Men's Golf Academic Honor Roll released

American, Bucknell and Lafayette were each represented with seven student-athletes

CENTER VALLEY, Pa. – The Patriot League's 2005 Men's Golf Academic Honor Roll was announced on Thursday by Executive Director **Carolyn Schlie Femovich**. A total of 35 student-athletes made the list, including a League-high seven each from American, Bucknell and Lafayette. Three golfers with perfect 4.00 grade point averages were recognized.

Following American, Bucknell and Lafayette were Army, Holy Cross, Lehigh and Navy with three student-athletes apiece on the honor roll, and Colgate with two.

AU junior communication major **Rob MacDonald** (Reisterstown, Md./Park), Army freshman **Patrick Beverly** (Humble, Texas/Humble) and Lafayette senior civil engineering major **Jeremiah O'Neill** (Newbury Port, Mass./Phillips Academy Andover) all achieved 4.00 GPAs.

Following the conclusion of the spring semester, senior economics major **Scott Manley** (Dove Canyon, Calif./Santa Margarita) of the 2005 Patriot League champion Army Black Knights was named the League's Scholar-Athlete of the Year for men's golf.

To be eligible for the Academic Honor Roll, a student-athlete must earn a 3.20 grade point average in the spring semester and be awarded a varsity letter in one of the League's six winter or 10 spring championship sports.

A total of 863 student-athletes were named to the League's Winter/Spring Academic Honor Roll, including 53 with perfect 4.00 GPAs. Bucknell led the way with a total of 199 candidates. The Winter/Spring Academic Honor Roll includes the sports of men's and women's basketball, men's and women's swimming & diving, men's and women's indoor track & field, baseball, softball, men's and women's lacrosse, rowing, golf, men's and women's tennis and men's and women's outdoor track & field.

The Patriot League, which was founded on the principles of admitting athletes who are academically representative of their class, is in its second decade of academic and athletic excellence. Participation in athletics at Patriot League institutions is viewed as an important component of the undergraduate experience. The Patriot League, which began as a successful Division I-AA football conference in 1986 and became an all-sport conference in 1990, includes American, Army, Bucknell, Colgate, Holy Cross, Lafayette, Lehigh and Navy as full members and three associate members. These institutions are among the oldest and most prestigious in the nation and their alumni have played leadership roles in the shaping of our country. In the most recent NCAA Graduation Rate Report of student-athletes, the Patriot League ranked FIRST among NCAA Division I conferences.
