PATRIOT LEAGUE EXECUTIVE DIRECTOR

CAROLYN SCHLIE FEMOVICH

Appointed the fourth Executive Director of the Patriot League in July 1999, Carolyn Schlie Femovich's selection by the Patriot League Council of Presidents continued its adherence to equity and innovation in its approach to intercollegiate athletics.

One of two women to hold the top post of a combined men and women's conference at the NCAA Division I level, Femovich brought with her 17 years of experience in NCAA Division I athletics.

During her first year as Executive Director of the Patriot League, membership was enhanced with the announcement that American University would become a full League member in the fall of 2001, and that Georgetown University would join the Patriot League in football beginning with the 2001 season.

Femovich focused her energies on setting a strategic direction for the future of the Patriot League during the 2001-02 academic year. In recent years, primary efforts have aimed at increasing League visibility and competitiveness, as well as the quality of services to the membership.

Femovich recently finished a four-year term as the Patriot League's representative on the NCAA Management Council and is currently serving as chair of the NCAA Championship and Competition Cabinet and NCAA Women's Basketball Issues Committee. She was also the chairperson of the prestigious Collegiate Women's Sports Awards Program and continues to serve on the Board.

Prior to her appointment as Executive Director, Femovich served in a leadership role in the administration of a highly-successful Ivy League athletic program at the University of Pennsylvania.

During her tenure as Senior Associate Athletics Director (1986-99) and Associate Athletics Director (1982-85), her responsibilities included administration of intercollegiate sports and recreation programs, strategic planning and facilities development, human resource management and event planning.

In her first position at Penn, Femovich oversaw 15 intercollegiate programs, coaching staffs and athletics facilities. She also served as Penn's Interim Director of Athletics in 1985. Femovich represented the University in a variety of external capacities with the Ivy League and NCAA, and on a number of sports committees and boards.

Femovich's career in intercollegiate athletics began in 1974 at Indiana University as a graduate teaching assistant. In 1975, she moved to Gettysburg College as head coach of the women's basketball and tennis programs as well as assistant professor of health and physical education and the Coordinator of Women's Athletics.

Included in the impressive list of regional and national committees Femovich has served on are the NCAA Division I Women's Basketball Committee, the NCAA Basketball Marketing Sub-Committee and the NCAA Division I Busi-

ness/Finance Cabinet and the NCAA Division I Women's Basketball Committee.

She played a primary role in bringing the 2000 NCAA Women's Basketball Final Four to Philadelphia and is a member of the executive board of the Philadelphia Sports Congress. She also held the office of President of the Eastern College Athletic Conference (ECAC) in 1996, which now includes more than 300 member institutions.

A graduate of Valparaiso University, Femovich received a masters of science degree from Indiana University. She and her husband, Robert, reside in Hellertown, Pa.

PATRIOT LEAGUE ACADEMIC AND ATHLETIC SUCCESSES

In its second decade of combining academic and athletic excellence, the Patriot League sponsors championships in 23 men and women's sports. Initially started as an NCAA Division I-AA football conference in 1986, the Patriot League became an all-sport conference in 1990 and includes American, Army, Bucknell, Colgate, Holy Cross, Lafayette, Lehigh and Navy as full members, and Fordham and Georgetown as associate members. These institutions are among the oldest and most prestigious in the nation and their alumni have, and continue to play leadership roles in shaping our country.

Since 1998, the Patriot League has ranked first each year among all Division I conferences awarding athletic aid in the NCAA Graduation Rate Report. In addition, the Patriot League finished first in the new NCAA Academic Progress Report (APR) among all Division I conferences awarding athletic aid (combining with all eight of its full-time member institutions for an average of 984 out of 1,000). The APR is used to measure academic eligibility, retention and graduation of student-athletes.

Patriot League student-athletes and teams continue to enjoy success at the national level, with opening round victories coming in several NCAA Championships, including consecutive wins in men's basketball, a final four appearance in men's lacrosse and a sixth-place finish at the NCAA Cross Country Championship.

The Patriot League's mission is simple, to provide successful competitive athletic experiences while maintaining high academic standards, and to prepare its student-athletes to be leaders in society.

During the 2006-07 academic year, Patriot League student-athletes and teams accomplished the following:

*Fourteen Patriot League student-athletes were named *ESPN The Magazine* Academic All-Americans including American's Heidi Hershberger (field hockey), Army's Nick Hill (baseball), Lindsey Gerheim (softball) and Patrick Beverly (golf), Bucknell's Shannon Curd (women's soccer), David Frisbey (football) and Melanie Buczko (women's cross country/track and field), Lafayette's James Conrad (baseball) and Navy's Lizzie Barnes (women's soccer), Kari Weniger (women's soccer), Chris Renninger (golf), Kelly Zalka (women's swimming and diving), Michael Niemi (men's cross country/track and field) and Kirsten Andrews (women's cross country/track and field).

*54 Patriot League student-athletes earned *ESPN The Magazine* All-District Academic All-America honors.

*American field hockey spent the entire season ranked in the top-20 in the NFHCA national poll.

*Three Patriot League field hockey student-athletes were named NFHCA All-Americans including American's Camila Infante and Denise Infante on the Second-Team and American's Irene Schickhardt on the Third-Team.

*Colgate's Mike Gallihugh led the Football Championship Subdivision in tackles and was a finalist for the Buck Buchanan Award.

*Lehigh was the first team in Patriot League history to receive a first-round bye in the NCAA Men's Soccer Tournament and the second to advance to the third round.

*The Patriot League had two teams win a game in the NCAA Men's Soccer Tournament for the first time in its history (Bucknell and Lehigh), with 2006 being the second year it sent multiple teams to the postseason.

*Lehigh women's soccer student-athlete Daniela Molina was selected to play for the Colombian National Team at the World Cup.

*Navy women's soccer owned the longest winning streak among NCAA Division I schools, posting 19-straight victories, and captured its first NCAA Tournament victory.

*Navy goalkeeper Lizzie Barnes posted the seventh-longest shutout streak in NCAA women's soccer history.

*American volleyball twin freshmen Ann and Clair Recht were featured on national morning shows for setting the record of being the tallest female twins in the Guinness Book of World Records.

*The Patriot League had two post-season participants in the sport of women's basketball for the first time since 2002 with Holy Cross playing in the NCAA Tournament and Bucknell in the WNIT.

*Holy Cross' Keith Simmons was named All-America Honorable Mention by the *Associated Press* in the sport of men's basketball.

*Navy's Paul Harris earned All-America status after finishing sixth in the 800 meters at the NCAA Indoor Track and Field Championship.

*Four different men's lacrosse teams spent time in the national polls, including Army, Bucknell, Colgate and Navy. Navy ended the year ranked a Patriot League-best eighth in the nation.

*Three Patriot League student-athletes were chosen in the Major League Lacrosse Draft including Navy's Billy Looney (first round, fifth pick), Colgate's Colin Hulme (second round, 16th pick) and Navy's Ian Dingman (third round, 30th pick). Looney became the highest drafted Patriot League student-athlete into MLL.

*Four Patriot League student-athletes were named USILA All-Americans including Navy's Billy Looney on the First-Team and Navy's Jordan DiNola and Colgate's Colin Hulme and Brandon Corp as Honorable Mentions.

*Bucknell's Nick Sciubba ended the year ranked first in the nation in goals against average and save percentage in the sport of men's lacrosse.

*Seventeen Patriot League rowers were named CRCA National Scholar-Athletes.

*Bucknell's Katherine Brewster-Duffy and Navy's Lindsey Spiess were named CRCA All-Americans.

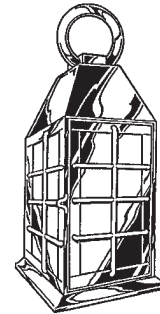
*Five Patriot League student-athletes were selected in the MLB draft including Army's Nick Hill and Milan Dinga, Bucknell's Jason Buursma and Navy's Mitch Harris and Jonathan Johnston.

*Lehigh's Kate Marvel ranked first in the nation in triples per game in the sport of softball, while Lehigh as a team ranked first in the same category.

*Navy's Kevin Teague became the first male diver in Patriot League history to win four consecutive 1-meter and 3-meter Patriot League Championship titles and to be named Patriot League Diver of the Meet four times.

PATRIOT LEAGUE HISTORY

- 1986** The Colonial League is founded and begins full round-robin play in football only; Lafayette College Associate Professor Alan Childs is named Executive Director.
- 1989** Carl Ulrich appointed as first full-time Executive Director.
- 1990** Colonial League changes its name to Patriot League.
- 1990-91** Patriot League becomes an all-sport conference, sponsoring 22 - 11 for women and 11 for men; Membership includes Bucknell University, Colgate University, Fordham University, College of the Holy Cross, Lafayette College, Lehigh University and the United States Military Academy.
- 1991** The United States Naval Academy joins the Patriot League as a full member.
- 1993** Constance (Connie) H. Hurlbut is named Executive Director of the Patriot League, becoming the first woman and youngest person to be selected as the leader of an NCAA Division I conference.
- 1995** Fordham University resigns its full membership, but remains in the Patriot League as an associate member in football.
- 1996** Change in Patriot League policy allows basketball scholarships beginning with the class entering in the fall of 1998.
- 1997** Creation of the Patriot League television package, which grows to 12 games on DIRECTV and ESPN, beginning with the 2002-03 season.
- 1999** Carolyn Schlie Femovich is selected as the fourth Executive Director of the Patriot League.
- 2000-01** Patriot League celebrates its 10th Anniversary; Patriot League policy regarding merit aid expanded to include all sports except football, beginning with the class entering in the fall of 2001.
- 2001** American University joins the Patriot League as a full member; Georgetown University joins as an associate member in football.
- 2003** United States Naval Academy increases participation from 12 sports to 18 by joining Patriot League in men's lacrosse, men's swimming and diving and men's and women's cross country and track and field.
- 2004** Women's rowing added as Patriot League's 23rd sport.
- 2005** Patriot League celebrates 20th anniversary for the sport of football.
- 2007** Patriot League unveils broadband package for men and women's basketball. Nearly 100 regular-season and a dozen Patriot League Tournament games are streamed. A two-year agreement for basketball TV package with ESPN2 begins. Patriot League men's basketball 'Game of the Week' package on SIRIUS Satellite Radio debuts.

TOP PERFORMERS RETURNING TO THE COURSE

Nine of the 11 All-League performers from last year's Patriot League Championship return, including Patriot League Player of the Year Matt Czarnecki of Holy Cross. He will try to become the second student-athlete in Patriot League annals to win back-to-back honors as the individual champion of the Patriot League Tournament. Also returning is Navy's Chris Renninger, who finished second in the Patriot League Championship and earned Patriot League Golf and overall Male Scholar-Athlete of the Year honors. Co-Rookie of the Year finishers Steven Suarez (Lehigh) and Andrew Cohen (Bucknell) are back after both placing fourth in last year's Championship.

BISON GO FOR A THIRD

Bucknell will try to become the second Patriot League program to win three consecutive titles, and first since Army won the first five six crowns from 1991-95 (with fall and spring titles in 1994).

FIRST YEAR AT THE HELM

The Patriot League welcomes one new coach to the group in 2008, as Mac Gifford takes over the reigns at Colgate. Gifford was the Head Women's Tennis Coach at Syracuse from 1999-2006.

Two-time defending champion Bucknell was chosen to win its third consecutive Patriot League Championship in a vote by Patriot League head coaches and sports information directors in the 2008 Golf Tournament Poll.

The Bison received eight first-place votes and 65 points overall. Last year, Bucknell earned its second consecutive and second overall Patriot League crown. Head Coach Jim Cotner, who has received Patriot League Coach of the Year honors in the last three seasons, returns a pair of All-League performers including 2007 Co-Rookie of the Year Andrew Cohen.

Navy came in a close second in the poll with 63 points and four first-place votes after finishing just three strokes behind the Bison at last year's Championship. Navy has a pair of All-League performers back, with Chris Renninger returning after finishing in second place, just one shot off the lead, at the 2007 Championship. Chip Hardie earned Second-Team All-League honors, while Ryan Wielgus was the 2006 Rookie of the Year.

Winners of a League-high nine Championships, Army came in third in the poll with 52 points and one first-place vote. The Black Knights look to get back in the winners' circle for the first time since 2005 with three 2007 All-League performers, including three-time All-League selection Pat Beverly.

Lehigh received 48 total points for fourth place. The Mountain Hawks finished fourth at the Patriot League Championship last year, but were just seven shots behind Bucknell. Steven Suarez returns after sharing Rookie of the Year honors last season.

Colgate (27), Holy Cross (20) and Lafayette (19) rounded out the poll. Holy Cross senior Matt Czarnecki won last year's Patriot League Championship, and will try to become the second golfer in League history to win consecutive titles.

TIEBREAKING PROCEDURES

In the case of ties in the Patriot League Championship, the following process will be used until all ties are broken:

In case of a tie by two (2) or more teams, the champion is decided by a sudden-death play-off. Weather and time permitting, all six golfers from each team tied for first place play an additional hole. The best four of the six scores are counted with the lowest total winning the playoff.

If a tie still remains, the second hole will be played, etc. **If weather and time do not permit**, a match of cards will be conducted. It is the responsibility of the sport committee to rule on the feasibility of continuing with a playoff, but every attempt should be made to conduct one if possible. Final round fifth (5th) man scores will be compared. If a tie still exists, final round sixth (6th) man scores will be compared. If a tie still exists, second round fifth (5th) man scores will be compared, followed by second round sixth (6th) man scores. If a tie still exists, first round fifth (5th) man scores will be compared followed by first round sixth (6th) man scores. It is the responsibility of the sport committee to rule on the feasibility of continuing with a playoff, but every attempt should be made to conduct one if possible. If a playoff begins but cannot be completed, fifth (5th) man scores on the last hole completed will be compared. If a tie still exists, sixth (6th) man scores on the last hole completed will be compared.

BISON REPEAT

Bucknell won its second consecutive Patriot League Golf Championship in 2007, and second of all-time. The Bison won the title on their home course with a score of 883, three strokes ahead of second-place Navy and five in front of third-place Army.

THE AWARD WINNERS

Though his team finished in a tie for sixth, Holy Cross junior Matt Czarnecki earned Patriot League Player of the Year honors by winning the individual title at the League Championship by one stroke.

Bucknell Head Coach Jim Cotner was awarded Patriot League Coach of the Year for the third year in a row, and second consecutive solo honor after sharing the title in 2005.

Bucknell's Andrew Cohen and Lehigh's Steven Suarez shared Patriot League Rookie of the Year honors. Both freshmen came in fourth place in the Patriot League Championship.

SECOND ON THE COURSE, FIRST IN THE CLASSROOM

Navy's Chris Renninger was selected as the 2007 Patriot League Golf Scholar-Athlete of the Year in a vote by the Patriot League's Sports Information Directors. He was later also selected as the overall 2007 Male Scholar-Athlete of the Year. He was the second Navy golfer, and second golfer at all, to earn the Male Scholar-Athlete of the Year honor, following Billy Hurley (2004). Renninger boasts a 4.0 grade point average and is first in his class among 1,073 members. He earned a perfect mark in seven consecutive semesters at the close of the 2007 season.

RARE COMPANY

Bucknell's Charles Waddell finished third in 2007 after winning the last two Patriot League Championships, but his place was high enough to join the elite in the League record books. Waddell became the fifth Patriot League golfer to end his career by earning All-League status in all four of his seasons.
