COLGATE DOWNED BY BOSTON COLLEGE, 2-0, IN NCAA FIRST ROUND

The Colgate Raiders were downed by Boston College, 2-0, in the opening round of the NCAA Tournament on Nov. 21. The Raiders end their season with a mark of 12-6-3 after making their second-straight NCAA Tournament appearance.

The first period featured spirited, back and forth action by both teams. In the 10th minute, Colgate sophomore Jeff Leach streaked down the left side of the field and crossed a ball to junior Steven Miller, whose shot went just wide of the right post. But the Eagles quickly got back on offense, and at 18:32, Boston College midfielder Alejandro Bedoya crossed to teammate Shawn Chin inside the Colgate box, where Chin touched the ball in to the far corner of the net, giving the Eagles a quick 1-0 lead. Patriot League Goalkeeper of the Year David Cappuccio got his only save of the period in the 37th minute, when Boston College's Bedoya set up forward Edvin Worley, who sent a pop-up shot right to a waiting Cappuccio. But at 40:57, the Eagles found the back of the net again, as Worley's header off of a corner kick by Chin arched in for a goal, putting Boston College up, 2-0, as the Eagles outshot the Raiders, 7-2.

Cappuccio sustained a first-period injury and was replaced by Chris Miller in the Colgate goal for the second half. Miller had two saves in the period and allowed no goals as the Eagles took 10 shots in the second period. Steven Miller took both of Colgate's second-half shots, one in the 54th minute and the other in the 63rd minute, both of which went over the goal. Boston College netminder Chris Brown finished the game with no saves.

Friday's game was the last for a talented bunch of Colgate seniors, including Matthew Barton, Jimmy Stephens, Patriot League Second-Team All-League selection Daniel Kerley, First-Team All-League selection Glenn Volk, William Batson, Matt Leach and David Cappuccio, who finished his career as Colgate's career shutout leader with 23.

Patriot League teams are now 7-15-1 in the NCAA Tournament since the League received its first automatic bid in 1995. League teams dropped to 1-7 against ACC teams in the Tournament, with the last win coming in 2001.

PATRIOT LEAGUE MEN'S SOCCER COSIDA HONOREES

Colgate senior defender Daniel Kerley, Bucknell junior forward Chris Hennings and Lafayette junior defender Matthew Reichenbach were honored as CoSIDA/ESPN the Magazine Academic All-Americans. Kerley was named to the First Team, Hennings was a Second-Team selection and Reichenbach was a Third-Team pick.

ELEVEN NAMED TO NSCAA ALL-REGION TEAMS

Eleven Patriot League men's soccer student-athletes were named to their respective National Soccer Coaches Association of America (NSCAA) All-Mid-Atlantic Region Teams.

Holy Cross defender Jerry Dickinson and Colgate forward Alex Weekes were designated First-Team Mid-Atlantic Region members. Dickinson is the 2008 Patriot League Defensive Player of the Year, while Weekes is a Second-Team All-League pick who scored both goals in Colgate's 2-1 victory over Holy Cross to win their second-straight Patriot League title.

Six Patriot League student-athletes were awarded Second-Team Mid-Atlantic Region honorees. Colgate's David Cappuccio is the Second-Team goalkeeper, and is the 2008 Patriot League Goalkeeper of the Year. First-Team All-League defenders Alejandro Melean of Holy Cross and Glenn Volk of Colgate are also on the team. First-Team All-League midfielder Adam Gazda from Lehigh, 2008 Offensive Player of the Year Conor O'Brien of Bucknell and Lafayette forward B.J. Glenn round out the Patriot League representatives on the Second Team.

American's Cooper Bryant, Lehigh's Jim Taranto and Colgate's Chris Ross are all Third-Team Mid-Atlantic Region selections. Bryant, Taranto and Ross are all First-Team All-Patriot League selections as well.

ARMY'S GLUBZINSKI NAMED TO LOWE'S ALL-SENIOR ALL-AMERICA TEAM

Army senior goalkeeper A.J. Glubzinski, a finalist for the 2008 Men's Soccer Lowe's Senior CLASS Award, was named to the First-Team All-Senior All-American Team. The All-Senior All-America Team is based on the cumulative results of NCAA Division I coaches and national media and fan balloting for the award, which honors the attributes of senior student-athletes in the classroom and community, in character and in competition.

AMERICAN

The Eagles tied Holy Cross, 1-1, in the Patriot League semifinals, but the Crusaders advanced to the title match after advancing 5-3 on penalty kicks. Freshman goalkeeper Matt Makowski earned Rookie of the Year honors for an outstanding first-season campaign.



ARMY

Army won its first Patriot League game of the season, defeating archrival Navy, 1-0 in the annual Star game. The Black Knights finished their season 3-14-0 overall and 1-6-0 in the Patriot League. Senior goalkeeper A.J. Glubzinski earned Scholar-Athlete of the Year honors for his academic and athletic performance.



BUCKNELL

The Bison lost a double overtime heartbreaker, 3-2, to American in the regular season finale, eliminating them from postseason contention. Bucknell finished the year 8-8-3 overall and 3-4-0 in the Patriot League, and junior midfielder Conor O'Brien was named Offensive Player of the Year.



COLGATE

The Raiders won their second-straight Patriot League title and NCAA Tournament berth by beating Holy Cross, 2-1, in the Championship game. Colgate lost its first round NCAA game, 2-0, to Boston College. Raider goalkeeper David Cappuccio ended his career with 23 shutouts, third all-time in the Patriot League.



HOLY CROSS

Holy Cross advanced 5-3 on penalty kicks to the Patriot League Championship game after tying American, 1-1, in the semifinals. The Crusaders lost the title game, 2-1. Senior Jerry Dickinson earned Defensive Player of the Year honors.



LAFAYETTE

After securing its seventh-straight postseason berth, Lafayette fell to Colgate, 2-0, in the Patriot League Tournament semifinals. Sophomore B.J. Glenn earned NSCAA All-Region honors, while sophomore Stephen Macurdy was an All-League honoree.



LEHIGH

The Mountain Hawks were eliminated from postseason contention with a 2-0 loss to Colgate in the final regular season game. Lehigh finished the season 7-7-3 overall and 2-3-2 in Patriot League play. Three Mountain Hawks earned All-League awards this season.



NAVY

The Mids lost their last game of the season to archrival Army, 1-0 in the annual Star game. Navy finished its season 4-11-3 and 0-6-1 in Patriot League play. Head Coach Rich Miranda resigned shortly after the end of the season.

Patriot League Tie-Breaking Procedure/ Selection Seeding

Non-League contests completed before the Monday prior to the Championship will be included in the tie-breaker formula, if necessary. Any non-League contest played on or after the Monday prior to the Championship will not be included in the tie-breaker formula.

a. In the case of a two-way between teams in the final standings for regular season League play, the following process will be used until all ties are broken and the seeding process is completed (ties will be broken in rank order beginning with the highest seed):

i. Head-to-head competition - the higher seed will go to the team that has won the most League contests played against the other team involved in the tie (in the sport of volleyball, both matches and individual games will be considered).

ii. If a tie still exists, a comparison of records will be made between the tied institutions starting at the highest possible seed and continuing through the lowest seed, if necessary.

iii. Sport specific tie-breaking procedure, if any (see Sport Specific regulations).

iv. Comparison of records versus out-of-League common opponents.

v. Coin flip.

b. In the case of multiple ties (more than two teams tied for the same spot), the following process will be used: Note: The entire process for multiple-team ties must be completed. The Patriot League does not revert back to the two-way tie formula once the multiple-team tie has been resolved.

i. Records between the tied teams will be evaluated to determine if one team won more contests against the other tied institutions (in the sport of volleyball, both matches and individual games will be considered).

ii. If a tie still exists, a comparison of records will be conducted for each team starting with the highest seed not involved in the tie and continuing through the lowest seed, if necessary.

iii. Sport specific tie-breaking procedure, if any (see Sport Specific regulations).

iv. Comparison of records versus out-of-League common opponents.

v. Coin flip (two teams) or draw (multiple teams).
