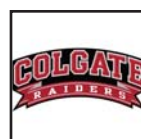

PATRIOT LEAGUE EXECUTIVE DIRECTOR

CAROLYN SCHLIE FEMOVICH

In selecting Carolyn Schlie Femovich as its fourth Executive Director, the Patriot League Council of Presidents continued its adherence to equity and innovation in its approach to intercollegiate athletics. Femovich brought 17 years experience at the NCAA Division I level to the Patriot League when she was appointed Executive Director in July of 1999. She is one of four women to hold the top post of a combined men and women's conference at the NCAA Division I level.

Throughout her tenure at the Patriot League, Femovich has focused on key areas including the development of a comprehensive multimedia package, expansion of League membership, improvement of League competitiveness, and quality of services to the membership.

Under her direction, Patriot League basketball has gained increased television exposure through contracts with national outlets and as a result of the League's broadband initiative, which streams more than 100 men and women's basketball games live annually via the Internet. Additionally, selected Patriot League Olympic sports have found a home as a part of the League's all-sport packages with various television entities and have seen increased visibility through the streaming of Patriot League Championship events.

In 2001 Femovich orchestrated the addition of American University as a full member and Georgetown as an associate member in football, which has helped to strengthen and stabilize the membership. She has also increased service to the membership with improvements in championship administration, League governance and a focus on the student-athlete experience. During her time with the Patriot League, emphasis has been placed on the competitiveness of its men and women's basketball programs, as well as other key sports that present unique opportunities for the League.

Femovich has served in national leadership positions with the NCAA as chair of the Division I Championship/Competition Cabinet and as the League representative on the NCAA Management Council. She was also chairperson of the prestigious Collegiate Women's Sports Award Program, where she continues to serve as a board member. Currently, she serves as a board member of the National Association of Collegiate Women Athletic Administrators (NACWAA).

During her tenure as Senior Associate Athletics Director (1986-99) and Associate Athletics Director (1982-85) at the University of Pennsylvania, her responsibilities included administration of intercollegiate sports and recreation programs, strategic planning and facilities development, human resource management and event planning. In her initial years with the Quakers, Femovich supervised 15 intercollegiate programs, coaching staffs and athletics facilities. She also served as Penn's Interim Director of Athletics in 1985. Femovich represented the University in a variety of external capacities with the Ivy League and NCAA, and on a number of sports committees and boards.

Femovich's career in intercollegiate athletics began in 1974 at Indiana University as a graduate teaching assistant. In 1975, she moved to Gettysburg College as head coach of women's basketball, women's tennis, assistant professor of health and physical education and the Coordinator of Women's Athletics.

Included in the impressive list of regional and national committees Femovich has served on are the NCAA Basketball Marketing Subcommittee, the NCAA Division I Business/Finance Cabinet and the NCAA Division I Women's Basketball Committee, arguably the most prestigious women's sport committee in the NCAA. She played a primary role in bringing the 2000 NCAA Women's Basketball Final Four to Philadelphia and is a member of the executive board of the Philadelphia Sports Congress. She also held the office of President of the Eastern College Athletic Conference (ECAC) in 1996, which now includes more than 300 member institutions.

Femovich is a graduate of Valparaiso University and received a master of science degree from Indiana University. Femovich and her husband Robert reside in Hellertown, Pa.

PATRIOT LEAGUE ACADEMIC AND ATHLETIC SUCCESS

Now in its third decade as an all-sport conference combining academic and athletic excellence, the Patriot League sponsors championships in 23 men and women's sports. Initially started as an NCAA Division I-AA football conference in 1986, the Patriot League became an all-sport conference in 1990 and includes American, Army, Bucknell, Colgate, Holy Cross, Lafayette, Lehigh and Navy as full members, and Fordham, Georgetown and MIT as associate members. These institutions are among the oldest and most prestigious in the nation and their alumni have, and continue to play leadership roles in shaping our country.

Since 1998, the Patriot League has ranked first each year among all Division I conferences awarding athletic aid in the NCAA Graduation Rate Report. The League finished at the top spot with 96 percent of its teams reporting a graduation rate of 85 percent or higher in the most recent data. In addition, 90 Patriot League teams earned NCAA Academic Performance Program Public Recognition Awards after posting academic progress rate scores in the top 10 percent of all squads in their respective sports.

The Patriot League's mission is simple, to provide successful competitive athletic experiences while maintaining high academic standards, and to prepare its student-athletes to be leaders in society.

During the 2009-10 academic year, Patriot League student-athletes and teams accomplished the following:

*11 Patriot League student-athletes earned CoSIDA/ESPN The Magazine Academic All-America honors, with Army's Andrew Maisano (Men's Lacrosse), Erin Anthony (Women's Basketball) and Elizabeth Betterbed (Women's Soccer), Navy's Beth Reed (Women's Soccer), Alex Buck (Men's Swimming and Diving) and Mark Van Orden (Track and Field) and Bucknell's Patrick Selwood (Men's Soccer) receiving First-Team Academic All-America recognition.

*50 Patriot League student-athletes received CoSIDA/ESPN The Magazine Academic All-District honors.

*The Patriot League placed second among all Division I conferences with 90 teams receiving NCAA Public Recognition Awards for their performance in the classroom.

*Navy's Beth Reed and Mark Van Orden received NCAA Postgraduate Scholarships.

*Reed was also named the CoSIDA/ESPN The Magazine Women's Soccer Academic All-American of the Year, and won the Patriot League Female Scholar-Athlete of the Year Award.

*Reed and American's Anne-Meike de Wiljes earned the Patriot League's nominations for the NCAA Woman of the Year award.

*Army's Andrew Maisano won the Lowe's Senior CLASS Award for Men's Lacrosse, and earned the Patriot League Male Scholar-Athlete of the Year award.

*Other Candidates for the Lowe's Senior CLASS Award: Marquis Hall, Lehigh (Men's Basketball); Andrew Kydes, Army (Men's Soccer); Elizabeth Betterbed, Army (Women's Soccer); Mandy Correale, Holy Cross (Softball).

*Army's Elizabeth Betterbed was selected as a Rhodes Scholar.

*Holy Cross' Olivia Pruszko earned a Fulbright English Teaching Assistantship

*Holy Cross' Dominic Randolph finished fifth in the voting for the Walter Payton Award, given to the Most Outstanding Player in the Football Championship Subdivision, and won the ECAC Player of the Year honor.

*Fordham's John Skelton became the first Patriot League player taken in the NFL Draft since 1995.

*Lehigh's C.J. McCollum was named the ECAC Men's Basketball Rookie of the Year and received multiple national freshman honors.

*Navy's Adam Meyer was named the Mid-Major Swimmer of the Year by CollegeSwimming.com, and received Honorable Mention All-America honors at the NCAA Championship Meet.

*Bucknell won the 2010 Patriot League Presidents' Cup. The Bison also won the male and female trophies.

*It was the eighth time in Patriot League history that a school won the overall, male and female titles.

*Every Patriot League team won at least one championship for just the fifth time in League history.

*Army Men's Lacrosse defeated No. 2 Syracuse, 9-8, in double overtime in the NCAA Tournament first round.

*Bucknell defeated Princeton in the first round of the NCAA Men's Soccer Tournament.

*A pair of Patriot League teams played in the postseason in women's basketball. Lehigh made the NCAA Tournament, while American qualified for the WNIT.

*Three Patriot Leaguers were selected in the Major League Baseball First-Year Player Draft, while a pair were chosen in the Major Lacrosse League Draft.

*Army's Garret Thul was named national freshman of the year by Inside Lacrosse.

*Three teams were ranked in the final Sports Network FCS top 25 for the first time since 2005.

PATRIOT LEAGUE HISTORY

- 1986** The Colonial League is founded and begins full round-robin play in football only; Lafayette College Associate Professor Alan Childs is named Executive Director.
- 1989** Carl Ullrich appointed as first full-time Executive Director.
- 1990** Colonial League changes its name to Patriot League.
- 1990-91** Patriot League becomes an all-sport conference, sponsoring 22 for women and 11 for men; Membership includes Bucknell University, Colgate University, Fordham University, College of the Holy Cross, Lafayette College, Lehigh University and the United States Military Academy.
- 1991** The United States Naval Academy joins the Patriot League as a full member.
- 1993** Constance (Connie) H. Hurlbut is named Executive Director of the Patriot League, becoming the first woman and youngest person to be selected as the leader of an NCAA Division I conference.
- 1995** Fordham University resigns its full membership, but remains in the Patriot League as an associate member in football.
- 1996** Change in Patriot League policy allows basketball scholarships beginning with the class entering in the fall of 1998.
- 1997** Creation of the Patriot League television package, which grows to 12 games on DIRECTV and ESPN, beginning with the 2002-03 season.
- 1999** Carolyn Schlie Femovich is selected as the fourth Executive Director of the Patriot League.
- 2000-01** Patriot League celebrates its 10th Anniversary; Patriot League policy regarding merit aid expanded to include all sports except football, beginning with the class entering in the fall of 2001.
- 2001** American University joins the Patriot League as a full member; Georgetown University joins as an associate member in football.
- 2003** United States Naval Academy increases participation from 12 sports to 18 by joining Patriot League in men's lacrosse, men's swimming and diving and men's and women's cross country and track and field.
- 2004** Women's rowing added as Patriot League's 23rd sport.
- 2005** Patriot League celebrates 20th anniversary for the sport of football.
- 2007** Patriot League unveils broadband package for men and women's basketball. Nearly 100 regular-season and a dozen Patriot League Tournament games are streamed. A two-year agreement for basketball TV package with ESPNU begins. Patriot League men's basketball 'Game of the Week' package on SIRIUS Satellite Radio debuts.
- 2008** United States Naval Academy adds women's lacrosse as its 19th Patriot League sport. Patriot League receives women's basketball grant from NCAA.
- 2009** United States Naval Academy adds women's tennis as its 20th Patriot League sport. Patriot League receives women's basketball grant from NCAA for second straight season.
- 2010** Massachusetts Institute of Technology (MIT) joins Patriot League as associate member in rowing.

Navy will host the Patriot League Golf Championship in Annapolis from April 30-May 1, and the League's coaches and sports information directors predict success on the home course as the Mids were tabbed the favorite to win the title on Tuesday.

Navy ran away with the top spot in the poll voting, taking home 69 points and 10 first-place votes. Defending champion Lafayette was next with 53 points and a first-place vote, while Army and Bucknell tied for third with 49 points and took home one and two first-place votes, respectively. Lehigh (39), Colgate (22) and Holy Cross (13) rounded out the rankings. Head coaches and golf sports information directors from each of the seven schools voted in the poll, and could not vote for their own team.

The Mids, who last won the Patriot League title in 2008, have more going for them than just the advantage of hosting the Championship at Naval Academy Golf Course. Senior Ben Hayes and junior Peter Reilly are both former Patriot League Rookie of the Year recipients that earned second-team All-Patriot League honors with a top-10 finish at last year's Championship. Hayes and freshman David Hall won the Patriot League Golfer of the Month awards in the fall. Navy has fared well at its home course, including a fourth-place finish at the Fall Classic in September and taking first place at last spring's invitational.

Lafayette was picked just sixth in last year's poll before winning its first League title, but the Leopards will come in with preseason expectations this time around. Rob Robertson was named Patriot League Player of the Year for winning last season's individual title, while Tyler Ostrovsky earned a third-straight All-Patriot League honor by finishing in a tie for sixth. Lafayette enjoyed a strong fall that included fourth-place finishes at both the Cornell and Rutgers Invationals.

Army will be under the direction of first-year Head Coach Brian Watts, who spent the past nine seasons as the boss at Oregon State. Watts inherits a solid lineup that includes senior Matt Krembel, who has earned All-Patriot League recognition in each of his three previous years. Matt Philie returns after placing third at last year's Championship to earn the Patriot League Rookie of the Year award. The Black Knights have already played two events this spring, including a dual match win over Stetson.

Bucknell has the most to replace from last year, as a group of standouts that included four-time All-Patriot League selection Andrew Cohen has graduated. However, the program with three of the last five Patriot League titles showed well in the fall by winning its invitational in September.

Lehigh placed second at last year's League Championship, and has an experienced lineup with three players that have earned All-Patriot League honors. Doug Marcincin and Dwight D'lorio finished in the top 10 last year to earn second-team recognition, while Duncan Zeiders placed seventh at the 2009 League Championship. Lehigh opened up its spring season with a fifth-place finish at the Mission Invitational from March 12-13.

Keith Tyburski enters his first full season as head coach at Colgate, and the Raiders got off to a fast start in the fall by winning their invitational to open the season in September. The Raiders opened the spring season by placing sixth at the Homewood Suites Invitational over the weekend.

Holy Cross is picked to finish in seventh place, but boasts one of the top golfers in the Patriot League in Steve Zychowski. The sophomore placed in a tie for fourth at last year's League Championship to earn first-team All-Patriot League honors, then qualified to play in the 2010 United States Amateur Championship over the summer. The Crusaders are not a one-man show, either, as Mike McCarthy earned second-team All-Patriot League honors last year. Holy Cross opened the spring with a fourth-place finish at the George Washington Invitational last weekend.

The Patriot League Golf Championship will be competed on the weekend of April 30-May 1 at the Naval Academy Golf Course. The format is a two-day, 54-hole tournament, with 36 holes of play on Saturday and 18 holes scheduled for Sunday.

TIEBREAKING PROCEDURES

In the case of ties in the Patriot League Championship, the following process will be used until all ties are broken:

In case of a tie by two (2) or more teams, the champion is decided by a sudden-death play-off. Weather and time permitting, all six golfers from each team tied for first place play an additional hole. The best four of the six scores are counted with the lowest total winning the playoff.

If a tie still remains, the second hole will be played, etc.

If weather and time do not permit, a match of cards will be conducted. It is the responsibility of the sport committee to rule on the feasibility of continuing with a playoff, but every attempt should be made to conduct one if possible. Final round fifth (5th) man scores will be compared. If a tie still exists, final round sixth (6th) man scores will be compared. If a tie still exists, second round fifth (5th) man scores will be compared, followed by second round sixth (6th) man scores. If a tie still exists, first round fifth (5th) man scores will be compared followed by first round sixth (6th) man scores. If a playoff begins but cannot be completed, fifth (5th) man scores on the last hole completed will be compared. If a tie still exists, sixth (6th) man scores on the last hole completed will be compared.

LAFAYETTE WINS FIRST PATRIOT LEAGUE TITLE

Lafayette rode an individual title performance from sophomore Rob Robertson and placed two others players in the top six of the field to hold off rival Lehigh by seven strokes and win its first Patriot League Golf Championship on April 25 at Seven Oaks Golf Course.

The Leopards had never previously finished higher than the fourth in the field that they placed in 2003. Lafayette Head Coach Jim Hutnik won his second Patriot League Coach of the Year award, also winning in the 2003 season. Rob Roberston becomes Lafayette's first-ever Patriot League Player of the Year winner as the individual champion at the event. Army's Matt Philie, who placed third, was named Rookie of the Year as the highest freshman finisher. Lehigh's Steve Suarez, who finished second in the field, was later named the 2010 Patriot League Golf Scholar-Athlete of the Year.

Lafayette took a nine-shot lead into Sunday's final 18 holes, and only allowed Lehigh to get two strokes closer to defeat the Mountain Hawks by seven shots. Lafayette shot a 902 (+38) in the 54-hole tournament (303-295-304). Lehigh came in second place with a 909 (307-300-302). The Mountain Hawks earned their highest finish since placing second in 2004.

The Lehigh Valley rivals were followed in order by Army (912), Navy (914), defending champion Bucknell (917), host Colgate (928) and Holy Cross (936).

Lafayette went on to the NCAA East Regional, where the Leopards placed 14th in New Haven, Conn. from May 21-23

BUCKNELL'S COHEN IN ELITE COMPANY

Bucknell's Andrew Cohen earned his fourth All-Patriot League honor by tying for 10th place at the League Championship. Cohen became the sixth player in League history to earn four All-Patriot League honors in his career. He is the first since Bucknell's Charles Waddell (2004-07) to accomplish the feat. Cohen received two First-Team and two Second-Team selections in his career. He won the 2009 League Championship with a record score of 208.
