette's Bill Russo (1986-99) for the longest tenure in League history.

Lehigh and Drake meet for the first time on the gridiron...The Mountain Hawks are looking to end a two-game losing streak in both season and home openers, and Head Coach Andy Coen goes in search of his first win in those contests ...They had won eight consecutive season and home openers from 1998-05...Drake started its season with a 17-13 win over Upper Iowa on Thursday, in the debut for first-year head coach Chris Creighton...Patriot League teams are 2-0 all-time against Drake, with the last matchup coming when Towson won in 2000.

Lehigh Notebook The Mountain Hawks have eight starters returning on the offensive side of the ball, but will be starting a new quarterback...Sophomore J.B. Clark won the starting assignment at quarterback...Lehigh is coming off its first losing overall and Patriot League season since 1997...They have not recorded consecutive losing Patriot League records since 1988-89...First-Team All-League defensive lineman Brian Jackson and linebacker Tim Diamond return, but the Mountain Hawks have to replace the entire starting secondary...Jackson and Diamond both garnered All-America honors in the preseason.

Georgetown Notebook The Hoyas bring back 15 starters from last year's team...Nicholas Umar was selected to wear the Joe Eacobacci No. 35 Memorial Jersey, which is an award in honor of the former defensive standout who was killed in the terrorist attacks on Sept. 11, 2001...2006 Patriot League Rookie of the Year Charlie Houghton returns at running back...The Hoyas play their first three games on the road, with the home opener on Sept. 27 against Holy Cross...Third-year Head Coach Kevin Kelly is trying for his first victory in a season opener.

Holy Cross Notebook The Crusaders have eight starters back on the offensive side of the ball after leading the Patriot League and placing in the top 15 nationally in passing, total and scoring offense a year ago...Patriot League Preseason Offensive Player of the Year Dominic Randolph returns as the active FCS leader in passing and total offense per game...He was named a Walter Payton

Award candidate last week...Holy Cross plays the exact same opponents and order of games as the 2007 season, with only the sites switched...It has won seven games in each of the last two seasons, and the 14-8 mark is the best two-year span since 1991-92...Holy Cross Head Coach Tom Gilmore has a 2-2 record in both season and home openers.

Kizekai returns after earning First-Team All-Patriot League status as a kick returner and setting a League and Bucknell mark with 1,113 kick return yards in 2007...The Bison were flagged for only 29 penalties in 2007, while no other FCS team had fewer than 41...Of the five departed offensive starters, four were on the offensive line...First-Team All-Patriot League defensive end

Josh Eden is taking the next two years off to serve a Mormon mission...The Bison are 3-2 in season openers under Head Coach Tim Landis, and also 3-2 in home openers.
